Steve Brown, Wycombe Wanderers Assistant Manager, shares his views with us

Good evening and welcome to Dennis Wise, his assistant Gus Poyet and the silent assassin in the background Paul Ince. Also the players and supporters from Swindon Town.

What a fantastic evening at Fulham last Wednesday, to play away against a Premiership side and record a 2-1 win during 90 minutes was superb. Two great goals by our inform striking partnership, Jermaine Easter and Tommy Mooney saw us lead 2-0 at half time. After conceding two minutes into the second half the team regrouped to complete the job and take us into the third round for the first time in the club's history. There were some outstanding performances on the night and it would be unfair to name individuals as the whole team were excellent. What made it an even better result was the five players that were missing have been regular starters for the first team this season.

Having arrived at the ground very early on Saturday we waited for the Third Round draw and when Charlie Nicholas, also a former Celtic man, pulled out number 32 I was delighted

The Lincoln game on Saturday seemed to be a game too far with the small squad we have with injuries being a major factor on the day. After the game at Craven Cottage played with an intensity that was not familiar to League 2 the recovery period was not sufficient and it took its toll in the second half on a sun soaked afternoon where the pitchside temperature was 85 degrees. Two goals from ex Wanderer Mark Stallard put an end to our eight match winning sequence going down 3-1.

The first cup draw last Saturday was the Johnstone's Paints Trophy which replaces the LDV Vans Trophy. The competition comes with a new set of rules, one is that teams are required to play six players that have appeared

in the previous twelve matches. The draw has paired us with this evening's visitors Swindon Town and will take place here in just over three weeks time on Tuesday 17th October, kick off 7.45pm.

There was some good news last week when Matt Bloomfield signed a new two year deal for the club. Matt is a real asset to Wycombe Wanderers as his performances reflect and we are pleased he has committed himself to a new deal.

Thanks to our fans, you have been terrific in all the games, please keep it going its so important to get behind the team.

Finally I would like to thank the three people that played with me at the Wycombe Wanderers Golf Day. Terry Evans Steve Hayes and Keith Ryan, this four ball would have graced any Ryder Cup Team (needless to say we won the title) who were also worthy winners for the third consecutive time and played some outstanding golf.

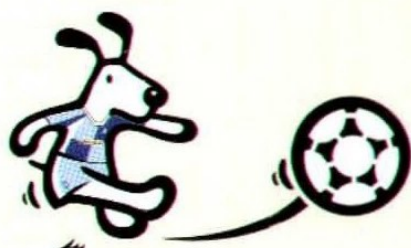

HOSPICE AT HOME

Wycombe Wanderers Football Club (WWFC) have announced that it has chosen the Iain Rennie Hospice at Home (IRHH) as its first ever Charity of the Year at a Launch Event at Adams Park on Tuesday 26th September. IRHH patron and WWFC supporter and commentator, Bill Turnbull from BBC Breakfast, formally announced the partnership and unveiled some of the plans for an exciting fundraising year.

This is the first time that Wycombe Wanderers have adopted a Charity of the Year and the Iain Rennie Hospice at Home is delighted to have been selected. IRHH Appeals & Communications Director, Robert Breakwell, said, "The news that Wycombe Wanderers have chosen to support us is very exciting and has come at a really good

time for us. This will be a unique partnership between two organisations that both play an important part in the life of our communities. The IRHH's Emergency Appeal to raise an additional £200,000 has just been launched and we are sure that working with the Club over the next year will give our fundraising a very welcome boost. Everyone is really thrilled by the news and the nine nurses in our Wycombe Nursing team are looking forward to meeting the team and getting involved with the Club."

Plans for a number of fundraising activities are taking shape. A WWFC Parachute Jump Day, Celebrity Football and Cricket Matches, a Sports Dinner and Auction, a WWFC London Marathon Team, guest appearances by WWFC players at IRHH events and Hospice Shops as well as bucket collections at the ground are all under consideration.

The Iain Rennie Hospice at Home's local Fundraising Groups based in High Wycombe and Beaconsfield are also pledging their support for the year of fundraising which will run until the end of

December 2007.

"More than 7,000 terminally ill patients have been cared for by Iain Rennie nurses since the service began in 1985," said Robert Breakwell. "We know that many families who support Wycombe Wanderers will have been helped by our nurses over the years and we hope that everyone at WWFC will help us to have a great year. Everyone at the Club has been extremely positive and encouraging and we just hope to make a great success out of the opportunity to work alongside our local Football Club."

The Iain Rennie Hospice at Home provides specialist nursing care for patients in the Chilterns area of Hertfordshire and Buckinghamshire with a terminal or life-threatening illness. Iain Rennie nurses offer a 24 hour on-call service to anyone living with a terminal illness who wishes to be cared for in their own home and the service is offered free of charge to patients and families. Iain Rennie Nurses cared for a total of 792 patients in the year to 31st March 2006.



Wycombe Wanderers Football Club plays a key role in the High Wycombe and surrounding district community. The board of directors and the club's employees felt that the club would be well placed to provide its facilities and support to a local charity for the purpose of raising the charity's profile within

the local community and to assist with increased fund raising activities to help meet the chosen charity's financial needs.

Locally based charities were invited to apply to become the club's Charity of the Year. Around 20 charities submitted applications for consideration by the club and all were

very deserving causes. A selection panel, which included individuals from the club and representatives from the club's Supporters Trust and Founders Trust, evaluated each of the received applications and had the very difficult task of selecting a charity to become the club's Charity of the Year for 2007.

Wycombe Wanderers Website Manager, Matt Beadle tells the tale on the opposition

Who would have thought in our previous encounter with Swindon Town that the next time we played the Robins they'd have Premiership superstars Dennis Wise, Gus Poyet and Paul Ince all amongst their staff?

Mind you, it's equally unlikely that anyone expected Wycombe to be managed by a former Champions League winner in Paul Lambert. Life is indeed full of surprises and this all comes at a time when the Scissor Sisters have reached Number 1 in the music charts...and with a song entitled 'I Don't feel Like Dancin'. Neither do we Jake and co, and certainly not with you.

But that's all by the by – we were talking about Wise, Poyet and Ince. The manager in Wise perhaps isn't a great shock seeing as he was always in the market for a new club following a relatively successful stint at Millwall a few years back. The lure of League Two has always proved to be appealing for some high profile ex-players too down the years. Names such as Ian Rush, Mark Wright and Tony Adams spring to mind but whereas the former Blues boss struggled to adapt to the lower echelons of the Football League, Wise admitted upon taking the job that it 'won't phase me'.

Poyet was a surprise. Here is a man

once of River Plate, Real Zaragoza and Chelsea who now finds himself preparing for a trip to Accrington Stanley and Torquay United. It's a measure of how, after the Coca-Cola rebranding episode, the Football League and their 'booming' media outlet FLI are desperately trying to expand the bodies profile throughout eh Football World.

Both men have stated that they will put themselves up for selection, an announcement that's enough to strike fear into any team this season. Even clubs as high as the Championship would admit that the thought of Wise and Poyet back together again in the middle of the park wasn't the most pleasant of surprises, even if the manager did recently state that they'd struggle to get into the team after such a good start to the season.

Not only that but with Ince there to back them up it borders on ridiculous, or at least you would think so. All three have appeared in FA Cup finals, all three have represented their country and all three are very good players. Having said that Ince has now played four times for the club, two of which culminated in their only defeats of the season so far.

The second of those against Peterborough last week saw Swindon leapfrogged by the Blues at the top of

League Two. Prior to that maximum points from an emphatic August handed a double scoop to the club with Wise awarded Manager of the Month and striker Cristian Roberts winning the respective Player award. Interestingly Roberts dedicated the accolade to ex-boss Iffy Onuora following his support when the 26 year old was treated for alcohol addiction last term. He said, "I'd like to thank Iffy for standing by me, when others might have chosen to rid themselves of the problem." Nice touch and a comment that supports the argument about Iffy who some said he was simply 'too nice' to be a successful manager.

For all the positives to come out of the County Ground so far this season, the club was struck a major scare when five officials were seriously injured in a plane crash that landed on Denham Golf Course in early August. Fortunately there were no casualties in the accident and all passengers are expected to make a full recovery. Included amongst them was Mike Sullivan, a former Sales and Marketing manager at Adams Park who occasionally returns to assist in Sporting Dinners throughout the year. After sustaining broken arms and ribs, we continue to wish Mike all the best in his recovery and hope to see him back soon.



IN CHARGE

Dennis Wise

For the first time in his career Dennis Wise has found himself outside of the top two divisions with Swindon Town but it's not something he's worried about. Upon taking the job Wise, who turns 40 in December, admitted that he still has a lot to learn in management and that the County Ground is the perfect place for him to start.

"I think it's only right that we do it from the bottom and work our way up. It will make you a better person. It would have been easy for me to take the other job," he says, referring to one of the many offers he received after leaving Coventry City at the end of last season.

His time at the Ricoh Arena marked the

sixth club he had played for following two spells with Southampton - the place where it all began - Wimbledon, Chelsea, Leicester and Millwall.

The last of those was where he gained his first taste of management, taking over from Mark McGhee in October 2003. In just short of two years Wise led the Lions to an FA Cup final and then subsequently into Europe but when a failure to see eye to eye with Chairman Jeff Burnage got in the way, he concentrated again on his playing days.

And up to now it's been the 'on pitch' Dennis Wise that people can familiarise with. He'd probably be the first to admit that he's never been far from trouble,

and was probably one of the most aptly labelled members of Wimbeldon's 'Crazy Gang' which stormed into the old First Division during the late 80's and shocked everyone by nabbing the FA Cup from Liverpool in 1988.

His passion and tenacity then earned him a £1.6million move to Chelsea two years later and Wise went on to become one of the Blues' most celebrated players, holding an English mantle in midfield despite the influx of foreigners into the club.

Dennis has also won 21 caps for England and has played in a major finals, appearing in all three matches at Euro 2000.

Adrian Wood singles out Lee Peacock – the Robins' much experienced front man

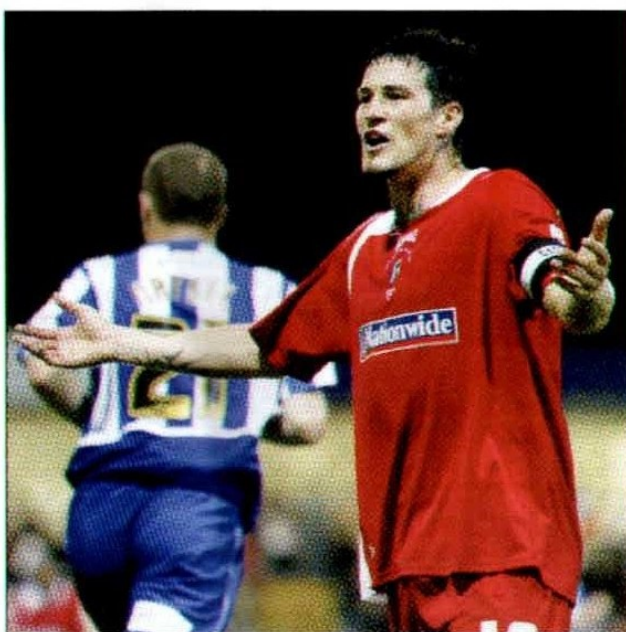
This evening's profile is of another of League 2's most experienced and respected strikers – Town's 29-year old **Lee Peacock**. A former Scotland Under-21 international, Peacock made his senior debut 13 seasons ago. In a career that has seen him serve six different clubs, he is approaching his 400th FL appearance and last season became a member of that select group who have netted 100 League goals.

Early days at Carlisle

Born in Paisley, Peacock joined Carlisle United as a trainee and soon progressed through the ranks. He made his FL debut in Div 3 back in season 1993/94 and established himself in the Carlisle first team over the next few seasons. He played a key role with nine goals as the Cumbrians won promotion from Div 3 in 1997 winning the Auto Windscreens Shield the same season. His work rate and powerful build made him a strong runner who made his presence felt in opponents' penalty areas. Already a Scottish Youth International, he won an Under-21 cap against Belarus. In Oct'97 he moved to Div 3 side Mansfield Town in a £90,000 deal. He must have wondered what he let himself in for as he found himself two months wages out of pocket during a financial crisis at Field Mill.

Big money moves

It all came good however for Peacock in 1998/99. Now fully fit, his strength, power and enthusiasm helped the Stags to a healthy 8th position. Peacock claimed 17 league goals including a hat trick against Barnet – in the first game to be played with the new fluorescent ball. He then netted 7 in just 12 appearances in 1999/2000, before his chance came with Manchester City. Peacock had been



high on City boss Joe Royle's wanted list since his two goals against City in an Auto Windscreens Cup tie in Dec'98. Despite interest from QPR and Bristol City, Peacock moved to Maine Road for a £500,000 fee in Oct'99. City won promotion to the Premiership that season but Peacock, hampered by injuries, managed just eight appearances in a sky blue shirt. With the arrivals at Maine Road of George Weah and Paulo Wanchope, he soon realised his first team opportunities were restricted. In August 2000 he accepted an offer to join 2nd division Bristol City with a £600,000 transfer fee being agreed.

Consistent goal scoring

In four full seasons at Ashton gate, Peacock netted 54 Div 2 goals in 144 appearances – his season's tally always being in double figures. Despite winning the LDV Vans Trophy in 2003, he was unable to assist the Robins to promotion – despite finishing 3rd in both 2003 and in 2004. In July 2004 Peacock moved north to Sheffield Wednesday signing a two-year deal. He was unlucky with a series of niggling injuries but still played an important role in the Owls reaching the League 1 play-offs. He netted against Brentford in the semi

final and featured in the 4-2 victory over Hartlepool at the Millennium Stadium as the Owls achieved promotion.

Arriving at the County Ground

Last season Peacock was a regular in the Owls line-up in the first half of the season but when Paul Sturrock confirmed his contract would not be renewed, he moved to Swindon in Jan'06. He scored on his debut against Bournemouth and, always offering 100% and using his height to good advantage, he soon became popular with the

Town fans. Injuries however again restricted his opportunities and he was eventually forced to have knee surgery.

Enjoying his game

Instantly recognisable by his ever increasing series of tattoos – Peacock recently commented about the new regime at Swindon under Dennis Wise and Gus Poyet. "Pre season was a nightmare, but Wisey and Gus led by example and it pushed me to work as hard as I possibly could. You notice it more in the last 10 minutes of a game – we look fit and give very little away. I can honestly say that it's the first time I've truly enjoyed football in about five years. I'm one of the first ones out there and one of the last off the training pitch every day. I feel I'm learning things and improving day to day. I feel like a totally different person. There is a sense of direction, a great set of lads, and there's a real buzz. We've set our own standards now and that's to win every game. I know I've got another two years left on my contract but I want another one – I want to stay here". Peacock's three goals to date have helped Town's excellent start – he would love to add to that tally this evening.

A giant in goal at 6' 7", Brezovan signed on a year's loan from Czech club FC Brno in the summer of 2006. Brezovan became a fans favourite after performing heroics on his competitive display against Hartlepool United on his debut, saving two penalties from Porter and Humphreys to earn Town all three points.



JACK SMITH

Position: Defender

Previous clubs: Watford

Signed from Watford in the summer of 2005, Smith added youthful experience to the Town side.

Due to the departure of Paul Robinson to West Bromwich Albion he was thrust into first-team spotlight at Watford and coped admirably, registering two goals – the first of which a 'Goal of the Season' contender at Sheffield United in front of the Sky Sports cameras.

He made 38 league starts for Town last season in a variety of positions including right back, left back and midfield. This term he will be looking to consolidate his favoured spot in the right of defence.

JAMIE VINCENT

D.O.B 18/06/1975 • Height: 5' 10"

Position: Defender

Previous clubs: Crystal Palace, AFC Bournemouth, Huddersfield Town, Portsmouth, Walsall (I), Derby County, Millwall, Yeovil Town

Jamie arrives at the County Ground hoping to make the left back slot his own.

Vincent began his career as a trainee at Palace before a switch to the south coast at Bournemouth, where he made over 100 appearances between 1996 and 1999. He then made a £500,000 move to Huddersfield before an even bigger £800,000 deal saw him join Portsmouth.

Spells at Derby County and Millwall followed before he signed a one-year deal with Town in July.

JEREL IFIL

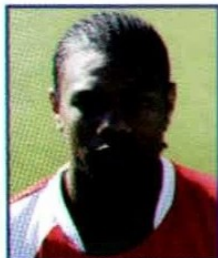

Named on-field Captain by manager Dennis Wise in mid-July, Ady Williams brings with him a wealth of footballing experience. Signed from Coventry City in pre-season, the former Welsh international boasts successful spells with Wolves and Reading on his CV and has just the credentials that could set Town on their way to League Two success this season.

GARETH WHALLEY

D.O.B 19/12/1973 • Height: 5' 10"

Position: Midfielder

Previous clubs: Crewe Alexandra, Bradford City, Cardiff City, Wigan Athletic

Signed from Wigan Athletic on a free transfer in July 2005, Gareth settled well into the side making 27 appearances last season but missed the start of the current campaign after needing an ankle operation in July.

A trainee with Crewe, he made over 200 appearances at Gresty Road before signing for Bradford City for whom he spent two-seasons playing Premiership football. After a brief return to Crewe on loan he joined Cardiff before moving on again to Wigan where he helped the Latics attain Premiership status with promotion from the Championship.

AARON BROWN

D.O.B 14/03/1980 • Height: 5' 10"

Position: Midfielder

Previous clubs: Bristol City, Exeter City (loan), QPR, Torquay United (loan), Cheltenham Town (loan)

Brown began the current season looking to play his way back into the managers plans after submitting a summer transfer request before possible moves to Brentford and Doncaster both fell flat leaving him still at the County Ground.

The left sided midfielder began his career at Bristol City, where he progressed through the ranks to make a total of 135 appearances. A move to QPR followed, but after just one start for the London club an initial loan spell at Swindon was followed up with a permanent move to the club in January.

CHRISTIAN ROBERTS

D.O.B 22/10/1979 • Height: 5' 11"

Position: Striker

Previous clubs: Cardiff City, Hereford United (loan), Drogheda (loan), Exeter City (loan), Bristol City

Cardiff born striker who joined Town in October 2004 in a £50,000 switch from rivals Bristol City.

An aggressive front runner he adds real pace

to the Robins front line. Formerly with Exeter for whom he had a good scoring record he had scored 6 goals in 22 starts for Swindon prior to this season.

D.O.B 25/01/1985 • Height: 5' 10"

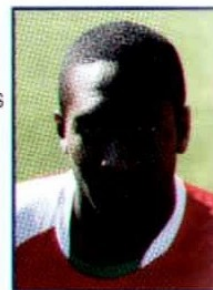

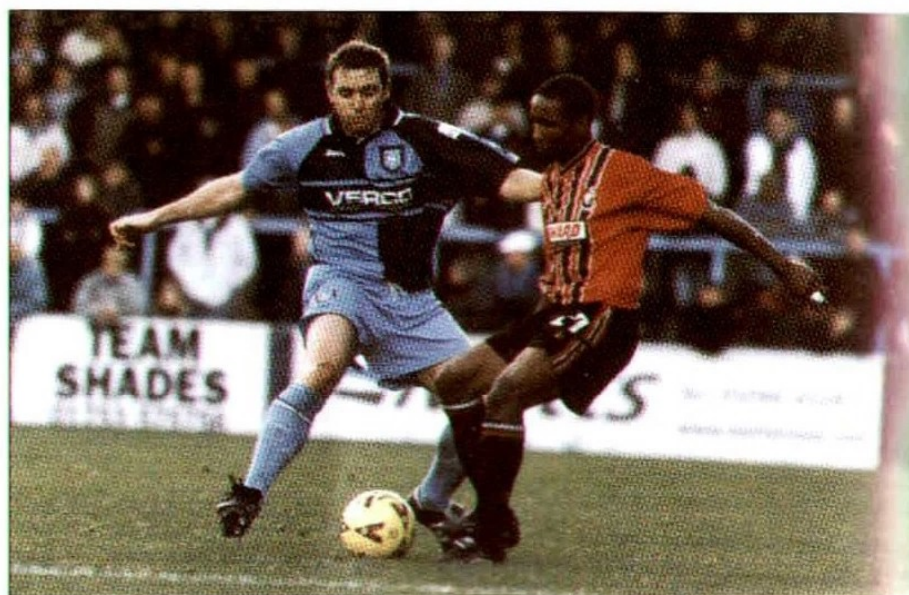
WHO?

Jermain Defoe

The diminutive striker actually began his career on the books of Charlton Athletic but was controversially snapped up by West Ham United in 1999. He made just two appearances for the Upton Park side during the 2000-01 season, scoring on his debut in the 1-0 League Cup victory over Walsall. Instead he was sent out on loan to gain first team experience on the south coast with Bournemouth, thanks to Hammers manager Harry Redknapp's connections with the club. While at Dean Court Defoe set about breaking the record for scoring in consecutive matches, hitting 12 goals over his first 10 matches in the third tier. When he arrived at Adams Park he was halfway through his sensational streak, having already hit four goals in his first three games.

WHEN?

Wycombe welcomed Bournemouth to Adams Park following up a hard-fought



draw away at Colchester United the week before. However, it was to be a miserable afternoon as 18-year-old Defoe lit up the park and guided his side to a convincing win. Carl Fletcher had given the visitors the lead in the first half but it was Defoe's solo strike after an hour of play that was the highlight of the game – and a clear indication of the bright future that lay ahead. Receiving the ball at his feet the youngster's pace took him into position on the left and his shot was fired in beyond a helpless Martin Taylor. The dismal day was completed in the 90th minute when Fletcher got his second with a powerful strike to condemn Wycombe to their heaviest defeat in almost a year.

WHAT HAPPENED NEXT?

Defoe finished the season with 18 goals for The Cherries, still

his best seasonal tally. After making his name during his spell in Dorset he returned to the East End of London and established himself in the West Ham first team. Over the next three seasons he netted 29 goals for the claret and blues and was regularly linked with a transfer to Manchester United or Arsenal, his boyhood heroes. However, it was Tottenham Hotspur who finally got him to put pen to paper and he switched to White Hart Lane in 2003. Despite his natural talent and eye for goal he has struggled to hold down a regular first team place with the North London side, consequently he missed the final cut for England's squads at Euro 2004 and World Cup 2006. Following the appointment of Steve McClaren he has returned to the England fold, hitting a goal in the recent qualifier with Andorra.

Complaints

Complaints – not something we all enjoy receiving but, especially when you work for a football club, they're unfortunately part and parcel of the package.

Personally I think people are too quick to notice what hasn't been done rather than applaud you for what is already there and what they assume to simply be the norm. It's the most minor errors which, granted, maybe shouldn't occur in the first place, that are picked up on rather than the hours people spend dedicating themselves to a job that really only gives them personal reward more than anything else.

Results from the recent supporter survey were brought to our attention a couple of weeks ago and within that were a number of comments, some positive and some negative. Naturally, it's the negative shouts that tend to hit you harder because for all the praise you might get, knowing that some people aren't satisfied with what you do encourages you to prove them wrong. Maybe it is just a small band of supporters that vent their views – not in the most sincere way it has to be said – but nevertheless if someone isn't happy with a service they're ultimately paying for then you can't just ignore it.

I've always been of the view that it's the eleven men on the pitch that matter most. Along with them, the five subs in the dugout and the management, if success occurs on the playing side of the club then everything else should fall into place. They take priority and in terms of the Official Website that has been the case in recent months, or at least we'd like to think so. As a supporter I know my main port of call is the team – injuries, suspensions, interviews and quotes. If this isn't the case then please let us know. There's a new feedback section on the site now which invites you to air your views – they won't be ignored.

Marketing and PR

Marketing and PR is important. The club needs to sell itself and bring in the revenue that keeps it afloat as well as boosting its reputation amongst the town, something that has perhaps been lost since the early 1990's. It's interesting to look back at some of the old Season Review videos that were produced back then and how the Valley Terrace was packed to the rafters for midweek Conference encounters against the likes of Dagenham & Redbridge and Bath City. Over ten years down the line, following promotion to the Football League and an FA Cup semi final, and we're struggling to attract 6,000 fans to a League Two fixture. Our attendances towards the end of last season are a case in point. On April 15th 1993, with the club on course for promotion from the Football League, a 6,220 capacity crowd crammed into Adams Park for a midweek game with Runcorn. At the same stage last campaign, with the club on course for promotion to League One, 5750 passed through the gates at a now 10,000 capacity at Adams Park.

One quibble about the website was that the reporting of news was slow. In terms of match reports and general information throughout the week, I'd beg to differ. However, where perhaps the argument may come from is the lack of speculative reporting that appears on the site. Speculation is a huge part of football and everyone, everyday, either hears or reads something that provides the much needed 'gossip' for the afternoon at work. If more leeway was given as to what could be reported on the site then maybe you would see more of a tabloid approach to wwfc.com but at present, club policy does and will probably always prevent that. But it's not a bad thing. After years of implementing it

now (and constantly referring to it in articles such as this one) it's hoped that fans understand and recognise that once news appears on the site then it is 100 per cent official. Other publications are likely to have already approached the subject and that is where the problem lies. 'If it's on SkySports or BBC then why isn't on our site?' we hear you cry. Most of the time it's because, whether it be regarding a player, a deal hasn't yet been finalised. Take Jabo Ibehre for example. It looked almost certain that we were going to sign him only for the poor lad to believe that the world revolved around him and as a result make a u-turn and waste everyone's time in the process. After knowing of the potential signing the previous day, we could have revealed all. However, that's not common practice for a football club, not for Wycombe Wanderers anyway. As it turns out, Mark McGhee broke the news to some Brighton newspaper – a gesture which wasn't appreciated to say the least. It made Leyton Orient look unprofessional and it made us look like we were withholding information from the fans. Eventually we produced what we'd planned to do from the outset and that was to speak to Paul Lambert after the event. It made for a very interesting article both on the flat site and Wanderers World which hopefully you enjoyed.

Speaking of Wanderers World, it's now been worked out that the service is available for just 10p a day. I'm no salesman (and never, ever want to be one) but that doesn't seem to be too bad. With match highlights, exclusive interviews and a searchable video archive that stretches back over five seasons (yes, I'm reading off the script) it's worth taking a look.

1906-07 100 YEARS AGO

On Saturday 29th September 1906 the Wanderers played only their second league fixture of the season. Because of other teams involvement in the F.A. Cup, F.A. Amateur Cup and County Cup competitions they had played friendly matches for the past three weeks. Now they had their first away trip of the season to Hastings & St. Leonards on the Sussex coast.

Hastings had lost the opening game against Fulham and then inflicted the first defeat of season on the Blues by winning 3-0 at a canter.

All three goals were scored in a first half totally dominated by the home side. Centre forward Rigate was the chief architect for Hastings and scored after six minutes. Although Wycombe did create the odd chance in front of goal their shooting left room for considerable improvement. With twenty two minutes gone Wilson scored a second for the home side and then Rigate got the third four minutes later. It looked as if it could be worse when stand-in Wanderers left back Youens handled in the area. Full credit must be given to Collier (*right*) in the Wycombe goal who pulled off a fine save and it was no less than Wanderers deserved.



After a fighting display in the second half Wycombe did very well to come away with just a three goal defeat. Circumstances had prevailed to rob them of four key players on the Friday and it was with great credit they came through the ordeal as well as expected. Hastings & St. Leonards were a semi-professional side at the time with far greater resources that enabled them to compete against the full time professional sides.

World News: In Paris on 29th September the first international hot-air balloon race set off. In the US President Taft declared himself provisional governor of Cuba after rebel forces attacked the government of the Caribbean island.

1931-32 SEVENTY FIVE YEARS AGO

On Saturday 26th September 1931 the club arranged a very attractive friendly against Metropolitan Police. The Wanderers had knocked the Police out of the Amateur Cup the previous season at the quarter final stage after a terrific replay at Loakes Park. The Police were virtually unchanged from the previous season and so a crowd of 2,000 plus turned out to witness another pulsating game.

Wycombe proved to be the better side in the first 45 minutes and deservedly led 3-1 at half time. The Wanderers had rested three players, centre half Pat Badrick and two inside forwards Dick Braisher and George Tapping. They were replaced by the Stone brothers from Sonning Common, Len and Walter and Jim Munday came in for Badrick at centre half. Walter Stone had a good game scoring twice, either side of a Bill Brown header to leave the home side looking comfortable at half time.

However, so often the phrase 'a game of two halves' is used to describe a match of changing fortunes. It certainly applied here as Met Police forced the running in the second half. A mixture of fine goalkeeping by Jim Kipping (*right*) and good defending, poor finishing and a stroke of luck saw Wycombe hang on to win 3-2 after former Blue Doug Vernon converted a penalty. Vernon scored for the Police in the first half and the tussle between him and Dickie Cox throughout was enthralling.

World News: On September 30th in London police were out in force to dispel riots after demonstrations protesting against the Governments austerity programme. In Copenhagen Denmark abandoned the Gold Standard to be followed by Norway, Sweden and Egypt.

1956-57 FIFTY YEARS AGO

With three goals in the opening fifteen minutes Wycombe Wanderers had 5,000 supporters jumping for joy on Saturday 29th September 1956 against Kingstonian.

Sadly the high glee turned to gloom for the crowd as Wanderers attempted to gild the lily and lost their early spontaneity.

It all began when Jack Tomlin fired in a 20 yard drive in the opening seconds that Banks, in the K's goal, reached with an acrobatic leap across his goal. With the visitors goal under constant pressure in the first ten minutes it was Cliff Trott (right) that struck first. Two goals in as many minutes - the first after a sparkling move between Smith, Tomlin and Bates, and the second from a shrewd pass by Tomlin. Five minutes later Trott took the paint off the crossbar with a scintillating drive, Bates seized on the rebound and cleverly hooked it over his head into the net. Out of nowhere Coates accepted a pass from Vernon to stop the rot with a surprise goal for the visitors. It was the signal for Kingstonian to enjoy their best spell of the game. Playing with renewed confidence they gave the home side some anxious moments and threatened to reduce the arrears to a situation of parity. The half closed with Wanderers keeper Dennis Syrett making two fine saves to preserve the Wanderers 3-1 lead.



Wycombe tried very hard in the second half to recapture the form of the opening fifteen minutes all to no avail. It was not until the last minute that Bates finally broke the stalemate of lost endeavour.

World News: On 29th September in Panama the Nicaraguan President Somoza dies after being shot on a visit to the Canal zone. In Cyprus British six troops were hurt after a home made bomb went off during a lecture. The bomb was constructed from a toffee tin and was the work of Greek terrorist movement EOKA.

TWENTY FIVE YEARS AGO

Wycombe Wanderers recorded a convincing win over Carshalton Athletic on Saturday 26th September to storm to the top of the Berger Isthmian League. It was an impressive business like performance by the Blues who had far too much for the poor home side. For Wycombe it was a good day all round as Sutton could manage a draw at lowly Hendon and the Blues climbed to lead by one point.

Wycombe started as if they meant business forcing three corners in the opening four minutes. Nothing came from them but the warning signs were there, Carshalton looked very edgy from set pieces. After a lot of Blues pressure they finally went ahead on 21 minutes. A slip by a defender allowed Howard Kennedy to cross for Dell. The goalkeeper dropped the ball and Glynn pounced to lay it back for Long to score. Come the interval Wanderers only had the one goal to show for all their effort.

The second half was but a minute old when Wycombe went further ahead. A free kick 18 yards from the Carshalton goal was taken by West, his shot hit Wilson and rebounded to Kennedy (right) who drove the ball past Lightfoot. Wilson should have made it 3-0 when put clear by Glynn but his weak shot bumbled wide of a post. Four minutes later Wilson was replaced by Andy Longstaff who played an important part in the final goal on 80 minutes. West played the ball to Longstaff, who in turn played in Glynn and made it count from eight yards.

The match programme carried news about the death of Wanderers club Patron Frank Adams who had celebrated his 90th birthday on Saturday 5th September but on Saturday 19th September died in his sleep.

World News: On 29th September 1981 German architect to the Third Reich Albert Speer died in Spandau Prison, West Germany. In London Dennis Healey pipped Tony Benn by a whisker to retain the deputy leadership of the Labour Party.

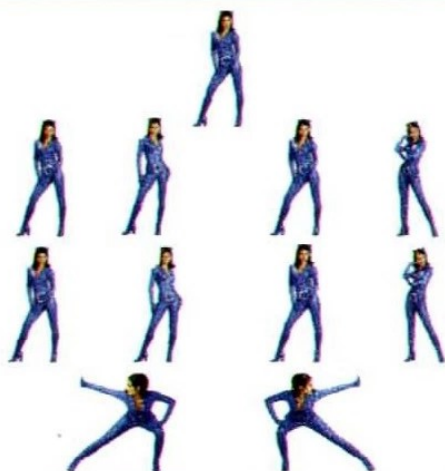

Exiting evening in prospect as both Swindon Town and us have made an outstanding start to the season, with both of us desperate to get out of League Two and back into League One where we used to meet regularly.

The game will be given that little bit of extra atmosphere by the fact that it is a night match, night matches always seem to have that bit of extra excitement, indeed John Gorman would have loved to play some Friday evenings by choice.

You may have noticed the fracas around the dugouts prior to the Chester City game, when the match referee refused to allow us to use the TV monitor, installed for coaching purposes. I had been over the executive boxes when at around 2-10pm he asked to speak with me about the subject, but by the time the message had reached me and I had returned it was 2-30pm.

He asked if we had obtained Football League permission for the use of a TV monitor in the dugout, to which I replied that there was no regulation to prevent it and we had used it the previous match. We agreed that I would contact Referee's supremo at The Football League Jim Ashworth, for ruling on the situation, which I tried to do right up until kick-off, on his mobile.

Sadly he was not replying and all I could do was leave a message, so the match referee instructed us not to use the TV monitor during the game, not wishing to "fall out" with the official before the game we removed the monitor immediately. The whole incident had been conducted in a most civil and

friendly manner and we complied with his wishes as soon as it became obvious Jim Ashworth could not be contacted.

In the event Jim rang me back at 3-15pm and we discussed the matter, although he was of little help at the time, there was clearly nothing in the regulations to stop us using the monitor but no one had ever asked the question before.

The following Monday we discussed the matter more fully, with the referee having already emailed Jim with a request for a ruling, it appears that no one knew the answer.

So as I write these notes we are no further forward, I asked verbally and then in writing for a ruling and Jim agreed to contact Keith Hackett at the FA, together with Neil Barry of the PGMOL for their views. I did respectfully request a ruling by the 22nd September in time for the Lincoln City match, Jim is very good and efficient and I suspect I will hear soon..... But I/we must remain patient.

The referee's objection was that if there was a contentious incident, it would make matters worse if it were viewed instantly on a TV monitor, of course I do understand this.

However, if the viewing proved the official had been correct then it would only make things better and not worse, in addition most Premiership clubs have a TV monitor in their boxes why not us?

We do have an excellent relationship with the authorities and will of course abide by their ruling, but on the day no one could give me a reason why we should not continue

to use it.

Watch this space.

There has been some comment about loan players and the number we are allowed to register, we are in fact allowed eight Standard Long Term Loans (four over 24 and four under 24) and also to register Emergency Short Term Loans.

We currently have five loan players, two Standard Long Term and three Emergency Short Term you are not allowed to name any more than five loan players in the final sixteen for any game.

So to sum up, we can still sign Loan Players, but as we can only name five in any one game any other Loan signing would leave the Manager with the decision of which one not to include.

The regulations covering Transfer Windows and Loan signings are a minefield, they are also subject to change, we really do have to have our finger on the pulse and keep up with developments.

To this end I attended a weekend two day seminar and conference at Staverton Park at the beginning of September, with most of the other Football League and Premiership Secretaries.

It was a valuable exercise, keeping up to date with developments, regulations and changes, with the overnight stay, dinner, together with the late night and early morning networking sessions at the bar invaluable (you can never have too many contacts).

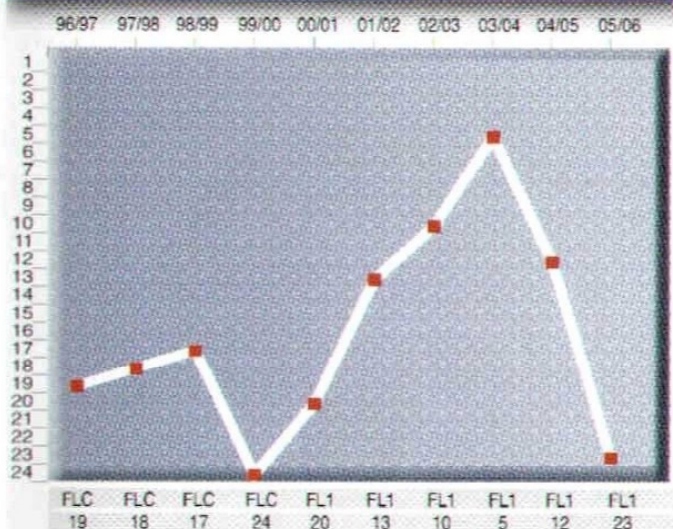

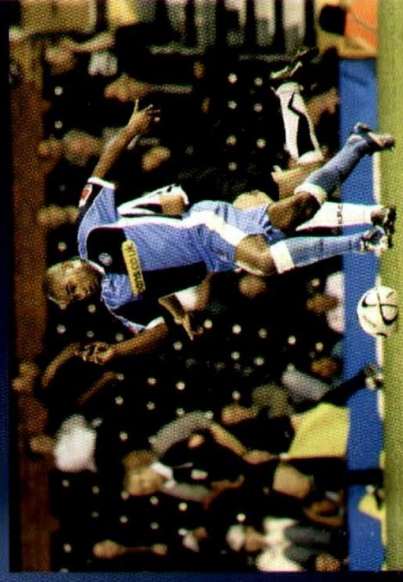

In four days time we make the long trip to Lancashire to take on Accrington Stanley. Last season's Conference champions are back in the Football League after an absence of 44 years. Back in 1962 they resigned from the FL, were wound up, reformed in 1963, disbanded in 1966 only to restart as Accrington Stanley (1968) returning to the Lancashire Combination in 1970. Stanley were Northern League Div 1 champions in 1999/2000 and Northern Premier League champions three years later. Manager John Coleman has been in charge since May 1999. This will be the first ever meeting between the clubs.

Consolidation in League 2

After just one win in their first seven League 2 fixtures, consecutive home victories over Wrexham and Boston have moved The Reds into a comfortable mid table position. Since a disappointing 0-2 defeat to Darlington in their first home fixture, they have not lost at their 'Fraser Eagle Stadium'. Two goals from Benin international Romauld Boco earned a 2-1 home win over Barnet – their first FL win since 1962! After a 1-1 draw with Rochdale, previously unbeaten Wrexham were thrashed 5-0 and this was followed by a 2-1 win over Boston with Andy Todd grabbing a last minute winner. On their travels the Reds have picked up just one point from four fixtures, this coming in a 1-1 draw at Stockport. Leading marksman is former Crewe trainee Gary Roberts who has hit 6 goals (incl. 2 penalties) in Stanley's last five league fixtures. Another prolific marksman is 32-year old Paul Mullin with 58 goals over the last 3 seasons. This season he has scored twice in the league whilst also netting the winner against Nottingham Forest in the Carling Cup. Average home attendance this season is 2,391 with a best of 3,045 for the Rochdale fixture.



Recommended road directions

Take the normal route to northbound M6 (M40, M42). Leave the motorway at J21A (signposted Leeds, Bolton, Manchester), then join the M62. Exit the M62 at J12, then join the M60. Leave the M60 at J18, then keep left to join the M66 (signposted Bury, Burnley). At the end of the motorway, continue forward on the A56. At the Rising Bridge roundabout, take the first turning, the A680 towards Accrington for about 3 miles. After passing the police and fire stations on the left, follow the ring road dual carriageway around the town centre, through the pelican crossing, and three sets of traffic lights. At the fourth set of lights, opposite the Castle pub, turn right to rejoin the A680. Follow this road up the hill for approximately 1 mile. Livingstone Road is approx 400 yards past Accrington Victoria Hospital on the right. The ground is on the left.

Mileage from High Wycombe = 207. Convenient service areas on the M6 for that break of journey are at Stafford and Sandbach (128 and 149 miles from Wycombe respectively)

Parking

Apparently there is ample free parking behind both goals at the ground. There is also on street parking around the ground.

Facilities for visiting supporters

Accrington will not send us tickets to sell in advance so you need to get them there on the day. Seat tickets are priced Adults £15, Senior and U-18 £10, Junior U-12 £5.

Standing prices are Adults £13, Senior and U-18 £8, Junior U-12 £4. The match day programme will cost you £2.50.

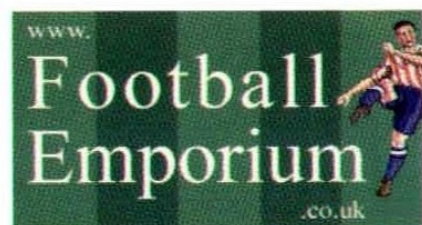
Fancy a pre-match pint?

Summer moves in Devon

There was plenty of comings and goings at Plainmoor over the summer. Boss Ian Atkins allowed some 14 players to exit, including the likes of Tony Bedeau (Walsall), Alan Connell (Hereford), Jo Kuffour (Brentford), and keeper Andy Marriott (Boston). Meanwhile arrivals have included experienced striker Mickey Evans from Plymouth, keeper Nathan Abbey (Bristol City) and Northern Ireland U-21 midfielder Jamie Ward (Aston Villa). A £10,000 fee brought in midfielder Adam Murray from Carlisle. Other new faces in the line-up this season have been midfielder Lee Mansell (ex Oxford) and defender Stevland Angus (Barnet).

A satisfactory start

After their 1-0 home victory over Mansfield ten days ago, Ian Atkins admitted his side "would have taken" their league placing of seventh at the start of the campaign. Defensively the Gulls are now stronger – the Mansfield result was their third consecutive clean sheet and the side has only conceded six goals in nine league outings. Their away form is currently good – unbeaten in four fixtures they have won at Barnet and Bury, and drawn at Hartlepool and Darlington. Their only league defeat in their first nine league fixtures was at home to Lincoln when they conceded two stoppage time goals. Jamie Ward scored the winner against Mansfield to take his personal total to 3, whilst experienced Lee Thorpe has 2.

The great escape

For most of last season it looked highly probable that the Gulls would suffer a second consecutive relegation. They

failed to win any of their first seven league games and were already in basement position. At the turn of the year they were in 22nd place and boss Leroy Rosenior was eventually replaced short term by former Wycombe player John Cornforth. Wins against Peterborough and here at Wycombe lifted the side temporarily to 21st before three straight defeats sent them back to bottom in mid-April with the Conference looming. Ian Atkins however was recruited as manager and four consecutive victories (including a 2-0 win at champions to be Carlisle) meant a 20th place final position - three points clear of relegation. The Gulls did enjoy some limited success in the FA Cup. Having defeated non-league Harrogate and then Notts County, they were unlucky to only draw 0-0 with Premiership Birmingham at Plainmoor – they went down 0-2 in the replay at St Andrews. Leading goal scorer was Tony Bedeau with 9 league and 2 cup goals. Average home attendance was 2,851 (18.8% down on the previous season's figure) with a high of 5,697 on the final day against Boston.

The Gulls are back in town

This will only be the Devon side's third ever visit to Wycombe and we are still looking for our first league victory over them – at home, or away. Last season's meeting here – on March 18th – was an important one for both sides. United were down in 23rd place fighting for their Football League survival while we were second and seeking automatic promotion. The majority of the 7,134 crowd (our best of the season) went home disappointed after the Gulls' Tony Bedeau broke clear to net the game's only goal in the 57th minute. The only other fixture here between the sides was back on Easter Saturday 1994. It was our first season in the Football League and both sides were looking for promotion. The crowd of 5,808 saw us get off to an excellent start, Matt Crossley heading home Steve Guppy's corner after just 13 minutes. We dominated a stormy match that saw nine bookings but failed to finish off the Devon side. We were punished in the sixth minute of second half stoppage time when substitute Mark Sale headed past Paul Hyde. Both league meetings at Plainmoor have been drawn, 1-1 (Dec 1993) and 2-2 (Dec 2005). Let's hope we obtain that elusive victory in ten days time!

Saddlers regain leadership

Last weekend's 10th round of league matches saw Walsall take over top spot although the top four are separated by only a single point. Walsall won 2-1 at struggling Bristol Rovers with early goals from Scott Dann and Daniel Fox. Interestingly Walsall have yet to concede a home league goal this season having started with five clean sheets. Maybe Mansfield will break that sequence on Saturday. This evening's visitors Swindon Town probably think they should be the current leaders. The Robins drew 1-1 at Notts County but boss Dennis Wise was adamant that Lee Peacock's late effort had crossed the line. The extra points would have put Town one point clear at the top. Meanwhile the Sunday papers listed Wise as a candidate for the vacant manager's job at Leeds United. There are rumours of financial concerns at Swindon with investor Bill Power quitting after that horrific air crash last month. The recent signing of Paul Ince had taken the side's wage bill over the FL cap of 60% of their turnover and the club's long serving secretary was recently made redundant.

London Road goal blitz

The league's most dramatic game to date this season took place at Peterborough last weekend. At one stage visitors Hartlepool led 4-0 but three Peterborough goals in 11 second half minutes sparked hopes of a remarkable

comeback. Hartlepool were hanging on until Matty Robson broke away to make the final score 5-3 to the visitors – this game brings back memories of our home fixture with Macclesfield last season! Relieved Hartlepool boss Danny Wilson commented – "It was one of those incredible games. I am knackered and I was only watching it! When we were 3-0 up at the break, I told the lads to go out and do exactly the same in the second half. But we allowed them back into the game and conceded what were three sloppy goals from our point of view."

Dunbavin denies Stags

Accrington Stanley (our next League opponents) continued their improved form with a 2-2 draw at Mansfield. Paul Mullin netted both Stanley's goals but their real hero was keeper Ian Dunbavin who pulled off penalty saves from Richard Barker and Alan Sheehan. Interestingly boss John Coleman had taken Dunbavin off two minutes before the end of the Carling Cup tie at Watford because he reckoned his other keeper would do better at saving penalties!

Revamped Football League Trophy

Interesting changes have been announced for this season's competition. Johnstone's Paints replace LDV Vans as the sponsors and the jackpot for the overall winners will be £90,000. Extra time will be scrapped, penalty shoot outs

coming in after 90mins. Clubs will also be required to include a majority of the 11 players that have appeared most often in first team games this season. Free tickets will be available for children under-16 accompanied by a paying adult. There will be four sections North East, North West, South East and South West. This will reduce travelling – I remember Wycombe once playing at Shrewsbury in the 'Southern' section. The new South West section will see a repeat of this evening's fixture – the game to be played here in three weeks time.

Carling Cup heroics

Whilst Wycombe won at Premiership Fulham last week, Notts County also did League 2 proud, winning 1-0 at Middlesbrough. T'chan Ntoya hit the Magpies winner in the 26th minute. The third L2 club to make it into the last 32 was MK Dons who won 2-1 at Championship outfit Barnsley. The 10 other L2 representatives all fell at the second hurdle but there were some brave performances. Both Accrington and Darlington went out on penalties at Premiership opponents Watford and Reading respectively. Hartlepool also went out on penalties – at Championship club Hull City. All three L2 clubs have home draws in round 3 – Notts County entertain Southampton, MK Dons play hosts to Tottenham, whilst League 1 club Doncaster Rovers must travel to Adams Park.

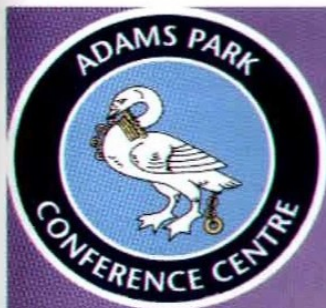

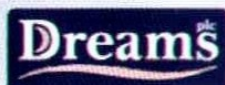
