



# Money is the root of all evil?

situation of clubs being placed into administration is becoming the norm in English football just now.

Already Leeds United and Luton Town have been deducted points this season as a result of incurring huge debts.

There are sure to be more who suffer the same fate, if not this then certainly next season.

The problem is not going away and indeed it appears to be worsening - so much so that I wonder if it would be better if every Football League club began the season on minus-ten points.

Then, if they could prove during the campaign they were sound financially, they could reclaim the deducted points.

It may be a tonque-in-cheek suggestion but it does highlight the seriousness of the problem and the pitfalls that await clubs who overspend or do not run a tight ship.

And the people who suffer the most are the fans. They are the ones pumping money into clubs through the purchasing of tickets and merchandise and are showing their loyalty.

Yet they then have to sit back and question where their money has gone and what has happened to the transfer fees received from the sale of players.

Clubs going into administration is becoming a regular occurrence in English football, so how do we deal with this ever growing problem?



It is not easy being a passionate follower of a football club when you have so many queries. which are usually unanswered, about what is going on.

Of course the other side to the administration matter is that teams will now be looking over their shoulder more than ever.

If, for instance, you are on 30 points after your first 20 games you may be pondering a charge towards the play-off places.

However, if money has been handled rather carelessly and administration is a very real threat, a points penalty could see your team thrown into a relegation-battle.

Rotherham United last season

showed just what a hard task it is to get yourselves out of the danger-zone and they knew from the start what they had to do.

It is not just about the penalty imposed but more about the knock-on effect for a club.

The morale must dip in the immediate aftermath and the turmoil of having to sell players to recoup lost money does not help matters.

It is hard to know what can be done to halt the decline of these high-profile and less-glamorous sides.

What is sure though is that some restrictions need to be enforced to improve the health of the English game.

OLTAN Stieber has illuminated Yeovil Town's performances with a string of mesmeric displays on the left wing since arriving on loan at Huish Park from Aston Villa.

The Hungarian could well be labelled the 'baby-faced assassin' as his deadly deliveries into the box belie his youthful looks.

Stieber is only 19 but has made a major impact and added much-needed balance to the Glovers midfield.

His quality was not really in doubt as he signed for Villa after extended trials at their Premier League rivals Manchester United and Arsenal.

The way in which he has coped with the physical demands of League One football is admirable given his slender frame, but not surprising given his meteoric rise so far.

"I started out at Ujpest, which is one of the best clubs in Hungary, but it was always an ambition of mine to come to England." said Stieber.

"I had trials at United and Arsenal and it was a real shock to

"I was only 16 and was away from home for the first time. I'd only seen players like that on television before that

"Suddenly I was alongside people like Thierry Henry every day. It was a dream to be involved at such big clubs.

"In the end I signed for Villa, who are another big club. I know they once won the European Cup!

"I was really happy when I joined them and I've enjoyed myself so far. It's a good place to learn more about the game."


Stieber has been sent on loan to Yeovil to develop further, having captained Villa's reserves this season.


And he is delighted to be involved with the Glovers as they try to emulate last season's SUCcess and reach the play-offs.

"I had a very good pre-season with Villa and went with them on their tour of America," said Stieber.

"I played in the first game against Toronto in front of about 20,000 people which was the biggest crowd I've ever played in front of.

"Since then I've been playing for the reserves and I think

Slade was alerted to Stieber when he was made captain of Villa's second string - although the youngster admits he is not a natural skipper.

"Captains are usually loud and have a lot to say on the pitch, he added. "But I am quite quiet.

"I'm not a captain who shouts and screams, I just try to lead by example. I hope that by playing well I can inspire the team.

Stieber's arrival at Huish Park allowed the Glovers to switch to a 4-4-2 formation, with the young Hungarian playing wide on the left.

He said: "My left foot is definitely my stronger foot so I prefer playing on that side.

"When I played at youth level in Hungary I used to play in the middle of midfield, but at the moment I'm not strong enough to do that in English football."

Stieber will undoubtedly get stronger as he develops physically and has his eye on breaking into Villa's first team.

But he will soon have some family competition for a place in the side at Villa Park - from his 16-year-old brother Andras.

"Andras is training with Villa," explained Zoltan. "He hasn't signed yet but will do that in July when he is old enough."



# Saved by the Bell

T the start of the 1980-81 season, manager Barry Lloyd went about strengthening his side which included signing forward Andy Bell.

Andy was one of those great strikers who could score with either foot and when in the penalty box was a real poacher.

He started playing his football for Haselbury Plucknett scoring numerous goals for them.

This caught the attention of Exeter City, but things didn't work out with them and he was released.

He was having talks with Dover Athletic when Barry Lloyd approached him

Andy went on to make 151 first team appearances for Town He was top scorer in the 1982/83 Known for having a happy knack of being in the right place at the right time this week we feature one of Yeovil's great strikers ANDY BELL

season with 27 goals and notched up a grand total of 46, when towards the end of 1984, then manager Trevor Finnigan, sold him to Weymouth.

Andy's football took him on to Bath City, Paulton Rovers and then Bideford before moving to Chard Town.

He jokes: "I must have been reaching about 60 by then so I thought I better call it a day!"

Looking back over his Yeovil Town career Andy recalls that FA Cup games were always special to him.

"I also remember playing Barnet at home in the league when Barry Fry was their manager.

"I scored a few and he'd say to

me afterwards, 'it wasn't you that was causing us all the problems, it was that Malcolm Beck in the middle' - even though I'd just scored a hat-trick against him!"

After Andy's playing career finished, he took his coaching badges, helping out at Millfield School and semi-professional clubs like Chard Town.

He now concentrates on running his own courier business.

Andy is a season ticket holder at Huish Park, and has thoroughly enjoyed watching the club's rise up through the Leagues and is now looking forward to even more success, which he's sure will come.





A superb low cross from Kayleigh Nardiello on the left wing was side footed into the net by Jemma Tewkesbury which sent the game into extra time.


Yeovil began it well, and after just 15 seconds Alana Willson chipped over the bar.

Slade sent out a strong side that included Ritchie Jones, Mark Lynch, Craig Alcock and Wilfried Domoraud.


Controlling the match from the start Yeovil nearly took the lead when Scott Spencer smacked a shot against the post in the first minute.

# Ever heard of confidentiality!

LTHOUGH writing enjoy this column my background is in accountancy rather than journalism.

For this reason the concept of "confidentiality" is second nature to me, as it is for doctors, solicitors, and members of many other professions.

I remember a partner in the first firm of accountants where I worked, in a small and rather insular town, emphasising the point with a tale about his wife.

She came home from shopping one day and told him that a store that she patronised regularly was closing down.

After pausing for thought she added, "But you probably knew that anyway".

He did, as he had been advising the owners for many years, and had handled the taxation aspects of their forthcoming business disposal for them.

Such matters would never be disclosed outside of the office - not even to the partners' spouse.

This fundamental concept of confidentiality being strictly observed is one of the main principles of many professions, but I have always believed that in some areas it extended beyond these boundaries and into common practice.

One area where I assumed that such principles remained was the job interview.

Jose Mourinho's recent public withdrawal from the vacant England manager's job exposed a real lack of confidentiality in the FA's selection process. Should these potential candidates show more respect for such a valued position?

If several people made the "short list" for a vacancy then my belief was that the identities of ultimately unsuccessful candidates would not be made known, or their qualities or deficiencies discussed elsewhere.

Similarly, if the person initially offered the job should choose to decline the offer for whatever reason then I would expect them not to publicise the facts.

This does not seem to apply to international football manage-

It will probably never become clear whether the FA intended to offer the job of England manager to Jose Mourinho, or whether any discussions were of a very informal and exploratory nature.

However, following his very public "withdrawal" from the list of potential candidates seeking the position, he will now appear to have turned England down!

Had Mr Capello followed suit and publicly "withdrew" then whoever ultimately got the job would face the prospect of being commonly considered third or fourth choice before their team even kicks a ball!

This is not an entirely new situation as Steve McClaren took over after "Big Phil" Scolari had apparently been offered the position.

So why is it that the likes of Mourinho have to open their mouths when a dignified silence would surely be better for all concerned?

SUPPORTING SPORT IN BLACKHORN COUNTRY

AVING just made the journey to Leyton Orient the trip to Luton will seem very familiar as once again it's a journey up the A303 towards London.

After about 80 miles along the A303 you will then need to join the M3. Leave the M3 at junction 2 and join the M25 northbound.

Once on the M25 you will need to travel along until you reach junction 21 in order to join the M1 which is signed Luton Airport.

Leave the M1 at junction 10, and at the roundabout take the second exit onto the M1 spur.

At Kidney Wood roundabout take the second exit onto the A108 signed Luton Airport.

At the next roundabout take the first exit onto the A505 signed



Town Centre and the first exit at the following one.

At the Osborne Road roundabout take the second exit followed by the first exit at the Kimpton Road roundabout.

Then at the next one you will need the first exit signed Dunstable followed by a sequence of third exit, first exit and first exit again for the following three roundabouts.

The final exit should take you on to the A5065 and this will then lead you to the ground.

There are two places close to the ground where you can park at a cost of £3. For food and drink there are a couple of places which are suitable for travelling fans.

There is the Bedfordshire Yeoman on Dalton Road, which also has a chippy nearby.

The other one is the Conservative Club on Leagrave Road.

You will be charged an entrance fee of 50p but the benefits are that the beer prices are a lot cheaper than anywhere else around.

Please note there is no alcohol available in the ground but all the usual food outlets are available.

With the teams generally falling into line it's now a period to reflect on the progress and organisation of the Centre to ensure the work achieved so far can be built on to reach higher levels.
















SWINDON Town's story off the pitch has somewhat detracted from its perform-


"I have just played a full season for Lyn and the body coped with it. Therefore, I feel the Championship is the right level for me."

TRANMERE ROVERS, have extended the loan deal of Blackburn Rovers defender Andy Taylor by another month.


The full-back has been a mainstay for Tranmere since moving to Prenton Park in November and has impressed Ronnie Moore.
