



Swindon Town crashed to a 7-1 defeat at Nottingham Forest with Nicky Southall grabbing a hat-trick along the way.

Swindon lined up at a vibrant City Ground cheered on by 1,188 travelling supporters and it was Town who kicked off after both teams had gone through their respective prematch huddle routines.

Nicky Southall hit the first of his treble after just three minutes firing an unstoppable shot from 35-yards past Evans before Wes Morgan headed home unchallenged on 17 minutes. Ian Breckin then headed home unchallenged from Forest's second corner of the match as the ball looped over Evans and into the net.

Into the second half and Forest continued to be a yard faster to the ball than Town and it came as no surprise when Grant Holt charged down the right wing and crossed into the area. Nicky Southall had time to pick his spot before heading home for his second and Forest's 4th of the game with the half only six minutes old.

Southall sidefooted home for his hattrick on 55 minutes with the home side running the show. Two minutes later Town slipped even further behind when Wes Morgan headed home from another Forest corner to lift the noise levels to a crescendo around the City Ground and that was the cue for a Mexican wave around the stadium.


Trevor Benjamin headed a free-kick home from Aaron Brown in the 76th minute. The Town fans present showed they had not lost their sense of humour with a rendition of "you're not singing any more" despite the fact that the Robins were still five goals behind.


Jack Lester completed the scoring in the final few minutes before the referee brought an end to a torrid afternoon for STFC.
















We have almost a quarter of the season left to play. Play your part today and help roar Town on to three vital points.


ONE TO WATCH: CHRIS GREENACRE

Chris Greenacre signed for Tranmere on July 13th 2005 on a two-year contract. The striker joined Rovers from Championship side Stoke City where he had spent the last three years of his career.

Born in Wakefield, Yorkshire, Greenacre began his career at Manchester City as an 18-year old and stayed at Maine Road for five seasons. After being loaned out to Cardiff City, Blackpool and Scarborough, he

moved to Mansfield in 1999. He finished leading scorer in Division Three two seasons later, a feat that saw him quickly snapped up by Stoke.

This season has gone well for the front man who has scored 12 goals in 33 games so far.

The Squad

Dino Seremet joined Rovers on loan on January 1st from Luton Town after Steve Wilson joined fellow goalkeeper John Achterberg on the injury list. The 6'4" Slovenian joined Luton in July 2004 after impressing on a trial from Maribor Pivovarna Laako and has made nine appearances for the Hatters to date. John Achterberg arrived at Rovers in September 1998 from Dutch side FC Utrecht and has now has made more than 250 appearances under four different Managers during his stay with Tranmere.

Michael Jackson has now made over 450 league starts in a career which has seen him serve Crewe, Bury and Preston North End before he initially arrived at Prenton Park on loan in December 2002. The move did not become permanent until May 2004 but he is now very much part of the Tranmere set-up. Jamaican international Ian Goodison has over 70 caps to his name and captained his country to their first ever World Cup win over Japan back in 1998 and signed a new one-year deal at the end of last season and has impressed since joining in early 2004 after a previous



spell in England with Hull City. Gareth Roberts was born in Wrexham and joined Liverpool as a trainee in 1994. Upon being released by the Reds he moved to Greek side Panionios before joining Tranmere after a successful trial. He has now made over 250 appearances for the club as well as winning full international caps for Wales. most notably appearances against Brazil and Portugal. The versatile David Raven joined from Liverpool on loan for the rest of the season on January 31st 2006. The 20-year old defender was a schoolboy at Tranmere before joining Liverpool in March 1999, aged 14, for an initial fee of £25,000. He is an England Youth International and has made four first team appearances for Liverpool. Birkenhead-born defender Paul Linwood has now made 32 starts for Rovers since joining as a trainee in July 2002 and has benefited from a loan spell with Wrexham.

The experienced Mark
Rankine has now topped over
500 league starts in a career
which began back in 1988 with
Doncaster Rovers. He has also
represented Wolves, Preston
North End and Sheffield United
and has found the net once
so far this term. Steven
O'Leary first joined Rovers

on a one-month loan deal in October from Luton Town. After impressing in his five appearances, he came back to Prenton Park until the end of the 2005/06 season on a long-term loan. Sam Aiston joined Rovers on a free transfer in July 2005. The 29-year old Geordie began his career as a youngster with Newcastle United in 1994 and joined Sunderland in 1995 on a free transfer. He was then loaned out to Chester City (twice), Stoke City and Shrewsbury. He made the move to the Gay Meadow permanent in July 2000 for £50,000 and became a regular in a Shrewsbury shirt. Primarily a left-winger, Aiston's speed and strength are his best assets. Steven Jennings has risen through the ranks at Tranmere since joining at the age of 14 when he was released by Everton.

Delroy Facey joined Rovers in August 2005 from Oldham Athletic on a free transfer. The powerful striker started his career at Huddersfield Town and has played Premiership football at Bolton and Championship football with West Brom. He has also had spells with Bradford, Burnley and Hull before joining Oldham in March 2005. Steve Davies joined the club as a 14-year old trainee and has risen through the ranks to the brink of the first team and has made several substitute appearances to date.

Brian Little

Brian Little was appointed Manager of Tranmere Rovers on October 13th 2003, succeeding Ray Mathias at Prenton Park.

Having played professionally for just one club, Aston Villa, for whom he made over 300 appearances before injury forced him into playing retirement, his first taste of management came with Wolves in 1986 when he took charge as caretaker manager for eight games before joining the coaching staff at Middlesbrough.

Two years later he moved back into management with Darlington and quickly led them to the GM Vauxhall Conference title. His success there was quickly noticed and in March 1990 he became Leicester City boss. Little took the Foxes to three Play-Off finals against Town at Wembley and eventually gained promotion to the Premiership in 1994.

Six months later he was on his way back to Villa Park for a three-year managerial reign that saw him win the Coca Cola Cup and guide Villa into Europe. Further spells in Management followed with West Brom, Stoke City and Hull City.

Interesting Facts...

• The club were formed when Lyndhurst Wanderers and Belmont Cricket Club came together in 1884 to make Belmont FC. A year later the team **changed its name** to Tranmere Rovers, who later became founder members of the Third Division (North) in 1921.

'Dixie' Dean made his debut for Tranmere at the age of just
 16 years and 355 days in
 1924. Dean scored 27 goals in 30 games for Rovers, before being transferred across the River Mersey to Everton for £3,000, where he scored a British record 60 League goals in one season in 1927/28.

The last time we conceded so many, against Bolton, commentator Stuart Mac cried. Tears flowed again last weekend, judging by callers post-match to 103.6FM BBC Radio Swindon, Since the Burnden Park debacle. we've suffered a handful of 6-0's. Notably the defeat by Middlesbrough was followed by a victory over Queens Park Rangers in which Iffy Onuora netted the winner on his Town debut! with a 3-0 loss. A month later, the Gills made the trip to the County Ground, which had become a fortress for Swindon recently, having not been beaten here since 26th November, It was a bitterly cold night, but I'm sure those who attended were glad to have spent their Valentines Night in SN1, watching the best in the west. However the match was tense with chances going begging, and the failure to wrap up the game earlier left an anxious second-half. At last, the final whistle blew and the only goal of the game, a fine Jamie Cureton lob, secured another three points. The Town had won their last four home matches and were finally out of the bottom four. Not only that, we had jumped up five places to sixteenth position and relegation was no longer on the minds of the fans, but

some were even talking of the play-offs!

"Things have obviously taken a turn for the worse, as four days later we lost at home to fellow strugglers Rotherham, despite taking the lead twice, followed by the City Ground experience, not doing much good for our goal difference, now the second worst in the division, only one better than MK Dons. This could be vital at the end of the season considering the closeness of the bottom half of League One.

"We are now back in the relegation zone, in 22nd place, but hopefully this is just a mini blip in form, and Iffy Onuora and his men can pick themselves up and earn some vital points. We are still only four points away from Bradford, who currently lie ten places ahead of us. 



SEAN AND 'NICHO' ARE LOOKING TO POLICE THE DEFENCE AS TOWN PULL TOGETHER...

hey may have both started their football careers in Merseyside, but Town's Scouse duo Sean O'Hanlon and Andy Nicholas will be hoping to impart some misery on the team visiting from the Wirral this afternoon.

Even more so after last week's freak result against Nottingham Forest, in which the pair both endured their first heavy defeat in professional football. Sean and Andy are both at a loss as to why their usually dependable backline was infiltrated so many times, and with a positive response this afternoon, both are keen to make sure it doesn't happen again. Instead, both are keen to make a statement that Swindon Town aren't throwing in the towel.

It's been a tough season for O'Hanlon and Nicholas. Both have been in excellent form despite Town's lowly position, Sean as captain and Nicho on the left after a disappointing campaign last time around and despite making 181 appearances between them, they're still learning all the time. However, both have fine footballing pedigrees from the schools of Everton and Liverpool respectively, and with a first win in three this afternoon the dynamic duo will be hoping they can continue their footballing education by helping secure Town's League One safety...

I'm sure you've both said enough already about last weekend's defeat at the City Ground - more important is how we react today, isn't it?

SOH: It's vital we win against Tranmere. We let everyone down last weekend: ourselves, the staff and the fans - especially the fans because they turned out in force. Saturday's game is a good opportunity to forget the defeat and put it behind us. We were the victims of three quick goals - to go so quickly and so far behind against a side like Forest and in front of a big crowd - it just didn't go right for us. AN: Any home game at this stage of the season is important, but I think after last week and to some extent, the week before as well [Rotherham], we need a

looking for a clean sheet.

It's easy to be negative after such a defeat, but a win today would see us catch today's visitors, and they're in mid-table!

SOH: The league is so tight if we'd lost 7-1 and were 10 points adrift then you could understand if people started to throw in the towel, but we're not. We've not played well in the last two games and that's something that has to be addressed - but you're right, a win today and then again at Yeovil and we could be climbing the table again. 
What do we know about Tranmere Rovers...



to climb out of it - which is a good thing - we just have to make sure we return to some good form over these next two games and work hard as a team.


As two players that grew up in Merseyside, did you ever come across each other or any of today's visitors?



Swindon went into the match hoping to secure their first double of the season after having won at Millmoor last December and they kicked off playing towards the Town End in bright sunshine.



Rotherham United then equalised in the 31st minute through Shaun Barker who headed home unchallenged.








> here haven't been too many seasons in Town's history to rival what happened in 1992/93 and while the season was ultimately success for us, Tranmere Rovers can look back at how close they came to claiming the glory themselves.

Three wins in the first four Division One matches started the season well for Town but then just two points from the next 12 available made us wonder whether we'd flattered to deceive.

As September

closed, Town stood 8th but when a Craig Maskell goal produced a win over West Ham at Upton Park, one amongst three victories in October. Town were up to 2nd and eying the Premiership.

A slight slip in the New Year saw us drop back, but by the end of February we were in the play-off frame to stay. .

Meanwhile, our visitors' campaign tracked Town's match by match. Rovers themselves hit 2nd in November, momentarily dropped out of top six in March but recovered to take

4th by the end of the season.

The two League fixtures between the clubs saw the points shared equally. A Dave Mitchell brace in February gave Town a 2-0 victory at The County Ground, and a hat-trick from Rovers' Kenny Irons wrapped up the points at Prenton Park in April despite Mitchell's third strike against them.

But now the real story...

With Town finishing 5th and Rovers 4th, the teams were to face each other in the playoffs, and the TV cameras were here at The County Ground to capture the action of the first leg. Anyone arriving late would still be kicking themselves.

The game was less than two minutes old when Tranmere defender Steve Vickers forced the ball from Dave Mitchell. From the resultant throw-in. Nicky Summerbee swung in a cross which Vickers, under pressure from Mitchell, headed powerfully past his own keeper Eric Nixon.

Within a minute, Vickers knocked another Summerbee cross straight to Ross McLaren. who's parried shot was turned into the net by Mitchell. You had to feel for Vickers, but in truth we waited until after the final whistle.

John Aldridge then had a

headed 'goal' ruled out before Craig Maskell intercepted a Vickers ball in midfield to put Mitchell through. One-on-one with Nixon, he squared to Maskell to put Town 3-1 up.

It we were cruel we could have voted Steve Vickers, Town's man of the match.

Up on Mersevside the drama continued in the second leg. A Martin Ling run allowed John Moncur to restore Town's three-goal aggregate advantage before a wounded Tranmere came storming back.

Mark Proctor reduced the arrears before Pat Nevin netted from a Fraser Digby fumble.

At the other end, Craig Maskell's attempt was saved before he composed himself to bury the loose ball. 5-3 to Town overall, but when Glenn Hoddle made an uncharacteristic challenge in the box, Kenny Irons' penalty left Town with a very nervous last seven minutes.

Town were Wembley-bound where we merited the odd goal in seven against Leicester City. Much has already been written about that.

Tranmere were to meet Leicester in the play-offs the following season, but by then Town were already downwards bound once more.

Jamie O'Hara is on loan from Tottenham to the end of season and he was one of those on the score sheet at Millmoor last weekend.

The season is entering that vital stage approaching Easter. Both teams need the points for different reasons.

Colchester fell to a Brian Howard goal in a 1-0 defeat at Barnsley last weekend, a result that left the club on 59 points from 33 games. After such a consistent season so far, Phil Parkinson's side will not be prepared to settle for a play-off place when automatic promotion is still within their grasp.




