

It's certainly no exaggeration to say I have a number of spinning plates in the air so we will have to see which one drops first.


So it's onwards and hopefully upwards but we do need your support. I thought there was a great atmosphere at Huish Park last week and I hope we can generate the same enthusiasm today.


So please get behind the lads and let's hope for three points and my first real win as Yeovil manager.



TERRY BRINGS IN MORE LOAN SIGNINGS

WITH the closure of the loan transfer window on Thursday, Yeovil manager Terry Skiverton was again busy this week.

First of the latest new signings, who arrived on Wednesday, was midfielder Danny Maguire from Queens Park Rangers.

Nineteen-year-old Maguire has come through the ranks at Rangers and has been at the club since he was eight years old.

During his time at the club he began to be noticed during his time in the youth side and last season was appointed captain of the Under-18s side.

Noted for the strength of his passing and reading of the game Maguire was offered his first professional contract at the end of last season.

Also in on loan is midfielder David Noble who was brought in from Bristol City after some more help from former manager Gary Johnson.

A former Arsenal trainee Noble signed for City from Boston United in January 2006. He has also had spells on loan with West Ham and Watford.

Noble has made 64 appearances for City to date scoring eight goals in the process.

Both players will be in the squad for today's big match with local rivals Swindon Town.

Everyone at the club would like to wish Danny and David all the very best during their stay at Huish Park.

FORMER Yeovil Town striker Giuliano Grazioli has been forced to retire from the game after being diagnosed with a serious eye condition.

A build up of pressure behind the eye has led to specialists advising the Finchley-born striker to give up or face losing his eyesight.

Giuliano joined Yeovil on loan from Peterborough in November 1995 and the next three months saw him achieve legendary status with a prolific spell.

In thirteen appearances, he scored sixteen goals including six doubles and formed a lethal partnership with Warren Patmore. Their goals helped Yeovil to fourth place in their first season in the ICIS League after relegation.

The striker was prolific everywhere he played. He once hit five in a game for Peterborough and scored 114 goals in 212 games for Barnet

He will remain at Ryman League Dover, his last club, and will do some scouting and coaching for them. Everyone at Yeovil Town would like to wish Giuliano the very best for the future.

YEOVIL Town Reserves were narrowly defeated 2-1 in their recent fixture with Plymouth Argyle at Somerton.

Consisting largely of players from the Under-18s side, the Glovers went on to take the lead after just eleven minutes when Lloyd Moyce's cross was converted by Adam Wakley.

Argyle reacted well to the early set back though and hit back with two first half goals.


The second half was end-to-end stuff and the Glovers were perhaps unlucky not to get an equalising goal but the away side managed to hold on to claim the win.

"When Gary Johnson arrived, he took things to a new, more professional level and I began to do checkups and treatment for all the squad."


Don was born in Lanark, near Glasgow, in the same hospital as former Yeovil Town physio Jim Joyce.


"I was due to leave the RAF and saw the position for the practice in Yeovil. I rang them but they were looking for someone more immediately. Twelve months later, I came down anyway and the rest is history."

CHRIS Weale may have returned to League 1 on loan but the Yeovil-born goalkeeper still has his heart set on playing in the Premier League.

Weale left Huish Park nearly three years ago to link up with former Town boss Gary Johnson at Bristol City.


He moved while still recovering from a serious knee injury, an injury which ended hopes of a move to West Ham.



And despite suffering a frustrating time at Ashton Gate so far, the 27-year-old is still aiming for the top.

He said: "Looking back to when I left, I'd done my cruciate and ideally I'd have wanted to leave Yeovil having signed a million-pound deal some

where to play in the Premier League at the age of 23 or 24.

"That didn't happen, I got the injury and I was out of contract. Gary Johnson at Bristol City gave me a very good offer that I couldn't really refuse.

"It was a club going somewhere, I knew Gary and I knew he got the best out of his players. I couldn't turn it down.

Sad

"I was sad to leave Yeovil but I felt that maybe the club had gone as far as it could at that time so it was the right time.

"I love the club and I'm very passionate about it having supported Yeovil since I was a young lad.

"The first game I saw was at the old ground and it was always an ambition of mine to play in the first team, which I did.

"But I've got ambitions and goals I want to achieve so I felt I had to leave in order to progress towards them.

"Over the last couple of years things haven't gone as well as I'd have hoped but fingers crossed that will change soon.

"I was close to going to West Ham at one point before the injury and you do hear things, but that's all in the past.

ABOUT IT HAVING SUPPORTED YEOVIL SINCE I WAS A YOUNG LAD

"I just want to focus on now. I know I've got the ability to get to where I want to get to and it's just a matter of time in my opinion.

"I'm 27 now but keepers don't reach their best until their early 30s and I've coped well with the setbacks I've had."

Weale has suffered a number of injuries while at City and his opportunities have also been limited by the excellent form of Adriano Basso.

Rapatitad

But he still feels the move up the A37 has benefited his career and intends to make his mark in the City first team after completing his loan spell with the Glovers.

He added: "I have had a few injuries and I slipped a disc in my back while I was training and twisted my pelvis as well, so that wasn't good.

"Then I broke my thumb and hurt my wrist as well. I was frustrated at not playing and maybe sometimes you do too much.

"I've tried to ease back but you try to train hard to improve and make sure you're ready when called upon and maybe I've pushed it too much in the past.

"But I need to be playing games and I believe I'm a number one goalkeeper. There's number ones and number twos and I believe I'm a number one because of the way I approach every day really.

"I've had my injuries but they're in the past and I'm looking after myself a lot better now and listening to my body and mind more.

"Once you get a grasp of that, life becomes a lot easier so I'm getting there.

"I've become a better player and a better person for having moved and I love Bristol as a city. On a personal level it's been fantastic for me and my girlfriend.

"Professionally it hasn't gone as well as I'd liked it to, but you never know with football and a change in fortune could be just around the corner.

Stronger

"You can't have success all the time. I think if you have failure it makes you a better person. Through adversity you become stronger.

"I've been positive over the last three years. I've had injuries but I've bounced back every time and I believe I've been a better goalkeeper every time I've come back. That will hopefully show on the pitch."

Weale has returned to a Yeovil Town

squad with few players left from his spell with the club.

And he finds two of his former team-mates - Terry Skiverton and Nathan Jones - installed as the management team.

He added: "The club hasn't changed much. The playing staff has but the other staff haven't and it's been great to see everyone again.

"The manager is very relaxed, very himself and a very good person to get on with.

Inspirational

"He was an inspirational character when I was here before and he's a very inspirational person now. I've been impressed with both of the management team. They are very positive people, similar to myself.

"The manager is trying to get the right people in to create a better, positive atmosphere around the club.

"We started in the Conference and worked so hard to force our way up into the position the club's in at the moment.

"I am passionate and I want to keep the club in League 1. I don't want to get too passionate because that can affect performances and there's only so much a keeper can do but I'm desperate to help Yeovil stay up."

UNDER-fire Carlisle United manager Greg Abbott has won a vote of confidence in the Brunton Park boardroom.

The Cumbrians' chief executive David Allen has urged supporters to get behind the team after they slipped to just three points above the League 1 relegation zone with a 2-1 home defeat to fellow strugglers Hereford United on Tuesday night.

Fans turned on the team after the midweek defeat which left them without a victory since the start of March and there could be further demonstrations at today's home match with Northampton Town.

He said: "When players put the ball over the bar from four yards with their keeper nowhere near and people miss headers unmarked at the far post — how can I explain that?"

Northampton boss Stuart Gray branded his side's defending "sloppy" as they sunk to a 4-3 defeat against Swindon Town in the week.

The Cobblers, who visit Huish Park on Tuesday, went ahead inside three minutes through Adebayo Akinfenwa then leaking three goals before halt-time.

Gray said: "The really disappointing thing is the way the goals were conceded. It was poor all round."

Roberto Di Matteo, manager of MK Dons, was also furious at his backline after seeing them ship two goals in the second half to gift Crewe Alexandra a 2-2 draw at stadium:mk on Tuesday.

He fumed: "It was five minutes of madness that cost us two points."

The Italian reacted by bringing in Irish midfielder Stephen Gleeson on loan from Championship side

HOW DID YOU BECOME A SWINDON FAN?

I MOVED to Swindon in 1987 with my job. Up until then I had been an 'armchair' fan of Tottenham, but was really just a football fan.

The first time I saw Swindon was at Upton Park against West Ham, which was also my first ever live game.

From 1988-1994 I only missed a handful of home games, but then my job took me all over the country and that, together with financial constraints, limited the number of games I attended.

I started going regularly again about five years ago and haven't missed a game this season.

WHAT HAS BEEN YOUR BEST MEMORY OF THEM?

DEFINITELY the football we played under Ossie Ardiles and Glenn Hoddle.

The two play-off finals at Wembley were special, as were the semis, particularly the two against Blackburn Rovers in 1990.

We won 2-1 at Ewood Park in the first leg, then took them back to The County Ground and won by the same margin.

Taking my son (then aged four) to see Swindon's last game in the Premier League was also special.

AND THE WORST?

BEING demoted by two divisions, after winning promotion at Wembley in 1990 was a hard pill to stornach, as was Hoddle's resignation after we finally secured promotion to the top flight in 1993.

More recently it has been the relegation to League 2 in 2006, made more miserable by the fact it was sealed away at Bristol City.

The financial problems that the club endured up until recently, with

the possibility of the club ceasing to exist, is without doubt the worst.

WHO HAS IMPRESSED YOU THIS SEASON, TEAM-WISE AND PLAYER-WISE?

FABIAN Delph at Leeds has been head and shoulders above any other player I've seen this season.

Team-wise it's difficult to say as Swindon usually play very well against the decent sides and struggle against those in the bottom half.

Huddersfield played some nice football. Obviously Leicester have been very strong all season.

WHO SHOULD YEOVIL BE WARY OF THIS AFTER-NOON?

SIMON Cox is always dangerous and, on their day, Anthony McNamee and Hal Robson-Kanu can be potent threats down the wings.

Our most improved player this season is, for me, Kevin Amank-waah. Yeovil fans don't need me to tell them what he's capable of!

WHICH FOUR TEAMS WILL BE RELEGATED THIS SEASON?

OBVIOUSLY I won't say Swindon! Cheltenham, Hereford, Brighton and one from Yeovil, Northampton, Orient and Crewe.

IS THERE ANY MAJOR DIFFERENCE NOW THE MONEY TROUBLES SEEM TO HAVE GONE?

OFF the pitch we've definitely seen improvements. The whole set up appears much more professional and the new board is committed to making the club a profitable business.

Andrew Fitton comes across as a man with a desire to take the club as far as he can, within the boundaries of sensible financial management. That, to me, is the blue print all football clubs should adhere to.

On the pitch it's not been smooth sailing. The previous manager, Maurice Malpas, wasn't as successful as most of us hoped.

Danny Wilson has come in and had to change things considerably. After a slow start with him in charge the team is finally getting the results and, hopefully, will pull away from the relegation zone.

These seasons have been made all that more memorable by an eventful climax to the season - something that is facing thousands of fans across the country.


If ever clubs needed a 12th man in the support of their followers then this is the time.





Harry Montacute had another strong game in midfield for the Glovers with Ashley Clarke and Tom Scott working tirelessly.


The win lifts Yeovil up to seventh and if they can continue their good form they could finish the season in the top four. The young Glovers' next match is away to Oxford United.





"I am also pleased to hear that the community came out of their houses to help. I would like to thank the team for all their hard work and determination to get this done."





THE world's most famous cup giant-killers Yeovil Town came close to pulling off the biggest upset of their illustrious history when they lost two-nil to Premiership giants Liverpool.

Goals from substitute Emile Heskey and a hotly-disputed penalty from Danny Murphy saw Gerard Houllier's men through in a game where they looked lost for large spells of the game.

Houllier came into the game under pressure. Just a solitary win in their last five games had seen the media and the fans begin to turn against him. This tie came in between trips to Manchester City and Chelsea and was an irritation to the studious Frenchman.

He went into the game without his England stars Steve Gerrard and Michael Owen who were injured but his team could boast internationals everywhere you looked and he could afford to keep £11 million striker Emile Heskey on the bench.

Home manager Gary Johnson had seen his team suffer two successive defeats after an eight-match unbeaten run but hopes were still high for a competitive game.

Fog swirled around Huish Park as the game got under way. No Yeovil fan could have dreamt the way it started as Darren Way and Nick Crittenden combined down the left to send in a teasing cross that stretched keeper Jerzy Dudek quite literally, the Pole requiring treatment from the physio.


Perfectly

'Pool striker Florent Sinama-Pongolle set himself up for a chance that never came thanks to a perfectly timed tackle from Crittenden.

Critts' running was causing the visitors defence no end of problems and it was he and Lee Johnson who were starring as Yeovil ran the game.

On eighteen minutes came a move that was breathtaking in its execution. The one-touch passing down the right hand side, all one-touch and fancy flicks, was stunning; unfortunately at the end of it the ball wouldn't come down for Darren Way and he fired high and wide.

Keeper Chris Weale saved well from Vladimir Smicer and then came Yeovil's best chance. A Yeovil corner fell to Gavin Williams just outside the




box and he caught it perfectly, the ball arrowing towards the top corner before Dudek saved brilliantly. From the resultant corner, Colin Pluck got in on the act and saw his far post chance denied by the Liverpool defence.

Things had to calm down, calm down a little and they did so. Paul Terry was injured in a poor tackle by Jon-Arne Riise and though he struggled manfully to carry on, he retired six minutes later replaced by Andy Lindegaard.

El-Hadji Diouf, the Senegalese striker, collapsed in the box and was booked for his troubles. The last chance of the half fell to Diouf who shot wide when set up by Harry Kewell.

After the break, Yeovil continued to press forward but with less success than in the first half. Kevin Gall had a chance early on but saw his shot blocked.



The game turned on fifty minutes when the ineffective Sinama-Pongolle was replaced by Emile Heskey who had a chance almost immediately, Chris Weale saving well.

This spurred Liverpool on and Diouf and Riise both could have scored but didn't. With twenty minutes left, the opening goal finally came.

Smart

The burly Heskey turned his marker on the edge on the box and fired low into the net with a smart finish. The visitors had come into the match more but it was still a harsh lesson for the Glovers.

It was game, set and match eight minutes later. Man-of-the-match Hugo Rodrigues challenged Kewell for the ball on the edge of the penalty area, Kewell went down and it was a penalty.

A cruel twist for the likeable

Portuguese who had been quality all game. Danny Murphy slotted home comfortably for 2-0 and the tie was over.

The rest of the game slipped quietly away with half-chances for Kirk Jackson and Terry Skiverton but it wasn't to be.

As the final whistle went, the record crowd of 9,348, many of who had queued for twelve hours to get their tickets, had seen their heroes give everything but come up short.

Houllier lived to fight another day and Yeovil could concentrate on their promotion charge up League 2.





"I am now in four or more times a week, with Josh, young Lloyd Irish and now Wealey again and it's fantastic to see them progressing."


