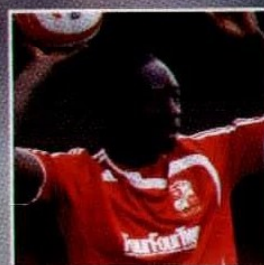

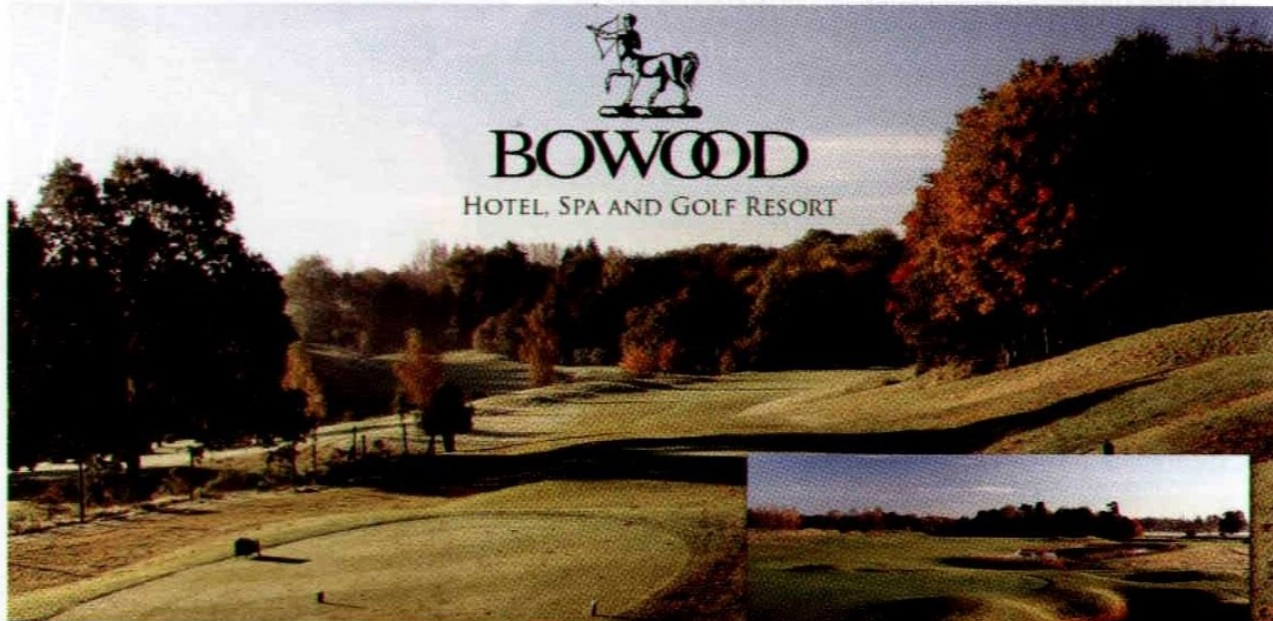

CAUGHT ON CAMERA

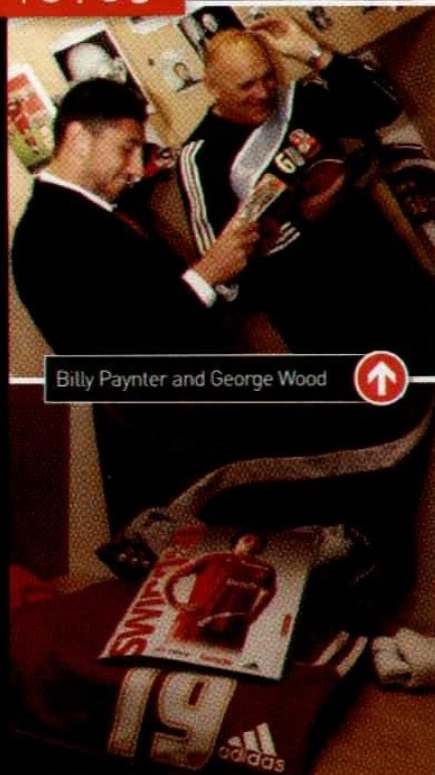

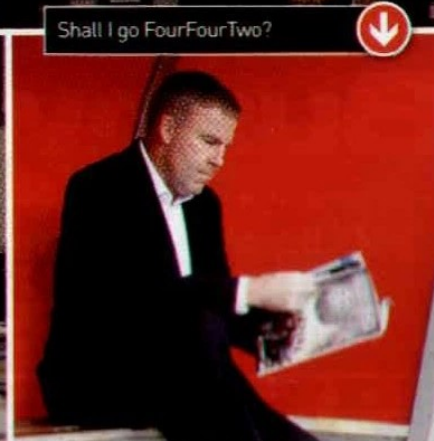

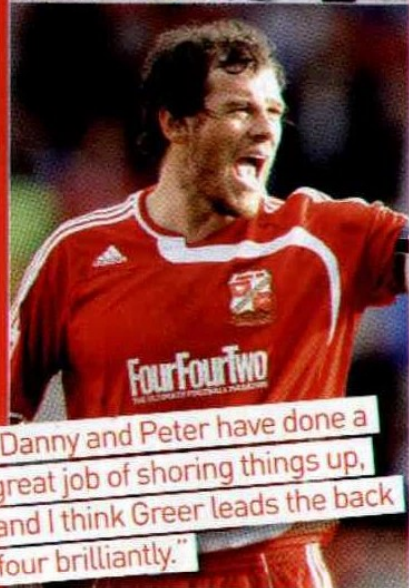
NEIL: He quietly goes about his business, but is very effective. He's also chipped in with a couple of

goals. He and Gordon [Greer] look an excellent partnership.

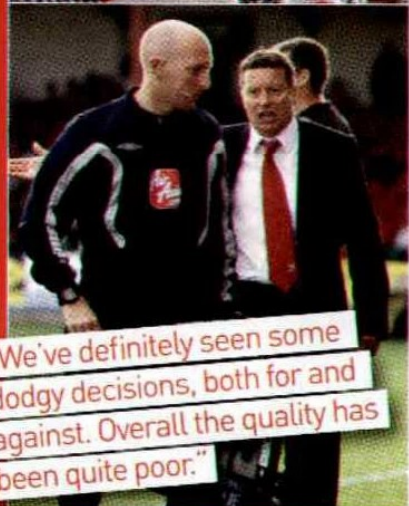
STEVE: I'm convinced he's going to get better and better. There have been a couple of concentration lapses on the defensive side, but these are things that can be sorted out, and he looks like he could be notching a few important goals in the future.

Q We defended well for large parts... what do you make of our back line this year?

STEVE: I'm very relaxed watching Swindon defend these days, which is

saying something after more than a decade of defensive despair!

NEIL: Certainly a change from last year – I can't remember having so much confidence in a Swindon defence! Long may it continue.

STEVE: Danny [Wilson] and Peter [Shirtliff] have done a great job of shoring things up, and I think Greer leads the back four brilliantly – he's well on track to becoming a Town legend. We just need to keep a clean sheet past 80 minutes!

DAN: We have progressed very well from last year and look a lot more solid, but I still think we have a way to go. The lack of goals has put more pressure on us, so we know if we do concede we will probably get a draw at best, which is never ideal.

Q What would you suggest we do to prevent us from conceding goals late on?

STEVE: I think we've sat back for too long in the second half of recent games. We can keep this up for long periods, but at the moment I'd like to see a concerted effort to push forward and pressurise the opposition as the game reaches its last quarter.

NEIL: I'm not sure that's the problem – I would prefer us to try and kill teams with the second goal rather than still giving teams hope with a slender lead. Against Millwall towards the end we were playing one up front compared to their two – it's inviting teams forward.

DAN: I'm with Neil: score more in the first place to reduce the pressure on the back four. We do seem to have teams get at us down the flanks, so it will be interesting to see how Danny resolves this. We saw Callum Kennedy play in favour of Leccinel Jean-Francois last week, but in the second half one in front of the other definitely looked to shore things up, but reduced our capacity going forwards.

Q Did the referee get the big decisions right? What did you make of the two red cards?

NEIL: Initially I thought both were a little harsh, but after the first sending off the ref had no option with the second. It was a shame as Millwall didn't just come to defend and it looked like an open game, but got spoiled.

STEVE: I thought Douglas was a

victim of his own sportsmanship. He might have caught Abdou, but it looked like he won the ball first. If he had walked away rather than checking the player was OK, then the Millwall players wouldn't have had chance to charge in. The referee seemed to take quite a while to get the red out, I think he was influenced by the Millwall players making such a big fuss.

DAN: The guy was a joke! He made a bad decision and got worse, he didn't even have the good sense to admit his mistake. I think he was awful for both teams. I hope he is very happy with himself for being the most important man on the pitch last week. Laughable.

Q How would you assess the quality of refereeing you've seen this season?

STEVE: We've definitely seen some dodgy decisions, both for and against. Overall the quality has been quite poor – but that's nothing new to this season.

NEIL: I don't think it's been too bad overall. Refs are always going to make mistakes, but I think they get a hard deal; it's not a job I'd want!

DAN: I had honestly thought the level this year has been better than most until last Saturday. I said that before last week's game, so maybe I spoke too soon!

Q We're still sitting seventh in the table. Do you think this is an accurate portrayal of where we'll finish, or can we improve?

STEVE: No, we're better than that. There's a long way to go and I want to see the players and management focus on automatic promotion. We are the definite dark horses of this division, and I truly believe we can go up.

NEIL: I can't see the defence conceding too many, so it depends on if we continue to struggle scoring. I'm confident of a play-off spot, though. I think some fans should show a little more patience, remember where we were last year?

DAN: My heart says play-offs, my head says mid-table, but I would love a trip to Wembley. I think a lot will depend on where we are at Christmas and if we are in with a shout I like to think the board might go and get a couple of additions to take us over the line...

Q We've been drawing a lot of games recently, is it important we get a win today? Do you think it's even more important we get a result given the quality of opponents we have coming up?

NEIL: We've got some big teams coming up, but always seem to do well against them, so we shouldn't panic if we draw against the 'lesser' teams. I think the division is really tight this year and there's going to be a few ups and downs, hopefully more ups....

STEVE: I think it's important to get back to winning ways at home. I can't cope with another 1-1. Let's try and get 2-0 up and then I'll be happy!

DAN: I think we are probably drawing too many at the moment. With the games coming up I think we can start to see where we are in this division and see if we deserve our seventh place in the league. If we want to progress we do need to start finishing teams off, starting with today.

Q We play Norwich, Leeds and Huddersfield in the next four weeks: How do you think we'll get on against the big guns?

NEIL: Beat them all, or probably draw 1-1!

STEVE: In recent seasons I would have assumed that we would lose the 'big' games. This year is different, our team is strong throughout and as long as the players stay focused, we can expect a healthy points haul from these games.

DAN: On current form I think a good bet would be three points from three draws, but maybe I'm being negative. I think we could get a result with Huddersfield and Norwich, but we could struggle at Leeds. I would love us to beat Huddersfield, I lived there for a while and I haven't seen us beat them since we put six past them at The County Ground.

Q Which opposing teams or players have impressed you so far this season?

STEVE: I haven't seen anything special in terms of overall team performances, but I thought James Henry from Millwall was excellent on Saturday, and a few of the goalkeepers have been quite handy too, which is a shame!

NEIL: Henry was good, although no-one team has really looked great. Simeon Jackson of Gillingham looked good.

DAN: Colchester were good, I thought they looked organised and showed a bit up front, apart from that I haven't really seen a lot of quality down here.

Q Who has impressed you for Town?

NEIL: Who hasn't! But I must give special mention for the back five, JP McGovern and Jonathan Douglas.

STEVE: I'd pick out the midfield pair of Douglas and McGovern, too. They have made a real difference.

DAN: I have been impressed with Gordon Greer, he has been a proper captain this season he gets stuck in and gives 110%. He also organises our defence, and gets the players around him playing well. I must admit that McGovern has been a revelation, but that's not to ignore Douglas and Ferry, who have both been excellent. I couldn't really name anyone who has had a bad season so far.

Q Two more young players earned international call-ups last week... are you happy with the quality of youngsters coming through?

DAN: I am very happy to see the youngsters coming through and progressing, I think that supply line is where the next Sam Parkin, Simon Cox and Chalky White are going to come from.

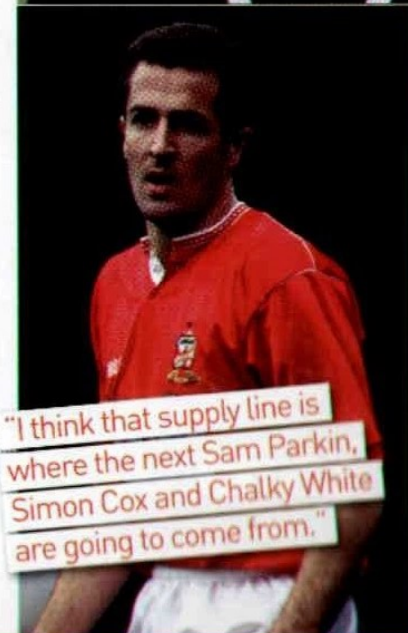

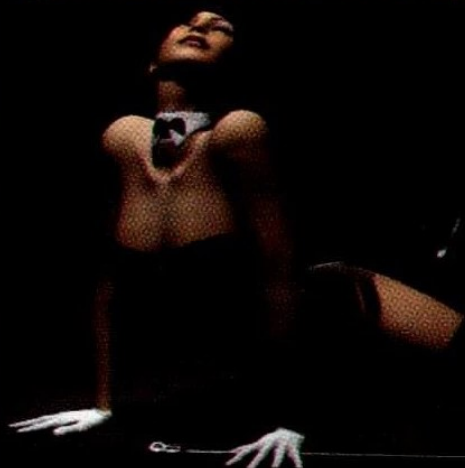

HARTLEPOOL UNITED

It's been a difficult month so far for Hartlepool United. Today's visitors have yet to register a win in three attempts in October and will have eyes on all three points as they visit The County Ground this afternoon.

The month began with a testing 688 mile round-trip to Exeter City and Hartlepool were on the receiving end of a 3-1 defeat, which was followed by a defeat in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy to Grimsby Town back at Victoria Park days later. Last Friday night Hartlepool were back in League One action and took a point from the home clash with Brentford.

Recent meetings with The Pools have been entertaining to say the

least. Six goals were shared on Town's last visit to the North-East, with hat-tricks for Simon Cox and Joel Porter seeing plenty of post-match interest for the matchball. Incidentally, that game took place almost a year ago to the day. A six-goal thriller would no doubt please The County Ground faithful today, as long as the victory goes Swindon's way.

Hartlepool have experience of edging Swindon out in tight encounters. Following Danny Wilson's appointment as Town boss in December 2008, The Pools were 1-0 winners here in February of this year in controversial circumstances. Ben Clark scored the only goal of the game following a last-minute

penalty award after an alleged foul from former Robins defender Jerel Ifil. Another narrow victory for Hartlepool was registered in February 2007, with former Town winger Andy Monkhouse heading home the winner to secure his side victory. Swindon's record against Hartlepool is far from a bad one though, with ten wins registered to Town's name in comparison to half that figure for the visitors.

Danny Wilson has stamped his authority on Swindon territory by assembling a resolute squad here in Wiltshire. Having spent a 133-game spell as Hartlepool manager, he will be eager to see Swindon seal victory this afternoon.

FLINDERS

The 6ft 4ins goalkeeper moved to Pools during the summer of 2009 following his release from Crystal Palace. Flinders started his career with Barnsley and made his league debut for the Tykes in March 2005 against Peterborough. Later that year the agile shot stopper was capped by England Under 20s and soon attracted the attention of Eagles boss Peter Taylor who took him to Selhurst Park in July 2006. However, competition was tough at Palace and he made just 14 appearances for the Club in three years, though he did gain league experience with loan spells with Gillingham, Brighton, Yeovil and Falkirk.

COLLINS

The powerful defender arrived from Hull City on deadline day of the transfer window in January 2008 and immediately displayed his

strength in the heart of Pools defence. An uncompromising centre-back, Collins came through the ranks at Huddersfield Town before moving on to Bury and then Port Vale where he made more than 150 apps. A move to Hull City marked the next stage in Collins' career but a knee injury hampered his progress at the KC Stadium (from where he enjoyed a loan spell here with Swindon) and he was allowed to move on to The Vic. Injury and suspension caused a few problems at the start of life with Pools but he soon overcame that and began to show his qualities in defence.

MONKHOUSE

A fans favourite at Victoria Park, left-winger Monkhouse joined the Club from Swindon Town in January 2007 after spending a couple of successful months on loan with us. During his loan spell he played eight games and Pools won all eight – but it wasn't just his status as a lucky omen that prompted then manager Danny Wilson to make his move to The Vic permanent. The skilful winger has already shown himself to be a goal threat from the left hand side, a player just as likely to convert chances as create them. Monkhouse started his career with Rotherham United and ironically scored against Pools on his league debut for the Millers. His move to Swindon in the summer of 2006 didn't work out as planned and Pools took advantage of the situation to bring him to the north east.

BROWN

One of the most talented players to have represented the Club, Brown is tipped for a big future in the game. He battled back from injury to make his First Team debut in April 2006 and then played a key role on the right side of midfield in the 2006/2007 promotion season, scoring seven goals and being named Supporters' Young Player of the Year. However, that simply acted as the starting point for the skilful young star who went on to hit the net thirteen times as Pools re-established themselves in League One in 2007/2008. He looked certain to overhaul that figure after getting off to a fine start last season,

deployed in a more attacking role he had already scored eight times before injury ended his campaign prematurely. Signed from Cramlington in 2004, Brown pledged his future to the Club by signing a new contract last term despite rumours circulating about interest from the Championship.

HARTLEY

Snapped up from Sunderland during the summer of 2009, central defender Hartley had been part of the Black Cats' all-conquering Reserve side. Born in Hartlepool, he grew up watching football at The Vic but it was at Sunderland where he played his football and after joining them in 2000 he made his First Team debut for the Wearsiders as a substitute in the game at Leicester on New Year's Day 2007. Hartley also gained league experience from a loan spell with Chesterfield in 2008 when he spent three months with the Spireites and played twelve games. Determined in the tackle and strong in the air, Hartley is comfortable operating either in the centre of defence or at left-back. Despite Sunderland making a late offer to retain his services, Hartley's mind was made up and he signed for his hometown club at the end of May.

BEST OF THE REST

Ritchie Humphreys brings tremendous experience to the Pools camp and has over 400 league appearances and began his career with Sheffield Wednesday. Former Barnsley right-back Neil Austin joined in the summer whilst Antony Sweeney has now clocked up over 200 league starts in Hartlepool colours. Midfielder Gary Liddle is also a one-club man and has been a regular once again this term. Adam Boyd – with 83 goals in 180 league starts – is enjoying his second spell at Victoria Park after rejoining from Leyton Orient over the summer for an £80,000 fee. Another summer signing, striker Armann Bjornsson, came off the bench in Hartlepool's last game.

GAFFER

CHRIS TURNER

Director of Sport Chris Turner was confirmed as temporary boss until the end of the 2008/09 season after taking over following the departure of Danny Wilson in December.

Turner is in his second stint in the hotseat at Victoria Park having previously enjoyed a successful spell in charge between 1999 and 2002.

During that time he led the Club to three successive play-off campaigns in what was then Division Three and laid the foundations for the eventual promotion before being lured away to hometown team Sheffield Wednesday midway through the 2002/2003 campaign.

Turner had begun his playing days with the Owls in 1976 and played almost 100 games before moving on to Sunderland in 1978.

After seven years and 195 appearances at Roker Park, Turner attracted the attention of Manchester United and went on to play 65 times for the Red Devils before returning to Hillsborough in 1988 and helped them to League Cup glory in 1991.

Following his departure as manager of Wednesday in 2004, Turner had a short stint in charge at Stockport County before his return to Pools as Director of Sport in 2006.

During the summer, Turner put his stamp on the squad at Victoria Park by bringing in twelve new players as Pools look to improve on last season's 19th place finish.

Talent Spotter

This week's staff profile sees a man who has filled a number of roles here at The County Ground under the spotlight. 'Budgie' has been Under 18's Manager, Assistant Manager, Caretaker Manager and he now has one eye on the future as Head of Player Development.

Name: Dave Byrne
Job Title: Head of Player Development
Year Joined: 2006

How are you settling in to your role as Head of Player Development?

It has been a lot of paperwork! I have concentrated my efforts on the Under 16's because they would be the new intake, so I have been trying to form an opinion of who the club should take onto a scholarship. Once that process has been completed then hopefully, later on in the year, I will be able to take a look at some trips abroad to look at International players. Until we have governed the positions that we know we need to fill, then I'm looking at home-grown talent at the moment.

It's a wide role... how did you decide where to start?

We have the nucleus of a decent squad of players at Under 18's level and we will lose eight players at the end of the season, so we will be looking to bring eight in to replace them. If we only take two or three from the Under 16's then that will

leave five places to fill. I am trying to bring in a player from a Coca-Cola Championship at the moment.

There are promising home-grown players coming through the system now, how promising is the future for Swindon?

It's fantastic. Nothing pleases me more to see the kids that I was working with when I first came to the club, breaking into the first team squad. If we are going to keep doing that then we need to ensure that whoever comes into the scholarship programme is better than what we have. For the first-year scholars in the system now, they need to be looking to shift the second years and challenge them for places. Likewise the second years need to be involved at first team level. Some of the players we have weren't even getting picked for their Under 18's last year, but are now experiencing reserve team football at Swindon. It's not all about where we finish in the league as a reserve side, it's about making sure that when the players step up to senior level then it's not a totally new experience for them.



You have been with Swindon a while now, how are you enjoying being around the Town?

Swindon is a good place to be at the moment. The Speedway is going well, the ice hockey is coming on and the football is developing well too. The Speedway the other night was fantastic and the boys put in a really good shift for 'Rosco' but unfortunately it wasn't to be for them.

November 12th 1983 saw Hartlepool arrive at The County Ground for a Fourth Division fixture, and Town defender Simon Gibson opened the scoring. But it was the visitors who were to benefit from Gibson's strike as he turned the ball past Scott Endersby in Swindon's goal to gift United the lead. Gary Emmanuel restored parity before halftime, and further goals from Andy Rowland and Leigh Barnard gave Town the points, despite Phil Ray pulling one back for Hartlepool.

Four months later a single, first half goal from Paul Batty secured a win at the Victoria Ground for Town.

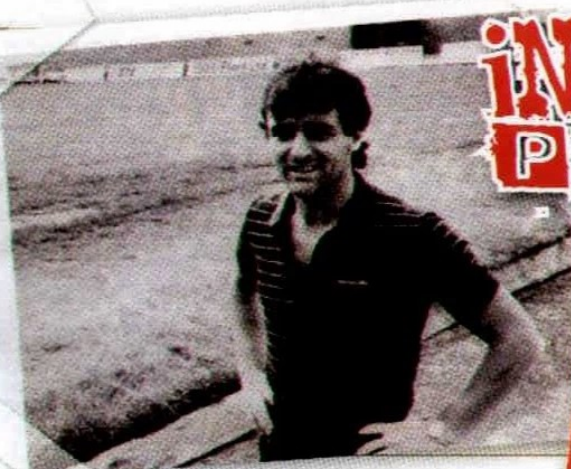

Season Outcome For Both Clubs

The end of the season brought disappointment for both clubs. Town finished a lowly 17th in Division Four, our lowest ever final League placing. Manager Ken Beamish was to reap the consequences of such a poor showing, and was replaced by Lou Macari in the summer.

Hartlepool meanwhile fared even worse, coming in at 23rd place in

the table, a huge 18 points behind Swindon. Never out of the bottom four all season, with automatic relegation from the Football League still some time away United survived re-election and went on to fight another day.

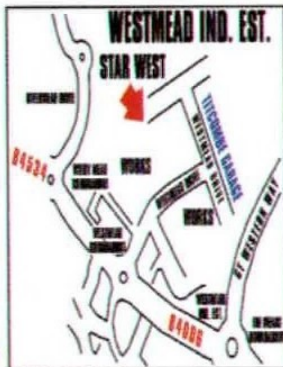

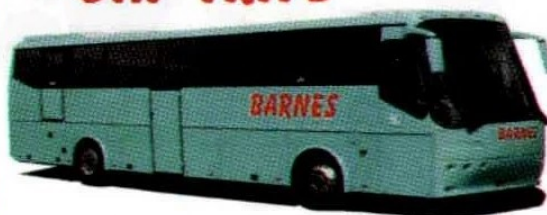

KEVIN AMANKWAAH BELIEVES TOWN'S TEAM SPIRIT CAN GO A LONG WAY TO HELPING THE ROBINS SECURE AN IMPRESSIVE LEAGUE ONE FINISH AT THE END OF THE CAMPAIGN.

Amankwaah joined The Robins from Swansea City in the summer of 2008 and has now made 38 league starts for the club. A powerful presence in the backline, the 27-year old is clearly enjoying life in Wiltshire having added to his game in attack as well as in defence.

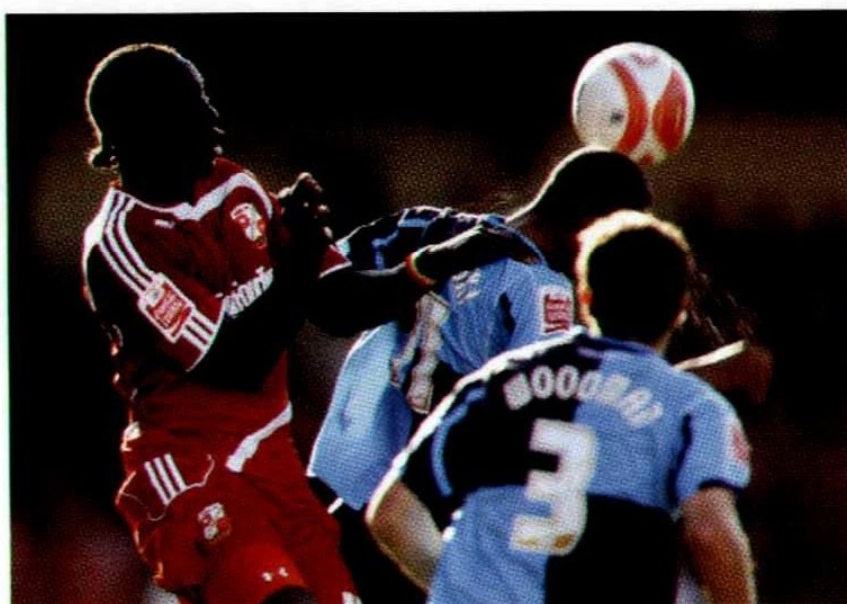
"Last year was a stop start season for me," he said, speaking after training earlier this week. "This season I have established myself in the side and it's going well. I'd like to think that I have been performing but I still want to keep improving; I certainly won't rest on my laurels.

"It's been good in front of goal as well. I haven't really been noted as a goalscorer during my career but things at Swindon have worked out for me. I used to stay back for corners but the Gaffer has now given me license to get forward to try and get on the end of things. I am always happy to contribute to the team."

The departure of thirteen players from The County Ground went some way to altering the dressing room atmosphere, but Amankwaah recognises improvements have been made on and off the pitch at The County Ground.

"The atmosphere has changed... the expectancy is there this season and at the moment we are showing that we can compete with the best there is in the division. If we can turn a few of our draws into wins then we will be at the right end of the table - and hopefully that will mean the play-offs for us.

"The Gaffer has brought in a few players of his own and that has helped shape the squad. By the looks of things on the pitch

he seems to have made the right decisions. The team is looking solid on the pitch and everyone has gelled really well off it as well. Last year we may have been lacking a bit of quality but things have changed this time around."

Town go into today's home clash with Hartlepool United unbeaten in eleven League One games. It's an impressive statistic which Amankwaah attributes to the arrival of Danny Wilson, who he worked under at Bristol City.

"I was a youngster when he gave me my debut. It was off the bench at Oldham when I was about 17, coming on for the last ten minutes or so. It was great to be working under someone like Danny Wilson. He presented me with an opportunity to play League football and I learnt a lot from him.

"When the news came through

that Danny Wilson was taking the Swindon job I was happy. You know what to expect from him."

Amankwaah has been a regular at right-back this term and alongside the likes of Gordon Greer, Scott Cuthbert, he has played a significant part in improving Swindon's defensive record.

"We look a lot more solid at the back this year, although we gave away another late goal again last weekend."

He added: "I would like to think that our fans appreciated the point we had last weekend given the fact that we were down to ten men for a large part of the game.

"When teams come to Swindon we expect to win the game and Hartlepool will be no different. We don't take anyone for granted but we have to go out and do the job."

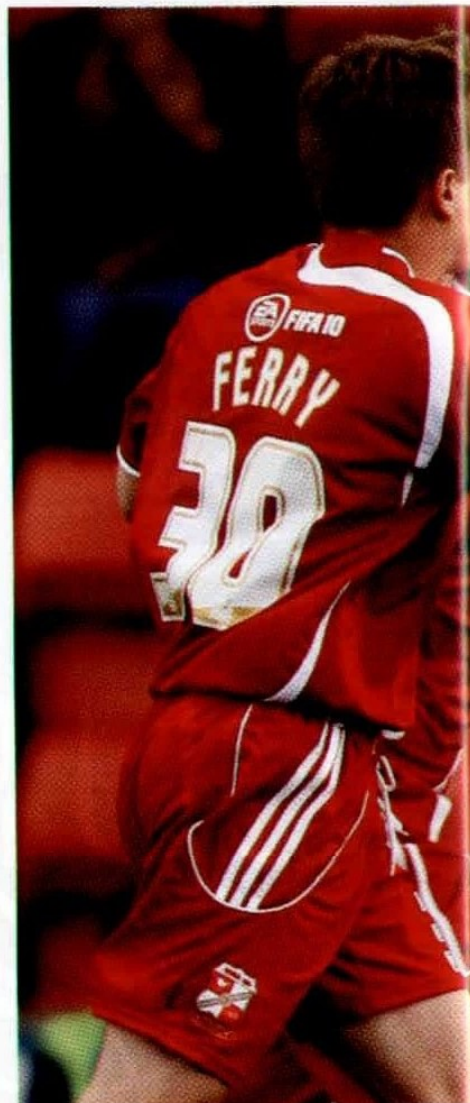

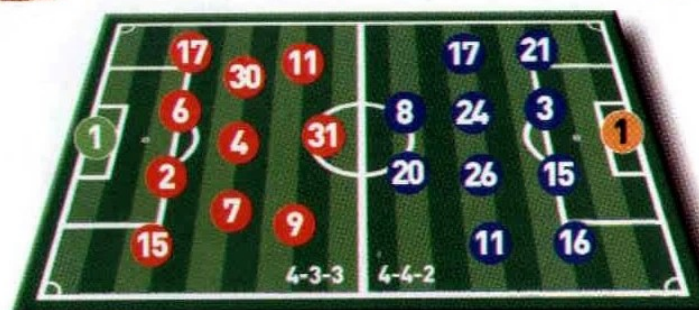

With just over a quarter of the season gone now, I think it's time (again) for me to state the obvious.

Swindon Town are legitimate promotion contenders. There, I've said it. As a commentator I have had plenty of stick down the years for tempting fate, but even the most superstitious of you must now be starting to believe the team have taken a huge step forward this season.

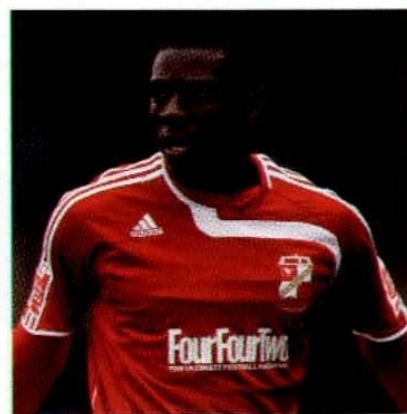
Every club starts their campaign with hopes of being one of the top teams; some even expect to be there. But after what could kindly be described as a couple of distinctly mediocre seasons, The County Ground is finally becoming a place where other teams don't really want to come.

Danny Wilson has been remarkably consistent in his public comments on the Town's chances, saying the squad looks good enough to challenge, but they've got to go out and prove it. But there is one obvious area which needs to improve over the next few months; they need to score more goals.

The hope is that Ben Hutchinson and Tope Obadeyi will continue the improvements they've shown during their loan spells, and that they'll pick up the slack. It's a plan which could well work, because they undoubtedly have the talent. The question is, will it happen quickly enough? I hope it will, but have my doubts mainly because it's a lot of pressure to place on players who aren't used

to it. Neither Billy Paynter nor Alex Revell has ever really been prolific scorers, despite the other qualities they bring to the team, and Charlie Austin is the most untried member of the striking department.

They may have five to choose from, but I can't help but think that Swindon's actions in the upcoming transfer window will have a huge effect on their chances of making the play-offs. Hutchinson and Obadeyi could well have finished their loan spells by then, and while finding another Simon Cox (or even getting the old one back on loan) is unlikely that should surely be the top priority. One final signing could prove the difference between a good season, and a truly memorable one.

Our aim is to support people with Down's syndrome, their families and carers and also anyone with an interest in Down's syndrome by providing information, advice and support as well as raising general awareness. We are a parent-led support group run by a committee of 14 volunteers and a registered charity - 1096089 - affiliated to the National Down's Syndrome Association. All our work is funded by our Group and the money is raised through jumble sales, sponsored walk, donations and grants from local companies and businesses.

The group provides opportunities for parents to support each other by organising trips to the theatre, theme parks, a Christmas party, barbecues, activity sessions and monthly baby/toddler support meetings. We aim to provide training and information through an annual training day aimed at teachers and teaching assistants and through seminars throughout the year. We also

support pre-schools, primary and secondary schools by providing school resource packs containing manuals, flash cards, software, DVD's, numeracy resources and books aimed at educating a child with Down's syndrome.

The Group also provides some specialist sporting activities - football training run in conjunction with Swindon Town Community Team. This training session is open to all children with a disability between the ages of 5 - 18. Tennis lessons with a specialist coach and fortnightly swimming lessons with a specialist swimming coach and working towards nationally recognised qualifications. The Group also runs weekly speech and language therapy sessions.

These sessions are attended by children with Down's syndrome, their parents and, in most cases, a teaching assistant from the child's school. **Visit: www.swindondownsgroup.org.uk**

TABATA TRAINING:

A simple training method to improve both aerobic and anaerobic energy systems.

This method of conditioning was invented by Dr. Izumi Tabata and his team at the National Institute of Fitness and Sports in Tokyo. The team was looking at different exercise protocols and their effect on the energy production systems of athletes with the aim of finding ways to increase both anaerobic and aerobic conditioning.

Furthermore, though Tabata has been used for energy system work it was quickly found that it is a hugely effective way to strip fat from the body. The training is itself brief, but the knock on effects are increased calorie utilization through the day and more importantly, an increased rate of fat burning in the hours after training. While low intensity long duration work has you burning fat on the bike for say 45 minutes, Tabata causes you to increase the rate for fat burning for many hours after.



The basis of Tabata Training is 4 minutes of intense interval training/ circuit training. What you are doing is taking an exercise we'll use sprints as an example here.

- Sprint as hard as you can for **20 seconds**
- Standstill for **10 seconds**
- Repeat 7 more times for a total of **8 sets**.
- So what you have is a total of **4 minutes workout time**.

During scientific studies the fitness improvements when performing the Tabata run 5 days a week for 6 weeks are incredibly impressive. Maximum oxygen capacity (VO2 max) increased by approximately 14% while anaerobic capacity improved by 28%.

Tabata Training can also be done with a number of different exercises the idea is to use an exercise that gets the whole body involved or at least the major muscle groups. Tabata Training can be done with Barbells, Dumbbells, Kettlebells or just Bodyweight exercises.

Monday for another look at his hamstring injury. Hopefully he will get the all clear and he can resume training sooner rather than later.

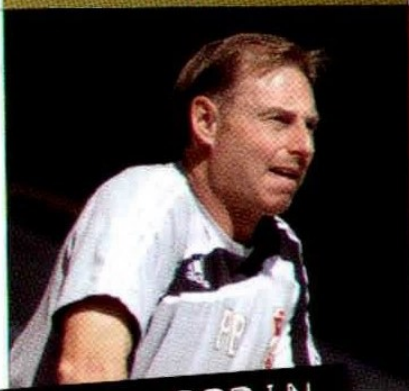


Kurt Hammonds is coming towards the end of his six-month spell of ACL rehabilitation. It is becoming increasingly

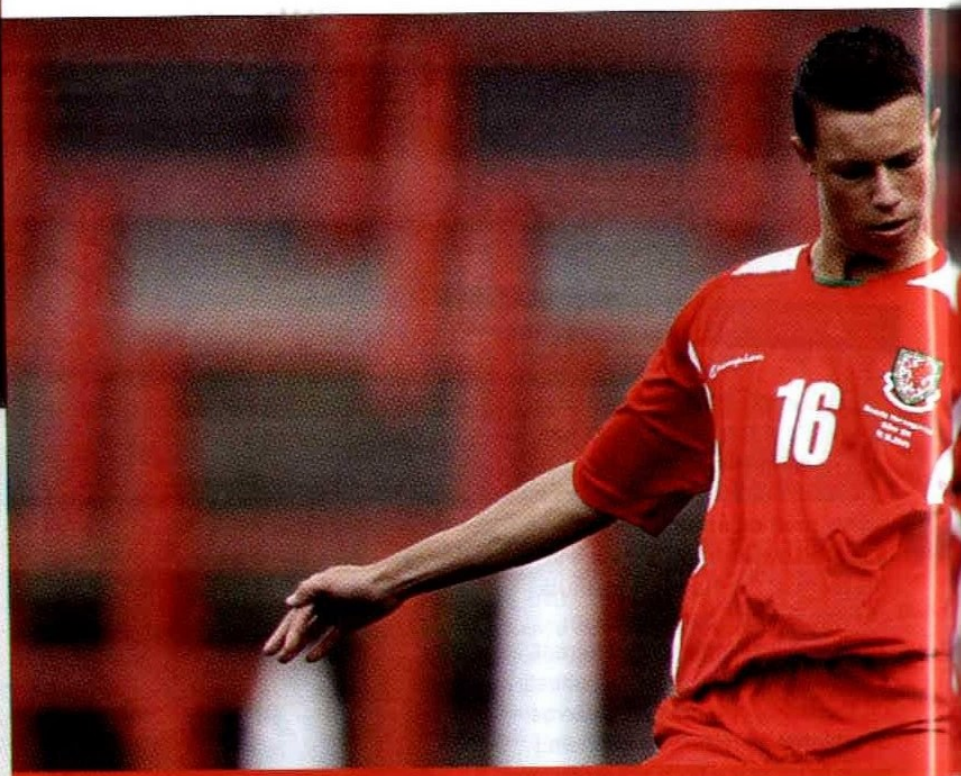
It was back to League action after a five-week break and the young Robins were eager to get three points after recently qualifying for the second round of the Puma Youth Alliance Cup.
