




We believe in the Academy at this Club and will look to give experience to talented young players wherever possible.



Milton Keynes Dons Football Club were presented with a Champions Flag by the Football League on Saturday ahead of our first home game of the season against Northampton Town.


The presentation was made to Dons Chairman Pete Winkelman by Football League Administration Director Glynis Firth, in recognition of the Club's League 2 triumph last term.



Ross McCormack's penalty gave Cardiff a first-half lead as a strong Bluebirds side held off MK Dons to reach the third round of the Carling Cup. The Dons pulled a goal back with 15 minutes left, Sean O'Hanlon heading in a free-kick, but Cardiff held their nerve.

The Dons with six changes to the side that beat Huddersfield at the weekend settled into the game well and pressed City back with some inventive play. The home side eventually broke the deadlock in the 45th minute, although their joy at scoring was tempered by yet another injury blow.

Scimeca was brought down in the box by Diallo and appeared to suffer a serious injury as a result of the tackle, departing the field on a stretcher. McCormack tucked the penalty away to give Cardiff a half-time lead and the hosts grabbed a second goal after 58 minutes, as Whittingham curled in a fine 25-yard free-kick.


The Dons did manage to pull a goal back with 15 minutes remaining, as O'Hanlon rose to head home a right-wing cross, but Cardiff held on.



CARL REGAN

A lot of clubs have achieved back-to-back promotions and there's no reason why we can't

Carl Regan's career has seen him play with and learn from some of the biggest names in English football.

A boyhood Liverpool fan, the Dons full-back could surely have only dreamed of working with the likes of Jan Molby, Ian Rush, Mark Wright and Paul Ince.


But ironically enough, it was the Reds' rivals from across Stanley Park that gave Carl his shot at professional football.

Carl says it was a pleasure representing Everton and he went on to win the FA Youth Cup with the Toffees in 1998/99.

"I started at Everton when I was an Under 10. I was Liverpool fan as a kid but it wasn't too bad, I always wanted Everton to do well, especially when I started playing for them!

"When we won the FA Youth Cup the final was against Blackburn and it was a two-legged affair. The first game was at Ewood Park and then we won it at Goodison Park in the return game.

"I remember winning it but I have better memories of the semi-final against Leeds. That was over two legs as well with the second leg at Goodision, live on Sky Sports, and I scored one of the goals to put us through.



"Obviously winning the cup was a great feeling but I'll never forget the semi-final."

Among Carl's team mates on that day were Manchester City defender Richard Dunne, Huddersfield striker Danny Cadamarteri and Tony Hibbert and Leon Osman – both still on the blue half of Merseyside. "I speak to Danny every now and again, I spoke to him after the game at Huddersfield last week, and I still speak to a lot of lads from that team.

"Phil Jevons is at Huddersfield as well, Franny Jeffers, Tony Hibbert there's a few that keep in touch.

"It was a good group of lads back then, similar to what we've got in Milton Keynes now. The team spirit and the atmosphere were always very good."

MY TIME

CARL REGAN



The high company Carl was keeping in his early years wasn't restricted to just Merseyside either, with the fullback going to represent England at Under 18 level.

"A fella called Colin Murphy was the manager back then, and there were some very good players in the side. Ste Gerrard, Wayne Bridge, Darius Vassell, Joe Cole, Ledley King – most of the current England squad to be fair!

"They were good times and all of them have gone on to great things."

After reaching the end of his contract at Everton, Carl turned down a renewal at Goodison Park in 2000 to seek first team football.

His outlet came at League 1 club Barnsley, who were managed at the time by Dave Bassett. "I was offered a one-year deal to stay at Everton but I felt the time was right to move on and play some football.
Some people said I should have stayed at Everton but you have to do what you think is right at the time.

"Dave Bassett is a bit of a character – a very funny man and a good manager as well. I was grateful to him for taking me to Barnsley and

giving me my debut in the Football League.

"He was only there for a couple of months when I got there, but some of the lads had some fantastic stories about him. I couldn't possible repeat them though, it was a long time ago!

By his own admission, Carl didn't make the best of starts to his Barnsley career – sent off after 18 minutes of his debut against Norwich City for a wild challenge.

But it was more the overzealous enthusiasm of a 19year-old eager to impress, than a malicious outing.

"I was talking to a few of the lads before the game, it was my home debut and I needed to get a good tackle in early-on and get the crowd behind me.

"I went a little bit too far and got myself sent off so it wasn't a very good start! I'm not even too sure who it was I tackled!" Injury robbed Carl of three months of that first season with the Tykes, but worse was to follow when Barnsley were relegated to League 2 the following season.

"I was out for three months of that season after injuring medial ligaments against Wimbledon in a Sky live game. By the time I'd got back Dave Bassett had been sacked and a new manager came in.

"We went down the following season which is never a good experience for any footballer."

Carl joined Hull City at the start of the 2002/03 season, then in League 2, under the guidance of the first of many Liverpool legends.

Jan Molby first brought him in on loan before making the deal permanent that November. As boyhood Red, it was a dream come true for Carl.

"You watch these people play football when you're young and wonder what they're like as people and as managers. So far none of them have disappointed me!"You learn a bit from every manager you work under. I was fortunate enough to work under quite a few I watched as a kid -Paul Ince, Ian Rush and Mark Wright at Chester, Jan Molby to name a few."They all have their own ways and methods and I've taken bits from every single one of them. I wouldn't like to pick one out as a favourite."

MY TIME

CARL REGAN

So is Carl surprised at Hull's ascent to the Premier League, having been with them in League 2 just six years ago? Not one bit. And what is more, he can see the Dons going the same way.

"I'm not surprised by Hull getting to the Premier League at all. When I got there they were in League 2 but had a new stadium and were getting gates bigger than anyone else in the division."I can see this Club going exactly the same way it reminds me so much of what was happening at Hull it's untrue."Everything is in place here - the stadium, the fans, the back room staff, the players - we just need to kick on, get promotion to the Championship and the Club will be getting close to its potential."

Having spent a couple of seasons playing non-league football, Carl returned to the Football League in March 2005 when he signed for Chester.

"Ian Rush was the manager there to start with but I also worked under Keith Curle and Mark Wright – there's a few Liverpool legends cropping up here isn't there?!"In my first full season we had a midtable finish, which was a decent position for Chester who had not long been in the Football League."

With and impressive season behind him and his contract up at Chester, opportunity knocked for Carl at Macclesfield under Brian Horton, who took him to Moss Rose in June 2006.Horton didn't last long the following season though, replaced in October after a poor start to the season by a certain Paul Ince.

"He just came in and changed everything. He made the lads feel like they were playing for Manchester United let alone Macclesfield. We were down and out at the time and he helped us turn things around and survive on the final day."Even as a player he commanded respect and when you played for him as a manager you wanted to go out and give it 110 per cent every week."It showed on the pitch both at Macclesfield and in Milton Keynes and I think all the fans saw the benefit."The stories about the lads sneaking out for McDonalds were a bit exaggerated though! We were out getting nice, healthy chicken sandwiches for our dinner!"

When Ince left to join the Dons in the summer of 2007, Carl had been one of the players he wanted to bring with him immediately.

It didn't happen before the transfer window closed, but Ince got his man in January in a deadline-busting swoop as Regan became part of the League 2 winning squad."As soon as I got the phone call I was down here like a flash. I think I made the trip from Liverpool to Milton Keynes in record time!

"I'd played for Macclesfield at stadiummk on the Tuesday before signing for MK Dons on the Friday. We managed to get a draw in that game so it was a nice way to end my time with Macclesfield."It was quite difficult here at first because the lads were top of the league and playing really well with a strong squad. But I think I've settled in well now and feel very much part of the squad."I just about scraped a medal last season and nobody will be getting that off me! It's in the safe!"

And so to this season, Carl's ninth as a professional, and the Dons defender sees no reason why Roberto Di Matteo's men can't make a challenge for back-to-back promotions.

"Given the start we've had and from what we've seen, I see no reason why we can't go and challenge for promotion. We need to keep the hard work going, keep our heads down and carry on going about our business without shouting too loud about it.

"A lot of clubs have achieved back-to-back promotions and there's no reason why we can't do it as well. We've got the players, the fans and the stadium so why not?"

TODAY'S VISITORS SWINDON TOWN

Town looking to get back on track after some recent reversals

After a promising opening day win Swindon Town arrive in Milton Keynes today on the back of three straight defeats, and though it's still very early into the new campaign, Town manager Maurice Malpas will be very keen for his team to get back to winning ways this afternoon.

Goals from strikers Billy Paynter and Simon Cox, plus one from former MK Dons favourite Jon-Paul McGovern, gave Town a three-goal lead in under an hour against Tranmere Rovers in their season opener, and though Ronnie Moore's team pulled a late goal back it proved to be no more than a consolation as Swindon's 3-1 win saw them continue on from a fine end to last season that saw them win three out of their last four games.

Those nine points gave Town a final finishing position of 13th, with a seasonal record of 16 wins, 13 draws and 17 losses form their 46 games played, and the late season improvement may have had some bearing on former Scottish international Malpas being relatively quiet in the summer transfer market.

Having boosted his squad back in January with the £200,000 signing of former Reading prospect Simon Cox, and then seen him go on to top Town's goalscoring chart last season, Malpas added to his defensive and midfield options during the summer, bringing in midfielder Michael Timlin from

Fulham after an impressive loan spell, the versatile Kevin Amankwaah from Swansea to add to the defensive picks, and perhaps most significantly the vastly experienced Frenchman Lilian Nalis to add some bite to the midfield department.

The former Leicester and Plymouth player has started all four games for Town so far this season, the last three of which have seen Malpas's team ship in a total of eight goals in losses to QPR at home in the Carling Cup, then 2-0 away at near-neighbours Cheltenham Town before last Saturday's 3-1 home defeat by Colchester United.

Former Scottish international Malpas commented after his team's latest reversal that they had made "schoolboy errors" in losing to the U's, while defender Jack Smith said to his club's website: "We started well enough but couldn't take our chances and then Colchester managed to get the first goal. We just didn't stay with the runners from the long ball and paid the price. "That got to us and to be fair Colchester built on their lead before the break with a second." "I thought we could have nicked a point, because we had opportunities but it proved to be one of those days. All we can do is take a look at where we have gone wrong and try and put things right."



Thanks to their first round Carling Cup loss Town have had a full week to prepare for this afternoon's game, manager Malpas taking the opportunity to give a number of squad players the chance to impress in a midweek friendly at Charlton.

With another away game scheduled for the next weekend at Hereford, followed by a big League One clash at home to Leeds United the following Saturday, Town will certainly be looking to get some more points on the board sooner rather than later. They have a good mixture of youth and experience, and after stabilisation last season following their promotion of the previous campaign, should well be capable of mounting at the least a sustained play-off challenge this current season.

TODAY'S VISITORS SWINDON TOWN

MANAGER: MAURICE MALPAS



A one-club man throughout the whole of his professional career, 46-year-old **Dunfermline-born Maurice** clocked up 617 League appearances for Dundee United, making his debut for the club in 1981 and playing his last game at Celtic Park in May 2000. A very consistent full back who amazingly escaped serious injury throughout the whole of his time at Tannadice, enabling him to make thirty or more League appearances in 17 consecutive seasons, he won League and Cup honours with United and after gaining his

first Scottish international cap against Finland in 1984 went on to play 54 further times for his country, making his final appearance against Italy in 1993.

Having doubled up as a player-coach during his latter seasons at Tannadice he took on full-time coaching duties at the club after his playing retirement, and was part of a temporary management team in 2002 before leaving United in January 2003. Soon linking up with Motherwell as assistant to then manager Terry Butcher, he took over at Fir Park in May 2006 after the former England international's departure to Sydney, but after a disappointing campaign that only just saw the club escape relegation from the SPL he left by mutual agreement in June 2007 and after a short spell in temporary charge of the Scottish Under-21 team took over at the County Ground in January 2008.

In his own words

"Our target is to be in the mix at the end of the season, whether that be straight promotion or in the play-offs."

"The main thing is to get off to a good start and then maintain it. I made the mistake last season of talking about the play-offs, so this year we will be taking it a few weeks at a time and adjusting our targets accordingly."

A regular starter since joining Town, he also skippers the side.







SIX OF THE BEST SWINDON TOWN

Football historian LEIGH EDWARDS profiles six of the biggest names associated with Swindon Town

OSSIE ARDILES

Former Argentina international midfielder Ossie Ardiles was unlucky not to lead Swindon Town to the top-flight in 1989-90. Together with Ricky Villa, the World Cup winner made headlines with his transfer from Huracan to Spurs in July 1978. He helped them win the FA Cup in 1981 and UEFA Cup in 1984, moving to QPR in May 1988. Appointed Swindon's boss in July 1989, he plotted their 1989-90 Second Division play-off final success but they were denied promotion due to an illegal payments scandal. He took charge of Newcastle United in March 1991, then managed West Brom and Spurs before coaching overseas.

GLENN HODDLE

Ex-England international midfielder Glenn Hoddle was player-manager



COLIN CALDERWOOD

Commanding central defender Colin Calderwood was capped 36 times by Scotland after leaving Swindon Town. Signing professional for Mansfield Town in March 1982, he moved to the County Ground in July 1985 and starred as Swindon won the Fourth Division title in 1985-86. He also helped the Robins win promotion in 1986-87, then featured in two further play-off finals including the 1993 Wembley triumph. Scoring 20 times in 330 League games for Swindon, he moved to Tottenham Hotspur in July 1993 and later played for Aston Villa and Nottingham Forest. He has since managed Northampton Town and now Forest.

MIKE SUMMERBEE

Brilliant winger Mike Summerbee was capped eight times by England after leaving Swindon Town. Initially with Cheltenham Town, he moved to the County Ground in March 1960 and was an important figure in Swindon's 1962-63 promotion success. He netted 39 goals in 218 League games prior to joining Manchester City in August 1965, amassing a vast collection of domestic and European honours under the Joe Mercer/Malcolm Allison partnership at Maine Road. Subsequently with Burnley, Blackpool and Stockport County, he is a successful businessman and his son Nicky also starred for Swindon Town.

STEVE McMAHON

Former England international midfielder Steve McMahon managed Swindon Town to the Second Division title in 1995-96. Initially with Everton, he joined Aston Villa in May 1983 and moved to Liverpool in September 1985. He starred as they won the League Championship three times and FA Cup in 1989, then reunited with Peter Reid at Manchester City. Appointed Swindon's player-boss in November 1994, he made 43 League appearances and remained in charge until September 1999. He managed Blackpool to promotion in 2000-01 as well as two LDV Vans Trophy final triumphs, since coaching Australian side Perth Glory.

DON ROGERS

England U-23 international winger Don Rogers scored twice in Swindon Town's 1969 League Cup final success. Signing professional at the County Ground in October 1962, he featured in Swindon's 1962-63 promotion campaign and was ever-present in four successive seasons. He starred as Swindon won promotion again in 1968-69 and the Anglo-Italian Cup in 1970, reuniting with Bert Head at Crystal Palace in November 1972, Moving to QPR in September 1974, he rejoined Swindon in March 1976 and netted 148 goals in 412 League games overall for the Robins. He has since run his own sports shop in Swindon.

SWINDON TOWN

After a year off for good behaviour, the MK Dons and Swindon renew hostilities this afternoon, and since the relocated Dons and Town first met up in August 2004, it's been today's visitors who have held the whip hand, winning three and drawing one of the six games played.

Stuart Murdoch was the MK Dons manager for the clubs' first game, goals from Sam Parkin and Brian Howard either side of an Allan Smart leveller (pictured top) being enough to give Town the spoils, but by the time the return game was played in March 2005 Danny Wilson had taken over and the point the Dons gained from the 1-1 draw, Wade Small opening the scoring before Grant Smith equalised, was to prove crucial in the successful battle against relegation.

October 1st 2005 was the date of the next meeting, and this time it was Swindon who had a new man in charge, Iffy Onuora having taken over from Andy King the previous week. Both teams had made poor starts to the League One campaign, having just three wins between them, but goals from Malvin Kamara, Gareth Edds and Izale McLeod gave the Dons all three points after Rory Fallon had scored after just seven minutes for Town.

The Dons were rooted to 24th spot when the return game was played at the County Ground the following April, with Swindon just two places above them, but although Clive Platt's goal (pictured middle) was enough to lift Wilson's team over Town in the table, both teams ended up being relegated, leading to vastly differing circumstances by the time of the next meeting in September 2006.

Both teams had new managers, Dennis Wise for the home team and Martin Allen for the visitors, and not only that, Swindon also fielded Paul Ince in their ranks, one of the three games he played for the club before moving into management. Not surprisingly with two such competitive bosses in charge, this game was a feisty affair, Jack Smith from the spot and Paul Evans netting for Town after Jon-Paul McGovern had given the Dons a 17th-minute lead.


With both teams challenging for promotion the return game played at the National Hockey Stadium on New Year's Day 2007 was another highly-charged occasion. The Dons had won five straight taking then into second spot in the table going into the game, but after Lee Peacock had scored for the now managed by Paul Sturrock visitors on the half-hour, Izale McLeod then earned and missed a penalty for the homesters.

The three points lost, coupled with just one from the following two games, meant that in the final reckoning it was Town who went up automatically, the Dons who missed out in the play-offs, and the subsequent season's gap before today's seventh meeting.





I got the feeling last Saturday that for the first time since venturing into the chaotic world of management Roberto Di Matteo felt like he belonged at the club.

It's not been an easy summer for the rookie boss whose original plan for the warm weather days involved studying for a business administration degree at the European School of Economics in London.

But it showed he is made of tougher, braver stuff when he answered the call of Pete Winkelman.

Not many come away from a meeting with the chairman without feeling positively enthused about the club though. Just ask Paul Ince and Martin Allen!

Nonetheless, he chose the football path, made harder still by the fact he was replacing an iconic, and stupidly successful manager in Ince. A person the players had the utmost respect and admiration for.

Since then he's had to work flatout to assess the squad and has had a harsh introduction to the murky dealings of the transfer market. With ingoing and outgoing moves proving hard work to say the least.

With a hardly ideal pre-season either he probably couldn't wait for the season to start. Even though it did with a loss at Leicester City. But what we have seen then is an ability to learn quickly. The failings of that game have gone, and so to have the nerves. Norwich was an improvement, a confidence booster despite it not being the best of matches. The Cobblers win showed they are more than capable at this level.

And the Huddersfield hammering showed on their day they can be a match for anyone. Superb passing football mixed with a steely Italian-like ability to soak up pressure that would have made Di Matteo proud. Watching him after the game, the way he reacted with his players and assistant Eddie Newton it looked like he had caught the addictive bug that is football again. Something that would have been hard for him after a dazzling career was wrecked by one tackle. In his post-match interview Newton said the win was down to the players starting to believe in themselves, and the manager. A few other people started to believe again that afternoon though. For the first real time I noticed the crowd chant the manager's name. And it was that, which really

capped off the afternoon for me.





THE NAME IS THE SAME **BALDOCK**

TEDDY BALDOCK, born in Poplar on 24 May 1907, became World Bantamweight boxing champion at the age of 19 after beating Archie Bell at the Royal Albert Hall. He lost the title to Willie Smith later in 1927 and was burned out by the time he was 24. Not surprising considering



he went to the United States in the fall of 1926 and had 12 fights in under three months, winning them all. Despite earning big money in the ring, he died penniless at the age of 63.

Sam: I've never heard of him, but if we're talking boxing... We were doing some fitness sparring in the gym the other day and Ade (fitness coach Ade Mafe) came at Dean Lewington expecting him to defend himself. Lewie just tucked his head in and jumped back like a little wuss! It was hilarious!



SEAN BALDOCK, born in Hastings on 3 December 1976, is a runner who represented Great Britain in both the 2000 Sydney Olympics, when he came 5th in the 400m final, and the 2004 Athens Olympics, when he was a member of the 4x400m relay squad. He was also fairly swift over 100m and 200m as well.

Sam: But I bet he's not as quick as Jude Stirling AKA Usain Bolt. I used to run the 200m at school. My best time was 24 seconds flat but football was always going to be the sport for me.

Released in the summer of 2006 after he had played 19 League games for the Dons, Nick quickly then linked up with his former Wimbledon manager Terry Burton at Cardiff City, but just played one

cup game for the Bluebirds before being loaned to Torquay and then released last summer.

After a unsuccessful trial back with the Dons Nick then suffered some bad luck, as he explained to his new club's website. "After being released by Cardiff, I was at MK Dons on trial and then 45 minutes into my first training session with Dagenham and Redbridge I broke my foot. It was a disaster because I was out of contract and had to wait for treatment on the NHS. I was out for three months. It couldn't have come at a worse time. Slightly further away from MK at the moment is popular former winger Nick Rizzo, who last Friday evening was part of the Perth Glory team that continued the new Australian A-League campaign with a 3-3 draw at home to reigning champions Newcastle Jets in front of an 8.876 crowd at the Members Equity Stadium.


Now into his second season with the Glory, after making 13 starts and one




substitute appearance in his first campaign, Nick missed their opening game 1-0 defeat at Adelaide United and came on for the last five minutes of the match against the Jets.







YEOVIL TOWN

Glovers look a good fit as Slade bids for a chart-topping spot.

It's all things west country for the MK Dons at the moment, as following on from Swindon today next up for Roberto Di Matteo's team is another home game, against Yeovil Town next Saturday.

Led by former Grimsby boss Russell Slade, the Glovers, now established in the League One fold, have always been known for their Cup giantkilling feats throughout their non-league history.

However, despite eliminating Charlton Athletic

at The Valley in the first round of the Carling Cup, the Huish Park club were unable to uphold that tradition in their most recent outing, a 5-1 second round Carling Cup defeat at the hands of Premiership side Middlesbrough last Tuesday evening.

That loss for the Glovers came on the back of a strong start to the League campaign though, draws against Leeds and Walsall either side of a win away to Hereford leaving Slade's team sixth in the early league table and in a strong position to better last season 18th-place finish.

Last Saturday's 1-1 home draw with Leeds was real roller-coaster for the Glovers, falling behind after just 26 seconds and then being forced into making three substitutions due to injury. But speaking after the match,

Slade made it clear that he was happy with the resolution shown by his side, saying: "I was delighted with the second half come back – football is such a strange game and you never know what is coming next – today was a story worth reading."

Despite not being blessed with the largest squad in the division, the Glovers

proved against Leeds that they are tough to beat, something that the Dons will have to bear in mind next Saturday. Slade continued: "We lost a couple of players, we went 1-0 down, and we then had a twice-taken penalty and it was a fantastic story to finish on but in the end it just wasn't quite an epic story.

"In a way we deserved to win the game, because with the injuries we had and to come from 1-0 down was a terrific effort." Experienced striker Lloyd Owusu slotted home the equalising spot-kick for the Glovers, the first one they had been given in two seasons, and since joining Yeovil from Brentford last summer the well-travelled 31-year-old has been a regular feature in attack for Slade's team.

Major summer signings this year have been former Huddersfield midfielder Danny Schofield, quickly snapped up on a Bosman in early May, and former midfielder Darren Way, whose recent two-year spell away from the club at Swansea was ruined by a continuing run of injuries.

More recently, young Crystal Palace midfielder James Dayton also joined the Huish Park ranks on a one-month loan spell, while Crewe midfielder Gary Roberts has also joined the Glovers on loan until January.

But it's former Chelsea trainee
Terry Skiverton who is the focal
point of the Yeovil team, having
been with the Glovers since their
non-league days and now
claiming over 350 senior
appearances for the club. An
imposing figure at the heart of
the defensive set-up, manager
Slade will be looking to him to
make the noise as the Huish Park
outfit look to mix it near the top
of the charts this season.







Aaron Wilbraham got the only goal of the game against Northampton just after the hour to hand Roberto di Matteo his first points as MK Dons manager.





Being a keen admirer of classic architecture as I am, there's plenty to like about that place. The Galpharm Stadium itself is a very individualistic piece of work, and looks mighty impressive from a distance as the train trundles into Huddersfield.

But believe me it's nothing compared to the railway station, which according to Wikipedia "was designed by James Pigott Pritchett architect in 1847-8 using the neo-classical style, the station is well known in architectural circles for its classical style facade with a portico of the Corinthian order, consisting of six columns in width and two in depth, which dominate St George's Square, where it is located, facing out towards Lion Buildings. The poet John Betjeman described the imposing station frontage as the most splendid in England."




