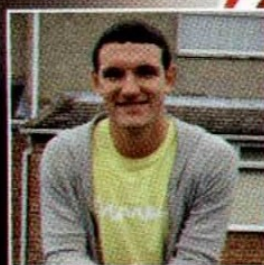

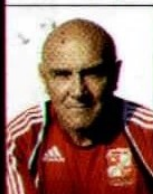

Good afternoon and welcome back to The County Ground for this League One fixture. Today I would like to welcome Kenny Jackett, his staff, players, directors and supporters along for the game.

On Tuesday night we made it through to the Area Quarter-Finals of the Johnstone's Paint Trophy with a victory over Exeter City. We fully deserved to go through but we got caught up in the final twenty minutes and didn't take charge of the game as we should have done. The unbeaten run has come about through hard work from the players. Hopefully the team performances will get better as we go along because there is a long way to go. We are not playing anywhere near our maximum and I hope things will improve as the season goes on. The key areas are Christmas and Easter, because that's when things get tough. We are very realistic in our outlook – we are not sitting in the top six and thinking everything is done and dusted. We have to keep pushing on.

Millwall are in Town today and it should be a great game. We have had them watched several times and they will be a side who should come here and play football. They are a side who haven't had the best away record but they set themselves up very well on the road and have been quite unlucky in some cases. They will try and win the game and it should be an entertaining game.

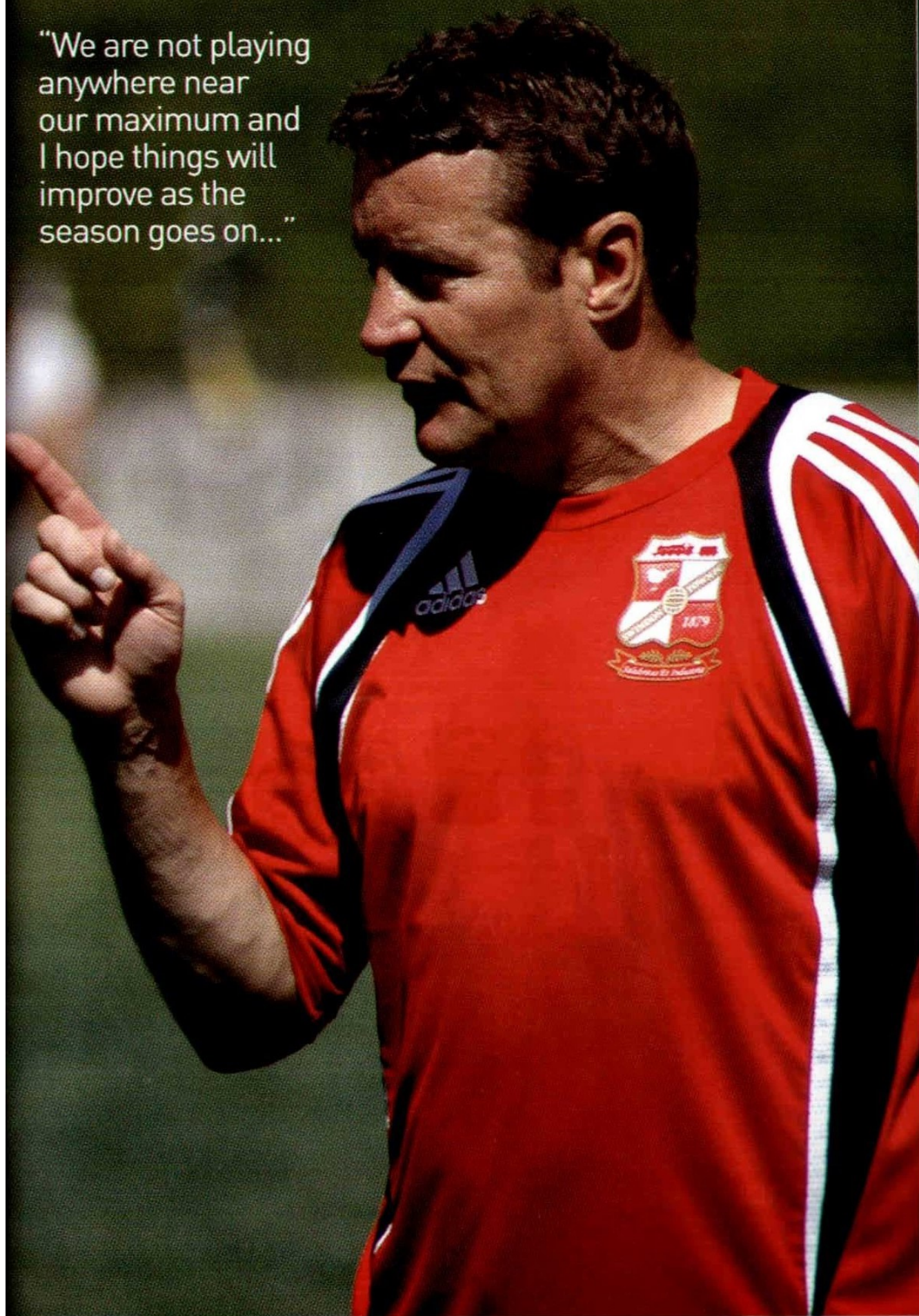
Ian Wilmer, Swindon asked:

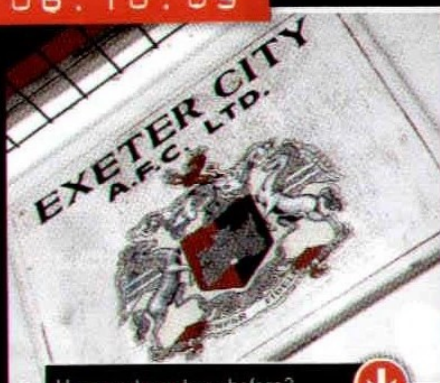

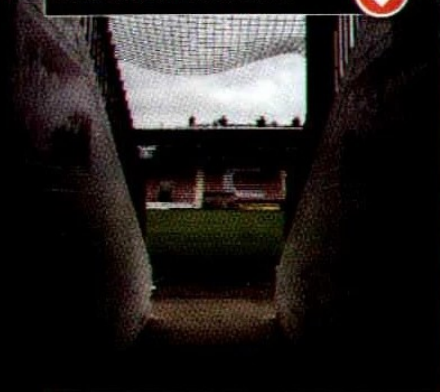

Exeter proved the destination for the second time inside seven days, following the 1-1 League One draw on Tuesday 29th September. 189 fans made the trip to back the Reds with the official matchday programme taking a look behind the scenes on the night.

Phil Smith was the Town hero on the night as he saved two penalties in the shoot-out and his final save from substitute Stuart Fleetwood was enough to secure the win. Danny Wilson's men should have made sure of the tie in normal time, with Anthony McNamee's lofted cross catching home stopper Andy Marriott unawares to give Town the lead. Further chances followed with Jon-Paul McGovern, Jonathan Douglas and Ben Hutchinson all going close before substitute Lee Peacock spurned a one on one late on. The home side scored a late leveller against The Robins for the second time inside a week, with Fleetwood lifting the ball over Smith to send the game to penalties. 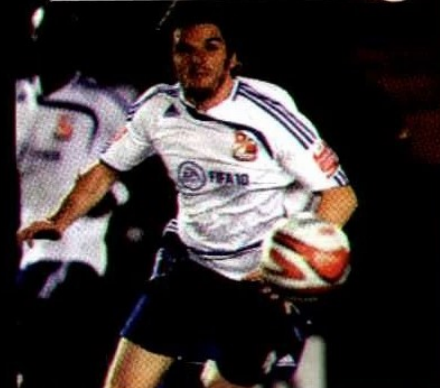

PAUL: I'd say so, especially when you consider the slip-up we had on the first day. You would never have thought we'd be where we are after that performance!

MARTYN: Some are saying it was the best thing that could have happened to us; it was definitely the best thing that could have happened to Gillingham.

TONY: I think that game brought everyone, players and fans, back to their senses. There was a sense

of optimism before the season. We were good in pre-season, too. Maybe there was a sense that the players thought they were better than they are, I don't know. It was a real come down to earth, but you can't fault how they've reacted.

MARTYN: You have to take into

consideration that it can be hard playing teams on a high from their promotion. That, and they hate us as well!

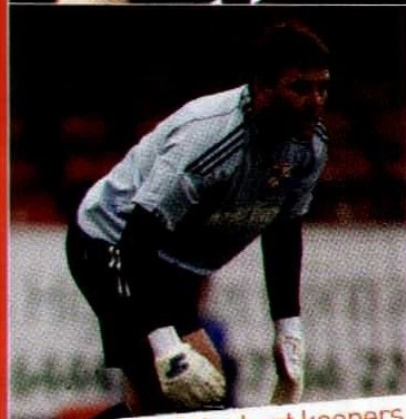
Q Before Brentford there was a sense of frustration that we had drawn too many games. Last season we would have lost those matches: is that an indication of how far we've come this year?

PAUL: I think so. Last season I never felt that confident going into a game in terms of getting a win. Drawing against Wycombe and Exeter, I thought it was a case of

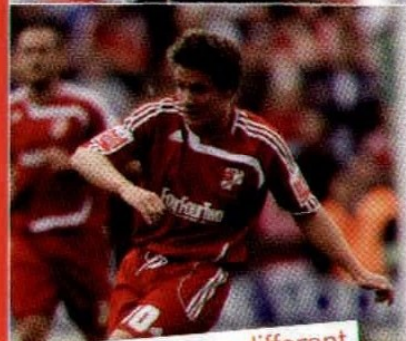
same old Swindon, but maybe the Brentford game is a turning point? The difference is we're drawing games we would have lost last year. If we can be a bit more ruthless, then who knows? This year we're a goal down and you're confident we can get something out of it, which is a vast improvement.

TONY: We're more difficult to beat at home especially. We've been saying that we'd be surprised if Swindon lost more than two at home, because we look so solid.

MARTYN: It also helps that we've got two centre-halves in great form

in Scott Cuthbert and Gordon Greer.

PAUL: We've got superb defensive midfielders as well, and it's such a great help to have that backbone in front of the goal. Even David Lucas in goal, we were nervous when he went down injured during the warm up against Colchester, we were thinking it was a case of Peter Brezovan all over again and a long lay off! He has such a commanding presence, it's great to see and would have been a nightmare if he had been out for any length of time, but Smith did well at short notice.

TONY: I think Lucas is one of the best keepers we've had in a long time. It's one of the best defences we've had in a long time.

Q So who has impressed you most, and what have been your highlights of the season so far?

PAUL: I think the midfield as a whole... they seem to have more time and space. I rarely feel that they're looking to get rid of it as soon as possible; they're always looking for that next pass. I just think we have leaders in every area, which isn't something we've had for some time. The only problem area was the attack, and even they did well at Brentford...

TONY: I'm just enjoying the style of football we're playing. We look tighter as a team, Gillingham aside. We just need to keep it going for the last 20 minutes. Even the games we're drawing, we're playing really, really well. I've not left many games feeling too disappointed so far, which is a change!

PAUL: We're a bigger team now as well. I noticed that when we played Southend. They looked like a big side, but we competed.

MARTYN: Simon Ferry was a different class in his first game and while he was substituted a week later, he's been solid ever since. He looks completely in control and he gets the ball moving quickly. He has the ability to get forward, too.

PAUL: He has a voice on the pitch, too. It makes a real difference.

MARTYN: There a recurring theme

in the new signings, they're all confident players with a presence. I'm not sure if that was a deliberate thing by Wilson, but it's good. Whether or not they're like that, or he's brought that out of them I don't know, but the players are realising it's not just about playing, it's talking as well. Wilson's really impressed me. He's proved he's not afraid to make decisions. He'll also make big substitutions if he has too.

Q The loan strikers scored at Brentford, and Charlie Austin has now joined. Do you still feel this is an area that needs strengthening?

MARTYN: Well, I'm convinced that Simon Cox will be back on loan before you know it!

PAUL: Last year we needed to score goals to keep us up. This season we're a bit stronger, meaning we probably don't need to score as many goals...

MARTYN: ... but you feel we just need someone who really has that killer instinct.

TONY: I think Revell does ok. He peels off players well and he has a presence. He scored a great goal last weekend. If he continues to improve then I'd like to see us sign him in January.

Q People still aren't talking about the play-offs yet, but expectations are changing, aren't they?

MARTYN: Mine have definitely!

TONY: At the start of the season I was thinking top half. Now I think we'll easily finish in the top half, and I think we have a great shout of reaching the play-offs. In fact, I'd be disappointed now if we didn't.

MARTYN: I remember Steve McMahon saying one season that any points we get at this stage are key to keeping us up, so I'm still working out what we need! But I think the important period will be January, when the loan players go back. Will we be able to keep them, or will we struggle when they go back?

MARTYN: Having seen Colchester play, I think they're a good bet because their forwards will cause a lot of problems. We did well against

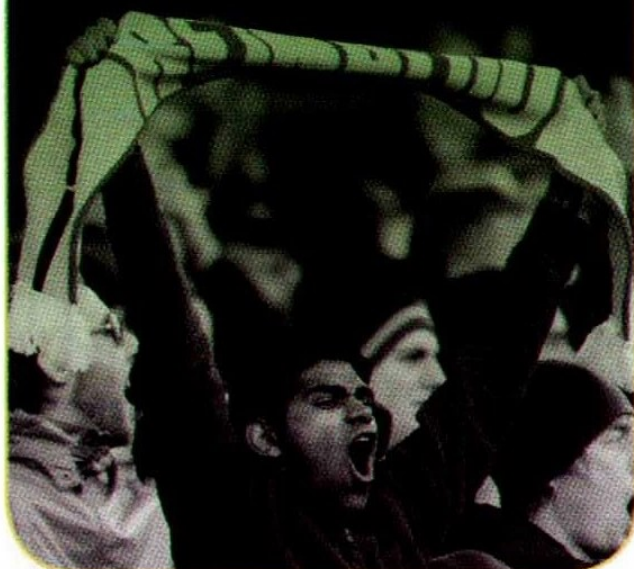

them and I think that was a good marker. It'll be interesting to see how we fare against the other big teams like Leeds.

TONY: I'd like to see us add players to the squad in January. Left-back is a position I'd like to see strengthened. I've seen teams play the ball into that channel and there have been big gaps. Callum Kennedy could do better with more games under his belt. He just needs those games to get experience.

PAUL: I think the good thing is that the new players are causing the others to raise their game. Players that might not have played so well last season are looking better, and it's creating not only a stronger team, but one with competition for places. At that start of the season I thought we'd be short of players, and that's where we've struggled before. We've never had more than one good player in every position, and the gap between the reserves, youth team and first team has been big. But now, there's quality all over the pitch. We can swap players at will this year, which also means that we don't have to stick to any rigid systems, there are players who can do several jobs and not disrupt the team when they come in.

MARTYN: Well, when you see how far Craig Easton has been from the team this year, that's a measure of how much stronger the squad is.

Q Millwall have done well this season, how do you see this game going?

PAUL: I'd like to see us win, of course. It will be a tough one, but I'll be disappointed with a draw.

TONY: It all boils down to the expectation again. Last year you'd think: 'Millwall, don't fancy that', but not this season. I expect us to win every game.

PAUL: Wilson mentioned a feel-good factor before the Wycombe game and he's right. There's always been an excuse for people not to turn up and watch Town, but they're dwindling this season. I'd love to see this place fill up because the current team deserve the Town's support. It would be phenomenal to fill this stadium up like we used to in

the Premier League. Even getting to three quarters of the capacity would be great. People aren't proving a point by not coming any more.

TONY: We look fitter this season and maybe that's got something to do with why we're doing well. Chatting to Marcus (groundsman) earlier this season, he watches them when they train on the pitch and he says they're always wearing the heart monitors. They're all working at 75% a lot of the time.

Q Talking of the pitch, it's like a carpet...
MARTYN: It is!

PAUL: I remember when we started doing this, whenever there had been a sliding tackle, it was like relaying a carpet because the pitch would just roll up. The club have invested some money into it and it's paying dividends. I'd be surprised if we weren't in contention for pitch of the season.

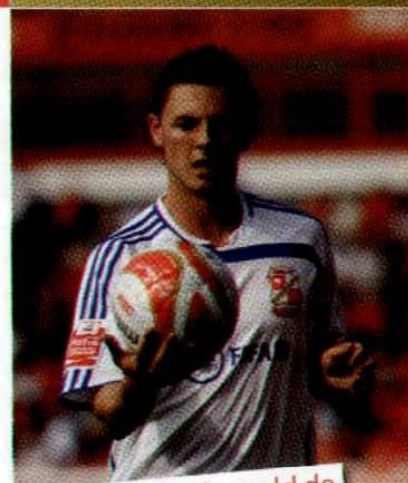
TONY: Now Marcus is working full-time, it's so much better.

Q So we obviously see you guys there with the forks at half-time, talk us through what you actually do...

TONY: Well, with the forks we replace divots at half-time, and then we line up after the game and walk back and forwards to fix any imperfections. It's good fun seeing the players close up at half-time. Sometimes, depending on who's come out to warm out, you know what the manager's thinking.

PAUL: In doing this we've been lucky to get tickets to games, too. We don't do it to get paid, but it's good to do your bit and be able to come and watch the team. When we started nine years ago the club really was on its knees. We started to help Marcus out really, but now the pitch is looking good, people appreciate it, and they can see the difference.

TONY: We look the part now, too. We've been given a kit and sponsorship thanks to Pharma Tooling Ltd as well! But it's worth it, I think we do our jobs and with Marcus on board full-time, the pitch looks worthy of some of the football

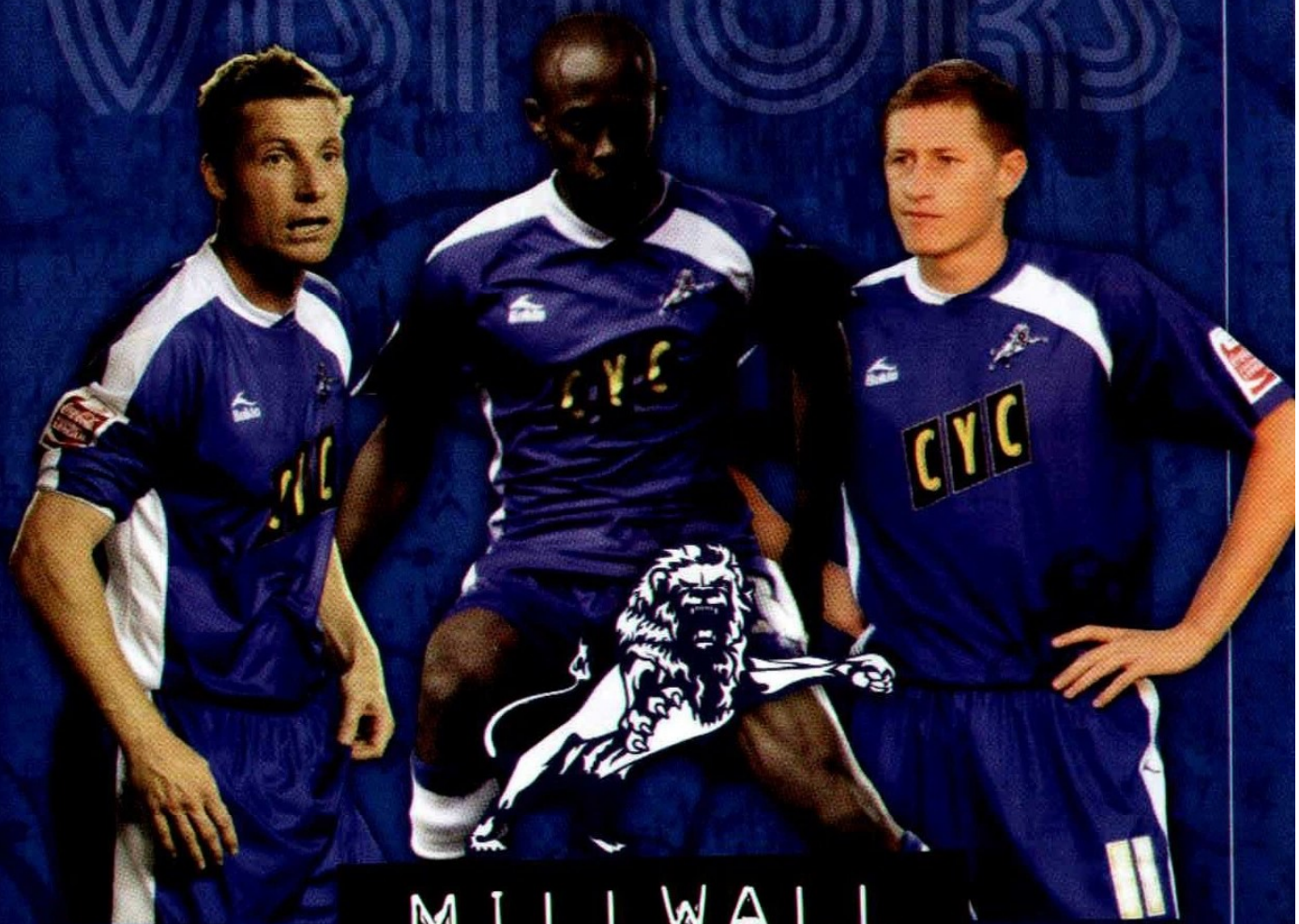

Millwall arrive in Wiltshire this afternoon only four points behind The Robins in the League One table. It has been an indifferent start to the season for today's visitors, with former Town defender Jack Smith set to return to The County Ground for the first time since his summer departure.

The Lions enjoyed a solid start to the new campaign, especially at the back as they conceded just one goal in their opening five league and cup games. Their Carling Cup defeat at West Ham United was followed by a run of three consecutive two-nil defeats on the road, which indicates there could be an opportunity for Town to claim three points at home

at the first time of asking in October.

The last meeting between the two sides arrived eight months ago at The New Den with a 43rd minute opener from Billy Paynter almost enough to secure three points against The Lions. A late stunner from James Henry dashed any hopes of victory as he lashed in a 30-yard drive to leave the scores level. Henry has returned to SE16 for a second loan spell after enjoying a successful spell with Kenny Jackett's men last season. The Royal hit seven goals last term and spent the majority of the second half of the campaign in the Capital plying his trade in League One. After hitting a hat-trick last weekend in Millwall's 5-0 home win over Tranmere Rovers, the 20-year old

seems to have rediscovered his scoring form.

Many Town fans will remember the Coca-Cola Cup meeting with Millwall back in 1995. It was a historic night for The Robins with two goals from Andy Mutch putting Swindon on the way before a sublime strike from Jan-Aage Fjortoft sealed a place in the Semi-Finals of the competition. Then Millwall boss Mick McCarthy commented after the game that if Fjortoft had meant the goal, he would 'bear his backside in Burton's shop window'. McCarthy soon retracted his comments after seeing a replay of the goal.

If Town can score three at home this time around then three points shouldn't be too far behind.

FORDE

Galway-born keeper who joined Millwall from Cardiff City in the summer of 2008.

He played League One football for both Luton and Bournemouth during loan spells in 2007/8, saving a Neil Harris penalty during Millwall's 2-0 defeat at the hands of the Cherries in March. Since his debut against Oldham at the start of the 2008/9 season, the Irishman has played every minute of every match and is looking to continue that run. Recorded 19 clean sheets, one less than Golden Glove winner Danny Coyne at Tranmere and saved five penalties in those matches.

FRAMPTON

Big strong defender who joined Millwall from Brentford in the summer of 2007. Originally with Crystal Palace, for whom he made 35 appearances



between 1998-2003, Frampton established himself as a first team regular following his move to Griffin Park, playing at left-back, centre back and occasionally in midfield, captaining the Bees for a spell as well. He began his Millwall career at left back, but after a period on the sidelines with a foot injury, returned to action at centre half in place of the injured Zak Whitbread in January 2008. Having reverted to full back, he is firmly a firm favourite with the Den crowd, winning the MSC Player of the Year award after an outstanding 2008/9 campaign.

PRICE

A former teammate of Town Captain Gordon Greer, much-travelled striker Jason is in his second spell with the club having spent a period on loan at The Den towards the end of the 2008/9 campaign. An injury picked up during the Play-Off semi-final first leg against



Leeds at The Den deprived him of a second consecutive Play-Off final appearance, having been on the winning side for Doncaster against Leeds the previous year. Price signed for Millwall on a permanent

basis during the close-season having been released by the Yorkshire club. Born in Ponypridd, Price joined Swansea City from non-league in Aberaman in 1995. After spells with Brentford, Tranmere and Hull City he joined Doncaster in 2006, helping them win promotion to the Championship.

ALEXANDER

Alexander was snapped up by Millwall on 1st July 2007 from Leyton Orient after finishing as The O's top scorer for the third time in 2006/7 to further cement his reputation. A powerful and hard-working forward with a clinical finish, Gary signed for the O's in January 2003, and went on to



hit 16 goals in his first full season at Brisbane Road. Although an ankle injury meant he spent much of the following campaign on the treatment table, he still made it into double figures. An impressive start to the 2005/6 season, which included an incredible run of scoring in nine consecutive games, led to the south London-born hitman winning the Powerade League Two Player of the Month award in September, and his 15 goals overall played a strong part in helping the O's towards promotion. Gary is also strong in the air and he has now rattled up over 100 goals over the course of his career.

CRAIG

Returned to The Den on a permanent basis during the summer of 2008, having left for Crystal Palace 12 months previously. The popular left back, who can also operate as a central defender, won Millwall's Young Player of the Year award just prior to moving across South London after making more than 80 senior appearances for The Lions. Kenny Jackett brought him back to SE16 on loan in March of 2008, and so impressed was the Lions boss, that he bided his time before landing Craig on a three year deal.

BEST OF THE REST

Town fans will know all about Millwall right-back Jack Smith, who spent four years at The County Ground after signing in the summer of 2005 from Watford and made 134 league starts for The Robins before linking up with The Lions following his release from Swindon in May. Nadjim Abdou spent a year with Plymouth Argyle before signing for Millwall in 2008 and the Frenchman is now a regular member of the starting line-up. James Henry, on loan from Reading, scored against Swindon in January with a long-distance screamer and is back at The New Den this term and scored a treble against Tranmere Rovers last weekend.



GAFFER KENNY JACKETT

Kenny Jackett enjoyed a successful playing career with Watford under Graham Taylor, being a member of the side that reached the FA Cup Final in 1984 and winning 31 caps for Wales. Following early retirement through injury at the age of 28, Kenny held a number of coaching roles at the club before becoming head coach in 1996 with Taylor reverting to the role of Director of Football. Taylor then resumed as manager and Jackett assisted him in leading Watford to consecutive promotions. On Taylor's departure in 2001, Jackett also left to assist Ian Holloway at QPR where he was involved in another promotion campaign (to the Championship). In April 2004 Kenny was appointed as manager of Swansea and guided them to promotion in his first full season when they finished third in Division Two. They then reached the League One Play-Off Final a year later, and were in or around the top six for much of the 2006/7 campaign before he left the club by mutual consent in February 2007. He was appointed reserve team coach at Manchester City a month later before joining Millwall as manager on 6th November 2007. In a difficult first season, Kenny saw the club to League One safety in May, finishing 17th. It proved a catalyst for greater things, as Jackett led Millwall to fifth place. After knocking out Leeds en-route to Wembley, he saw his side fall short in an epic 3-2 defeat to Scunthorpe in the showpiece final.

Bouncebackability

This week's staff profile sees one of the longest-serving members of the backroom team under the spotlight. The recovery of Town's injured players is overseen by Club Physiotherapist Dick Mackey - who has now worked under fourteen Swindon Town Managers.

Name: Dick Mackey
Job Title: Physiotherapist
Year Joined: 1993

How did the role at Swindon Town come about and where were you working before?

I was working as a Chemist at a company called Deloro Stellite, which was a tremendous grounding prior to getting into football. Working in manufacturing teaches you a number of things - order, discipline and an appreciation of what life is like outside of the game. Glenn Hoddle was then looking for a youth team physio and I applied for that and got the job on a part-time basis, working under John Trollope. We had some good times and some very good sides, travelling to the likes of Crystal Palace and Tottenham in the South-East Counties league. I then moved up to become full-time first team physio during Steve McMahon's time in charge.

You played a bit too didn't you. Tell us about your footballing background?

I played for Swindon Boys on this

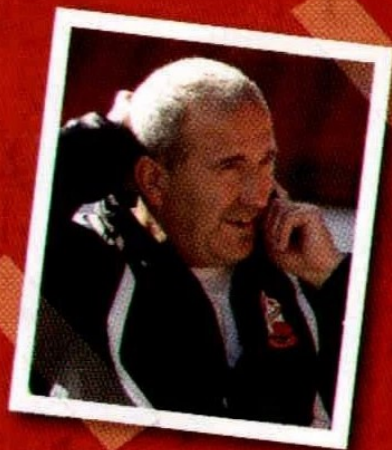
ground a number of times. People like Ernie Hunt and Mick Summerbee were around at the time and they were fantastic players. I also played for the likes of Chippenham, Ferndale, Pinehurst and for the County but to be honest I just love football.

How has your role changed since Dave Morrison's appointment?

Dave Morrison now looks after the fitness side in addition to the warming up and cooling down. I did that role for many seasons but I remember one season under Paul Sturrock - we went on a winning run and he insisted I continue. That's football logic! It was almost impossible to combine the two and Dave's appointment has allowed us both to concentrate on our individual roles. We have had two or three long-term injuries quite close together and those have been time intensive.

Which players have endeared themselves to you over the years following a recovery from injury?

It's a good question and not an easy one to answer. Players are very often



not at their best when recovering from injury - often short tempered and frustrated. Stevie Adams was here a few seasons ago and was a very nice lad who tried extremely hard. He was a very fit boy who couldn't quite turn the corner. I also remember thinking back to Keith O'Halloran who was a smashing boy who was unlucky. He got through a huge amount of work but didn't quite get back to his best.

The two teams were to meet four times during 1991/92.

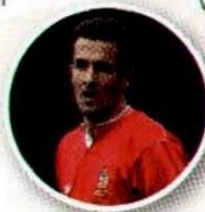
It was 25th September 1991 when Town took the trip to The Den in the Rumbelows Cup and raced into a two goal lead in little over half an hour through a brace from Steve White. Paul Stephenson pegged one back for the home side just before the break and Chris Armstrong completed a comeback on 63 minutes.

Just over a month later, the second leg at The County Ground saw Town triumph 5-3 on aggregate through two goals from Duncan Shearer and a further strike from White, despite John Colquhoun opening the scoring for the Lions.

Then on New Year's Day 1992 another 3-1 win for Town, and another couple from Shearer, moved Town up to 7th in Division

One. Martin Ling completed our striking before halftime, with John McGinlay replying on 53 minutes.

It was into April before the teams met for the fourth time that season. This time it was Malcolm Allen who produced the first goal of the day with a 12th minute strike, while front man Terry Gibson, on loan from Wimbledon, scored his only goal in Town colours to clinch a draw.



Football Snippets

In October, Second Division Blackburn Rovers spectacularly appoint Kenny Dalglish as their manager. Dalglish's first match in charge takes place at The County Ground where goals from Steve White and Colin Calderwood give Town a 2-1 win.

November sees England striker Gary Lineker join the Japanese League when he signs for Grampus Eight.

BACK ON TRACK

SWINDON TOWN produced a devastating first half win in 11 matches and start 1992 in style. Goals from Duncan Shearer, Paul Stephenson and Steve White moved Town up to 7th in Division One.

In February and just three days after being told his job is safe, former Town boss Ossie Ardiles is sacked by Newcastle United and replaced by Kevin Keegan.

After players threaten strike action, the PFA win a 50 per cent increase in their share of TV money, and a deal worth £304m is struck with the BBC and Sky for match coverage. The first division is to be renamed the Premier League and reduced to 20 clubs by 1995. Confusingly divisions Two, Three and Four, will become One, Two and Three.

Leeds United's late charge for the title ends with the Elland Road outfit clinching the trophy for the first time since 1974. Eric Cantona is the inspiration.

The World That Season



August brings the release of journalist John McCarthy who has been held hostage in Beirut by Islamic fundamentalists for more than five years. Whitney Houston croons 'I Will Always Love You', and Billy Ray Cyrus releases 'Achy Breaky Heart'.



In November, business tycoon, publishing magnate and football club owner Robert Maxwell is found dead in the Atlantic off the coast of the Canary Islands. Flamboyant Queen lead singer and founder Freddie Mercury dies of AIDS in November.

The Conservatives poll almost 42 per cent of the votes in April to win the general election.

Season Outcome For Both Clubs

With Glenn Hoddle at the reins, Town missed the Division One play-offs by five points, finishing eighth in the table. Striker Duncan Shearer bagged 32 goals in all competitions, but left in a £800,000 deal that took him to Blackburn Rovers in March. The move effectively scuppered Town's promotion chances as the goals dried up, and Rovers

themselves claimed the last play-off place and ultimately promotion.

After defeating the Lions, Town put paid to Huddersfield in the Rumbelows Cup by 4-1, before losing out to Crystal Palace by the only goal in round four.

At The Den, Bruce Rioch was replaced by Mick McCarthy as boss during the season, and in December

the club announced plans to leave for a new purpose built stadium in December. The Lions finished the season in 15th place.

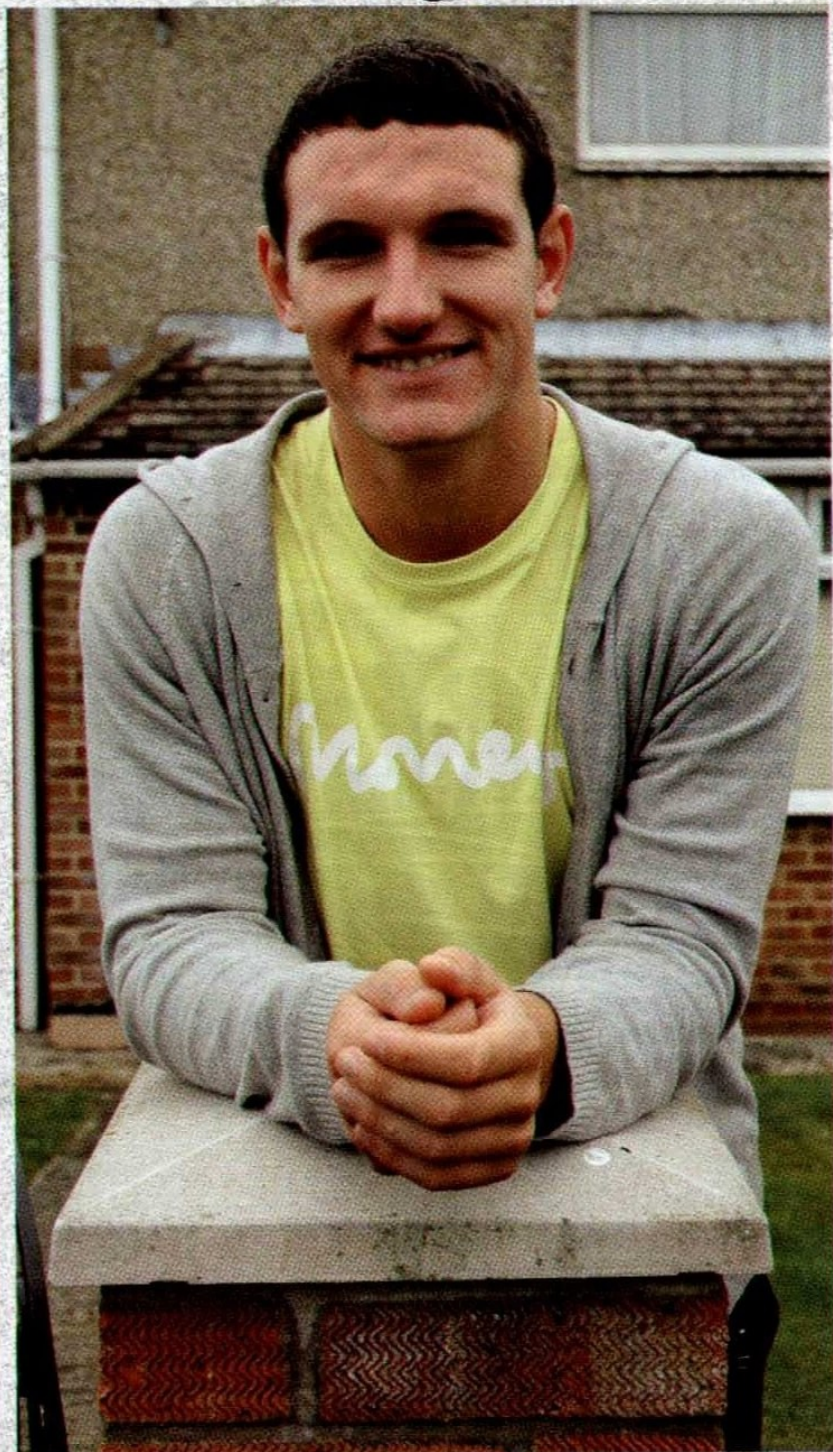

How difficult did you find the move, in terms of location, from Plymouth?



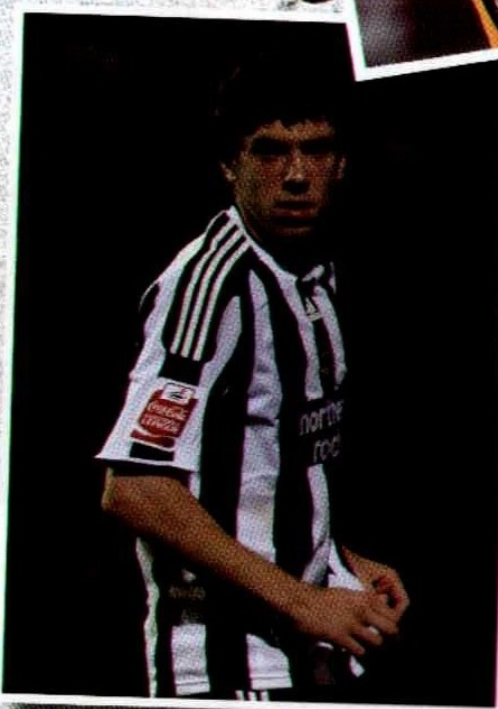

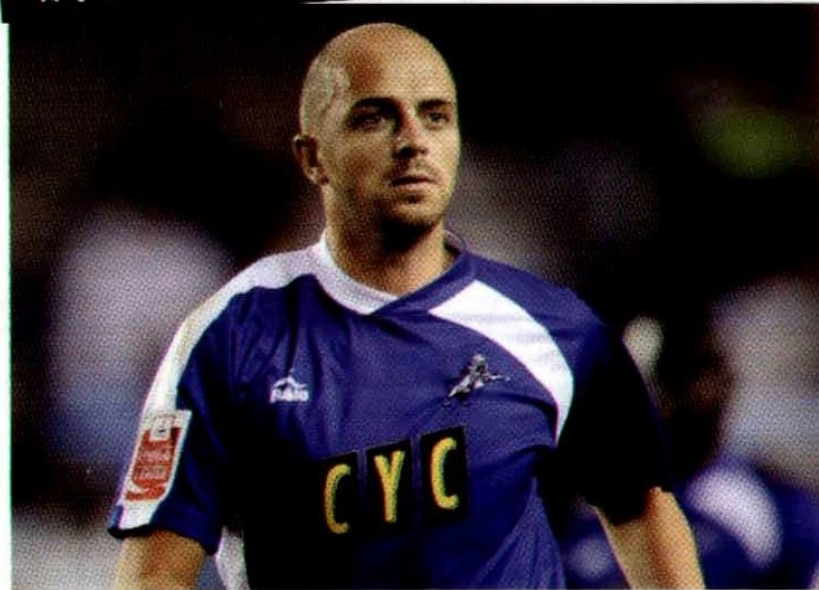

Of all the summer transfers out of The County Ground none surprised me more than Jack Smith. He was one of the players you thought might be offered an extended stay at The County Ground. But it wasn't so much the fact that he left that was surprising, as where he ended up going, Millwall.

Anyone who remembers the Lions last visit to The County Ground in September 2008 will remember Millwall manager Kenny Jackett going absolutely ballistic on the sidelines about an incident involving Smith. The then Town full-back had basically just been elbowed in the face by Jermaine Easter, who was sent off. Jackett, though, was having none of it claiming Smith had made the most of the incident. Yet nine months later he signs him for Millwall!

At least Jackett accepted afterwards he was wrong about the incident, and has signed a player who's more than capable of doing well in League One. Let's just hope he doesn't pop up with his first goal in a Lions shirt this afternoon. And it gives me a good chance to talk about one of Swindon's most consistent performers so far this season, Kevin Amankwaah. OK, so Smith spent half (or more) of his time at left-back

during his time at Swindon, but I'm with Danny Wilson on this one. If there's a better right back than Amankwaah in League One at the moment, he must be playing pretty well!

Should Swindon avoid defeat this afternoon it will equal their longest unbeaten run in the league in almost six years. The

middle of the 2003/4 play-off season was the last time the Town managed 11 without defeat, with a team featuring the likes of Parkin, Mooney, Miglioranza and Howard.

The difference between that team and this? Well, the Town won nine of those matches that year, compared to a best possible five this time around. And despite the improved form of Alex Revell and Ben Hutchinson, I don't think they're likely to help Swindon match the goals scored tally of that team. But Jonathan Douglas would have walked into that midfield and I don't think any Town fan would swap the current back five for the 2004 vintage.

support pre-schools, primary and secondary schools by providing school resource packs containing manuals, flash cards, software, DVD's, numeracy resources and books aimed at educating a child with Down's syndrome.

The Group also provides some specialist sporting activities - football training run in conjunction with Swindon Town Community Team. This training session is open to all children with a disability between the ages of 5 - 18. Tennis lessons with a specialist coach and fortnightly swimming lessons with a specialist swimming coach and working towards nationally recognised qualifications. The Group also runs weekly speech and language therapy sessions.

This unfortunately will keep Lloyd out of action for around four to six weeks. We visited a consultant on Thursday to make sure no action was required. This kind of fracture does not usually require any kind of plaster but it will be necessary to reduce weight-bearing.

Hasney Aljofree trained on Tuesday with the youth team in his preliminary steps back to full training. It has been a long six months for him, so I do hope Hasney can continue in his quest for match action.

Alan O'Brien has recently returned



from a spell at Lilleshall and is now running pain free, albeit at a low tempo. His hamstring tear was considerable and it's very important that we do not take a shortcut when dealing with his rehabilitation. If we can get him back up to good strength and speed, then he will return to Lilleshall for a strength test.

Kurt Hammonds is coming towards the end of his six-month spell of ACL rehabilitation. It is becoming increasingly difficult to hold him back from joining in with the rest of the squad. However, he needs to be patient for another two to three weeks before he will be let off the leash.

Yinka Casal has had an operation on his patella tendon which thus far has proved to be successful. At the time of writing he is able to run pain free and is working hard on quadricep strengthening and hip-flexor work in his bid to get back playing.



DAVE'S TOP TIPS

Regular physical activity can go a long way to:
Feeling less stressed;
Feeling better about yourselves;
Feeling more ready to learn in school;
Keeping a healthy weight;
Build and keeping healthy bones, muscles and joints;
Sleeping better at night and making friends.

- Try and aim for an hour of moderate intensity exercise every day. The one hour doesn't have to be done all at once; it can be built up over the day. For example: four 15-minute periods of activity for example during play time at school, three of 20 minutes, two of 30 minutes.

- This can include fast walking, jogging, biking, roller skating, running, swimming, jumping rope or group activities, such as playing soccer, hockey, volleyball, baseball, rugby, netball etc.

- For a healthy heart, you need to perform aerobic exercise. Aerobic exercise is any activity that uses oxygen, raises your heart rate and makes you slightly breathless. It helps to keep your heart, lungs, blood vessels and muscles healthy. Combined with a balanced diet, aerobic exercise is the best way to maintain a healthy weight.

- Play and enjoy a wide variety of fitness activities. This will improve your motor abilities for example balance and co-ordination: this also develops all muscles in the body and therefore decreases the chance of muscle imbalance which may result in injuries.

"Generally the lads do weight training sessions on Tuesday and Thursdays after training, but using the stand gave them a bit of variety rather than sitting in the gym.

"So as a coach I thought it would be good for them to do. Leg strength is a key part of football nowadays and players' speed and contact is something we are working on.

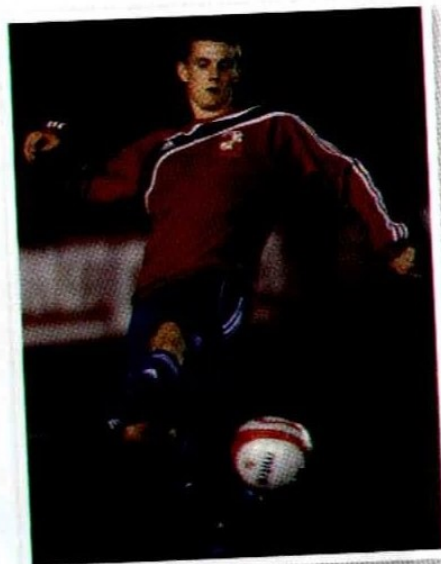
Youth Department

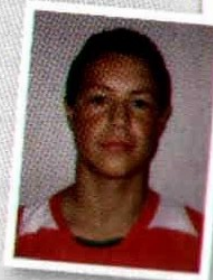
However, this fixture against Wales, which will be staged at Huish Park, represents a first international call-up for the other 16 squad members and they will all be looking to impress.

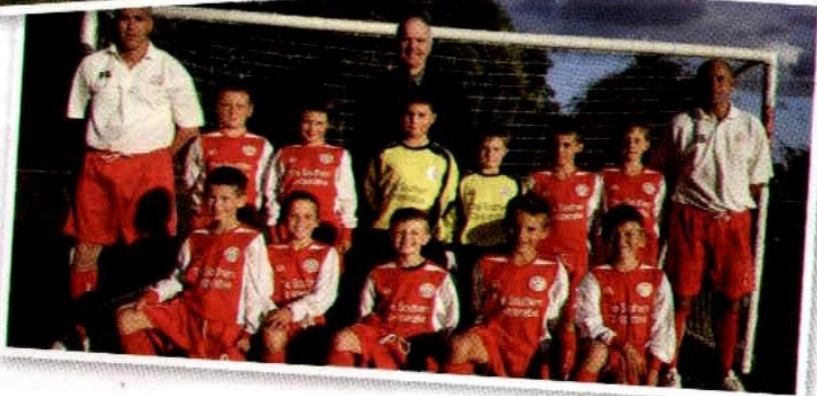

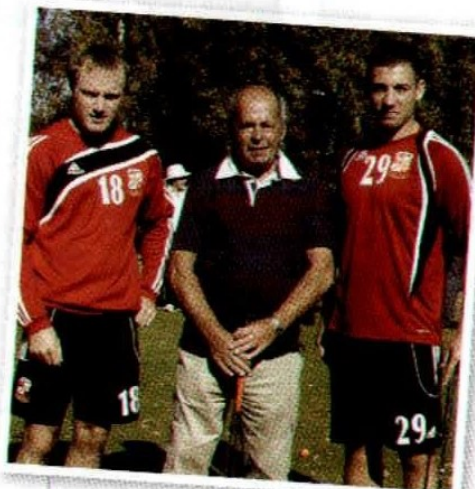
"It was great to see the guys out there enjoying themselves," said O'Brien, a Republic of Ireland International who joined Town from Hibernian in the summer.

Elsewhere, former Town striker Jamie Cureton scored his second goal of the season to help Norwich City to a 5-1


























win over another of his former clubs, Bristol Rovers.

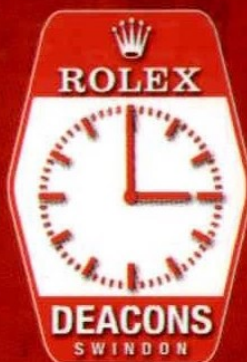
