

THE MANAGER

WELCOME back to Brisbane Road for tonight's game against Swindon Town as we look to bounce back following Saturday's disappointing home defeat at the hands of Huddersfield Town.

It was a massive blow and although we're not going to say our chances have disappeared, we do have to change things around quickly.

It looks like a big hill to climb now, but we will not give up and we've got a chance to bounce back tonight but, as harsh as it may sound, perhaps it's time for a reality check.

Saturday's result means that we have taken just 16 points from our last 16 games and that sort of points return is nowhere near good enough to make the play-offs.

Indeed, a team that averages a point a game is likely to find themselves nearer the bottom of the table than the top and, any side looking to finish in the top two needs to average a couple of points a game, and we haven't managed to do that since the early stages of the season.

We have to face the unpalatable truth that we're not playing well at the moment.

TOGETHER

If we are to make the play-offs, then we have to start stringing together a succession of back-to-back victories. But, given the fact we have recorded just one win in our last nine games, we desperately need to dig out a couple of victories and I'd happily settle for that, just to get us out of this rut.

Looking back at Saturday's performance, it wasn't really good enough. We didn't create enough chances, despite trying a slightly different system, and there can be no arguments that the best side won on the day.

At the moment we are not doing the basics well enough and look like 11 individuals rather than a team.

There was no spark or invention about us on Saturday, and I'm saddened by that, because we give people the freedom to play and encourage them to pass the ball and express themselves in the top third of the pitch, but that's not happening right now.

But, I don't think you can look back at Saturday's game in isolation, you need to look at the bigger picture, and the simple truth of the matter is that we're not picking up enough points here at home.

LOST

Statistics don't lie, and we have now lost our last three home games, and have not managed to score during that sequence.

On that evidence alone our home form is simply

not good enough to make the top six and a glance at the league table indelibly underlines that fact.

We have played 18 games at home and have taken 26 points, and that sort of return makes it difficult to sustain a promotion push.

However, if you compare that with our away form, we have taken 24 points from 18 games and that stands the test and equates favourably with sides higher up the table.

COUNTED

With things not going so well, now is the time for every player and every single supporter to stand up and be counted.

When things are going wrong, the first reaction of some players is to hide away and the first reaction of the fans is to start getting on the players' backs. It's imperative that doesn't happen.

Because, it's vital that after all the hard work that has gone into the season so far, we don't let things drift during the final 10 games and end up in the bottom half.

Unfortunately, that's what it's looking like at the moment, and if there are players who think they can take their foot off the gas between now and the end of the season, then they are wrong. This is the time we really must all pull together.

INTERESTING

It was interesting to hear Huddersfield manager Andy Ritchie after last Saturday's game insisting his side can still make the play-offs, even though they are four points worse off than us.

Of course, any side that can suddenly go on a run over the last 10 games and string those wins together has a great chance of making it. It's all about momentum and the way momentum can swing one way or another.

If you analyse the season, I believe that our early form helped paper over the cracks and although we can still make the top six, we are currently like a leaf that was on top of the tree.


But, over the last few months, that leaf has blown away and, very gently, it has started floating downwards. Like that leaf, our momentum swing is going in the wrong direction.

While clubs like Oldham and Northampton both climbed above us at the weekend and their momentum swing is on an upward curve.

It's imperative that we stop our downward spiral, and we will only do that if we can find a win from somewhere, and quickly.

First of all, though, we have the obstacle of Swindon to get past and they've already proven to us this season that they are a stubborn side.

We bossed the large majority of the game when we played at the County Ground in November, but they still came away with a point when they scored with the last kick of the game.

We need to make sure there's no repeat of that tonight and a win would set us up nicely for the rest of March – a month in which four of our five remaining fixtures are against teams below us in the table. So, as ever, please get behind the team tonight and help them towards three points.

INTERODUCING STATES

SWINDON TOWN arrive here tonight knowing they need a win to keep their play-off hopes alive. But new boss Maurice Malpas will be hoping for a less eventful match than last Tuesday's encounter against Huddersfield Town.

That fixture threw together the two sides who were due to visit Brisbane Road in a three-day spell and it produced a real cracker.

Swindon raced into a three-goal lead as Billy Paynter netted early on, and then former O's star Craig Easton popped up with a quick-fire double, all in the opening 31 minutes.

But then it almost went wrong for the home side, as Phil Jevons cut the deficit after Huddersfield were awarded a 39th-minute penalty.

After the break it almost turned into a disaster for Swindon, as they were reduced to 10 men when Lee Peacock was sent off for a foul. Then, with 15 minutes to go, Paynter also saw red for punching the ball off the line. Jevons converted again from the spot to set up a nail-biting finish, but the nine-man home side hung on.

SUSPENDED

Without a game last weekend as their scheduled opponents Bristol Rovers were playing in the cup, it means that both Paynter and Peacock are suspended for tonight's encounter.

It's a blow for the Robins, who are looking for a second successive promotion, after they finished third in League Two last term.

Paynter, who was sent off at Crewe earlier in the season, picked up a two-game ban and also misses the home game against Carlisle United.

He reflected on the Swindon website: "It's disappointing for me to be honest. The next two games are big ones for the team and I don't want to miss out on any games of football, but that's how it goes."

It also gives boss Malpas, who took over from Paul Sturrock earlier in the season, a bit of a headache for tonight's game, with two key players suspended.

He admitted on the club's website after the Huddersfield match: "We may have to take a look at the loan market now. The squad is stretched as Billy (Paynter) and Peacs (Lee Peacock) are big players for us."

ALIVE

But Malpas was pleased with the win, as it kept the hopes of a

late promotion push alive and he added: "I have probably lost a few more hairs after that. We were cruising in the first half, but we were struggling in the second half. Thankfully we came out with all three points.

"The defensive work went well in the first half and we created chances at the other end. Sometimes we have to win ugly, and we did that tonight."

The manager reserved special praise for former 0's old boy Easton. The midfielder is Swindon's leading appearance-maker this season, having played 34 times for the Robins following his switch to the County Ground from Brisbane Road during the summer.

"Craig produced an excellent finish for his goal. He got right over the ball and showed excellent technique. He got two goals and we're very pleased with him," added the manager.

And Easton would, no doubt, love to hit the target again tonight on his return to the Matchroom.

However, it's Swindon's away form that has prevented them from playing more of an imposing role in this season's promotion chase.

The win against Huddersfield saw the Robins lift their points total to 47 for the season from 35 games, but the majority of those, 31 in fact, have come at home.

On the road the Robins have found it more of a struggle and have won just three and drawn seven of the 17 trips to date.

They do have a victory in the capital this season, as one of those three wins was achieved at Millwall, when they edged home by the odd goal in three.

While their other two successes came with identical 1-o wins at Yeovil and Luton.

REVENGE

The O's will, no doubt, be looking for a spot of revenge tonight as, when the two sides clashed earlier in the season, Orient looked to be heading for a win when Adam Boyd put them 1-0 ahead in the 86th minute.

But, in the fourth minute of stoppage time, Hasney Aljofree scrambled home a leveller, despite the visitors having 57 per cent of the possession during the game.

That last-gasp goal also prevented the O's from returning to the top of the table.

Since then Orient have failed to find their early season form on a regular basis, and a win for Martin Ling's side tonight might see them achieve less loftier aspirations, as it could be enough to push them back closer to the top six.



DEFENCE

PHIL SMITH

Harrow-born goalkeeper
Phil Smith joined Swindon
in July 2006 from Crawley
Town. The 6ft tins
stopper started his career
with Millwall as a
youngster, but he was
released in 2001 and
dropped into non-league.
Spells with Folkestone
Invicta, Dover Athletic,
Margate and Crawley
followed before he
returned to the Football
League two summers ago.

MIGUEL COMMINGES

French right back Miguel Comminges arrived at Swindon in July 2007 from Reims, a second tier side in his homeland. Comminges first came to the attention of then Town boss Paul Sturrock on a scouting mission to France last year, and after tracking his progress. Sturrock moved to sign the 25-year-old on a oneyear deal in the close season. Miguel has also played for Amiens.

JACK SMITH

Right-sided defender lack Smith is in his third season as a Swindon player following a July 2005 move from Watford. The 24-year-old made 25 League appearances for the Hornets, scoring two goals, before moving on to the Robins. He enjoyed a solid season at right-back during Swindon's 2006/07 promotion campaign, and has now returned to fitness following the dislocated shoulder he suffered last October.

JEREL IFIL

Londoner Jerel is closing in on his double century of Swindon appearances, having become a firm fans' favourite following his summer 2004 transfer from Watford. The powerful defender had previously enjoyed three loan spells at the County Ground between 2003 and 2004 and he signed a new three-year deal last summer, lerel also spent time on loan at Huddersfield during his Watford days.

HASNEY ALJOFREE

Swindon skipper Hasney Aljofree linked up with Paul Sturrock for a third time in his career when he moved to Swindon last summer. The 29-year-old previously played under the Scotsman at Dundee United and Plymouth Argyle and he wasted little time in slotting in at Swindon. An experienced player with over 250 career appearances to his name, Aliofree has formed a good partnership with lerel Ifil.







MIDFIELD

CRAIS EASTON

Scottish midfielder Craig Easton turned down the offer of a new contract with the O's in favour of moving to Swindon last summer and he has quickly become an integral part of the Robins' side. The former Dundee United and Livingston man enjoyed two fruitful years in E10 between 2005 and 2007, helping Martin Ling's men gain promotion from League Two and then avoid relegation last term.

SSPIENE KAARGUR

French left-sided midfielder Sofiene Zaaboub initially ioined Swindon on a short-term contract in November 2006 and he impressed sufficiently to earn a deal until the end of this season. Zaaboub has enjoyed a nomadic career, taking in spells with Montereau and Saint-Étienne in his homeland before playing for Modena in Italy, Real Jaén in Spain and FC Brussels in Belgium.

CHRIS ALLEN

Devizes-born midfielder Chris Allen has worked his way through the youth ranks at Swindon to earn his first professional contract. The 19-year-old made his debut in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy victory over Brentford earlier this season and he has come back into the side in the last three weeks. Chris now has nine first team appearances under his belt and looks to have a bright future in the game.

JOH-PAUL McGOVERN

Jon-Paul McGovern, a lively winger who can also operate through the middle, joined Swindon just hours before the close of the summer 2007 transfer window. The 27year old Glaswegian began his career at Celtic, but he failed to make the breakthrough at Parkhead and moved onto Livingston. He moved into English football with Sheffield Wednesday in 2004 and has also played for Milton Keynes Dons.

ANTEONY MCNAMES

24-year-old wingman Anthony McNamee signed for Swindon from Watford in January 2008 for an undisclosed fee. Gianluca Vialli gave him his Hornets debut as an 18year-old in March 2002 and he went on to make nearly 100 League appearances for the Vicarage Road club. But finding first team opportunities more limited in the last two seasons, he opted for the move to Wiltshire.

JAMIE VINCENT

Swindon Town became the eighth club of Wimbledon-born defender Jamie Vincent's career when he signed for the Robins in August 2006. The 32-year-old started off with Crystal Palace, where he made 25 League appearances before moving on to Bournemouth in 1996. He has since played for the likes of Huddersfield, Portsmouth and Derby, costing over £1.3million in transfer fees.

SIMON COX

Former Reading man Simon Cox has made a big impact at the County Ground since arriving from the Madjeski Stadium club, initially on loan, at the start of the season. Cox, 20, made the move permanent in the January transfer window as Swindon fought off competition from Northampton Town for his signature. He has scored 10 goals in 27 appearances this season.

MOSES ASHIKODI

20-year-old striker Moses Ashikodi joined Swindon on loan from Championship side Watford in January and is awaiting his first Robins goal. The Lagos-born player began his career at Millwall, where he made his debut at just 15. He moved to West Ham United in 2004, but he left Upton Park without making a first team appearance and signed for Rangers. He then joined Watford and is gaining experience at Swindon.

BARBY CORR

Ex-Sheffield Wednesday voungster Barry Corr signed for Swindon last summer, teaming up with then-boss Paul Sturrock once again. The 6ft 3ins striker failed to find the net in 17 League games for the Owls, but he has enjoyed a more fruitful time at Swindon, netting five times in 18 appearances this term. He first played for Swindon on loan from Wednesday last term, and he has also been loaned to Bristol City.

BILLY PAYNTER

Liverpool-born striker Billy Paynter is suspended for this evening's match at Brisbane Road having been sent off in last week's 3-2 victory over Huddersfield. The former Southend man signed for the Robins from the Roots Hall club last August and he has gone on to score nine times for his new club. Billy started his career with Port Vale and he has also played for Hull City and Bradford City.











CHRISTIAN ROBERTS

Welsh forward Christian Roberts, who is equally comfortable either on the right wing or up front, has made over a century of League appearances for Swindon since joining the Robins for a £20,000 fee from Bristol City in November 2004. He started off with hometown club Cardiff City, but it wasn't until a July 2000 move to Exeter City that his career took off. He has now scored 74 career goals.



BEST OF THE REST

Slovakian goalkeeper Peter Brezovan is currently warming the bench as Swindon's second choice goalkeeper. The 28-year-old stopper signed for the Robins in 2006 from Czech side 1. FC Brno.

Veteran defender Ady Williams is in his second season as a Swindon player after his transfer from Coventry. The 36-year-old spent 11 years at Reading over two spells and he has also played for Wolves and Millwall. Andrew Nicholas, a 24-year-old left-sided defender left Liverpool in 2003 to sign for Swindon and he has since gone on to make well over 100 appearances for the club. Maurice Malpas' defensive options also include Patrick Kanyuka, who signed for the club in January after being allowed to leave QPR, and Chris Blackburn, a summer arrival from newly-promoted League Two club Morecambe.

promoted League Two club Morecambe.

Energetic midfielder Michael Pook signed his firstoprofessional contract ahead of the 2005/06 season and he has gone on to make over 100 appearances for the club. Lee Peacock, the former Bristol City and Sheffield Wednesday striker who has been switched to a midfield role at Swindon, is banned for today after being sent off in the recent 3-2 victory over Huddersfield.

Up front, Blair Sturrock, the son of former manager Paul, signed for Swindon in 2006 from Rochdale and he has scored five goals this season. Youngster Kaid Mohamed is currently out on loan at Blue Square Premier side Torquay United, for whom he has scored twice in seven games.





SWINDON TOWN midfielder Craig Easton is hoping to give the Robins' play-off hopes a boost tonight at the expense of his old employers.

The 29-year-old Scot spent two years at Brisbane Road, playing a key role from midfield as Orient won promotion to League One.

But now he is focused on helping Swindon to the Championship and he knows how important three points could prove to be this evening.

We caught up with him ahead of the game.

Tonight's game is your first at Brisbane Road since leaving for Swindon in the summer, are you looking forward to it? Of course I am. I loved my time at Orient - I had two great years

there, probably two of my best in football. We got promoted and went on a great FA Cup run in the first season and then stayed up after a tough year, which was a decent achievement, so I've got plenty of good memories.

I think the highlight would have to be winning promotion at Oxford, and I'm grateful to Martin Ling and Dean Smith for taking a chance on me and giving me the opportunity there. It was nice that the fans took to me and I'm really looking forward to seeing everyone tonight.

And with Orient and Swindon fighting for the play-offs, it's a massive game too ...

It's weird how it's worked out with both of us involved in the race for the play-offs. It's so tight that any team who goes on a run now will have a great chance of making the top six. It's one of those games where a draw isn't going to be much good for either team, so both teams will be going for it and hopefully we can come away with three points.

We do know it is going to be a tough game though. When they came to the County Ground I thought Orient were one of the best sides we've faced this season, but we beat Huddersfield in our last game and we'll be hoping to build on that.

That 3-2 win over Huddersfield last Tuesday must give you confidence for this game?

We played better in the first half of that game and won it in the first 30 minutes really. It was a bit different after half time and the sendings off didn't do us any favours, but we held on for the win and that was important for us.

It was nice for me to score two goals too. I got into decent areas twice and managed to finish the chances off after good play down the left hand side. I'd like to build on that because I do like getting into the penalty area and scoring goals.

You were due to play Bristol Rovers at the weekend, but their FA Cup involvement meant you had a weekend off. Was that frustrating?

In some ways, because it would have been good to have the opportunity to build on the win over Huddersfield straight away. However, we've been busy recently with games on Saturdays and Tuesdays, so it was probably good for us to have a little rest ahead of such a big game. It's been enjoyable in training and I'm sure the lads who have been carrying knocks would have been glad to have more time to recuperate for tonight's game - so it could work in our favour too.

And with Orient losing to Huddersfield at the weekend, are you expecting a reaction from them?

They need to get back to winning ways, so we will have to be wary of Orient. But our win over Huddersfield was what we needed after a defeat in the previous game.

We're confident that we can get a result and three points would be great because we're desperate to be involved in the play-offs.





Martin Ling: "It was a disappointing display," he continued. "We lacked creativity all over the park and we've found scoring goals, especially here, difficult recently.

"We didn't really create any decent chances and the better side won the game. We've got to do the basics of the game right, and we didn't do that today.

"There was no spark or invention about us, and I'm saddened by that, because we give people the freedom to play and encourage them to pass the ball and express themselves in the top third of the pitch. That's not happening right now.

Timeline...

12 mins - Huddersfield's Phil Jevons is inches away from giving the visitors the lead when he connects with Malvin Kamara's terrific cross, but sends his glancing header just wide.

21 mins – Right winger Kamara proves to be a thorn in Orient's side early on and he works space for a cross-shot, which fizzes into the hands of Glenn Morris.

38 mins — Orient opt for a diamond in midfield in an effort to find some creativity, but Huddersfield continue to appear the more likely scorers and Chris Brandon skies an effort over the crossbar.


51 mins – Jabo Ibehre does well in the right hand channel to hold off a challenge before passing to Jason Demetriou, who forces a good save from Matt Glennon with his well-struck 20-yard effort.


60 mins - Demetriou tries his luck from outside the penalty area again and this time his shot takes a deflection off Frank Sinclair but drops the wrong side of the post.

70 mins – JJ Melligan comes off the bench and is involved almost immediately, finding space behind the Terriers' backline to cross low for Adam Boyd, who stabs wide under pressure.

75 mins – But it is a Huddersfield substitute – Luke Beckett – who provides the afternoon's defining moment, linking up well with Andy Booth to convert the former Sheffield Wednesday man's low cross from close range.

85 mins - Orient fashion one chance to level, but Ibehre can't take it, finding the gloves of Glennon with a fierce drive that flew through the penalty area.

ATTENTION




HISTORICAL O'S

Sid Bishop

Continuing the two-part conversation with club stalwart Sid Bishop, in this article, the legendary centre-half gives a further insight into his life with the O's before it sadiy ended with an acrimonious parting of the ways

Confidence is the key word used by Sid Bishop to summarise his personal approach to the game. The outstanding and dependable defender joined the O's ground staff in 1953 and went on to give 12 seasons of loyal service that embraced 323 League and Cup appearances.

Sid played against the best forwards of his time and when questioned as to the

most difficult opponent he ever faced, Bishop replied with typical candour. "There were certain players who were good but they never gave me a difficult time," he responded. "I always had an inner-built belief in my own ability, I felt that I was always in control and that came with an increase in confidence and experience as I played more and more games.

"Sometimes after we came off the field, I felt that I could have gone back on straight away and played another match. It was not because I didn't do anything mind you! I suppose because of my background as a PT Instructor, I was really fit."

It was during the brief reign of manager Dave Sexton when Sid finally left Orient and sadly, it was not on the best of terms as he explains. "I'd already told the club that I intended to retire at the end of the 1963/64 season and when Dave — who I knew quite well — arrived, he asked me what had been going on and I told him that I wanted to retire.

"I'd had a bit of a row with the club because I wanted to buy
the club house I was living in at Woodford Green but they
wouldn't sell it to me. There was dispute and the club held onto
my registration so that I couldn't go and play for anyone else and
that brought an end to my professional career as a player.

"I was very disappointed with Chairman Harry Zussman's attitude over the whole business after I'd given the club such loyal service over 12 years but I'd made my decision to retire and decided to carry it out. So I went to Hastings as player manager but I wasn't happy there and quickly moved onto Guildford City where I stayed for 18 months but although we won the Southern League Cup, I didn't feel I was achieving anything in life. So I became a licensee of a pub near Portsmouth but then my wife became ill and, with two kids to look after, I quit the business."

Sid returned to London and worked in a variety of jobs to earn

money until he retired. Sadly, his wife died a few years ago but the O's legend is still a regular visitor to Orient and the Supporters' Club travelling from his home in Harlow.

There were rumours on a number of occasions during his playing career that Sid was a transfer target for clubs with a higher profile than the O's although he cannot personally corroborate that speculation. "I was never told anything apart from one occasion when we coming away from Manchester United when Carey said to me, "Would you fancy living up here, Sid?" Matt Busby's son-in-law Don Gibson played for us for a while and he said to me on a several occasions, "Matt's

having you scouted again this week." I told him that was nice but it never came to anything and I never let it affect my game. But I was happy in London playing for Orient anyway.

Bishop accepts that the game in his day could be a physical battle although he is quick to state, "It wasn't as dangerous as it is now. It's ridiculous, players come in boot high with tackles and it's a wonder that someone hasn't lost an eye. There are elbows flying around and gamesmanship and cynicism in other ways.

"When I played, if I thought that a player was feigning, I would say to him, "If you go down again mate, then you won't get up." When I see all the shirt-grabbing that goes on in the penalty box these days, I get really annoyed. If that had happened in my day, a few people would have got a good wallop.

"There was the odd time when an opponent would clobber me off the ball out of sight of the referee. On one particular occasion I said to the ref: 'Can I hit him for what he's done? He just replied: 'Don't let me see you do it Sid!' You wouldn't tell the referee how to do their job but you could talk to them in those days."

Despite his macho-approach, Sid Bishop was a player who would always try to win the ball fairly relying on his superb timing both on the ground and in the air. Despite his tough no-nonsense approach to the game, he was never booked as a player with Orient.

Sid questions whether the modern-day player achieves the same amount of satisfaction from playing the game as colleagues from his generation. "I enjoyed every game I played, but I don't see enough of today's players laughing and enjoying the game like we used to," he states.

"I'm sure that I would certainly enjoy it given the money they earn."

As for Man United, as one of the so called leading lights in this country you would expect better from them despite the disappointment of defeat.



The number of victories recorded at Orient by tonight's visitors with the most recent on December 11 1971 when the Robins gained a 1-0 success. Their best away wins against the O's are by 3-0 scorelines, recorded on December 6 1947 and repeated on December 19 1964.

Our heaviest success came on January 21 1933 when we set a new club record recording a 7-1 success with goals from Bill Keen, Tommy Mills and Charlie Fletcher who all scored twice with Andy Thompson completing the rout, although the goals then dried up as

we failed to find the net in three of our next four matches. The teams had also figured in a high-scoring game at the County Ground earlier in the season when they shared six goals. The record score only lasted a season before we recorded a new high beating Aldershot 9-2.

In addition to the 7-1 success, we have also enjoyed a couple of other emphatic victories over these opponents, winning 5-0 in April 1939 and 4-0 in October 1955. On that occasion, Ron Heckman started the flow of goals before Ken Facey scored a hat-trick in what was to prove a promotion winning campaign for Orient. Later in the season, we completed the double over the Wiltshire side at a snowy County Ground when goals from Tommy Johnston and Phil Woosnam ensured us a fifth successive victory in a sparkling run of form that eventually stretched to ten consecutive winning games before the sequence was ended. Tonight's visitors tally of goals to date in East London totals 28.


LEARNING THROUGH FOOTBALL

LAST Friday, a group of Year 5 pupils from Willow Brook Primary school visited Brisbane Road for a ground tour to round off their successful six-week 'Learning Through Football' educational programme. 



IN a bid to boost their promotion chances, Nottingham forest have sealed the loan capture of Preston's Brett Ormerod.


The much travelled 31-year-old striker has signed until the end of the season, after turning down a move to League Two Morecambe a lew days earlier.



Dave Groombridge

A product of the outstanding youth club, Dave joined us from Chase of Chertsey who acted as a nursery club to both Arsenal and Orient. He was identified as a potential goalkeeper for the England Amateur side although he was never given the opportunity at that level.

Born in Norbury in April 1930, he played for amateur side Hayes before joining the O's in 1951 when manager Alec Stock offered him professional terms. The consistent form of custodian Pat Welton though left Groombridge to spend much of his time in an understudy role.

Dave made his debut for the club at Bournemouth & Boscombe on Christmas Day 1951 but finished on the wrong end of a 3-2 scoreline although he kept a clean sheet the following day for the return fixture that saw a goal from Dennis Pacey earn Orient a revenge victory. However, a 6-1 defeat at Exeter three days later saw Groombridge replaced by Welton, although he did earn a regular place in the side during the 1953/54 season and appeared in our FA Cup run that saw Orient reach the sixth round before losing to fellow Third Division side Port Vale.

However, Welton's consistently reliable form restricted Groombridge to just three appearances over the next two seasons although he shared duties with Welton for the 1956/57 campaign – our first back in the Second Division.

Injuries and the arrival of Frank George again forced Groombridge to the role of second choice although he did win his place back playing 37 matches in the 1959/60 campaign before being forced to retire from playing at the age of 30 due to injury.

He later managed Edgware Town and coached Leyton FC.

Joe Mallett

Joe Mallett spent most of his footballing life at Southampton playing as a wing-half before becoming he became a coach, manager and then scout for the club. Born in Gateshead, Northumberland in 1916, Joe was spotted playing for the Dunston Colliery works team and was signed at the age of 17 by Charlton Athletic to serve his apprenticeship under manager Jimmy Seed.

He had not made any first team appearances before he was loaned to Queens Park Rangers to gain experience in April 1937 and although he returned to Charlton and made two league appearances for them, he moved permanently to QPR in February 1939 for a fee of £800 before his career was interrupted by conscription into the RAF during World War II.

In February 1947, he signed for Southampton for a club record £5,000 and, although now aged 31, Mallett proved to be a bargain purchase providing a strong link between the defence and attack. He soon became the Saints captain and remained loyal to Southampton until April 1953 when, having clocked up 223 appearances and scored three goals, he joined Leyton Orient as player-coach in July 1953.

He was now aged 37 and made 27 appearances under former QPR team-mate Alec Stock before joining Nottingham Forest as coach in September 1954. However, he returned to Orient as coach three years later only to move back to Forest in 1959. In June 1964 he joined Birmingham City as coach, and a month later accepted the vacant managerial position.

Though he was a proven technical coach with sound judgment of a player, under his management Birmingham won only 13 out of 64 matches and were relegated from the First Division. The Blues appointed Stan Cullis as manager although Mallett remained at the club as his assistant from December 1965 to 1970. Joe went on to manage Panionios and coach at Apollon in the Greek Super League before coaching in the USA at New York Cosmos, then Washington Diplomats and latterly at San Jose Earthquakes. He also scouted for former club Southampton.

THE expertise and experience of safety stewards, police, doctors and members of the St John Ambulance are vital ingredients in the safety management of the Matchroom Stadium. However, the successful implementation of this plan depends to a very large extent on the cooperation of you the spectator.

Please contact a steward if you have any worries over a matter of safety, concerns about the behaviour of other supporters or if you need help with ticketing or finding your way around the stadium.

As Stadium Manager I would like to draw your attention to a number of key issues.

FIRST AID

There are two first aid rooms located in the East Stand. These are manned by members of the St John Ambulance and cater for most types of injury or illness. Should you require medical attention ask where the nearest steward or a member of St John who are located throughout the ground.

there is also a club doctor in the stadium for all fixtures and, for futures with crowds of over 5,000, the London Ambulance Service are also in attendance.

PERSISTENT STANDING

The Matchroom Stadium is an all-seater stadium and standing during matches or other events is not permitted. Spectators should remain mated at all times and not obstruct the view of others.

LOST PROPERTY

Stewards will ensure that any lost property is taken to a secure storage location. If you wish to claim property you believe to be lost in the stadium please ask the nearest steward or telephone the club on 0871 310 1881.

FACILITIES FOR DISABLED SUPPORTERS

Viewing areas for wheelchair users and dedicated toilet facilities are available throughout the ground.

The club provides a dedicated steward whose sole responsibility is the welfare of our disabled supporters and he visits all disabled areas regularly throughout the course of an event.

PROHIBITED ITEMS

Leyton Orient has a legal obligation to deny entry to the stadium to anyone carrying cans, bottles, glasses or containers of any description. Other prohibited items are clearly displayed at each turnstile block. Spectators bringing such items will have them confiscated and these cannot be returned – they are given up as a condition of entry.

PLEASE DO NOT SMOKE

The Matchroom Stadium is a non-smoking venue. Spectators are requested not to smoke at any time in public areas and safety stewards are authorised to ask any person found smoking to leave the stadium.

LICENSED BARS/FOOD OUTLETS

There are many bars and food outlets open to the public here at the Matchroom Stadium.

For these outlets to operate safely and effectively it is critical that all persons making use of them move away from the bar and counter area immediately after purchases have been made.

Supporters are reminded that it is a criminal offence to consume alcohol within sight of the pitch and any supporter attempting to carry alcohol into the stands faces possible ejection and arrest.

EMERGENCY EVACUATION

In the event of an emergency within the stadium which requires there to be any form of evacuation, a tannoy announcement preceded by an audible tone will be made.

Supporters should then follow the instructions given to them by the safety stewards and, in the event of an evacuation, should make their way to the nearest exit gate.

PLAYING SURFACE

Supporters are reminded that at no time are they permitted to enter the field of play. Any supporter who encroaches onto the pitch will be ejected from the ground and arrested.
