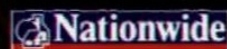

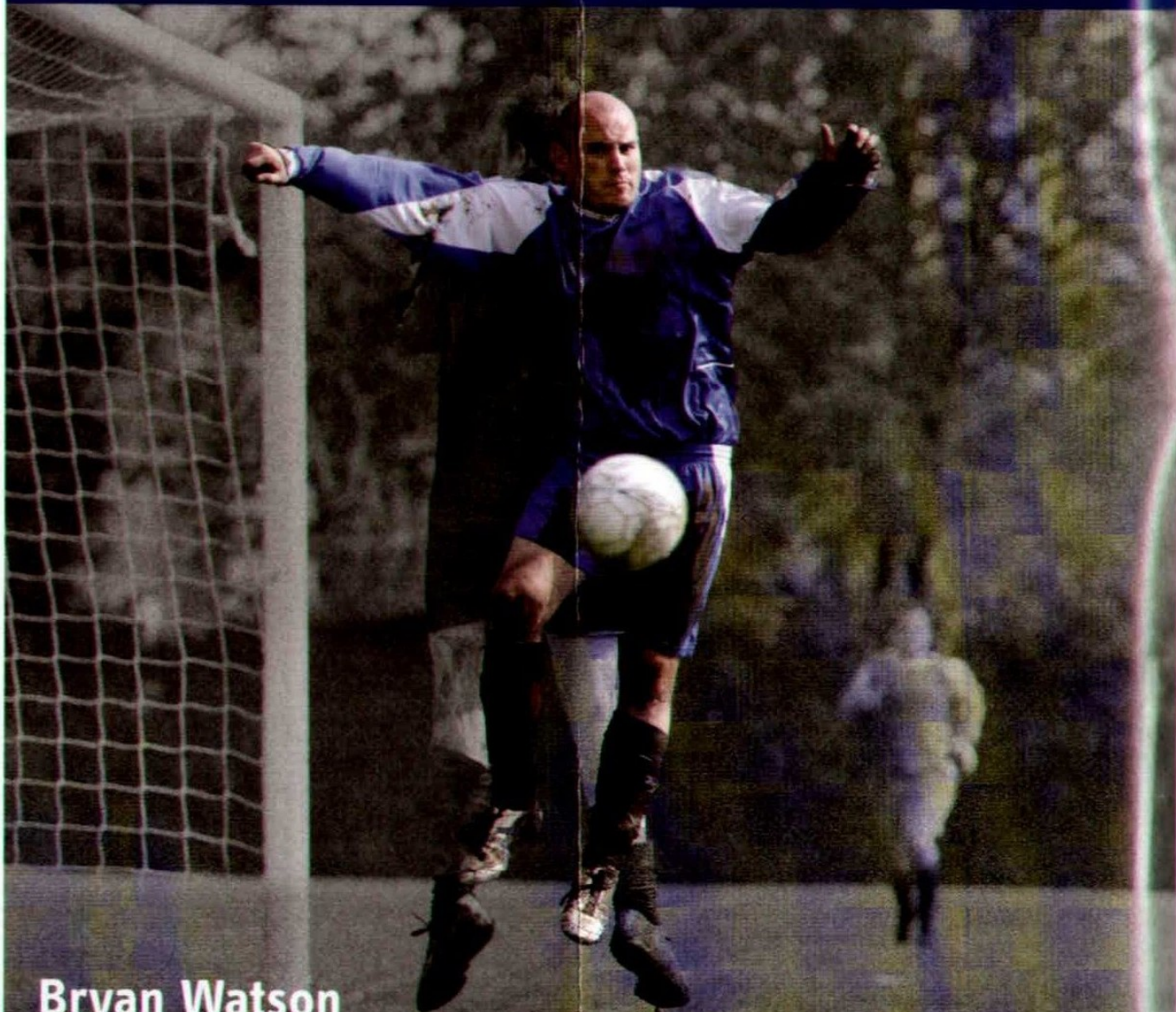

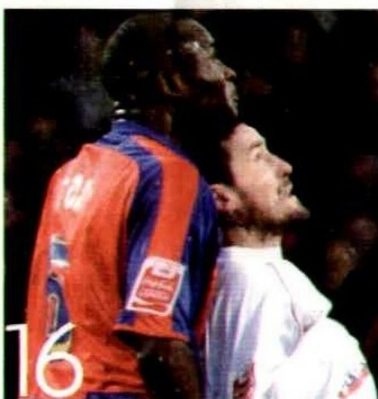

Good afternoon and welcome to today's League Two home encounter with Wrexham.

It was a good performance at Palace, although we are of course disappointed to have gone out of what is a lucrative cup competition for the club. The formation suited us on the day and

We would like to keep him at Swindon and hopefully he can settle with us here. He seems to enjoy his role out on the left and he has a good touch and excellent vision. Wrexham, like ourselves, come into today's game on the back of their FA Cup exit last weekend. Today's game could be a dangerous one for us because I do not want an 'after the Lord Mayor's show' sort of performance. Wrexham have been very unfortunate with injuries this season and that has hampered their progress somewhat. They have some very good players that can hurt you when on the top of their game and we must show Wrexham the respect which they deserve.

There was a reserve team game at Yeovil Town in midweek which gave several players who didn't feature at Palace last weekend the chance of a game. Jon Stewart, who has been sitting on the first team bench of late as deputy to Phil Smith, played in between the sticks. Charlie Comyn-Platt has now returned from his loan spell at Grays Athletic and he too played at Yeovil. There were also games for Gareth Whalley, Aaron Brown, Curtis Weston, Andy Nicholas and Blair Sturrock. It was a bit of a risk to play so many 'first team' players in the game but it's crucial that players are kept up to speed in terms of match fitness. The

reserve team games are also important because I want players to be pushing for first team places and reserve games are the place to impress in a match situation.

Unfortunately the weather conditions have not been kind to us over the recent weeks. This has hampered our training because the pitches over at Wanborough have taken a lot of water following all the rain we have had. On Thursday we were able to use the Cirencester Arena again – which is an excellent facility – and it enabled us to get some work done without having half an eye on the weather forecast.

It is back to the league for us today and hopefully we can emerge with the all-important three points. Your support as ever has been invaluable to the team, so please continue from where you left off at Selhurst Park with another vocal performance.

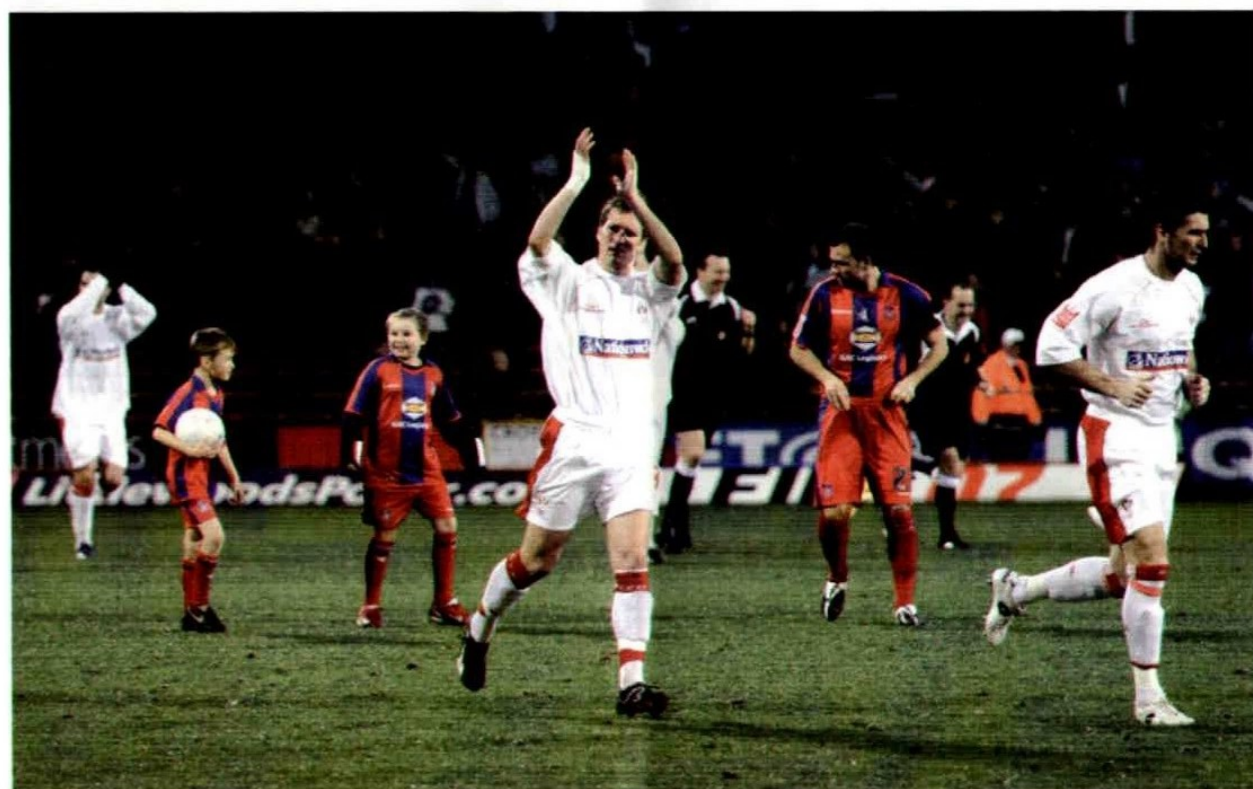

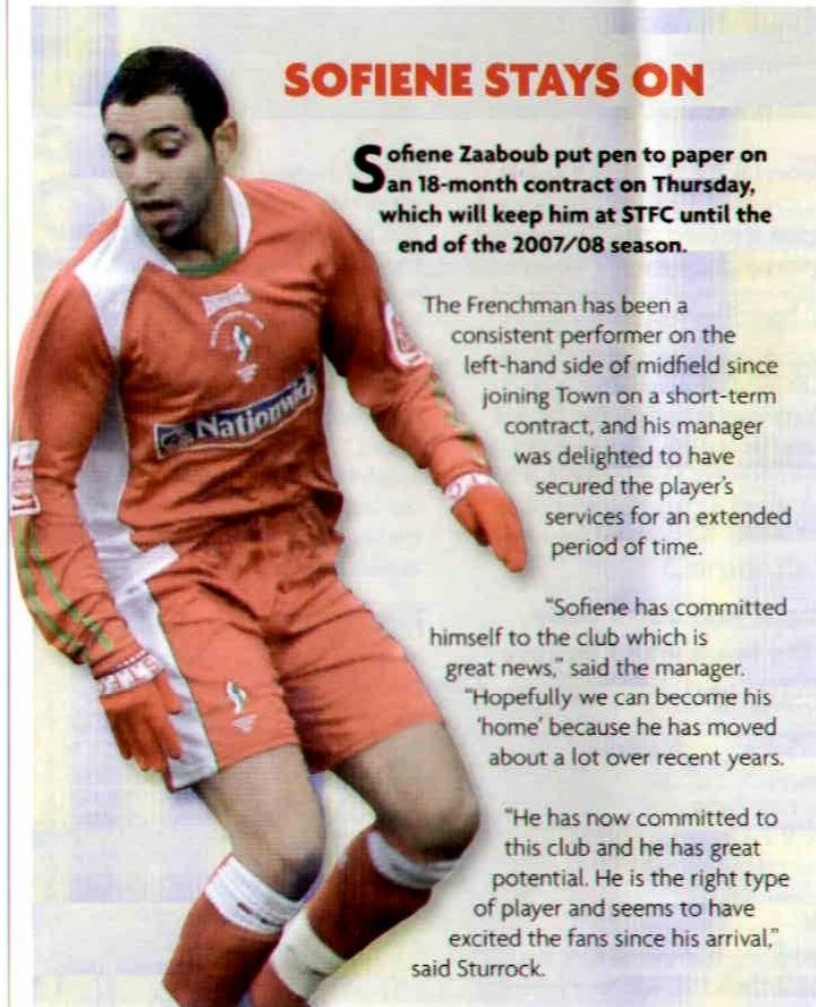
SOFIENE STAYS ON

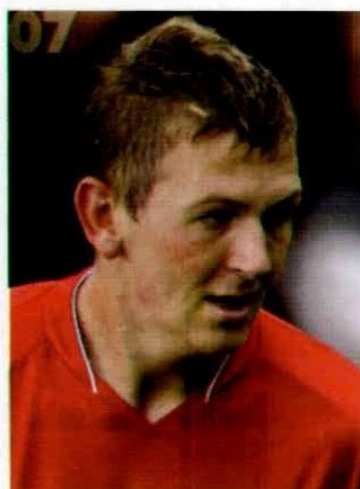
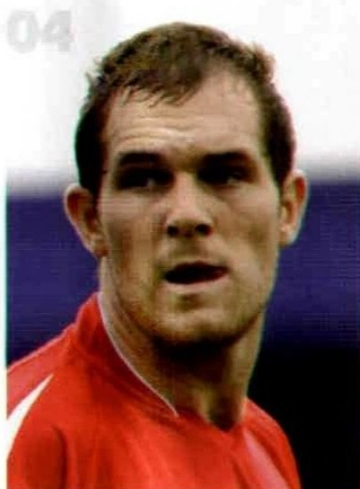
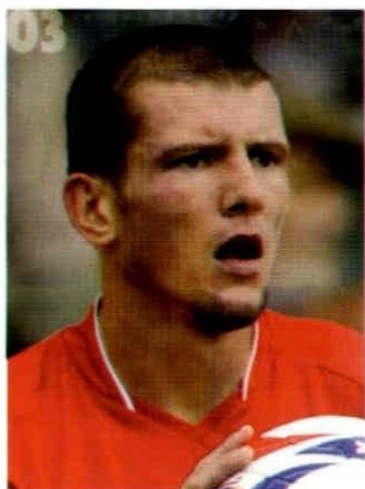
In League action, Wrexham aren't having the best of seasons. Fifth from bottom of League Two, 25 games have yielded 28 points, leaving our visitors just two points above a resurgent Macclesfield who have climbed off the bottom

of the table and occupy the closest relegation place.

Its Wrexham's travelling form that is most responsible for their league position. Eight of the 12 matches away from the Racecourse Ground have ended in defeat, no team in League Two have conceded more and only two have scored fewer.

Despite statistics like that, Chris Lewellyn has nine goals to his name, and young midfielder Mark Jones has seven.

After starting his career with Belfast side Cliftonville, Ingham earned Under-21 honours before switching to Sunderland. A four-year spell with the Black Cats saw him loaned out on a number of occasions, including a spell with Wrexham in 2003, before making the move permanent in the summer of 2005.

02 LEE ROCHE Defender

Another player to return to the Racecourse, in Lee's case coming back after enjoying a season long-loan spell while with Manchester United in 2000/01. Back at Old Trafford he pushed into the first team squad playing in Europe, the League Cup and also one substitute appearance in the Premiership. Since then he had been with Burnley and was recruited by Denis Smith in the summer of 2005.

03 RYAN VALENTINE Defender

A former trainee at Everton, Valentine joined Darlington in the summer of 2002. After four years and 151 league starts for The Quakers he joined Wrexham on a free transfer in August last year. He

scored from the spot against Town in the game between the two sides at the start of the campaign.

04 SHAUN PEJIC Defender

Made his debut at Port Vale in 2001, but had to wait until a visit to Peterborough United in January 2002 for his second appearance in a Wrexham shirt. Qualified to play for Wales through family connections, he was an established member of the Under-21 side, after making his debut away to Finland in September 2002.

05 STEVE EVANS Defender

27-year old defender who joined the professional ranks at The Racecourse Ground in the summer of 2006. So far this season he has clocked up two red cards and three yellows, as well as notching two goals during a busy first half of the 2006/07 campaign.

07 MARK JONES Midfielder

Locally born youngster who was promoted to the first team squad two years ago and earned himself a professional deal. He was also called up by John Toshack to be part of the Wales senior squad

for the friendly with Slovenia in August 2005, along with more games in 2006.

10 DARREN FERGUSON Midfielder

Initially signed on a short-term contract following his return from a spell in Dutch football with Sparta Rotterdam in September 1999, Darren later committed himself to a two-year deal at the Racecourse, one that was later extended and now he is Wrexham's longest serving player.

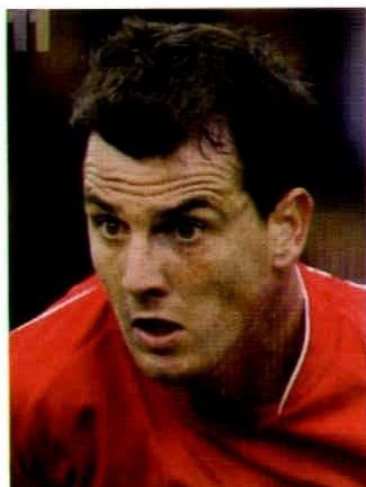
11 CHRIS LLEWELLYN Striker



Growing up in south Wales, Chris was spotted by scouts from Norwich City and forged a successful career with The Canaries before signing for Wrexham in the summer of 2003 after a loan stint at Bristol Rovers. A Welsh international, Llewellyn had a year at Hartlepool United before returning to The Racecourse last summer and has nine goals to his name this term.

12 MATT CROWELL Midfielder

After a successful youth career with his hometown team Swansea City, Matty was among a number of



Welsh youngsters taken to the south coast of England by Southampton. Recommended to Denis Smith, Matty arrived on trial at the end of the 2002/03 season and impressed the manager enough to be offer a deal for the current season.

13 MICHAEL JONES Goalkeeper

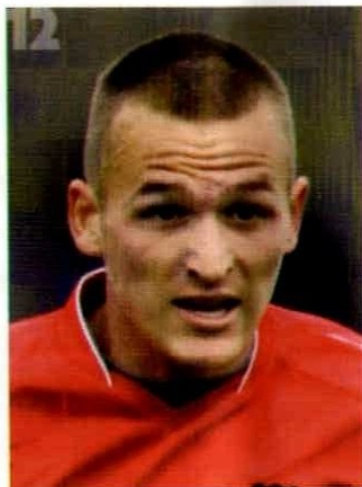

15 MIKE WILLIAMS Defender

Joined Wrexham in September 2005 and has made 20 league starts to date, with 13 further appearances from the bench. He is yet to open his goalscoring account for The Red Dragons but the defender is growing in stature and gaining experience.

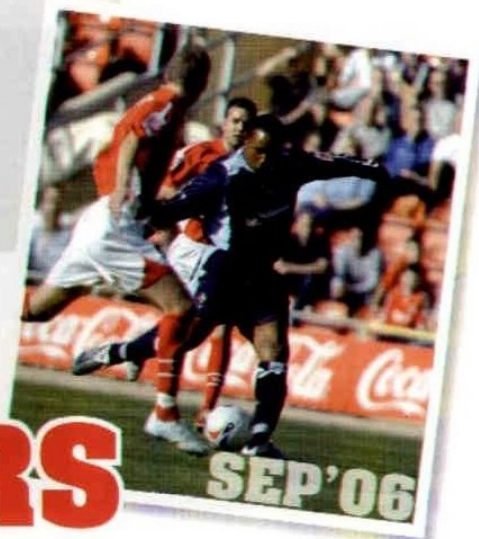

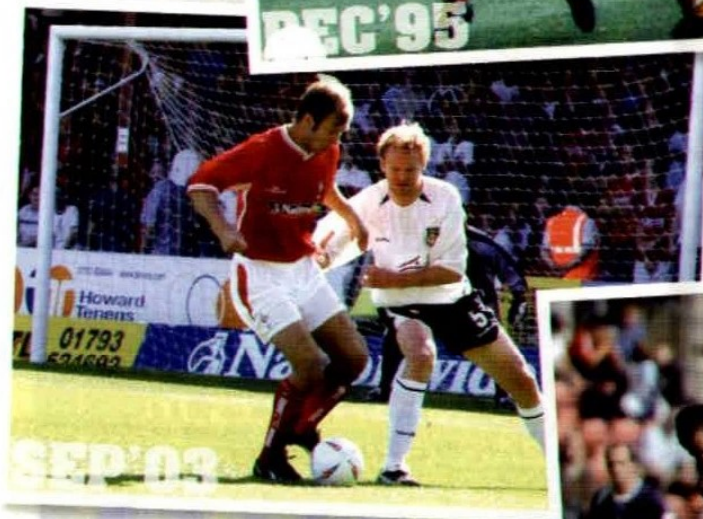


Wrexham are the visitors to The County Ground this afternoon and Town fans will be hoping for a repeat of the last scoreline between the two sides at SN1.

At the time of writing, Andy Monkhouse is all set for Hartlepool. He has an incredible record in League Two this season. He's never been on the losing side in games he's begun! He'll forever be the first recruit of the "Dennis Wise revolution" but injuries cost him an early chance to impress the new manager. I notice he's also well-backed in a poll to establish the best-ever loanee at Victoria Park!

There are no permanent arrivals, yet. Kyle Critchell has just played as a trialist for the Reserves in a 3-0 win at Yeovil. He's familiar to Paul Sturrock from his days at Southampton. The Saints' fan in our office reckons the youngster is a

versatile "Steady Eddie" who's played in a variety of positions in defence and midfield - watch this space - listen to 103.6 FM BBC Radio Swindon for more news.

It's now looking more and more likely Luke Rodgers will decide not to move to SN1 when he leaves Crewe. Sofiene Zaaboub could be set for a longer stay with negotiations well underway for a longer contract - I look forward to more of our "Franglais" interviews!

As for temporary transfers, who knows? We've certainly been blessed with an array of stars in recent seasons who have gone on to make a real name for themselves. Michael Carrick (virtually unknown on arrival from West Ham) is at the heart of Manchester United's climb to the top of the Premiership, Newcastle's James Milner is equally impressive - remember his two goals (as a Leeds headline-maker) in six games for the Town? Lee Holmes from Derby was a widely-acclaimed

out-and-out left-winger and who can forget the late Jimmy Davis.

More temporary deals which spring to mind, with apologies for not mentioning your potential favourite, brought us world-renowned Shay Given from Blackburn, Liverpool youngster David Thompson who's never quite "hit the heights" and Everton's "Rodders"-lookalike Tony Grant. Michael Reddy, then at Sunderland, was "explosive" on his debut with a goal as early as the third-minute at home to Bury while Dean Marney's introduction from Tottenham Hotspur prompted a notable sequence of seven matches unbeaten, if memory serves me correctly.

Living the Dream

Be honest, you've dreamed of scoring for the Reds in front of the Town End. You have haven't you? You've imagined hitting the back of the net – even if it comes off your derriere – and waving your shirt around your head 'Super Sammy' style, or maybe doing a bit of break dancing like Lee Peacock. That's the dream for all Townies – donning the shirt and playing for the club your support – but that's exactly the situation Swindon supporter Michael Pook finds himself every Saturday come 3pm.

In his third season as a professional the 21-year old midfielder, who used to sit in the Arkells Stand, now tries to make his Dad happy by helping the local team to three points at the weekend. We interrupted 'Pooky' watching the cricket (we did him a favour) to discuss formations, beating Leicester in '93 and the exuberance of youth...

Back in the side in the last few weeks – have you been happy with the way you've been playing?

It's good to be back and even better is being part of a winning team – when the side wins it helps your chances of keeping your place. I'm happy with my form but more importantly the team is playing well and getting results.

When Curtis and Paul come back there's a healthy competition for places in the centre of midfield...

That's what every club wants. Paul Evans and Curtis Weston are both good players and so when you're asked to come in [in their absence] you have to do a good job. I had to wait for my chance this season and when they got injured I took it. I give my all in every game and that's all I can do.

It must have been encouraging for you and the rest of the side to have played so well at Palace last week...

We played really well. It was a bit of a kick in the teeth to concede in the manner we did so early on. It was a huge disadvantage. The second goal showed you the quality they had but we could have prevented the first one. But we showed great character, we had a load of chances and we could have had two or three on another day. There are plenty of positives to take from it and if we can play like that against teams in our league – then we'll be ok.

The midfield looked happy with the formation used last week...

It works really well with the three in the middle – it's a good system. Mike [Timlin] is able to sit back and he gets a lot of the ball – which allows Sofiene [Zaboub] and I to make forward runs. I got in the box a few times last week and had one opportunity cleared off the line – as long as I keep getting in those positions I'll be happy.

As a Town fan you must be living the dream representing the club you support?

My Dad and I watched a lot of games before I started playing for Town and my Dad still comes; he loves it. I have a lot of friends and family still come to games and I'm really proud of that. My Dad is pretty good at getting comments in about how I play – I think all footballers know when they've had a good or a bad game. The main thing is my parents always support me and they've been really good.

What do you remember about watching the Town?

We used to sit in the Arkells Stand before the Intel Stand as it was then, was built – after that I sat in there. The best days were during our promotion to the Premiership – we went to all the play-off games and the final at Wembley was amazing. We went to see some good teams in

those days, it's just a shame that we've gone from playing the likes of United and Arsenal to, no disrespect to them, the likes of Macclesfield Town.

That must be the dream for you, then – to be a part of the side that climbs the leagues again?

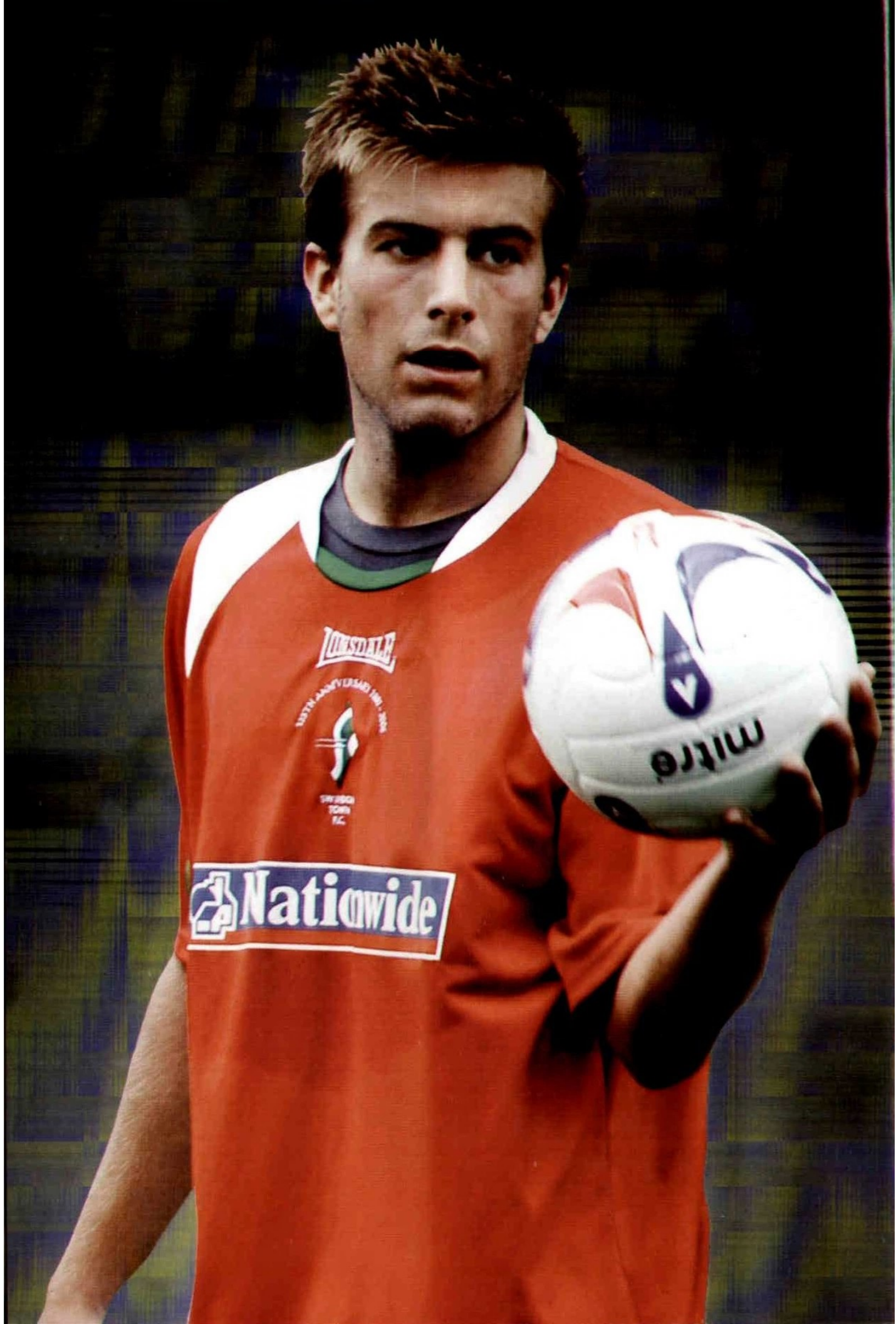
We have an excellent chance of promotion this year and beyond that the club has every potential to go further. It's a lot easier to go down than climb back up – but the players need to work on the field, as well as those working for the club off it and who knows what we can achieve.

You're an overwhelming success story for the club's youth system...

I was playing for Swindon Robins when I was invited to come for a trial by Tommy Wheeldon, the youth coach back then. I think I did enough to catch his eye! This was when I was eight or nine; after that I came for a six-week trial and after a couple of weeks I was asked to join and it was then I joined the Centre of Excellence.

It's nice to have progressed to the first team squad having been here for so long. Clive Maguire [Community coach] was one of my coaches back then and to still see him around and to share some of the stories is great. You get told that it's always going to be one in 100 that makes it and so it's nice to know that I got through. I'm doing what I always wanted to do, so I have to make the most of every opportunity.

A lot of your friends don't make it – how disappointing is that?

It's probably the most disappointing thing about football. You spend so much time with these players that you become close friends and to see them go, it's the worst thing about the game. But that's football, things can change so quickly – one day you could be asked to move and start all over again.

Lukas and Andy Caton are looking like they could both make an impact on the first team as well...

It's a credit to the youth staff that we have Lukas and Andy playing for the first team. Lukas is younger than I was when I was given my chance and he's not playing for any other reason than on merit – and he's been an important player for us. He's scored goals, like Andy did when he first came into the side and hopefully Andy can come back from his injuries and continue where he left off.

And for you, you've some great midfielders around you to learn from...

All three of them are different players. Curtis is a good dribbler and has great pace while Michael [Timlin] and Paul [Evans] can pass and keep the ball. It's a nice mix of youth and experience and everyone helps me – they talk to me and pass on advice in their own way.

And Dennis Wise and Paul Sturrock, two great minds to learn from as well?

I've been here for two years and in that time I've played under so many managers – all offering different points of view and you try and pick up things from all of them. The key is to do the things your current manager asks you to do.

What's been the best advice you've ever received?

I couldn't put it down to one piece of advice. I've been offered a lot of good advice down the years. But each and every manager has said to enjoy it while you can – and that's what I try and do.

And so to Wrexham this afternoon – can we continue our good form?

I'd like to think we can get a good result. It's tight at the top and we need a result, but we have struggled against teams at the bottom this season. We tend to perform better against the teams around us and then drop points when we shouldn't. But we've had a good Christmas – we had a decent performance last week at Palace and we have to use that momentum – we have to really focus and make the most of being at home.

Did you watch the 2-2 draw between MK Dons and Lincoln city on Monday night?

It was a good result for us. It keeps both teams within our reach and if we can win our game in hand we can leapfrog the two of them. It's a strange league – if we were in the league above with our amount of points we'd be top! But the four teams at the top are very close – but we have every right to be up there.

You scored in the 3-0 win against Grimsby and came close last weekend, is that one of the aims for you as you develop as a player?

It's easy to say 'yes, I'd like to score more goals', but I never play thinking that I don't want to score – it's easier said than done! I was happy with the Palace game in that I was in the box a few times – I had a chance off the line and at least I'm getting in those positions. If I keep getting in the right areas and with a bit of luck, perhaps I'll score a few more.

Considering you're only in your third season you've experienced the play-offs, relegation... will this be your first promotion?!

We came close to going up two years ago. I was on the bench at Brighton and we really thought we deserved to go up – I've never sat in a more disappointed dressing room. Hopefully this year we can avoid the play-offs and go straight up – that's what everyone wants and if we keep doing what we're doing we should be okay. ■

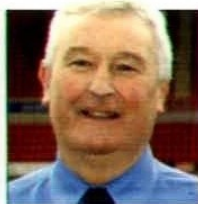

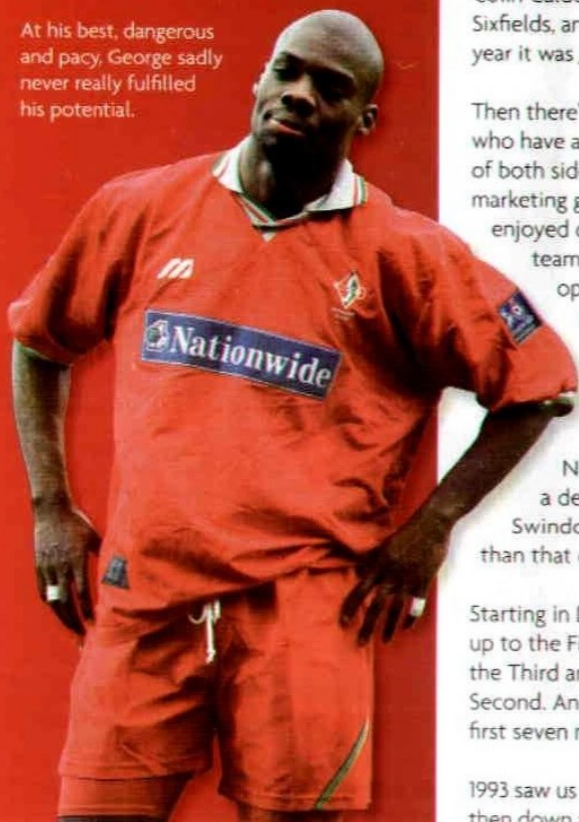

NDAH, GEORGE

Signed for Town from Crystal Palace for £500,000 in November 1997. An England youth international striker, George's career was blighted by injury, including a dodgy knee that he suffered soon after arriving at The County Ground.

In that light, the £1m Wolves invested when Town Player of the Year Ndah departed to Molinux in 1999 might have been a bit hasty. A broken leg shortly after becoming a Wanderer did little to improve his selection chances.

At his best, dangerous and pacy, George sadly never really fulfilled his potential.



NORTHAMPTON



Northampton and Swindon have various things in common, including the names of their home grounds, which were both The County Ground until Northampton moved to the Sixfields Stadium.

Playing wise, we've shared Frank Large, Steve Berry, Dave Syrett, Sam Parkin, Russell Lewis, Eric Sabin and Charlie Henry amongst others

Until last summer, Town legend Colin Calderwood was the boss at Sixfields, and until the turn of the year it was John Gorman at the helm.

Then there's sponsors Nationwide who have added cash to the coffers of both sides over the years. Their marketing guys must surely have enjoyed clashes between the two teams that offered photo opportunities showing both sides sporting the Nationwide logo.

NINETIES

Never has there been such a decade in the history of Swindon Town Football Club than that of the 1990's.

Starting in Division Two, we went up to the First Division, down to the Third and then back to the Second. And that was just in the first seven months!

1993 saw us up to the Premiership, then down again. Down another level

and back up again quickly followed, then we hung on until just five months into 2000 when we dropped into what's now called League One.

When we started the decade, Ossie Ardiles had recently replaced Lou Macari as manager. Then came Glenn Hoddle, John Gorman, Steve McMahon and Jimmy Quinn, who stayed around until just into the new millennium before being superseded with Colin Todd. And HE didn't stay long either.

We took what is still only our second championship in 1996, and when you consider that we played 41 years at the same level after joining the Football League in 1921, the nineties was some contrast to what had come before.

NEW GROUND

Hardly six months goes by without another story regarding either the redevelopment of The County Ground, or a new site being identified as a possible alternative. One day perhaps the talking will stop and the building will start.

NELSON, GARRY



Born an Essex lad in 1961, Garry Nelson made an impression at many a club and also at the publishers.

He started his football career at local Southend United where he had been a junior. Signing as a professional in July 1979,

NOBLE, PETER

If as an inside forward in the sixties you'd scored a goal every other game in the top flight, you'd be disappointed to find you'd had to drop two divisions and leave your city of birth to get a regular game. That was what Peter Noble faced after registering seven, First Division goals in 15 League appearances for Newcastle in 1966/67.



Noble signed for Newcastle United in November 1964. Limited to just one more outing in 1967/68, he joined a Danny Williams-led Swindon in Division Three in January 1968 for £8,000.

For a man who was only 5ft 9in, Peter had an uncanny knack of out jumping taller defenders to score important goals and his aerial ability was considerably better than it had a right to be.

A couple of strikes in his first 14 outings didn't trouble the top of the goal scoring chart, but with Pat Terry's departure to Brentford in June 1968 and the switch of Roger Smart to the right hand side of midfield, Noble claimed the regular number 10 shirt and recorded 16 League goals in 1968/69.

His goals helped take Town into Division Two at the end of the season, and everyone will be familiar with events in the League Cup that year. With four goals in the run that took Town to Wembley, Noble made crucial strikes against Torquay, Bradford and Burnley and most importantly the winning goal in the replayed semi-final against the Clarets at the Hawthorns.

Les Allen was then the Town manager who oversaw Peter's transfer to cup victims Burnley for £40,000 in June 1973, after 62 goals from 216 League appearances at the County Ground.

On his arrival at Turf Moor, a defensive crisis saw Noble successfully switched to full back with great success, with Burnley finishing sixth in the top flight in 1973/74. Then returning to a forward role, he finished top scorer in four of the next five seasons.

In January 1980 Peter joined Third Division Blackpool, a move that dropped him into Division Four just twelve months later.

A season alongside Dave Bamber and Dave Hockaday followed, but nine goals in 44 matches in a mid-table finish failed to extend Peter Noble's League career.

Nelson made admirable progress, completing almost 130 League games for the club over the next four seasons. He picked up a championship medal in 1981 when United claimed the Fourth Division top spot a year after suffering relegation from the Third, but chose to drop back into the bottom division in August 1983 when he joined Swindon for £10,000.

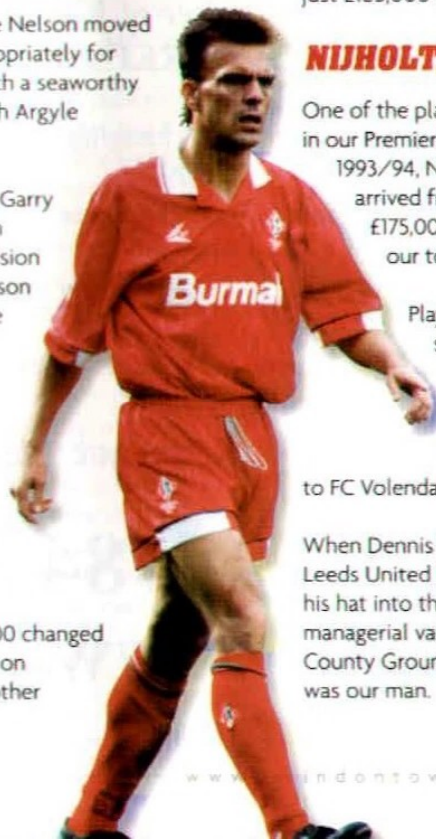
Garry scored his first goal in 80 appearances here at the County Ground on his home debut in a 4-0 win against Chester, but goal-scoring was only part of his game. Generally deployed in a wide striking position, it was his role to supply chances to others, the beneficiaries including Jim Quinn, Alan Mayes and Colin Gordon amongst their number.

Two years and seven goals after his

arrival in Wiltshire Nelson moved South West, appropriately for someone with such a seaworthy name, to Plymouth Argyle for £15,000.

That move meant Garry would miss out on Town's Fourth Division championship season of 1985/86, but he was unlikely to worry too much as Plymouth took second spot in Division Three. A very creditable 20 goals followed in Division Two.

In July 1987 £80,000 changed hands and he was on his way to yet another



seaside town, this time Brighton of Division Three where the Nelson influence once again brought about promotion at the end of his first season. By the summer of 1991, he had played twelve seasons of League football when Charlton spent £50,000 to take him to the capital where he helped Athletic to seventh spot in the Second Division.

Over the next five seasons Garry was to make almost 200 appearances for Athletic and apart from losing to Crystal Palace in the play-offs in 1995/96, Charlton generally finished in mid-table. It was at this time that Garry turned his attentions in a different direction when his diary 'Left Foot Forward' was published.

Garry then joined Third Division Torquay United as player/coach. You can't keep a Nelson away from the coast.

Following up his first literary success with 'Left Foot in the Grave', after in excess of 30 appearances Nelson's vast experience and growing media skills were recruited by the PFA in the role of Commercial Executive. For a player who contributed greatly on the pitch, Garry Nelson also provided good value for money off it, costing his six clubs just £165,000 in total.

NIJHOLT, LUC

One of the players who joined in our Premiership experience of 1993/94, Netherlands-born Luc arrived from Motherwell for £175,000 in the July preceding our top-flight adventure.

Played 32 times that season and more than 50 more matches followed before Nijholt went back to the land of his birth to FC Volendam in August 1995.

When Dennis Wise departed for Leeds United last year, Luc threw his hat into the ring to fill the managerial vacancy here at the County Ground, but instead, 'Luggy' was our man.

A double from Charlie Comyn-Platt helped Swindon Town towards a 3-0 win at Yeovil Town, with Aaron Brown also on the scoresheet for a strong visiting side at Huish Park under the watchful eye of manager Paul Sturrock.

Swindon Town named a strong line-up to take on The Glovers, with all but four players having first team experience. Southampton defender Kyle Critchell was handed an opportunity to impress watching Swindon Boss Paul Sturrock with Lukas Jutkiewicz partnering Blair Sturrock up front.

The Glovers had young pro's Darren Behcet, Jake Smeeton, Craig Alcock, Gavin McCallum, Tom Clarke and Steve Maher in their ranks playing alongside four trialists including Brentford winger Alex Rhodes and former Cardiff City defender Rhys Weston.

Former Town loanee Rhodes showed promise at times, enjoying some reasonable runs down the wing, and getting involved in the set pieces, with a good early corner that sadly came to nothing, after it had showed good intent with it's delivery.

In essence the game was an even affair early on, with both sides seeing plenty of possession in the midfield, attacking well down the wings, threatening around the box, but creating very little in front of goal.

Swindon were always dangerous though, with Jutkiewicz and Rigley looking a threat, and it was Rigley who created the game's opening

goal on 33 minutes when he sent in a decent free kick from the right of midfield into the heart of the Glovers' box. The ball came to Jutkiewicz who sent in a shot from 10 yards that forced Behcet into a fine one handed save, but was powerless to stop Charlie Comyn-Platt coming in for the rebound to crack the ball into the empty net.

With half time approaching, the powerful Aaron Brown raced across the front of the Yeovil box to send in an excellent shot from 15 yards that bounced its way past the diving Behcet to give his side a double advantage at the break.

The game carried on in much the same vein in the second period, with both teams enjoying equal possession, but with the Robins making the most of theirs.

It took them less than a minute to score, when following some questionable defending from the Glovers who repeatedly failed to clear a free-kick into the box, the ball fell to Comyn-Platt to score his second of the game, slotting it home from a few yards out to make it 3-0.

It was an unassailable lead for the visitors, and settled Swindon into some confident play, with the Glovers always having to fight from off the back foot in an attempt to get back into the game.

Scott Doe went close on 52 minutes before Tom Clarke brought a great save from Jon Stewart towards the end of the game.

"It was a workmanlike performance," said Paul Sturrock post-match. "There was a bit of a wind which made things difficult but overall we worked hard and finished up worthy winners in the end."

JIMMY ALLAN

Having already welcomed keepers Sam Burton (509 appearances) and Peter Downsborough (320 appearances) today we welcome Jimmy Allan who made 436 appearances between 1971 and 1983. This total would surely have been extended to have beaten Sam Burtons total had his career not been stopped by injury. Jimmy now works as a rep for a packaging company and lives in Devon.

DAVID SYRETT

David was an extremely promising young striker who went straight into the first team in 1973 and also earned England Youth honours during his time with Swindon. In 135 games for the Town, David netted on 39 occasions, before moving onto Mansfield, Walsall, Peterborough & Northampton. David now lives in Warminster and is Head Groundsman at Chafyn Grove School in Salisbury.

TERRY HUBBARD

Terry joined the club as a youngster in 1968, making his first team debut in 1971, Terry was a very talented midfield player who earned Under 23 caps for Wales. He unfortunately suffered a few injuries during his career making 98

appearances and netting twice before leaving the Town in 1976. Terry now lives in his hometown of Pontypool and is the Deputy Manager of a Leisure Centre in Cwmbran.

RUSSELL LEWIS

Like Terry, Russell also joined the Town from South Wales in 1976 and made his debut the following year. Russell was the type of player who delighted every fan never giving less than 100%. He made 216 outings in the Town colours scoring on 9 occasions, before moving onto Northampton where he still lives and works for the Football in the Community at Northampton Town FC.

BILLY TUCKER

Billy joined the Town from Hereford United in 1979, and was involved in one of the most exciting periods in the Town's history, reaching the Semi Final of the League Cup before losing over two legs to Wolves. Who will ever forget his equalizing header at Highbury bringing them back to the County Ground and that epic 4-3 victory? In total Billy made 51 outings for STFC scoring 6 goals. He still lives in Swindon and works as a Management Accountant.

ALAN MAYES

One of the most exciting players to have worn a Town shirt, he scored a hat trick on his debut at Rotherham and went on to score 83 goals in 184 games in two periods as a Town player having joined Chelsea in between. Alan played between 1978-1981 and 1983-1985.

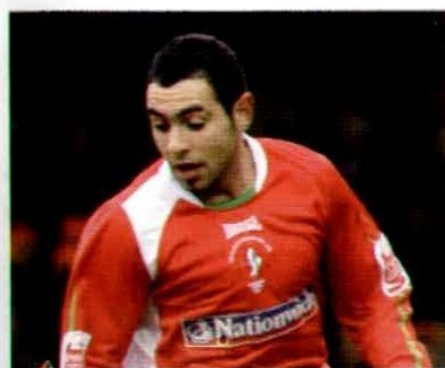

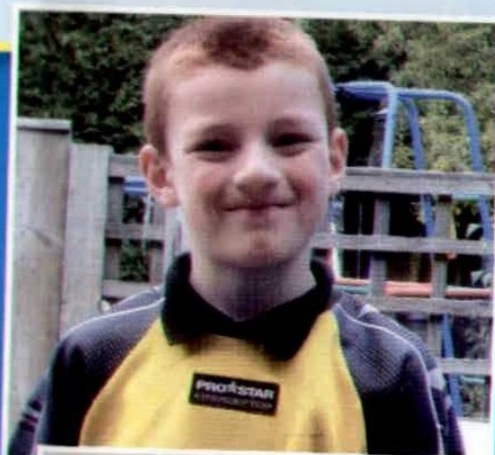

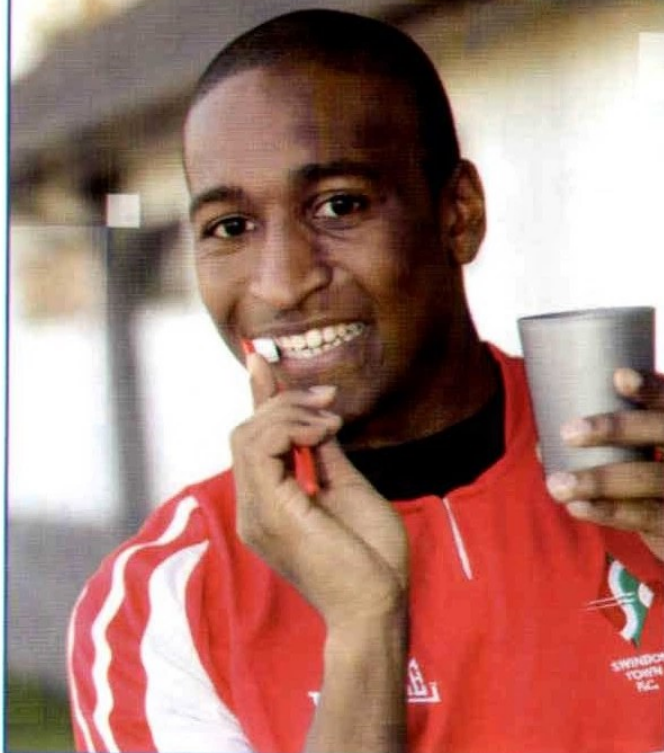

AWAY SUPPORTERS

Away fans are housed at one end of the ground in the Town End terrace, where up to 1,821 fans can be accommodated. When in the Conference, this was a home terrace, but with admittance to the Football League, the Club have given it to away fans to ensure proper segregation. Town fans will benefit from a good sized stand, that in the close season has seen a number of improvements, such as new toilets and catering facilities being built.

GETTING THERE

By Road: From the A1 take the A43 towards Stamford and then on entering Stamford Town Centre take the A16 towards Market Deeping/Spalding and then onto Boston. On entering Boston you will go over a railway crossing. Bear right at the next set of traffic lights (signposted Boston College). Go over the small Haven Bridge and straight along John Adams Way (dual carriageway), the floodlights of the ground can be clearly seen on the right. Turn right at the next traffic lights, into Main Ridge, then take the next right into York Street.

Parking: There is no car parking as such for fans (unless you are a permit holder) at the ground itself. So you will need to either park in one of the town centre pay and display car parks or seek street parking. One such pay & display car park is the Pescod Square car park, which holds 400 cars and is just off John Adams Way.

By Rail: Boston railway station is a ten minute walk from the ground. Head down

Station Street towards the large church tower. At the end is a Police Station, bear right down the right hand side of the station and head over the river footbridge. Once across turn right up the alleyway, into Church Lane. Keep going straight on, past the Britannia Inn and then cross the street to go down South Street. Take a left turn into Spain Lane and at its end you will come to a dual carriageway. The ground is clearly visible on the opposite side of it.

AROUND THE GROUND

The *Coach & Horses* on Main Ridge is the nearest pub to the ground. Further on down the road is the *Wellington*, a larger quieter pub serving hand pulled Mansfield Bitter. Also on the corner of this road is the *Eagle Chippy*. There is a Social Club behind the York Street Stand, that also admits away fans. The Town centre is a short walk away from the ground. *The Eagle*, in West Street near to the railway station and *The Still* in Market Place are both recommended, as well as any Batemans pubs you come across.

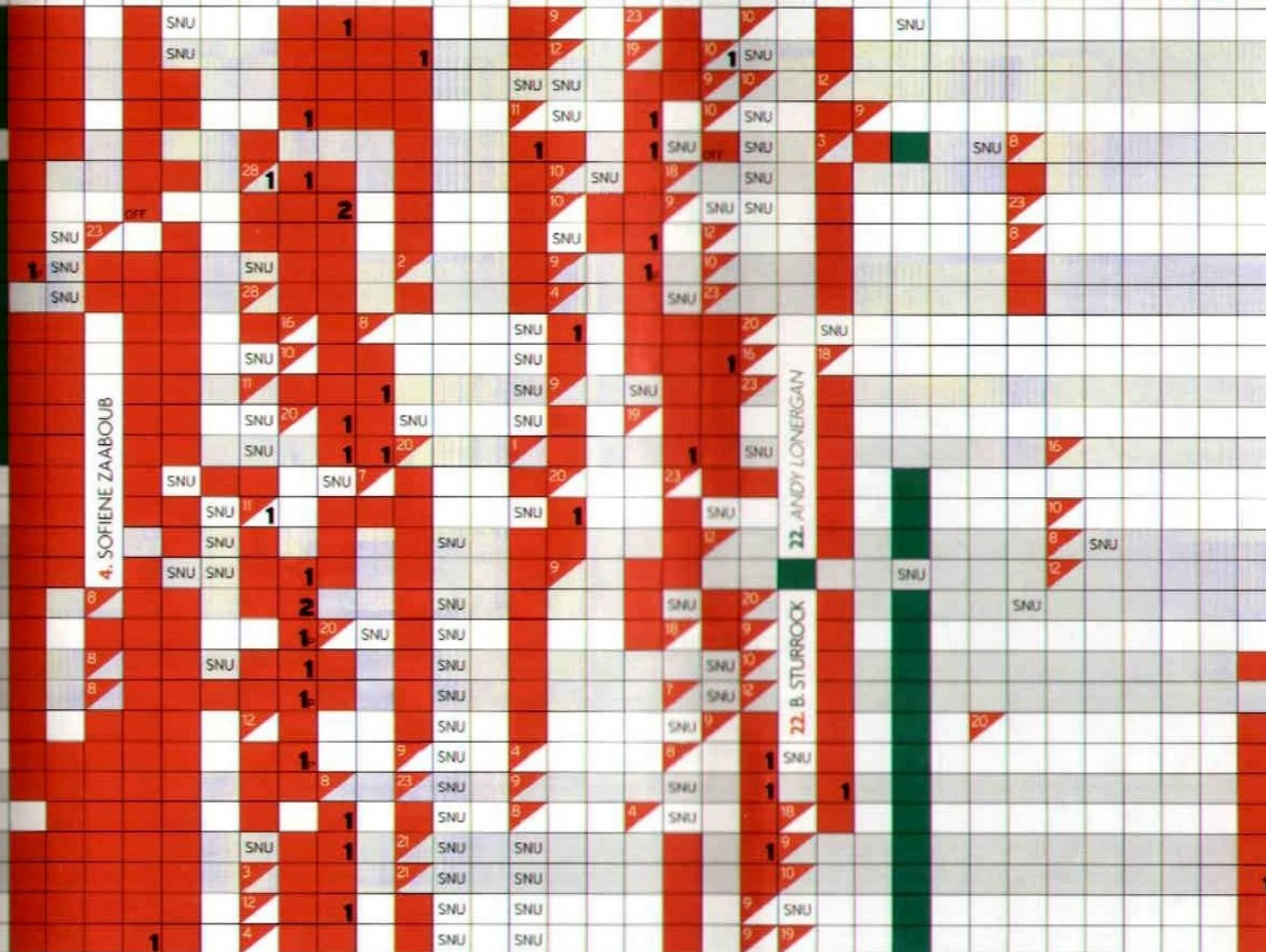

EMERGENCY PROCEDURE

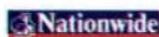
