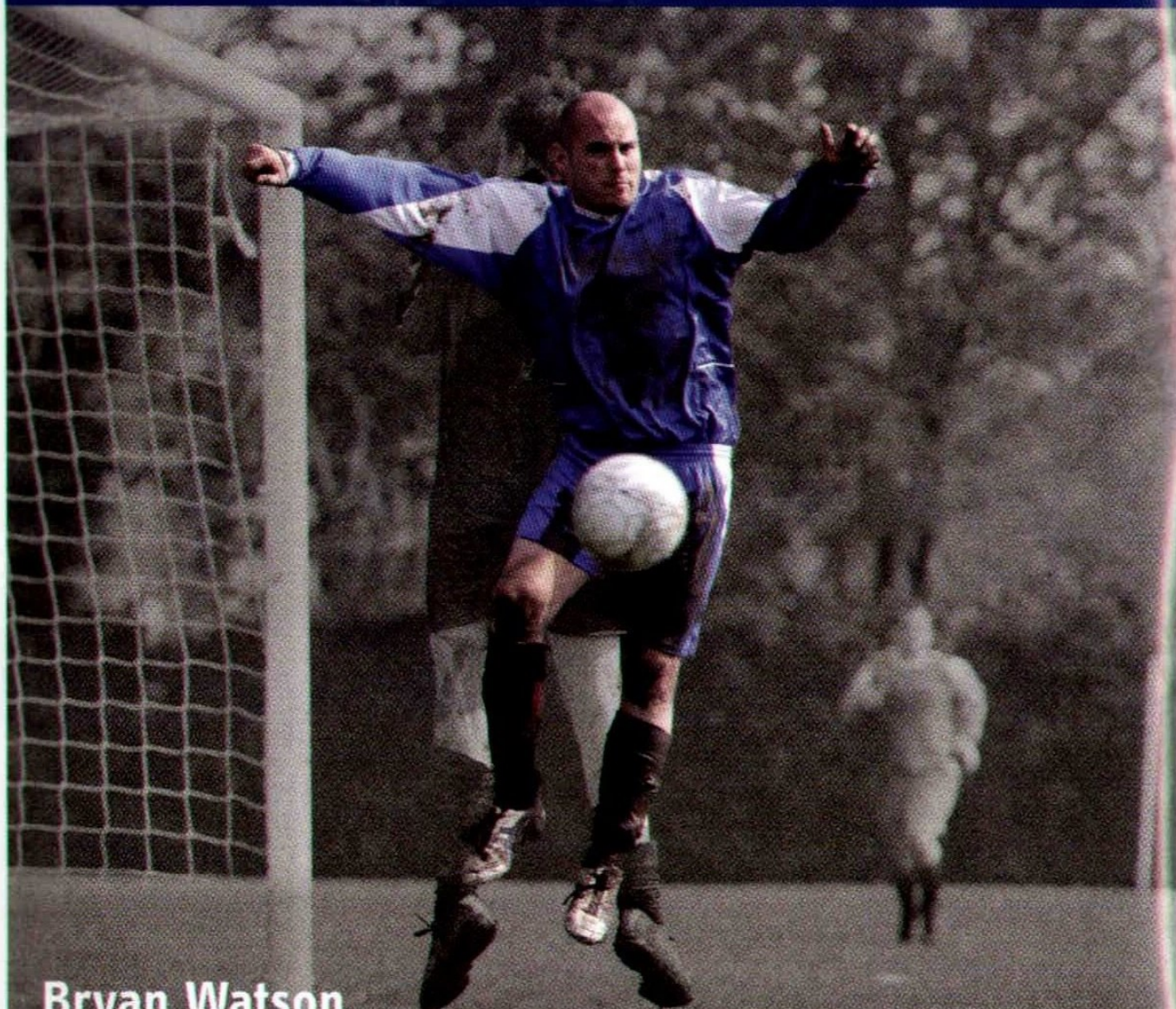

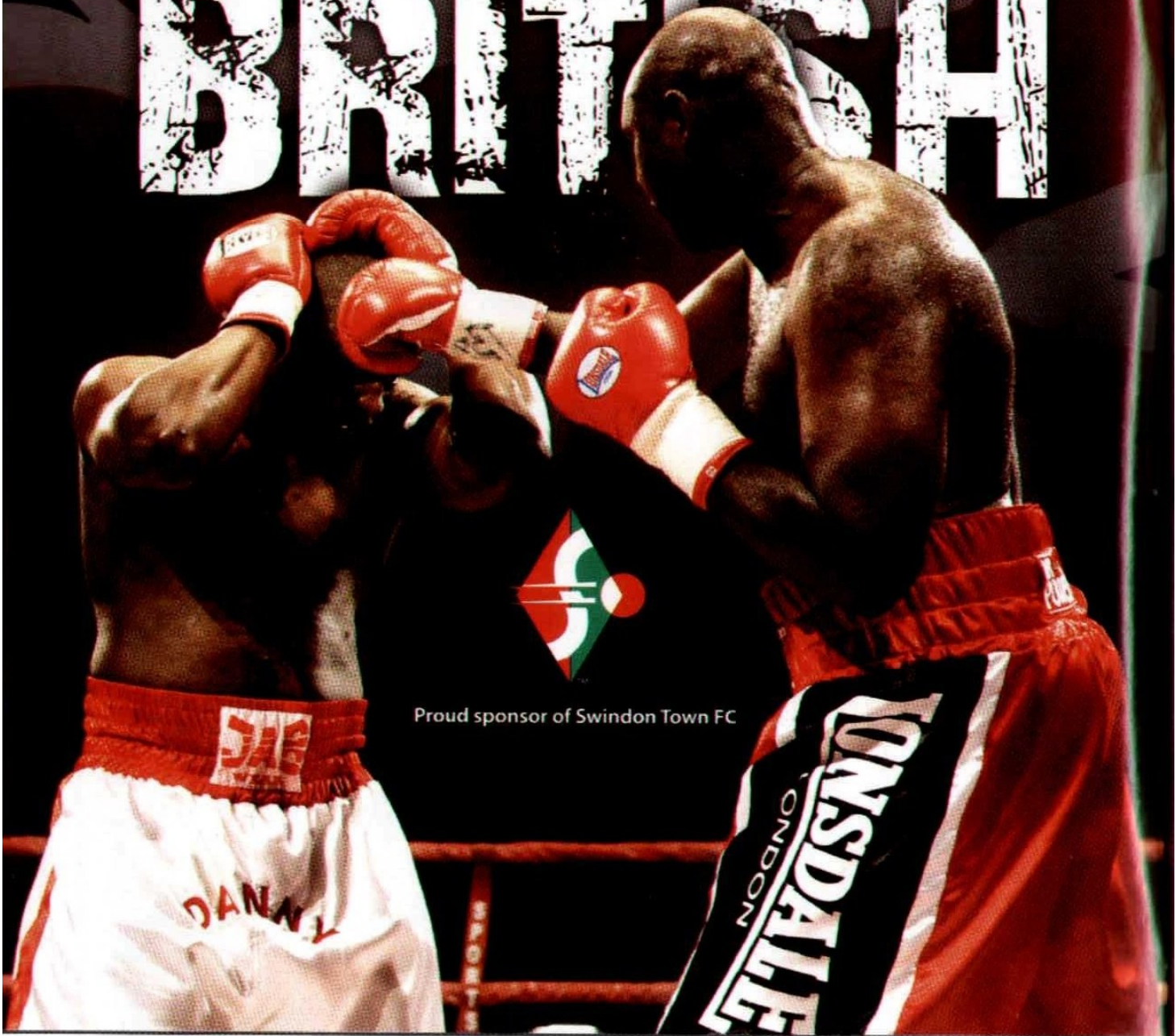

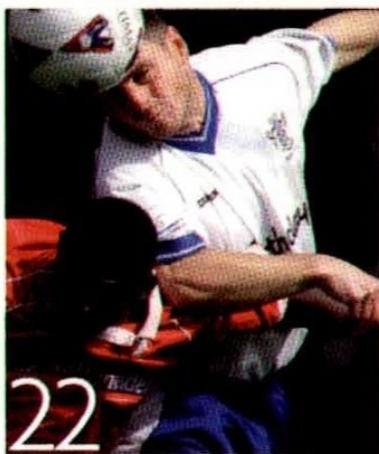

Good afternoon and welcome to this afternoon's game with Bury back at The County Ground.

Last weekend we travelled down to Torquay and managed to come away with the vital win which has put us back up into the promotion places.

We have churned a result but not played well which, if we are going for promotion,

Micky Evans very well and Phil Smith had a solid game. I am a great believer in continuity and he made two great saves again last weekend. He will get another start this afternoon because he has deserved his chance.

Unfortunately we come into today's game with a couple of injuries. Paul Evans came off early on last weekend with a knee injury. He had a scan in midweek

then we have to do that. The back four and goalkeeper did very well but as an offensive unit, we were disappointing.

The expectation levels after the Carlisle game were high but a win is a win and it's another three points under our belts. The penalty decision went our way and we got the rub of the green on this occasion.

We had lost our two league games prior to going down to Devon and it was vital to get back on track. Andy and Jerel handled

but at the time of writing we don't know the extent of his lay-off. Michael Pook also sustained a knee injury he picked up his fifth yellow of the campaign last weekend so misses today's game through suspension anyhow.

Andy Monkhouse and Charlie Comyn-Platt have now both left the club on one month loan deals. Andy had been out with a hamstring injury and with the limited reserve games we have this season I felt it best for him to get out and get



some regular matches under his belt. We have good cover on the left hand side of midfield with Sofienne Zaaboub and Aaron Brown in contention at present.

Sofienne had another solid game last weekend and soldiered up and down the left flank. Andy Caton and David Stroud can also play there so there are options for us. Charlie is in a similar situation after injury and has joined Grays Athletic and I think he will benefit from regular games.

Michael Timlin joined us on Thursday afternoon in a loan deal which will see him stay with us until January 1st 2007. I have seen him play for the Republic of Ireland Under 21 side and also for Fulham so know what he is capable of. He has experience in League One and I am sure he will definitely do a job here.

The next opportunity for us to bring players in will be January now. I have people in mind but until people have signed I don't get carried away. If players do come in January then they would be permanent moves and for those players who want to play for this football club.

Bury had an enthralling encounter with Weymouth in midweek for their FA Cup

First Round replay. Bury have now had one defeat in nine and that will probably make them favourites this afternoon.

Chris Casper has an excellent record and hopefully in a few games time we too will have a record to be proud of. Bury have two excellent strikers, a decent midfield and a mean defence so we will have to be on our guard. If we can take our form from the Carlisle game into this afternoon's encounter then hopefully we will come out with the result we all want.

The next month or two will bring its own pressure and we have to try and cement our place in the top three. I think every game brings pressure after relegation last season. This team has known how to win since the start of the season and we have to kick on now. There are challenges ahead for us and we have to be ready for them, starting today.

LEGENDS RETURN!

Swindon Town today welcome another set of legends to the club and they will all be enjoying pre-match hospitality in the executive area as part of the club's 125th Anniversary celebrations.

JOE BUTLER signed from Newcastle United in 1965 and his tenacious manner of play soon made him a great favourite. He scored 21 times in 428 appearances and was a member of the team that were victorious at Wembley on that famous afternoon in March 1969. He then played a season with Aldershot and has been involved in the taxi industry for a number of years.

ARTHUR HORSFIELD joined Swindon after playing for both Newcastle and Middlesbrough. 'King Arthur' soon became a cult hero with the Town End scoring a hat trick against Roma in an Anglo Italian Match. Arthur scored a total of 57 goals in 132 appearances before moving onto Charlton and Watford where he netted over 70 more goals. Arthur now lives in Gravesend and is a



manager for Royal Mail.

WILLIE PENMAN also played for Newcastle United before joining the club in 1966. A very skilful player, Willie netted 22 times in 120 games and came on as substitute for John Smith at Wembley. He later played for Walsall and had periods of management at both Cheltenham and Dundalk, before setting up his own sports business in Walsall where he still lives.

CHRIS JONES signed for the Town in 1968 from First Division

Manchester City for whom he made his league debut. A very hard working player Chris came off the bench on many occasions to net a vital goal, none more so than the winner at Rotherham which clinched promotion for the 68/69 team. Chris netted a total of 20 goals in 78 games before returning north where he netted over 100 goals in the rest of his career, he now lives in York.

Town legends DON ROGERS and JOHN TROLLOPE are also with the party this afternoon. We hope you all enjoy your day!

DEADLINE DEALS

Thursday's loan deadline came and went with two players leaving SNI and one new signing arriving.

Fulham midfielder Michael Timlin has signed for the club until 1st January 2006. Timlin is a talented central midfielder and he has spent loan spells at Scunthorpe United and Doncaster Rovers.

He started his Fulham career as a left-winger but was converted to central midfield by Fulham's then Academy Director, Steve Kean. The switch paid remarkable dividends for the player as he made rapid through the Academy's ranks and on to the international stage with the Republic of Ireland. Last season Timlin made two appearances for Fulham and captained the Republic of Ireland Under 21 side to victory in the Madeira Cup.

Andy Monkhouse has left the club for a month's loan spell at Hartlepool United, whilst Charlie Comyn-Platt also departed with Andy King's Grays Athletic the destination, also on a one month loan deal.

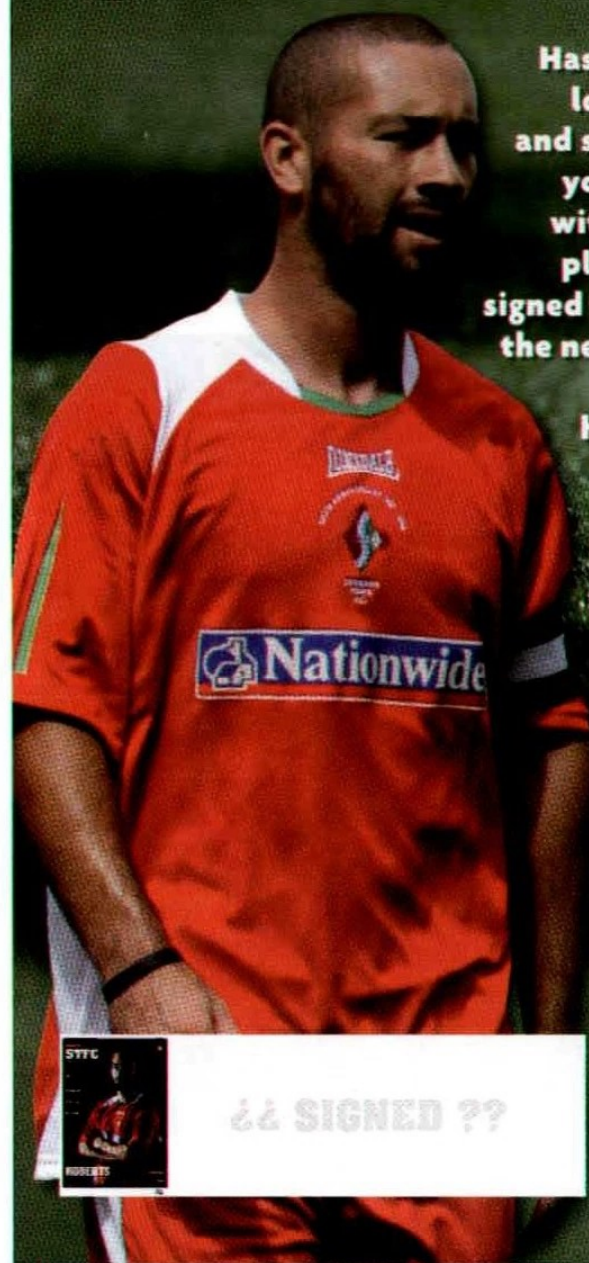

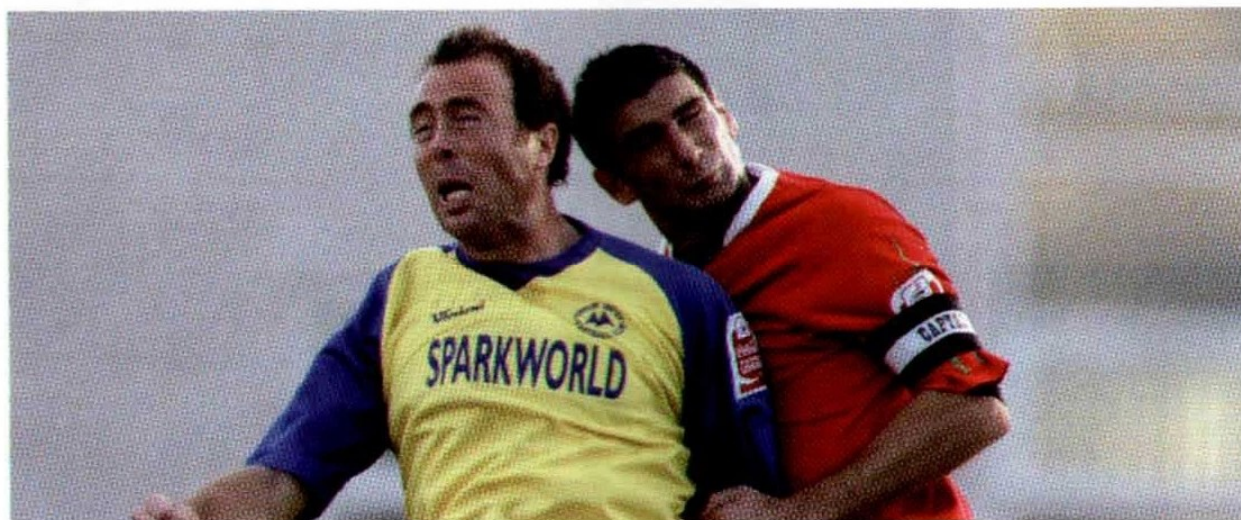

MANAGER

CHRIS CASPER

Ardent Swindon Town fans may remember Bury manager Chris Casper who enjoyed a loan spell at The County Ground back in September 1997. The defender joined Town on a two-month loan from Manchester United and made ten appearances for The Robins, scoring one goal.

Burnley-born Casper, son of former Bury coach Frank Casper, joined The Shakers at the start of the 2003/04 season as Youth Team Manager after his own playing career was halted through a severe injury.

Chris joined Manchester United as a trainee in 1991 and signed professional in January 1993. He captained the England Youth team and was a member of their European Championship winning side in 1993 and the England under 21 sides in Toulon 1996.

He joined Reading on loan in September 1998 before making a permanent move to the Madjeski Stadium. A further 45 games followed and more would have followed but for a horrific challenge that saw a double break in his leg. Court proceedings followed and Chris was awarded damages for loss of earnings and his career as a professional football player.

Following the dismissal of Graham Barrow, Chris initially took over as caretaker manager, but after an impressive run of results and performances, and an equally apt set of interviews, Chris was appointed manager on 15 October just before Bury beat Darlington at Gigg Lane.





BURY

This is the third successive weekend that today's visitors have faced opposition from the south west of the country.

The day after we overcame League One Carlisle United in the FA Cup, Bury faced Conference side Weymouth where they were held 2-2, and last weekend as we recorded a win at Torquay United, Chris Casper's team were being defeated by two goals to nil by Bristol Rovers at Gigg Lane.

Both results could be considered somewhat of a shock. The loss to Rovers last weekend dropped Bury down a place to ninth in the table, but in truth, with just three wins from ten home attempts, it's fair to say the Shakers' league position is built mostly on their away results.

That suggests today's opponents are formidable on their travels, something that is borne out by the facts. Bury have won their last four away League games.

Manager Chris Casper is the son of Burnley legend Frank. He played nine times at centre back for Town in a loan spell from Manchester United in 1997, scoring the goal that won the game against Tranmere

Rovers on 13th September nine years ago. After some impressive work at Team Bath, he took over at Gigg Lane in October 2005.

The Shakers' top scorer is Andy Bishop with eight goals so far. He's followed by Glynn Hurst who has hit six, but Bury have potential problems at the other end of the pitch.

Goalkeeper Kasper Schmeichel, the son of another famous father, plays his last game of a loan spell from Manchester City today. Veteran custodian Alan Fettis is out with a broken arm and Joe Lewis recently joined on a trial from Norwich. Aaron Grundy is making the step up from trainee and played against the Terras of Weymouth to prevent Schmeichel becoming cup-tied.

There is an eight-point gap between the two teams this afternoon and Paul Sturrock's start at the County Ground has yielded two straight wins. With Bury's away form as it is, this looks like being an intriguing encounter.

02 PAUL SCOTT Defender

'Scotty' signed for the Shakers mid August 2004 on non-contract terms after being released by promoted Huddersfield Town at the end of the 2003/04 season and became the third ex-Terrier to join the Shakers. A versatile player, he rose through the academy system at Huddersfield and eventually became a regular for the Terrier's reserve's and first team.

03 TOM KENNEDY Defender

Defender who is one of many current players to have progressed through the clubs Youth Team. He made his full league debut on Boxing Day 2003 and since then has rarely missed a game since. Tom has a left foot that many top players would die for and can deliver inch perfect crosses into the box.

04 JOHN FITZGERALD Defender

Dublin-born centre-half who joined the Shakers on loan from Premiership neighbours Blackburn Rovers in January 2005, he remained with the club until the end of the 2004/05 season and after being released by Blackburn quickly agreed terms with Bury and signed

a two-year deal and is now in his final year of his current contract.

05 DAVE CHALLINOR Defender

A tough tackling and fearless skipper, Dave is also the original master of the 'long throw' having used it to good effect in his Tranmere Rovers days. Chall's league career began at Prenton Park where he made over 150 appearances for Tranmere before moving on to Stockport County in 2002. He joined Bury during the 2003/04 season on a three month loan deal, which was then made permanent after his release by the Hatters.

06 COLIN WOODTHORPE Defender

A player with vast experience, including European games under his belt. Colin began his career with newly promoted Chester City as an apprentice in 1985, five years and 155 appearances he found his way to Norwich City and was a part of the UEFA Cup success the Canaries had. Other former clubs include Aberdeen and Stockport County.

08 DWAYNE MATTIS Midfielder

Irish midfielder who arrived at Gigg Lane during the summer of 2004 on

a free transfer from Huddersfield Town. He finished his first season as the Supporters Player of the season and Website Player of the season. He was given his first league start by Lou Macari at the McAlpine during the 2001/02 season and went onto play over 50 games for the Terriers.

10 TOM YOUNGS Striker

23-year old frontman who joined Bury from Leyton Orient in the summer of 2005. The striker was forced off early on during last weekend's home defeat to Bristol Rovers so may be out of contention for this afternoon's encounter.

12 ANDY BISHOP Striker

A former Walsall trainee who signed from non-league York City, but a striker that finished last season as the Conference League top scorer with 23 League goals. Andy joined the Shakers after rejecting a new deal at the Kit Kat Stadium in favour of League Football. He has also made league appearances for Kidderminster Harriers, Rochdale and Yeovil Town.

14 RICHIE BAKER Midfielder

A product of the youth system at





Preston North End. Richie joined the Shakers over the summer after being released by the Lilleywhites. Preston has decided to scrap their reserve side this season, and joining Bury will offer Richie the chance to gain some league football. With pace and ability on the ball, he is an asset to the side.

15 CHRIS BRASS

Defender

Joined the Shakers in January 2006 and signed a new one year deal in the summer. A former Burnley captain with 142 games for the Turf Moor side, Brass has great experience and has also managed York City. Tough-tackling defender who motivates those around him.

17 DAVID BUCHANAN

Midfielder

Product of the club youth system, David is now into his second professional contract at the. A tough tackling midfield pocket dynamo. David was also a member of the Northern Ireland U19 squad and is now a member of the U21 side having played four times at the higher level.

18 MARC PUGH

Midfielder

19-year old midfielder who arrived at Gigg Lane on trial in mid-February and impressed for the reserve side with two well-taken goals in as many games. He was then offered a contract and has gone on to impress with his



excellent close control and exciting style. Has two goals to his name so far this term.

25 KASPER SCHMEICHEL

Goalkeeper

Nineteen-year old keeper who is on loan from Manchester City and joined the Shakers at the back end of August for his second spell at Gigg Lane. Kasper arrived at Gigg Lane during the 2005/06 season and made 15 appearances, 5 of them clean sheets. Son of Danish goalkeeping legend Peter Schmeichel, this is the last game of his loan spell.

28 GLYN HURST

Striker

30-year old striker on loan from Shrewsbury Town. Started his career with his Barnsley and has had successful spells with Ayr, Stockport, Chesterfield and Notts County. He knows where the net is and has scored 114 goals in 268 league starts to date and will be a threat this afternoon.

A Ben Wells strike was cancelled out by Danny Clay with this Wiltshire Premier Shield Semi-Final First leg ending all square at The County Ground.

Swindon Town named a strong side to face Salisbury City, who arrived in SN1 just days after their FA Cup success against Fleetwood. Former Town keeper Matty Bulman started in goal for the visitors who also included former loanee Jon Beswetherwick amongst their substitutes.

Andy Monkhouse provided the first opportunity for the Town front two to attack a decent ball into the box on 9 minutes. Lonergan's long kick downfield was left by Jutkiewicz and the ball rolled out to Monkhouse on the left touchline. His deep cross threatened to cause problems before Lee Stevens came across to clear the danger.

Gareth Whalley, making his first start since the Johnstone's Paint Trophy exit at Wycombe Wanderers, was enjoying his return to the side and linked up well with Monkhouse on the left.

Ben Wells opened the scoring on 33 minutes. Lukas Jutkiewicz raced onto a lofted pass down the middle before lifting the ball over

the advancing Bulman, who got a touch to the ball on the edge of the area. The ball eventually fell to midfielder Ben Wells who hit home from 16-yards to make it 1-0.

Declan McGregor then had an opening just minutes before the break. The Whites striker ghosted through the Town defence but having got to the ball at the byline, curled his effort back towards goal only for the returning Lonergan to gather.

Salisbury mustered together an equaliser on the stroke of half-time. A corner from Alex Haddow bounced around in the box and was stabbed home by former Exeter City midfielder Danny Clay.

The second half began with lengthy treatment for Salisbury City striker Declan McGregor who suffered under the challenge of Charlie Comyn-Platt. Michael Pook then hit a knock-down from Jutkiewicz over the bar on 50 minutes.

Lukas Jutkiewicz peeled away from his marker on the edge of the area with just two minutes remaining. Stroud picked him out with an incisive pass but Jutkiewicz's right foot lob landed just the wrong side of the post in front of the empty Town End.

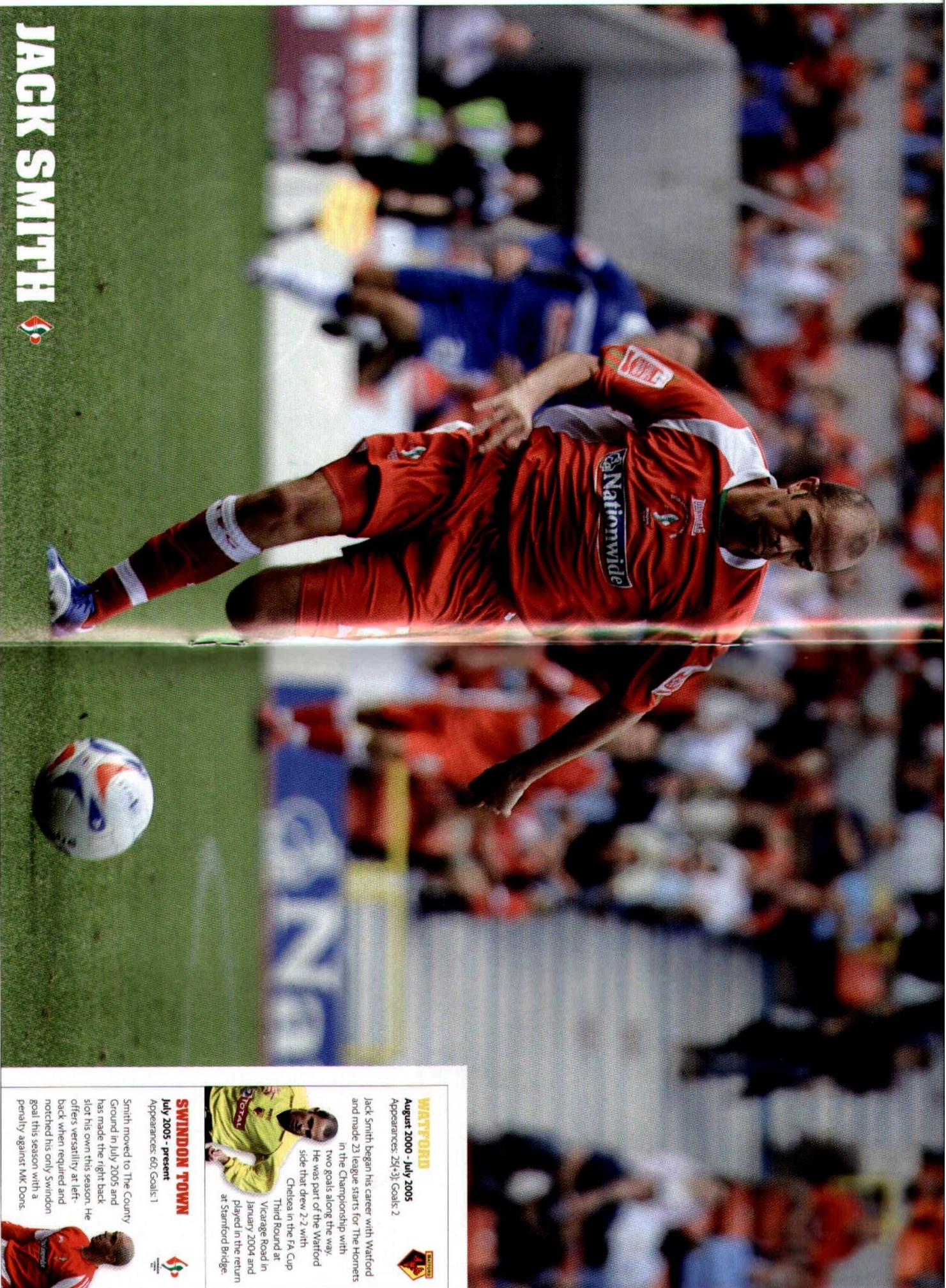

Yeah I'm quite pleased to be honest. I had a problem with my knee and so to come back and get a couple of goals is a fine way to come back. Long may it continue.

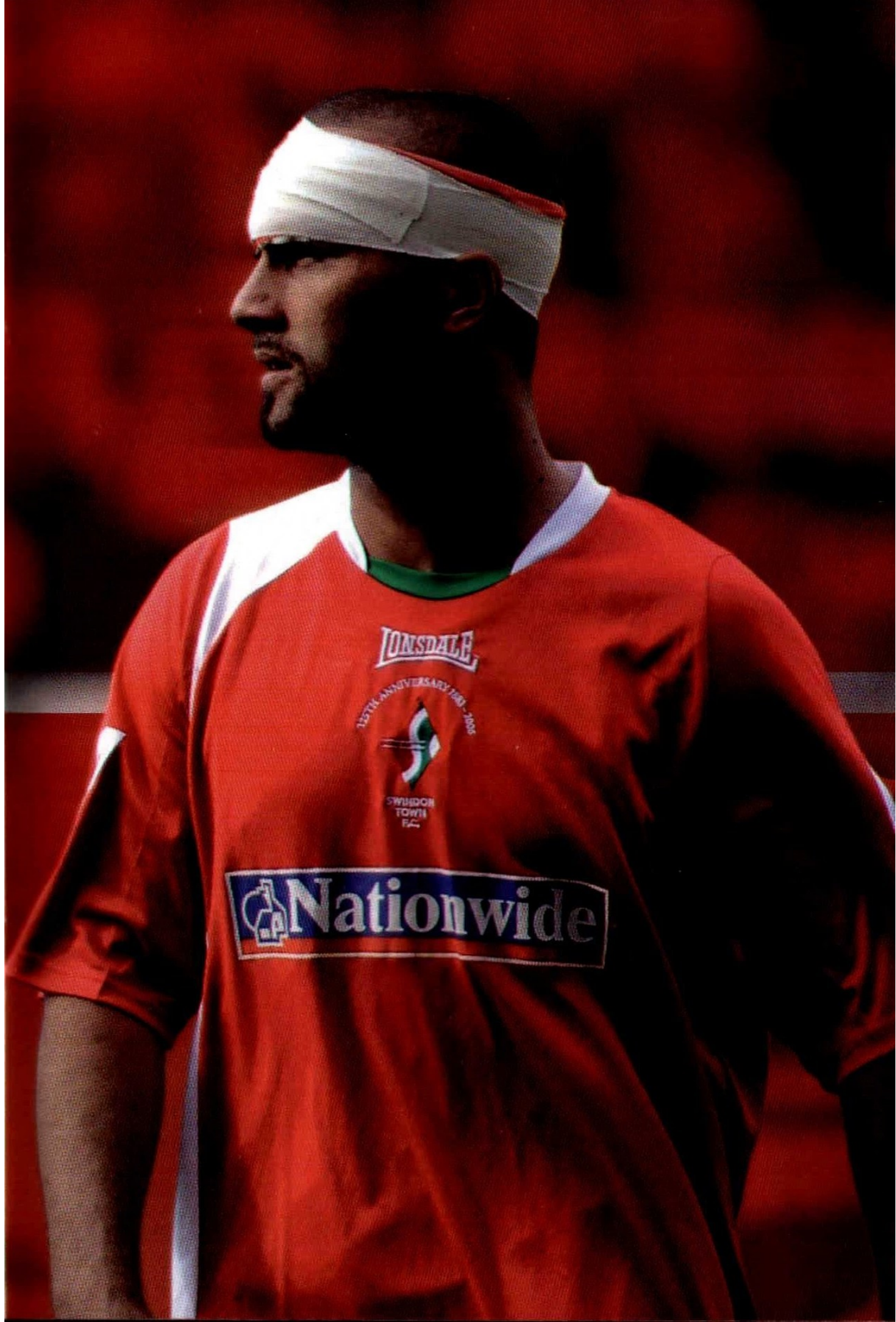
A lot of questions have been asked of the strikers this year, and so to score a run like this must be the perfect tonic?

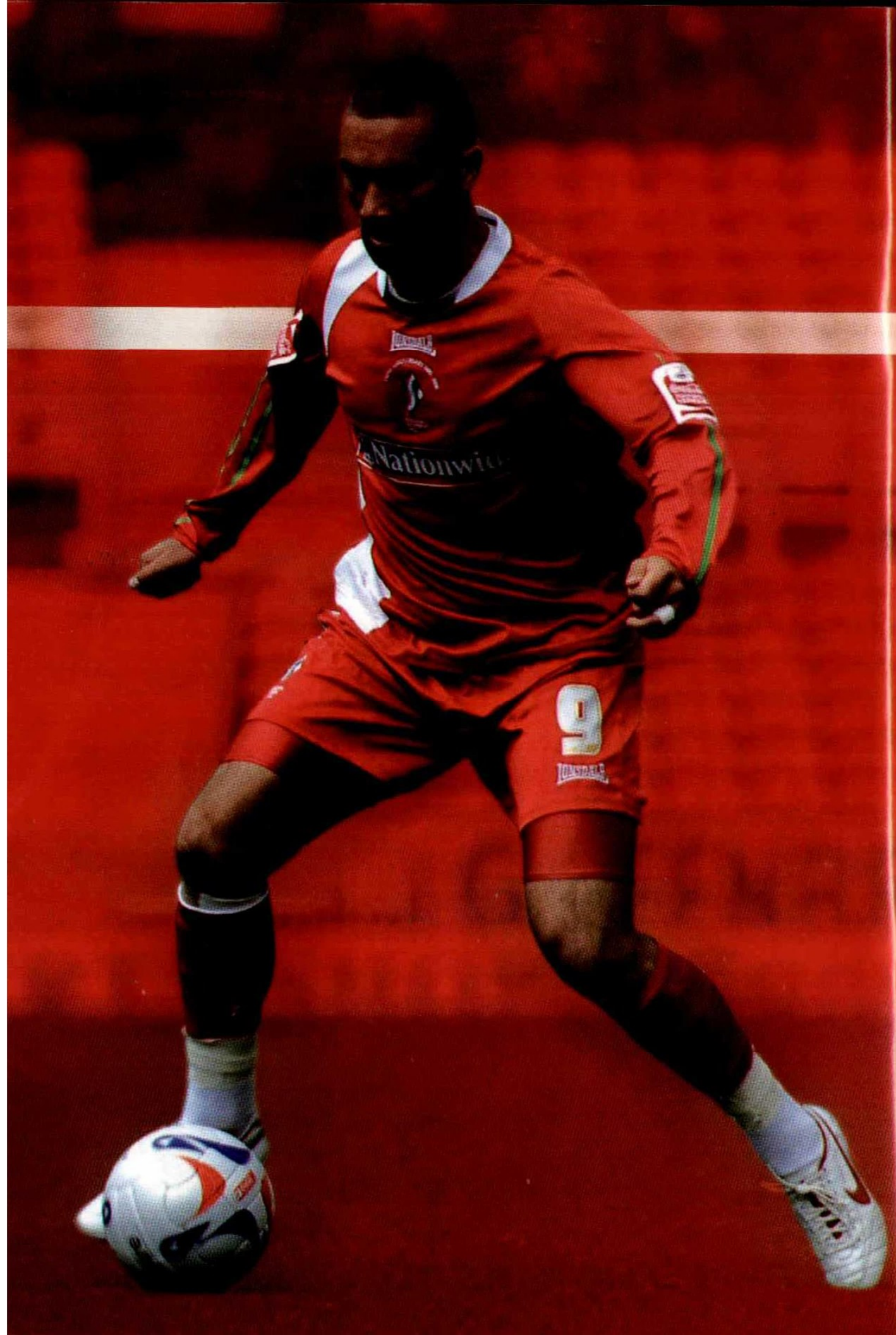
Strikers will always be judged with goals – I respect that and understand that – and so when you get some goals and some results – it's great. It's obviously

great for me if I'm scoring, but it's more important that the team keeps winning – scoring goals is more of a relief.

Lee, Royce and Fola alluded to the fact that the strikers have been working hard, and thankfully it looks to be paying off...

The team had an excellent run at the start of the season despite the fact that strikers didn't really find the net – and we kept on going. We were covered to an extent. But now more questions are being asked of us and thankfully for me in the last few weeks, it's been going well. It's an excellent confident boost.

So does the holiday offer still stand?

I spoke to Dennis a couple of weeks back and he was asking me about the injury. He also said that if I get the 20 I'll still get the holiday! To be honest if it happens it happens – it's a great incentive but like everything, we've moved on. I won't hold him to it but if it happens it happens.

There looked to be a bit of confusion over who would take the penalty at Torquay Saturday...

The way things have been going, with me scoring in the last few games – I just wanted it. I felt confident. Obviously I missed one at the start of the season – that's where the confusion came from. Yet as a striker the last thing you want to do is pass up an opportunity to score when you're in good form. I spoke to Jack Smith after the game and it's amazing, apparently 33% of penalties will be missed this season – so there must be more of an advantage going against the goalkeeper at the moment.

And a nice way for you to silence their fans!

Yeah, that's the mentality of fans. Going back to Devon, I had an excellent time down there playing for Exeter – the Torquay fans will always try and hold you to it – but that's fine by me.

Our away support was superb?

It's amazing that our fans give up

their Saturday and go all the way to Torquay, it's a couple of hours away – it's fantastic. We were lucky enough to get a win to thank them and despite the fact that it wasn't a fantastic performance, we got the win and that's the main thing.

The Gaffer was disappointed with the overall performance, what has he been working on in training this week?

He's been working on the attacking side – how to get into areas of the pitch and get crosses into the box – he wants us to be an attacking force. As a striker that's fantastic, so hopefully if we can maintain it gives us the chance to get some goals.

What have you made of the Gaffer so far?

He's come in and told us the way he wants us to play and it's up to us to adjust to that. It sounds really interesting and hopefully I can be an integral part of that. He's going to be looking to make changes but hopefully I'm the sort of player he wants around. I enjoy it at Swindon – I've had a rocky time here but things are looking positive for me now. I'm up for the task ahead and hopefully I can keep going for a few more seasons – starting with promotion this season.

The Gaffer has said he may bring a striker in, that we're not clinical enough – does that bring the best out of you – would you welcome competition?

It will motivate me. When managers come to clubs they have ideas and players in mind – I'm not silly enough to ignore that. After what I've gone through in the last year I appreciate every game like it's my last and so it's important for me to have a good season. I've played 13 games and scored six so my stats aren't too bad – it's all about adjusting to what's being asked of you. Promotion is on the main list of priorities this season and I want to be a part of it.

That's two A-list managers this season now!

It's been up and down. Wisey was a great character and it was good experience to work under him. He lifted us when perhaps we were losing faith after what happened last season and he had some good ideas – we all enjoyed it. But the new Gaffer is another character – he's done ever so well at Plymouth – he has experience with big clubs and he's come to help us achieve our main aim this season.

You were high on confidence early on in the season and look like you're coming back into that now...

I was and it was partly due to the pre-season I had. I lost a lot of weight from what I was playing at last season, then I had the knee injury – which thankfully is sorted at the moment and I'm starting to get back to that. I'm confident and when you're confident everything seems to fall into place. I'm enjoying playing

and enjoying scoring goals and we've been winning games. I've scored in each of my last three games and hopefully I can keep this going over the next four months.

Big game today...

Every game is a must-win game. It starts today then Mansfield Tuesday and six points is a must from the two – that would be a bonus for Christmas time, a period when we play so many games. If we can come into January on a high then we can really push on. The Walsall game will be massive and if we can get through the FA Cup, too... but first and foremost let's try and get six points in the bag.

What do we know about Bury?

To be honest I don't concentrate on anyone else – I'm not that kind of footballer. I focus on what we've got to do – everything else will take care of itself. I do know that they've won eight of their last ten, so they'll be confident, but a confident Swindon Town should be good enough to beat anyone.

Hopefully Kasper Schmeichel won't be looking to emulate his old man in goal...

His father's a legend! But hopefully we'll give him more than he can cope with.

And Morecambe in the FA Cup – who would you fancy in round three if we make it?

It's written on the cards isn't it... it

would have to be Leeds. Or Chelsea or Manchester United. Why not? It's a fantastic chance for the club to earn a few quid. I'd rather that than play a team we have more of a chance of beating – it would be a great occasion for the players and fans – it would be the icing on the cake.

You have been enjoying your football this season – how refreshing has it been to go out there and enjoy it following the problems you had last year?

There's no hiding the problems I've been through and I seem to be in a decent place right now. I've almost got a year's sobriety behind me, which is a fantastic achievement for me, and the people that have supported me. Julian and James at the Sporting Chance Clinic, my wife, my kids and my family – things are going really well. I'm enjoying being a father, a husband – you know, I appreciate my wife for standing by me. It's been a hard time for her but we seem to have got through it together and life is ok. I spend my nights chilling with my kids – living a normal life not trying to race the roads and doing things I shouldn't be doing as a professional footballer.

You must be relieved that you went down the road of recovery because there is a huge stigma attached to alcohol in football...

Football, alcohol and gambling all seem to be connected through our lifestyle, and people always say we

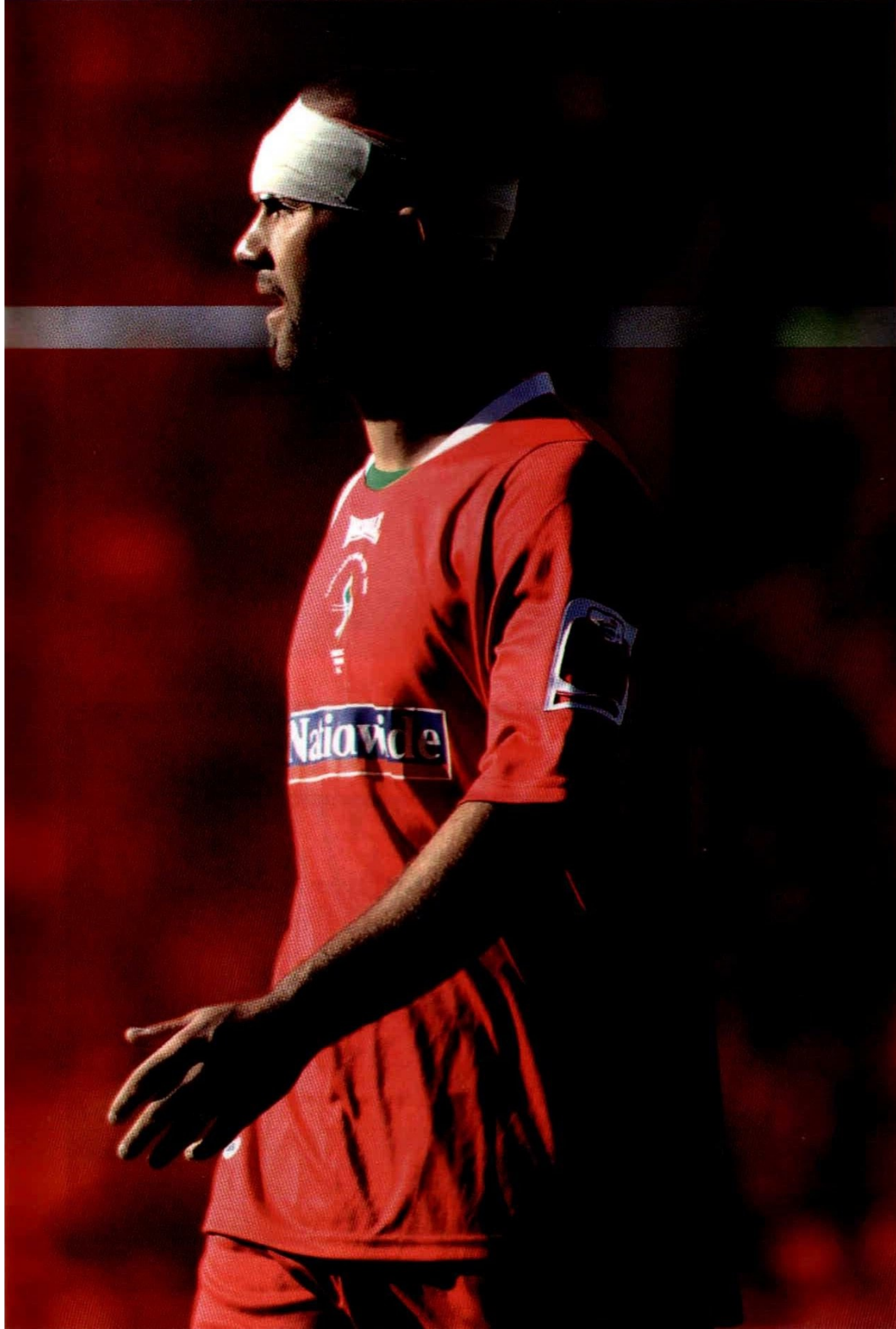
get too much time on our hands. But if you want a drink you'll find one in the Sahara desert and thankfully I have come through those times. If I can help anyone in any way now, youngsters coming through then I would be happy to do that. I've seen both sides of the life footballers can live, the right and the wrong way and I'm on the right road now. I have a fantastic background with my family and friends – so it's all going in the right direction now.

Promotion this season would cap a fine year for you...

If they said to me you don't play again but we win promotion then so be it. Obviously I want to be a part of that but it would be the icing on the cake for me personally. We have a good squad, some good players and hopefully we can achieve what we set out to do last June.

Now you've received some stick in these pages for your musical tastes in the dressing room...

People listen to iPods at work and I like to have music in the dressing room. Shakesy is the main man for music, but it's important to get the adrenaline going. I don't like quietness before a game – it annoys me! I probably annoy others but we all have our own ways. I used to sit next to Reevesy and he wouldn't let anyone touch his shin pads or boots. Whatever prepares you best you have to do. I like my music and at the moment Shakesy is supplying some decent tunes.

Some of you may have read on the website this week that we have announced Adam Greaney as the new Disability and Twilight Football Development Officer for STFC. Adam previously worked as a Football in the Community Officer for the past two years after graduating from Leeds Metropolitan Carnegie University with a degree in Sport & Recreation

Development. With Adam taking up these two roles it will allow STFC Football in the Community, and their local partners, to deliver more sessions and make football more accessible for footballers with disabilities and disaffected young people.

Both positions have been awarded a Football Foundation grant, coupled with other local partnership funding such as the Wilts FA, Swindon Borough Council and the Wiltshire & Swindon Sports & Activity Partnership (WASP) who all help fund the positions will enable the projects to deliver more coaching sessions, tournaments, festivals and further personal development for participants. 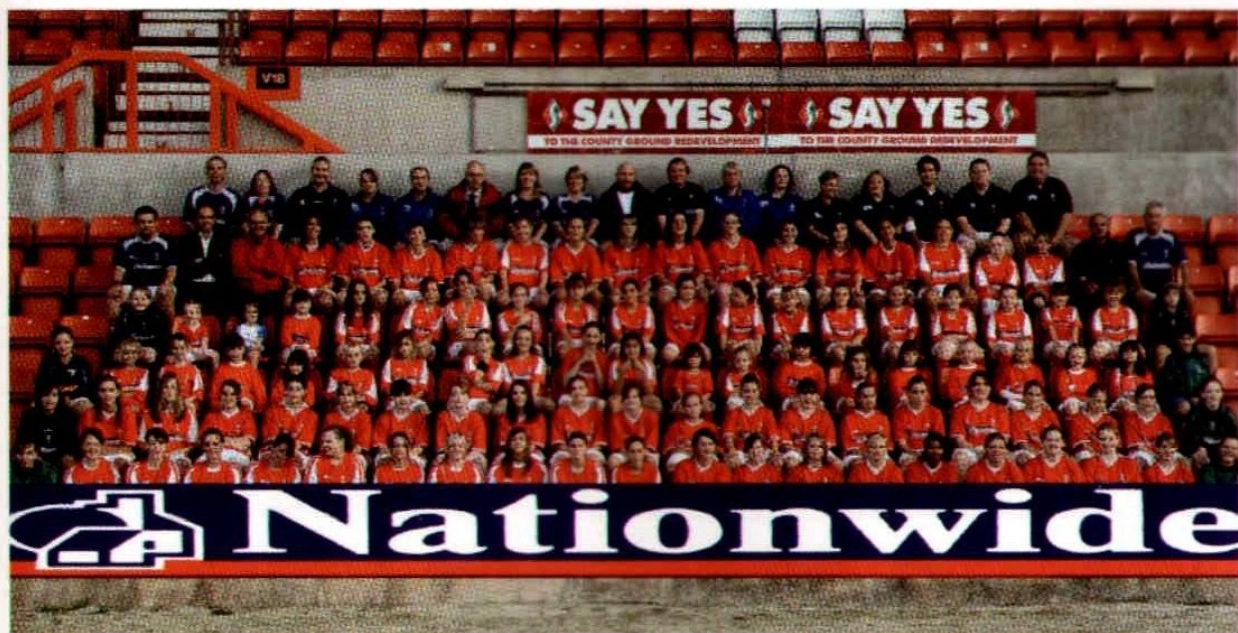

JENKINS, STEVE

Unlike Tommy, Jenks mark two was a Welshman, as so many Jenkins' seem to be.

After starting with Swansea City, the defender moved on to Huddersfield Town for £275,000 and almost 260 appearances followed. Let's not dwell on the fact that the price the Terriers paid to take Steve to Huddersfield was the only time he cost a club a fee.

A loan spell at Birmingham City, then his free transfers, firstly back to South Wales and Cardiff City, then Notts County and Peterborough United preceded his move to Swindon just over two years ago. Again, no money changed hands.

Oh, we've just dwelt on it!

Steve was a consistent defender who turned out for Town on over 50 occasions, and was released at the end of last season. His only goal for us came at Bournemouth in September of last year, and it came in a 2-1 defeat in the middle of an eight game losing run. Rory Fallon was the only other man to score during the entire period.

But we hadn't brought him in as a goal scorer. Steve Jenkins' steady influence at the back was appreciated.



JENKINS, TOMMY

When star winger Don Rogers was sold to Crystal Palace in 1972, the board were faced with a huge hole to fill. How do you replace someone who has been raised to god-like status by the supporters at the County Ground?

With £150,000 from the Don's sale burning a hole in their pocket, the board sanctioned a bid for Southampton and London-born wide man Tommy Jenkins, and £50,000 was spent bringing the ex-Reading man to Swindon.

The Royals had spent just £1,500 capturing Jenkins from Margate in the summer of 1969, but turned that into a massive 4,000% profit when he went to the Dell just five months later for £60k. That's some business.

After a little over 80 appearances and four goals at the Dell, Town manager Dave MacKay brought Jenkins to Wiltshire, and then he disappeared to take over at Nottingham Forest.

Tom made 100 appearances for us, netting four League goals as we dropped from Division Two to Division Three. Help from older readers to explain to their siblings how that relates to the current naming of the Football League would be appreciated here.

Les Allen and then Danny Williams both gave Jenkins a chance, then in February 1976 Jenks made his last appearance in a 3-0 home defeat to Peterborough and that was that. Tommy was off to the States to play in Seattle, leaving Trevor Anderson and David Moss to continue the wing play for Swindon Town.

Don's boots were big to fill. Tommy tried, but ultimately failed.



JOHNSTONE'S PAINT TROPHY

We're up to J, so it's time for another glance at the knock out cup for the bottom two divisions. This season it's been christened the

JUVENTUS



On 2nd May 1970, Town took on a small Italian team by the name of Juventus. The occasion was the Anglo/Italian Inter-League Clubs Competition and the match took place at the County Ground with 12,879 in attendance.



Juve weren't too bad a side then, as now. In fact by the time Town faced the Italian side, they had been crowned their country's champions a dozen times, most recently in 1967, and were on course to win it again in 1972 and 1973.

Town not only beat their well-respected guests, but did so convincingly. By four goals to nil actually. Goals from Peter Noble (pictured), Stan Harland and a brace from Arthur Horsfield did the damage.

Two weeks later we travelled to Turin for the away encounter. The crack team were surely wounded. Town could expect a backlash. Peter Noble grabbed the only goal of the game and we'd humbled them in their own back yard as well.

Not bad eh? Can Man U lay claim to sticking five past Juventus for no reply? Thought not.

Back in the 1990's with Arsenal in Europe, I wrote to then ITV presenter Bob Wilson to point out that the TV companies often stated that the Gunners had been the first to defeat Juve in Italy in European competition.

This was plainly a mistake and perhaps he'd like to put the record straight I suggested. Particularly as it was him who Don Rogers had left grovelling in the mud at Wembley in 1969 and given Town the chance to face Juventus in the first place.

The Anglo/Italian was not deemed a senior competition, the Chesterfield-born, Scottish international replied. What would he know?

Johnstone's Paint Trophy, a catchy little monicker if ever there was.

Despite yet another change of title, the competition remains pretty much the same as usual, except that a draw after 90 minutes sees the game go straight into penalties rather than the customary 30 minutes extra-time first.

If the change of name confused anyone at the beginning of the season, it wouldn't have been long before a familiar feeling washed over us. Town were knocked out in the first round. It's good to know where you stand isn't it?

JONES - VARIOUS

Taking a look at the players who have represented Town under the name of Jones is like searching a Chinese phone book for someone called Wong. You have to use your

fingers and toes to keep up with the Jones' who have pulled on Swindon's red and white.

In fact, it's possible to construct a tidy looking side made up entirely from men called Jones.

Starting with Roy in goal and a back four of Ken, Arthur, Dai and Albert, the midfield could comprise of Mark, Tom (pictured) and Morris and raiding left-sided wide man Fred. Up front Eddie and Chris could complete the team. It wouldn't have been short of experience either. Altogether the eleven men made

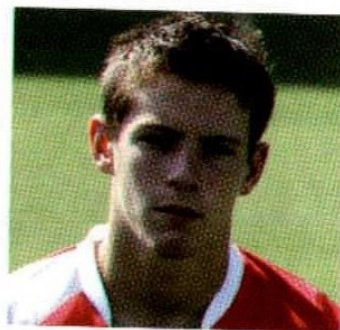


772 appearances for Town.

With 17 Jones' all told, there's even enough left to have a full substitute's bench as well. And think of how simple it would be for the people in the club shop, sticking names on the backs of replica shirts.

JARRETT, ALBERT

Spent two months on loan here at the County Ground last season making half a dozen appearances and also featured in an unfortunate car crash. The London-born wide man came in from Brighton in January of this year and made a move to Premiership Watford in the summer.



JUTKIEWICZ, LUKAS

This young lad is making a good impact and at the ripe old age of 17 is now on his fourth Town manager already. All of them have valued Lukas' abilities, and five of the last six League games of last season saw Lukas take to the pitch under Iffy Onuora.

And new boss Paul Sturrock looks ready to continue giving the strong front man a chance to impress.

His ball to Christian Roberts to allow 'Robbo' to complete the scoring in the final minute against Carlisle United in the FA Cup a couple weeks ago will have helped the new boss form an opinion.

A bright future beckons for the 6ft 11in striker.

AWAY SUPPORTERS

Town supporters will be housed in the Healthland (William Sharp) Stand at one end of the ground, where around 2,000 fans can be accommodated. There are a few supporting pillars at the front which could impede your view. The good news though, is that even a small amount of away fans can really make some noise and make a good atmosphere. A trip to Walsall can be disappointing in terms of trying to get there and the stadium itself, but is more than countered by the relaxed atmosphere around the ground and the friendliness of the Walsall fans themselves.

GETTING THERE

In general getting to Walsall is pretty easy from Wiltshire. The ground is right next to the M6, in fact you can see it from the motorway just north of the RAC Control Centre. Unfortunately, this stretch of motorway normally has a large traffic jam on both Saturday lunchtimes, so allow 'extra-time'.

By Road: Leave the M6 at Junction 7 and take the A34 towards Walsall (beware of speed cameras on this stretch of dual carriageway). At the end of the dual carriageway turn left at the Bell Inn public house into Walstead Road (sign posted Bescot Stadium, Bescot Station Park & Ride). Continue straight on this road for two miles, passing another pub called the Tiger on your left. You will come to Bescot Stadium and entrance to the away end on your right.

Parking: There is a good-sized car park located at the ground (cost £3) and behind the away stand, which lends itself to a quick getaway after the match. Alternatively there is some

street parking to be had off Wallowes Lane.

By Rail: Note that if you go by train, Bescot Stadium has its own station, situated behind the away end only a few minutes walk from the turnstiles. Trains run there on a local line from Birmingham New Street and the journey time is around 20 minutes. There is a regular service on Saturdays along this line and you should not have too many problems getting away after the game.

AROUND THE GROUND

The King George V in Wallowes Lane is okay, but as the nearest pub to the ground it gets rather busy which can make it a bit difficult to get served quickly. It is about a 15-minute walk away, opposite the Morrisons Supermarket. If you are walking from the stadium, go out of the official car parks and down towards McDonalds. Go past McDonalds on your right and take a left hand turn into Wallowes Lane. At the end of the lane turn left onto the main road and the pub is just setback on the left. Away fans should avoid the Fulbrook pub near to the ground.
