
defence, which caused them problems all afternoon.


GARY PETERS

Gary has spent over 35-years in the professional game, playing over 650 first team games and being involved in 10 promotions as either player or manager.

He has an eye for young up and coming players and handed David Beckham his first regular run in a side after taking him from Manchester United to Preston North End on loan. Gary brought John Maken, Sean Greagan and Kevin Kilbane to Preston, players who Preston sold on for over £8 million.

Since taking over the managerial reigns at Town Peters has steady the club in his first season and them finished fourth from bottom in the division but safe from relegation. The following season Peters and assistant manager Mick Wadsworth turned Town into a solid unit which saw the side just miss out on a play off place thanks to a home defeat by fellow play off hopefuls Lincoln City.

This season Peters has strengthened the Town squad with some good experienced talent and with new first team conch John McMahon on board Town will be looking to at least make the play offs.







ne STFC goes head to head with another this afternoon at The County Ground for a League Two clash which is important to both sides.

Under Gary Peters' guidance The Shrews have made steady progress this term and currently find themselves just inside the Play-Off spots after a 3-0 win over Rochdale on Tuesday. They are well-placed with two games in hand on the teams around them and don't be surprised if The Shrews do make it into the end of season shakeup. They are now on an unbeaten run which now stretches to 14 games and includes victories over Peterborough United, Wrexham and Notts County.

Gay Meadow has become something of a fortress this term and their home form has provided an excellent platform on which to build. With just three home losses (Swindon have four registered defeats at SNI) they have become a hard side to beat on their own turf.

County Ground and Shrewsbury's form away from home has seen them take all three points on just six occasions on the road. Notable wins on their travels include 3-0 victories at both Hartlepool United and Stockport County. The Town defence should take note.

The last meeting between the two sides was what proved to be Dennis Wise's last game in charge of The Robins. DEREK ASAMOAH

Diminutive but tricky striker who has caused problems for many opposition defence during his career. Signed from Lincoln City last summer, Asamoah started his career with Hampton & Richmond before further spells with Northampton Town and Mansfield Town. Has scored nine goals so far this season.

Birmingham-born midfielder who began his career with Walsall but failed to make an impact with the Saddlers and joined Kidderminster in January 2000. We're in a sequence of four away fixtures out of five - this is the exception, before Tuesday's "game in hand" at Rochdale and then the Easter weekend after which the manager has said the promotion picture may have become a little bit clearer. The push for "automatic" was boosted by a 3-2 success against Lincoln at Sincil Bank last time out. The squad certainly had a "freshness" after five new faces were brought in just before the transfer deadline.

Another delegated article today to nephew Richard Adams, a dedicated football fan who's followed England all the way to Barcelona this week. As we go to press, he may or may not be happy on the return journey:

"Today sees the clash of the Football League's only two STFC's! The last time Swindon and Shrewsbury met, at Gay Meadow, back on the 21st October, was also the last game with Dennis WIse and Gus Poyet in charge. Soon after, they signed for Leeds United. Swindon managed to hold on to a 2-1 victory, with Phil Smith (making his League debut for the Town after Peter Brezovan's injury the week before) making

a point-blank save in the dying seconds. Fola Onibuje had given the visitors the lead after 12 minutes. The equalizer for the Shrews came from Ben Davies and then a deflected Aaron Brown shot late-on resulted in a tense last 10 minutes.

The end of that game saw
Swindon lying in third place
behind Walsall and Wycombe
and Shrewsbury just outside the
Play-Offs in eighth. Not much
has changed in terms of position
24 games later. At the time of
writing (24/3), Swindon are still
chasing automatic promotion
and Shrewsbury are ninth but
with two games in hand on
Wycombe, only 3 points behind
the Chairboys who are occupying

the bottom Play-Off spot.

Shrewsbury Town have enjoyed a good run of form this year; they haven't been defeated since the Boxing Day loss at then leaders Walsall. Swindon, meanwhile, have had a mixed set of results in the last ten games!


Swindon and Shrewsbury have played each other 51 times. Swindon have won 23, Shrewsbury have won 14 and there have been 14 draws. Swindon's biggest win was 5-0 in September 1977, with goals from Kamara, Aizlewood, Moss, Guthrie and Trollope. However Shrewsbury have also had good results against the Town, including a 7-0 win on the final day of the 1954-55 season, and a 7-3 victory two years later.

It was against Shrewsbury Town in 1963 that Swindon finally secured promotion in front of 20,000 fans at the County Ground after 43 years of third division football!"

coring a goal on your debut is always going to help endear you to the fans, especially when it's against your local rivals. But scoring another, in a crucial game against a promotion rival and in front of the Sky cameras is a one-way ticket to legendary status and so far, Barry Corr has gone about silencing those that thought his goalscoring record wasn't quite what the doctor ordered.

Truth is the 21-year old, who celebrates his birthday on Monday, has suffered from injuries throughout his career and the youngster hasn't had a chance to fulfill his potential. Now, with the chance to fire Swindon back into League One the Irishman looks set to grab it with both hands. And if anyone's going to get the best out of him, he says, it's our man Paul Sturrock...

I FEEL LIKE I OWE HIM SOMETHING BECAUSE HE'S HELPED ME BECOME A BETTER PLAYER. I HAVE TO GET MY SEASON STARTED, I HAVE A LOT TO PROVE BECAUSE I'VE NOT DONE MUCH IN FOOTBALL, BUT I KNOW I'M CAPABLE OF IT.

You've been here a week now, how are you settling in?

I was straight into it with the reserve game last Monday. I've not played many games so it was nice to get on the pitch. It was difficult though, I'd just driven down that day so I was a bit stiff!

A good debut on Monday, and an even better one on Sunday for the first team?!

I really enjoyed it, it was good to go straight back in and get Swindon back on track for automatic promotion. We can look to kick on from there. I couldn't have wished for a batter start, really. It's difficult in the reserves, especially when you don't know people but you can only do what you can do and it was more about getting some match practice.

Two goals, one against our rivals Bristol City in the reserves and a crucial one on Sunday in the promotion hunt...a good week's work!

There is a bit of rivalry and I've seen it from both sides, so it was good to get one over on City. Then, coming into the Lincoln game, these games are what it's all about and that's what you want as a footballer. Every game now is must-win and it's points, not performances that matter in the push to promotion. I just want to play and help Town achieve that goal of promotion and perhaps score a few goals in the process.

The gaffer has been impressed with your game but says fitness could be improved, have been working on that?

There weren't many reserve games over Christmas for Sheffield Wednesday and a lot of games were off due to weather, so I'd probably played two games since December? Match fitness is different to normal fitness and so while I feel good, I know there's a bit to go — I can only get

that by playing games and I didn't feel as sharp as usual last week, but that will come with games. The gaffer will have me running and I'll be at my peak soon enough,

You're familiar with the gaffer and vice versa...


We worked together for a while and we know what we're all about – I'm pleased to be here working for him. Working with Paul Sturrock is great, I really respect him. He's been good to me, he took me to Sheffield Wednesday as well and it was just a shame I got riddled with injury. I feel like I owe him something because he's helped me become a better player. I have to get my season started, I have a lot to prove because I've not done much in football, but I know I'm capable of it.


You know some of the players as well, does that help?

It does a little bit – it makes it easier when you walk into the dressing room. It's still hard because you don't know every one and there's banter flying about and you're not in on it – but I know Lee [Peacock] and Michael [Timlin] and it does help; it allows you to express yourself more.

Do you feel any burden of expectation coming into the side - given that Town haven't been scoring goals?

It's more a case of working my way in — there are good strikers at this club, I'm under no illusions that I'll walk straight in. I know Lee quite well and know what he can do. Young Lukas — he's on his way to Everton so he must be a good player (I), and I know Blair, another good player, Christian Roberts too. I'll just keep my head down, work hard and try and do my talking on the pitch. The manager says it's up to the players to keep the jersey — so it's up to me to perform and see what happens.

You've had a stop-start career, you've suffered from a lot of injuries?

A lot of injuries - a new manager came in at Sheffield Wednesday and I was coming back in without being match fit and there were a lot of good strikers there. For the sake of my career I felt as though I had to move and I came here, back with Paul Sturrock. I'm happy to be here. My season hasn't really got started, I just want to play games and I'm looking forward to it.

You went to Bristol City at the beginning of the season, and you trained with Chesterfield as well didn't you?

I went to City when I was coming back from injury, at the start of the season. I enjoyed my time there and started a couple of games. It came at a time when they wanted to extend the loan but having come back from injury I wanted to try and impress the Wednesday boss because he was new. I didn't want to be on the outside without him knowing what I could do - but I've had to look elsewhere since then anyway.

What are you expecting from League Two?

A physical game, people say it'll be tougher, the pitches not as good, but I just want to play my game and help Swindon make automatic promotion - get my head down to help them achieve that.

Is it a nice position to be in, coming into a side with a shout for promotion?

Definitely, but there are eight games to go and it would be terrible to see the

season fizzle out here - we want to keep the excitement up and this football club deserves it, it's in the wrong position at the moment and it needs to be higher up the Football League. We are looking to promotion and we'll be fighting for an automatic spot.

The side had been on a poor run - can you still sense the belief in the side?

Everybody knows we're not in a good run. the manager is trying to put his finger on why that is and the unity of the team is still very good. The win Sunday gets us back on track and the squad is very good, they work hard and they want automatic promotion; play-offs wouldn't be the end of the world but the lads, from what I've seen, they feel they can do it without the lottery of the play-offs.

Today's game will be tough, Shrewsbury come here in good form...

We want to win all our games here, put on a shown for the fans and the three points are important. The lads told me about the fans here and while it was nice to celebrate with them Sunday, I'm looking forward to seeing what they're like at The County Ground.

We understand you're living at a hotel at the moment, how's that?

I don't like it at all if I'm honest. In Sheffield I had my mates around and up the road - but my friends have been ringing me to make sure I'm ok and the lads have been fantastic. They've been doing everything they can to help me get to know them better.

windon Town Ladies picked up Sthree points from two away games in the South West Combination League.





As far as it's possible to ascertain, Town have never played a competitive match in Venezuela.

VIZARD, TED

Once a Welsh international, Ted Vizard became manager of Town in 1933 and (you'll be surprised to hear this) we had a bit of a cash flow problem. Previous incumbent Sam Allen had led the club for an incredible 31 years as the position slowly evolved from one of secretary, who had team selection foisted upon him by the board of directors, to one more comparable to today's role.

Ted became the first man to be master of his own players, but through the cash shortage, his first action was to axe almost an entire team's worth. Familiarly, there was very little money available to replace them. Town had just successfully applied for re-election to the Football League having finished bottom of Division Three South in 1933, so the lack of funds was hardly an ideal team building foundation.

To his credit. Eddie Vizard us being a laughing stock and took Town to a series of mid-table finishes. moving on to



UPRICHARD. NORMAN

Joining Town on a free from Arsenal before Christmas in 1949, Norman was destined to play for his country of birth, Northern Ireland. The goalkeeper was an early present for manager Louis Page when he made his debut against Torquay United on Christmas Eve at the County Ground, although the game ended in defeat at the hands of the Gulls.

And it was Torquay who caused both Town and Norman great embarrassment in March 1952 when United stuck nine past Town for no reply. When you consider Uprichard had also been between the posts when we lost 8-2 to Southend in February 1951, from this distance in time, it seems our Norm must have learned quite a lot by the time Portsmouth offered a five figure sum three years after he had arrived in Wiltshire. He'd made 73 first team outings for Town and the move brought his elevation to the international stage where he eventually claimed 18 caps.

After 182 League appearances for Pompey came a move which on the face of it seems strange. Moving from south coast team Portsmouth to Thames estuary outfit Southend, the Shrimpers took the man that they had stuck eight past to Roots Hall. Did they regret it? It's difficult to know, but just 12 games later, Norman made his last League appearance.

UPTON PARI



Two particular matches stand out between Town and West Ham United, and both took place at Upton Park in the FA Cup.



On 28th January 1967, Town travelled to London to take on the Hammers in the third round. The home side contained the three England internationals of Bobby Moore, Geoff Hurst and Martin Peters, all of whom would still be finding their attention wandering off the TV in the evening and on to the mantelpiece where their World Cup Winners medals would still be glinting in their newly-minted condition.

A hat-trick from Hurst might have seen off the Germans, but another one wasn't enough to dispose of Swindon.

A brace from Don Rogers and a single from Dennis Brown cancelled out Hurst's triple and brought the Hammers back to The County Ground where they were duly despatched from the competition. Another three strikes, these from Willie Penman, Don Rogers and

VIVEASH, ADI

Adi was one of those players that we're always told that club supporters clamour for. A local-born lad who had come through the ranks as one of the supporters' own.

So when manager Ossie Ardiles brought Adi on as substitute for his first appearance in September 1990, there were some raised eyebrows. With a midfielder going off and a defender coming on, there was surely some sort of formational re-shuffle on the cards. Little more than half an hour later.

Viveash was back off again, and the incident spoke more about Ardiles' lack of managerial experience than the performance of the young debutant.

There was much competition in defence at the time and Viveash had to be patient for an extended chance For a player who looked more suited to a central defensive role, Adi spent much of his time at left back. Managers Glenn Hoddle and John Gorman came and went without either giving the local lad much of a chance, and two loan spells at Reading gave a clue to the direction Adi's career might take.

Steve McMahon seemed to offer him a lifeline, but Viveash wouldn't be the only one to have been rumoured to have fallen out with that particular boss. A loan spell at Barnsley led to a transfer to Walsall, where he became Club Captain and Player of the Year.

Then a full time move to Reading brought promotion, before a return to The County Ground under Andy King. Sadly, he was soon out of favour once more, going from prodigal son to sacrificial lamb after one particularly bad performance as part of the defensive unit.

Loan spells at Kidderminster followed, then the arrival of Sean O'Hanlon and Jerel Ifil heralded the end of Viveash's second spell at The County Ground.

Ken Skeen accounted for the First Division side.

Then eight seasons later it was the fourth round that drew Town to Upton Park. Again honours were shared. This time, Peter Eastoe grabbed the goal that levelled the scores. No happy ending this time though. Town lost the replay by 2-1.

VAN DER LINDEN, ANTOINE

One of nine Colin Todd signings in the summer of 2000, it wasn't long before Andy King inherited this classy looking Dutch central defender. Starting 17 games of the season Van der

Linden came off the bench almost as many times, and with King once proclaiming that he must be able to play anywhere 'because he's Dutch', Antoine was often the man thrown up front in a desperate attempt to turn a match around.



Perhaps frustrated by the lack of regular starts, Antoine's last appearance came at Stoke City in the last game of 2000/01. Then a return to his home country took him back off the domestic radar.

VINCENT, JAMIE

Left sided defender who was signed by Dennis Wise last summer, Jamie has been the subject of some big money moves over his career. Starting at Crystal Palace, he moved on to Bournemouth where he established himself to such an extent that Huddersfield Town took a £500,000 punt on him and made him a Terrier in 1999.

That worked out so well that two years later Portsmouth took him back to the south coast by upping the ante to £800,000 to claim his signature.

Further spells at Derby County and Millwall followed, then Wise brought Jamie to SNI for nothing. A bargain compared with what our man has cost some of his other clubs. When Ady Williams was ruled out through his unfortunate knee problems, Jamie claimed the skipper's armband.

A top tip here. Anyone still sporting a Paul Ince shirt can turn it into a Vincent one with the addition of just three extra letters.



"I knew a few of the lads from before and I had played against a few others during my career. It made the decision to come here a lot easier and it's a good squad. By bringing more players in only adds to the competition for places and that should come through into performances on the pitch."

The Londoner was handed a debut off the bench at Lincoln City last week in what proved to be a hardfought win at Sincil Bank.

"I enjoyed the game," he said speaking to STFC Magazine earlier in the week. "It was nice to get the win and get off to a good start. After a defeat at Grimsby it was important to get back on track quickly and thankfully we did just that.

"I hadn't played a first team game since November so it had been a while. It was good to get my debut out of the way and get some time on the pitch in a Swindon shirt. Being on TV didn't really change things. First and foremost you think about the game and get on with your own performance."

The 27-year old began his career as a trainee with Charlton Athletic but after two years at The Valley he made the switch to Gillingham, where he spent four years with The

Gills. A move to Nottingham Forest then arrived in May 2004 but his stay at The City Ground was punctuated by loan spells at Boston United, Yeovil Town, Grimsby Town and Walsall in the hunt for first team action.

A substitute appearance against Lincoln City last weekend was his 98th outing as a professional and the versatile loanee is hoping his season can end with automatic promotion.

"I thought we showed that we were more than capable of beating Lincoln last weekend so hopefully we can continue on and get another win against Shrewsbury.

"No one wants to be involved in the play-offs if they can be avoided. Automatic promotion has to be the target and we are fully focused on that."



AWAY SUPPORTERS

Swindon fans will be housed in the Willbutts Lane Stand (recently renamed the Westrose Leisure Stand), where the view of the action and the facilities are pretty good. Up to 4,000 supporters can be accommodated in it and normally away fans are confined to the centre of the stand. If required, then this stand can be split between home and away fans. The acoustics are excellent, so away fans can really make some noise from within it.

GETTING THERE

By Road: Exit the M62 at Junction 20 and take the A627(M) towards Rochdale. At the end of the A627(M) you should be in the left hand lane to turn left at the traffic lights. Go straight on over the roundabout (approach in the middle lane) into Roch Valley Way. At the next crossroads (where the Cemetery pub is on the corner) go straight onto Sandy Lane, where the ground can be found on the right after approx 3/4 mile.

Parking: Parking at the ground is now for permit holders only, so it is a case of either street parking or using the matchday parking facility at Oulder Hill School. The school is located on the way up to the ground, on the left hand side, along Sandy Lane (it is then a 10 minute walk uphill to the ground). If you do elect to park on the street then be wary of the "residents only" parking scheme, as otherwise you could end with a parking ticket for your trouble.


By Rail: Rochdale is served by trains from Manchester & Leeds, and is around two miles away from the ground. A taxi is recommended as it is a half hour work to

the ground from the station.

AROUND THE GROUND

At the ground there are two bars to choose from, Studds & The Ratcliffe Arms, Studds is located underneath the Pearl Street Stand and is worth a visit, if only to sample the large range of tasty pies & pasties on offer at £1.50 (which are also available inside the ground). The Ratcliffe Arms, with Sky TV, is located at the car park entrance to the ground, on Sandy Lane. A couple of minutes walk along Willbutts Lane, is the Church Pub. which seems to be the favoured haunt of away fans. Also on Willbutts Lane, is a small chip shop, with lengthy queues.

If you arrive early, the Cemetery Hotel, located at the bottom of Sandy Lane and on the corner with Bury Road, is also worth a visit. This comfortable historic pub has a range of real ales on offer and again friendly clientele. Otherwise alcohol is available inside the ground, although it is cans poured into plastic glasses.




