John's Journal

Ithough we didn't get the win we Awere hoping for against Walsall last Saturday and had to settle for a goalless draw, along with our victory over Crewe in September, it was the strongest performance we have given in League One. Those are the two matches in which we have kept clean sheets this season and they've yielded four points. We have to aim to increase our percentage of clean sheets for the rest of the season. If we do that we'll more than hold our own in this division.

In a number of games this season we've had our best spells in the latter stages of matches. But that's been when we've been chasing the game. The difference on Saturday was that we had much more control of the match from the start and Darren Randolph was never in the action to anywhere near the extent he was at Leeds the previous week.

Walsall came here with only two defeats in eight league games but I thought we more than matched them and on another day could have nicked all three points as we had a good goal disallowed. When Bradley Hudson-Odoi

got the ball in the net only for the referee to award them a free kick, seemingly for pushing. But, looking at the DVD afterwards, I couldn't see any evidence of an infringement by any of our players. There was, of course another close shave when they scrambled the ball off the line. Many people including some of the players felt the ball had crossed the goal line, but after watching the incident in slow motion I have to say the officials in this case were proved right when they waved play on. Andy Williams and Bradley also went close to breaking the deadlock with headers. We're not getting the best of fortune in front of goal at the moment.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank our supporters for the way they've got behind the team this season. Like the players and the club staff, there us obvious disappointment at being bottom of the table, something we are all working hard to rectify. But the support has been very positive and in the second half on Saturday the continuous vocal volume was particularly impressive. It's something the players do appreciate and it was a vital help in keeping them going



and finishing strongly.

Having received a first round bye, we start our challenge for the Johnstone's Paint Trophy with a quick return to Edgar Street for Swindon Town after the drawn league fixture here a few weeks ago. Of course, our top priority is to improve our league position but a decent run in the Trophy can be financially rewarding with the prize of a Wembley final. It's a competition we will be aiming to do well in and a win tonight would be a great confidence boost for our trip to Oldham on Sunday and Brighton the following Saturday.



A Look Back

Bulls and Saddlers Battle Out Stalemate

Hereford United secured their 5th point of the campaign with a 0-0 draw against League 1 high-flyers Walsall at a wet and blustery Edgar Street.

United boss Graham Turner made three changes going into the game with Andy Williams, Moses Ashikodi and Kris Taylor returning to the starting eleven in place of Matt Done, Simon Johnson and Nick Chadwick. Also absent from the 16 man squad was Ben Smith who was missing due to illness.

Former Milan player, Bruno N'Gotty, made his home debut after a solid performance against Leeds following his arrival on loan from League 1 pacesetters, Leicester City.

It was a game that United were keen to get something out of after a string of four straight defeats had seen The Bulls slump to bottom place in the League standings. Conversly, Walsall came to Edgar Street on the back of three victories that saw them occupy a top six

Showing faith in his side that defeated Carlisle the weekend previously, Saddlers boss Jimmy Mullen decided to go into the game unchanged, meaning former England international, Michael Ricketts started in attack, and former Bulls loanee, Chris Palmer started at right back.

It was a game that saw little to set the pulses racing, but United fans and staff will have gone home happy after ending their losing run.

In a slow start to the game, Nicholls was the only player to have any real effort on goal, however thankfully for The Bulls he sent a string of chances high or wide leaving Darren Randolph with far less to do than his heroics during The Bulls 1-0 defeat to Leeds.

In an opening half that saw neither team taking charge it would perhaps have been unjust had Micheal Ricketts' effort in the 40th minute, or either of Bradley Hudson-Odoi's efforts in the dying moments of the half, gone in.

In Walsall's best chance of the game, Ricketts found himself unmarked 12 yards from goal, but being slightly at an angle, failed to send his right footed shot in on target - with the ball whistling past the far left hand post, close - but not close enough - to his fellow strike partner, Jabo Ibehre.

Shortly afterwards and Bradley Hudson-Odoi sent a header from a deep left footed cross by Kris Taylor inches wide of the upright - the former Fulham man, who was looking to add to his threegoal tally so far this season, probably should have done better 8 yards from goal, but he was soon to have another attempt, latching on to an Andy Williams through-ball on the right to send a right footed shot in on Ince's goal.

The second half saw United enjoy far more of the possession, but The Bulls never looked convincing in their attempts to break down a stubborn Walsall defence.

In a similar move that saw Hudson-Odoi head wide in the first half, Taylor this time combined with Williams, but the result was the same, with the loanee sending his header from 12 yards out narrowly wide.

United were then denied by a goaline clearance from a goalbound Andy Williams effort. Shortly afterwards and United managed to get the ball into the back of the net, however, referee Mr. Mathieson had already blown for a push on Ince in the visitors goal to deny United an opener. Another hard working display from The

Bulls, who competed more than

admirably with their visitors. A greater level of concentration from The Bulls meant that Walsall were limited to few chances - and United will be happy to have ended a losing run.

What they said...

Graham Turner: "We showed a bit of grit and determination - we had a couple of good headed opportunities, one in either half. In the end, against a side that are going well in the League it was a decent performance, and a grinding out of a result.

"We've done alright there, their two front lads are a handful and I think generally we controlled things guite well. A clean sheet was important.

"I say it's like a cricket innings, you build it up and sometimes you have to take singles - we got a point today.

"There is obviously a concern that we're not putting the ball in the back of the net, and that's obviously a concern, I think we miss the presence of Steve Guinan, but Andy Williams is back with us, and I think we've got enough here to turn it around."

Opponents Profile



HASNEY ALJOFREE

Solid centreback who joined the Club in August 2006 and will be looking to build on a solid first season in Wiltshire that saw him make an impressive 38 league starts. Hasney began his career with Bolton Wanderers and made 22 appearances for the Trotters at first team level.

A switch to Dundee United followed but after two seasons North of the Border, Hasney moved to Plymouth Argyle on a free transferin the summer of 2002 and he went on to make well over 100 appearances for The Pilgrims, many of them as Captain.

CHRIS ALLEN

Young midfielder who came to the fore during the 2007/08 campaign after being handed his full league debut at Southend United in December.

The Devizes-based middle-man made eight league appearances for The Robins last season and will be keen to impress during reserve outings this term in a bid to win a first team spot.

With excellent delivery from a setpiece situation and a keen eye for goal, Allen has a lot to offer the Town squad.

KEVIN AMANKWAAH

The first signing of the summer, Kevin is looking to nail down a regular starting slot after joining on a two-year deal from Coca-Cola Championship side Swansea City. At 6'1 he adds height to the backline and will be in competition with the established Jack Smith for the right-back berth. Made his debut off the bench at MK Dons on Saturday 30th August 2008 in a 2-1 win for The Robins.

PETER BREZOVAN

Slovakian goalkeeper who joined Swindon in the summer of 2006 on a year-long loan from FC Brno. The stopper made an immediate impression, saving two penalties on his debut at Hartlepool United in August of the same year.

Brezovan's impressive performances saw him retain the number one spot until a broken arm against Grimsby Town in October 2006 brought his season to a shuddering halt.

'Brez' returned to action at the start of the 2007/08 season although was made to wait for his chance with Phil Smith keeping him on the bench. Regained his place in the starting line-up at Port Vale in October and kept his place in the side.

BARRY CORR

Sheffield Wednesday striker Barry joined Swindon Town in a permanent deal in the summer of 2007.

At 6'5 the striker certainly offers a physical presence in the front line. He started out in English football with Leeds United and gained youth honours for the Republic of Ireland during his time at Elland Road.

He then joined Sheffield Wednesday in April 2005 from after an initial trial spell with the Elland Road club. He made 17 league appearances for the Hillsborough club and also had a loan spell at Bristol City in October 2006.

Corr initially arrived at The County
Ground on loan and made a goalscoring
debut, hitting the second goal at Lincoln
City in March 2007 to earn Swindon a
valuable win. He then battled through a
back injury to help secure promotion
back into League One with some
talismanic displays.

SIMON COX

Striker Simon signed a permanent deal at The County Ground in January 2008 after enjoying successful loan spell with Swindon.

Cox initially arrived in August 2007 on a long-term loan and made the most of his temporary stint, scoring 10 goals before his loan spell was up, including a last minute penalty against Swansea City on New Year's Day to secure a point.

The front man then returned to Reading and made nine senior appearances for his hometown club. Cox had joined Reading at the age of nine and progressed up through the academy ranks before making his senior debut against Luton Town in the Carling Cup in September 2005.

CRAIG EASTON

Craig arrived at The County Ground in June 2007 and added real experience to the central midfield area.

The former Scotland Under 21 International joined up at The County Ground with over 300 league appearances under his belt and has made a significant impression since signing for The Robins.

Easton, 28, started his career at Dundee United where he came up through the ranks to make 162 league starts before departing in the summer of 2004.

He then spent a year at Livingston before joining Leyton Orient in July 2005. In all he made 65 league starts in two seasons for Martin Ling's O's.

Easton was handed his first chance to impress in the home Carling Cup clash with Charlton Athletic in August 2006 and made 40 league starts for Town last term, scoring six goals along the way including a brace in the 3-2 win over Huddersfield Town.

JEREL IFIL

Powerful defender Jerel joined Town permanently in June 2004 in a £70,000 switch after enjoying three loan spells with Town previously from 2002-04.

Jerel became a fan's favourite during his brief stays in Wiltshire and signed on a permanent basis in June 2004.

He benefitted from a partnership alongside the experience of Ady Williams in the middle of defence during the promotion season of 2006/07 season and scored a vital day on the last day of that season against Walsall.

'The Beast' as he is affectionately known to the Swindon faithful, has now played over 100 games in a Town shirt and signed a new three-year contract in May 2007.

JACK SMITH

Town's number two for the last three seasons, Jack signed from Watford in the summer of 2005.

Due to the departure of Paul Robinson to West Bromwich Albion he was thrust into the first-team spotlight

at Watford and coped admirably. He made 38 league starts in his first season as a Swindon player - in a variety of positions including right back, left back and midfield.

The defender started the 2007-08 in solid form, despite pressure from summer signing Miguel Comminges. However, a dislocated shoulder halted his progress but he returned to action for the FA Cup win at Wycombe Wanderers and forced his way back into the starting line-up making a further fifteen first team appearances.

BEN JOYCE

Energetic striker who burst onto the first team scene towards the end of the 2007/08 campaign.

Came off the bench to score on his debut in the final minute of the 6-0 victory against Port Vale and enjoyed further action as a substitute against Gillingham and Millwall before the 2007/08 campaign came to a close.

Joyce arrived at The County Ground in the summer of 2007 after spells with Aston Villa and Plymouth Argyle. The striker has featured in both of Swindon's pre-season tours since arriving in Wiltshire, with trips to Austria in 2007 under Paul Sturrock and 2008 with Maurice Malpas in charge.

PATRICK KANYUKA

Physical centreback who joined Swindon Town in January 2008 following his release from Coca-Cola Championship side OPR.

Started out with Leyton Orient as a youngster and after impressing against QPR in a friendly, joined the Loftus Road side on a permanent basis.

He made his first appearance for QPR against Burnley in 2005 and went on to make 12 league appearances for The R's.

Made an immediate impression in his first appearances in a Town shirt, winning the Man of the Match award after a 1-0 win at Luton Town at the end

However, a series of niggling injuries meant he made only three further appearances for The Robins before the season was out. A summer of rehabilitation saw the defender impress in pre-season in Austria, and he made his first League One appearance of the

season in the 3-1 home defeat to Colchester United on Saturday 23rd August 2008.

CALLUM KENNEDY

Former Reading defender who was granted a taste of first team action by former Town boss Paul Sturrock. The youngster made a surprise start in the 4-1 win over Brentford in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy in September 2007.

Comfortable at left-back, Kennedy was a regular for the Town reserves last term and was taken on the pre-season tour to Austria in the summer of 2008.

JON-PAUL MCGOVERN

Jon-Paul joined Swindon Town on Friday 31st August 2007, just hours before the close of the transfer window, signing a contract until the close of the 2009/10

A lively winger who can operate out wide or through the middle, McGovern's arrival was a major boost to then boss Paul Sturrock who had been chasing the player for some time.

The 26-year old was a key cog in Sturrock's Sheffield Wednesday side which won promotion to the Coca-Cola Championship and made over 60 appearances for The Owls during two seasons at Hillsborough.

McGovern began his career as a trainee at Celtic but after one season, he was released by the Scottish giants and subsequently signed for Livingston in July 2003 after a successful loan spell in England with Sheffield United. A promising season for 'Livi' saw Sheffield Wednesday come in for the midfielder who joined Paul Sturrock's squad in time for the start of the 2004/2005 season. He was an ever-present during the promotion winning campaign and scored the first goal at the Millennium Stadium to help secure promotion.

ANTHONY MCNAMEE

Anthony joined Swindon Town in January 2008 from Watford for an undisclosed fee.

McNamee enjoyed his best season in a Watford shirt in 2005/06, when he helped Aidy Boothroyd's side to an improbable promotion to the Barclays Premiership.

With a mixture of starts and

substitute appearances to his name the young winger took part in over 40 games, scoring just once.

McNamee spent time on loan at Crewe Alexandra during the 2006/07 Premiership campaign, but returned to play a part in Boothroyd's Championship squad.

The winger offered both pace and trickery down the flanks soon after signing and Town fans have already taken great delight at a number of Man of the Match performances.

A fans' favourite at The County Ground, 'Macca' is one of the trickiest customers in League One and is a real asset in the Town side.

SEAN MORRISON

Robust centreback who arrived in Wiltshire during the summer of 2007. After impressive displays for the youth and reserve sides, Morrison was handed a call up to the first team and made appearances against Gillingham and Millwall at the end of the season. The defender has benefited greatly from the advice passed on from defensive coach Ady Williams. Morrison made his first start of the season in the Carling Cup encounter against QPR where he lined up against the likes of Emmanuel Ledesma and Dexter Blackstock.

LILIAN NALIS

The Robins signed midfielder Lilian on a one-year deal at the end of July following his release from Plymouth Argyle at the end of the 2007/08 season.

36-year old Nalis has plenty of experience in the English game with spells at Leicester City, Sheffield United and The Pilgrims.

A French midfielder, Nalis began his career in his home country with the likes of Le Havre, Caen, Guingamp and Bastia. After three seasons with the Bastia, Nalis moved to Italian side Chievo before a move to England.

He joined Leicester City in 2003 and spent two years with The Foxes - one of which in the Premier League, before a switch to Sheffield United. A loan spell at Coventry City followed and after just six appearances at Bramall Lane - he joined Plymouth.

In total Nalis made over 100 league

appearances for The Pilgrims and signed for Swindon in July 2008.

BILLY PAYNTER

Striker who joined on deadline day in August 2007 and has hit 8 goals in 23 league starts for the club so far. Has League experience with the likes of Port Vale, Hull City and Southend United.

Paynter's preferred position is striker, but he has also played on the right wing for both City and Vale, as well as for a Football League Under-21 team (selected and managed by Peter Taylor) in a game against an Italian Serie B side, a match which took place at the KC Stadium in February 2006.

He hit a hat-trick for Swindon against Bournemouth in September 2007 and followed this up with a double against Gillingham in a 5–0 win in early October 2007.

LEE PEACOCK

Signed by former boss Iffy Onuora, 'Peacs' arrived midway through the 2005-06 season after turning down a move to Walsall.

Having previously been at the likes of Sheffield Wednesday and Manchester City, as well as local rivals Bristol City, Peacock came to Town an experienced and versatile player.

He scored off the bench in his first appearance as a Swindon player against AFC Bournemouth in January 2006 — a goal that wrapped up a 4-2 home win.

Always a favourite with the crowds, Peacock went under the knife at the end of Swindon relegation season but returned successfully and was the Town's top goalscorer by October, before being switched to a midfield role under Paul Sturrock. On April 24th 2007, Peacock was named the PFA's Fans' Player of the Year in League Two.

A hardworking player, Peacock has now returned to a striking role after a brief foray into the midfield last term. Has scored 119 goals in 319 career league starts and adds tremendous experience to the set-up.

PHIL SMITH

After being released by Millwall as a youngster, Smith spent time in non-league with Crawley and Margate before joining in the summer of 2006

and impressed during the promotion campaign after deputizing for the injured Peter Brezovan.

He picked up the PFA Fans' Player of the Month for December 2006 and was rewarded for his efforts, with a two year extension on his current contract, ensuring he had a future at the club until 2009.

His heroics between the sticks for the promotion season didn't go unnoticed by the fans, who named him their Player of the Season in May 2007.

Has now made over 50 appearances for The Robins and will battle it out for the number one shirt again this season.

MICHAEL POOK

A Swindon-born midfielder who has come up through the ranks, 'Pooky' made his first team debut at Boston United in September 2003.

Though he regularly appeared on the bench later that season, he didn't make it onto the pitch until the following September, coming on as an injury-time substitute in a Carling Cup match at Elland Road.

He was an integral part of the youth team that won the Youth Alliance South West Conference title. Without having started a match in the first team, manager Andy King offered him a professional contract, and he finally made his first start on in April with then boss Andy King looking to the future.

The midfielder marked his 50th senior appearance for the club with a goal in Swindon's 3-0 home victory against Grimsby Town. He signed a new one-year deal in the summer of 2008.

BLAIR STURROCK

The former manager's son made his Swindon debut in December 2006 after spells with Dundee United, Kidderminster Harriers, Plymouth Argyle and Rochdale. He joined Swindon Town after suffering an injury whilst playing for Rochdale. After reaching full fitness, the striker was then handed a chance to impress for the Town second string and his performances saw a short-term contract handed out. First team chances then came his way with a Town debut off the bench at Macclesfield Town in December 2007. He then made a further nineteen appearances, scoring three

goals as Town went on to win promotion from League Two.

The 2007/08 season saw the front man score six goals in twenty-seven first team appearances, including the winner in the FA Cup tie against Forest Green Rovers in December.

JAMIE VINCENT

Began his career at Crystal Palace before switching to AFC Bournemouth, where impressive performances for The Cherries brought about a £500,000 switch to Huddersfield Town.

It was a successful time at The McAlpine Stadium with the defender making over 60 appearances, games which drew the attentions of Portsmouth. An £800,000 move to Pompey followed in February 2001.

After three years with the Fratton Park club, further spells followed at Derby County and Yeovil Town before signing for Swindon under Dennis Wise in the summer of 2006.

Vincent's solid performances in defence for the Robins secured his place in the first team last season, although injuries have hindered his progress so far this campaign.

LLOYD MACKLIN

Lightening-quick winger who was joined by Ben Joyce and Callum Kennedy on the pre-season tour of Austria in the summer of 2007.

Became the youngest ever play to represent Swindon at first team level when coming on against Brentford in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy in September 2007.

He went on to feature prominently for the youth and reserve teams as the 2007/08 campaign was played out and will be hoping to press for first team involvement now the new season is under way.



Bulls On The Road

Next Sunday we travel to table topping Oldham Athletic, kick off 2:00pm. The Latics are currently unbeaten at Boundary Park and last Friday they lost 3-1 at Stockport County.



We last visited Oldham back in March 1974 when both sides fought out a 1-1 draw. John Ritchie gave United the lead early in the first half, but the hosts equalised midway through the second half. The Latics finished the season as Division Three Champions.

Bookings for the supporters' coaches can be made in Legends before tonight's game. The cost of travel is £14 for members and £15 for non-members and they depart Edgar Street at 9:00am. Members receive their discount when booking in Legends only. Members who book via the main office pay the full rate, but will receive their £1 back on the matchday when boarding the coach, but please remember to bring your membership card.

Oldham Athletic Boundary Park, Oldham OL1 2PA

Boundary Park is located just off the M62 along the A627 (M)spur, but is also within easy reach of the M60, M6, M56, M66 and M67.

From the M62: Leave the motorway at junction 20 (signposted Rochdale, Oldham). Follow A627 (M) towards Oldham and leave motorway at second junction with PC World on your left (signposted A627). The ground is clearly visible from the roundabout.

From the M60: Leave the motorway at junction 21, then

follow signs for Oldham and pass McDonalds on your left. Continue through several sets of traffic lights and go down Broadway before branching left up the slip road just before the start of the A627 (M). Take the third exit at the roundabout for the official car park. Parking is priced at £3 for cars, £5 for minibuses and £10 for coaches/buses.

Following this game we then travel to the Withdean Stadium on Saturday 18th October to take on Brighton & Hove Albion, kick off is at 3:00pm.

Street at 8:30am and the cost of travel is £19 for members and £20 for non-members. The game is all ticket for Bulls supporters and tickets are currently on sale from the main office. 


