



DEBUTS FOR DUO





Good afternoon and welcome to this FA Cup Second Round tie with Morecambe at The County Ground.

Once again your support was welcomed last weekend and hopefully we can provide you with more cause for celebration at the final whistle today. Against Bury the conditions weren't ideal and that really didn't help us. Unfortunately I lost the toss and they turned us around. I told the lads just before kick-off that we had to get to half-time level and then push on in the second period; and that's what happened. We made hard work of it but as I said I think we deserved it.

Bury played very well in the opening twenty minutes and knocked the ball around well. They had a good go at us in the early stages and it wasn't until one of their lads went off injured that we got into the game. I thought we got a hold of things just before half-time


SAMMY MCILROY

His playing career needs no introduction, as he was a star of the Manchester United team during the 1970's and early part of the 1980's. Making his debut as a 17 year old, he became one of United's youngest ever players. After leaving United he went on to play over Stoke City and Manchester City.

After retiring Sammy enjoyed considerable success in management taking Macclesfield Town into the Football League as Conference Champions in 1997 and then gaining promotion from the then 4th Division to the 3rd Division.

Sammy then went on to manage his home country Northern Ireland before trying to rescue the fortunes of Stockport County, and after guiding them to safety at the end of 2003/04 season, he parted company with the Hatters in November 2004. Took over the reins at Morecambe on a permanent basis at the end of last season following the termination of long serving manager Jim Harvey's contract.





MORECAMBE

Awarm welcome to everyone who has made the journey down from Morecambe this afternoon for today's FA Cup second round tie. The occasion is a unique one, bringing as it does the first ever meeting between the two teams.

The Shrimps qualified for today's game through a 2-1 win over Kidderminster Harriers on the same day as we struck three past Carlisle United.


Wayne Curtis struck from the penalty spot to put the home side ahead before Michael Twiss doubled the lead. A late goal from the visitors was too little too late. Twiss is the club's top scorer with ten in all competitions.

A fifth place finish in last season's Conference brought a 4-3 aggregate play-off defeat by eventual winners Hereford United and raised hopes for another crack at promotion to the Football League this season. Currently sixth, those expectations look justified.

Last weekend, Morecambe hosted our local Conference side Forest Green Rovers when the two teams fought out a 1-1 draw. A 13th minute goal from Garry Thompson saw the home side take the lead before they were pegged back 15 minutes later. It was the first time Morecambe had not taken maximum points in six matches, but that still leaves our visitors unbeaten in eight.

Manager Sammy McIlroy has a wealth of experience at League level and can be expected to be well prepared should his team make the step up.

But for now, it's the FA Cup that both teams will be focussed upon, with the potential reward of a plum tie with a Premiership club on offer for the winners.

Joined from Blackburn Rovers on loan in November 2005 as cover for the injured Ryan Robinson. Kept a clean sheet on his debut and whilst with Blackburn Rovers he represented England at U17 level. A reliable keeper who has now signed a permanent deal with the Morecambe.

02 ADAM YATES Defender

Joined the Shrimps from Leek Town on the eve of the current season. Previously with Stoke City for 3 years, during which time he had a loan spell at Halifax Town. Made his debut on the first day of this season, coming on as a substitute against Burton Albion in the 0-1 home defeat. Has also played for the England non-league side.

What odds on Wayne banging in the winner tomorrow?



Another three points against Bury despite a disappointing performance...

Yeah, we had a terrible start to the game but we managed to turn it around in the first half – we started playing football. The pitch was wet, which made it difficult – it looked okay from the side but it was tough. We got some luck in the end – but three points is the main thing. We need to keep working on these wins now and build a performance to match the result.

You say he loves the internet...a bit like Ricky Shakes! He has his own MySpace site, is that something you're into at all?

I would never dream of that but Ricky loves it – when he lived down the road he would come round and go on the internet and chat to his mates. He loves all that!

The gaffer also seems to be encouraging the players to live

locally – that must great for you living in the area?

It's a big help. The Gaffer is making people stay over the night before a game so they're not travelling the day of the match. He has spoken to some people about where they're living and how it can affect them and any new player is being encouraged to live locally. It's just something he believes in and I think it adds to the collectiveness of the squad. It's always been a close-knit squad since I've been here, the lads have always got on – but this can only add to it.

And do you like the Stovies the gaffer's been encouraging the players to eat?

From what I can tell it's like a corned beef, potato hash concoction. It sounds awful – I hadn't had corned beef since I was about eight – but it's a Scottish thing that he's grown up eating it. He loves it – he calls it refuelling the body with something substantial – I'm sure he's making us eat it just so he can have it. With brown sauce and baked beans too! Some of the lads have double helpings to get on his good side. ■

Five home matches in the last six! Just in case you're getting bored with me, I've passed the anorak over to nephew Richard Adams for a trawl through the archives of our recent FA Cup campaigns - not particularly successful!

"In the past decade, Swindon Town haven't gone further than the 3rd round. Having said that, we haven't lost on home turf in the competition for five years (against then Premiership side Coventry City).

Ten years ago, we went out to Premiership side Everton, losing 3-0 at Goodison Park. In the 1997/98 season, disaster struck when the Town, in the 1st division of English football, lost 1-0 to Vauxhall Conference side Stevenage Borough, when Fraser Digby's goal kick blew back in the strong wind towards the goal in front of the Stratton Bank, only for Giuliano Grazioli (who later signed for us) to slot home to cause the upset. The next season saw a 3rd round defeat in a replay at Oakwell, Barnsley winning 3-1, following a goalless draw at home.

The 1999/2000 season saw a visit to The Valley in the 3rd round, where Swindon, at the wrong end of the 1st division, lost narrowly to Charlton, flying high in the same league, with Ty Gooden scoring the only goal

for the visitors. After seeing off non-league sides Ilkeston Town and Gateshead in the first and second rounds respectively, we welcomed Coventry City to The County Ground on January 6th 2001. The Sky Blues included the 19-year-old Chris Kirkland, who left for Liverpool the following season for £6million. In front of a full house, a 2-0 defeat. This is the last time Swindon lost at home in the FA Cup. Coventry were relegated at the end of the season.

The following year, the Town again got to the 3rd round, only to be knocked out by Manchester City at Maine Road. City, like Charlton two years previously in the season they knocked out Swindon, went on to win the 1st division and promotion to the Premiership.

We can write as little as possible about 2002/03. Live on BBC One in front of millions, as well as 11,641 at the Kassam Stadium, Swindon had the embarrassment of losing to local rivals Oxford from the division below, and to make

matters worse, our near-neighbours were then paired with the eventual winners Arsenal at Highbury!

The next three campaigns all saw a 4-1 result in Swindon's FA Cup matches. The Town lost to Wycombe 4-1 in 2003/04 in the first round, but the following season beat Sheffield Wednesday 4-1, also in the first round, with Jenkins, Miglioranza, Roberts and Howard all getting on the scoresheet. The next round was not so good, with Swindon and Notts County battling it out live on Sky Sports for a place in the third round against Middlesbrough, who at the time were 5th in the Premiership. County won, in a dismal performance by Swindon in which Grant Smith was sent off. Last season, Swindon lost to Boston 4-1 in a first round replay following a 2-2 draw at The County Ground.

Swindon Town are favourites ahead of today's game but we can't take the opposition lightly as Sammy McIlroy's side hasn't lost since 7th October. In the past 10 years, we've been beaten by Stevenage (three divisions below us), and in three of the last four seasons, we've been knocked out by teams a division below us, as Morecambe are!"



THE FA CUP

A SECOND ROUND PREVIEW

Twenty ties see League One, League Two and Non-League sides rub shoulders with plenty of potential surprises in store.

There is guaranteed to be at least two sides from outside the Football League in the Third Round, given the draw, but after the heroics of RUSHDEN & DIAMONDS and BASINGSTOKE TOWN last time around, who would rule out more joining them?

There are only a pair of ties between League One sides, the first being the Sunday meeting between BRISTOL CITY and GILLINGHAM. With City recording seven wins from nine at home to stage a promotion challenge, and the Gills firmly in mid-table, with only one away success and 23 conceded on the road, a home win looks likely. BRADFORD CITY versus MILLWALL looks less clear-cut, as City have faded of late, whilst the Lions have shown the green shoots of recovery under Willie Donachie, and will hope to feature in the draw for the next round at least.

Most of the ties pair League One and Two sides, with many of the lower-ranked sides looking well capable of bridging the gap in divisions. SCUNTHORPE UNITED, pushing for

promotion through the goals of League One's top scorer Billy Sharp, host a WREXHAM side who are particularly porous defensively on the road, having let in almost three goals a game. It's in sharp contrast to PETERBOROUGH UNITED, who have earned five away league wins through scoring just seven goals, though they face a very difficult task at TRANMERE ROVERS, whose successful season has been built on strong home form.

All of the other League One sides must travel away, although that's


potentially difficult tie at BRISTOL ROVERS, who are tight, if not prolific, at the Memorial Stadium, and it looks one of the likelier draws.

However, at least the Cherries don't need to travel as far as SWANSEA CITY, who are DARLINGTON's opponents, with both sides handily placed around the play-off zone of their respective divisions, and it could be another stalemate. HEREFORD UNITED have meanwhile built their solid start to the season around results at Edgar Street, but if PORT VALE can find the form which

not too much of a disappointment for NORTHAMPTON TOWN, who have found results easier to come by away from Sixfields, a trend they hope will continue at an improving BARNET side, though one which has lost top scorer Tresor Kandol on loan to Leeds United. However, AFC BOURNEMOUTH are winless away from the South Coast, and face a


saw them take Tottenham Hotspur to extra time in the Carling Cup, they should progress. The draw serves up a local derby between MANSFIELD TOWN, one of League Two's most prolific scorers (aided by the goals of Richie Barker) and a DONCASTER ROVERS side struggling for goals and wins so far this campaign.

MILTON KEYNES' form has been inconsistent, though they remain amongst League Two's top scorers, but their opponents BLACKPOOL have shot up the table after overcoming a disappointing start and should be slight favourites, but TORQUAY UNITED versus LEYTON ORIENT is harder to call after poor form for each side. United slid down the table after starting well, whilst the O's have extremely weak away form. It may be that the sides cancel each out in the event.

There is still plenty of Non-League involvement, and Conference National STAFFORD RANGERS, one of the few part-time sides left at this level, will be forgiven for approaching their trip to League One BRIGHTON & HOVE ALBION with some trepidation given their Northwich colleagues 8-0 loss there in the last round. Despite Rangers being one of the most solid sides at their level, Albion should progress. It's a similar verdict as NOTTINGHAM FOREST, leaders and still unbeaten away from home in the league, travel to a SALISBURY CITY side with a formidable home record pushing for promotion into the Conference from the Nationwide South. The table-topping theme continues with KINGS LYNN, chasing

the Southern Premier title (the level below City), host an OLDHAM ATHLETIC side chasing League One honours. Lynn have not lost since the opening day, and boast an array of attacking options to make a shock a real prospect, but the Latics can point to the goals of top scorer Chris Porter.

Moving onto League Two sides, a trio of ties match league colleagues, most notably the dramatically improved STOCKPORT COUNTY against promotion-chasing, and Carling Cup Quarter Finalists,

which finally came in the FA Cup replay at WALSALL, and having shown they can beat the best the division has to offer, will hope to repeat the trick against an inconsistent HARTLEPOOL UNITED side.


The draw is completed by two all-Non-League affairs, thus guaranteeing representation from outside the Football League, as RUSHDEN & DIAMONDS and TAMWORTH put the Conference National relegation battle they are both involved in behind them, and fight for Cup honours at Nene Park. The other game sees a

BURY have also improved of late, but built on away form, so mid-table visitors CHESTER CITY will still be confident of featuring in the draw for the next round. Slightly to the south, MACCLESFIELD TOWN will hope to add to their maiden win of the season,

Hampshire derby between the towns of ALDERSHOT and BASINGSTOKE. The Conference National hosts should have the edge given John Grant's place among the top scorers, but having won at CHESTERFIELD in the last round, the visitors will be confident of an upset, despite their current league struggles in Nationwide South (at the level below Aldershot).





AWAY SUPPORTERS

Town supporters will be housed in the Healthland (William Sharp) Stand at one end of the ground, where around 2,000 fans can be accommodated. There are a few supporting pillars at the front which could impede your view. The good news though, is that even a small amount of away fans can really make some noise and make a good atmosphere. A trip to Walsall can be disappointing in terms of trying to get there and the stadium itself, but is more than countered by the relaxed atmosphere around the ground and the friendliness of the Walsall fans themselves.

GETTING THERE

In general getting to Walsall is pretty easy from Wiltshire. The ground is right next to the M6, in fact you can see it from the motorway just north of the RAC Control Centre. Unfortunately, this stretch of motorway normally has a large traffic jam on both Saturday lunchtimes, so allow 'extra-time'.

By Road: Leave the M6 at Junction 7 and take the A34 towards Walsall (beware of speed cameras on this stretch of dual carriageway). At the end of the dual carriageway turn left at the *Bell Inn* public house into Walstead Road (sign posted Bescot Stadium, Bescot Station Park & Ride). Continue straight on this road for two miles, passing another pub called the *Tiger* on your left. You will come to Bescot Stadium and entrance to the away end on your right.

Parking: There is a good-sized car park located at the ground (cost £3) and behind the away stand, which lends itself to a quick getaway after the match. Alternatively there is some

street parking to be had off Wallowes Lane.

By Rail: Note that if you go by train, Bescot Stadium has its own station, situated behind the away end only a few minutes walk from the turnstiles. Trains run there on a local line from Birmingham New Street and the journey time is around 20 minutes. There is a regular service on Saturdays along this line and you should not have too many problems getting away after the game.

AROUND THE GROUND

The King George V in Wallowes Lane is okay, but as the nearest pub to the ground it gets rather busy which can make it a bit difficult to get served quickly. It is about a 15-minute walk away, opposite the Morrisons Supermarket. If you are walking from the stadium, go out of the official car parks and down towards McDonalds. Go past McDonalds on your right and take a left hand turn into Wallowes Lane. At the end of the lane turn left onto the main road and the pub is just set back on the left. Away fans should avoid the Fulbrook pub near to the ground.




