



Billy Paynter will come in and start today and we have options as to who we pair Billy with. He has to get back to how he was playing before he was left out of the team.





He kept his nerve as we all thought he would and calmly slotted the ball home. The County Ground erupted and in all honesty it was nothing less than the lads deserved.

Today we welcome Barnet for Round Three of the FA Cup. It's another big game for both clubs and hopefully we can progress to the next round. I am sure both Swindon and Barnet would have hoped for a 'big tie' in Round Three - but the dream cup draw could be just around the corner in Round Four.





BYRNE'S TRANSFER PLANS

Town caretaker boss David Byrne has offered his views on the club's plans for the January transfer window.

The transfer window opened in the early hours of New Years Day and the boss already has targets in mind.

Town have been linked with a permanent swoop for striker Simon Cox and despite the Reading striker being at the forefront of much transfer talk at The County Ground, Byrne has additional plans.

"I have been tracking a few players and we have names in the frame. "I have spoken to certain clubs about individuals and those clubs have been fairly receptive to what I have spoken to them about," he revealed.

"We need to strengthen in some areas and I am aware of that. Ady and I have kept things going and we have continued to work towards the future, regardless of our own position."

He added: "If a new manager comes in then we will pass our own list of targets to him so the work will not go to waste that's for sure."

WILLIAMS ON TOWN'S FA CUP HOPES

FA Cup Semi-Finalist Ady Williams believes Town's FA Cup dream is very much alive ahead of today's tie with Barnet.

The former Welsh International was a member of the Wolves side which lost 1-0 to Arsenal at Villa Park in April 1998 with the Gunners side that day included the likes of Patrick Viera, Nicolas Anelka and Marc Overmars.



"That was a great day, one that will stick in the memory for a long time.



fairclough

Barnet boss Paul Fairclough started his playing career in the fabled Anfield bootroom under the legendary gaze of Bill Shankly, but after failing to break into the first team he moved on to University, before spending fourteen years playing non-league football for Wealdstone and St Albans City amongst others as a midfielder and sweeper.

In 1988 he started his first managerial job at Hertford Town, where he spent two years at the helm before moving to local rivals Stevenage Borough. Two successive promotions in his first two seasons took Stevenage into the Isthmian League Premier Division, and in 1993-94, he took the club into the Vauxhall Conference.

In one of the most memorable FA Cup runs of recent years in 1997-98, Stevenage under Paul's leadership overcame the challenge of Cambridge United and Swindon Town, before setting up a Fourth Round tie against Newcastle United. After coming back from a goal down to secure a famous 1-1- draw, the side eventually went down fighting 2-1 in the replay, further enhancing the reputation of the Conference clubs and the quality of players below The Football League.

After leaving Stevenage in 1998, Paul embarked on sports consultancy work for Nike UK, where his work took him to Barcelona, Inter Milan and Brazil's training camp, as well as embarking on a spell as Club Scout for Arsenal Football Club, and coaching work as an Academy Director in Cameroon.

The lure of club management saw him return for two seasons as Manager at Stevenage Borough in February 2000, before returning to Arsenal, where he has been employed as an

integral part of Arsene Wenger's Scouting team during their Champions League campaigns.

Joined Barnet in March 2004 and has won 77 out of 189 games in charge to date.





It's been a productive twelve months for Adam Birchall. The front man joined Barnet a year ago and has made a big impact during his stint at Underhill. A tireless worker, Birchall began his career with Arsenal before getting his first taste of league football with a three-month loan stint at Wycombe Wanderers which began in August 2004. He made a significant impact at Adams Park. netting four goals in eleven starts for The Chairboys. He then returned to Arsenal although failed to make it as a Wenger boy and was forced to return to the lower leagues to continue his footballing education. Birchall joined Mansfield Town on a free transfer in the summer of 2005 and scored on his debut in a 2-2

draw at Stockport County in the opening day of the 2005/06 season. However, just two further goals followed during the campaign. The front man joined Barnet on loan in November 2006 and made a success of his temporary switch, with two goals in six league starts enough to convince the Barnet management into a permanent swoop twelve months ago. With seven goals to his name already this term he could well go on and be one of the League Two frontrunners this term.

Town beware, he likes the FA Cup too with three goals in eight appearances in the competition.

CLASSIC FA CUP THIRD ROUND DAYS



12TH JANUARY 1929 SWINDON TOWN 2 NEWCASTLE UNITED 0

Back in the years between the two World Wars, Town were elevated from the Southern League to compete in the newly constructed, regional Third Division, and January 1929 saw us drawn to First Division Newcastle United in the third round of the FA Cup.

The frozen County Ground pitch needed plenty of work ahead of the start but Town kicked off towards what is now the Town End in the first half. It may have been a long time ago, but we will all know that means that Town were facing the wind, while the visitors had the sun in their eyes. It's good to feel so familiar with events so long ago.

Scottish international Hughie Gallagher was the star of the Magpies' side but Town's Harry Morris also proved a handful, opening the Town scoring in the first half after a run from the edge of the box. Then in the second half our man did it again, this time with his head to give Town a comfortable looking two-goal victory.

GAP AT THE END 39 LEAGUE OF THE SEASON: 39 PLACES



11TH JANUARY 1930 MANCHESTER UNITED 0 **SWINDON TOWN 2**

A year later and Town were up against a top-flight side once more, this time a competent First Division side called Manchester United at a place called Old Trafford.

GWR were involved, but this had nothing to do with radio. Instead, the railway ran a special train 'oop north' for Wiltshire travellers, and 29 minutes into the game Jimmy McCartney's throw-in allowed Joe Eddleston to strike from the edge of the area to give Town the lead.

Swindon goalkeeper Ted Nash was outstanding, but twice the

ball rebounded from his woodwork. Les Roberts headed Swindon's second goal from a Bertie Denver cross.

United finished sixth from bottom of Division One that year, something younger fans might find difficult to believe.

GAP AT THE END LEAGUE PLACES



12TH JANUARY 1938 SWINDON TOWN 2 GRIMSBY TOWN 1

So on to 1938 and we were drawn to travel to Cleethorpes to play Grimsby, the sort of fixture that today might not grab the attention but then pitched the Wiltshire Town, still in the Third Division South, against the Lincolnshire

Town of Division One.

The first encounter resulted in a 1-1 draw courtesy of an Eddie Jones goal for Swindon, bringing the Mariners back to The County Ground where the real action took place.

On a pitch, heavily sanded to overcome the conditions, 23,000

witnessed Swindon go behind in the first half before Ben Morton scored his first Swindon goal since a £1,000 fee brought him from Torquay 17 games earlier. With the game into extra-time, Alan Fowler met an Arthur Hetherington cross with five minutes remaining to clinch the game in Swindon's favour.

GAP AT THE END 32 LEAGUE PLACES



10TH JANUARY 1948 BURNLEY O SWINDON TOWN 2

Burnley had come close to a Division Two championship and FA Cup final double as recently as 1947, so Town were up against it in this FA Cup Third Round match. Town's manager Louis Page was an ex-Burnley player and his tactical nous appeared to be crucial at Turf Moor as his side stifled the Division One side.

Jackie Dryden scored Town's first after an interchange involving GAP AT

Maurice Owen and Morris Jones in the first few minutes, then just before half time Owen managed to dispossess Burnley keeper Woodruff to grab a second.

Town keeper Frank Boulton saved a penalty in the second period and Town were in Round Four. The newly promoted Clarets finished third in Division One that season

28TH JANUARY 1967 WEST HAM UNITED 3 SWINDON TOWN 3


Barely six months earlier England had won the World Cup. Now we travelled to Upton Park to face Martin Peters, Bobby Moore and Geoff Hurst, all proud possessors of World Cup winners' medals.

And it was Wembley hat-trick man Hurst who scored first for the Hammers half way through the first half, before Don Rogers combined with Willie Penman to equalise. Then Hurst headed home for the Hammers fifteen minutes before half-time.

Dennis Brown brought the game level on the hour, then produced the pass that Rogers completed


to give Town a 3-2 lead. With 13 minutes to go. Hurst paid Swindon the compliment of scoring his second treble against top class opposition by rescuing the Hammers.

Penman, Rogers and Ken Skeen outweighed West Ham's strike from John Sissons in the replay to take Town through to Round Four.





15TH JANUARY 1972 SWINDON TOWN 0 ARSENAL 2



We were at the heady heights of what is now called the Championship when this game kicked off, and the frisson of playing the team Town had beaten at Wembley three years ago added to the tension.

The Gunners were en route to a fifth place finish in Division One, Town destined for a mid-table place a division below, and the game was settled by goals from George Armstrong and Alan Ball.

So, the result didn't match that of

the League Cup final of 1969, but the game is notable for another reason. Take a look at the club history panel on page five of the programme you are holding.

A record 32,000 people crowded in the County Ground that day, a statistic that is unlikely to be beaten under present circumstances. Supporters were squeezed into every nook and cranny, including onto the wooden terracing of the recently dismantled North stand, now the area occupied by the Arkells' Stand enclosure.

GAP AT THE END 28 LEAGUE OF THE SEASON: 28 PLACES

Nil- nil at half time, Town's Peter Noble had come closest to breaking the deadlock, before winger David Moss produced the cross that Joe Butler drove home for the opener. Moss was then grounded by goalkeeper Dave Latchford for RayTreacy to score from the spot as we progressed to Round Four.

Birmingham finished second in Division Two and went up to the top flight. Town finished eleventh.



GAP AT THE END GET THE SEASON:

LEAGUE PLACES



8TH JANUARY 1977 FULHAM 3 SWINDON TOWN 3



This game captured the imagination, pairing Third Division Town with the beaten FA Cup finalists of less than two years previously.

A whole division separated the two sides as the game at Craven Cottage kicked off, and to add spice, Fulham included Rodney Marsh, George Best and World Cup winning captain Bobby Moore (again) amongst their pre-Mohamed Al Fayed number.

Trevor Anderson, David Moss and Ray McHale gave Swindon a 3-1 halftime lead, before Fulham came back to draw level. Then, back at the County Ground, legend Moore was missing as his famous teammates conceded five for no reply, courtesy of doubles from David's Syrett and Moss, and a single from Trevor Anderson.

Almost 24,000 packed the ground you are in today.

Eyal Berkovic


Considered by many to be one of Israel's best, Eyal Berkovic arrived in England with a season long loan stint at Southampton before moving to West Ham United the following season. Spells with Celtic, Blackburn Rovers (loan), Manchester City and Portsmouth followed before announcing his retirement from the professional game in May 2006. In the summer of 2006 he was appointed as the general manager of Maccabi Netanya – but lasted only two months and never managed a league game.


46 📵 Steve Robinson














We hope you all had a great Christmas and a good New Year. We in Football in the Community are really looking forward to the year ahead.

Former Town defender Colin Calderwood has guided his side towards the summit of League One this term with some established performances. Forest held second spot going into 2008 and Calderwood will know only too well that there is much work ahead if The Reds are to finally haul themselves out of League One.

After being appointed as the twelfth manager in thirteen years for The Reds in May 2006, the new boss got off to a perfect start as he led Forest to a seven point lead at the top of League One in November 2006. History does not fall in Town's favour though. In a total of eighteen encounters between the two sides, Forest have emerged victorious on eleven occasions with Swindon managing just one win in what was the last between the two sides here at The County Ground. Four Town players – Jack Smith, Jerel Ifil, Michael Pook and Christian Roberts are survivors from that side which took the field on Saturday 13th August 2005.
