



Good evening and welcome back to The County Ground for the first of two important home games this week. Tonight's visitors are Cheltenham Town and I would like to welcome Martin Allen, his Staff, Players, Directors and Supporters along for the game this evening.

Saturday's game up at Tranmere Rovers was a disappointing display from the team and we didn't do enough to take anything from the game.

We needed that bit of quality and it just wasn't there. We didn't create the chances we needed to win the game and we were just not clever enough in and around the box to open them up.

As soon as they went down to ten men we knew they would tighten things up, but we didn't move the ball quickly enough. We kept trying to run up blind alleys rather than using the ball to stretch them out. The goal we conceded was poor and we said to the players after the game that with our squad, we should be going to places like Tranmere Rovers and getting the three points. At the moment we lack that little bit of creativity, that little bit of craft to create the opening that could lead to the vital goal. We were poor in the attacking third and didn't create enough with the possession we had.

This evening we face Cheltenham Town who themselves have been embroiled in a fight against relegation. It has been a difficult season for them, with Martin Allen now looking to steer them to safety. We will respect what Cheltenham do,



but we need to do our jobs and get the result. They will be giving it everything to get the result but we have to try and slam the door shut as firmly as we can before looking to start rising up the league.

Tonight's game will be the biggest test that we have had so far. The players have to respond after Saturday's showing and that was made clear to them after the game at Prenton Park. Now we need to play in a manner where decisions are nice and clear. The players need to be calm and see what options are available to them. We have a game plan and we

have to stick to it – which we didn't do on Saturday.

Tonight is our biggest game of the season so far and we need to go on a run, starting with a home victory this evening. We need two or three wins to get ourselves up the table as soon as possible.

Enjoy the game.







The Carling Cup final took place on Sunday with Manchester United lifting the trophy in front of a capacity crowd at the new Wembley!

2009 marks the 40th Anniversary of the 1969 League Cup final win over Arsenal with a series of celebratory events planned this weekend.

There are further links with the trophy as current Manager Danny Wilson was a part of the Luton Town side which beat Arsenal 3-2.

"The final was a tremendous occasion, even the journey from the hotel to the stadium was unforgettable," Wilson said.

"The fact that it was Luton's first time at Wembley since 1959 meant it was extra-special for the fans. Just looking down Wembley Way and seeing all those flags made the hairs on the back of my neck stand up.

"You don't think you can top that until you walk out onto the pitch.

I had goosebumps on hearing the 'Wembley roar' which comes at you from every direction. The last 10 minutes of the game were crazy. Some finals turn out to be a bit dour, but both sides were going for it, and if I'm honest we couldn't play any other way."


The midfielder made sure his trip to Wembley was extra special with a goal for The Hatters, sparking predictably suitable celebrations.

"All I can remember about my goal was Brian Stein going down the left hand side and his cross being deflected as I made it into the six-yard box. The deflection


seemed to wrongfoot the Arsenal defence, and I reacted quickest, getting my head on the ball to nod it in. Minutes later, of course, Brian Stein scored the winner and it was total pandemonium.

"Our manager Ray Harford was very calm and composed before the game, but once we picked up the cup he let his emotions out. I remember chucking him in the bath and he didn't have a change of clothes!

"We had a lot of fun that night. In fact, I don't think I went home for a week after we won."

Swindon Town were dealt a late penalty blow as Hartlepool United returned North with three vital League One points.



Martin ALLEN

Martin Allen took over as Cheltenham Town manager in September 2008, becoming the club's sixth permanent manager since gaining promotion to the Football League in 1999.

Born in Reading in 1965, Martin began his playing career with Queens Park Rangers, signing professional for them in 1983 and spending six years at Loftus Road. A competitive midfield player who won two caps for the England Under-21 side, he played in the 1986 League Cup Final against Oxford United before a £670,000 move to West Ham United. At West Ham he won two promotions to the top flight in 1991 and 1993.

He stayed with the Hammers until 1995 when he made a £500,000 switch to Portsmouth and had a brief loan spell at Southend United during his three years at Fratton Park.

Martin's coaching career began at Reading, where he was assistant manager to Alan Pardew. His first management job was at Barnet and led the Bees to the brink of the Conference play-offs in 2004 but

was offered the chance to manage Brentford before the end of the season. He enjoyed two successful seasons at Griffin Park, leading Brentford to the League One play-offs in both 2004-05 and 2005-06 and reaching the FA Cup fifth round in both seasons.

In the summer of 2006 he moved to Milton Keynes Dons and once again led his team into an unsuccessful play-off campaign, this time in League Two. A year later Martin was appointed manager of Leicester City in the Championship but left after only four games following a difference of opinion with chairman Milan Mandaric.

After a break from management in which he pursued some scouting and media work, Martin returned to the dugout with Cheltenham and signed a three year contract. He has a long affinity with the club as his father Denis managed the Robins between 1974 and 1979 and Martin spent a large part of his childhood around the Robins back in their Southern League days.

Scott P Brown

A young goalkeeper with a growing reputation who spent his early career

on the books of his hometown club Wolverhampton Wanderers. He left Wolves in 2003 and played briefly in the Welsh Premier League for Welshpool Town before spending six months with Bristol City.

Nicholas Bignall

Moved to Cheltenham Town during the January 2009 transfer window, initially on a one-month emergency loan. He is a striker or winger who has come through the Reading Academy and for two consecutive seasons he was the under 18s' top scorer, notching 11 in 24(+) in 2006/7, then nine in 15(+) appearances in 2007/8.

Lee Ridley

A left-back who was signed at the start of July 2007 on a free transfer from Scunthorpe United. He joined The Iron straight from school as a trainee and made his debut towards the end of the 2000-2001 season. In all he made over 100 first team appearances during a seven year spell as a professional at Glanford Park.

David Bird

A product of the Cheltenham Town Centre of Excellence programme, having joined the Robins from his local club Cinderford Town at the age of 17. Made his senior debut for Cinderford in the Southern League at the age of only 15. He has now made over 160 league starts for the club, either

the centre of midfield or wide on the right.

Shane Duff

A tall, strong central defender who joined Cheltenham Town straight from school and spent a year in the youth team before being offered a professional contract in 2000. After a couple of years in the reserves and a loan spell at non-league Evesham United, Shane was ready to make a the move into first team football.

Drissa Diallo

Defender who joined Cheltenham Town during September 2008, initially on a one month emergency loan period from the MK Dons, which was further extended through to the January 2009 transfer window. He quickly became a popular and integral feature of the club and agreed an 18 month permanent deal with the Robins.

Marley Watkins

Although born in London, Marley Watkins spent much of his early life in Swansea, South Wales and was a Schoolboy player at Swansea City until the age of 16. Released by Swansea in 2007, he was spotted by Cheltenham Town coach Bob Bloomer at the Football League exit trials.

Ian Westlake

Joined Cheltenham Town on a three-month loan from Leeds United in October 2008. The move became a permanent move during the January transfer window, thus keeping him at Whaddon Road until the end of the 08/09 campaign. Has two goals to his name in Robins colours.



Ashley VINCENT

Ashley is a quick forward player who can operate either out wide or as a central striker. He began his career as a Scholarship player at Wolves and spent three years at Molineux, featuring for both the youth team and reserves.

He moved to Cheltenham Town in summer 2004 and gained some first team experience on loan with Aldershot Town before returning to make quite an impact with the Robins during the final stages of that promotion winning campaign.

Sadly Ashley sustained a cruciate ligament injury at the beginning of the 2006/07 season and was forced to miss the campaign in almost its entirety.

Over the course of the 2007-08 season Ashley made 20 first team starts and a similar number of appearances off the bench. Despite favouring a position up front he was generally utilised in a wider position which certainly caused a certain amount of frustrations for the young player.

Nevertheless, his 25 yard strike during the home game against local rivals Swindon Town was certainly one of the high points of last season and he has six goals to his name so far this term.



Gordon Greer has proved such a good find the chaps on Time Team would be hard pushed to do better. Few had heard of the Scotland 'B' international when Danny Wilson announced the loan capture in January, but he's now recognised as one of the most crucial cogs in the machine hoping to steer Town away from the drop. Greer started life at Clyde before joining Blackburn Rovers in 2001. He only made two appearances but his first – in a pre-season friendly – saw him score against Catalan giants Barcelona. Four years at Kilmarnock followed, where Greer teamed up with former Robin Danny Invincibile before he headed south to Donnie's Keepmoat Stadium in 2007. Injuries have curtailed his career in the last two seasons, but a move to The County Ground has invigorated the Scot, not to mention his new teammates and fans. A rock at the back and a commanding presence, Greer will be crucial as we approach 'squeaky bum time'. And if the boss plays his cards right, he'll hopefully secure the big man's services on a more permanent basis. 'Sign him up, sign him up, sign him up'...

You've had a frustrating couple of years with injury, are you happy to be playing regular football again?

It's great to be playing again. When the manager first approached me I jumped at the chance to come to Swindon Town. I really enjoy working with him and the players. He is a very good manager and together with the squad, I've been made to feel very welcome.

What were your first impressions when you joined?


One of the first things I thought was that Swindon had huge potential. It's a top club and it has to stay up and be given the chance to try and push on. I was at Doncaster when they were promoted in 2008 and I see the same professionalism and expectation. Did you seek Mr Invincibile's advice before putting pen to paper?




What have you found to be the main differences playing in the SPL and England's Championship and League One?

League One is a lot more physical than the Scottish Premier League. It's hard to compare the divisions because even though we used to play League One teams in pre-season, they were only pre-season games. Obviously the league up there is smaller, which isn't as good, but you're definitely up against more physical players down here.

You seem to have slotted in seamlessly, are you happy with the way you're playing?

I still feel as though my main job is getting back to full fitness, but it's coming with each game. I'm fairly happy with the way I'm playing and I feel I've settled in well. I'm pleased I've got the chance to play more games until the end of the season and help finish this job. I just want to keep going...

Are you still living out of a suitcase off the pitch?

Yep, I'm living in a hotel at the moment and I was just packing up my things to go to training when you called. It's not great. It can be frustrating; I've got a one-year old daughter and it's hard not being with her, missing all the things she's doing. But I needed to play football again and this is what I had to do. I had to get away [from Doncaster] and start playing regular football again. I'm out of contract in the summer and this is my livelihood, so I had to try and put myself in the shop window. I have a family to support, so it was important that I sort myself out.

Have you been frustrated Swindon haven't been able to win more points in the last six games?

It can be disheartening when you play well and draw games, like we did against Leicester and Millwall, but you can't let it get to you. We have to take heart from the fact that we've been playing well and keep doing what we're doing. As long as we do everything we can... you just can't legislate for late goals like the one scored by Millwall - 'Brez' had no chance - or penalty decisions

like the one we encountered against Hartlepool. The boys have played really well and they've been unlucky [not to win more games]. If we'd have drawn against Hartlepool last week it would have been another point gained and the unbeaten run would have continued, so we just need to make sure we learn lessons from these experiences and try and win the games coming up. We have to try and close games out and take our chances to climb the table.

Tonight's game is the first of several key encounters with teams around us at the bottom, have the players got their eye on games we must win?

I think you have to take each game as it comes, you can't look too far ahead and predict where you can pick up points. You have to be confident and pick up points where possible, but it's no good getting draws away at Leicester and Millwall if we can't beat the sides around us. We need to take the confidence gained from competing with the top sides and show the same kind of character against the others.

Do you feel under any more pressure playing the teams at the bottom?

I don't think there's any added pressure. Obviously when you play the teams at the top the expectation is different, because you're thinking anything you get is a bonus, but I wouldn't say we feel any more burdened when we're expected to win. We just need to make every game count.

We have to pick up points in every match. If we lose the odd game we won't be panicking, it won't mean we're relegated, but each win will help take the pressure off. Obviously a win at Tranmere will ease the pressure [against Cheltenham], but if we haven't won then we just need to focus on our strengths and the job in hand.



A classic encounter

When we were promoted to the Premiership in 1993, a massive five divisions separated us from our visitors this evening. Less than ten years later the two teams competed at the same level, due to the contrasting fortunes of the Town from Cheltenham and that from Swindon.

So to last season, and the two teams had shared the points with a 1-1 draw at Whaddon Road back in August, when an Ashley Vincent goal 18 minutes from time had equalised a Blair Sturrock first half strike.

By the time the two teams met again in February both had made a change in manager. John Ward left Whaddon Road in October to be succeeded by Keith Downing, and Paul Sturrock left Swindon for Plymouth, to be replaced by Maurice Malpas in mid January.

Both new men had tough tasks ahead of them, but with Cheltenham closer to the drop zone, if the pressure weighed more heavily on the shoulders of Downing it wasn't evident at the kick-off.

Inside three minutes Peter Brezovan denied Steve Brooker, then the Slovakian's woodwork was rattled by Andy Gallinagh as the visitors took the game to their hosts.

But with 20 minutes of the game gone it was Simon Cox who celebrated his permanent move to Wiltshire with his first goal since making the full time switch from Reading. A mistake by Alex Russell gave the ball to Jon Paul McGovern whose cross supplied Cox to open the scoring on the night.

Four minutes before the interval

"Four minutes before the interval Billy Paynter, back from suspension, tucked away an Anthony McNamee cross."

Billy Paynter, back from suspension, tucked away an Anthony McNamee cross, then substitute Christian Roberts, on the pitch for just a minute, recorded what was to be his last goal for the club with ten minutes of the match remaining.

Just five more games would see Roberts grace a Town shirt before long-term injury forced the Welshman into a premature retirement.

The match had been an exercise in good finishing and bad defending, with Cox working tirelessly and Paynter settling the nerves with a

flicked header when Cheltenham could still easily have forced their way back into contention.

The three-goal margin may have flattered Swindon, but the result left the Wiltshire Robins five points of the play-offs with two games in hand.

From that 11th place we never moved more than two places in the remaining 16 games of the season and finally finished 13th.

For Cheltenham's part their 18th position was surrendered one place at the season's end, but that was enough to avoid a drop to the basement division once more.





Three second half goals from Connor Essam, Luke Rooney and Jack Payne condemned Town to defeat at Gillingham at a sun-kissed Beechings Cross on Saturday morning.

Paul Bodin's Under 18's had travelled on Friday and stayed overnight, but were dealt a blow 24 hours before the game with Mark Scott and Jordan Record ruled out through injury.

It was Gillingham who soon took control with Essam putting a header wide and Rooney was denied by Town keeper Callum Antell who was out quickly and bravely to block at his feet.

Town then got going forward and not for the first time this season a ball over the top caused

problems. However Lloyd Macklin's low shot struck the legs of Conor Quinn in the Gills goal and Ollie Bartrum put his body on the line in blocking the follow-up from Danny Wallington.

Although Will Evans seemed to have the Swindon rearguard well-marshalled it was stand-in keeper Antell who was forced to make the saves as the Gills looked to make the breakthrough. Dean Rance had a shot tipped over, Rooney had an angled shot touched onto the bar while Tom Murphy's shot on the turn was straight at the keeper.

Seven minutes after the break Gillingham finally took the lead. Initially a Rooney corner was headed down by Liam Wybraniec to Charlie Stimson. As he looked to turn, the ball was hacked away for another corner. This time it was Essam who timed his run perfectly to meet Rooney's corner and the centre-half powerfully headed home.

Sixteen year-old left-back Jack Evans broke into the area but saw his shot saved and Murphy saw

a strike deflected wide before the second goal came in the 69th minute. Evans neat touch set up Josh Sargeant to cross from the left and Rooney thrust himself forward to plant a stooping header wide of the keeper. It was the attacking midfielder's 12th goal of the campaign.

Three minutes later it was all over, bar-the-shouting, when Gillingham added a third with Rooney again involved. This time his ball in from the right-wing fell perfectly for Jack Payne to thump home on the half-volley to register his first goal of the season.

Matt Barnes and Andy Westall went close for the visitors but not as close as Callum Day for the Gills. The substitute met Murphy's cross from the left with a diving header that looked destined for the bottom corner until Antell got across to touch the ball round the post.

The Gills will now face South East Conference title favourites Queens Park Rangers in the Southern Section Final.



AFOOT IN BOTH CAMPS

It has almost been three years since I started following the fortunes of these two teams for the Western Daily Press and in that time I have seen them lock horns four times.

The most memorable clash happened here at the County Ground 18 months ago in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy.

Not that there was anything particularly special about the football served up on a night when Cheltenham came out worthy victors against a shadow Swindon side.

No, it was the events that took place behind the Arkell's Stand as fan frustrations over spiralling debts and the continuing Portuguese consortium shambles reached breaking point. Those angry protests by worried fans provide the abiding memory from the early days of my Swindon watch; a turbulent time where what was going on

in the boardroom continually overshadowed the happenings on the pitch.

No such problems at Whaddon Road - the club with the sensible board noted for running a tight financial ship. The roles are reversed, however, as the two sides prepare to meet this evening. Swindon have since that night back in October 2007 gone from strength-to-strength off-the-pitch with the arrival of Andrew Fitton and his consortium of astute businessmen.

Gone are those days when transfer embargos, late payment of bills and failure to pay players wages on time dominated the Swindon headlines. It is Cheltenham who are now in the news for reasons other than those that occur when players cross the white line.

Martin Allen's side are seemingly destined for League Two after being cut adrift at the bottom of the table and in the last fortnight have confirmed that 'cashflow' problems have led to a brief transfer embargo and saw the players paid a day late. Allen is having to operate without an assistant and has also released goalkeeper coach Alan Fettis due

to the continuing bleak financial outlook.

They have fared little better on the pitch, either. Heavy defeats at the start of the campaign brought Keith Downing's time in charge of team affairs to an end. A move by the board to appoint Allen to follow in the footsteps of his father, who also managed the club in the 1970's, was widely applauded at the time. His reign started well enough with a 2-1 win over West Country rivals Bristol Rovers. A plethora of loan signings and a run of just 3 wins in 24 games since then, however, as Allen has tried to turn the club's ailing fortunes around, has polarised opinion amongst supporters regarding the current manager. Swindon's season has been somewhat less tumultuous. A change in manager has occurred following the departure of Maurice Malpas, but at least Danny Wilson and his side have a good chance of winning their own battle against the drop - even if they are far from safe just yet. How will it go tonight? Well, with an interest in both clubs, I'm going to stick my neck out and go for a draw. Wouldn't expect me to say anything else, would you?





And the manner of some of those defeats doesn't help either. I don't think any Town supporters who were at Whaddon Road on Tuesday 17th September, 2002 are likely to forget it either.

Andy King was a true marmite manager. You loved him or, well you get the idea. He had the potential to be utterly charming in person, and was prone to extreme generosity. He could also be a complete nightmare to deal with if he was in the wrong mood. His biggest problem (although some would say it was his most endearing quality), was that he said whatever was on his mind at the time. He either didn't want to edit out some of the more controversial stuff, or he couldn't. Whichever it was, I think that night at Cheltenham was probably his

lowest point at the club.

The team were utterly rubbish that night. In a season in which they actually played some very good football, they made a poor Cheltenham team look like Brazil (well ok, maybe Costa Rica). "Super" Sammy Parkin was sent off, and Swindon lost 2-0 at a ground where I think everyone was expecting a draw at the very least (and perhaps that was the problem). There was also the small matter of players and fans at each others' throats in the second half after a few choice words in the direction of Andy Gurney. It's difficult to believe Steve Coppell didn't run screaming out of Whaddon Road having seen all that, having only been brought in that day to help out manager Andy King!


And that seems to have set the tone for Swindon in this particular fixture. Too many more performances like that and we might have a real derby on our hands!




Above: A visit to Whaddon Road was in store for Steve Coppell on his first day as assistant to Andy King.






