the gaffer

Good afternoon and welcome back to The County Ground for this afternoon's match against Carlisle United.

We're coming off the back of what was an excellent point gained away at Huddersfield Town last weekend, and are full of confidence ahead of what will be another tough game in League One.

We knew last Saturday would be our biggest test to date, and a point just keeps us ticking along nicely. It was a massive game for both sides and was

despite a defeat on Tuesday against Huddersfield.

Many people will see us as clear favourites for this game, but it is important we treat it as we would any other game, because I can guarantee it won't be any easier a task to beat Carlisle than it was to beat Leeds or any other team in this league.

All of a sudden we've become favourites in games, whereas at the start of the season we might not have been which obviously puts more pressure on us, but it's a great

important we didn't lose it so I was delighted to come away with the point.

We didn't set up for the draw at all, but as the game wore on we came under more and more pressure and must be pleased with a point.

We defended very well in the second half under intense pressure, and had to rely on David (Lucas) a few times especially during the second half, but the most pleasing thing was that we've learnt our lessons from the last couple of weeks when we've conceded late on and that was very encouraging.

I even think we might have nicked it towards the end because they were throwing caution to the wind and left a few gaps at the back, but I was delighted with a point overall.

I fully expect Huddersfield to be up there at the end, and it's vital for us to have got the point, and I think we'll see how good a point it is if we can get maximum points from the Carlisle and Stockport games.

Looking towards today's game, I'm confident we can get a result against a Carlisle team who will be confident after two high profile wins against Leeds United and MK Dons

pressure to be under and is the sort of thing we enjoy.

No one needs me to say how difficult a game it's going to be because even though they lost on Tuesday against a tough Huddersfield team, they've just beaten MK Dons 5-0 last Saturday so will still be confident from that.

To pump five goals past MK Dons is no mean feat, and something we will definitely have to be wary of, because their front players will be full of confidence.

They're coming into the game in great form so we're expecting it to be tough and are taking nothing for granted whatsoever.

I don't think anybody else should be either, but we've given everybody a lot of optimism and I believe that we can sustain our run, starting today



"Our furry mascot is a large fox known as OLGA (an anagram of GOAL) and the fox association goes back to the days of John Peel – a philanthropist, renowned policeman [The Peelers] and local character," said Hall.

"His hunting exploits became synonymous with Cumbria and it



became tradition for local man George Baxter (aka Twinkletoes) to place a stuffed fox on the penalty spot prior to kick-off at every home game – something which George Baxter carried out from 1947 until he passed away in 1987."


From the Boardroom

Swindon Town FC this afternoon has the pleasure of welcoming Carlisle United and all who travel with them to The County Ground, for this the 16th home league fixture of the season.

After today's fixture only 16 league games remain, how quickly a season passes!

Carlisle United have been enjoying a purple patch of form of late until their most recent home defeat to Huddersfield Town last Tuesday evening but we know what tough competitors the "Terriers" can be. Danny Wilson's Red Army visited The Galpharm Stadium last Saturday and came away with a very credible 2-2 draw. It was a tough contest and in Danny's view, it was the team's character, commitment and discipline that allowed us to return south with that hard won, well earned point. One final note on Carlisle United, I am sure that on behalf of you all, I can extend to them hearty congratulations on reaching the Johnstone's Paint Trophy Final – a truly great effort and well done. 



Roger Jones knows a thing or two about goalkeeping. Town's Upton-upon-Severn born Kit Manager had a successful playing career which saw him make over **700 professional appearances**. He speaks to us about his playing days and his current role at The County Ground... →

They say that you have to be mad to be a keeper. Was it always going to be a career between the sticks for you?

Not really. No, I just got pushed into it really when I was a kid. Basically we had no one in goal and so I volunteered and that's how it started.

Didn't it all begin at Portsmouth?

Yeah, I started at Pompey as a kid. I used to play for a local side and played outfield but we were short of a keeper one day and I got spotted by a scout who had watched me for a couple of games and that's how I went to Pompey.

Didn't they stop running a reserve team at that time?

Yeah, I'd been there for a couple of years and Jim Smith got rid of all the young lads and just kept the first team squad.

Obviously options were a bit limited then?

Well maybe with Pompey but it prompted Bournemouth to come in for me. Obviously they knew all about it and I went straight down to Bournemouth.

You had a successful time down at Bournemouth didn't you?

I did. Things went well for me down there. I was obviously number two when I went. I was understudy to Dave Best and when he was sold to Ipswich I took over after just a few months.

Being the last line of defence, if the keeper makes a mistake there's no place to hide. Is there any one incident that you'd sooner forget?

I think that all of the Stoke people will know the one I want to forget and that would have to be the FA Cup game against Blyth Spartans. That's definitely my worst game for Stoke. I made a couple of mistakes and we got punished for them. It

was a night that myself and all of Stoke wants to forget.

You played over 700 games in your career. What's the pick of those?

Blimey I can't just think of one although I did play for England under 23's and that was one to remember. It was away to Hungary. We lost 1-0 but it was a very proud moment for me. I had other games for the under 23's playing against the full England side. One was before the West Brom Cup

Final. I think it was not long after the World Cup and it was at Arsenal. They would have these friendly games the night before the Cup Final on a regular basis at that time and those games were

and they've seemed to struggle a bit. I hear people saying Joe Hart is in fine form at Birmingham but he's been out of the frame for a while however he's had a new lease of life since he's gone there from Man City. You sometimes find that when someone goes to a new club and it's certainly helped him plus Birmingham are a well organised side. Things are going well for him but as we speak I wouldn't say that he's an England number one.

Let's move on to your time at Blackburn. That move seemed to come out of the blue!

It did. I was at Bournemouth at the time and the manager, Freddie Cox, came to me and said Blackburn would like to speak to you. Are you interested? I said yeah







CARLISLE UNITED

Carlisle United have been the epitome of inconsistency so far this season, and as such currently sit in 12th position in League One – seven points clear of relegation trouble but 15 adrift of the play-off places.

The Cumbrians' start to the season set the tone for their campaign up until now, with two wins, two draws and two defeats from their opening six matches.

A fairly torrid run of form then followed in September, and it was not until the end of October that Greg Abbott's side registered consecutive League One victories, triumphing over both Southend United (2-1) and Charlton Athletic (3-1) at Brunton Park.

The ever-crucial Christmas period bore fruit for United, as they took eight points from a possible 12, remaining unbeaten during December and starting to edge towards the top half of the table.

However, their trademark inconsistency returned to haunt them at the turn of 2010, as their opening six games of the year produced the same return as had the first six of the season: two defeats, two victories and two draws.

February started poorly with a defeat away at Colchester United, but The Cumbrians' last three results have provided a timely boost of confidence for Greg Abbott and his players.

A creditable draw away at

Huddersfield was followed by a 6-5 penalty victory over Leeds United in the Johnstone's Paint Area Final – booking the club a potentially memorable cup final date at Wembley.

Abbott's side then thrashed play-off hopefuls MK Dons 5-0 at Brunton Park last Saturday – a result which would have seen them flying into today's clash, but for a disappointing 2-1 reverse against Huddersfield Town on Tuesday night, which has pegged back their aspirations somewhat.

Veteran left-back Ian Harte leads the goal scoring charts at Brunton Park, with 12 to his name, and Town's very own Vincent Pericard also registers with six strikes for today's visitors.

COLLIN

The 25-year old goalkeeper joined United from Workington in the summer of 2009 on a two-year deal. The Carlisle-born stopper started his career with Newcastle United and had loan spells with Doncaster Rovers and Oldham Athletic before signing for Workington in 2004. He started to train with Carlisle United on a weekly basis in December 2008 and did enough to secure the offer of a permanent contract at the end of last season. He made his debut for Carlisle in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy against Morecambe. The competition has been a fruitful one for the stopper this term, as he added to his reputation with a penalty save against Leeds United in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy Northern area final.

THIRLWELL

A former Swindon loanee - Paul Thirlwell joined the Cumbrians on a three-month loan deal from Derby County in September 2006. He

started his career at Sunderland, making 77 first team appearances before signing for Sheffield United in the summer of 2004, before moving on to the Rams in the summer of 2005. His loan spell at Brunton Park went extremely well - so well, in fact, that he signed a two and a half year contract during the January 2007 transfer window. A holding midfielder, he has taken on the duty of breaking up the play and doing the hard work across the centre of the park. Injury wrecked his 2007/08 campaign, but he put that behind him and regularly leads by example.

KEOGH



23-year old Keogh initially joined Carlisle United in November 2007, on loan from Town's local rivals Bristol City. He returned to Bristol after a six week stay, and went out to Cheltenham for two months as talks continued to bring him to Brunton Park on a permanent deal. The clubs finally agreed the move in August 2008, and Keogh joined the Cumbrians on a two-year contract. He started his career as a trainee with Stoke before signing for Bristol City in 2005. The defender also has international experience playing and captaining the Republic of Ireland U21's. Although his preferred position is as a centre-back he can slot in anywhere along the defensive line, where his strength and assurance has already proved to be a big asset to the side.

KAVANAGH

A vastly-experienced midfielder, Graham Kavanagh initially arrived at Carlisle United for a one-month loan spell in October 2008. This was quickly extended for a further month to provide much needed cover for the injured pairing of Paul Thirlwell and Chris Lumsdon. Kavanagh, a product of the successful Home Farm Academy in Ireland, has over 500 first team appearances to his name for clubs such as Middlesbrough, Stoke City, Cardiff City, Wigan Athletic, Sunderland and, more recently, on

loan with Sheffield Wednesday. A full Ireland international, he joined the Black Cats for £500,000 in the summer of 2006 and has enjoyed two spells with the Owls during his stay at the Stadium of Light. He signed an 18-month player-coach contract in January 2009 and completed his UEFA A badge last summer.

HURST

The winger started as a trainee with Sheffield United although made just one first team appearance for The Blades which came against Swansea City in the Carling Cup.

Whilst with the Bramall Lane club - he had loan spells with Boston United, Stockport and Chesterfield. He went on-loan to Scunthorpe in January 2007 and made 13 appearances, earning himself a permanent move to the Iron at the end of that season. He made 74 appearances for the Glanford Park outfit in total and joined the Cumbrians at the start of the 2009/10 season. Hurst scored on his debut for Carlisle, in a League One fixture against Stockport County and notched his second goal of the campaign in the recent cup win over Leeds United at Brunton Park.

GAFFER GREG ABBOTT

Midlands-born Greg Abbott joined Carlisle as First Team and Reserve Team Coach in July 2006.

He started his playing career at his hometown club in Coventry as a youngster before moving to Bradford as an 18-year old. His nine year spell at Valley Parade came to an end in the summer of 1991 when he moved to Halifax, but he would spend just one season with the Shaymen.

Three months with Guiseley followed, but this was to be a prelude to a move to Hull in December 1992, where he would see out his playing career, making 141 appearances and scoring 18 goals. Having hung his boots up in May 1996 he went on to hold senior positions with non-league outfits, including the joint managership of Thackley during the 1998 / 99 season. He then had nine years with Leeds United in a variety of roles including Football in the Community, Academy Coaching and the U18 team Coach.

He stepped up to the caretaker manager role with Carlisle when Neil McDonald left the club and was the natural successor to John Ward when his tenure ended during the 2008/09 season.



The versatile left-back spent the latter part of the 2008/09 season with the Cumbrians, scoring one goal in his three appearances.


Harte started his career at Leeds and made over 250 appearances during his time at Elland Road. He also had spells with Levante and Sunderland and brings a wealth of international experience to Brunton Park.

Then defender was handed his international debut in 1996 against Croatia and earned a regular starting berth for the 1998 World Cup qualifying campaign. He also made the squad for the 2002 World Cup qualifiers and was the only player to play every minute as Ireland reached the World Cup for the first time in eight years. He also notched up four goals during the campaign, from left-back, including a penalty against Iran in the play-offs.

He was recalled to the team for the home match against Israel in June 2005 and the away game in the Faroe Islands four days later. Harte scored in both games, which marked his return to the Irish senior football set-up.


Liverpool manager Rafael Benitez has laughed off the idea of a Champions League play-off, saying teams would be playing "until the end of the century".







Keeping it clean

Whilst the on-field team have been taking the plaudits of late, a number of Town staff work tirelessly behind the scenes to ensure the club runs smoothly. Meet one of them...

Name: Matty Vernon
Job Title: Maintenance
Year Joined: 2004

How did you first join Swindon Town FC?

I was about 18-years old and had just finished at College and an opportunity came along to join the club on a two-week work experience placement. Ron Topp was Stadium Manager at the time and during my work experience period the club had a delivery of padded seats from Manchester United – which I helped install. When the work experience came to an end Ron asked me if I would like to join the maintenance team on a full-time basis which I did.

What does your job involve?

I support the stadium and maintenance team with jobs such as litter picking and toilet cleaning across the whole stadium. I also unlock the stadium gates first thing in the morning and help clean the stands, if a game has recently taken place, or help prepare the stadium for an event.

How does your role change on a matchday?

My main matchday role is to help prepare the stadium for the match. This begins with litter picking in the car park and clearing any other rubbish from in and around the stadium. I then unlock the stadium gates and switch on lights inside the concourses. I also check the toilets in all stands. At the end of the game I turn off any remaining lights and assist with locking up the stadium.

Tell us about your favourite memory of following Swindon?

The play-offs at the end of the 2003/04 season were good when Andy King was in charge. The home win over Leeds United a few weeks ago was great and travelling to see Swindon take on Fulham at Craven Cottage was also another good day out.

Do you follow the Town away from home?

I go to a lot of the away games and am a member of the STFC Supporters Club. I go on the away supporters coach a lot of the time and have been to grounds both good and bad. The best ground I have been to with Swindon is the KC Stadium, the home of Hull City. The worst one would be Bristol Rovers or Accrington Stanley.



What are your hobbies outside of your job?

Occasionally I go up to London to see Chelsea play, because my family support them. My other hobbies include shopping and socialising with workmates.

Match Background

Both sides met in a goalless stalemate at Brunton Park in the third match of the 1971/72 Division Two season, and on 8th January 1972, this time at The County Ground, again neither team could breach the net.

The introduction of David Dangerfield and Ray Bunkell were the only two differences between the two Town line-ups. Carlisle introduced a certain Stan Bowles for the second fixture and fielded another notable name, defender John Gorman, in both games.

The first game had seen legend Dave Mackay line up in the centre of defence for Town after his arrival the previous May from Derby County, but by the time the two sides met again, Town manager Fred Ford had been sacked and Mackay was installed as player/boss.

Swindon favourite Stan Harland, skipper before Mackay's arrival had been shipped off to Birmingham City, many believed in order that the Scotsman could take his shirt.

Football Snippets

Fourth Division Colchester United win the Watney Cup, defeating West Bromwich Albion 4-4 on penalties.

In September Tommy Docherty is appointed manager of Scotland.

Ted MacDougall of Bournemouth sets a scoring record for the FA Cup in November, hitting nine goals in an 11-0 win over non-League Margate.

George Best fails to turn up to play for Northern Ireland against Scotland at Hampden, and announces his retirement at the age of 26.




But despite fond memories of his time with The Cumbrians, Pericard admits there will be no room for sentiment come 3 o'clock this afternoon.



SYNDROME GROUP

Our aim is to support people with Down's syndrome, their families and carers and also anyone with an interest in Down's syndrome by providing information, advice and support as well as raising general awareness. We are a parent-led support group run by a committee of 14 volunteers and a registered charity - 1096089 - affiliated to the National Down's Syndrome Association. All our work is funded by our Group and the money is raised through jumble sales, sponsored walk, donations and grants from local companies and businesses.

The group provides opportunities for parents to support each other by organising trips to the theatre, theme parks, a Christmas party, barbecues, activity sessions and monthly baby/toddler support meetings. We aim to provide training and information through an annual training day aimed at teachers and teaching assistants and through seminars throughout the year. We also

support pre-schools, primary and secondary schools by providing school resource packs containing manuals, flash cards, software, DVD's, numeracy resources and books aimed at educating a child with Down's syndrome.

The Group also provides some specialist sporting activities - football training run in conjunction with Swindon Town Community Team. This training session is open to all children with a disability between the ages of 5 - 18. Tennis lessons with a specialist coach and fortnightly swimming lessons with a specialist swimming coach and working towards nationally recognised qualifications. The Group also runs weekly speech and language therapy sessions.

THE IMPORTANCE OF WARMING-UP BEFORE EXERCISE

Why warm up? Several changes takes place in the body once physical activity is initiated. A person's respiratory rate, blood flow, and oxygen and nutrient levels delivered to the muscles cells increases.

The rate of increase should be regulated in a steady pace to prepare the body for the physical stress that exercise will demand. If one foregoes this priming procedure,



the body will function less efficiently and the workout will produce less quality results. Warming up preps up the nervous system, heightens mental awareness and alertness, and loosens up joints and muscles to make them less prone to injuries. Warm ups jump starts the fluid located in the joints making them more lax, minimizing the risk for wear and tear of the muscles. It gives the heart a suitable period to adjust and pump up blood and nutrients into muscles.

How does a person warm up properly? Initially, it can be done in any procedure that enables the heart to beat faster. One can simply walk and jog, or if cardiovascular equipment is available, such as rowing machine or a bicycle, it can be utilised. Start

at a gentle pace, and then slowly increase the pace until heart beat rate increases and the body temperature rises. During this period dynamic stretching exercises, e.g. heel flicks (performed by J-P in the picture), high knees, side stepping and hamstring kicks (performed by J-P and Billy in the other picture) can be undertaken. Stretching helps in developing overall flexibility, particularly in the spine, shoulder, leg muscles and hip areas.

The kind of stretching depends on the type of activity a person plans to engage to. For instance, if one is about to play sports, the recommended kind of stretching would be the ones that mimics the movements that will be done in the court or field. Here at Swindon, before a game, once the players have completed a 6-8 minute warm



up period as explained, they are given a couple of minutes to statically stretch and take on fluid.

After this period, the warm up pace and intensity increases. Players will then perform specific movement patterns over an 18 yard distance, gradually increasing intensity to nearly 100%. To finish of the warm up before going into ball work, 6-8 sprints over a short distance (5-yards) incorporating twisting and turning movements are performed at 100% effort.



DICK'S DIARY

Alan has been doing football-related pitch runs and exercises and other running techniques to improve his running

efficiency. In the afternoons he has been carrying out hamstring strengthening exercises as well as going swimming at The Nuffield. He has been working very hard and I hope his efforts are rewarded with a trouble-free return to first team availability.

Kurt Hammonds has improved well in his second week of recovery following further knee surgery. Kurt faces a lengthy spell of rehabilitation but I am confident that he will recover from his setback and pursue his footballing passion.



Callum Kennedy shows weekly improvement following his lengthy recovery period from a pelvic stress fracture. We are

now able to row and cycle and a small amount of jogging together with large volumes of swimming. Callum is now a hugely efficient swimmer, hopefully the patience he has shown will be rewarded with his return to training.

When did you **LAST** breakdown?
