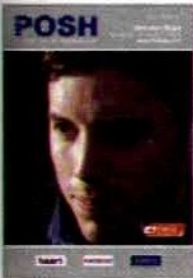

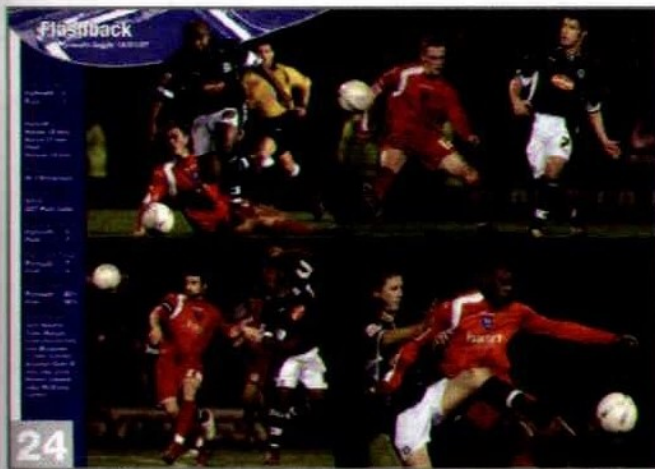

Emergency Procedures

In the unlikely event of an emergency at London Road requiring the evacuation of all or part of the ground, spectators are requested to remain where they are, stay calm and listen for announcements over the public address system. All emergency announcements will be preceded by a distinctive chime. The announcements may direct spectators in specified areas to evacuate through exit gates to the outside of the ground, or on the pitch. Club stewards and police officers will assist in directing spectators to the safest locations. If requested to vacate a particular area in the ground, spectators should do so as calmly and quickly as possible to assist in a safe and speedy evacuation.

Ground Regulations

Persons are admitted to this ground subject to their acceptance of the Ground Regulations and the Rules and Regulations of the Football Association and the Football League which are posted in and outside the Stadium. Entry to the ground shall constitute unqualified acceptance. The club reserves the right for it's stewards, servants, agents and Police to remove from the ground any person who does not comply with these rules and regulations, or whose presence within the ground is, or could reasonably be construed as constituting a source of danger, nuisance or annoyance to any other person. Throwing of any object within the ground. Taking part in chanting of an indecent or racist nature. Entry onto the field of play or the surrounding track without lawful authority or excuse. Additionally, the use of threatening behaviour or abusive language is strictly forbidden and will result in ejection from the ground.

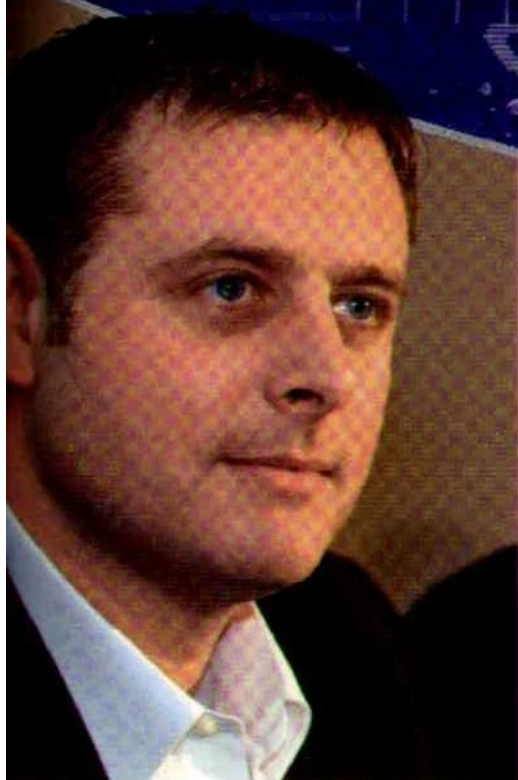

The Boss

Darren Ferguson

New player-manager Darren Ferguson takes charge of his first home game at London Road this evening as Swindon Town visit and the Peterborough United boss is positive for the future after witnessing a performance of commitment and effort at Lincoln City on Saturday.

I would like to welcome the Swindon Town manager Paul Sturrock and his players to London Road for this evening's game. It was obviously disappointing to lose at Lincoln City on Saturday after controlling large parts of the game. To concede a goal from a set-piece was disappointing and you can't keep losing goals in that manner.

The lads kept their shape, were well-organised and for 20 minutes in the second half we were by far the better side. Lincoln had a spell, which they are going to have because they are the home side and are going well in the league, but we seemed to be coping OK and I thought we were unlucky to lose I have to admit.

You need to score when you are on top in a game and we didn't do that. Even as early as four minutes, Josh Low had a good chance to score and if that goes in I think we would have gone on to win the game comfortably. Unfortunately it didn't, but there are a lot of positives to take from the game, the discipline and the shape was excellent.

I think you have to be flexible in terms of the formation when you play different teams, I felt three centre halves was the best way to go against Lincoln with the personnel we had available. I saw enough in training prior to the game and I know how much talent there is in


the squad, so I am looking forward to the future. The players need to keep believing like they did in the first half.

The results are very important and we need a win as quickly as possible, but off the field we are building a structure. We have a youth team in place and a reserve team for next season, we are working on the training facilities and have brought Ben MacKenzie, a sports scientist to the club. Ben will improve the players diet and fitness.

I brought Kevin Russell, a man I trust, to work alongside myself and Tommy Taylor will continue as first team coach. For a football club to work, you need to have the right structure in place and I can assure the fans that we will try to get that right.

Tonight's game will be a tough one, but they are all hard games in this division. Finally, I would like to thank the 1,299 supporters who made the trip to Sincil Bank. The support was first class and it was just disappointing not to reward them with the three points.

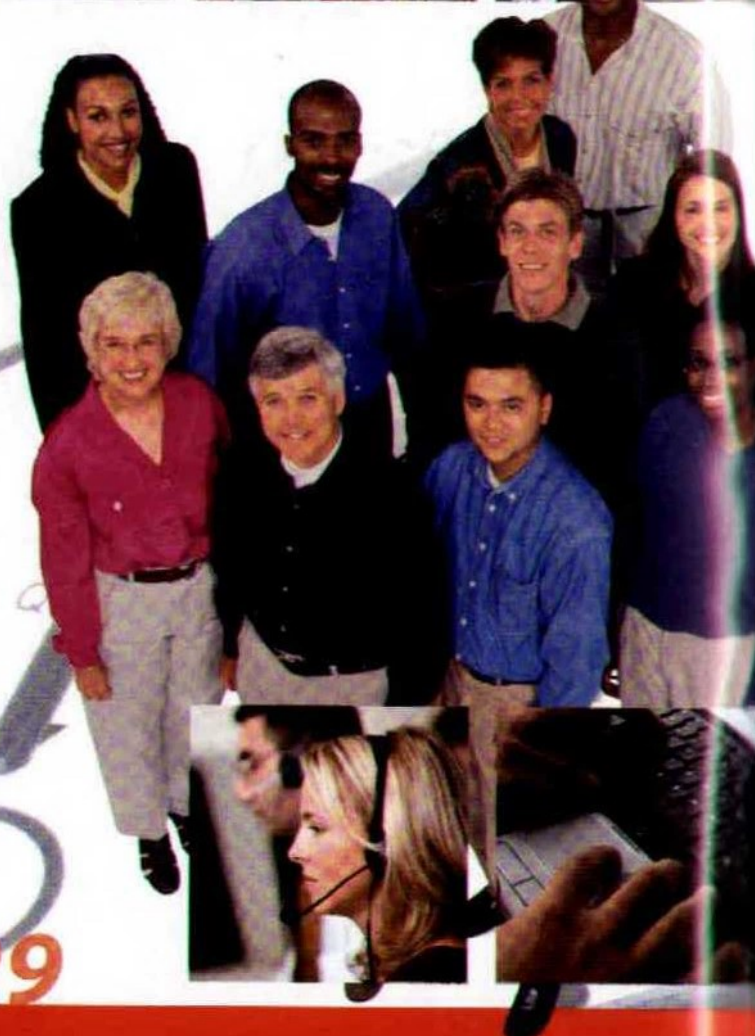

The Visitors

Swindon Town

Swindon Town are the visitors to London Road this evening and the Robins will be looking to build on an impressive start to 2007 which has seen them keep pace with the teams seeking automatic promotion from Coca-Cola League Two.

The Robins had won every league game since the turn of the year prior to Saturday's meeting with Macclesfield Town at the County Ground and Paul Sturrock's men also impressed in their third round FA Cup tie with Championship play-off contenders Crystal Palace.

Sturrock has knitted a squad together which has youth and experience and in striker Christian Roberts they have someone who is a big threat at this level, not just with his pace, but his goal-scoring ability.

Manager Sturrock spoke to his club's website last week and appealed for the supporters to remain calm and patient despite the good form of late. 'I think the fans need a reality check as well because there is a long way to go in the season. The league is so tight and a referee's decision, a suspension or an injury could cost us dear.

'We have to keep the focus from game to game. There are some very good teams in this division with teams who will throw money at their squads. We will remain positive in our approach home and away in our attempts to get the results we need,' Sturrock said.

It is not hard to figure out why the club are fighting for automatic promotion

as one look at the squad fills most teams at this level with envy. Former Bristol City striker Lee Peacock is good aerially and holds the ball impressively, while Jerel Ifil was a one-time Barry Fry target during his management days at London Road. Ifil has plenty of pace and is a regular at the heart of the Swindon defence.

Lucas Jutkiewicz is a talented youngster who has made a big impression from the substitutes bench while the manager's son Blair scored one of the goals in the recent 3-1 away victory at struggling Boston United.

Blair was delighted with the performance: 'It's a good feeling to score and I am very happy with the goal. Lucas was unselfish and he rolled it through. Everyone did the hard work out there. We fought hard on a bumpy pitch and thankfully we took all the points. The boys did well to get the win so I don't think I'll be pushing for a start quite yet - I'll have to be patient on that front.'

It is close between Peterborough and Swindon if you look at the head to head with both clubs recording 18 victories. The last league win for Posh at London Road against Swindon came in 2004 when goals from Adam Newton, Dave Farrell, Richard Logan and a 45-yard effort from Steven Thomson earned Posh a 4-2 home success.

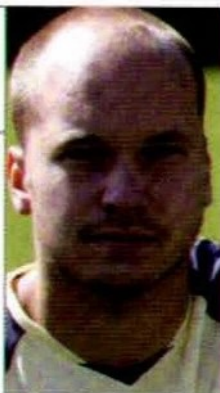
PHIL SMITH

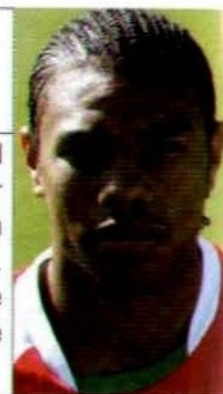
JEREL IFIL

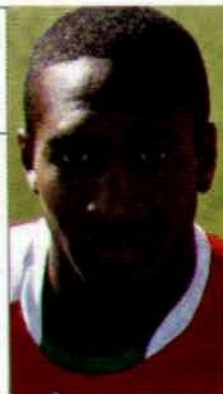

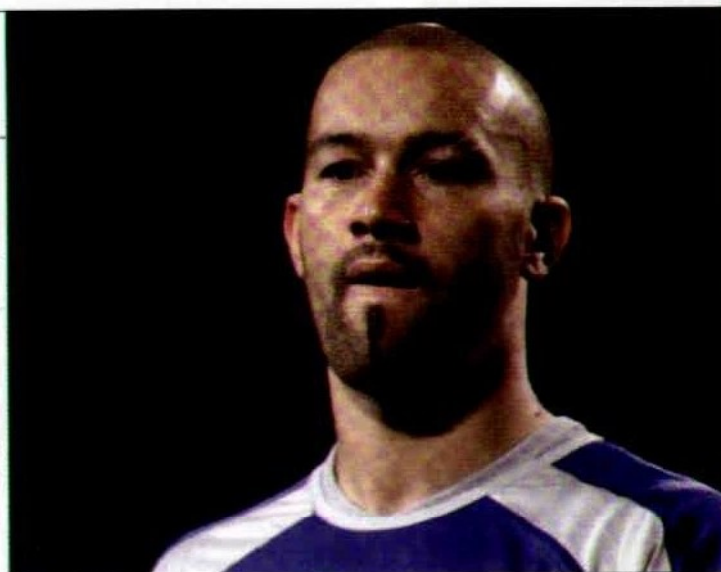
CHRISTIAN ROBERTS

Paul Sturrock is the new man in charge of Swindon Town following a glittering career as player and promising career as manager. Sturrock arrives at Swindon Town having achieved numerous successes as a manager - which includes winning the League One Play-Off final with Sheffield Wednesday.

A member of the successful Dundee United team of the early 80's Sturrock picked up a league winners medal in 1983 and two league cups in 1979 and 1980. 'Luggy' as he was affectionately known also appeared in the UEFA Cup final against Barcelona in 1987 where they were defeated 2-1 on aggregate. Sturrock began his playing career at Tannadice in 1974 as an apprentice.

Born in Ellon, Aberdeenshire, Sturrock was an integral part of Jim McClean's sides' success. He scored 171 goals in 576 appearances becoming United's best attacking player of all time and his skills put fear into the opposition but respected nonetheless.

After 20 years of dedicated service at Tannadice he hung up his boots and began a coaching role at Dundee United. Four years later he finally made his first move into management by becoming the St. Johnstone manager and led the side to the first division title in 1997. When United came calling the following year the lure to manage his only club was too hard to resist and was back in charge at his spiritual home as manager of the Tangerines.

It was to be a short spell in charge at Tannadice - just two games into the 2000-01 season he resigned and left



Scotland to begin life as a manager in the Football League with Plymouth Argyle. The Home Park fans quickly warmed to their new boss and he led the Pilgrims to the League Two title amassing 102 points and being named Nationwide Manager of the Year. In League One he guided them to eighth before a move to near neighbours Southampton. In three and a half years he instilled a style of play that would eventually lead Plymouth to the Championship which is where they continue to impress.

Sturrock took over at Southampton in March 2004 with his first Premiership game in charge resulting in an impressive 2-0 victory over Liverpool. However his time at St Mary's turned sour and after just 13 games in charge he left the Saints following a 3-2 win against Blackburn on August 24 by mutual consent.

In September 2004 he took over as manager at Sheffield Wednesday and it was to be an impressive spell at Hillsborough. Swindon are no strangers to success and with the experienced Paul Sturrock now at the helm - these are exciting times indeed at SN1.

Player Spotlight

Adam Smith

It is important to put your bodies on the line as professional footballers and former King's Lynn defender Adam Smith did just that – unfortunately he was one of the main targets during a team-building paint-balling exercise last Wednesday.

The idea of the paint-balling was the brainchild of new Peterborough United player-manager Darren Ferguson and Smith admitted that he enjoyed the experience and it helped bring the players closer together after a difficult run of form.

'The lads went paint-balling last week, I took a knock to the head, but it was a good team building exercise and everyone enjoyed themselves. It was good to do something like that after the training sessions earlier in the week and I think the lads certainly had fun.

'It has obviously been another new experience for me with a new management team coming in, but the training has been good.

'Training has been upped and everyone is enjoying it at the minute. The manager has got the respect from the players for what he has achieved in the game and has already made a big impact.

'We have had a few double training sessions and to a certain extent it has been proving yourself all over again. I came in with Keith Alexander and now I have to make my mark on Darren.

'It has been very hectic ever since I joined to be honest and it does take a little bit of getting used to – it is certainly different to life at Kings Lynn,' Smith said.

Posh had lost seven league games on the trot prior to the weekend clash with Lincoln City at Sincil Bank and Smith admitted that something had to be done after the poor run of league form.

'I think when a team has lost seven games on the trot, something needs to be done, you can't keep doing exactly what you are doing. The players are behind the new manager and we are all pulling in the right direction.

'We have to improve as a group of players. We have been on a difficult run, but the lads know what needs to be done to put things right.

'The players are disappointed with how things have gone. We have to grind out results and keep it tight at the back. Then we can move forward as a team and try and push for a promotion spot, which we are all looking for,' Smith said.

Smith scored his first goal in the Football League during the defeat at Darlington and has played in a few positions already since his move from the Linnetts, although his preferred position is left-back.

He has made four starts so far this season and has impressed the supporters with his attacking adventure on the left hand side.

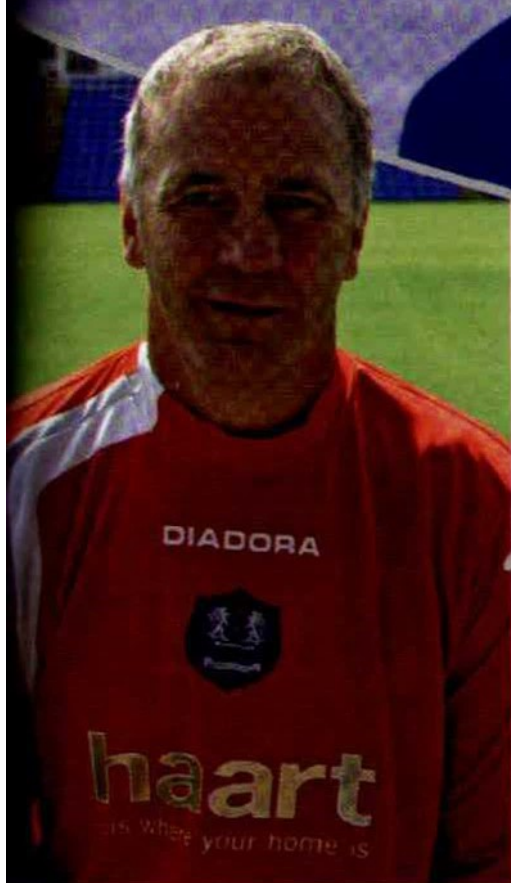

He was in for treatment on Sunday and hopefully he will be fit for tonight's game.

A calf strain (torn calf muscle) occurs when part of the muscle of the lower leg (gastrocnemius or soleus) is pulled from the Achilles tendon. It is similar to an Achilles tendon tear or rupture, but occurs higher up in the back of the leg.

A sign of a calf strain is similar to that of an Achilles tendon rupture - you may think you've just been hit in the leg and hear a 'pop.' There is sudden pain at the back of the leg, pain, swelling or bruising in the calf muscle, and you have difficulty standing on the toes.

This injury happens during acceleration or changes in direction. The torn calf muscle may spasm, and contract forcefully. The toes will point down. Bruises show up in the foot and ankle due to pooling of blood from internal bleeding.

Since my last programme notes, we have picked up a couple of injuries. Danny Crow suffered an injury during Monday's training session last week. It is an ankle tendon problem and a lateral leg muscle problem, which has not responded too well to treatment.

It is touch and go whether he will be fit for tonight's game with Swindon Town. Aaron Mclean suffered an ankle injury during last Tuesday's training session, but he has responded better to treatment and was involved at Lincoln City on Saturday.

Craig Morgan had a knee problem after the Plymouth Argyle game, but trained at the back end of last week and travelled to Sincil Bank. Guy Branston has had a calf strain for two weeks, but he trained with the squad on Thursday and Friday and has recovered well.

Unfortunately for Guy though, he suffered a calf strain during the game against Lincoln during the second

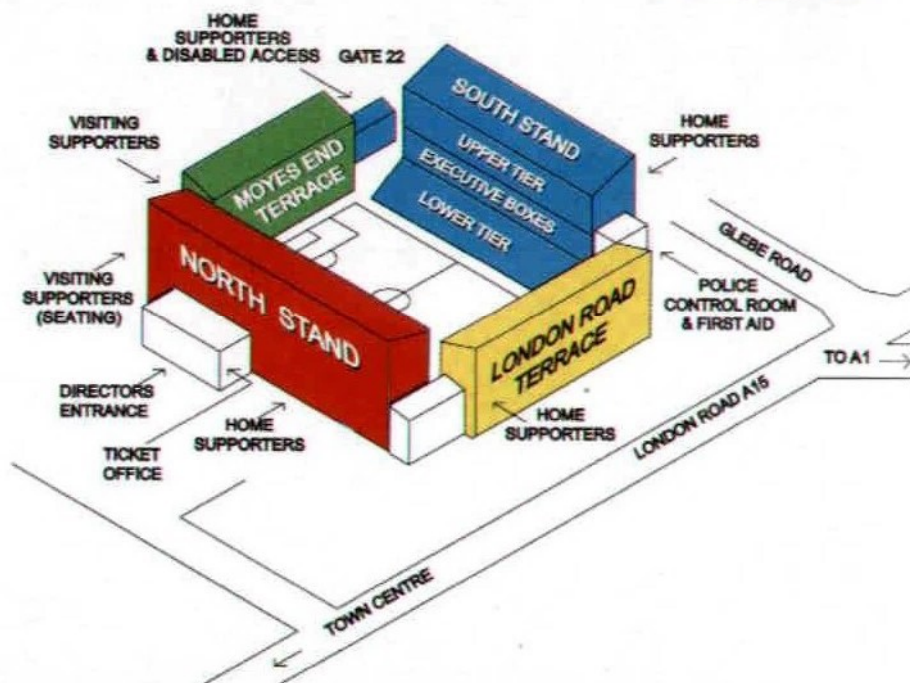

Exit the M6 at junction 17 (Sandbach) and follow the A534 to Congleton. From here take the A536 to Macclesfield (Macclesfield is signposted from the Motorway). After passing the 'Millers' pub on the left continue for about 1/4 of a mile and turn right at the Texaco garage onto Moss Lane. Follow Moss Lane until you reach the ground.

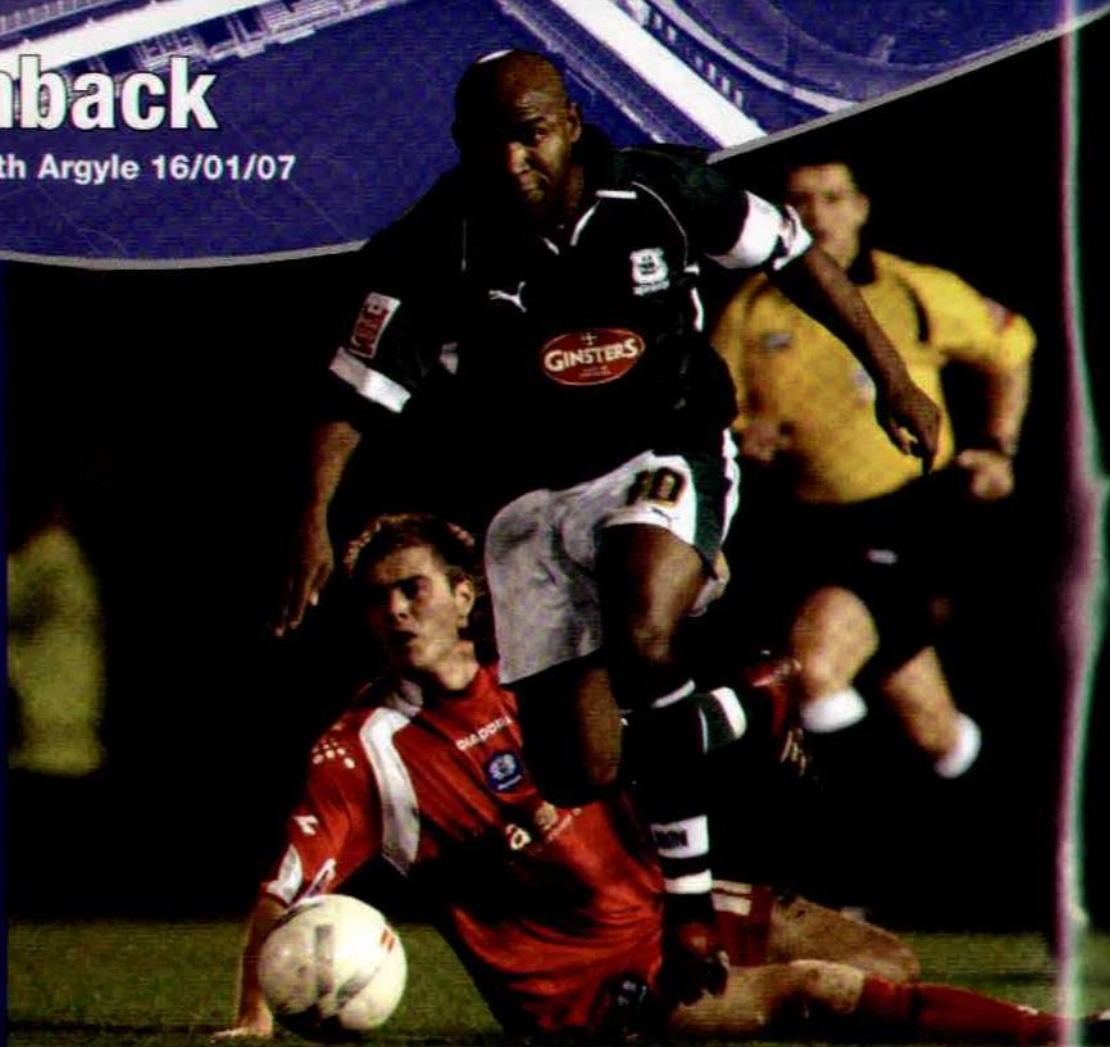

GOAL OFFICIAL SUPPORTERS CLUB SPONSORSHIP SCHEME

Last season the Goal Sponsorship Scheme was very successful with £2,000 raised. We are again looking for 100 Official Supporters Club members to sign up for a season long sponsorship. Each person that joins the scheme will commit to sponsoring each goal scored by Peterborough United in units of 25p.

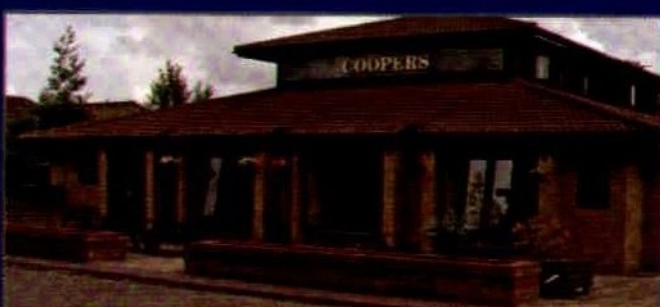

From the past

In the latest in our series looking back at some of Peterborough United's most memorable matches, Peter Lane recalls a meeting with Crystal Palace back in 1960 with over 21,000 supporters packed into London Road to watch it.

On Wednesday 7th September 1960, Posh visited Palace and what an occasion with us winning 2-0 before an astonishing attendance of 36,478 (a record for a Fourth Division game at that time). What a fantastic game I witnessed.

However, the home game on the following Monday (12th September) proved to be an even better one. Again a large crowd of 21,171 was in attendance, that was just 800 sort of the then ground record against Lincoln City in the FA Cup in 1957.

Arthur Rowe, ex-Tottenham Hotspur, brought his side boasting Welsh international Vic Rouse in goal and future England centre forward Johnny Byrne in attack. On a lovely September evening I witnessed a game that would have done credit to the First Division let alone the Fourth.

Terry Bly scored the first of his many hat-tricks for Posh (16th, 32nd and 72nd minute)

with Billy Hails helping to lay on all three before scoring himself. By half-

time Posh were 3-0 up. Heckman then scored in the second half for Palace before Bly completed the hat-trick to make it 4-1.

Posh then had a twice-taken penalty saved by Rouse which was due to a defender encroaching into the area – sounds all too familiar! This victory took Posh to the top of the league with 13 points from eight games (two points for a win and one for the draw).

The match day programme consisted of 12 pages with outer and inside cover in blue print and the rest of the programme in black and white. It cost a staggering 4d with an aerial shot of the ground on the cover. You could also see the old Royal Oak pub on the end of the bridge.

Clearly visible on the photo was the fact that both the London Road and Moyes End were only half under cover. Inside the programme were several small adverts, one of which advertised the Peterborough Standard Book, 'Never so Posh' for 2/6d.

There was only one photograph

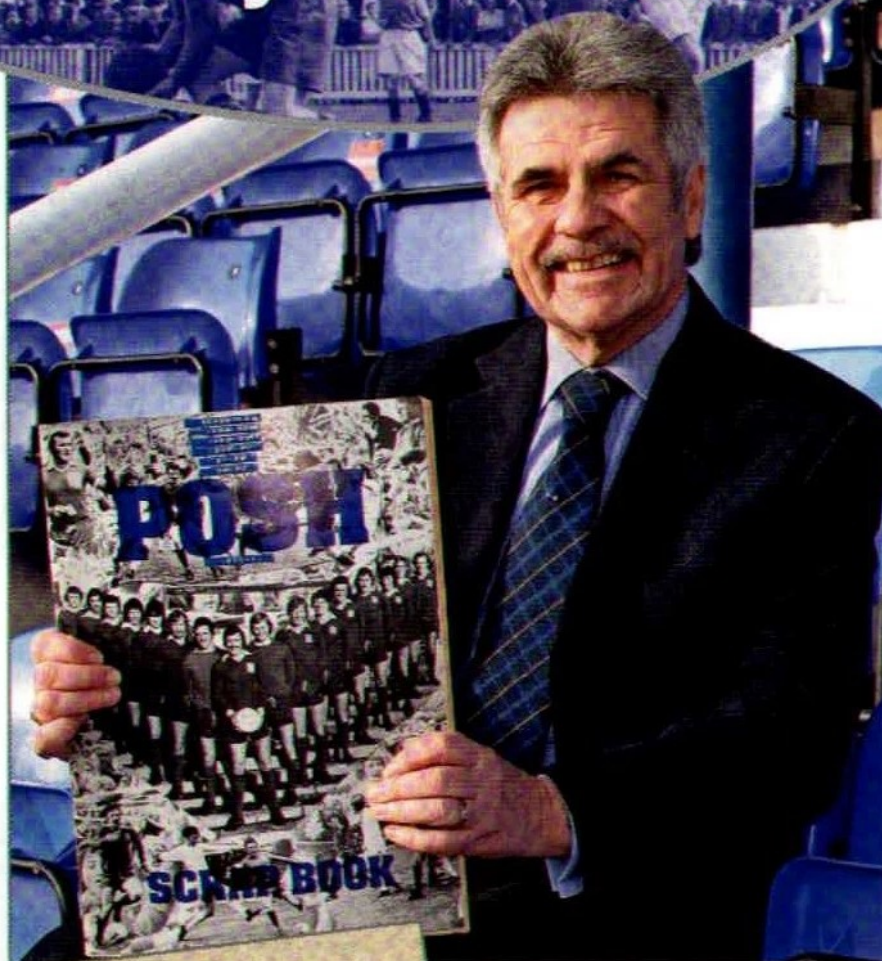


inside of Norman Rigby leading the sides onto the pitch. Both teams were listed on the centre fold with an advert underneath by British Rail offering an 'Evening by the Sea' at Skegness on Saturday 24th September. Another notice advertised was for a dance in the Posh Ballroom with the Kenny Colson Band.

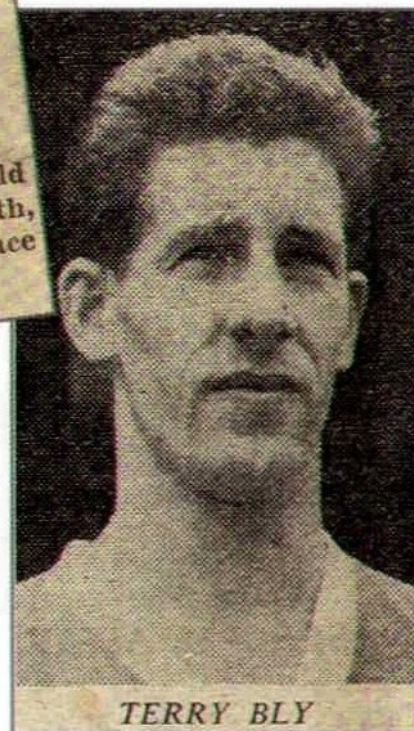
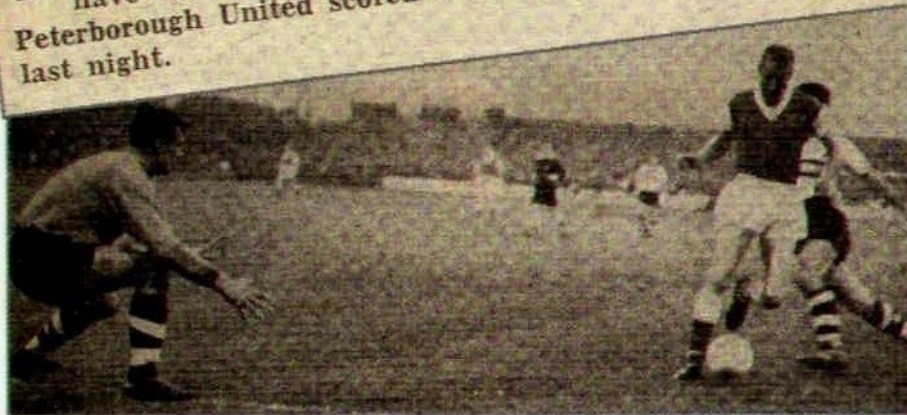

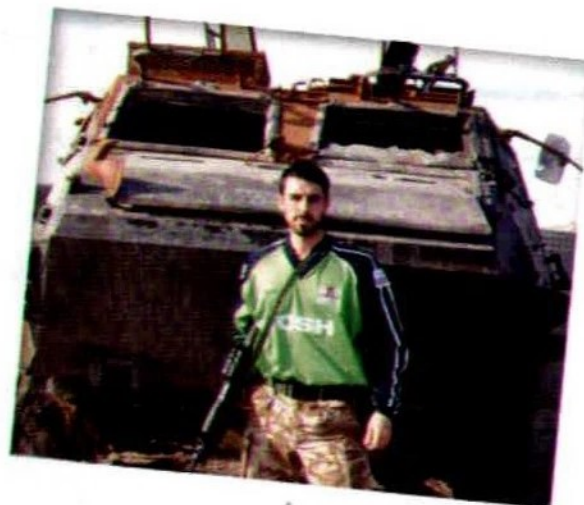
Posh In Afghanistan
