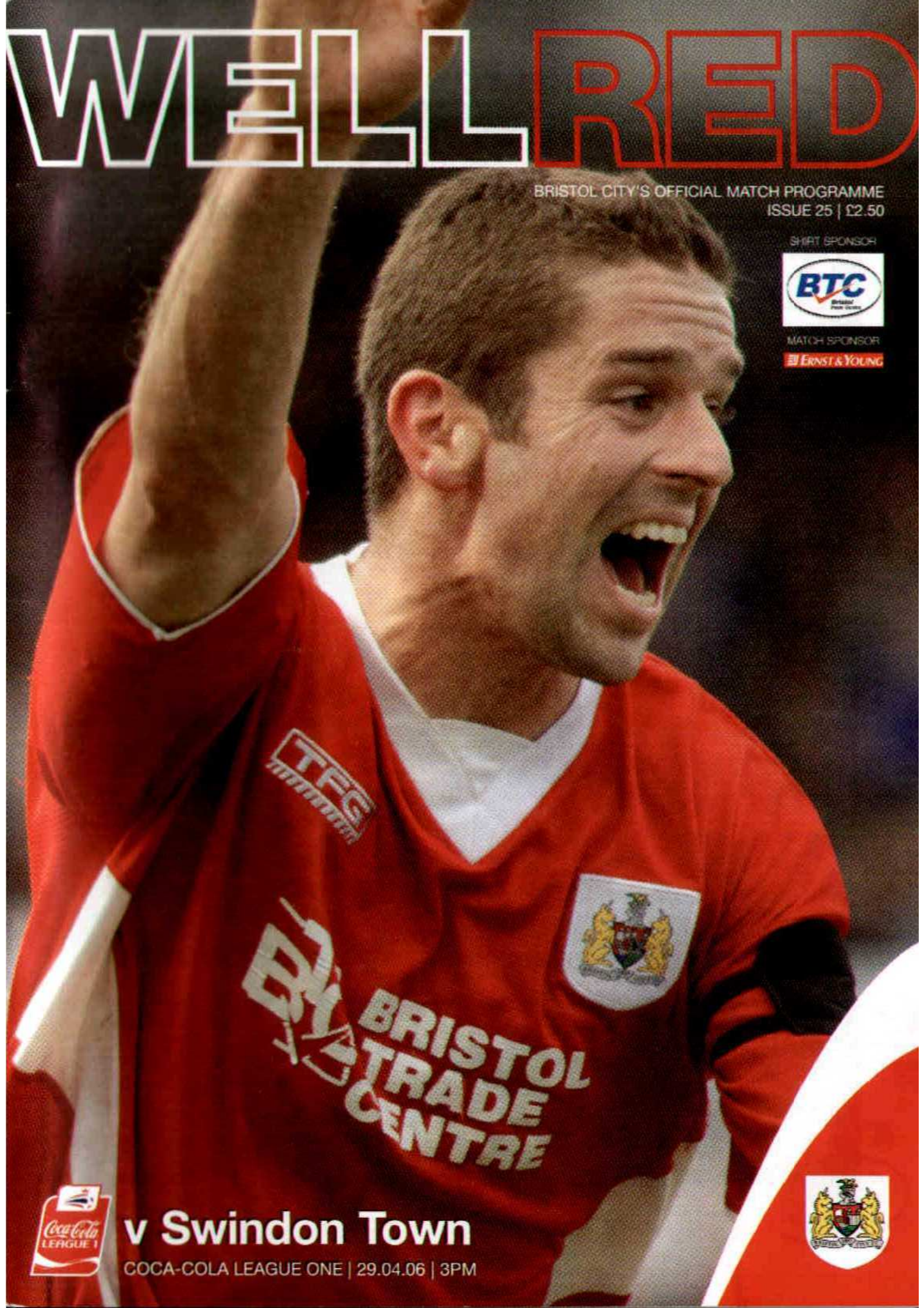

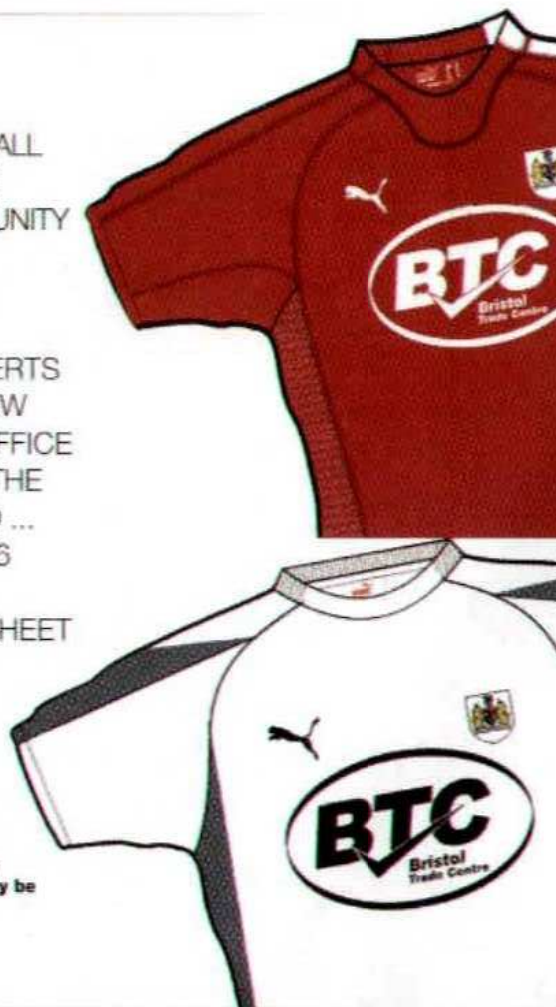

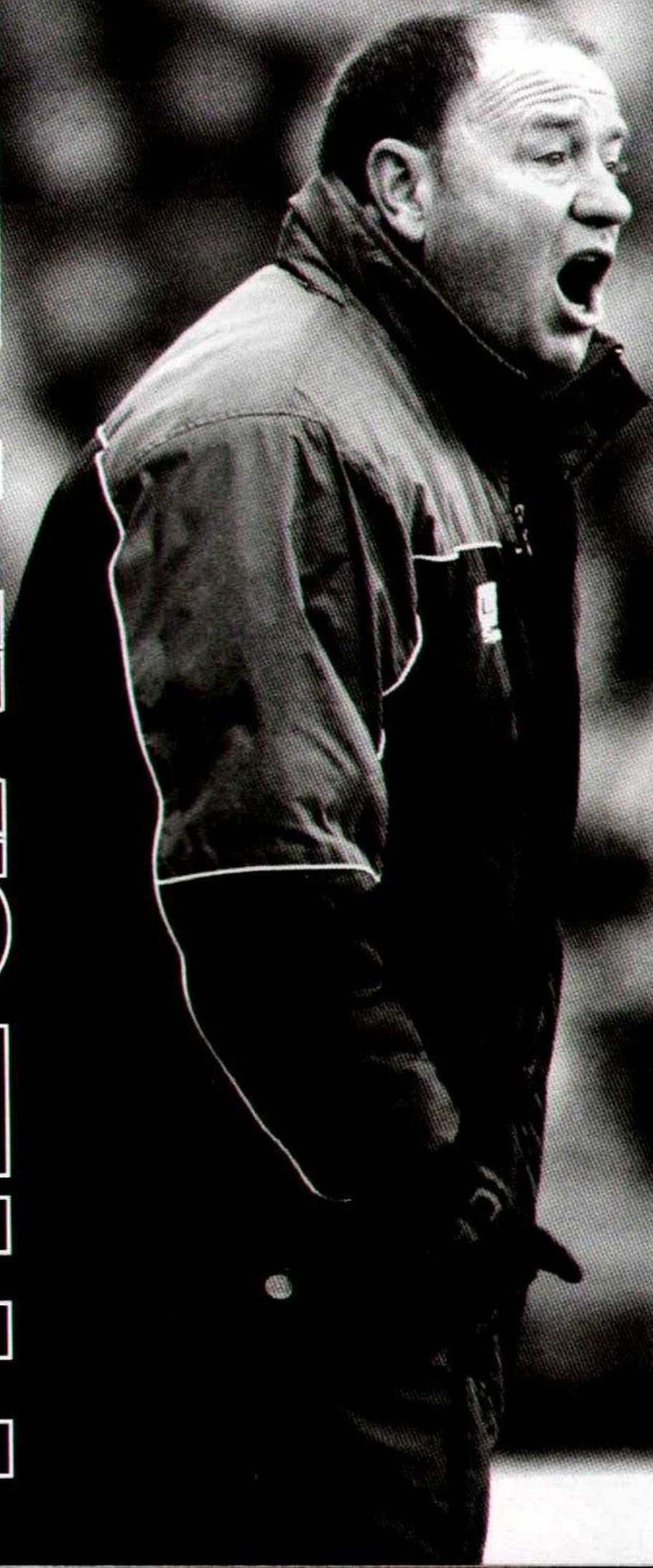

Amazingly, seven of our last eight games have been against clubs battling to try and get away from the relegation zone. Our response to the challenges presented by those fixtures has been magnificent.


As this is the final home match programme of our 46-game League campaign, I want to thank the players for their efforts and our fans for their tremendous support over the season.

certain of avoiding relegation.

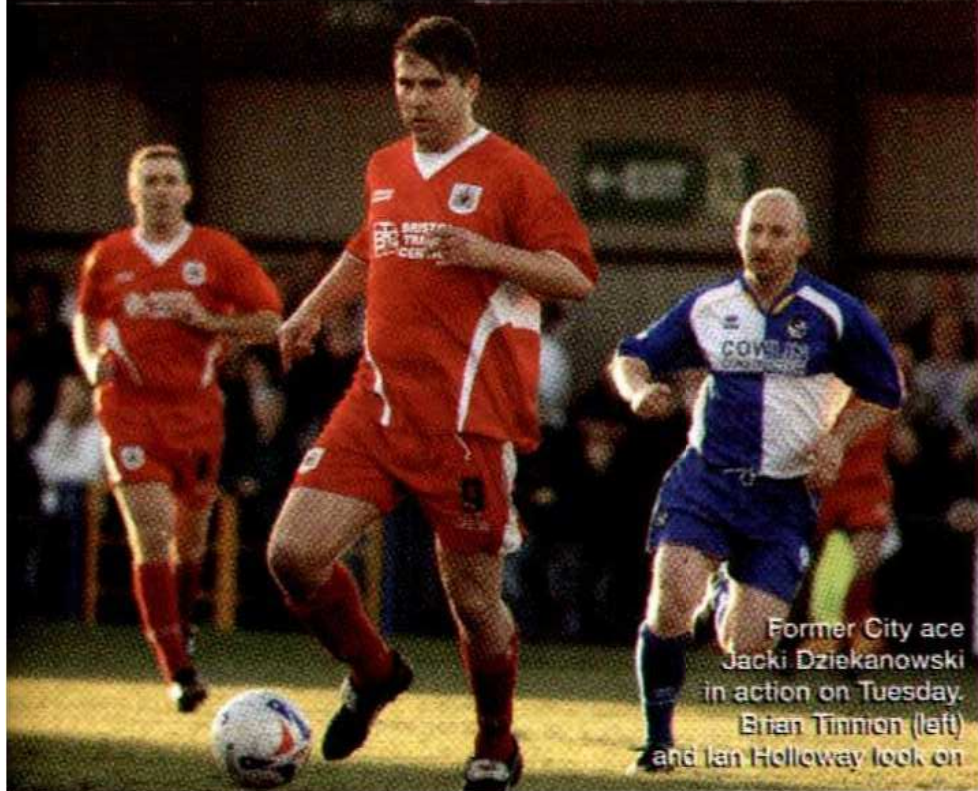

"IT WAS EVERYTHING I COULD HAVE HOPED FOR." THAT WAS the reaction of a delighted Steve Phillips after his testimonial game at Clevedon Town's Hand Stadium on Tuesday night.

Star of the show was Jacki Dziekanowski, whose return to action in a City shirt drew a crowd of 2,500 to the game. Kick-off had to be delayed for half-an-hour because of the long queues at the turnstiles.

Jacki rewarded spectators with a goal and played the whole 90 minutes as a City Legends XI lost 2-1 to their Bristol Rovers counterparts.

The result was immaterial. Both sets of players had turned up to pay tribute to City's long-serving goalkeeper and Steve was thrilled by the turn-out and the occasion.

Rovers were led by Ian Holloway. Also on duty for the Pirates were Brian Parkin, Billy Clark, Andy Tilson, Geoff Twentyman, Phil Bater, Wayne Noble, Phil Purnell, Devon White, Carl Saunders, David Mehew, Andy Reece and Tom White.

Rovers edged in front through Mehew before Jacki produced some trickery and a cool finish to equalise early in the second half. A late own goal from Osman settled the outcome.

# IN THE CITY

SWINDON TOWN

**S**WINDON NEED TO WIN TODAY'S WEST COUNTRY derby if they are to stand any chance of avoiding relegation. Even then, victories by Tranmere and Rotherham would mean they become the first ex-Premiership club to be demoted to the Football League basement – a division they have not played in since 1986.

This is the sad scenario facing City's local rivals following last Saturday's 3-1 home defeat to Brentford, which left them five points adrift of safety.

That relegation could be confirmed today at Ashton Gate is a further twist of the knife for a club which has struggled to escape the clutches of the bottom four all season.

The situation is made all the more poignant by the presence in Iffy Onuora's squad of three former members of City's 2003/04 play-off side – Aaron Brown,

Lee Peacock and Christian Roberts – plus two ex-Rovers players, Jamie Cureton and Andy Gurney.

As Cureton himself stated this week: "If we do go down, there is not a worse place for that to happen than at Bristol City. If we do go down, it is important that it is at home in front of our fans."

Of the ex-City contingent, Brown is the most likely to play. Peacock is ruled out and faces knee operation this summer, while Roberts scored for the reserves this week.

## ONE TO WATCH JAMIE CURETON

Born: Bristol, 28.8.75. Prolific scorer in the lower leagues who has struck 14 times this season for Swindon and Colchester.

In total he has scored 160 goals in a career which started at Norwich and has seen him win promotion from this level with Reading and QPR. He is best known locally for his time with Bristol Rovers, for whom he netted 78 times in a four-year spell between 1996-2000.

Ironically, given Swindon's present position, he has also played a major part in League One rivals Colchester's success this season, scoring seven goals in a ten-game loan spell.

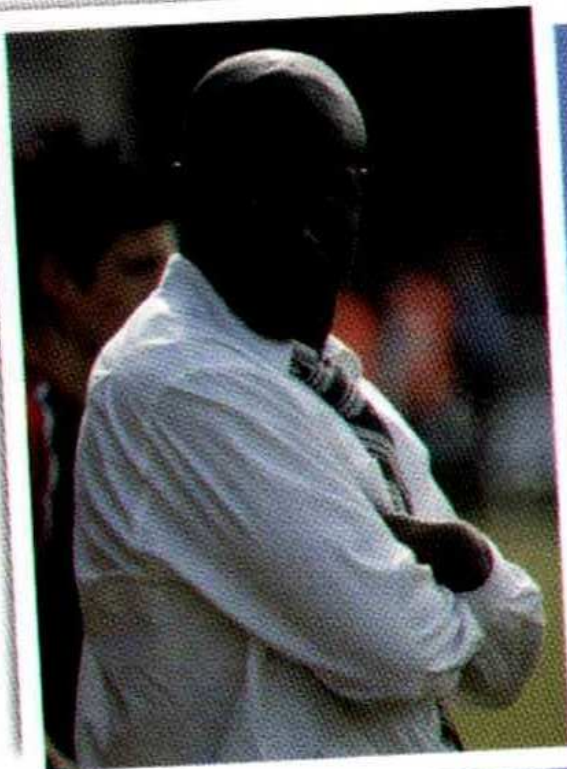

## THE GAFFER IFFY ONUORA

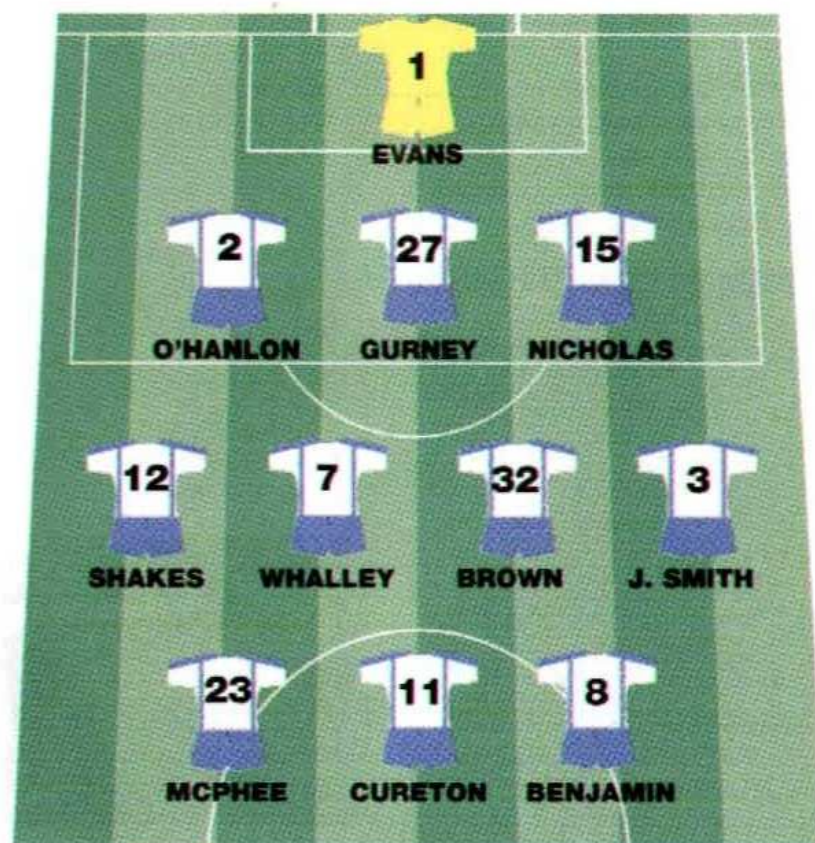
Born: Glasgow, 28.7.67. Former Swindon striker who was appointed manager in September, following the departure of Andy King.

Scored 133 goals in a playing career which started at Huddersfield Town in 1989 and also saw spells with Mansfield Town (where he played under King), Gillingham, Sheffield United, Wycombe (loan), Grimsby (loan) and Tranmere before ending in the summer of 2004 back at Huddersfield.

In addition, he spent just under two years at Swindon between March 1998 and January 2000, scoring 25 goals in 81 games, and returned to the County Ground in October 2004 as Youth Development Officer.

Onuora was given further responsibilities as coach in the close season, in a backroom staff that included Ian Woan and Alan Reeves before a run of five successive defeats led to King's departure in September.

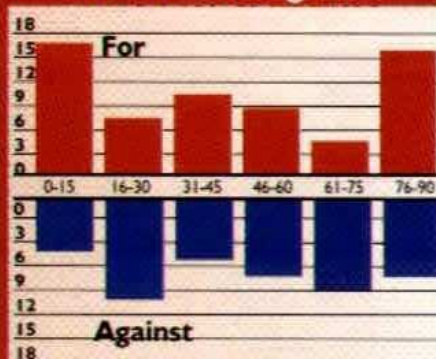

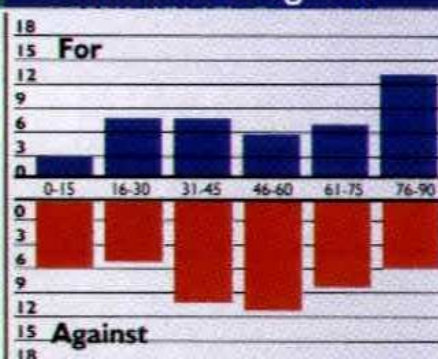

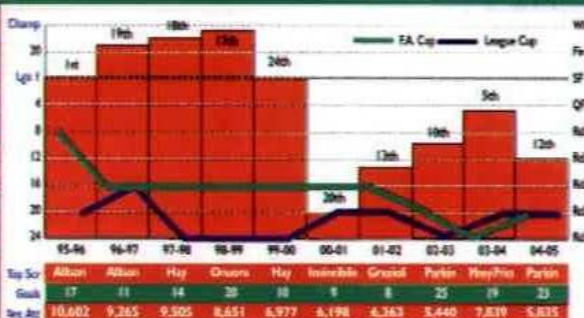

There was more trouble for City when defender Osei Sankofa was sent off for bundling over Hameur Bouazza and Dave Partridge had to leave the field on a stretcher. Rory Fallon piled on the misery by netting the winner on 31 minutes to give bottom club Swindon their first victory in 11 games.

## Back in business

### FORMER CITY WINGER AARON BROWN

admits it will feel strange running out against his former club at Ashton Gate this afternoon.

But he insists he will be doing all he can to help the cause of local rivals Swindon Town who need to win today to avoid relegation to League Two.

The last time the 26-year-old Bristolian took part in a League game at City's home ground was on Friday 12th March 2004. It proved to be his last game for the club.

Aaron broke his leg in a challenge with Rushden & Diamonds defender Marcus Bignot, an injury which led to a frustrating year on the sidelines.

He recalls: "We were both running for the ball towards the byeline. I remember stretching my leg for the ball, but got my studs caught in the turf and I rolled over my ankle. I knew straight away something was wrong.

"It was very frustrating for me because I felt I was playing well at the time and couldn't be involved as City went on to reach the play-off final."

Aaron – who first joined City's youth development scheme at a tender age, before going on to make his debut under Benny Lennartsson in December 1998 – left the club in the summer of 2004 to join Queens Park Rangers after making 191 appearances and picking up a LDV Vans Trophy winners medal in 2003.

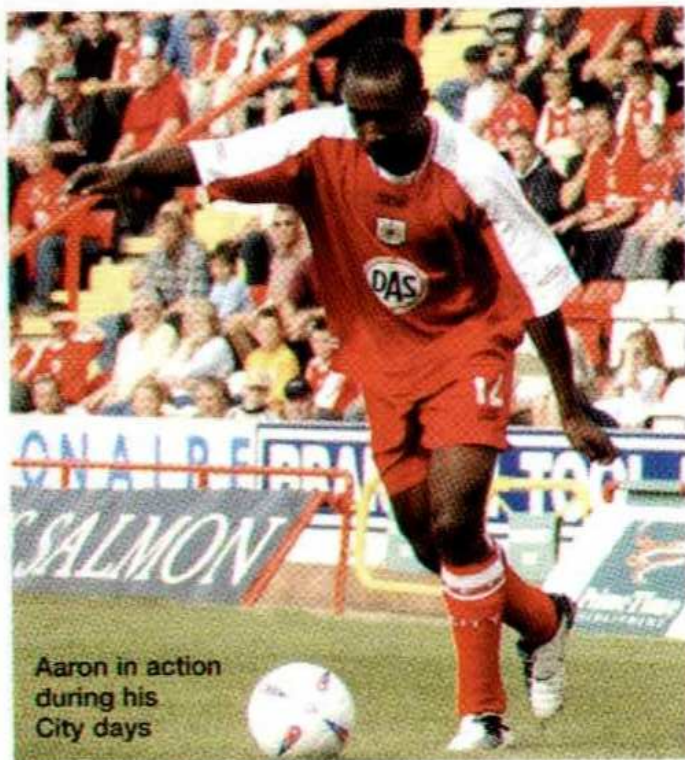
Still recovering from his broken leg he was not to play a senior game of football until March 2005 whilst on loan with Torquay. Despite playing briefly for QPR at the start of this season he went on loan to Cheltenham before a similar deal with Swindon was made permanent in January.

He says: "I have signed an 18-month deal and feel much more settled now.

"I have got a run of games under my belt and have been happy with my form."

Despite Swindon's difficult position, Aaron, who scored from a free kick during last week's 3-1 defeat by Brentford, says he is looking forward to playing a part in today's derby.

"Although I have played for Swindon reserves

here, it will probably feel strange playing for the visitors in a big game.

"But the City team is quite different to the one I was involved in – in fact with Lee Peacock and Christian Roberts at Swindon there will be just as many of my old team-mates in the away dressing room!

"Both teams need to win and that will make it a good game to be involved in.

"City have been performing well recently so it is probably not a good time to play them, but we will be doing all we can to make sure we still have a chance of staying up."

Aaron has not entirely severed his family ties with City. Although younger brother Marvin is now playing for Weston-super-Mare, the youngest of the Brown siblings Cameron is currently a member of City's under-14 squad.

"He's coming up fast but I wouldn't want to put too much pressure on him. I just hope he enjoys his football. I know from experience how quickly things can change."

from Newcastle United, making his debut in defence and earned glowing praise from manager Denis Smith.

But it was the quality of the attacking football that caught the eye. When Russell Osman headed clear for City on 32 minutes Hazzard controlled the ball in an instant and produced a pinpoint pass for Craig Maskell to fire past Keith Welch.

Osman was also involved in City's equaliser a minute before the break. His long ball found Cole, who crossed for Gary Shelton to flick the ball beyond Nicky Hammond.

Inevitably, a Hoddle pass set up a Swindon goal on 57 minutes. Martin Scott hesitated fatally over whether to intercept it and allowed David Kerslake in behind him to cross for Nicky Summerbee to score.

This time the lead lasted only a minute as Dziekanowski's through ball found Rosenior, who beat Hammond with a low drive that zipped off the wet surface.

Both managers complained about poor defending afterwards, but that overlooked the attacking potential on display from both teams. Hazzard was a class act in Swindon's midfield, while Rosenior enjoyed one of his best games in a City shirt.

There was drama right to the last minute when Cole's pace took him clear to round Hammond, only for Swindon's defence to recover and crowd out the striker as he shot.

It seemed a fair result and a boost for both sides. But, while Swindon went on to promotion glory, City slumped to 18th by the following January and Smith was sacked after just ten months in charge.

## JACKI DZIEKANOWSKI

BORN: Warsaw, 30.9.62

SIGNED: £250,000 from Celtic in January 1992

Jacki Dziekanowski was a player idolised by Ashton Gate fans, but less popular with a number of City team-mates.

When the club were struggling for results there was a tendency for colleagues to criticise the Polish star's work-rate, or lack of it. Jacki was the first to admit that he didn't think it was his job to tackle.

"People expect me to run past opponents when I get the ball and I need to conserve

energy for that," he used to say. "There are nine other players in the team to defend."

How you rated Jacki depended on your response to that attitude. What no one could dispute was his ability, which at times made him look a cut above all around him.

Jimmy Lumsden was the manager who brought Jacki (real name Dariusz) to Ashton Gate when he paid Celtic £250,000 in January 1992.

The Scottish giants had coughed up £650,000 to recruit him from Legia Warsaw in July 1989 and he rewarded that investment by being their top scorer in 1989/90, netting four times against Partizan Belgrade in a European Cup Winners Cup tie.

For City, Jacki netted nine times in 50 starts. When Russell Osman replaced Denis Smith as manager with the club in relegation trouble, his priority was to shore up the defence and Jacki proved surplus to requirements.

City stayed up and the player capped 62 times by Poland was allowed to leave on a free transfer in September 1993. For many fans it was an unforgivable error by a manager who never achieved the same popularity.

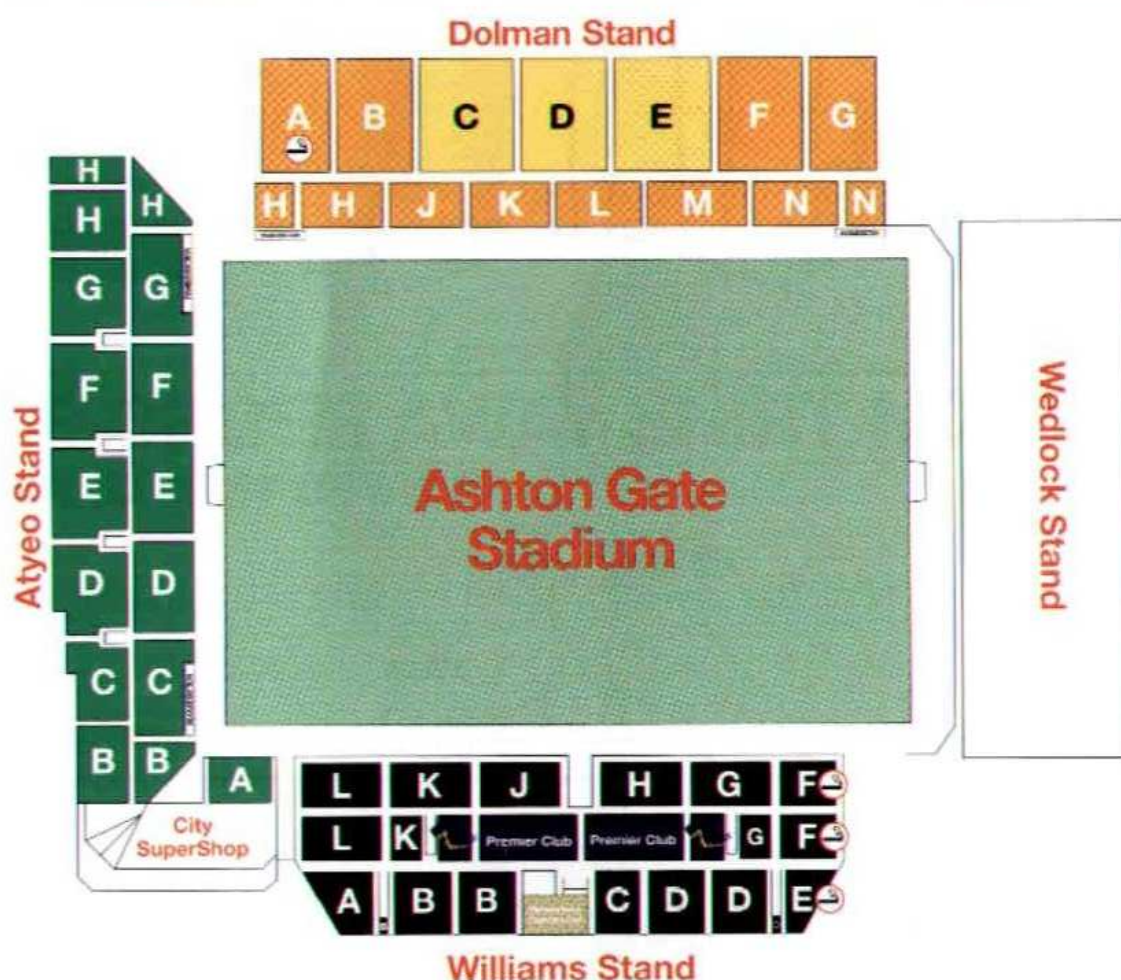
## 2006/07 smoking policy

# A new look for Ashton Gate stadium

THIS SUMMER WILL SEE A FRENZIED PERIOD of redevelopment and refurbishment around Ashton Gate Stadium.

The work will be carried out in three stages, financed entirely from income generated by the Premier Club.

First, a new seating deck will be built in the centre of the Williams Stand for use by Premier Club members. It should be completed in time for the Ronan Keating concert on June 24th.

The second component of work involves creating five-star, back-of-house facilities for the Premier Club. The Centenary Restaurant will be completely refurbished and the Atyeo Suite, which is being vacated by the Supporters Club, will be transformed into a modern Sports Lounge.

This will be the lounge bar for Premier Club members, who will also use the Centenary Restaurant; this facility will also be used on non-matchdays for conference, dinners and parties.

The third planned change involves the Dolman Exhibition Hall, an exciting initiative which will offer City fans some of the best facilities in the entire League.

This will see the floor levelled, lounge bar made into the new home for the Supporters Club, a new kitchen, full-sized kiosk, ceiling and lights put in, and the current bar doubled in length, with a new cellar. When finished the hall will hold 1,300-1,500 people.

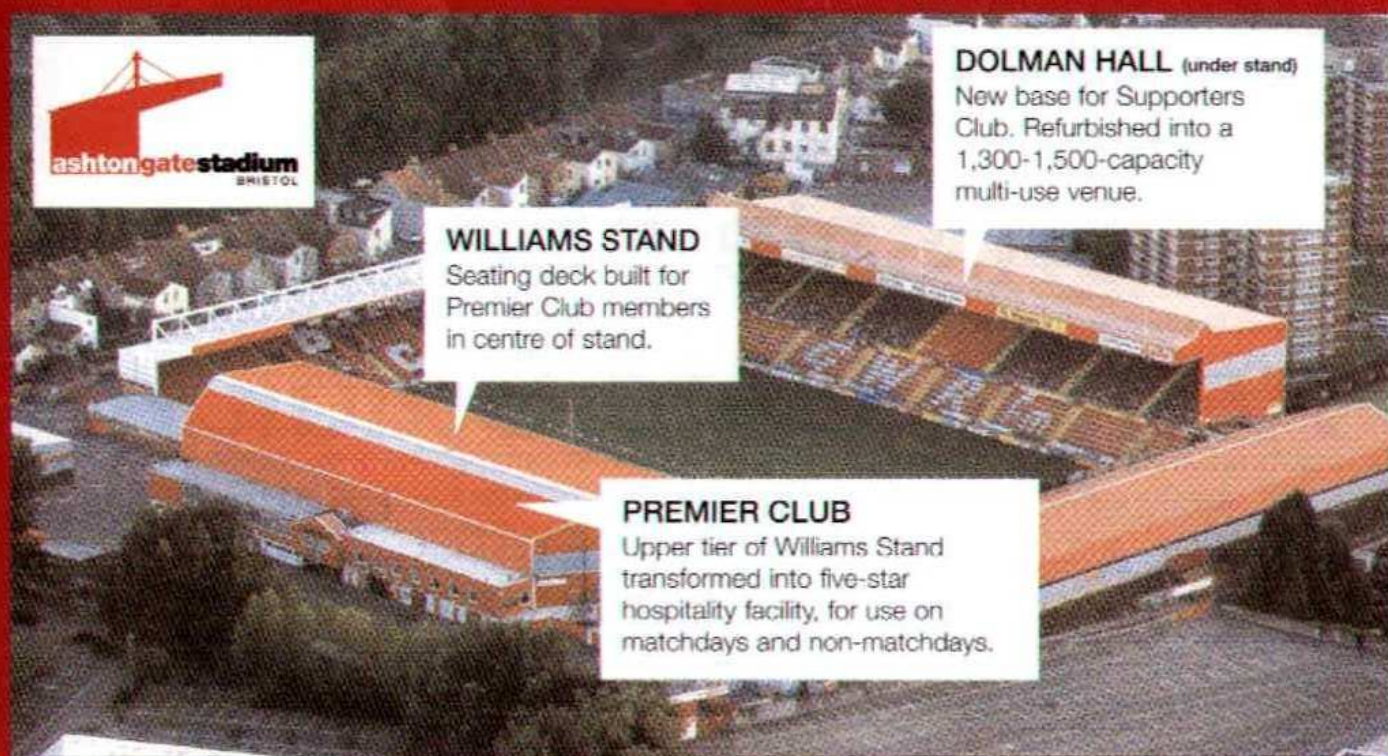
This work will start on May 19th and is scheduled to be completed by August 3rd.

A fourth phase of work, involving the installation of a new PA system, the replacement of wooden seats in the Dolman Stand and the improvement of toilet facilities on the upper deck of the Dolman Stand is also planned but is dependent on grant aid from the Football Foundation.

City chief executive Colin Sexstone says: "The first three phases will be financed by income from the Premier Club, which illustrates how important it is for the future of our club.

"The facilities created will greatly increase our potential for creating income from the stadium on non-matchdays, as well as directly benefiting both Premier Club members and supporters."

## Back to First Division after 65 years UP, THE CITY!

### Whitehead scores winner after three minutes

Bristol City 1, Portsmouth 0

BRISTOL CITY are back in the First Division after a break of 65 years, but they were made to fight all the way before clinching promotion with a 1-0 win over bottom-of-the-table Portsmouth at Ashton Gate last night.

It was an historical night and Bristol's biggest soccer occasion in 76 years since the City club reached the First Division for the first time in 1910.

A crowd of more than 27,000 had packed into Ashton Gate to see if City could get the result they needed.



THIRTY YEARS AGO THIS MONTH CITY fans were in ecstasy following promotion to the top flight of English football.

It was on April 20th 1976 that City beat Portsmouth at Ashton Gate to clinch runners-up spot behind Sunderland in the old Second Division.

Four seasons in what is now the Premiership were to follow, with the team fashioned by manager Alan Dicks enjoying victories over the likes of Arsenal and Liverpool along the way.

It was a Clive Whitehead goal after just three minutes which proved the winner against Portsmouth. A crowd of more than 27,000 had packed into Ashton Gate to see if City could get the result they needed.

In the final minutes hundreds of spectators began to encroach towards the touchlines ready to mob their heroes when referee John Homewood blew the final whistle.



It took some City players ten minutes to reach the dressing room. They then emerged in what is now the Williams Stand to salute thousands of supporters on the pitch.

Many long standing fans were shedding tears of joy. It was 65 years since City had played at the top level of English football and the celebrations went on long into the night.

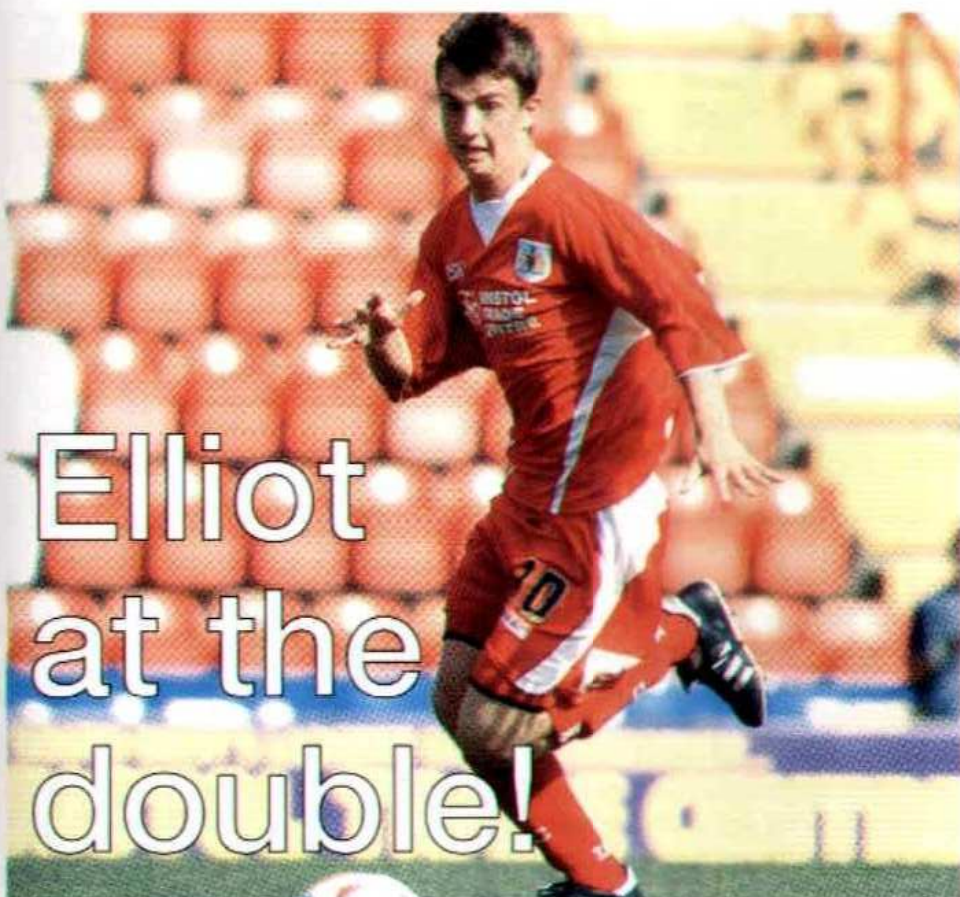

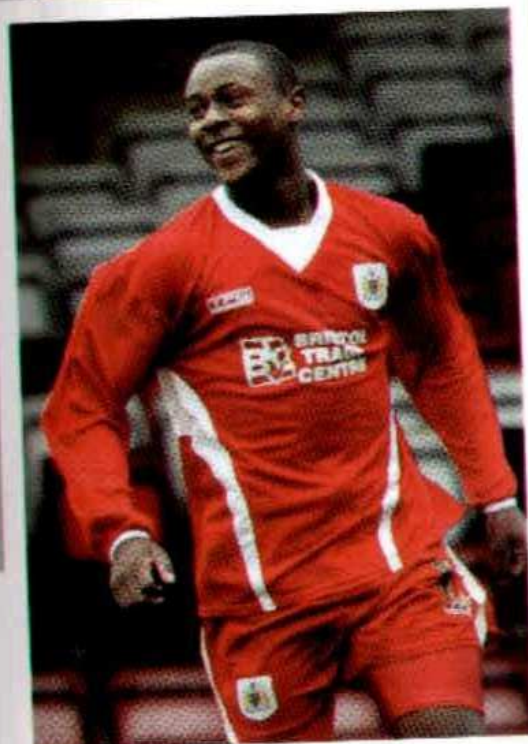

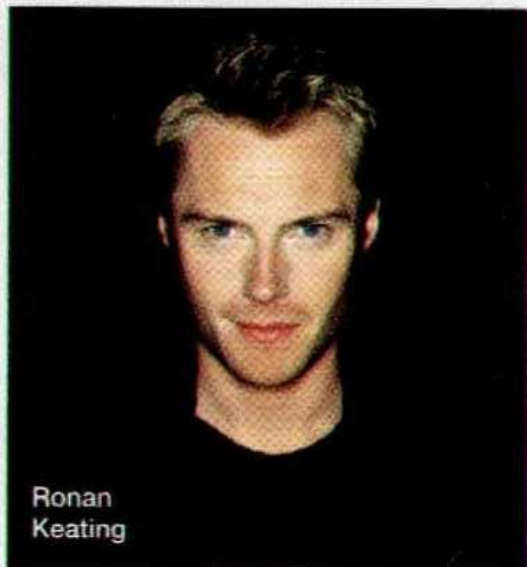

# SUPPORTERS CLUB



## Gary – in his words

**WE WERE DELIGHTED WHEN GARY Johnson took a break from his hectic schedule, to allow Supporters Club chairman Alan Robinson the chance to put questions that give our members an insight into his thoughts on his first season at the helm, and his hopes for the future.**

**Alan Robinson:** How do you feel this season has gone, and are you happy with the progress made?

**Gary Johnson:** I am happy because, when I first came to Ashton Gate, I promised we'd get ourselves out of trouble, and we've certainly done that. In fact, I'd say we have improved sufficiently to finish the season strongly.

**AR:** What would consider success to be next season?

**GJ:** The only success under consideration is promotion – that's how we need to think at the start the season and achievement of that goal is how we should end. We cannot start the season by aspiring to reach the play-offs or at least to avoid relegation. Instead we will be aiming to win the Championship.

**AR:** How short in terms of players do you think City are from producing a promotion winning side?

**GJ:** I think several of the players already at the club have improved sufficiently to play a part in this club's success in the future. Of course, we're going to need to add to our squad, which is rather too small as it

stands. We've added five or six lads into the lower end of the professional scale, because you always need potential and we can then blood them in as and when required. We also need four or five quality first-team players to add to the competition and quality we've already got.

**AR:** Thanks Gary, now a light-hearted question. If you were in Jose Mourinho's position and had unlimited funds, which three current Premiership players would you sign for City?

**GJ:** I think they'd struggle to get into our side at the moment! 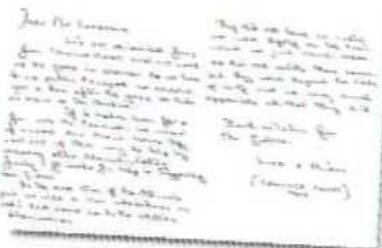
## Praise for fans
