

FREQUENCY

Tuesday night was a disappointment and whilst I thought we could have taken something from the game, the challenge now is to put that behind us and get another home win today.

We were delighted to kick start our away form with a win at Millwall on last weekend. I have said all along that if we can win our home games and pick up a point or more away from The County Ground then we will be there or there abouts.

Despite not reaching the standards that we know we can achieve, there were several positives to come out of the encounter. Phil Smith did really well in goal and kept us in the game when he cleared one off the line. Billy Paynter and Simon Cox are now getting a bit of an understanding and Lee Peacock is getting into his midfield role which I am sure will be of benefit to us.

Unfortunately we weren't able to make it three wins on the bounce as we went down to a defeat at Swansea City. I didn't feel that it was a 2-1 defeat and the disappointing thing was that we didn't take something from the game. It was one of those nights when you learn more about your team in defeat than from a win. Looking back I felt there was too much square and back passing in our play. When we got the ball forward our strikers held it up well and we got into the game. We need to be more positive in our approach if we are going to take more pointage from games.

The first goal came through one of our players playing a square pass and it hurt us - we didn't clear our lines properly. We have to learn - when they don't learn, they don't listen and I want to put severe pressure on the

players now and that's something we will have reiterated to them before Saturday. The only way the players will learn now is through selection and that's something I'm not afraid to do. I am a bit disappointed with the attitude shown by some of our players on the night but they improved after the break. If one of those second half chances had gone in then we could have taken something, but it's one of those things.

There were positives to come from the game and we have to carry those into today's game. We played well in the second half on Tuesday and we did create chances. We hit the post through Billy Paynter and could have drawn level on a number of occasions. We kept them down to one or two flurries going forward. It would have been easy for us to capitulate there but we kept going.

Today we entertain Gillingham who will have their tails up after an impressive midweek win over Leyton Orient. They seem to have steadied the ship after a difficult start to the campaign and will not be easy opponents to face. As I have said we need to be positive in our approach and hopefully with your support we can achieve the result we need to keep us amongst the chasing pack.

Therefore if you have just either been released from the local penitentiary or safely landed your spaceship back here on earth this is the latest.

Jim Little, Chairman Designate of the Club, and the represen-

tative of Best Holdings, has been in constant dialogue with both the Club's Board of Directors and the major shareholders. During the past two weeks Best Holdings have requested additional information, which has now been provided.

Whilst admittedly there have been a number of issues concerning the transaction, the Board are confident that sufficient progress has been made this week to resolve those difficulties.

The delays experienced, in the opinion of the Board, are not to

be interpreted as an indication that the deal is stalling. On the contrary both parties have a mutual determination and will to finalise the transaction as soon as possible. However it must be recognised that it is prudent to take time to ensure that all the 'Minor Paperwork' that Jim alluded to in the last programme is agreed in order that it does not become a major problem post-completion.

Jim made reference in last Wednesday's Swindon Advertiser to the Club's debts. These are explicitly dealt with and warranted by the shareholders in the Sale and Purchase contract and should not be an issue that would prevent completion.


Jim reiterated, also in Wednesday's Swindon Advertiser, that both parties 'Are still going over the tiny points'. However the Board believe that these 'Tiny Points' have now been addressed and the additional information required by the purchasers has now been provided.






OLDHAM ATHLETIC GAME OFF

"The guy tried to take me on and I slid in to get the ball but he then tried to step over me but ended up landing on my shoulder and it just buckled and it's come out of its joint. "I spent the night at Swansea hospital which was an experience but everyone looked after me and they were all friendly so I have to thank them for all their help." The defender has vowed to the first team fold as soon as possible although it looks to be towards the end of November before any return is expected. "Early indications are around six weeks out, but I'll be working hard to try and get back before that if I can. I want to get back into the side as soon as I can and ensure I don't miss too much action."

mick & iffy docherty onuora

Mick Docherty joined The Gills in January 2006 as Assistant to then boss Ronnie Jepson. Following Jepson's departure in September, Docherty stepped up to take the managerial hotseat alongside former Town manager Iffy Onuora.

As a player, Docherty was a full-back for Burnley, Manchester City and Sunderland, before an injury brought an early end to his playing career. He subsequently joined Sunderland's coaching staff.

In the 1980-81 season, Docherty took over as caretaker manager of Sunderland with four games of the season to go. He managed to save the club from relegation with a 1-0 victory over Liverpool at Anfield on the last day of the season. They finished 17th, two points clear of relegation.

Following his spell at Sunderland he took over as manager of Hartlepool United in 1984.

He later assisted Dave Sutton and succeeded him in 1994 as manager at Rochdale, accepting the job after three preferred candidates declined it. In 1994/95 he led Dale to the Northern Final of the Auto Windscreens Trophy. In his only full season in charge, 1995/96, a bright start led to an FA Cup third round match at Liverpool. Thereafter the team went into a steep decline and shortly after the end of the season, Docherty was dismissed and replaced by Graham Barrow.

Docherty was coach at Burnley where he worked alongside Ronnie Jepson and Stan Ternent. He was released alongside them at the end of the 2003-04 season, but

rejoined the Gills in January 2006 alongside Iffy Onuora.

Town fans will be more than familiar with the affable Onuora, who took charge of Swindon following Andy King's exit during the early stages of the 2004/05 season. Iffy won 10 of 40 games in charge of The Robins, with 15 draws and 15 losses.

The temporary duo masterminded an impressive 3-1 home win over Leyton Orient on Tuesday evening at the KRBS Priestfield Stadium.



David Graham

Scottish striker who worked with current Town boss Paul Sturrock during his time at Sheffield Wednesday.

The front man became the tenth player to put pen-to-paper during the summer at The KRBS Priestfield Stadium, when he signed a one-year-deal just before the start of the 2007/08 season.

Started his career as a youth team player with Rangers before switching to Dunfermline in November 1998. His time with Dunfermline included loan spells at Inverness and Torquay United and after a successful stint at Plainmoor, he made the switch to England permanent in the summer of 2001. 45 goals in 98 league games for The Gills attracted the attentions of Wigan Athletic who parted with £215,000 for his services in June 2004.

A year later and Sheffield Wednesday was the next stop where he linked up with Sturrock at Hillsborough. However, loan spells at Huddersfield Town, Bradford City and Torquay United followed before a summer switch to Gillingham on a free transfer after just two goals in nineteen league starts for Wednesday.



"We have flexibility within the squad as we showed at Hartlepool United when we changed things about. It's good to have lines of communication open between




A repeat performance from the Robins this time around would do just fine.

"When we **played against the likes of Stoke, Wolves, Arsenal**; that season [1979/80] was particularly special."



18 years, eight as a player, 98 goals and 345 appearances... Andy Rowland was one of Town's most loyal servants. From the 1970s through to the mid 90s and costing just over £10,000 for every year spent here as a player, his relationship continued when he swapped his playing kit for the tracksuit of management, ending in the 90's under Steve McMahon.

Not bad for someone who, when he heard of Town's interest as a Bury player, didn't know where he was going... "I wasn't sure where Swindon was," he laughs. "The boss asked me to come down and I had to get the map out and have a look. It seemed to be a prospering side at the time and I was looking forward to playing for them."

Manager Bobby Smith had arrived wanting to make an immediate impact and as a result, he brought in a lot of faces he had worked with before. "He [Smith] signed a couple of players that I played with at Bury and it helped everyone settle in. The likes of Brian Williams and Billy Tucker, he seemed to get players around him that he knew, similar to what Sturrock is doing at Swindon now, with the players he's got from Wednesday and Plymouth. I guess if a manager believes in a player's ability then fair play to


them for going out there and getting them to be part of the new side."

Rowlands quickly established himself in the team, firstly in midfield and later as a defender. Rowlands had enjoyed a good grounding at Gigg Lane and his experience with the Shakers served him well as Town attempted to climb the football pyramid. "I'd had a couple of good seasons at Bury. The club was good for me and it was a good grounding for football – I played my first league games there. When I was at Derby all I had played were a mixture of reserve games. So when I went to Bury the first season was quite difficult, but after that I started to find my feet and I scored 70-odd goals."

His goalscoring form continued at The County Ground, where he forged an electric partnership with Alan Mayes. "It was a case of just one of those things, everything clicked. The team was playing well and we were creating chances; the fact that we both scored quite a lot of goals was down to the rest of the side as much as it was down to me and Alan. There was no magic formula, we didn't have anything in common off the pitch – it wasn't as if we were great mates, just for two seasons it just happened. Nobody could really

say why. I seemed to take most of the high balls and Alan picked the bits up and it worked both ways."

Despite the goals Town's league form wasn't impressive. The club just missed out on promotion in Rowland's first season, but went on to finish in mid-table, or lower, in the ensuing barren seasons. Joy in the cup however, saw Town embark on the sort of run that Town fans long for... "When we played against the likes of Stoke, Wolves, Arsenal; that




season [1979/80] was particularly special. We played Tottenham as well in the FA Cup, a game that we were unlucky to lose. I'd say that season was probably the highlight.

"Seeing the County Ground so full was unbelievable. Although we'd played in front of big crowds at the likes of Arsenal and Tottenham, having the CG full felt magical. The noise and the atmosphere, you could just sense that everyone was on the edge of their seats waiting for something to happen. It was really exciting times."

It could have been the cup runs that saw Town struggle in the league. And for Rowlands, Town's underachievement in the 'bread and butter' was a disappointment. "We would always get behind in our league fixtures," remembers Andy. "At some points we were about six games behind. By the time we had been knocked out of the league cup, that left us deflated – to win those games in hand and try to and push to get into the top two, it was just too much for us."

The 4-3 aggregate defeat against Wolves in the semi final in 1980 hit Town hard. So hard that during the remaining league games tempers sometimes flared. Rowlands recalls one ugly incident against rivals Gillingham... "I remember the fella running on the pitch and



Gillingham and having a go at the referee. And an incident in the tunnel, with Wilf Tranter and a couple of their players. After the Wolverhampton semi final the rest of the season just seems to have been lost. Alan Mayes wasn't the same player after that game, when he had his front teeth knocked out by the goalkeeper. Little things like that just seemed to take the edge off everything."

Worse was to follow, when the club slipped into Division Four. "I can remember us going down at Newport away, we had to win there to have a chance of staying up. Going into the fourth division was really the lowest point, but then again you look at it and it was the beginning of a great era, with the Macari days. Lou got the whole club going again, winning the division with a record number of points. Sometimes you have to go backwards to go forwards."

And when it comes to remembering town's league-winning campaign, Rowland is quick to recall the role played by Lou Macari. "Lou is a special bloke, he's one of those people who is quite matter of fact about how he does everything, he's someone who people respect," he recalls. "When he came to the club you could tell there was going to be no nonsense. He managed to turn average players into good ones, and we could run all day. We would steam roll teams in the last 20 minutes and nine times out of 10 we knew we would be fitter than our opponents. In the end we just overran them. It was only when we got up to the Second Division that things started to go wrong. Playing a simplistic game like we did was quite easy to read for the better players, so we were found out."

Rowlands moved backwards as his career evolved, firstly into defence, and then in goal! "To be quite honest with you I didn't care where I played. If I was

playing I was happy. Obviously Lou had signed players who were younger, quicker and fitter, so I was just happy to play. That's all I wanted to do, I didn't care where it was – I played in goal a couple of times."

Under Macari, Andy then switched from one side of the sidelines to the other, joining the coaching staff. Macari, he says, was a joy to work with... "He would ring me up at 6am and say 'we're going to a game today get your car outside', or at 8pm in the evening and say, 'don't forget we're doing this and that tomorrow'. You just went along with it. You knew what ever he was doing he was doing for a purpose. I remember there was one Sunday, I was about to get the dinner on, and he rang me up and said: 'can you take me to Crystal Palace?' We jumped in the car, went to Palace, sat and watched 20 minutes and he said 'this is rubbish, let's go home'.

Rowland isn't quite as effusive when it comes to McMahon, and it was under the Liverpudlian that Rowland's relationship with Town came to an end. Now, Rowland likes to keep up with events at the County Ground and he regularly talks shop with punters in his pub, the Plough Inn.



"Several fella's are keen Swindon supporters and they keep me posted on performances and players," he says. "I don't go very often. I went a couple of times last year, but with this job its so time consuming I just read the local rag and listen to what the punters tell me. I get a fair reflection of how things are going down there. Paul Sturrock, Kevin Summerfield and John Blackley don't live too far away either. We've had some good conversations about the game and put the world to rights. They are decent folk and I hope they can continue the good work that has been done already."

2 Dean Holdsworth


Vastly experienced striker who joined the Dons from London neighbours Brentford in July 1992 in a £720,000 deal. Made a massive impact on the Premiership during the early days, scoring 58 goals in 158 league starts during his time with the "Crazy Gang". Went on to enjoy spells with the likes of Bolton Wanderers, Derby County and Coventry City before moving on to the non-league scene.


3 Brian Kilcline

After a poor defensive start to the 1993/94 season, boss John Gorman dipped into the transfer market with a £90,000 move for defender Brian Kilcline from Newcastle United. The former Coventry City favourite arrived at The County Ground in January 1994 and went on to make 16 league starts for the Robins before departing in November the following year. The "Killer Kilcline" hats brightened up the STFC Superstore though!

4 Kevin Horlock

A popular player during his stay with Swindon, Kevin Horlock was a trainee with West Ham United before joining The County Ground ranks in the summer of 1992. The Town Reserves travelled to Bradford in the South West Regional League and won by six goals to one. Laura Potter scored two and there were


goals for Kirsty Jones, Tara Loftus, Kelly Oakes and Kayleigh Smith.



IAN ROBERTSON PHIL BENNETT



For the day job Ian Robertson is the BBC Rugby Correspondent covering both Radio and TV. In the evening he is a very amusing, entertaining and highly articulate after-dinner speaker. His rugby career ended with a bad knee injury at the age of 25 but by that time he had won "Blues" at both Aberdeen University and Cambridge University, had played for London Scottish and the Barbarians and had won 8 international caps for Scotland. He was vice-captain of Scotland. He joined the BBC as a rugby commentator in 1972 and has covered almost all major matches all over the world for the past 20 years. A prolific writer he is author or co-author of over 20 books including several best sellers.

Phil Bennett's wizardly entertained crowds throughout the seventies. His mercurial skills included a devastating sidestep and swerve. His unique hunched running style proved deceptive and he had an uncanny ability to unlock defences with his twinkling feet. He made his Welsh debut in 1969 against France, gaining caps as a fullback and centre, and in 1972 finally settled into the fly half berth. His form earned him a place on the British Lions tour of South Africa in 1974, where he would reach new heights as the star of the tour, scoring 103 points. His 50 yard try in the 28-9 second test victory in Pretoria, ranks as one of the supreme examples of individual brilliance on a rugby pitch. He retired from international rugby in 1978.


A home draw against high-fliers Tranmere Rovers the only other bright spot in a September which included defeats against Carlisle United, Swansea City and Doncaster Rovers.


The club will also be opening both the Arkells Stand and Town End for the game which kicks off at 7.45pm.
