ello and welcome to Paul Sturrock, his players and supporters of Swindon Town. And, of course a very warm welcome back to Field Mill to all the Stags fans that have been magnificent this season. I know I have said it a lot in the past but the support shown by our fans both at home and away has been a real credit to everyone of you.

Especially last weekend when we took on Doncaster Rovers in a highly charged, fast tempo and enjoyable game of football.

I will start this week's notes by just reflecting on that game. I was very pleased with our performance both the individual players efforts and as a team. It was, naturally a little disappointing to concede a goal so late on but that cannot be helped. Watching the video of the game you can clearly see that the ball took a double deflection as it pinged around the defence and although Carl Muggleton had the original shot covered the deflected ball found it's way in.

The pleasing thing about this game was that after a disappointing trip to Rochdale the week before the players put that behind them and made an honest attempt at playing the game. The result was a very entertaining game of football that kept the crowd on the edge of their seats for the ninety plus minutes.

> But back to what the job is really about. making headway in the league and this evening we have tough opposition in the form of Swindon Town, a team flying high at the top of our league but we will be looking to progress now from the form displayed at the weekend. It is a big game but I am hoping that the lads will take great confidence from it and with spirits being at a high again I hope that they can keep improving and keep striding up the league. To achieve this we need to start getting some points on the

board. I know that this sounds obvious but the fact is that the results of many of our games this season have not been a true representation of the efforts put in by my players who in my opinion have done a lot right but just been a little bit unlucky not to get the end result.

We, as you know are almost half way through the 2006/07 season and are approaching possibly our busiest time of the campaign. We have six games to play in December alone so there are still a lot of points to



play for. Three of these games (this evening, Bury and Hartlepool) are at home so if it is true that you have the advantage when playing on home turf we are looking at value points that we must keep at Field Mill by playing the advantage.

Of course in the new year there is potentially another game at home that many of us would like and that is the prospect of Premier side Bolton Wanderers visiting our 'small pond'. But I think that we have to put out of mind for now as we have to get back to the bread and butter of our game and that has to be the league. And of course we have to travel to BelleVue and play

Doncaster again before that game becomes a reality. As I have said many times before the crowd play a big part in what happens on the pitch. If the players feel that the crowd are behind them it spurs then on and can make the difference between a draw and a one nil win, it is as simple as that.

As we go into this game this evening I am again fortune enough to have pretty much a full squad to select form and with players battling for a place competition is tough in all areas and as the injured players have found out. When you are out there is another player ready to fill your place which means you have to work even harder. The last couple of games have seen this with young Nathan Arnold coming on and doing very well against Darlington the other week , this I believe is a very healthy situation to be in as it breeds as desire that can only be met by hard work, good discipline and self motivation, the key to a successful football team.

As I mentioned last week as we are approaching the half way mark I have a points tally and table position in my mind that I would like to achieve. With the vast number of games that fall in December these two targets are still achievable, but it won't be easy the players will have to be prepared to put the effort in and I have no doubt what so ever that whoever I select will give one hundred percent to the cause. With your help, we can achieve our goals and hopefully be in a strong position to make a genuine challenge for the top half of the table and be there or thereabouts in the final run in. Last year people wrote us off as having no hope of promotion but towards the final run in the same people even dared to talk about the possibilities of going to Cardiff for another play-off final.

Ok, it didn't happen. But we did finish strong and started this season off among the favourites to succeed this year. This is a tight league and stringing a couple of good wins together can and will make a big difference to our standing. I still believe that we will have a lot to sing about in May.

Well that's just about it form me for this week except to say keep getting behind us the lads really do appreciate it.

Rochdale: Dale taking pitch precautions

Rochdale groundsman Phil Collinson has been taking measures to avoid

postponements due to waterlogging. Underneath the sometimes troublesome Spotland pitch lies a so-called 'black layer' which has prevented effective drainage.

But with Dale currently midway through a fortnightlong spell between home games, Collinson has used a chemical spray on the pitch.

He said: "During the damp season, the black layer underneath the pitch is steadily increasing and it is anaerobic, which means it lives without oxygen. "So we have put down the chemical to help break it up and hopefully kill it off."

Collinson added on Rochdale's official website: "Without the black layer, the pitch will drain a lot better and I'm sure there is plenty more rain to come so the more we can do to drain it away the better chance we have come three o'clock each Saturday."

Swindon crowned champions while Stags just one game from promotion in 1986

n Saturday 19th April 1986, the Stags drew 1-1 with Swindon Town at Field Mill In front of a huge crowd of 8,416.

The draw confirmed Swindon as champions of



Division IV, while Mansfield remained in fourth place and would achieve promotion 3 days later, with a win over Hartlepool at Field Mill. Stags boss lan Greaves is pictured after promotion was achieved.

The Stags had hit a shaky run of form, with only one

win from their previous six matches, and made a nervous start, but took the lead against the run of play after 33 minutes. Paul Garner crossed from the left, Keith Cassells neatly flicked it on, and Neville Chamberlain stooped to head home from close range, despite the attentions of Swindon defender Colin Calderwood. It was Chamberlain's 19th goal of a glorious season. But ten minutes later Swindon were level. Dave Bamber mis-hit a free-kick and it fell to Leigh Barnard who drilled the ball home past Kevin Hitchcock.

Hitchcock made some vital saves in the second half to keep Stags in the game, and Stags



substitute Roddy Collins came close to claiming the points with a fierce 20 yard shot that was brilliantly saved by Kenny Allen. At the end of the game the home fans gave their side a standing ovation, while the Swindon fans celebrated the championship. Afterwards Swindon boss Lou Macari claimed that it was former Stags defender Colin Calderwood that had earned the championship, telling the media: "If Colin Calderwood had stopped at Mansfield, they would have been champions and not us." Calderwood was roundly booed all afternoon! Meanwhile Stags boss lan Greaves said: "It is one point in the right direction towards promotion."

interview with... michael boulding

Where the news full of talk about footballing brothers this week following the Manchester united Vs Everton game with both teams captained by the Neville Brothers. Stag's own Mickey Boulding talks to the Stag about his younger brother Rory, the FA Cup and the feeling around Field Mill:

" I was really pleased for Rory when I saw the team sheet for the Johnstones' paint game at Darlington and I saw his name on the bench. I have watched him grow up as an athlete and I think in the last six months or so I have seen him mature from a talented boy to a man. I think he has done amazingly well so far and I am delighted for him.

"When he came on as a sub in the first round of the same competition I think that he showed people that he doesn't get phased at all to play in front of a crowd and I think that he played well in both games. It is also nice to play on the pitch with your brother although the other lads gave me some stick saying that I can't play in the same side as Rory because I don't pass the ball to anybody else.

That's not true I always look for the person who has the best chance of converting a chance and it just so happens that when we played Grimsby it was Rory who made the best moves and had the best chance so I passed to him and he nearly scored.

"I think it will not be long before he is a regular name on the team sheet, he has good movement, is quick of the mark and makes good judgements of the ball that's ninety percent of the game. The other ten percent Is what goes on upstairs and think he has that as well. I have always tried to help with advice to the best of my ability although I am sure he will say I haven't helped that much. You can tell when somebody is going to become a good athlete from an early age and Rory developed and shown early on that he had a natural aptitude to football.

"ON my mum's side there are a few footballers and my dad enjoys the game and although my two sisters aren't really interested in the game I think that they are very proud when they see us both on the pitch together, I just hope that they can start watching us win more games.

"It has been a frustrating time for the players and the fans at the moment, travelling to places like Rochdale and to sit through the performance on that day must have been the most frustrating you can get but it is down to us as players to work hard and turn it around especially over the next month when there is so much to play for and give us all some Christmas cheer. We are not quite sure why the goals have dried up but it is something that we will be addressing and trying to improve on.

"Everybody has got one eye on the FA Cup and would like to get a good run together. A win against Doncaster would definitely lift the spirits of the team and get us back on track Tuesday's league game against Swindon. Let's hope that we can start to find our form soon as there is so much to play for in December and it really can make a difference to your standing in the league." carlotti

A giant in goal at 6'7, Brezovan signed on a year's loan from Czech club FC Brno in the summer of 2006.

Brezovan became a fans favourite after performing heroics on his competitive debut against Hartlepool United on the opening debut, saving two penalties from Porter and Humphreys to earn Town all three points.

Unfortunately he sustained an injury in the October home encounter with Grimsby Town and is recovering; but will not feature until the closing stages of the campaign.



PHIL SMITH

Goalkeeper Phil Smith joined Swindon in late July from Crawley Town. Smith had made 74 starts for Crawley Town during a two-

year stay, which followed a year's spell at Margate where he made 35 starts. A dependable customer, Smith is now the Town number one following Brezovan's injury.

JACK SMITH

Signed from Watford in the summer of 2005, Smith added youthful experience to the Town side.

Due to the departure of Paul Robinson to West Bromwich

Albion he was thrust into the first-team spotlight at Watford and coped admirably, registering two goals - the first of which a 'Goal of the Season' contender at Sheffield United in front of the Sky Sports cameras.

He made 38 league starts for Town last season in a variety of positions including right back, left back and midfield. This term he will be looking to consolidate his favoured spot in the right of defence.

LEIGH HENRY

Son of former Town striker Charlie, Henry came up through the Centre of Excellence ranks at The County Ground. Henry progressed into the reserves last season after catching the eye with a number of dominant performances for the Under 18's. He was rewarded with a six-month professional contract in June 2006 and will look to impress under the new management of Wise and Poyet, taking every opportunity available with typical grit and fervour.

JAMIE VINCENT

Jamie Vincent arrives at The County Ground hoping to make the left-back slot his own.

Vincent began his football career as a trainee at Crystal Palace before making the switch to AFC Bournemouth, where he made over 100 appearances between 1996 and 1999. He then made a £500,000 switch to Huddersfield Town which was followed by an £800,000 deal which saw him move to Portsmouth in 2001. Spells at Derby County and Millwall then followed.

He signed a one-year deal with Town in July 2006, and will be hoping to impress over the coming months in order to extend his stay in Wiltshire.



JEREL IFIL

Powerful defender Jerel Ifil joined Town in the summer of 2004 after enjoying three loan spells with Town previously from 2002-04. Jerel became a fan's favourite during his brief stays in Wiltshire and signed on a permanent basis in June 2004, he has almost amassed 100 appearances as a Robin and will look forward to forging a partnership alongside the

experienced Ady Williams.

ADY WILLIAMS

Named on-field Captain by manager Dennis Wise in mid-July, Ady Williams brings with him a wealth of footballing experience.

Signed from Coventry City in pre-season, the former Welsh International boasts successful spells with Wolves and Reading on his CV and has just the credentials that could set Town on their way to League Two success this term.

ANDY NICHOLAS

'Nicho' joined Town in the close season of 2003 following his

decision to leave Liverpool, where he came through the youth system but struggled to break into the first team. He was a regular in the Under 19's side at Anfield and won many plaudits with his performances at left back, which prompted Andy King to snap up the youngster. After working his way into the manager's starting line up with some hard work in training, Andrew seized his chance to become a regular

member of the side throughout the 2003/04 season and managed his first senior goal in a 4-2 win at Stockport in February.

Despite making such a positive impression during the 2003-4 season, the 2004-5 campaign saw the defender struggled with injuries and was unable to gain a regular starting berth. 'Nicho' is now an established member of the Town squad and is approaching 100 appearances for the club.

CHARLIE COMYN-PLATT

Charlie Comyn-Platt joined the Bolton Academy in the summer of 2002 after a long association with the club.

The assured defender was called into the first team for the first time in September 2003, and he was handed his debut when replacing Bruno N'Gotty for the final nine minutes of the 3-1 Carling Cup win over Walsall.

He also started both the



club's FA Cup games against Tranmere Rovers, during the same season.

He was loaned to Tony Adams' Wycombe Wanderers in mid-September 2004, making his debut in a 1-0 home defeat to Swansea City, and returned to Bolton in October, after a month with the Wanderers.

After being released by Bolton in the summer of 2005 he made the switch to The County Ground on a one-year contract and went on to make 27 appearances in his first season in Wiltshire, scoring twice against Boston United (FA Cup) and Doncaster Rovers (League One). After a successful first campaign, he signed a new one-year deal in the summer 2006.

ANDY MONKHOUSE

A product of the youth set-up at Rotherham United, Andy Monkhouse ended an eight-year association with the Millmoor club when he made the switch to Wiltshire in the summer of 2006.

Having made over 150 appearances for The Millers,

Monkhouse adds not only youthful experience to the Robins squad, but also unpredictable flair on either flank of the midfield.

GARETH WHALLEY

Signed for Swindon Town in July 2005 from Wigan Athletic on a free transfer.

Originally a trainee at Crewe, Gareth made over 200 firstteam appearances for them before signing for Bradford City in July 1998 for £600,000. Gareth was a regular during their two-season spell in the top flight and in March 2002 went back to Crewe on loan for a few months.

In jury kept him out from early-November 2002 until mid-April 2003 but he returned to play a significant role in the Club's promotion through the Play-Offs.

Left Cardiff in September 2004 and joined Wigan Athletic and subsequently made nine appearances for The Latics in the march to promotion to the Premiership.

During his first season at Swindon, Whalley settled into the side and made 27 appearances during the 2005-6 campaign.

Whalley still has two years to run on his current deal at STFC and has now returned to the first team fold after missing the start of the season after ankle surgery.

SOFIENE ZAABOUB

Versatile left-sided player at home in defence or midfield, Zaaboub was new manager Paul Sturrock's first signing as Town boss joining on a deal which will see him stay at SN1 until January 2006.

He made his debut as a substitute against Carlisle United in the FA Cup and was a trialist at Sturrock's former club Sheffield Wednesday. Previous clubs include FC Brussels, Modena and St. Etienne.

RICKY SHAKES

A tricky winger with plenty of pace, Shakes signed from Bolton Wanderers in a deal which also saw Charlie Comyn-Platt join the club.

Shakes spent time on loan with Bristol Rovers and Bury during the 2004-5 season and impressed Manager Andy King during a reserve game for STFC towards the end of the 2004-5 campaign.

A Trinidad & Tobago player, Shakes signed on for STFC in July 2005 and went on to establish himself on the right of the Town midfield, narrowly missing out on a place in the 'Soca Warriors' World Cup squad along the way.

MICHAEL POOK

'Pooky' signed a professional contract ahead of the 2005-6 season and was a consistent performer for the youth team and reserves prior to joining the professional ranks.

With a keen eye for goal, Pook's best effort to date is a 25yard thunderbolt in the Carling Cup First Round against Wycombe Wanderers.

An energetic 'box-to-box' midfielder, Pook is now very much part of the squad.

BEN WELLS

One of three Centre of Excellence players who were signed on as first year scholars in June 2004. An midfielder who impressed in the Under 17's last season. He was rewarded a squad number on Tuesday 30th November 2004 and made the bench against Bristol City in the LDV Vans Trophy.

Now signed on as a professional with a year's

contract, the energetic Wells will look to make the most of every opportunity that comes his way.

CURTIS WESTON

Another summer signing, Weston joined from Millwall where he became the youngest ever FA Cup finalist ever at 17 years and 119 days, coming on to replace Dennis Wise in the 2004 final against Manchester United.

A busy midfielder who likes to get amongst the goals, Weston has impressed with combative central displays, showing pace, aggression in

the tackle and awareness. The 19-year old has been in outstanding form so far this term.

DAVID STROUD

'Stroudy' is another of Town's team with County Ground connections, with his Father Kenny starring for Swindon. A skilful winger, he joined the Centre of Excellence before signing scholarship forms. He spent time on work experience with Basingstoke in 2004/05 and rejoined them in October 2006 on loan.

Stroud made his Town debut at Huddersfield Town in September and is a player with great pace and balance – Stroud is one to watch from a crop of exciting youngsters in the Town ranks and has been handed a six-month professional deal in which to impress.

ASHAN HOLGATE

Tall, gangly figure who can operate as a striker or in midfield. Scored on his senior debut against Millwall in pre-season 2004, after coming on as a substitute.

Made his competitive first team debut last term, coming on as a late substitute in the FA Cup draw with Boston United at The County Ground.

CHRISTIAN ROBERTS

Cardiff-born striker who joined Town in October 2004 in a £50,000 switch from local rivals Bristol City. He is an aggressive runner and will

add much needed pace to the Swindon frontline. Formerly with Exeter City where he scored 18 goals in 67 league starts for the Grecians from 2000 – 2002.

With 6 goals in 22 starts for the Robins so far, Roberts will be keen to play a big part in Town's 2006-7

campaign and his appointment as Vice-Captain seems to have invigorated the frontman who scored two against Carlisle United in the FA Cup First Round.

FOLA ONIBUJE

Dennis Wise handed 6'6 front man Fola a three-month contract in July 2006, and the former GB sprinter will be out to impress.

Having had previous spells with Preston North End, Barnsley, Huddersfield Town and Peterborough United – this is a big chance for the striker. Lagos-born Onibuje spent last season with Cambridge United – scoring 9 goals in 25 appearances.

LEE PEACOCK

Striker Lee Peacock joined Swindon Town on 20th January 2006 on a free transfer from Sheffield Wednesday.

Th experienced frontman started his career at Carlisle United as a trainee, but after scoring 11 goals in 52 appearances he made the switch to Mansfield Town in October 1997 for £75,000. It proved to be a productive spell with The Stags with 29 goals in 80 appearances attracting Manchester City who parted with £500,000 for his services. However, his time at



Maine Road was not as successful as he would have liked due to injuries, but his next stop certainly was.

A £600,000 move to Bristol City in August 2000 heralded the start of a successful four year spell at Ashton Gate. 54 goals in 131 league starts was the result of his stay with the Robins. Next up was Sheffield Wednesday, who he joined on a free transfer in the summer of 2004, on a free transfer.

Peacock wasted no time in settling in at Town, scoring on his debut against AFC Bournemouth after coming off the bench in the 4-2 home win. However, he finished the season with just 11 starts to his name after a knee injury ruled him out of the final games of the campaign.

After an end of season operation to cure the problem, Peacock enjoyed a solid pre-season and capped his start to the campaign with the winner at Hartlepool United on August 5.
