

The Manager of the Month nominations were made public earlier in the week, but that doesn't change anything from our point of view. It was nice to be mentioned amongst the runners and riders because it means the team are doing well – and that's the most important thing.

Jonathan Douglas would have been a doubt for the game on Tuesday after being on the receiving end of a bad challenge at Wrexham seven days ago. The injury didn't respond too well to treatment and he didn't train on Thursday – but we will hope that he recovers in time for the game today. Jonathan is a big influence to the team but we do have other options in there.

Up front we have a number of selection options as Charlie Austin and Danny Ward are both now available after missing last weekend's FA Cup game. They are both ready to go and have worked hard during the week. Danny had a lot of family going to the game at Stockport so he was bitterly disappointed to see the game called off.

Since the last home game we have also brought Alan Sheehan to the club and he made his debut at Wrexham seven days ago. He has quality and went straight into the side – and would have played at Stockport on Tuesday night had the game not been off. He wants regular

first team football and I am sure he will do well during his time with us.

After the midweek debacle up at Stockport, I must give a mention to our own Groundsman, Marcus Cassidy. He does a fantastic job and the money that has been spent on the playing surface reaps its rewards in times like this. There is lots of water around but the pitch has stood up really well. The pitch here is excellent.

Leyton Orient are the opposition this afternoon and they had a lively game against Gillingham earlier in the week. I think from their point of view they will be very pleased with the result they achieved and they are a very difficult side to face. We won't take them lightly because we know what they are about. Orient came here in April and secured a 1-0 win – and they will set themselves up to be very difficult to beat.

Today is our second Military Day of the season and I would like to extend a special welcome to all members of the forces who are here today, whether for the first time or returning to The County Ground. Only last week I joined members of club staff and players for a trip to RAF Lyneham – where we enjoyed a tour around the facilities and a flight in a Hercules aircraft. It was a tremendous experience and I hope everyone at the match today has a thoroughly enjoyable afternoon.



From the Boardroom

s I pen these Boardroom notes in readiness for the Leyton Orient fixture, I am on the road to Stockport for the fixture at Edgeley Park.

After all of the rain these past few days, which saw Stockport's Saturday FA Cup game postponed, and now with a forecast that predicts sleet Marie Saunders has made three calls to Stockport throughout the morning and has been given absolute assurances that the pitch has been passed fit to play. Game on and we travel in hope!

The past few weeks have been eventual ones for Swindon Town FC. We secured those three important points up at Carlisle and then put in an excellent performance at home against Huddersfield, in what can only be described as atrocious weather conditions, to secure a further three points. Last Saturday the faithful travelled to Wrexham to witness a hard fought, FA Cup Second Round tie, which saw The Robins leaving with a one nil win and entry into the 3rd round. The draw last Sunday afternoon saw us being pitted against Fulham FC at Craven Cottage, a fixture which is scheduled to be played over the January 2nd/3rd 2010 weekend. The draw was to result in five London clubs being drawn at home and this will place extraordinary demands on the transport systems and police resources. After a short stop at a Stockport hotel for a pre-match meal, I am back with you, much sooner than expected, due to the fact that our worst fears have been realised. The game has been called off; the pitch is in an appalling state and unplayable. The referee had no hesitation in passing his verdict and was as surprised as we were, that having seen the state of the pitch, how anyone in his or her wildest imagination could consider it playable. The apparent 0900hrs pitch inspection was carried out by the grounds man, hence not an official inspection. This is a total inconvenience for everyone and I feel so sorry for those loyal fans that made the journey in vain and thank

them for their efforts. The club will look at ways it can possibly offer some form of compensation as we seek to re-claim our expenses from Stockport. It is now raining heavily and we are on the long trip home, being entertained by Captain Jack Sparrow and his Pirates of the Caribbean - it is not raining there but there is a lot of sand around!

And so on to today and the visit of Leyton Orient to The County Ground. On behalf of everyone at Swindon Town, may I extend to the O's, their Directors, quests, Manager, players and fans, a warm welcome. One thing is for sure, thanks to the excellence of our groundsman, Marcus Cassidy, the pitch is definitely playable.

The games in hand are beginning to stack up so three points this afternoon would finally get December off to a good start.





own Boss Danny Wilson finally landed his man nine days ago with Bolton Wanderers striker Danny Ward joining on loan.

The 17-year old has Premier League experience under his belt after starting the season in the Trotters' first team. Ward – who joined the ranks at The Reebok Stadium after spells with Bradford City and Leeds United – is hoping to make the most of his spell in League One.


Swindon have already received assistance from Bolton Manager Gary Megson this term, with England Under-20 international Tope Obadeyi making 14 appearances for Town during a three-month loan.

Ward was introduced to the media on Monday morning ahead of Tuesday night's proposed away date at Stockport County, where he was due to sample League One action for the first time - although the fixture was postponed.

"The move to Swindon is something I am really looking forward to. The lads have made me feel welcome.

"My preference is to play as a central striker, so I can use my strength and hold the ball up for the team. Hopefully I'll be able to get amongst the goals as well. In terms of my earlier career - I started out at Bradford City as an eight-year old until moving to Leeds United at Under 12's level before spending five years there."

Ward speaks fondly of his involvement in the Bolton first team earlier this term, which saw appearances off the bench against Sunderland and Hull City, both inside seven days. The striker is

hoping his time in Wiltshire can help him return to the top-flight stage before the end of the campaign.

"The Premier League experience was great. I remember Gary Megson telling me that I would be on the bench – which was an exciting moment but to come off the bench on the opening game of the season was unbelievable.

"Swindon will be an important part of my development and I am sure I will benefit from being here."

Tope Obadeyi saw his initial onemonth loan stay extended to the maximum 93-day period – although Ward is keen to make an impact during his initial one-month stay.

"At the moment I'm just taking things as they come. I want to do well during the month I am here and getting regular first team football is really important. I'm coming down to play my part because from what I have seen there is a good squad of players here."

Danny Wilson also offered his views on the move and believes the youngster will be a valuable addition to his play-off chasing squad.

"Danny is another option for us going forward and he is a player I have had my eye on for a while. I am hoping he will add goals to the side because he is a natural goalscorer.

"He brings a few things to the party - his pace is an asset and he holds the ball up well too."



David Lucas will be another familiar face for you here. A player with good experience as well...





Away trips to Bristol Rovers and Charlton Athletic are punctuated by home games against Brighton & Hove Albion and Yeovil Town. Meanwhile Orient have home games against MK Dons and Southend United as well as visits to Walsall and Brighton.

The last meeting at The County Ground saw the visitors take all three points courtesy of Jason Demetriou's third minute strike. In the reverse fixture at Brisbane Road, Town had just announced Danny Wilson as the new Manager hours before the action got under way. Lee Peacock wasted no time in trying to impress – firing in a first minute effort before Jack Smith's penalty on the hour sealed the win.

It's neck and neck in terms of games won between the two sides. Town and Orient have won 24 games each. Robins fans will hope to edge ahead in terms of bragging rights by the time the full-time whistle is blown.

20-year-old goalkeeper Jamie Jones arrived at Orient in the summer of 2008 following his release by Everton. The Liverpool-born stopper came through the ranks at the Goodison Park club and signed his first professional contract there in 2007.

ENT

But with his route to first team football blocked by the likes of American international Tim Howard, he was deemed surplus to requirements by the Merseyside club, allowing Martin Ling to bring the youngster to E10.

Jones made his League debut at the end of January 2009 and became an instant hero - saving a stoppage time penalty to secure a 2-1 victory at Milton Keynes Dons in just his second game.

He kept his place between the sticks and ended the season as Orient's number one.



Most comfortable at right back, former West Ham junior Stephen can also operate further forward or on the left hand side, although it is as a rightsided full back that he joined the club.

After coming through the ranks at Upton Park, Purches was allowed to leave for Bournemouth where he made a total of 273 appearances in Bournemouth colours.





MKANDAWIRE

Robust defender Tamika Mkandawire joined The O's in June 2007 after a 12-month pursuit for his services. Former boss Martin Ling had been a long-time admirer of the Malawi-born centre back and he had a £60,000 bid for Mkandawire turned down by the Bulls prior to the 2006/07 season. But once his contract expired a year later, Ling wasted little time in persuading Tamika to join the O's on a three-year deal.

The talented defender settled in immediately in E10 and made an instant impact in the O's team, scoring the club's 5,000th Football League goal in the 2-2 draw with Northampton Town on September 1 2007. Mkandawire started his career at West Bromwich Albion, but he struggled to make the breakthrough at the Hawthorns and he moved to Hereford United on loan during the 2003/04 season to gain first team experience.

SUMMERFIELD

Plymouth Argyle midfielder Luke Summerfield joined Orient on loan in September 2009. With injuries sidelining Adam Chambers, Sean Thornton and Kristian O'Leary, O's boss Geraint Williams turned to Summerfield to plug the gap and he made a winning debut in a Brisbane Road London derby against Millwall. A 21-year-old central midfield player who came through the ranks at Plymouth, he made his debut at 17 at the end of the 2004/05 season. He has gone on to play 63 Championship games for Argyle, including three this season.

Summerfield also spent time on loan at AFC Bournemouth in the 2006/07 campaign and, after a successful first month in E10, will remain with the O's until December 22.

SCOWCROFT

The striker opted to link up with his former Ipswich Town teammate Geraint Williams once again when he put pento-paper on a one-year deal with the O's in July 2009 - 11 years after they lined up together for the Portman Road club.

O's boss Williams persuaded the Bury St Edmunds-born striker to move outside the top two divisions of English football for the first time after his release by Championship side Crystal

The physical frontman began his career with Ipswich, where he scored 47 goals in 202 Championship games between 1995 and 2001, winning five England under-21 caps in the process.

Scowcroft, who stands 6'1" tall, earned a £3million move to Leicester City in July 2001 and he found the net a further 28 times during his four years with the Foxes, which included two seasons in the Premier League.





GAFFER GERAINT WILLIAMS

Geraint Williams was appointed as manager of Leyton Orient on February 5 2009, replacing Martin Ling, who left the 0's by mutual consent the previous month.

Williams joined the club initially on a contract until the end of the season as Orient embarked on a crucial three-month battle to save their League One status.

47-year-old Welshman Williams previously managed Colchester United and led the U's to their highest-ever League position when they finished 10th in the Championship two seasons ago.

He spent just over two years in charge of Colchester, following a six-year spell as assistant to Steve Whitton and Phil Parkinson at Laver Road as the U's made progress through the Football League.

He becomes the 29th permanent manager of Leyton Orient and just the fifth under Barry Hearn's 14 years as chairman of the Club.

The former Welsh international made close to 700 Football League appearances in a playing career that lasted 20 years.

After beginning across the River Severn from his birthplace of Cwmparc at Bristol Rovers, he then played at the highest level for Derby County and Ipswich Town, enjoying seven seasons in the old Division One and Premier League.

He ended his professional career at Colchester United, where he spent a decade as player, coach and manager before leaving the Weston Homes Community Stadium club in September 2008.

Martin Ling and Craig Maskell were a part of Swindon's charge to the Premier League. Maskell was quite a force at one end – scoring 22 goals in 36 games during the 1992/93 season – which of course included a famous strike in the play-off final at Wembley.

At the other end loanee Paul Heald was drafted in towards the end of the campaign after injuries struck regular stoppers Fraser Digby and Nick Hammond. Goalkeepers Jon Sheffield and Stewart Kerr were also on the books during Town's one-season stay in the top-flight.

Sam Parkin lined up for Orient against Town on Boxing Day during a 13-game spell on loan from then League Two side Luton Town. The striker, who scored 67 goals in 120 league starts for The Robins, is now back in the first team at Walsall and came off the bench in last weekend's FA Cup defeat at Brentford.

More recently Patrick Kanyuka, who is now with Northampton Town, started off with Orient and impressed for The O's in a youth game against QPR and his display was enough to secure a permanent move to Loftus Road.

Midfielder Craig Easton was a popular figure at Brisbane Road during his two-year stay in the Capital after making the move South of the Border from Livingston. Easton's industrious displays from the heart of the midfield included a goal against Oxford United on the final day of the 2005/06 to secure promotion for Orient.

Open All Hours

One of the longest-serving members of full-time staff at The County Ground, Chris Abrook has seen more than most during his time at SN1. A familiar face to many Town fans - today we find out a little more about the journey from Singapore to Swindon.

Name: Chris Abrook Job Title: Bar Manager Year Joined: 1993

How did the role at Swindon Town come about and where were you working before?

I initially applied for a job at Allied Dunbar, which was over by where Tesco's is now. My details were then passed over to the football club and soon I was having an interview with the Hospitality Manager at STFC and I got the job as Bar Manager!

Before Swindon I was based at RAF Wroughton where I ran the officer's mess and the catering operation. It was a big job but it kept me busy. I had always lived on RAF bases as my Dad was in the forces so knew what it was like. Other jobs before that included being Head Barman at The Golden Lion Tap in Barnstaple, Devon!

You have seen a few Managers come and go here... what can you recall of the different styles?

Steve McMahon had a few strange rules. The players weren't allowed baked beans when he was here, although he was the first one who set-up the practice of players eating at the club before and after training. Before that the players just used to do their own thing.

Andy King was just loud! He was a nice guy though, through tough times at the club and he kept us entertained. Paul Sturrock had the players eating 'stovies' — a combination of corned beef and potatoes.

How has your role changed following the takeover of the club?

There is a lot more structure to the Club and it is now a lot more professional than it was before the new Board took over. There were times before when you didn't know whether you were going to get paid at all, let alone on time. Things are much improved now and it's much more enjoyable than it has ever been.

What are the best and worst aspects of the job?

The best thing is that no day is the same. You can go from managing the hospitality bars on a matchday



to changing a room around for a party in the evening. The job is varied although very rewarding. Making sure customers enjoy their time at The County Ground is an important part of the job. I'd say the worst thing is the long hours – but I don't mind because my job is both enjoyable and fulfilling.

harlie Austin's is a story as close to a footballing fairytale as it is possible to imagine.

Having been signed on at the age of 16 by the club he had followed as a young boy-Swindon Town-Austin's dreams of gracing The County Ground turf for a living were dashed when a serious knee injury saw him released from the club.

"I thought my chance was gone to be honest," he admits. "My Dad's a building contractor so I just worked with him and I didn't think I'd get a second chance in football."

Austin went on to play at nonleague level for both Hungerford and Poole Town, while working for his father, dreaming that one day he might get another opportunity to prove himself at professional level.

A few years and an impressive non-league goal scoring record later, the 20-year-old now boasts a 100% scoring record in professional football-netting in both his first team starts against Carlisle United and Huddersfield Town-and he admits he could not have wished for a better start.

"I have adapted to it a lot quicker than I thought I would-it's been an unbelievable start," he said.

"I never thought I'd be anywhere near where I am now, but I think it's gone so well because I've worked really hard.

"I've had to put a lot of hard work in a non-league level, and it's looking like all the grafting I've done has paid off, but I'm not getting ahead of myself."

Austin's goal scoring exploits and affection for the club have immediately endeared him to The County Ground faithful-including a particular section of The Don Rogers Stand with whom he celebrated the winning goal against Huddersfield Town last time out.

"They are some really good mates of mine, so it was great when I scored in front of them," he said.

"They always sit there and have

been Swindon fans since they were born really! My parents come to watch me a lot too, and they're obviously very proud to see me playing for Swindon. They live locally so it's easy for them to get up here, and it's good for me to know they're watching me play."

A boyhood Town fan, Austin is delighted to be living the dream of many young players, but is refusing to get carried away with his dream start as he is aware of the amount of work still to be done if he is to earn an extension on his contract which currently expires at the end of this term.

He said: "It is starting to sink in that I'm playing here, to a degree, but I still pinch myself sometimes and I think I always will. For me, even to make it as a professional was great, but to be playing for the team I supported when I was younger is even better.

"Now I just need to keep taking it one step at a time, and hopefully the goals will come, the team will do well and I can get a contract extension."

Before footballing commitments dictated when he could visit The County Ground, Austin was a regular at SN1, and recalls his most memorable moment from his time in the stands: "I remember when Rory Fallon scored that overhead kick against Bristol City

a few years ago," he said.

"I think we drew 1-1 in the end but it was such a memorable game just because of that great goal.

"Ever since I started playing men's football at 15 it's been difficult for me to get to games because I was playing every Saturday.

"So it has been quite hard to get to games but I always checked for the Swindon results. I never thought one day I'd be back here playing. Not once."

With Leyton Orient today's visitors, Austin is confident Town can continue their surge up the League One table in what he expects to be another tough encounter.

He said: "Leyton Orient are down towards the bottom but they're going to come here with nothing to lose, needing the points just as much as we do.

"There's going to be pressure on us as the home side, but we're confident we can get another win. You can see how tight it is up there towards the top of the table, so anything can happen really.

"If you lose, you drop down a few places, and if you win, you're right up there so if we keep winning we'll get in the play-offs and I think that's where we can end up this season."

SYNDROME GROUP

Our aim is to support people with Down's syndrome, their families and carers and also anyone with an interest in Down's syndrome by providing information, advice and support as well as raising general awareness. We are a parentled support group run by a committee of 14 volunteers and a registered charity - 1096089 - affiliated to the National Down's Syndrome Association. All our work is funded by our Group and the money is raised through jumble sales, sponsored walk, donations and grants from local companies and businesses.


The group provides opportunities for parents to support each other by organising trips to the theatre, theme parks, a Christmas party, barbecues, activity sessions and monthly baby/toddler support meetings. We aim to provide training and information through an annual training day aimed at teachers and teaching assistants and through seminars throughout the year. We also

support pre-schools, primary and secondary schools by providing school resource packs containing manuals, flash cards, software, DVD's, numeracy resources and

books aimed at educating a child with Down's syndrome.

The Group also provides some specialist sporting activities – football training run in conjunction with Swindon Town Community Team. This training session is open to all children with a disability between the ages of 5 – 18. Tennis lessons with a specialist coach and fortnightly swimming lessons with a specialist swimming coach and working towards nationally recognised qualifications. The Group also runs weekly speech and language therapy sessions.

PRE-ACTIVITY, DURING & POST EXERCISE



It is common for endurance athletes to carbo-load for events 90 minutes or longer. Carbo-loading aims to prevent the onset of fatigue during endurance events. If completed properly, carbo-loading will almost double the normal amount of stored glycogen found in a trained person. It is suggested to carbo-load in the 2-3 days leading up to an event. Sports nutritionists recommend consuming 9-10 grams of carbs per kilograms of body weight.

There are two types of carbs:

Simple and Complex. Simple carbohydrates are also called simple sugars and are found in refined sugars (white table sugar or sweets). They are also found in foods such as fruit and milk. Complex carbohydrates are also known as starches. Starches include grain products, such as bread, crackers, pasta, and rice, which should make up your pre exercise meal. Some complex carbohydrate foods are better than others. White rice and white flour have been processed. which removes nutrients and fibre. It is always better to choose whole wheat flour and brown rice whenever possible. These grains contain vitamins and minerals and are rich in fibre, which aids digestion. Fibre also helps you feel full, so you are less likely to overeat. Depending on activity level, most individuals require 4-6 grams of carbs per kilogram (1.8-2.7 per pound) of body weight.

Pre Activity:

It is important to fuel your muscles with carbohydrates. They should be eaten with a little bit of protein approximately 1-3 hours prior to activity, depending on your digestive system. If you process food really quickly, then 1-2 hours should

suffice. On the other hand, if you have a slow digestive system, 3 hours may be better.

During Activity:

If you are exercising longer than 75 minutes you will need to replenish your glycogen stores with the necessary fuel to keep your muscles functioning optimally. This may come in the form of energy drinks (Powerade, Refresh, Ultima), energy gels (e.g., Science in Sport, Powergel, and Lucozade). The ideal is 100-250 calories (or 25-60 grams of carbs) per hour, after the first hour of running. That is the equivalent of one to 2 ½ sports gels or 16-40 oz of sports drink per hour.

Post Activity:

Directly after prolonged or intense exercise, specifically within the first 15-30 minutes, it is important to replenish muscle glycogen. The tank is going to be empty and unless you replace what you used, the tank (your muscles) will be dry the next time you go to use it. Liquids are the easiest and quickest way to do this. It is recommended to have a ratio of 3:1 carbs to protein. Energy shakes and smoothies are great, as many athletes don't have the appetite for a plate full of food after exercise. These drinks contain the right levels of carbs and protein ratio and help with refuelling and muscle repair. Furthermore, post exercise, blood is still in your muscles, there is not a lot in the stomach for digestion. If you eat solid food to replace your stores, it may take longer to be absorbed and digested, and you risk missing that 30 minute window. It is important that within the next 45-90 minutes you have a larger whole foods meal with a 3:1 ratio of carbs to protein.

We saw the specialist on Wednesday and we are hopeful that he will be fit in time for today's game.

I made a remark to the Manager on Tuesday night after the decision to call the Stockport game off. It was that Jonathan Douglas would be the only one at the club happy to see the game not go ahead! He was most disappointed that he would have missed the game so from his point of view, the call-off was a bonus.

Elsewhere, Kurt Hammonds had a bit of a setback a few weeks ago. We had a second opinion on the knee and that confirmed what we already knew. There is plenty of work to do to get him up and running again but we will keep going.

Where was the **LAST** shop you visited?


Reiss in Cheltenham a few days ago. I didn't buy anything but the bonus was that the Wife didn't buy anything either!


