It went well, and I think it was important for us to do it at that time because we just wanted to get some of the players away from the predictions that are coming up around the area.


We've got some young lads in the squad who can get quite excitable so we wanted to get them away because it's easy to lose your focus sometimes.

Mobile Ticket Trial ->

Swindon Town supporters are being invited to take part in a mobile ticket trial for the last game of the season against Brentford.

Fans can buy tickets anywhere, anytime - and at a cheaper rate than anywhere else!

Mobile tickets are **ONLY £18.** Once in the stadium concourse why not purchase a drink from the Cross Bar or from any of our kiosks. If you come through the turnstiles before 2.00pm an additional **£2 discount*** on your ticket price will apply.

There are only 150 mobile tickets available for the last game of the season (Brentford's visit to The County Ground on 1st May), all located in Block One of The Don Rogers.

STFC is launching a mobile ticket service to make your life easier by enabling you to buy tickets directly from your mobile or our website.

The ticket will appear on your mobile as a text so no more forgetting or losing your ticket or fiddling about for bits of paper. Simply bring your mobile, scan the barcode off the phone's screen at the turnstile and, bingo, you're in and seated in a dedicated mobile ticket seating area in the Don Rogers Stand.

Tickets are available on the website (where you can buy the tickets and have the details sent to your phone) or by texting in the word Swindon to 82500 [you will receive a link that you need to open and then follow the onscreen instructions].

Tickets can be purchased securely using a credit or debit card. Normal operator charges apply for the initial text in and any data usage.

When you have bought your ticket you will see displayed on your phone a ticket with the STFC logo, some text and a barcode (a square full of dots). Simply show your mobile ticket to the turnstile operator at Turnstiles 28 & 29 and you will then be able to enjoy the match.

All fans who purchase a mobile ticket will be entered into a prize draw, with the winner being presented with a football signed by the STFC Squad. This presentation will take place on the pitch at half-time. The winner will be notified by text during the first half.




From the Boardroom

elcome back to The County Ground and a very good afternoon to our visitors from the Black Country, the Saddlers, fresh from their mid week exploits against Huddersfield.

Here we are at the penultimate home game of the current League One season, with only Brentford left to entertain on May 1st, and then who knows what will happen after that? But what a season it has been and believe me, there are still some twist and turns left in it before the curtain finally falls on May 8th. It is only when you cast your mind back to that sunny afternoon of August 8th 2009, when our season opened with a spanking from Gillingham, that you begin to realise how far we have actually come, now poised as we are with a strong chance of promotion, either via the automatic route or through the gear box of the play-offs.

Not only has it been a season of progress but it has also been a season of coincidences, just a few of which are:

- The two sides that suffered very heavy defeats on the opening day of the season, now sit astride the division i.e. Norwich and ourselves
- We defeated Southampton FC one nil at home and away
- We defeated Leeds United three nil at home and away, with Billy Paynter scoring two goals and Charlie Austin scoring one goal, on both occasions
- We drew with Exeter City in all three encounters (winning the JPT fixture on penalties)
- We drew with Charlton Athletic at home and away, with Charlton scoring the equaliser in extra-time on both occasions
- We lost three nil to Bristol Rovers away and four nil at home

Over 8,000 home fans were at The County Ground, along with the Sky Sports cameras, last Monday evening for the visit of Exeter City and what an exciting (and nail biting) 90 minutes of football they witnessed, with Danny Wilson's Red Army finally getting out of jail in those dying minutes of extra-time. The Sky Sports pundits were extremely complimentary about the quality of the game, the skilful football that STFC played, the condition

of the pitch and the overall professionalism of the club, so let's hope it acts as an incentive for them to return on a more regular basis! Dropping a couple of points on Monday evening was frustrating but then the ghost of twist and turns returned on Tuesday evening with Millwall and Huddersfield just managing to get out of jail in extra time, against Yeovil and Huddersfield respectively and Norwich losing unexpectedly to Leyton Orient. As Danny Wilson said to me late on Tuesday evening; "It really is squeaky bum time" but we have our very own DW50 who will no doubt apply the correct amount of WD40 for those final four games.

Keeping the 1st team squad focused and fresh at this time of the season, especially with the pressure that they and the management find themselves under presently, is very important. To help with the focus and the freshness, the management and the players have been away for a couple of days, staying at the Burnham Beeches Hotel and training at Bisham Abbey near Marlow. It is a well-deserved break and hopefully the change of venue has helped rejuvenate the batteries.

So time to saddle up and get those vocal chords warmed up once again for this afternoon's fixture in order to cheer the Red Army onto victory and three incredibly important points.



We caught up with three **London-based Reds** to find out how they follow the Town from afar, their thoughts on the run-in and why this season has been a success no matter what happens... ->

Are you ready for the run-in?


PA: My nerves are good at the moment, but that won't be the case if we get to Wembley – that's never good for the blood pressure!

MA: Strangely, I am calmer after the Exeter game. I've accepted we may miss out on automatic promotion, so I'm saving my panics for the play-offs. It seems weird hearing people talk about 'missing out on automatic' when you consider where we were 12 months ago. Whatever happens, this season has been amazing.

MM: My nerves are shot after the Exeter and Colchester games. We are playing some great stuff at the moment but seem to struggle in converting chances into goals.

You watched the Exeter match together in London; do you find it more nervewracking not being at the ground?

MM: Usually I'd say it is more nerve-racking being at the game, but watching us bombard the Exeter goal without scoring until the 94th





minute was terrifying.

MA: I always find watching Swindon on TV slightly unsettling, it's strange seeing that ground I know so well – a constant in my life for 20 years – from different angles. I tell myself that shouting at the screen is an utterly futile exercise. I never remember that, though.

PA: I find it's easier being a little detached. A little bit of central London went mad when the equaliser went in on Monday night. I think if we had managed a winner, some of us may still have been there the morning-after.

Presumably you do the London games in force?

PA: There's normally a good turn out for London games, they're treated as our home games to an extent.

MM: We pull out all the stops and we have good London knowledge between us.

MA: Fulham this year was the first time I've walked to a game since I left Swindon. Brentford was another highlight, a friend who lives in the area texted at half seven to say they could still hear us on the high road. I was strangely proud. Millwall two >
















seasons ago is probably my favourite away day ever.

Do you get to most home games, or do you have to pick and choose?

MA: I tend to average about 10-12 a season no matter what league we are in or how we are doing. The atmosphere at away games is more fun these days, though there is still something special about seeing a great win at The County Ground.

MM: I still have some friends and family in Swindon, so I try and combine home games with visits (or the other way round)!

MA: I'd probably go to more home games if First Great Western didn't charge such a ludicrously high fee for what is an hour's train journey from Paddington.

Midweek games are hard to attend for most of us, as for myself it's a two-hour drive each way, so I tend to do Saturday home games only. Saying that, I have already purchased a Season Ticket for next year, but won't get anywhere near full attendance.

Do you find it hard keeping up with news?

MA: Being an exiled football fan has got immeasurably easier with the Internet, whether you live 80 or 8,000 miles away. I've got a friend who is currently travelling in South America and he knows as much about what's going on as anyone, though whether you should be in an internet cafe waiting for final scores to come in when your fiancé is out looking at a volcano is a fair question!

PA: I'm a member of two forums, and use the official site daily. In fact both myself and Matt A are moderators on what was the old MOS.

MM: The forums mainly talk about Master Chef, which is not one of my main interests.

Any games you do/don't fancy in the run-in?

MA: I don't want to make any predictions that could come back and bite me; we've seen we can batter teams and still slip up. On paper,

Walsall, Wycombe and Brentford are winnable and Millwall an almost impossible task. But as the old saying goes, 'football's played on grass, not paper'.

PA: Exeter have shown anything can happen. Many games at the business end of the season quite often don't go as expected.

MM: I didn't think we would struggle against Exeter, who defended very well, but we have to win the lot. Millwall is always tasty but with added spicy interest for the season's final game. I hope we are both playing for second spot. My only fear is that if we lose that we will go into play-offs disappointed.

Would you rather we won at Wembley than going up automatic?

PA: Ask me that if/after we have won at Wembley!

MM: Automatic has got to be better for me, personally. But we should remember we have done really well this season and things bode well for the future, irrespective of promotion.

MA: If you could guarantee me a win at the beginning of the playoffs... but the truth is they are a
nerve-shredding experience for
everyone involved, I've only just got
over 'that night at The Withdean', I'm
not sure I could take another.

What are your best/worst play-off memories?

MA: May 31, 1993 remains one of the best days of my life. To get promotion to the top-flight again after the heartbreak of 1990 and to do it playing great football, it just doesn't get better than that.

MM: The '93 play-off final against Leicester was a victory against the injustice of the 1990 fiasco. I cried three times at that game, firstly out of disbelief that we were 3-0 up, desperation at being 3-3 and finally relief at the full-time whistle. A very emotional day.

PA: My favourite was the win over the Gills at Selhurst: we also looked down and out with five minutes of the home leg left. I don't think I've ever jumped around as much as when Charlie Henry's volley hit the back of the net.



What have been your favourite games/moments this season?

MA: Leeds away was just fantastic; Billy's second will live long in the memory. Brentford at their place was the best atmosphere I've been in for years, the game and the result weren't bad either.

PA: I'm going to sound like a right football snob, but it has to be Charlie's full debut goal at Carlisle, for me.

MM: I have really enjoyed watching Austin's meteoric rise from bricky to legend this season. And long may it continue. This Roy of the Rovers stuff is what makes the lower league so much better than the Premier League. Leeds away will take some beating. Paynter's second goal was awesome!

Which players have impressed you in particular?

MA: Scott Cuthbert is a class apart, and I think he'll go on to play at a much higher level, hopefully not too soon. You can tell how important Jonathan Douglas is by what happened when he was harshly suspended. Charlie's impact has been immense, but I think Billy Paynter deserves a lot of credit for creating a second successful strike partnership so soon after Coxy left. And Jean-Francois has all the makings of a cult hero, to be honest for the first time since I was a kid I've got about 12 favourite players.

PA: It would be unfair to single any of the squad out for extra praise; they have all been superb this season. This group have been a real pleasure to watch.

MM: McGovern is a different player since Danny Wilson took over. He has drastically improved and has worked his socks off this season. Paynter has been great and created so many chances for players around him, I feel he doesn't always get the credit he deserves. Ward and Ferry have brought a lot to the team and I hope we keep hold of them.

What does it mean to have seen Swindon in form this year – what would it mean to you if we were to return to the Championship?

MA: After a decade away I'd love to go back to the Championship, I'll

always see that as our natural home. What's been great about this season is having friends of other clubs compliment me on what a great side we've become, after a decade of pity – it's refreshing.

PA: The way we have played is a credit to the hard work that has been played out behind the scenes, by the board and the supporting staff. For the first time I can remember we have a solid foundation, we're definitely on the up.

MM: I agree, I am just so happy that the club is being well managed and looked after by Andrew Fitton, Nick Watkins and Jeremy Wray. The recent financial trouble and threat of 'winding up' orders has made being a Town fan an emotional strain during the last 10 years, so I'm just very happy that we are still going strong, playing good football and looking positively at the future ahead.

Walsall today then, do you fancy it?

MA: Having sat through that draw at the Bescot earlier in the season I'd like to think we'll show them how far we've come.

PA: Town 2-0

MM: 5-0 win. Greer hat-trick, Paynter and Austin.

The return of Super Sam... how would you compare our current strikers?

MA: Super Sam and Simon Cox scored goals in Swindon teams that weren't always performing that well, the big test for Charlie is if he can hit the back of the net when things aren't going our way. Having said that, I think Charlie has always scored goals wherever he's played, so he should be fine. The same sadly cannot be said for Parkin, with only three goals this season I doubt Walsall fans consider him as 'Super' as we do.

PA: Billy's been a revelation this season, he was one of our better players last year, but has now added goals and has really stepped his game up. Charlie... what can you say? He's been brilliant, a real joy to watch. Both are legends in the making here, which of course SSP already is, I'm looking forward to giving him the reception he deserves on Saturday.






alsall are playing for pride for the remainder of season 2010/2011, as they sit comfortably in 13th position in League One – 13 points clear of relegation trouble, yet 14 adrift of the play-off shake up.

Inconsistency has been the bane of manager Chris Hutchings' life this term, with his side registering consecutive victories on just three occasions during the campaign.

Following an opening day victory over Brighton & Hove Albion at The Withdean Stadium, the Saddlers then went without a win from the following six games, until a 3-2 victory away at Tranmere Rovers and a 1-1 home draw with Town signalled something of a resurgence

at The Bescot Stadium.

So much so that the next 11 games saw them defeated on just three occasions, and included victories over Huddersfield Town [2-1], Exeter City [3-0] and Yeovil Town [3-1].

With their play-off hopes gradually building off the back of this run, the Saddlers went into the Christmas period in optimistic mood.

However, this crucial period of the season was as disastrous as their previous run had been impressive, with the next eight fixtures bringing just four points from a miserable two month winless run which ultimately put paid to any dreams of reaching the top six.

Three wins out of four then followed, including impressive away triumphs over Bristol Rovers (1-0)

and Leeds United (2-1), but the Saddlers' trademark inconsistency has led them into today's clash, with four victories, six defeats and two draws from their last 12 matches – including a pulsaling 4-3 defeat against Huddersfield Town at The Galpharm Stadium on Tuesday night.

Troy Deeney and Darren Byfield top the goal scoring charts for today's visitors with 10 and 11 goals respectively, while Town legend Sam Parkin has netted on three occasions this term.

The reverse fixture at The Banks' Stadium back in September resulted in a 1-1 draw, as Billy Paynter's 80th minute penalty cancelled out Troy Deeney's early opener.

A highly-rated young goalkeeper, Rene Gilmartin has established himself as the Saddlers' number one over the past couple of months.

GILMARTIN

WALSALL

The Irishman moved to The Banks' Stadium as an 18-year-old in the summer of 2005 and made his first senior appearance the following September.

Gilmartin was allowed to linkup with local non-League outfit Hednesford Town for the majority of the 2007/08 but was recalled to The Banks' Stadium in January 2008 as cover for experienced 'keeper Clayton Ince, doing enough to earn a new deal in May 2008.

He was called upon a number of times over the last two seasons, including a man-of-the-match performance against The Robins in a 2-1 Walsall win in November 2008.

The 22-year-old's patience has paid off this campaign, and he has wrestled the number one shirt from Trindad & Tobago international Ince.

VINCENT

The former Swindon defender signed a one-year deal with The Saddlers following his release from The County Ground last summer and has gone on

to impress at the heart of the Saddlers' defence.

The 34-year-old came through the ranks at Crystal Palace before enjoying a two-and-a-half year spell at AFC Bournemouth.

Huddersfield Town paid £500,000 to secure his services in March 1999 and two years later, Portsmouth snapped him up in an £800,000 deal.

During his time at Fratton Park, Vincent spent a three-month loan spell at Walsall, making 12 appearances. His next move took him to Derby County and in recent years he has also served Millwall



Vincent signed for The Robins in the summer of 2006 and went on to make 89 appearances at The County Ground.

Comfortable at either centre-half or full-back, Vincent has been an almost ever present on the left side of Chris Hutchings' defence this season.

RICHARDS



Another pre-season signing, Matt Richards put pen to paper on a two-year deal just days before the current campaign got under way after

a successful trial.

The 24-year-old came through the ranks at Ipswich Town, making a total of 168 appearances for The Tractor Boys. During his time at Portman Road, the left midfielder also won England Under 21 honours and played a key role in the East Anglian club's play-off campaigns in 2003/04 and 2004/05.

The Harlow-born midfielder continued to impress for Ipswich the following two seasons but slipped down the pecking order in the summer of 2007. Richards spent the majority of the 2007/08 campaign on loan at Brighton, playing in the Seagulls' 3-0 victory at The County Ground.

Comfortable at either left-back or left midfield. Richards returned to The Withdean Stadium the following term and made a total of 57 appearances, scoring once for the Sussex side in three separate loan spells.

Following his release from Ipswich, Chris Hutchings snapped him up and he has been in good form for the Saddlers so far this season, scoring three goals as an almost-ever-present.

GRAY

Chris Hutchings moved quickly to complete the signing of experienced winger Julian Gray until the end of the season following his release from

Championship side Barnsley. The 30-year-old came through the ranks at Arsenal, but his first-team opportunities were limited to just one appearance for The Gunners before Crystal Palace paid £500,000 to take him to Selhurst Park in 2000.

His pace and skill out wide quickly became apparent at Palace and he went on to become a key figure for the club in well over 100 appearances, during which time he scored the goal at Anfield that knocked Liverpool out of the FA Cup in 2002/03.

Spells at Birmingham, Coventry and Fulham followed, before signing for the Tykes at the beginning of the current campaign. The wide-man made seven appearances under Simon Davey, but his short-term deal was not renewed, allowing him to move to The Banks' Stadium.


PARKIN


A Swindon Town legend, Sam Parkin is making his first return to The County Ground since departing in the summer of 2005.

The 29-year-old came through the ranks at Chelsea, before enjoying loan spells at Millwall, Wycombe Wanderers, Oldham Athletic and Northampton Town.

Andy King then moved to sign the striker in 2002, and he made a sensational start to his Swindon career, scoring a hat-trick on his debut.

Parkin went on to break the 20goal barrier three seasons on the trot, finishing with 73 goals in a 142 appearances and combining superbly with Tommy Mooney to fire Town to the League One play-offs in 2004.





GAFFER CHRIS HUTCHINGS

Chris Hutchings was named as Jimmy Mullen's successor as Walsall manager in January last year, successfully guiding the club away from the relegation

The 51 year-old has managed in the Premier League with spells at the helm of both Bradford City and Wigan Athletic.

His first coaching position came at Rotherham United, where he was youth team coach after bringing the curtain down on his playing career whilst at Millmoor.

He then moved on to Bradford City, initially as assistant to Chris Kamara, before working for the first time with Paul Jewell. During his time with the Bantams he helped the club rise from to the top-flight.

Following Jewell to Wigan Athletic in 2001, he spent six years at the club and played a key role in establishing them in the Premier League before stepping into the limelight as caretaker boss for a 13 game spell after Jewell's departure.

Moving on to Derby County in April 2008, again under Jewell's stewardship, he remained at Pride Park until December 2008 before accepting his first permanent managerial role, at The Banks' Stadium.

This term is his first full season at the helm, and his side are firmly embedded in mid-table comfort.


How much are you looking forward to a return to The County Ground?




My school days ...

Match **Background**

The second game of 1975/76 saw Town travel to Fellows Park, Walsall to challenge for the two, Division Three points on offer against the Saddlers. Town were hoping to build on the previous campaign that had seen a promotion push fail at the last hurdle under the original Town DW boss, Danny Williams.

Future Walsall boss Alan Buckley scored for Walsall and Peter Eastoe scored for Town in front of a crowd of 5,146

On 24th April 1976 the two teams met again, this time for the second but last fixture of the campaign, and 7,363 at The County Ground witness an unexpected penalty shoot out in the days before they were part of football law.

After 25 minutes Walsall's Buckley netted from the spot for his 35th goal of the season after being challenged by John Trollope. Just one minute

later, referee Lester Shapter repeated his decision at the other end, and Town's Northern Ireland international striker Trevor Anderson levelled.

Incredibly Shapter pointed to the 12-yard mark for the third time in seven minutes, Anderson obliging

once more to give us the lead, and eight minutes into the second period, Kelvin Clarke was

adjudged to have handled in the box to allow Anderson to complete a hat trick of penalties against the hapless Mick Kearns. The pair of David's, Moss

and Syrett added a 'regular' goal each in the last 15 minutes to produce a final score line of 5-1 to Town.






Then with six matches to go victory



efore last month's visit to Brighton & Hove Albion, Mark Marshall had made just six substitute appearances this season, and was preparing himself for another afternoon on the bench at The Withdean Stadium.

However, an injury to Vincent Pericard just 13 minutes in gave the winger his chance, and he duly took it with both hands; providing a vital outlet for Town during a tough second half and laying on Charlie Austin's 15th goal of the season.

"It was a bit of a shock to be honest because I hadn't been involved for a lot of the season, but I was ready for it," recalled the 22-year-old.

"I wasn't expecting to come on so early, but I just thought 'this is my opportunity, and I knew I had to go out there and give it my all.

"I was pleased with the way I played and I had a bit of freedom which helped set up the goal for Charlie and that made it a bit more special too.

"It was very boggy at Brighton which made it even harder for me but I was pleased with the way myself and the team dealt with the conditions.

"I felt like I did very well there and I was happy to contribute to a massive win for us."

That man of the match performance in East Sussex significantly raised Marshall's stock amongst Town fans and management alike, with Danny Wilson praising his 'bundles of energy' and stating that 'other players can learn from him.'

The winger was rewarded for his match-winning display with a starting berth three days later for Town's clash with Southampton at St. Mary's – quite a transformation for a player who had been turning out for Hereford United in

"It was a great night and another great win that I was pleased to be involved in.




Our aim is to support people with Down's syndrome, their families and carers and also anyone with an interest in Down's syndrome by providing information, advice and support as well as raising general awareness. We are a parentled support group run by a committee of 14 volunteers and a registered charity - 1096089 - affiliated to the National Down's Syndrome Association. All our work is funded by our Group and the money is raised through jumble sales, sponsored walk, donations and grants from local companies and businesses.

The group provides opportunities for parents to support each other by organising trips to the theatre, theme parks, a Christmas party, barbecues, activity sessions and monthly baby/toddler support meetings. We aim to provide training and information through an annual training day aimed at teachers and teaching assistants and through seminars throughout the year. We also

by providing schools, primary and secondary schools by providing school resource packs containing manuals, flash cards, software, DVD's, numeracy resources and books aimed at educating a child with Down's syndrome.

The Group also provides some specialist sporting activities – football training run in conjunction with Swindon Town Community Team. This training session is open to all children with a disability between the ages of 5 – 18. Tennis lessons with a specialist coach and fortnightly swimming lessons with a specialist swimming coach and working towards nationally recognised qualifications. THE IMPORTANCE OF CORE TRAINING

ore conditioning and abdominal conditioning have become synonymous in recent years but the abdominal muscles alone are over-rated when it comes to real core strength or conditioning. In reality, the abdominal muscles have very limited and specific action.

The "core" actually consists of many different muscles that stabilise the spine and pelvis and run the entire length of the torso. These muscles stabilize the spine, pelvis and shoulder and provide a solid foundation for movement in the extremities. Core conditioning exercise programs need to target all these muscle groups to be effective. These muscles help control movements, transfer energy, shift body weight and move in any direction. A strong core distributes the stresses of weight-bearing and protects the back.

The following list includes the most commonly identified core muscles as well as the lesser known groups. The goal of core stability is to maintain a solid, foundation and transfer energy from the centre of the body out to the limbs. Muscles that accomplish this goal include: Rectus

Abdominis, Erector Spinae, Multifidus, External Obliques, Internal Obliques, Transverse Abdominis (TVA), Hip Flexors which include the psoas major, Iliacus, rectus femoris, pectineus, sartorius.

Because the muscles of the trunk and torso stabilise the spine from the pelvis to the neck and shoulder, they allow the transfer of powerful movements of the arms and legs. All powerful movements originate from the centre of the body out, and never from the limbs alone. Before any powerful, rapid muscle contractions can occur in the limbs, the spine must be solid and stable and the more stable the core, the more powerful the extremities can contract.

Training the muscles of the core also corrects postural imbalances that can lead to injuries. The biggest benefit of core training is to develop functional fitness - that is, fitness that is essential to both daily living and regular activities.

Here are some simple core exercises: Half up Twists, Plank, Plank alternate leg lifts, side plank dips, Superman's, Dead bugs and the Oblique Leg Extensions.
