

At the back Gordon Greer has made a big impact and we would be foolish not to consider keeping him here beyond the season, but it is probably too early to be looking at that just yet with the games we have coming up. We will carry on as we are because his leadership has really helped the side. The defenders have benefited from playing alongside him, with Sean Morrison a prime example of that. Sean was fantastic the other night against Southend and we also have the likes of Kevin Amankwaah and

Jamie Vincent doing well at the back.

Hereford United will come here this afternoon looking for the points. Graham Turner's sides are always difficult to face but this game is tremendously important. Hereford have some good players with a few having come in on loan and they can turn a game. If we approach the game with any complacency then we will be punished. If we can emulate what we did the other night against Southend then we shouldn't be far off.



League One is still extremely tight and anyone can beat anyone.





He returned to his hometown club Hereford United in March 1987. Billy still lives in Swindon, working in Old Town.



Swindon Town 2 Oxford United 1

League One January 28, 1992

For Town's two goalscorers, their stories couldn't be any more polarised. David Kerslake bagged his first goal in 109 games after joining the club in December 1989, while Duncan Shearer – who made the game safe in front of the Town End despite Oxford pulling one back late on – netted his 27th of the season, equalling his record total in Swindon's red.

Oxford United 2 Swindon Town 4

League Division 2 (old) September 22,1990

Dave Bennett joined Town from Sheffield Wednesday to bolster our attack, but Fraser Digby was Town's busiest player, twice picking the ball out of the net at the other end after Dave Penney and Martin Foyle gifted the home side an early lead. Fitzroy Simpson pulled one back when he scored from the edge of the area following a quick free kick, while Steve Foley levelled when he bundled home following Paul Key's fumble.

Duncan Shearer rounded the keeper to give Town the lead in the second half before adding the icing on the cake, the Big Scot ramming home after Fitzroy Simpson's initial cross had been blocked.

Swindon Town 3 Oxford United 0

League Division 2 (Old) May 2 1989

Town fans may have protested against the potential use of ID cards before the game, but we weren't complaining about Town's performance. Once Digby had blocked a Foyle effort from close range the Reds went on the offensive, culminating in Alan McLoughlin's first ever goal for the club. Foyle missed a point-blank header in the second half and Ross McLaren made the profligate striker pay, converting from the spot after David Kerslake's cross was



handled. Colin Calderwood added a third from Paul Bodin's corner to equal Town's biggest winning margin of the campaign.

Swindon Town 4 Oxford United 0

League Division 2 (old) February 26, 1972

Fred Ford was sacked in early
November with Town struggling
at the wrong end of the table, and
Dave Mackay was entrusted with
turning Town's season around.
And while there weren't quite as
many fans in attendance for this
game compared to Town's 2-0 FA Cup
defeat at the hands of Arsenal in January,
where there was 32,000, the 14,743 that
did turn up were cheered by this emphatic
4-0 rout. Arthur Horsfield got a hat-trick – a
quarter of his season total – before John
Trollope grabbed the other.




It was close, but not close enough as Town went down to a narrow defeat at Elland Road last weekend.







Graham TURNER

Graham is currently the majority shareholder and manager of Hereford United and is unofficially the third longest serving manager of a club in the Football League although if his absence from the job during much of the 2001-02 season is taken into account, he would be 14th in the list.

He was appointed manager of Division Three side Hereford United for the 1995-96 season, another club with a precarious financial situation. In his third season as manager he bought the controlling shares in the club, taking on a large debt and saving the club from going under. With the bank balance firmly in the red he had to endure several fruitless seasons in the Conference and had to sell key players to keep the club in business. Indeed in his first eleven seasons at the club he made only one purchase for £20,000.

After a poor start to the 2001-02 season he decided to step down from his managerial role to concentrate on securing the club's financial future. When Hereford finished 17th at the

end of the season, Turner handed in his resignation to the board.

After several discussions with the board he again decided to remain at the club. He took the opportunity to build a new squad, retaining only six from the previous season. The team, consisting of players signed on free transfers, evolved arguably into the best footballing side in the Conference achieving three consecutive 2nd places. Unfortunately Hereford failed to progress in the play-offs in 2004 and 2005 but in the 2005-06 season it was third time lucky as Hereford defeated Halifax 3-2 to secure promotion to the Football League.

After a first season spent adjusting to life in the Football League, in which the Bulls finished 16th, Graham Turner then pulled together a squad which secured automatic promotion into League 1 in the 2007/2008 season. Graham was recognised for his achievements, with such a small budget, winning the League Managers' Association, League 2 Manager of the Season Award.


polished performance from The Robins.






It's February 1987. Coventry City are on course to win the FA Cup for the first time, Ron Atkinson has just made way for Alex Ferguson at Old Trafford, English clubs are banned from Europe and away fans are banned at Luton. And today's two teams took to the County Ground pitch to contest the Southern area Quarter Final of the Freight Rover Trophy.

The competition that is now known as the Johnstone's Paint Trophy had begun life as the Associate Member's Cup and has had more name changes than Elizabeth Taylor, but everyone agrees that it is the best chance for a club of our size to get to Wembley and interest seems to grow as each round progresses.

In 1987 Third Division Town had triumphed in a regional round robin that involved Leyton Orient and Brentford, and then gone on to a penalties win over Bournemouth in the knockout stage. The Bulls meanwhile had eliminated Newport County and Port Vale, before claiming a 1-0 victory at Molineux to eliminate fellow Fourth Division Wolves.

So to The County Ground, and former Derby County apprentice, midfielder Steve Spooner opened the scoring for the visitors with less than ten minutes on the watch, before future Swindon boss Jim Quinn drew the teams level in the 18th minute.

Then 12 minutes before half time, Peter Coyne gave us the lead to take Lou Macari's side into the

break the happier of the two.

Steve White increased the margin on 56 minutes, but when ex-Reading and Oxford striker Ollie Kearns reduced the deficit with 13 minutes to go there might have been some anxious glances between Town supporters.

Finally giant striker Dave Bamber settled the nerves in the last minute to give us a 4-2 win. His reward was to be immediately replaced by one time England youth international midfielder Jamie Reynolds.

Over 5,700 watched the match. The feel-good factor was short lived as Town crashed out at home to Aldershot in the area semi-final, having taken a two goal lead but allowing it to slip through their fingers after the dismissal of goalkeeper Fraser Digby.

At the end of the campaign we used the first year of the play-offs to claim successive promotions. Hereford finished 16th in Division Four.

In the Freight Rover final, Mansfield Town went on to defeat Bristol City on penalties after playing out a 1-1 draw.

Chalkie White moved on to Hereford on a free transfer in August 1994, scoring more than 50 times before being allowed to leave for Cardiff two season later.

But in between he returned to Swindon in the same tournament, by then called the Autowindscreen Shield, and the 37 year old plundered the only goal of the game to send Hereford through to the quarter-finals once more.

It was a calm display from







Avoiding the drop?

It's not often that I hope this column is out of date by the time you read it, but I certainly wouldn't mind this one being wrong.

As I write this, Swindon Town are in the League I relegation zone. They have another two games to do something about that before you'll be reading this, but there has to be a pretty good possibility that they'll still be there as they start today's game with Hereford.


How has it come to this? A handful of games to salvage what's left of perhaps the most frustrating season I've seen from Swindon in my 8 years covering the club. Normally I'm not that much of a statto (honest), but the reason the team is down in the depths of League 1 isn't difficult to see. Even compared with the Town team relegated in 2006, this season's defensive record is shambolic. With 11 games still to play this season, Swindon have already conceded almost as many goals(59) as they did three years ago (65).

Given that Town finished second bottom in 2006; the fact they're almost certain to concede more goals than they did then doesn't bode particularly well. So what's gone wrong at the back? For me, it's basic individual errors, lack of organisation, confidence and, yes, bad luck.

It's too simple to point the finger at one particular person or reason, but the fact that three different managers have tried, and largely failed; to stem the flow of goals tells me that changes in personnel are needed. Lack of concentration has cost Swindon far too many times, and that needs to change. It's not going to happen before the end of the season, but for next year – whatever division the team are innew faces are badly needed. Keeping Gordon Greer at The County Ground would be a good start.

The good news (at least compared to 2006) is that at least this team has a goal or two in it. They've already scored more (50) than they did during the relegation season (46) with 11 to play. Simon Cox is obviously the main reason for this, and it makes you wonder what might have happened had Rory Fallon stayed at The County Ground instead of leaving for Swansea.

Looking at the squad which got relegated last time, there were good players in there, but it didn't work as a team. Jamie Cureton was sold for £700,000 by Colchester after his miserable season at Swindon and Sean O'Hanlon could well be playing Championship football with MK Dons next season. But they didn't gel as a team under an inexperienced manager, and that's why they went down. Danny Wilson certainly has plenty of experience and that's largely why I'm still hopeful Swindon can avoid the same fate this season. But time is running out.

From the tackle Bodin picked up an ankle injury and had to be replaced by Matt Barnes. Danny Wallington also picked up an ankle injury and he too had to leave the field with ten minutes remaining to be replaced by Jordan Record.

Lloyd Macklin wrapped up the points five minutes from time. He picked the ball up deep inside his own half and sprinted clear through the home defence to finish from 10 yards passed the hapless Exeter Keeper to make it 2-0.

WEMBLEY WAY...

Recently some of the Junior Robins had a tour around Wembley Stadium. We had a great day. The tour guide was really good, telling us lots of different facts about the stadium and showing us all around, inside and out. Although it was great seeing behind the scenes of our national arena I think we were all blown away about how fantastic it was to come out into the stands and see how huge the stadium was. It can hold 90,000 people, and there are 2,618 toilets! The pitch is in the same place as before when the old Wembley was there, but the pitch is 4metres lower than the original.







A WEEKEND TO REMEMBER


The 1969 celebration weekend was organised superbly and the Sunday evening do was one of the best I have been to.


