Here at Bury Football Club we believe in developing successful players through the youth system. This can be seen in players such as

David Nugent, Colin Kazim-Richards and current players such as David Buchanan and Tom Kennedy, who have come through the ranks and were or are, regular first team players.

What now lies behind the development of players such as these is a new programme. the apprenticeship in Sporting Excellence (ASE) programme. ASE is a two year course, taken between the ages of 16 & 18, in which appentices study for an NVQ in acheiveing excellence in sports performance, an academic education qualification, a certificate in coaching football and learn key skills.

These qualifications equip both the apprentices who go on to become professionals footballers and those that leave the game, with skills and academic qualifications that are viewed as essential by employers.

The programme came into existence in June 2004 and is managed by league football education (LFE), a partnership organisation created between the Football League and the PFA. Bury FC, along with Bury college are then responsible for delivering the major content within the football and academic streams of the programme.

Today, Bury FC would like to celebrate the hard work and dedication to the first cohort of apprentices to go through the new ASE programme and to achieve the full framework. This being a pass grade or better in each of the four elements described.




To lose both games over that weekend was really disappointing as we fancied ourselves strongly to pick up sufficient points to see us safe.



"The lads are very disappointed after the Bristol Rovers defeat. We felt we were unfortunate to lose the Rochdale game, we went to Bristol intent on putting in another good performance, unfortunately we conceded a goal in either half. Its disappointing and one of them from a set piece which we are not happy about."

"The press called it a routine win for Bristol, and I can understand the thinking behind that headline. After the week they had last week with the Johnstone's Paint Trophy final, it was a game where if somebody got in front, they can batten down the hatches."

"We got to half time and we were thinking that we are still in the game, we tried to come out and get back in it and we let another one in on 60 minutes and the game finishes there."

"We've put a big effort in for the last couple of weeks and Monday's game was a tough game for us. The two sides over the Easter weekend are pushing for the play offs and it's been difficult for us, but we live to fight another day."


"Being named as man of the match is no consolation. Tom Youngs said to me as we came off that he thought I had had a good game, it's nice of him to say so, but it doesn't say much for the rest of the team in my own mind. We have a home game with Swindon coming up and we have the chance to sort it out and with four games to go, we have to start doing some work."

"All the young lads that have played this season have been great for us over the season, and with them not having the experience behind them, they have to dig in. They will come out the other end the better for it. We can't get on the backs of the young lads because they are doing a mans job in there."

"Glynn Hurst came off at half time, and if the manager thinks it is not working on the day, then he is going to change it. Hursty and Bish have worked so hard throughout all their games and they did the same on Monday. I wouldn't like to be playing where they play in that heat. We had two games in three days and if you look at the Premiership teams today, they will have had the numbers to swap two or three players around."

"Glynn is Mr Johnny on the spot for us and Tom Youngs brings something else to the side. The manager swapped it round because Tom does bring something else and he's deserved his chance to get back in, especially when he has been chomping on the bit to get back in the side."

"I know a few of the fans were unhappy when the gaffer took Fitzy off to put another defender on, but Fitz hasn't been playing games and he looked it, so what do you do, do you keep him on and let another goal in? You have to change it and you have to look at it that way. He was done in, he's not played, and sometimes it's as simple as that. The gaffer has to make changes and people need to look at the bigger picture."



Welcome to Gigg Lane...



Manager: Paul Sturrock: Arrived at Swindon Town FC having achieved numerous successes as a manager which includes winning the League One Play-Off final with Sheffield Wednesday. Left Scotland to begin life as a manager in the Football League with Plymouth Argyle. The Home Park fans quickly warmed to their new boss and he led the Pilgrims to the League Two title amassing 102 points and being named Nationwide Manager of the Year. In League One he guided them to eighth before a move to near neighbours Southampton. In three and a half years he instilled a style of play that would eventually lead Plymouth to the Championship which is where they continue to impress. Sturrock took over at Southampton in March 2004 with his first Premiership game in charge resulting in an impressive 2-0 victory over Liverpool. However his time at St Mary's turned sour and after just 13 games in charge he left the Saints following a 3-2 win against Blackburn on August 24 by mutual consent. In September 2004 he took over as manager at Sheffield Wednesday and it was to be an impressive spell at Hillsborough. He was named manager of the month for November and soon lifted Wednesday from 14th to 4th in League One and they were to drop out

of the play-off spots just once over the rest of the season, as more steel became engrained in their gritty style of play as time went on. The Owls made it into the play-offs and defeated Brentford in the semi-finals - with Town's Lee Peacock amongst the goalscorers over the two legs. Hartlepool United were the opponents in the showpiece final at Cardiff and victory sent 40,000 into wild celebrations.

PETER BREZOVAN: A giant in goal at 6'7, Brezovan signed on a year's loan from Czech club FC Brno in the summer of 2006. Brezovan became a fans favourite after performing heroics on his competitive debut against Hartlepool United on the opening debut, saving two penalties from Porter and Humphreys to earn Town all three points. Unfortunately he sustained in the October home encounter with Grimsby Town and is recovering; but will not feature until the closing stages of the campaign.

JACK SMITH: Signed from Watford in the summer of 2005, Smith added youthful experience to the Town side. Due to the departure of Paul Robinson to West Bromwich Albion he was thrust into the first-team spotlight at Watford and coped admirably, registering two goals - the first of which a 'Goal of the Season' contender at Sheffield United in front of the Sky Sports cameras.

JAMIE VINCENT: Jamie Vincent arrived at The County Ground hoping to make the left-back slot his own, and he has now established himself as the first choice. Vincent began his football career as a trainee at Crystal Palace before making the switch to AFC Bournemouth, where he made over 100 appearances between 1996 and 1999. He then made a £500,000 switch to

Huddersfield Town which was followed by an £800,000 deal which saw him move to Portsmouth in 2001.

SOFIENE ZAABOUB: Versatile left-sided player at home in defence or midfield, Zaaboub was new manager Paul Sturrock's first signing as Town boss. Having joined initially on a short-term contract, he has since signed a new deal to keep him at Swindon for another 18 months. He made his debut as a substitute against Carlisle United in the FA Cup and was a trialist at Sturrock's former club Sheffield Wednesday. Previous clubs include FC Brussels, Modena and St. Etienne.

JEREL IFIL: Powerful defender Jerel Ifil joined Town in the summer of 2004 after enjoying three loan spells with Town previously from 2002-04. Jerel became a fan's favourite during his brief stays in Wiltshire and signed on a permanent basis in June 2004, he has now exceeded 100 appearances for the club.

ADY WILLIAMS: Named on-field Captain by former manager Dennis Wise in mid-July, Ady Williams brings with him a wealth of footballing experience. Signed from Coventry City in pre-season, the former Welsh International boasts successful spells with Wolves and Reading on his CV and has just the credentials that could set Town on their way to League Two success this term.

GARETH WHALLEY: Signed for Swindon Town in July 2005 from Wigan Athletic on a free transfer. Originally a trainee at Crewe, Gareth made over 200 first-team appearances for them before signing for Bradford City in July 1998 for £600,000. Gareth was a regular during their two-season spell in the top














flight and in March 2002 went back to Crewe on loan for a few months.

AARON BROWN: Aaron Brown is now fully focussed on his Town career after a difficult start to the 2006-7 campaign. Brown requested a transfer away from SN1 in the summer following the club's relegation to League 2, but after interest from Brentford and an unsuccessful trial at Doncaster Rovers, 'Brownie' found himself back at The County Ground and he has now forced his way back into the first team plans.

CHRISTIAN ROBERTS:

Cardiff-born striker who joined Town in October 2004 in a £50,000 switch from local rivals Bristol City. He is an aggressive runner and will add much needed pace to the Swindon frontline. Formerly with Exeter City where he scored 18 goals in 67 league starts for the Grecians from 2000 - 2002. With 6 goals in 22 starts for the Robins so far.

LEE PEACOCK: Lee Peacock joined Swindon Town on 20th January 2006 on a free transfer from Sheffield Wednesday. The experienced frontman started his career at Carlisle United as a trainee, but after scoring 11 goals in 52 appearances he made the switch to Mansfield Town in October 1997 for £75,000. It proved to be a productive spell with The Stags with 29 goals in 80 appearances attracting Manchester City who parted with £500,000 for his services.

BARRY CORR: Sheffield Wednesday striker Barry Corr joined Swindon Town on loan until the end of the campaign on Monday 19th March 2007. The Irishman made his debut for the Town reserves against Bristol City on the same day he put pen to paper on the loan deal and netted on what was his first appearance in a Swindon shirt.

RICKY SHAKES: A tricky winger with plenty of pace, Shakes signed from Bolton Wanderers in a deal which also saw Charlie Comyn-Platt join the club. Shakes spent time on loan with Bristol Rovers and Bury during the 2004-5 season and impressed former manager Andy King during a reserve game for STFC towards the end of the 2004-5 campaign.

JON STEWART: Jon Stewart is a former Chelsea and Leicester City stopper who arrived at Swindon Town in the summer of 2005. The 6'3 keeper has been a regular on the teamsheet for the Town's Under 18 side and has also made several reserve team appearances along the way, gaining valuable experience.

DAVE PARTRIDGE:

Westminster-born Partidge is a Welsh International with six caps to his name who will add valuable experience to the Town ranks. He has also enjoyed a loan spells with Leyton Orient and Brentford earlier this term. Partridge began his career with West Ham United as a trainee before spells with Dundee United, Motherwell and Bristol City - who he joined for £150,000 in July 2005.

ANDY NICHOLAS: 'Nicho' joined Town in the close season of 2003 following his decision to leave Liverpool, where he came through the youth system but struggled to break into the first team. He


was a regular in the Under 19's side at Anfield and won many plaudits with his performances at left back, which prompted Andy King to snap up the youngster.

PATRICK NOUBISSIE: Patrick Noubissie signed for Swindon Town on deadline day in January 2007 after impressing manager Paul Sturrock on trial. The defender featured for Town's reserves in the middle of January, playing at right-back against Cardiff City. Noubissie arrived at Crewe Alexandra on a short-term contract in November 2006 having impressed the coaching staff whilst spending a brief trial spell at the club.

PAUL EVANS: An experienced campaigner with over 400 league starts and 2 Welsh caps to his name, 'Evo' joined the Town ranks in July 2006 from Nottingham Forest. His former clubs include Shrewsbury Town, Brentford, Bradford City and Nottingham Forest. He eventually left The City Ground after being frozen out by former Reds Boss Gary Megson, which also saw Evans spend a loan spell with Rotherham United towards the end of the 2005-6 season.

MICHAEL POOK: 'Pooky' signed a professional contract ahead of the 2005-6 season and was a consistent performer for the youth team and reserves prior to joining the professional ranks. With a keen eye for goal, Pook's best effort to date is a 25-yard thunderbolt in the Carling Cup First Round against Wycombe Wanderers. An energetic 'box-to-box' midfielder, Pook is now very much part of the first team squad and has now made over 50 appearances at senior level.

LUKAS JUTKIEWICZ: 'A boy in a man's frame' is how manager Paul Sturrock described the powerful striker, and few would disagree. Southampton-born, 17-year old Jutkiewicz spent time with The Saints before joining Swindon's Centre of Excellence and won the Golden Boot Award at the Milk Cup in 2004.

BLAIR STURROCK: Sturrock junior arrived at The County Ground in November 2006 to join up with Physio Dick Mackey for treatment following an injury which ruled him out of the latter stages of the 2005-6 campaign, when he was at Rochdale. The striker joined Dundee United as a trainee before spending time at Brechin on loan.

CURTIS WESTON: Another summer signing, Weston joined from Millwall where he became the youngest ever FA Cup finalist ever at 17 years and 119 days, coming on to replace Dennis Wise in the 2004 final against Manchester United. A busy midfielder who likes to get amongst the goals, Weston has impressed with combative central displays, showing pace, aggression in the tackle and awareness.

ASHAN HOLGATE: Tall, gangly figure who can operate as a striker or in midfield. Scored on his senior debut against Millwall in pre-season 2004, after coming on as a substitute. Made his competitive first team debut last term, coming on as a late substitute in the FA Cup draw with Boston United at The County Ground.

PHIL SMITH: Phil Smith joined Swindon in late July 2006 from Crawley Town. Smith had made 74 starts for

Crawley Town during a two-year stay, which followed a year's spell at Margate where he made 35 starts. A dependable customer, Smith is now the Town number one following Brezovan's injury. He has been a revelation in between the sticks, gaining confidence with each game. He saved a penalty at MK Dons on New Year's Day and was named the PFA Fans' Player of the Month for December a few days later.

BEN WELLS: One of three Centre of Excellence players who were signed on as first year scholars in June 2004. An midfielder who impressed in the Under 17's last season. He was rewarded a squad number on Tuesday 30th November 2004 and made the bench against Bristol City in the LDV Vans Trophy. Now signed on as a professional with a year's contract, the energetic Wells will look to make the most of every opportunity that comes his way.

ANDY CATON: A versatile player, 'Cates' joined Swindon Town as a first year scholar in June 2004 after spending some time with GLS Hellenic Premier Division side North Leigh where he was a prolific scorer. The son of the late Manchester City player Tommy, he came off the bench on the opening day of the 2003-4 season against Wrexham and scored to mark a fairytale start to his Swindon Town career.

MICHAEL TIMLIN: Classy midfielder who made his Swindon debut against Bury at the end of October, after signing on a one-month loan deal. After impressing during his first stint, his loan deal was extended until the end of the campaign and he opened

his goalscoring account for Swindon - his first senior goal - against Notts County at the end of December.

KEVIN JAMES: Kevin James joined Town until the end of the season and will add to the attacking options for the manager. The striker started his career with Charlton Athletic as a trainee before joining Gillingham where he hit 4 goals in 18 starts before a move to Nottingham Forest in May 2004. He has also spent time out on loan at Yeovil Town and Grimsby Town this term and will offer versatility to the squad as he can play either in the front line or wide out in midfield.

ASHLEY GRIMES: Ashley Grimes joined Swindon Town on Thursday 22nd March in a loan deal which will see him remain at The County Ground for at least one month. Grimes joined the club from Premiership side Manchester City, where he has hit seven goals for City's reserves this term. A nippy striker, Grimes has bags of potential and will be hoping to impress during his time in Wiltshire, gaining valuable Football League experience.

CLAUDE GNAPKA: Claude Gnapka joined Town on Thursday 22nd March 2007 and arrives in England having had previous experience in Spain with Alaves and Racing Santander. The 23-year old French defender will add another option to the Town squad and provide competition at the back. Claude has signed for Swindon on a free transfer until the end of the season. He was named on the bench for the first time three days after signing for the club, which came at Lincoln City on Sunday 25th March.

JUST three weeks into the season and Andy Preece is facing his first crisis. Not only is his team playing poorly but he suddenly seems to be having problems with the players off the pitch. The manager is upset with the attitude of certain squad members and after watching his team slide to a Bank Holiday horror show defeat against Roy Evans' Swindon, Preece did not mince his words.

"Some of our players have got to grow up," stated Preece.
"Sometimes they're just like big babies. They get left out of the side and they go around sulking and moaning. Then when they get back in the side they don't do any better than anyone else. We were so poor and flat throughout and there are a few players out there playing in the comfort zone.

"I've had a go at a few after the game and maybe they will think about it tonight rather than go out, have a few drinks and celebrate losing. I don't celebrate losing. It hurts me but I just wonder how much it hurts some of the players. It's about time they started hurting."

Let's hope Preece gets it sorted for at the moment Bury look like a team going in only one direction - and it is not upwards. The Shakers have never been blessed with an abundance of skill and flair but they have always had fight and passion. Preece dropped four players from the side that lost at Huddersfield but it didn't stop Swindon ripping Bury apart in clinical fashion.

The inspiration for the Robins' win came from strikers Joe Kaffour (top scorer in Arsenal's reserve team last year) and Eric Sabin, signed from French Second Division side Wasquehall. Both were on top form,

linking up well and embarrassing the home side's defence on several

The Shakers though started brightly. Baichung Bhutia in particular looked good but there were soon signs of things to come as Paddy Kenny was forced to make two superb stops, first a Matt Hewlett curler and then saving when Sabin was clean through on goal. Bury's best chance came and went in the 37th minute, Matt Murphy blasting a volley over the bar on his full debut.


Two minutes after the break Kaffour bundled home Sabin's cross and despite three substitutions from Preece and various tinkering of tactics, the home side never looked like equalising. Swindon went two ahead when Sabin burst clear and was allegedly brought down by Unsworth in the area. The full back, who had only been on the pitch for nine minutes, was dismissed by referee Mark Clattenburg and Keith O'Halloran fired home the penalty.

Unsworth was unlucky to walk as he seemed to make a legitimate tackle. At least it prompted 10-men Bury to briefly come to life as Gareth Seddon and Sam Collins had headers well saved. But the visitors made it a rout late on as David Duke ran half the pitch to round Kenny and score a fine goal.

Business options used to be restricted to publican, bookie or coach; not so for Liam Robinson, as the Yorkshire-born striker set up his own tree surgery business once he stopped playing the game.

"A friend suggested it. As a player you think football will last forever but it doesn't, so I got a job on a building site when I finished playing professionally and then I was a postman for four years," he now reflects.

"If you're daft enough to climb a tree with a chainsaw, it's great. I love it!" he laughs.



Over the Pennines

Liam moved to Bury from Huddersfield in 1987 when he was just 20. His first goal came in his home debut and his second followed in the same game, against Doncaster Rovers. "I'd had a few starts with Town but a few niggly problems. But it was an

ideal start at Bury and I never looked back," he says.

But greater things than a brace against Donny Rovers would follow as Liam's first season progressed. As Bury found themselves in the third round of the League Cup at home to QPR, a giantkilling was begging to take place. "I scored the winner past David Seaman but it all seems like such a distant memory. The game against United at Old Trafford sticks out, with Jamie scoring, because that would be special in anyone's book. But a lot of games that the fans loved, I don't really remember," he confesses.

"I remember stranger games," he continues. "I played just short of 500 games in my career but one that always stuck out was a 5-0 win against Wigan in the Leyland Daf cup or whatever it was called; I thought I played magnificently," he laughs.

Play-off disappointment

Robinson starred as Bury qualified for the end of season play-off lottery in two successive seasons in the early nineties. But disappointment on two different levels lay in wait: "Sam Ellis left me out of the second leg of the play-off game against Tranmere that we lost.

"I was very disappointed with that, not only because we lost but because I thought I could have done a job. As we got off the coach back at Bury, he just said 'I made a mistake with you tonight,'" he says.

When the club slipped into the basement in 1992, Liam stayed. Admittedly it wasn't for long as he soon departed for what was Division One and Bristol City. "I never really settled down there but it was a great team to be part of. When we knocked Liverpool out of the FA Cup, we all played for each other," he says.

A move to Burnley followed where Liam spent three years before he moved to Scarborough and suffered the ignominy of relegation from the Football League. And then came his extraordinary post-football career; proof positive that Liam Robinson was never going to be content with mediocrity.

Football historian Leigh Edwards profiles every Bury player from 60 post war League Seasons

Legends of Gigg Lane



BERT HEAD: Centre-half Bert Head was both a player and manager at Bury. Initially with hometown Midsomer Norton, he joined Torquay United in October 1936 and made his League debut in the following month's 1-0 victory at Aldershot. He was ever-present in 1938-39 and joined Bury as player-coach in

February 1952, making 22 Second Division appearances before becoming assistant-boss. Appointed manager of Swindon Town in October 1955, he rejoined Bury as manager between August 1965 and April 1966. He managed Crystal Palace to the top-flight in 1968-69, then was manager and director of Bath City and died in February 2002.

JOHN HEATH: Goalkeeper John Heath appeared in Bury's 1960-61 Third Division title campaign. A former Blackburn Rovers amateur, he moved to Bury in September 1956 and made his League debut in the following month's 1-0 defeat at home to Fulham. He understudied Roy McLaren, Frank Adams and Chris Harker, playing eight League games for the Shakers including a record 7-2 home defeat against Newcastle in October 1961. Reuniting with Dave Russell at Tranmere Rovers in March 1962, he moved to Wigan Athletic in July 1964 and joined Rochdale in February 1966. He later played for Buxton and settled back in his native Heywood.



TOMMY HENDERSON: Scottish winger Tommy Henderson played for Bury during the 1965-66 season. A former Leeds United apprentice, he then played for Hearts and was a Scottish Cup finalist with St Mirren before rejoining Leeds in November 1962. He understudied Albert

Johanneson as they won the Second Division title in 1963-64, moving to Bury in June 1965. Scoring once in seven League outings, he joined Swindon Town in an exchange deal involving Gordon Atherton in January 1966. He moved to Stockport County in July 1966, featuring in their 1966-67 Fourth Division title campaign. Later with Altrincham, he now lives in Leeds.



STAN HEPTON: Centre-forward Stan Hepton appeared for Bury during the 1959-60 campaign. Signing professional for Blackpool in March 1950, he had limited top-flight opportunities and joined Huddersfield Town in August 1957. He moved to Gigg Lane for £2,000 in June 1959 and contested a first-team slot with

Bill Holden and Bill Calder, netting three goals in 14 Third Division games for Bury prior to joining Rochdale for £2,000 in July 1960. Featuring in the 1962 League Cup final, he moved to Southport in July 1964, then played for Northwich Victoria. He later worked for the Ministry of Defence and still lives in his native Leeds.



GEORGE HESLOP: Experienced centre-half George Heslop helped Bury beat Manchester City in the 1972-73 League Cup third round. Signing professional for Newcastle United in February 1959, he made his First Division debut in their 8-2 win at home to Everton nine months later and joined Everton

as part of the Jimmy Fell deal in March 1962. He was sold to Manchester City for £25,000 in September 1965, starring in their successes under Joe Mercer and Malcolm Allison. Moving to Bury in August 1972, he made 37 League appearances for the Shakers. He later managed Northwich, then coached Bury and became a publican in Manchester.



DAVE HICKSON: Experienced centre-forward Dave Hickson appeared for Bury during the 1961-62 campaign. Initially with Ellesmere Port, he joined Everton in May 1948 and was leading marksman in their 1953-54 promotion success. He had spells with Aston Villa and Huddersfield Town prior to

rejoining Everton in July 1957 and moved to Liverpool in November 1959. Briefly with Cambridge City, he joined Bury in January 1962 and made eight League appearances before moving to Tranmere Rovers in August 1962. He later assisted Ballymena, Northwich, Winsford, Fleetwood and Ellesmere Port again, then was a Liverpool bookmaker.



MARK HIGGINS: Ex-England
Youth central defender Mark
Higgins starred as Bury beat topflight QPR in the 1987-88
Littlewoods Cup third round. The
son of former Bolton favourite
John Higgins, he signed
professional for Everton in August
1976 and played in the 1977 FA
Youth Cup final. Later captain, he

retired with a pelvic injury in May 1984 but revived his career with Manchester United in December 1985 and joined Bury for £10,000 in January 1987. Making 68 Third Division appearances for the Shakers, he moved to Stoke City for £150,000 in September 1988 and had a brief spell with Burnley before a back injury ended his career.



ANDY HILL: Ex-England Youth right-back Andy Hill was 'Player of the Year' in Bury's 1984-85 promotion success. Signing professional for Manchester United in January 1983, he moved to Bury in July 1984 and helped take Watford to an FA Cup fifth round replay in 1985-86, then beat QPR in the 1987-88

Littlewoods Cup third round. He was ever-present as Bury qualified for the Third Division play-offs in 1989-90, netting ten goals in 264 League games before being sold to Manchester City for £200,000 in December 1990. Moving to Port Vale for £150,000 in August 1995, he joined their coaching staff, then coached Bury's juniors.



NICKY HILL: Central defender Nicky Hill was a young member of Andy Preece's squad at Bury. A former trainee at Gigg Lane, he signed professional in July 1999 and made his League debut as a substitute in Bury's 3-2 victory at home to Blackpool in April 2000. He made his full debut in the 2-0 win at Cardiff City two days later

and had an extended run in the first-team towards the end of the following season when Sam Collins was sidelined by injury. Making 16 League appearances for the Shakers, he moved to Hyde United in August 2003 after a loan spell and joined Hyde United in October 2003. He has appeared for them this season.



GARY HILTON: Goalkeeper Gary Hilton understudied David Brown while at Gigg Lane. He had a few games with Bury reserves during the 1981-82 and 1982-83 campaigns and was a weaver with a Haslingden firm, playing for Ramsbottom United when joining the Shakers on a non-contract basis in August 1983. After David

Brown broke an arm and loan keeper Ray Mountford suffered a training injury, Bury had no alternative but to field him in the 2-0 FA Cup second round defeat at Scunthorpe in December 1983. His solitary Fourth Division appearance was in Bury's 3-0 reverse at home to Aldershot in May 1984 and he returned to local football.



MARK HILTON: Midfielder Mark Hilton was a member of Jim Iley's squad at Bury. A former Oldham Athletic apprentice, he turned professional in January 1978 and made his League debut in their 2-1 victory at home to Hull City two months later. He joined Bury in July 1981 and held a regular first-team slot during the 1981-82

campaign but suffered a broken leg against his former club in August 1982, netting three goals in 32 League outings while at Gigg Lane before moving to Witton Albion in July 1983. Later playing for Ashton United, Mossley, Ashton again, Accrington Stanley and Curzon Ashton, he was briefly Mossley's manager.



PAUL HILTON: Versatile central defender Paul Hilton featured prominently as Bury reached the FA Cup fifth round in 1979-80. A former England Schoolboy international, he played for Chadderton before moving to Bury as a striker in July 1978 and made his League debut in the following month's 2-1 defeat at

Swindon. He was displaced by new signings and switched to defence during an injury crisis in November 1980, scoring 39 goals in 148 League games for Bury. Sold to West Ham for £70,000 in February 1984, he provided reliable defensive cover until a knee injury ended his career in October 1989, then joined their coaching staff.

Shakers in action on... 14TH April

1888.... Bury's first recorded game on this date was a friendly fixture played at Rossendale, which ended 3-3 and included goals from Hitchin, Richardson and future captain George

1900.... In Bury's first league game on this day they lost 2-0 at

1906.... Bury were drifting closer to the bottom of Division One and their cause was certainly not helped by a 4-0 defeat at Woolwich Arsenal.

1911.... Bob Heap made the first of his 110 appearances for Bury, in a 0-0 home draw with Sunderland.

1922.... Bury beat Wolverhampton Wanderers 2-1 at Gigg Lane, with goals from James McCrae and Dave Robbie. 1923.... Bury reserve goalkeeper Tom Hulley made his third and final appearance for the club in a 5-1 defeat at Blackpool. 1925.... Bury lost 2-0 away against Champions elect Huddersfield Town.

1928.... Bury entertained Manchester United at Gigg Lane and a crowd of nearly 18,000 saw the Shakers win a thrilling game 4-3. The goals came from John Ball, Norman Bullock, John Reid Smith and an own goal.

1934.... Bury had a fine 3-0 away win against promotion chasing Preston North End, thanks to strikes from Arthur Buttery, Billy Chalmers and Sammy Earl.

1951.... Bury's battle against relegation from Division Two was severely hampered by a 4-0 defeat at Hull City.

1952.... Bury travelled down to South Wales to the Vetch Field, were they defeated Swansea Town 2-0, thanks to goals from George Hazlett and Harold Bodle.

1956..... Goals from Stan Pearson and John Robinson gave Bury a 2-0 away win at Nottingham Forest.

1959 Bury entertained Norwich City at Gigg Lane in a midweek Third Division game. The visitors had amazingly reached the FA Cup Semi Final, only to lose 1-0 to Luton Town in a replay. Norwich's heroics in the cup had begun to affect their promotion push and though they were still in the picture, Bury's 3-2 victory was a major setback for them. John Willie Parker, Bill Holden and Don Watson were all on the scoresheet, as the Shakers turned on the style under the floodlights.

1962.... Bill Calder and Tony Bartley were the Bury goalscorers in a 2-0 win at Plymouth Argyle.

1970.... Bury drew their home game 1-1 at home to Doncaster Rovers, with George Jones scoring in what was their final game as the season ended a few weeks early, due the World Cup soon to start in Mexico.

1973.... Bury beat Hereford United 3-0 at Gigg Lane thanks to two goals from Derek Spence, one of them a brilliant overhead kick and a strike from Alan Tinsley. 1979.... Bury lost 2-1 at Rotherham United, with Ken Beamish scoring.

1981.... Bury ground out a 1-0 away win at York City, where Steve Johnson grabbed the vital goal.

1984.... John Bramall and Joe Jakub were on the mark

for Bury in their 2-1 home win over Chester City. 1990... Bury's push for the Play Offs gathered momentum with a 3-2 away win at Leyton Orient. Alan Knill, Jamie Hoyland (pen) and David Lee, in the last minute, scored the goals. 1992.... Goals from Darren Lyons, Ian Wilson and Ian Stevens gave Bury a 3-1 home win over Exeter City.

2001.... In Bury's last game on this day, they lost 4-1 at Reading, where Colin Cramb was their goalscorer. 5 years ago this week in 2002 In Division Two, Chris Billy's goal for Bury in their 1-3 home defeat by Colchester United was of no consolation, as the result ensured the Shakers were relegated In the same division, Swindon Town gained a goalless draw away at Champions, Brighton.

10 years ago this week in 1997 Division Two leaders Bury beat Crewe Alexandra 1-0 at home thanks to an early goal from Ronnie Jepson..... In Division One, Swindon were ending the season on a dreadful run, in which they failed to win any of their last 8 games, including this week, a 0-4 home defeat by Ipswich Town.



"The lads played well in the second half again on Tuesday, as they did against Chester last week, and they came away with the same result, a 2-0 win against Carlisle United."

"In the last two games, we haven't played particularly well, but yet we have won them both and I can tell you the answers to why that is.

We have Kane Bentley playing at centre half when he should be in midfield and on Tuesday, I had Jordan Stepien, a striker, playing at right back because of the massive amount of injuries that we have at the moment."

"Ironically, the injuries that have been caused have been contact injuries. It's not the syllabus of what we do with them. It's been a horrific two weeks really."

"On Tuesday, the lads coped quite well with a strong team from Carlisle on a very bobbly pitch, but in the second half they managed to get the ball down and played some good football."

"Its difficult at the moment because we had three under 16's starting the game and six under 16's finished the game and over 50% of the team are 15 or 16 years of age, so that's why the performances are dipping slightly, but to be fair to the older lads, such as Jack Dorney, Domaine Rouse and the rest, they are adapting and leading from the front."

"We can't win the title now, Oldham won that on Saturday, but we have two games left, we have to play Preston at home and Accrington away in the league. If we get the right results in those games, we will finish second. We've only lost one game in 2007 and so far, we've only lost five games in the season. If you're not winning the league doing things like that, then second will do for us."

"Oldham have the title, they are a bigger club with bigger support. Tony Philliskirk has been there eight or nine years now, they also have eighteen scholars, as well as under 16's that come in throughout the year. Their system is setup and running, ours is at the beginning."

"The reserves drew with Oldham again last week, and again it was two scholars that scored the goals with Jack Dorney and Jordan Stepien. I'm very pleased for Jordan, on Tuesday he played at right back, he's played there before but he got on with it. Kane Bentley was magnificent playing at Centre half and he's been really good for us since Christmas."

"Under 16's were involved again. Max Johnson kept another clean sheet, Kevin Fields came into midfield and got the ball down and played well. We have players that can win games and they keep doing that."

"As for the injuries, Dominic Taylor had an operation on his knee and he won't be available until next year. Tom Clarkson broke a leg and we are just taking our time with him. It's tough for Tom because it's obviously decision time as well and he's fallen into a different area of the football club and a decision will be made on Tom at the end of the season."

"Michael Smith has a broken wrist so he won't be available until next season. Lee Peatfield is still in Blackpool Vic and the last update I had on him from yesterday was that he is going through a rough time at the moment. From looking better last week to the last 24 hours, his dad was a little concerned. We think he has been doing a little bit too much, but he's been getting out of bed quite regularly and walking, he's also been out for some fresh air for the first time, but in the last 24 hours, he seems to have gone backwards a little bit."

Chris Beech has described his youth team as a winning machine after another good solid 2-0 win over Carlisle United Youth on Tuesday afternoon.


