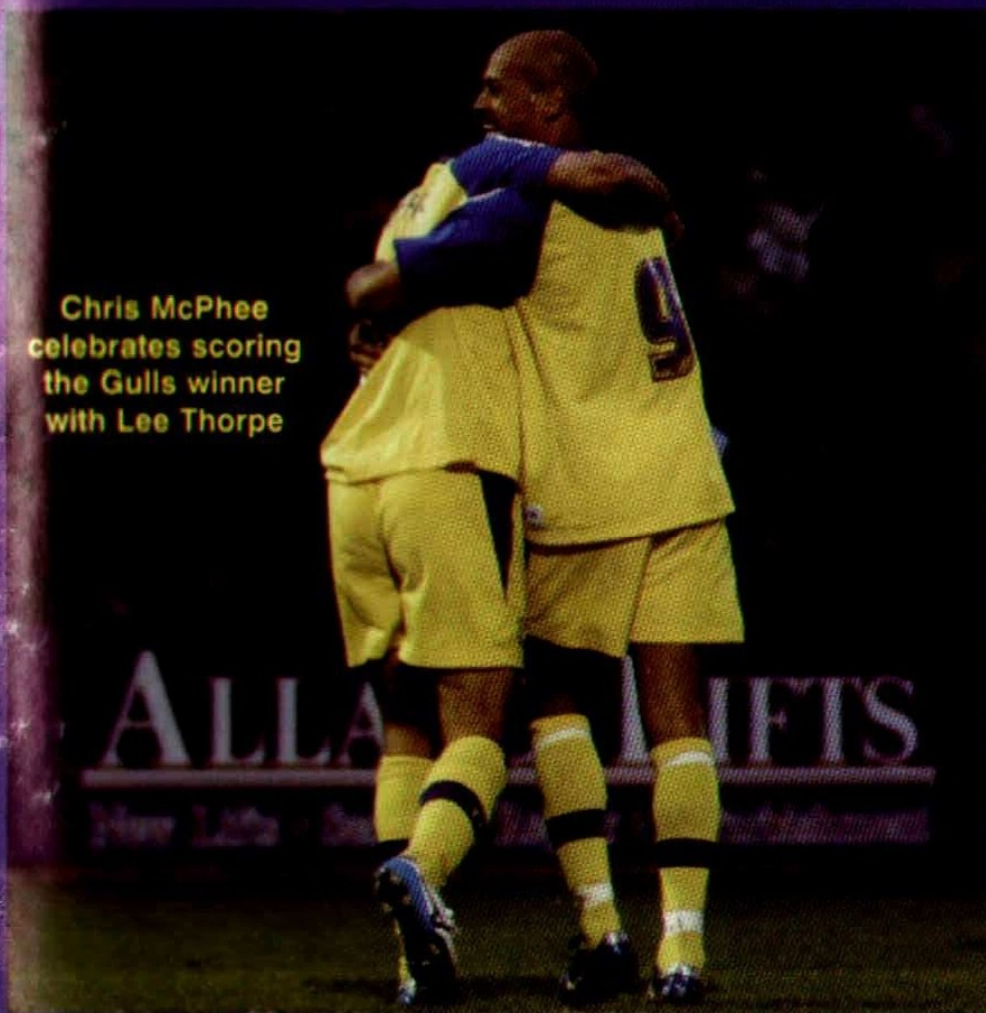

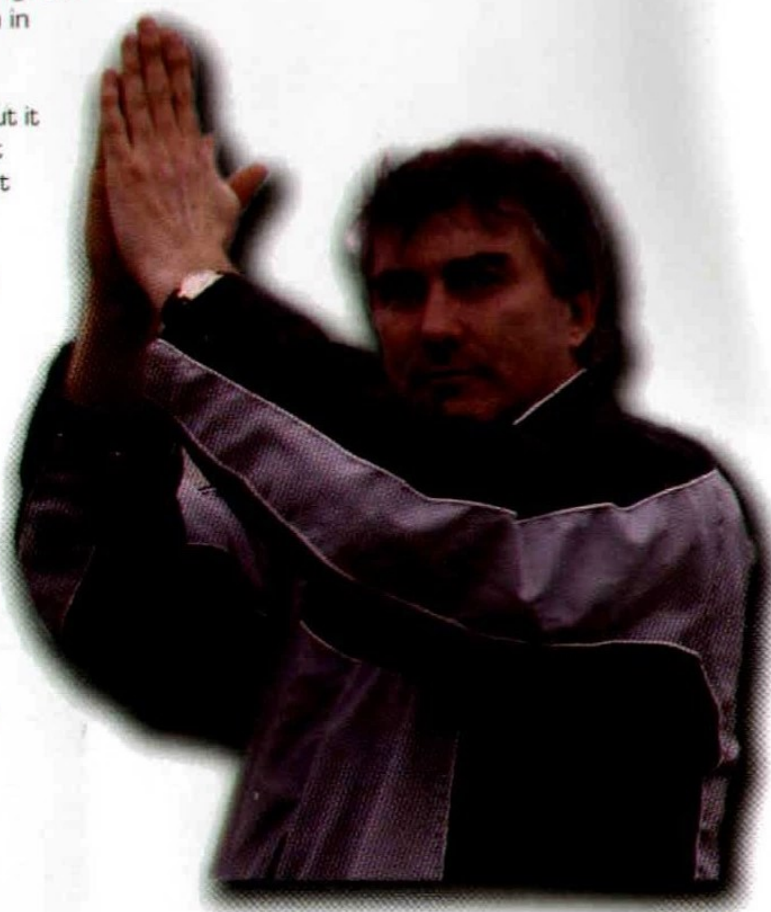
It was a terrific performance in the second half: pleasingly it went well for us. Soon we will get a little bit of luck and we will start getting the rewards.

## chairman

**W**hat a Weekend !...., after a difficult start to the match against Leatherhead our patience and better football in the 2nd half saw us just about make it into the 2nd round draw of the FA Cup sponsored by E.ON. I am sure that the difference in fitness between full time Professionals and part-time Players showed in the last 20 minutes of the game. The Directors of Leatherhead were very gracious in defeat and enjoyed their weekend on the English Riviera. We have agreed to play each other in a pre-season friendly at Plainmoor, should make for an interesting return.

I nipped into Boots & Laces on Sunday afternoon, to share the draw with some of our Supporters; we got a good cheer when our name came out of the hat first for another home tie. As you would all of have seen we have a mouth watering clash against Leyton Orient, whom we managed to beat 2-0 at the end of last season. Although 'The Orient' have struggled in the league since August, they are still a division above us and I am sure that we will show them the respect they deserve. Hopefully the home advantage will just tip the tie in our favour.

Although Paul Sturrock has only been at Swindon for a short period of time, he will have wasted no time in instilling his Scottish work ethic into his football which I watched on numerous occasions when he was Manager of Dundee United. Swindon have a great chance of promotion this year under his guidance and apart from this afternoon and certain return fixture on Monday 9th of April, I wish them well. Swindon is a fantastic little town which is booming at the moment and there is no reason why they cannot emulate Reading's achievements.

Finally I want to give my support to Roy Keane at Sunderland and his condemnation of the "Cheats and Conmen" who are dragging the image of the game we all love through the mud. # next at —————> plainmoor

The magic of the F.A. Cup returns to Plainmoor, two weeks today, when League One outfit Leyton Orient stand between the Gulls and a place in the third round of the world's most glamorous and famous Cup competition.

The O's won promotion to League One on the final day of last season, beating Oxford United 3-2 on a nail-biting afternoon, a result which condemned Oxford to relegation and the Nationwide Conference.

However, it's fair to say that the Londoners have found the going tough this season and as these notes are written they are currently bottom of the table with just two wins being gained from their past seventeen league and cup games.

They began the season with six straight away defeats, in the league, before they stopped the rot with a 3-3 draw at Oldham Athletic. A 3-1 defeat at Scunthorpe United then followed but in their last away game the O's picked up a point from a goalless encounter at Doncaster Rovers.

Like ourselves Orient will be desperate for a victory, in two weeks time, to take them into the Third Round, and it should be a cracking cup-tie. Just ninety minutes away from a place in the next round and everyone dreams of a draw against a Manchester United, Liverpool, Chelsea or Arsenal, which if you can get, would set a club up for years. There is nothing like the F.A. Cup to generate extra revenue for clubs, but also interest in the Club and the town, and it can really put you in the spotlight.

In last season's league game at Plainmoor, we managed a 2-0 victory over Orient thanks to second half goals from Martin Phillips and Tony Bedeau in front of a crowd of 2687. However, at one point, it was feared that the game would have to be abandoned after the floodlights failed and we were just one

minute away from calling the game off before the lights came back on.

A similar result in two weeks time would be just what the doctor ordered.

Let's hope that the Torquay fans turn out in force for the game and we can cheer the lads on to that magical place in the Third Round.

## ONE TO WATCH – MATTHEW LOCKWOOD

Now in his ninth year at Brisbane Road, Matt again underlined his importance to the club with a fantastic 2005/06 campaign – one which earned him a third nomination in the PFA League Two team of the year.

A highly rated left-sided defender who likes to attack, Matt weighs in with his fair share of goals – a number of which come from the penalty spot.

Having been strongly linked with a move up the divisions over the years, Matt has perhaps found his progress hampered by injury – notably a ruptured spleen which kept him out for over six months in 2002 – but last season marked a tremendous return to form.

Having completed his junior training at Southend United, Matt joined QPR in May 1995 and then Bristol Rovers in July 1996 where he made his league debut.

He joined Orient in August 1998 and was named in the PFA League Two team of the year in 1999/2000, 2000/2001 and 2005/2006.

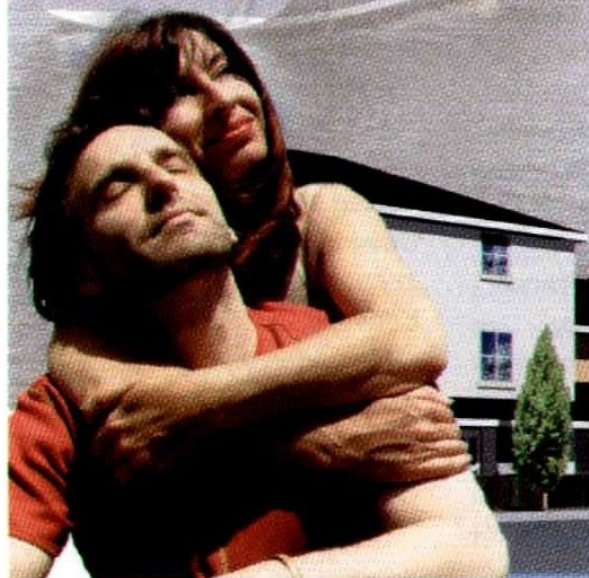
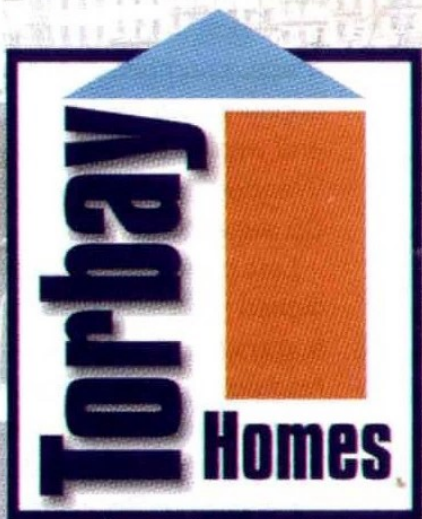

# SWINDON TOWN



## The Robins

Swindon Town will always be remembered for their 1969 League Cup triumph when they defeated Arsenal 3-1 at Wembley.

In more recent times they won promotion to the Premiership in 1993 after beating Leicester City in the Division One Play-Off under the guidance of Glenn Hoddle.

The Robins are currently fourth in League Two and were the favourites to win promotion at the start of the current campaign following the appointment of Dennis Wise as manager who has since taken charge of Leeds United.

Paul Sturrock is now in charge at the County Ground and will be looking for glory.

He has a proved pedigree in the lower leagues after masterminding Plymouth Argyle's Division Three Championship success of the 2001-02 campaign and he also built the Pilgrims side that lifted the Division Two title in the 2003-04 season before leaving Home Park to manage Southampton. Sturrock also steered Sheffield Wednesday to League One Play-Off glory in the 2004-05 season.

As a player, he was in the Scotland squad for the 1982 and 1986 World Cups and was part of the Dundee United

side that won the Scottish title in the 1982-83 season and he appeared in the 1987 UEFA Cup Final for the Terrors.

In goal, Peter Brezovan joined the club on a one-year loan deal from Czech side FC Brno. He quickly became a fans favourite following the Robins first game of the season against Hartlepool after saving two penalties as Swindon beat the Pool 1-0.

Phil Smith joined the Robins from Crawley Town during the close season. He has also played for Margate and will be looking to make a strong challenge for the goalkeeper's jersey.

Right back Jack Smith will be looking to make the position his own this season after appearing in a variety of positions last season. He was previously at Watford where he scored two goals, one of which was a 'Goal of the Season' contender.

Powerful defender Jerel Ifil signed for the Robins on a permanent basis in the summer of 2004 from Watford after enjoying three loan spells at the County Ground earlier in his career. He has currently made 100 appearances for the club.

Former Wales international Andy Williams brings plenty of

experience to the Swindon back line. During his career he has had spells with Wolves, Reading and Coventry City and stood in as Caretaker Manager following Dennis Wise's departure for Leeds.

Ex Liverpool youngster Andy Nicholas arrived at the County Road in the summer of 2003 after he was snapped by the then Swindon manager Andy King. He established himself as a first team regular during the 2003-04 season and has now made over 100 appearances for the Robins.

Young defender Charlie Comyn-Platt joined Swindon in 2005 following his release from Bolton Wanderers. He made a number of cup appearances for the Trotters and was loaned to Wycombe Wanderers during the 2004-05 season.

Left back Jamie Vincent signed for the Robins in the summer and will be looking to hold down a regular first team spot. He started his career with Crystal Palace before moving on to Bournemouth, Huddersfield Town, Portsmouth, Derby County and Millwall.

Winger Andy Monkhouse was part of the Rotherham United side that rose from Division Three to Division One in consecutive seasons between 2000 and 2002.

He ended an eight year association with the Millers when he signed for the Robins during the close season.

starlet Gareth Whalley arrived at the County Road in 2005 from Wigan Athletic. Gareth made over 200 appearances for the Railwaymen before he moved to Bradford City for £600,000 in 1998 and appeared for the Bantams in the top-flight in the 1999-00 and 2000-01 seasons. He has also played for Cardiff City.

Trinidad and Tobago winger Ricky Shakes joined the club in July 2005 from Bolton Wanderers. A tricky winger with plenty of pace, he has also had loan spells with Bristol Rovers and Bury. Ricky narrowly missed out on a place in the Trinidad and Tobago World Cup squad.

Former youth team player Michael Pook has firmly established himself as a member of the Robins first team squad. An energetic box-to-box midfielder, he scored a 25 yard goal against Wycombe Wanderers in the first round of the Carling Cup.

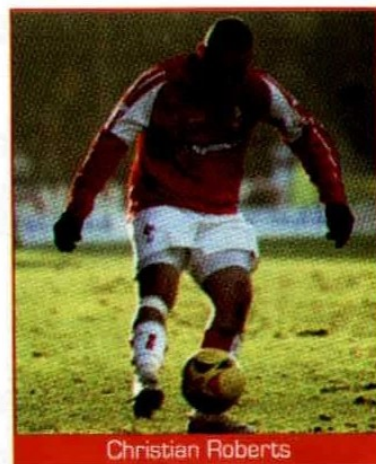
Experienced midfielder Andy Gurney is a player who needs no introduction to Torquay United fans. Gurney was signed from Bristol Rovers by Kevin Hodges in 1997. He was an integral part of the Gulls side that reached the Division Three Play-Off Final in the 1997-98 season. Gurney signed for Reading in 1999 for £100,000 before joining Swindon in 2001. He joined Swansea City in September 2004 on a free transfer before returning to the County Ground in January 2005.

Young midfielder Curtis Weston joined from Millwall in the close season. He wrote his name into the record books during his time with the Lions when he became the youngest ever FA Cup finalist ever at 17 years and 119 days after coming on to replace Dennis Wise in the 2004 final against Manchester United..

Left winger Aaron Brown started his career with Bristol City where he made 135 first team appearances before joining QPR in 2004. He had a brief loan spell at Plainmoor during the 2004-05 campaign and he joined the Robins in January 2006.

Cardiff-born striker Christian Roberts signed for the Robins in October 2004 in a £50,000 switch from local rivals Bristol City. Formerly with Exeter City, he scored 18 goals in 67 league starts for the Grecians from 2000 - 2002. Roberts will be keen to play a big part in Town's 2006-7 campaign and he has been appointed as Vice-Captain.

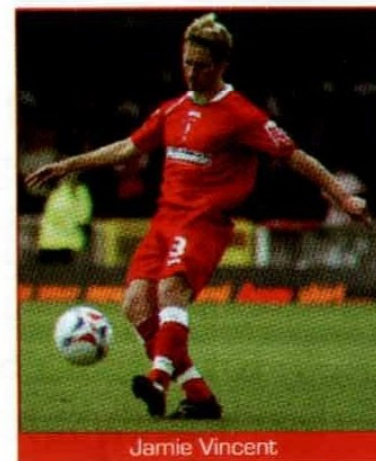
Striker Lee Peacock joined Swindon Town in 2006 on a free transfer from Sheffield Wednesday. He started his career with Carlisle United and moved to Mansfield Town in October 1997 for £75,000. Peacock would move on to Manchester City and Bristol City before he signed for Sheffield Wednesday on a free transfer in the summer of 2004 where he would serve under current Robins boss Paul Sturrock.

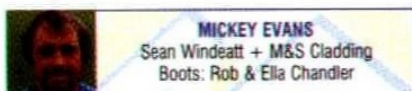

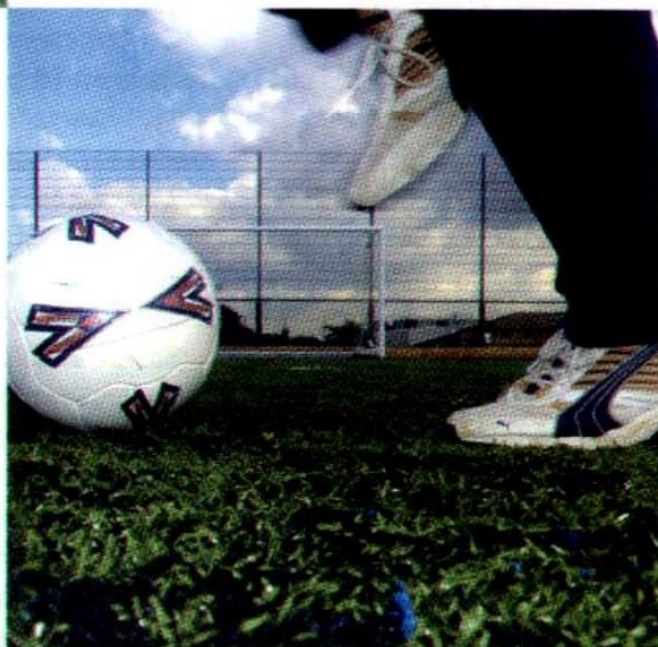



## THE SUMMER OF '66

The summer of 1966 proved to be a memorable one for Football in England.

Bobby Moore lifted the Jules Rimet Trophy at Wembley as England beat West Germany 4-2 after Geoff Hurst had become the only man to date to score a hat-trick in a World Cup Final.

Two months earlier, Torquay United had clinched promotion for the second time in their history after finishing third in Division Four.

It was a unique footballing double that has never occurred since.

The journey began on May 3rd 1965, a date that marked the end of an era for Torquay United. The club's longest serving manager Eric Webber was dismissed after 14 years in charge after Chairman Tony Boyce and his fellow directors had decided that the time was right for a new man to take the helm.

That man turned out to be former West Ham and Republic of Ireland player

Frank O'Farrell, a graduate of the West Ham Academy with Malcolm Allison, Noel Cantwell and Dave Sexton. He had already made a name for himself in non-league circles with Weymouth Town who he had guided to the Southern League title.

He quickly went about the signing the players that he felt could help the Gulls to mount a promotion challenge. Winger Gerry King arrived from Cardiff City and he returned to his former club Weymouth to sign former Manchester United midfielder Tommy Spratt, who would go on to be the clubs top scorer of the campaign.

Dougie Clarke and Alan Kirkham were signed Hull City and Scunthorpe United respectively.

O'Farrell introduced a more disciplined style to the one that was adopted by Eric Webber and he deployed John Benson as a sweeper.

After a promising pre-season, Torquay were dealt a major body blow on the opening day of the campaign when they lost 4-1 away at Bradford City.

However, the Gulls bounced back and won their next four league games. This run was followed by away defeats against Newport County and Barrow.

This prompted O'Farrell to hand a recall to veteran defender Reg Wyatt who had joined Torquay in October 1964 and only made eight appearances. The decision turned out to be a masterstroke as Wyatt marked his return to the side with a goal in the Gulls 1-1 draw with Southport, which started a run that saw the Gulls pick up 21 points from a possible 26.

By this stage of the season keeper Terry Adlington had been forced into a retirement after breaking his finger in the Gulls 2-1 defeat at the hands of Shrewsbury Town in the FA Cup.

This prompted O'Farrell to give a taste of first team Football to Gary McGuire. A former FA Amateur Cup winner with Walthamstow Avenue, McGuire had written to the club requesting a trial after returning from a spell in Australia. He would go on to

make 16 appearances for the club during the season.

History was made on October 2 1965 when Geoff Cox became the first ever substitute used by Torquay United when he came on for the injured Robin Stubbs in the Gulls 1-0 win over Doncaster Rovers.

The Gulls were in contention for promotion going into the New Year, winning their final game of 1965 against Aldershot 5-1 with goals coming from Reg Wyatt, an own goal, Robin Stubbs and two from Tommy Spratt.

O'Farrell pulled off a major transfer coup early in 1966 and it proved to be a crucial signing for Torquay. He persuaded his ex West Ham team-mate John Bond, who 18 months earlier had been part of the Hammers side that had won the 1964 FA Cup Final alongside Bobby Moore, Geoff Hurst and Martin Peters (More on them later!), to join the Gulls.

He helped to strengthen Torquay's defence and his experience was also beneficial to the younger players.

With six games to go, the Gulls lay fifth in the Fourth Division table and they needed a late surge of form to make the top three. After beating Tranmere Rovers, Colchester United and Halifax Town and drawing with Southport, Torquay faced Notts County at home in their penultimate game and needed to win. And win they did, with goals from John Benson and Tommy Spratt.

Three weeks later, 1,000 Torquay fans travelled to the North East as the Gulls faced Darlington and needed a point to secure promotion. Torquay drew 0-0 with the Quakers and it proved to be enough as other results went their way.

There was jubilation along the Newton Road following day as the club coach returned home as thousands of people lined the streets to welcome the team home.

Two months later, England lifted the World Cup for the first and only time to date as they beat West Germany 4-2 at Wembley in the Final. John Bond's former West Ham team-

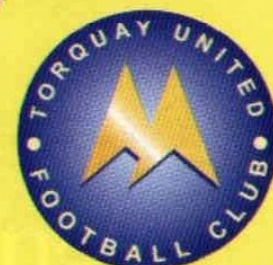


Frank O'Farrell masterminded the Gulls promotion in the 1965-66 campaign

mates Bobby Moore, Geoff Hurst and Martin Peters would play major roles in the victory. Moore captained the side, Peters scored England's first goal of the final and Hurst netted a memorable hat-trick.

The rest is history!

Footnote: The television commentator who famously said the immortal line 'They think it's all over, it is now' Kenneth Wolstenholme would later retire to South Devon and during his time in the area he visited Plainmoor on numerous occasions.

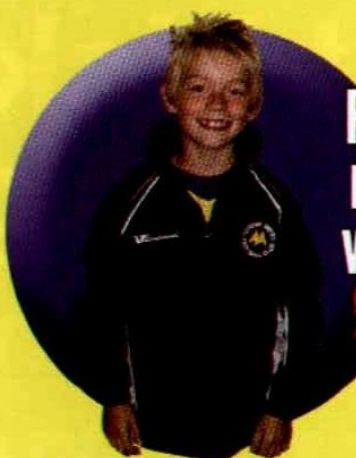

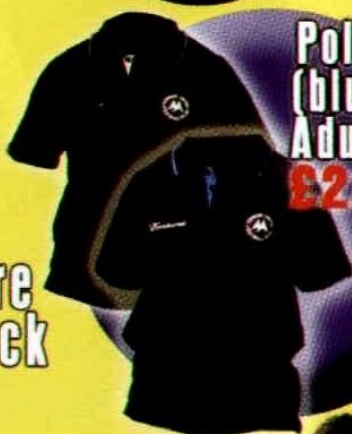

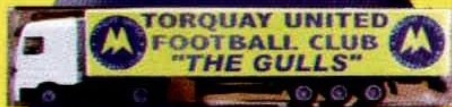

# On the road with the Gulls to **PETERBOROUGH UNITED** by Terry Brumpton

Next Saturday we hit the road again as we continue our League Two programme with a trip to London Road to take on the 'Posh' of Peterborough United.

As we write these notes Keith Alexander's side currently occupy seventh position in League Two and they have just enjoyed an excellent 3-0 home win over League One side Rotherham United in last week's F.A. Cup First Round tie. That win has earned the 'Posh' a second round trip to Tranmere Rovers and Chairman Darragh MacAnthony is to foot the bill for over 2000 fans to make the trip to the Wirral to cheer his team on.

If it's goals that you want from your football then it may well be worth making the trip to London Road next Saturday. From Peterborough's nine league games to date a staggering total of 37 goals have been scored with the 'Posh' scoring twenty of them but conceding seventeen.

Our last two visits to London Road has seen our team return with a point from both games. Last season we played out a goalless draw while the year before the spoils were shared again thanks to a 1-1 draw. We also played there in the 2003-2004 season when we suffered a 3-2 defeat, after extra time, in a LDV Vans Trophy game.

After our recent barren run, just one point from a possible twenty four, we shall be looking to return home with at least a point.

## By Car

Take the A380 until you come to the M5. Take the M5 North and stay on their until Junction 4A. Leave the M5 at this junction which is signposted The North East and London and then join the M42 Motorway. Leave the M42 Motorway at Junction 7A signposted London M1, and Coventry, and then join the M6.

Leave the M6 (signposted

Felixstowe A14) and then merge onto the A14. At roundabout take the 2nd exit onto the A14 which will be signposted for Felixstowe and Kettering.

Continue along the A14 until Junction 13 and then leave at this junction taking the 2nd exit off the roundabout onto the A605 signposted for Peterborough. Continue on the A605 before going on the A1139 and then the A1260. You then join the A15 before arriving at London Road.

The approx mileage is 262 which gives you a journey time of roughly four and a half hours.

## By Rail

By Foot - Turn right out of the station and into the long stay car park. Go under the railway bridge and walk up the path or steps to the main road. Turn right passing the Evening Telegraph on the left hand side and then ASDA to the right. Turn right into the pedestrian shopping area (Bridge Street) and straight on over River Bridge and mini roundabout, Ground is on the left hand side.

There are of course plenty of taxi cabs available from the railway station if you don't fancy the ten minute walk.

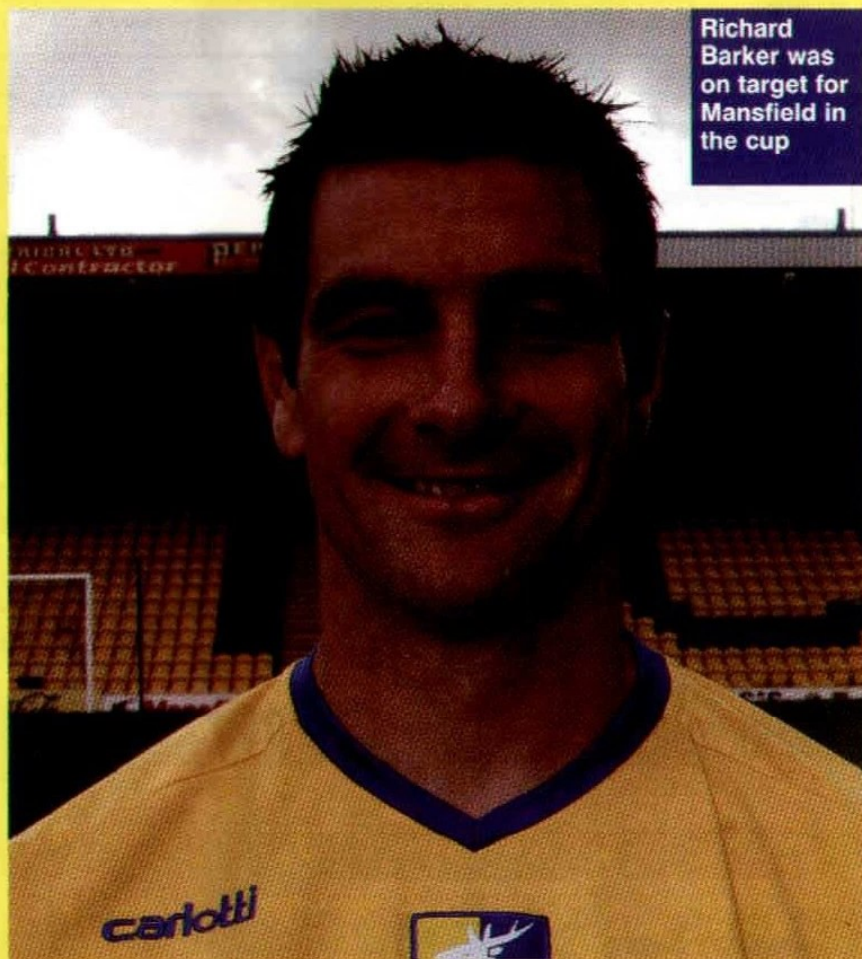

Chris McPhee proved to be a super sub for Torquay United as they bounced back to beat Ryman League side Leatherhead 2-1 at Plainmoor to progress through to the second round of the FA Cup.

The Gulls were dealt a shock blow fifty five seconds into the game when Iain Hendry headed home a Jamie Beer free-kick to put the Tanners in front.

Torquay then regrouped as they looked to get back into the game.

Adam Murray had an effort turned wide by Leatherhead keeper Chris Gibson and Kevin Hill headed wide.

It looked as though the current Leatherhead side were going to emulate the Chris Kelly inspired Tanners side of the 1974-75 season as they went in with a one goal advantage at half-time.

The Gulls made a positive start to the second half and played with renewed commitment and enthusiasm. Lee Mansell shot wide from

distance shortly after the re-start.

Skipper Lee Thorpe came agonisingly close to scoring an equaliser for Torquay when he nodded over after Kevin Hill had headed the ball back across the goal.

Their persistence paid off in the 59th minute when Mickey Evans headed the ball down into the path of Jamie Ward who slotted home to score his seventh goal of the season.

Ward later had an effort ruled out for offside four minutes later.

The Gulls pushed on in search of a winner as Evans also went close after latching onto a cross from Ward.

On 69 minutes, Ian Atkins introduced Chris McPhee in place of Adam Murray to increase Torquay's options in attack.

The move paid off three minutes later when McPhee headed home his first goal for

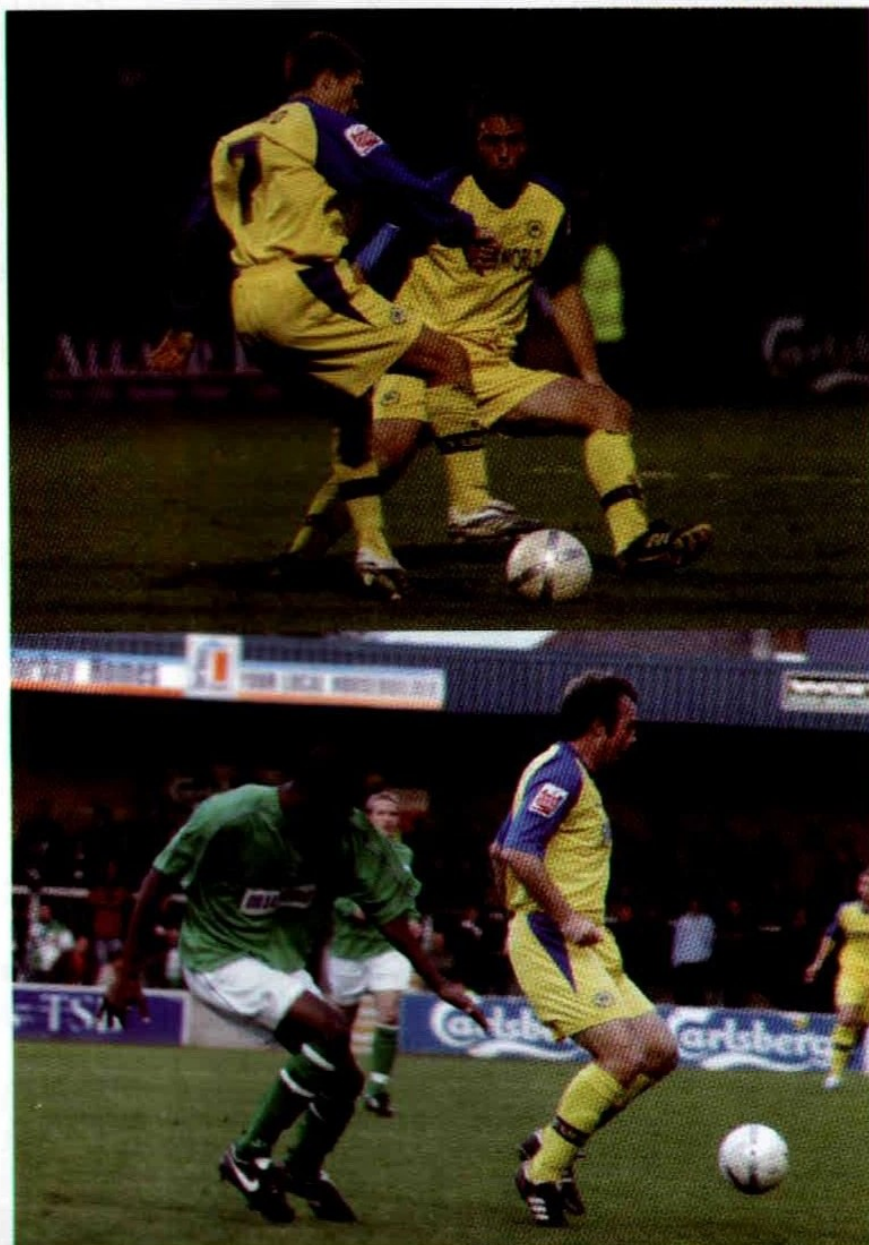
the club from six yards, following a vital knock down by Steve Woods, to put the Gulls in front for the first time in the match.

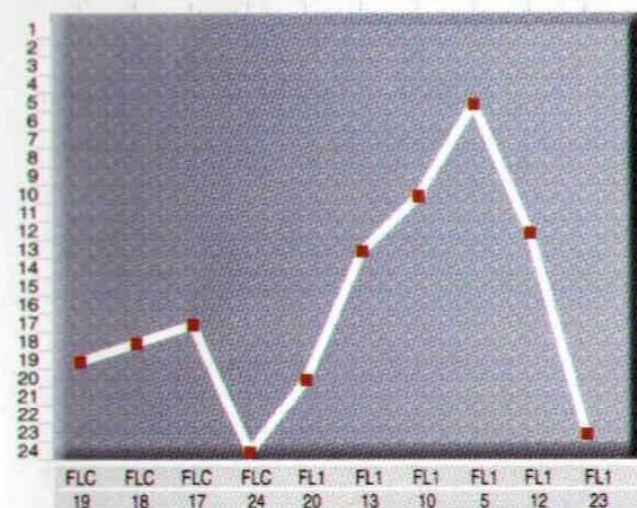

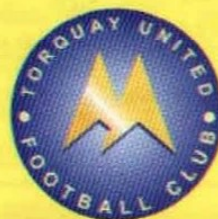
