





















Losing to such a late goal at Elland Road on Saturday was absolutely gutting, but we must now turn our attentions to registering three points against Southend tonight.

Swindon Town took a point from the last home clash against MK Dons, with Billy Paynter scoring his tenth goal of the campaign with Dean Lewington sent off for Di Matteo's promotion-chasing visitors.

Town made two changes for the game with Sean Morrison and Lilian Nalis replacing Jerel Ifil and Jack Smith, who missed the game through injury. Kevin Amankwaah moved to right-back with Nalis partnering Michael Timlin in the heart of the midfield.

The Robins made a bright start to the encounter and created chances throughout, with Simon Cox and Billy Paynter both hitting the woodwork during the course of a pulsating ninety minutes.

Speaking after the game, Manager Danny Wilson was enthused by the performance of his side. "It was a great effort and we certainly created chances, hitting the woodwork and making their keeper work. Unfortunately it was one point, not all three."










Steve TILSON

Having played for Southend United as a player, Steve Tilson rejoined The Blues as director of the club's up-andcoming youth academy; meanwhile his playing career continued to bloom, leading Canvey Island to FA Trophy victory at Villa Park against Forest Green Rovers in May 2001.

His long overdue testimonial was granted in March 2003 with a match against an England XI.

Eight months later he took over as Southend United manager from Steve Wignall and would make an even greater contribution to the club's history. In his first season, he guided the team to its first ever major final, although the LDV Trophy final was lost to Blackpool. The following season the side were again

beaten finalists in the LDV Trophy to Wrexham, but returned to Cardiff for the play-off final against Lincoln City. This time the side triumphed and promotion to League One was achieved. Instead of settling for stability after seven years in the basement, Tilson's men stormed to the League One championship in a tremendous season.

This gave Tilson the unique achievement of consecutive promotions as a player and a manager with the same club. Although the first season back in the Championship ended in relegation, Tilson once again made history for the club by masterminding their greatest ever victory, against Manchester United in the Carling Cup.

Lee Barnard





A small part of me still things I have some unfinished business at Swindon because I never really got an extended run in the side. That's football.

You have been back to Swindon a few times haven't you...

I came back with Notts County twice and got beaten quite heavily, so we won't talk about those ones! Last season I came back with Yeovil and we managed to win one nil in front of the Sky Sports cameras so that was a bit more memorable.


What sort of game are you expecting?

How do you feel you've played so far?



Striker Dougie Freedman is a very consistent player when it comes to scoring goals. He's come back from injury and will be a threat for them.









Final Score: Swindon Town 6 Southend United 1

October 22nd 2002 LDV Vans Trophy 1st round The County Ground.

A first round LDV Vans Trophy match rarely produces a game with great consequence, but when Southend visited The County Ground in October 2002 Town's manager was under some pressure. As they so often have been.

Having started the Division Two season with a 3-1 opening day win over Barnsley compliments of a debut-making Sam Parkin hat trick, a win at Chesterfield gave Town maximum points after two games. But by the time The Shrimpers came to town on Tuesday 22nd October, we had taken just five points from the next 24.

Not unexpectedly for a club with just one win in twelve attempts, we sat in the bottom four and in danger of the drop to the basement division.

And it was in Division Three that our visitors were competing, and somewhat more successfully than we were managing. Fourteen games into the season, ex-Bristol City man Rob Newman's side sat eighth, having twice managed three consecutive wins, and a promotion push looked on the cards.

After ten minutes Town's Jonnie Jackson, a loan signing from Tottenham, opened the scoring, but midway through the first period, veteran striker Graeme Jones struck an equaliser past Bart Griemink for Southend.

Twenty minutes before halftime another loan man, this one winger Jimmy Davis from Manchester United, restored our lead and when Matt Heywood made it 3-1 just before the break the breathing space produced some relieved sighs in the Town stands.

And nowhere more so than at the back of the Arkells Stand hospitality area, where manager Andy King regularly chose to watch matches.

The press had been rife with rumour that King was about to be replaced at the Swindon helm, and the appearances of Colin Calderwood and Stuart Pearce at recent County Ground matches had stoked the fire at the rumour mill.

But it was reported that former Manchester City, Barnsley and Bournemouth manager Mel Machin had been offered the chance to take the helm at The County Ground, and it was his procrastination that had seen King still in charge on the evening.

Four minutes into the second half Danny Invincibile increased Town's lead, and as supporters started to head home, both Stefani Miglioranzi and Sam Parkin hit goals to take the final score to 6-1 to Town.

Andy King's future continued to be the subject of speculation, but as the days passed and Machin failed to be installed in the manager's office, Town launched into an eight match unbeaten run and the pressure slowly eased on the boss. By the end of the season, Town had recovered to finished tenth and King had survived.

For Southend, the loss came midsequence of a run of five defeats in succession. The Shrimpers fell below mid table by the month's end and never recovered, losing ten of the last 13 and finally finished 17th in Division Three.





Southend will be tough opposition, but we must get on the victory trail sooner rather than later...



Are you looking forward to your home debut?



Life on the mic

How on earth do you become a football commentator? It's a question I'm often asked and I've never really come up with a good answer for.

Some people have wanted to do it since they were old enough to understand the offside rule. But for most commentators, including myself, it's just something you fall into doing.


I got to thinking about this when I started preparations for today's game against Southend, and it's all to do with hospital radio. Just bear with me, it will make sense in a minute (hopefully).

Hospital radio is one of the most common ways of getting into commentating full time, because it's the only chance most people get to do it. There's someone broadcasting to the local infirmary at games up and down the country every Saturday, and generally they do a great job. The only real commentary on Swindon's 1969 League Cup victory came from hospital radio. I'm telling you all this because I just want to be clear that I think they do a great job and provide enjoyment (and despair) to patients throughout England.

But, and you knew there was one coming; they can sometimes cause a problem or two. Take Southend for instance. The commentary box at Roots Hall is at the back of the directors' box, and is behind glass (and I've never worked out whether the glass is there for the benefit of the reporters, or to stop us annoying the great and the good of Essex with our commentary - but I have my suspicions!). In the radio box there's usually two BBC local radio stations, an independent station, sometimes a reporter from 5live and hospital radio.

As you'd imagine it can get a bit noisy with all those people talking in a confined space at the same time, but normally it's fine. On our last couple of visits to Roots Hall though, the noise level seems to have increased a bit. Now I've never properly met the guys who do the hospital radio there, because I'm usually busy and they turn up quite close to kick-off, but I'm prepared to guess that they're a bit excitable.

Swindon's last two trips there have ended with late goals condemning Swindon to defeat, so naturally you'd expect them to be pretty happy with life. But when the goals went in I thought Southend had somehow managed to claim promotion, the Champions League and the World Cup all at the same time. I could barely hear myself think and listening back to the recording of the game, you can barely hear me either. Which some people would say, is no bad thing!

a game. Those points would have put us currently in twelfth position in the table. It is very frustrating for you the fans probably now more than our management team.


