

ood afternoon and welcome back to The County Ground, for this our last home fixture of 2009, before we herald in the arrival of 2010 and all of the hope that a New Year brings.

I recall vividly this time last year and the visit of Yeovil Town FC when we were still managerless and languishing in 20th position in the league. We lost 3 – 2 and the result starkly reminded us of the urgent need for a new manager. At the time Andrew Fitton, Jeremy Wray and I were travelling up and down the motorways in search of the right man and then along came Danny Wilson. Danny's appointment on Christmas Eve 2008 was the source of much needed change and signalled a new beginning at STFC.

Now whilst on the subject of Danny Wilson, may I take this opportunity to extend to him, on behalf of everyone at Swindon Town, Directors, staff, players and supporters alike, a very Happy Birthday for January 1st. A New Year and a new life beginning 50 years ago- congratulations DW.

So I hope that you spent an enjoyable Christmas and the Robins certainly provided you with that extra special Christmas cheer by defeating a fiercely competitive Brighton & Hove Albion, and in doing so moved to 6th place in the division. Let us hope we are still in the dizzy play off heights at KO time today but as I sit here on December 22nd, penning these notes, it is beyond me to predict the Charlton Athletic result!

At the end of an old year and on the eve of a new one, there is a tendency to adopt a reflective mode, questioning what has been achieved, what progress has been made in the old year and what opportunities and change may the New Year hold? We've shown on many occasions so far this season that if we perform the way that we know we can, we can match anyone, and I think if we do that again today we can get a result.


Obviously Yeovil are in and around the bottom of the relegation zone, but that is not going to count for much by the time the match kicks off today.




Next weekend attentions will turn away from League One to the FA Cup. I will be making the trip across to Fulham with my two sons

January →

27: A draw against Stockport and a narrow defeat away at Huddersfield are followed by Danny Wilson's first win as Swindon manager. Town were in the driving seat at half-time thanks to Kevin Amankwaah's opener and Simon Cox's contender for goal of the season, a stunning volley from 35-yards Wilson described as a Bergkamp-ilk type of goal. Despite taking a 3-0 goal early in the second half. Town make it a nervous finale after conceding two goals in two minutes.

February →


Another two-goal lead at half-time at The County Ground, but this time it was visitors Scunthorpe who had it. Town showed great character to come from behind and beat the promotion chasers - at one stage down to nine men - 4-2.

26: Town youngsters Sean Morrison and Callum Kennedy sign contract extensions to their current deals. The duo signed on until the summer of 2010.

March \rightarrow

Wilson bolsters his squad with the signing of Welsh international midfielder Owain Tudur-Jones from Swansea on an initial month-long loan. The 24-year-old made his debut days later against Colchester and joined fellow loanee, Hal Robson Kanu, who joined from Reading.

24: Town secure one of the most crucial wins of the 2008/09 season as Cox's third hat-trick of the year sees us come from behind to beat relegation rivals Northampton Town 4-3 at Sixfields. "I think he can go to the top - no doubt about it," said Wilson after the game. "I can see players in the Premier League at







this moment in time, who have had decent careers at that level, but who aren't as good as him."

26: West Ham boss Gianfranco Zola scores a hat-trick as a Chelsea Legends XI beat a Swindon Town XI 3-2 in Christian Roberts' testimonial. More than 3,100 fans came to the Welshman's send off after he was forced to retire last September with a knee injury.

April →

Another game against relegation rivals sees Town snatch a glorious 3-2 away win at Brighton. A stunning start to the second half sees Gordon Greer, Billy Paynter and Simon Cox all find the scoresheet in a win Wilson describes as "a big result".

25: A Cox double virtually secures Swindon's League One survival in a 2-1 win against Bristol Rovers

at The County Ground. The lively frontman hit goals 29 and 30 with goals either side of the break to ensure the victory.

$May \rightarrow$

- 2: The Stratton Bank is renamed Adkins Family Stand for the next two seasons, following the result of the club's Stand Buy Me initiative. Simon Adkins' winning ticket was drawn live on Soccer AM by Town Chairman Andrew Fitton.
- Later that day, Town finish the season on a high with a 2-2 draw away at league winners Peterborough United. Cox signs off with a brace.
- 6: Wilson clears the decks for a busy summer by releasing 13 players including Michael Pook, Jack Smith, Jamie Vincent, Peter Brezovan and Barry Corr.
- 12: After a successful loan spell from Doncaster Rovers, Scottish defender Gordon Greer becomes Wilson's first signing of the summer after agreeing a two-year deal. The 28-year-old was released at the end of the season.

June →

- 2: Goalkeeper David Lucas puts pen to paper and joins Wilson's revolution. He joins on a free transfer after being released by Leeds United.
- 16: David Byrne is appointed Head of Player Development.
- 22: The backroom staff continues to take shape when Peter Shirtliff is named as Wilson's new right-hand man, three weeks after the former Tranmere assistant boss left his position at Prenton Park.

July ->

8: The news Town fans feared all summer finally comes when West Bromwich Albion complete the signing of top scorer Cox in a





- £1.9 million deal. Cox, 22, joined the Midlands side on a two-year contract.
- 10: Every cloud has a silver lining, and shortly after Coxy's departure, Town announce the arrival of former Leeds midfielder and Republic of Ireland international Jonathan Douglas.
- 12: Pre-season begins with a trip to Austria. The Reds kick-off the tour with a 1-1 draw against last season's Champions League giantkillers, FC Cluj.
- 13: Town make it five signings by adding 22-year-old defender Scott Cuthbert to the defensive ranks. The former Celtic man signs a two-year deal.
- 28: Cox returns as Town face West Brom in a friendly. Greer scores his first goal for the club with a header in the first half, and it was enough for the Robins to win the game 1-0.
- 31: Town announce the signing of 20-year-old Polish Under-21 international Jakub Jesionkowski. The youngster joins from Zaglebie Lubin.



August →

- 8: The new campaign gets off to a less than auspicious start with a 5-0 reverse against rivals Gillingham at Priestfield. "It couldn't have gone any worse could it?" says Wilson. "I'm completely gobsmacked," he continued. "We've got to now repay the faith the fans have put in us on Tuesday with a performance." They did, and put four past MK Dons in the Carling Cup.
- 12: Jerel Ifil completes a surprise move north of the border to Aberdeen. The centre-back wasn't involved in Town's Carling Cup victory over the Dons. Four days later The Beast makes his debut. Against Celtic!
- 14: Town announce the signing of 19-year-old striker Temitope Obadeyi on a one-month loan deal from Bolton Wanderers.
- 18: Town's opening days blues are banished by one of the wins of the season, a comprehensive 1-0 drubbing of Southampton. Sean Morrison scores in the ninth minute and Town spurn chances to add to the scoreline in a pulsating performance.
- 25: Town are knocked out of the Carling Cup on penalties at Molineux. The visitors put in a cracking performance against top-flight strugglers Wolves, but Greer's missed spot-kick was enough to end the run.
- 27: Town continue to reinforce and Celtic duo Simon Ferry and Ben Hutchinson arrive on loan. "Bringing the boys in has been a big lift for everybody," said Wilson. "They're very enthusiastic, really ready for the challenge and excited about coming down."







September →

- 2: Alex Revell adds more presence to Town's strike-force after joining on loan from Southend. "He's a very good athlete and he's going to be a threat in the box with his height," explained Wilson. "He's a big unit, very mobile and he started for Southend against us on Saturday. He obviously didn't score, but was up against some very good defenders that day," he joked.
- 8: Town give a trial to youngster Charlie Austin, who bagged 46 goals in 46 games for Poole Town in 2008/09...

October →

2: ... a month later, after impressing for the reserves, Austin seals a permanent switch in a deal until the end of the season, with the option to extend further.





November →

- 10: Another decent cup
 performance, another exit on
 penalties. This time it was at
 the hands of Norwich, in the
 Johnstone's Paint Trophy. "It was a
 cracking game," explained Wilson.
 "As the second half went on I
 thought you saw two cracking teams
 out there and for the last 25 minutes
 that was us at our best. We were
 exceptional at times."
- 14: With Gordon Greer and Scott Cuthbert in scintillating form, Sean Morrison signs a one-month loan deal with Southend United.
- 21: After making his first appearance from the bench away at Norwich, Austin starts his first game, away at Carlisle... and scores the winner. "It was a great experience." He said. "When I look back I will never forget this moment. If someone asks me when I scored my first goal, I will be able to tell them instantly away to Carlisle and we won 1-0. Pictures of that will be in my head for a long time."
- 26: Anthony McNamee joins Norwich on loan. "I saw him (McNamee) play a few years ago when I was at Wycombe in a preseason friendly against Watford," said Canaries boss Paul Lambert. "I'm glad we have got him in and he gives us another option."
- 26: Bigger news follows when Town make the following statement on the official website: "The Board of Swindon Town is pleased to confirm





that the issue relating to the loan between St. Modwen Properties plc and Swindon Town Football Company Limited has today been resolved to the full satisfaction of both parties."


- 27: Alan Sheehan becomes the third player to join from Leeds, albeit on loan. The left-sided player is joined by young striker Darren Ward, who signs on loan from Bolton.
- 29: Town's reward for beating Wrexham in round two of the FA Cup is an away tie against Fulham. "We couldn't have asked for more," says Wilson. Town fans agree, and more than 5,000 tickets are sold in the next two weeks.

December →


- 5: Town add to the points tally with a 3-2 victory over Leyton Orient.

 Austin and Paynter both find the net.
- 19: The duo do it again in a hardfought 2-1 win against Gus Poyet's Brighton that sends The Robins sixth with two games in hand. "We are on target for where we want to be," says Wilson. "The squad we have got together at this moment in time have proved that they can live in the top areas, and we've got to continue doing that."













This term Skiverton has seen his side defeat Tranmere Rovers, Brentford, Carlisle United, Bristol Rovers and Southend United. Skiverton will hope a positive Christmas run of results can help his side edge away from the lower echelons of League One.

The meeting between the two sides earlier in the campaign at

Huish Park saw The Robins take all three points. It was a tight encounter with an own goal from veteran defender Terrell Forbes just before the break enough to see the three points make their way back to Wiltshire. The game also saw Swindon boss Danny Wilson sent to the stands after protestations following a foul on Lecsinel Jean-Francois.

In total there have been only eight meetings between the two teams. Swindon are ahead with four wins whilst The Glovers have triumphed on three occasions. One of the more memorable encounters was a 4-2 win under Andy King's management in 2005 on home turf. Terry Skiverton scored a goal at each end on the

day with further strikes coming from Rory Fallon, on-loan Manchester United winger Colin Heath and Christian Roberts. Also returning to The County Ground today will be Martyn Starnes, a former Chief Executive here at SN1.

Yeovil's danger-man will be onloan Spurs frontman Jonathan Obika who has found the net on six occasions so far this term. Obika is in his second spell at Huish Park and will hope to spearhead a win for the visitors this afternoon. Former Ipswich striker Dean Bowditch could also feature with four goals to his name, including one in each of the opening two games of the campaign.

before returning to the Liberty Stadium in February.



He left Upton Park and made the journey across London to Queens Park Rangers where he was a popular figure winning the Player of the Year award there. The following season

he helped his team to automatic promotion into the Championship. Two months into the new season, he departed Loftus Road and made the long trip up to Grimsby Town where he stayed for one season before crossing the country and signing on for Oldham Athletic.

Russell Slade then signed him halfway through a two-year deal at Boundary Park and since then, his consistent displays at centre-half have made him an invaluable part of the defence. He scored an own goal in the previous meeting between Town and Yeovil earlier in the campaign.

KALALA

Jean-Paul Kalala recently signed a short-term contract with the club until the end of 2009 after returning to Huish Park for a second spell. He spent a one-season stay earlier in his career, the same year that Yeovil reached the play-off final.

JP, as he is known, began his career at Nice and came over to the UK signing for Grimsby Town spending a season at Blundell Park.

He joined Yeovil and scored one goal in his 41 appearances previously but had an inadvertent hand in Yeovil's second leg play-off semi final victory over Nottingham Forest. His shot rebounded off a post and defender Alan Wright to bring the score back to 3-2 on aggregate. He left the Glovers and joined Oldham Athletic for two seasons which included a loan spell-back at Grimsby Town before he was released last season.


Kalala received his marching orders against Gillingham 11 minutes from time although returned to action for the trip to MK Dons at the start of the month.


TOMLIN

He signed for Yeovil in July 2008 from Fisher Athletic for whom he had enjoyed a prolific season, previously scoring 24 goals in total. The frontman began his career at Aylesbury United and also had spells with Staines Town, St Albans, Yeading and Windsor & Eton before moving into the professional ranks of the Football League with Brentford.

After making 13 appearances for the Griffin Park team, he joined Fisher Athletic where he played in the same team as fellow Glovers Keiran Murtagh and Andre McCollin.





Terry Skiverton has been Yeovil's player-manager since February 2009 when he succeeded previous manager Russell Slade.

His early career was spent in London where he was a trainee at Chelsea. He didn't make the first team there and spent a period on loan at Wycombe Wanderers before making the move permanent.

After two seasons at Adams Park, he dropped out of League football and joined Welling United, enjoying a spell in the limelight as a cast member on Sky One's Dream Team.

Yeovil Manager Colin Lippiatt signed the defender for Yeavil and he was soon made captain and he helped helped Yeavil into the Football League for the first time scoring six times along the way as the Glovers romped away with the Conference title. He almost captained the side to two consecutive promotions as the first League season ended with the team missing out on the play-offs by goal difference.

Another promotion was achieved the following season though by winning League Two and Terry had his third winners' medal in just four seasons.

The disappointment of the 2007 Play-Off final was only slightly softened by his selection in the PFA League One Team of the Year.

Mildenhall is still in League One with Southend United, whilst Sheffield played in the Premier League for The Robins in 1994. He became the first ever player to wear the number 40 shirt in a top-flight fixture when playing for Swindon against Aston Villa.




uestion of the Day, as posed to me by e-mail as we beat Brighton here in the final fixture before Christmas:

The STFC Superstore is almost unrecognisable following a series of changes. Head of Retail Clare Haworth has made a significant impact since joining The Robins and we find out a little more about the woman who puts the shirt on your back...

Name: Clare Haworth Job Title: Head of Retail Year Joined: 2008

How did the role at Swindon Town come about and where were you working before?

I was working for Ernest Jones in Swindon, where I had been for three years when I got a call from a Sports Recruitment Agency. They asked me if I would be interested in working for a football club and then I found out about the opportunity here at Swindon. Being a football fan I jumped at the chance of joining such a progressive club. Being based in Swindon the location was ideal and it provided me with a new challenge.

What were the most challenging aspects of the job when you first came in?

To make the shop look more desirable to the customer. From a retail perspective the lay-out of the shop was incorrect and needed addressing pretty quickly. There was also an urgent need to increase the range of products available as at the time of joining there was only seven weeks left until Christmas. Nothing had been ordered so time was of the essence!

Matchdays must be pretty manic, how busy does it get?!

Very! We open the store at 10am and we sometimes get up to 200 children visiting almost at once as part of the Football in the Community Saturday Team Club scheme. They often visit soon after opening and return around half eleven. Once they have been in and out, stock has to be replenished before the real rush starts for the game. At around one o'clock supporters start arriving and with new products arriving all the time, customers return regularly so they don't miss out on the offerings.

The STFC Online Shop was launched a year ago, how much of a success has that been?

The success showed almost immediately. There are Town fans across the globe and the orders soon started coming in from places like Australia and Brazil! This Christmas the online shop has proved hugely popular with a large volume of orders being placed! The merchandise catalogue is available to view online and is available to collect from the club shop for gift ideas in 2010.



What are the best and worst aspects of the job?

Matchdays are the best and worst part of the job. I love all the anticipation building up to the games - the excitement amongst the fans generates a really good atmosphere in the shop and a home win makes everything worth it! The worst part is when the result doesn't go our way and seeing the disappointment on fans' faces after a game. Hopefully today will have a happy ending for all!



Season Outcome For Both Clubs

Between the two games Swindon parted company with boss Andy King. A 3-2 home defeat by Bradford City in September put paid to the boss' second spell in charge at The County Ground, and by the time the two Towns met in the Spring, Iffy Onuora held the Swindon Town reins.

Ultimately the change at the top made little difference as we slumped into the basement division at the end of the season with a 23rd place finish.

Yeovil fared better with their highest ever finish, clinching 15th place in League One under Steve Thompson. By the start of 2006/07, both teams were led by new men once more, Swindon opting for Dennis Wise and Yeovil employing Russell Stade.



hen Danny Wilson stepped into the breach left by Maurice Malpas on Boxing Day last year, Town's beleaguered squad were flirting with the League One relegation places.

A year on almost to the day, The Robins are now firmly in the play off shake up, and have an FA Cup Third Round tie at Fulham to look forward to this Saturday.

Despite masterminding this impressive turnaround on the pitch, Wilson himself believes a lot of the credit for the club's recent success should go to the consortium led by Chairman Andrew Fitton who saved the club from extinction in January 2008.

He said: "It has gone pretty well for me so far, but you have to tip your hat to the owners.

"Andrew (Fitton), Jeremy (Wray) and the other board members have supported the club, and brought it to the position it is in now.

"We wanted to be in an area in January where we might be challenging for the play offs, and we look like we've got a decent chance of doing that which is great."

Wilson started last season as manager at League One rivals Hartlepool United, but when he left Victoria Park in mid-December, the Town board wasted little time in making their move-ridding him of his worries about the club's chequered past in the process.

As he describes: "I think it was within two or three days of leaving Hartlepool that I got a phone call from Nick Watkins, asking if I would like to have a chat with the owners, and through courtesy I said yes which I always do.

"My biggest concern about Swindon was the history of how the club had been run, because their problems had been well documented.

"But those worries were dispelled almost instantly when I met the guys, as they were brilliant. We had a great conversation about the direction they wanted to move the club in, and the rest is history."

Wilson's first game in charge resulted in a 2-0 home defeat against Brighton & Hove Albion, but the manager sought to rectify the side's main weaknesses, and subsequently making Town a difficult side to beat.

He said: "Brighton was obviously a disappointing defeat, but for me it was a bit of a blessing in disguise because it didn't paper over any cracks.

"I knew I needed to make them more solid, because they had conceded a lot of goals and were only heading in one direction at that time.

"So the first thing was to shore up the defence, which we did by getting Gordon (Greer) in, and we got a few results by doing that."

Town secured their League One status with a home win over Bristol Rovers in April, and after a trying few months at the helm, Wilson admits it hadn't come a moment too soon.

"It was a massive relief when it finally came," he said.



"We looked like we were going to do it at Yeovil a month earlier, but we lost there and had a bit of a blip afterwards.

"We would have loved to have been safe earlier, but the Bristol Rovers game here guaranteed us safety and there was no better game to do it in.

"Obviously our planning for this season got delayed a little because we didn't secure safety until late on, so we couldn't start as early as we would have liked, but we got going as soon as we could."

With League One football guaranteed for another year, Wilson spent the summer re-moulding the squad, with some notable arrivals and departures-including Simon Cox's high profile £1.9m move to West Bromwich Albion.

While an immediate replacement was not found, Wilson was happy to have spent the summer building the solid nucleus of players which has served the side so well this term.

He said: "A player of the quality of Coxy, having done what he did last

season was always going to attract interest, and if the price was right, the board were not going to stand in his way.

"We had a few enquiries and close misses with replacements, but my priority was always to get the backline sorted, because you can't win games 4-3 every week.

"We got the middle of the team as strong as possible over the summer, with Jonathan Douglas, Scott Cuthbert and Gordon being big signings for us, and they've helped us set up a pretty good foundation."

Despite a 5-0 opening day thrashing at Gillingham, just three subsequent defeats, numerous impressive performances and some effective signings including striking sensation Charlie Austin have given the manager reason to believe that his first full season in charge can be a successful one.

He said: "Having got the team together and built those solid foundations, to get whacked 5-0 in your first game is a bit of a blow! "It was a shot across our bows, and we had to work hard to ensure we didn't do anything silly like that again, but the lads rallied brilliantly and kicked on with some great results and performances which have got us around the play off area.

"The plan now is to bring in some more players in January, and hope to push on from there."

And as far as 2010 is concerned, Wilson is confident he can end his first full season in charge at The County Ground at right end of the table.

He said: "I genuinely do think we can be challenging at the end of the season.

"I don't think anybody is underestimating us now, because we have proven we can compete with anyone in this league.

"If we can keep everybody fit, and bring a couple in as we go along, I think we've got a good chance of being up there come the end of the season."

ome to Victoria Falls, the South Central African nation had the potential to become one of the continent's richest countries following its declaration of independence in 1964 but colonial legacy, mismanagement, debt and disease are said to have rendered Zambia one of the

world's poorest countries.

local children.

Aids and malaria have had a crippling effect, leaving millions of inhabitants living below the World Bank poverty threshold of \$1 a day. Zambia is land-locked by the Democratic Republic of Congo, Zimbabwe and Angola and as a result is saturated with tens of thousands of refugees who have fled the fighting.


And after a chance encounter at the Gothia Youth Cup in Sweden in 2005, Swindon's Football in the Community Development Manager Clive Maguire decided to travel out Zambia and help make a difference.

"The Gothia Cup is the biggest youth competition in the world," he said. "And the African nations ignite the stadium when they arrive.

"In a lot of cases it takes these teams four or five years of fundraising to be able to play. Normally they are crammed into one room - 16 all sleeping a tight area just so they can play.

"In 2005, a Zambian team won the competition and that sparked our interest in helping and we decided to travel out there and see what we could do."

Maguire was joined by fellow FITC Development Manager Jon Holloway in 2008 as they teamed up with 'Alive and Kicking' - a charity operating



in Africa which partly produces footballs for the continent - spending five days in the capital Lusaka.

Many of the local children have to endure a ten mile walk under the relentless sun to get to training so the duo worked closely with local legend Samuel Matete - winner of the 400m hurdles silver medal at the 1996 Atlanta Olympic Games - to coach local children and provide them with vital equipment

In late November the pair returned, this time to Livingstone with the charity African Impact. FITC Community Development Coaches Tim Hall and Luke Sharps joined the team to deliver eight days of coaching with local schools and clubs including a 16-team tournament and several afternoons of painting schools and making bricks for the community.

"In the long long term we would like to finance a team over in Zambia that could play in Sweden in the Gothia Cup," added Maguire. "This year we were able to take kit, boots and equipment out for the players.

"We had a football boots appeal prior to leaving and were able to take around 500 boots out to Zambia which made a massive difference as most children play bare footed.

"We managed to leave a couple of Samba goals as well as Level 1 and Level 2 coaching education packs. Just to see their faces when we were able to provide them with basic equipment was fantastic."

The team has built a strong relationship with the Zambian FA and are dedicated to implementing and running football programmes to give children a chance of building their own futures in a country where life expectancy is just 45 years for men and 46 for women.

Will Prochaska, Director at Alive & Kicking said: "Coaching trips such as these are so important to communities in Zambia that rarely have access to professional quality coaching or even to balls. The impact on Alive & Kicking of being involved with such a positive project by Swindon Town FC has also been massive, and has helped us make a bigger difference to the people we work with."



A POSTCARD FROM AFRICA

With Clive Maguire & Jon Holloway

Monday 30th November

After a 10-hour flight from London Heathrow the day before we arrived at Lusaka. First up was a visit to a factory at Lusaka where we collected 50 footballs which we had purchased before taking a short flight to Livingstone. The coaching programme began in the evening, taking a session with Nirmala Youth FC before their game against Livingstone Police, Nirmala won their game 5-1!





Tuesday 1st December

It was an early start for the team as we visited Nakatindi Community School, coaching over 200 children between five and fourteen years old. We took thirty footballs into the school – you could see the delight on the faces of the children when they saw the brand new footballs. Previously games had been played with plastic bags and rags twined together.

The whole of the morning was spent at Nakatindi with matches and training. On departure we handed over books and crayons to the Headmaster of the school before making our way to Maanu Mbwami Community School, which

was a new school built by the African Impact Project with the help of volunteers.

In the evening we took another coaching session with the Nirmala team, who train every evening from 4.30pm until nightfall at around 7pm!

Wednesday and December

This was the start of a two-day coaching project which saw us work with around 25 coaches from Livingstone and the surrounding area. Jon, Tim, Luke and I delivered FA Standard Level One and Level Two sessions and also left DVD's and coaching packs with the Zambian FA for their future use. We spent all day at Livingstone, with the sessions culminating in a number of question and answer sessions with the coaches and Zambian FA representatives.





Thursday and December

A varied day which saw our coaching team divided in two. Jon and I finished off the coaching programme at Livingstone whist Tim and Luke went to Mwandi Community School about five miles away.

In the afternoon the learn got back together with an afternoon's brick-making on the agenda! A break from football coaching - but it was a really enjoyable experience with lots of photos taken with children from around the area.

Friday 4th December

Our penultimate day in Africa saw our coaching team manage a sixteen-team tournament, with children aged between thirteen and seventeen. Each of the teams that took part were allocated twenty pairs of boots and a full playing kit. This was a very humbling moment as we saw the equipment which had been donated to Swindon Town Football in the Community over the previous year finally find such a deserving home. The day was one of the highlights of the whole trip. The competition started at 10am in the morning and came to a close around nightfall after a fantastic day enjoyed by all.



Saturday 5th December

Our final day saw a meeting with the coaching

association and we brought back a formal coaching agreement between STFC Football in the Community and the Livingstone FA. This is something that we will look to further develop as the years go on and we hope to establish a community programme under the Livingstone-Swindon banner.

Overall it was an outstanding seven days with the FITC team achieving so much and hopefully laying the foundations for us to build upon and have our own community programme in this exceptionally deprived area of Africa.


Who knows, in ten years time we may see a Livingstone player come through and play at The County Ground in Swindon Town colours which would be a dream come true.











The group provides opportunities for parents to support each other by organising trips to the theatre, theme parks, a Christmas party, barbecues, activity sessions and monthly baby/toddler support meetings. We aim to provide training and information through an annual training day aimed at teachers and teaching assistants and through seminars throughout the year. We also

support pre-schools, primary and secondary schools by providing school resource packs containing manuals, flash cards, software, DVD's, numeracy resources and books aimed at educating a child with Down's syndrome.

PLYOMETRIC TRAINING

thletes from a wide range of sports use plyometric training to help them reach peak physical condition. Used correctly, it can be a highly effective form of power training, without the expense of equipment.

Plyometric training involves practicing plyometric movements to toughen



tissues and train nerve cells to stimulate a specific pattern of muscle contraction so the muscle generates as strong a contraction as possible in the shortest amount of time.

A plyometric contraction involves first a rapid muscle lengthening movement (eccentric phase), followed immediately after by an explosive muscle shortening movement (concentric phase), with Gordon Greer seen here completing a jump.

For a muscle to cause movement it must shorten, during this movement alone there is a maximum amount of force with which can be generated. However, if the muscle is lengthened just prior to this contraction, it will produce greater force through the storage of elastic energy. This effect requires that the transition time between the eccentric contraction and concentric contraction be very short. This energy dissipates rapidly, so the concentric contraction must rapidly follow the eccentric stretch. The process is frequently referred to as the "stretch shortening cycle", and is one of the underlying mechanisms of plyometric training. This stretching of the muscles, prior to the explosive contraction that follows, is often called "loading". The faster and greater the load the more powerful the reflex and subsequent contraction.

The golden rule of any conditioning program is specificity. This means that the movement you perform in training should match, as closely as possible, the movements encountered during competition. If you are rugby player, practicing for the line-out or a volleyball player interested in increasing vertical jump height, then drop jumping or box jumping may be the right exercise. However if you are a javelin thrower aiming for a more explosive launch, then upper body plyometrics is far more appropriate.

The important thing is to return Callum to full training as soon as possible.





Who would have come LAST in the club Christmas party best dressed competition?






Probably Ben Hutchinson who went as Mr Potatohead. The only problem was that it was better than what he usually wears anyway!
