

always easy when you're not in the starting XI.



KELLY BACK IN CONTENTION

Right-back Julian Kelly is in contention to play in today's crucial clash with Swindon Town after returning to full training earlier this week.

The on-loan Reading defender

had looked to miss the rest of the season after sustaining a hamstring injury against Huddersfield earlier this month, but has made a speedy recovery and rejoined his team-mates for training on Tuesday morning.

Kelly, 20, could now be involved at Adams Park this afternoon, as well as the two final fixtures of the campaign

against Leyton Orient and Gillingham before his loan deal expires.

The youngster arrived from the Madejski Stadium in February and scored the winning goal against Millwall on his debut, before going on to make seven further appearances for the club.

TRIO OFFERED PRO DEALS

Wycombe Wanderers have offered professional contracts to three second year scholars.

Winger Jerome Federico, central midfielder Sam Belcher and Northern Ireland Under-19 striker Matt McClure will put pen to paper on their deals in the summer.

"I'm delighted for all three of them." said head of youth Richard Dobson. "Consistent performances in the youth team followed by decent displays at reserve team level have earned them their first opportunity as a professional footballer.

"They realise this is the first step and they've got a lot of hard work ahead of them to push for the first team and have a long career in professional football."

Manager Gary Waddock added: "I'm delighted for the three lads and hopefully this is just the start of a long and successful career for each of them."

Richard Dobson also paid tribute to those youngsters who have not been retained:

"They have been a credit to the club during their apprenticeships and I'm delighted other clubs have expressed an interest following loan spells earlier in the season.

"I wish them the best of luck for the future."





Ian Westlake played an hour on his return to action as the Wanderers' reserve side drew 0-0 with Colchester United at Maidenhead FC on Tuesday 13th April.

Westlake played his first minutes since injurying his ankle in early December, and saw his teammate Dan Fitchett come closest to opening the scoring in a drab first half when the striker was unable to convert a teasing Kadeem Harris cross.

Wanderers showed more purpose in the second period, with West Ham trialist Miles Smith and winger lerome Federico causing a constant threat for the U's.

"We took more control in the second half and were more proactive, which was pleasing on a difficult pitch," he said.

What a fantastic week for the Blues! Just when it seemed that all was lost, we've given ourselves a real chance of staying up thanks to three successive wins against Hartlepool, Tranmere and MK Dons.

Nine points out of nine have guaranteed another exciting end to a season at Adams Park and opened up a shaft of light at the end of a tunnel that seemed to be heading towards relegation.

Ahead of today's crucial game against Swindon, the Blues can still achieve a maximum of 50 points and that's been enough to survive in League One in each of the last three seasons.

Victories in our three remaining games against Swindon, Leyton Orient (A) and Gillingham (H) would almost certainly guarantee survival – but make no mistake, that's a very tall order.

Just like last season, the drama looks set to go to the final day with at least half-a-dozen clubs still involved in the battle to avoid the drop into League Two. Stockport County are already relegated and will be joined by another three teams from a list that seems likely to include Hartlepool, Oldham, Yeovil, Leyton Orient, Gillingham, Exeter, Tranmere, Wycombe and Southend.

The permutations are endless and I'm sure everyone has been doing the sums, trying to work out who'll go down and who'll stay up, so here's a list of the remaining fixtures for those teams not yet out of danger:

We need more of the same today and in the games against Leyton Orient and Gillingham. Let's get this place rocking, as Gareth Ainsworth would say.

BEN CAMPBELL TALKS TO IN-FORM FRONTMAN ALEX REVELL

If anyone deserves some success it's Alex Revell.

A broken leg at the beginning of 2009 halted the striker's progress at Southend United before today's visitors Swindon Town opted against making his loan move permanent following the rise of lethal front pairing Billy Paynter and Charlie Austin.


But 'Revs', who is on an emergency loan from Southend until Saturday 1st May, has worked hard to regain his match fitness and now the Wanderers are reaping the rewards. Four goals and three magnificent performances in a week - which have seen Gary Waddock's side pick up nine points in their battle for survival – have catapulted the 26-year-old into the limelight.

"It's been a great week, not just for me personally but for the team as a whole because we've given ourselves a chance to stay in League One," Revell told the 'Quarters'.

"Obviously it was nice to get the goals, but it's about everyone working hard and trying to keep the club in the division we deserve to be in. "Personally, it's been a difficult year after breaking my leg in January and things not working out at Southend. Things have gone against me recently, but now that I've come here to Wycombe I feel like that is changing.

"I feel I'm getting my fitness back to where it needs to be. It's taken a long time, but it does when you are recovering from a serious injury. No one was more frustrated than me at not being at the level I wanted to be, but I feel like I'm there now."

Following a bright beginning to his Wycombe career, Revell hadn't

started for seven games prior to the Blues' 2-0 home win over Hartlepool when he picked up the man-of-thematch award and high praise from both Gary Waddock and his teammates for what was arguably the best individual display by a Wanderers player this season.

Wycombe's number 11 revealed that his omission from the side, following a lacklustre performance at Stockport, was what he needed to regain "the bit between my teeth".

He said: "I scored on my debut at Bristol Rovers and really enjoyed it. For a few games I thought I was doing well, with goals the only thing missing. But the first half against Stockport was where I let myself down.

"I'm the first to admit that I had a couple of weeks where I wasn't at it following that game. It knocked me if I'm being honest, but I got my head down and luckily I got my chance to return against Hartlepool. What I had lost was that bit between my teeth and I probably needed to come out of the team.

"Before this week I probably hadn't done enough to prove to people that I wanted to be here, but hopefully now they know what I'm about. However, it doesn't stop there. I said after both the Hartlepool and Tranmere games that I've got to prove to people I can keep going.

"Consistency is something I have really struggled with throughout my career, but this week I've done it and now the challenge is to carry it on."

And there would be no better time for Revell to continue his fine form than this afternoon when he goes head-tohead with the side he played a dozen games for earlier this season.

"I scored two goals for Swindon, but I was in and out of the team because I was trying to get my fitness back," he recalled. "Luckily for me, Danny Wilson gave me my chance to go there and I really enjoyed it. They're a good group of lads and they have some very good players who can unlock you at any time - that's why they're in the top four.

"They've got two boys up front who can't stop scoring, midfielders who produce goals and a defence that's kept a lot of clean sheets.

"Obviously it's nice to play against a former club and I enjoyed my time there, but sometimes it's just not meant to be. Towards the end of my time at Swindon, Bill (Paynter) and Charlie (Austin) started scoring and sometimes you have to hold your hands up and say 'they're playing better'. That's football, you move on and now I'm really enjoying it here at Wycombe. I just hope that I can pick up from where I left off against MK last Saturday."

Today will be Revell's penultimate outing of the season in the famous blue quarters with his 93-day loan from parent club Southend ending after next Saturday's trip to Leyton Orient.

However, with the Cambridge-born striker's contract at Roots Hall expiring in the summer, we may get to see more of him.

He said: "I've got two games left to prove that I want to be here. We'll see what happens come the end of the season. I like what the gaffer has done and maybe something could come about. However, my main aim isn't to get a contract for myself, it's about helping keep this club in League One."





LOCAL BOY MAT'T PHILLIPS EYES FURTHER PROGRESS

Not many young players are dealt such a favourable hand as Wanderers' Matt Phillips, who at the age of 19 is already one of the strongest and quickest wingers in League One.

Phillips' turn of pace, paired with strength beyond his years. has enhanced his status on the football circuit

A product of Richard Dobson's prestigious U18s side, 'Matty' can well and truly be described as a local boy living the dream, with 78 first team appearances to his name already.

A Chairboy since the age of eight, Matty relishes in the role of local hero. "Playing for your local club is massive." stressed Phillips. "A lot of people in Avlesbury know about Wycombe and I take a lot from that. People will often talk to my parents or ask me about how Wycombe are doing - it's good."

Despite regular involvement with the first team, Matt realises there is much to learn if he is to reach his full potential: "There are a lot of first team players with experience. You've got (Kevin) Betsy, Gaz (Ainsworth), Chris Westwood, even lads like John Mousinho and (Craig) Woody. All of them give me information and tell me what I can add to my game, so that I keep on improving.

"I'm happy but obviously I would like to add more goals to my game. I'm just looking to do the right things, keep creating and keep trying to change the game for the team."

After flying onto the scene last season. Phillips has started 17 first team games this campaign, featuring from the bench a further 16 times. However, this healthy involvement has not satisfied the voung starlet's desire.

Phillips said: "The only downfall this season is that I haven't started as many games as I would have liked, but I still feel part of the team and I am still improving as a player. I want to play at the highest level and be known as a good player."

Recent games have seen the winger thrown into the fray as a substitute, where his direct approach has had an instant impact on tiring defensive limbs. Outstanding performances against Hartlepool (capped with a stunning solo goal). Tranmere and MK Dons have cemented the winger's ability to play in the important games.

"Leeds was an especially good game to play in," beamed Phillips. "I didn't get to play against them at Elland Road, but it has been good to mix with the likes of Norwich and Charlton this season."

You have to go back to September 2008 to find the last time the Blues won four league matches on the bounce, when Peter Taylor's side beat Rochdale 1-0 at Spotland. Matty Phillips may struggle to remember this fixture, but victory today will take some forgetting.

What a difference a week makes! Nine points in seven days has given us a precious lifeline in a relegation battle that's set to go down to the final day of the season.


Last Saturday saw the Chairboys return from MK Dons with three points after another excellent performance that once again featured a delectable double from Alex Revell.


However, a special mention must go to winger Kevin Betsy, who caused the Dons endless problems all afternoon before sealing the points for his team with an injury time winner. "Words can't really describe how I felt," said Betsy after his late goal. "Scoring is such a great feeling, but when you add the fact that you're playing against your local rivals and you're in a relegation dog fight, it's even better.

"The last two or three weeks have been









fantastic. You just hope that we can keep emulating these performances and give ourselves a chance to survive."

Blues chief Gary Waddock was quick to compliment Betsy's performance: "I thought he was outstanding – and that goes for the last few weeks. He loves this club and it was nice for him to get an injury time winner in a derby game."

Waddock named an unchanged XI from Tuesday's 3-0 triumph at Tranmere, meaning Revell and Jon-Paul Pittman continued up front while Lewis Hunt lengthened his stint at centre back.

A superb contingent of Wycombe fans were in attendance with over 1,300 making the trip to the Dons. The travelling supporters were in full voice after 29 minutes when Revell deftly side-footed Kevin Betsy's pass into the far corner of Willy Gueret's net.

A late Aaron Wilbraham goal meant the teams went in level at half time, but the Betsy/Revell combination came into play again on 64 minutes to restore the visitors' lead.

Wilbraham equalised again on 75 minutes, only the second goal the Chairboys had conceded in the last three games. With the contest poised at 2-2, Waddock's men pushed forward and created a host of excellent chances including efforts from substitute Stuart Beavon.

As the game entered stoppage time, Wanderers pushed forward leading to a chaotic series of events inside the Dons' penalty area. The ball finally fell to Betsy, who wheeled away in delight after seeing his deflected shot nestling in the net.

As the referee blew for full time, none of the Wycombe players could hide their jubilation after such a dramatic win, including stand-in skipper Gareth Ainsworth: "To come here and win in the last minute – which I think we deserved – was absolutely fantastic. Kevin Betsy's the hero of Buckinghamshire tonight!


"This is a new Wycombe now. All 25 squad members know that if you want to be involved, you have to fight, scrap and give every last ounce of energy to be in Gary Waddock's team."

The Dons' squad may been unsettled by the resignation of manager Paul Ince just 24 hours before the game, but they can't offer that as an excuse. They were also strengthened by the return of Wilbraham and former Wanderer David McCracken.

You can take nothing away from the Chairboys' victory as the Dons were defeated for the third time in five games. Let's hope that our recent momentum is taken into today's clash with Swindon Town as both clubs look for the win that could prove pivotal for very different reasons.



SCOTTY SPEAKS

MATT CECIL CHATS TO FORMER WYCOMBE AND SWINDON FORWARD KEITH SCOTT

It's been eleven years since Keith Scott waved goodbye to Adams Park following his second spell with the club, but after returning to the home of his 'biggest joy' for last week's charity match, the legendary striker felt like he'd never been away.

'Scotty' had been due to the take charge of the Wycombe Wanderers Legends for Thursday's Mike Keen Charity Cup tie, but a re-arranged fixture for his Windsor & Eton side meant he was busy masterminding a crucial 1-0 victory at Uxbridge in their bid for the Zamaretto Division One South & West title, some five levels below Wycombe in the footballing pyramid.

However, the 42-year-old dashed up the M40 to join his old friends and team-mates after the final whistle, and told 'Ouarters' this week that the reunion was a special occasion for everyone involved:

"We got on really well in our time here and when we met up again on Thursday, we had the same enjoyment that we had all those years ago," he reflected. "It's that kind of spirit which is the reason we were so successful, and it was all down to the manager. Martin O'Neill assembled a group of lads who were young, hungry and had desire, and it was my biggest joy as a player to be part of the squad which won promotion to the Football League."

Keith's move to Adams Park from Lincoln City in 1991 undoubtedly kick-started his playing career as he hit 54 goals in three years with the Blues, as well as helping the club to two FA Trophy finals at Wembley and the historic promotion from the Conference in 1993, and so it was no surprise when a bigger club came knocking.

That club happened to be Swindon Town, a Premier League side under the management of John Gorman. Despite having strong emotional ties to the Blues, 'Scotty' admits it was a move he couldn't turn down:

"Everyone wants to play at the top level and when opportunities like that come up, you don't even have to think about it. You want to play against the best players and I would have played for £10 a week in the Premier League – it was a no-brainer."


But despite scoring two goals in his first two games in the top flight, 'Scotty' was forced to suffer the disappointment of relegation in his debut campaign:

"We had some very good players who went on to have long and successful careers, but a lot of that team were naïve and you get punished for that at the top level. Nevertheless, I had a fantastic time and it was a great learning curve for me – nobody has had a bigger influence on my career than John Gorman and Martin O'Neill."

After leaving the County Ground in 1994, the striker went on to play for 14 different clubs, including another two-year spell at Adams Park, and now combines his managerial role at Windsor & Eton with a job as a business development manager for an office refurbishment company.

And 'Scotty' hopes that winning the title with the Royalists this season might help him follow in the footsteps of Gorman and O'Neill by managing in the Football League:

"I love the game and of course
I harbour ambitions of one day
managing in the league. If it
happens, then that would be great,
but if it doesn't, I'm just to happy to
manage at a club where they've got
a real chance of being successful."

VETERAN WAS STANKED TO STANK STANKERS

KEITH RYAN

What price must Wycombe have paid for a player who served them for 17 years and made over 500 appearances? Well, in the case of Keith Ryan a new set of playing strip was all it took. The midfielder - nicknamed Rhino - arrived at Adams Park in the summer of 1990 after impressing Martin O'Neill in a training session. Out of contract at Berkhamsted Town, the Blues generously purchased the shirts, shorts and socks for The Lilywhites as compensation for Ryan. But the deal must go down as one of the best value for money transfers.

"I was a teenager playing for Berkhamsted in the Ryman League," he explained. "The club had been tipped off about my cousin Steve Whitby and one or two others, but I wasn't one of them. Steve was invited to train and I drove him up and asked the reserve team coach Jim Melvin for a trial. They gave me a go." The rest is history...

Making his debut in the friendly against Nottingham Forest that opened Adams Park, Ryan went on to become a permanent fixture in the club's midfield, and every other position aside from goalkeeper. Along with Jason Cousins, he featured in all four of Wycombe's proudest moments of the modern era – the two FA Trophy Finals, Play-off Final and FA Cup semi-final against Liverpool.

Also a member of the first Blues side to play in the Football League, that day is one that lives long in Keith's memory. "I was so proud and privileged to be a part of such an historic occasion, it was a shock to the system to play against a team with full-time players as until then we had only been part-timers," recalled the one-time carpet-fitter.

Late in his career injuries began to take their toll and – combined with an earlier injury that ruled him out of the 1996-97 campaign – he was prevented him racking up an even more impressive tally of appearances. He also scored 50 goals, none more memorable than his late strike against Liverpool at Villa Park in the FA Cup semi.

When the decision finally came to hang up his boots in 2006, after 16 years as a Chairboy, he still was not ready to cut his ties with the club and went on to serve as assistant manager to both John Gorman and Paul Lambert. Eventually leaving Wycombe in 2007, he is presently in charge of Queens Park Rangers' reserve team - where one of his regular players is former Blues' loan signing Angelo Balanta. Needless to say whenever Rhino returns 'home' he is met with a rapturous welcome from the Blues' fans.


ANDY HARMAN

Andy Harman joined Wycombe as a 17-year-old in 1981 after being spotted playing locally for Holmer Green. During five seasons he played 88 games and netted one goal from midfield. Starting as a squad player, he found his feet to step up from local football to the top of the amateur game. "The pace meant you really had to keep your fitness up. It took a while to get up to speed. The pitch at Loakes Park wasn't too hard to adapt to, you just had to make sure when you were down at the bottom to give the ball enough to get it to the top."

Harman's time at Wycombe was largely spent under the tutelage

of Mike Keen, recently honoured at Adams Park with a charity game. "He was a manager with a philosophy of just letting us go out and enjoy our football and I made a lot of good friends at the club during my time here."

After leaving Wycombe in 1986 he joined Marlow and went on to play over 300 games for them - actually beating the Chairboys with his new club in the 1991 Berks & Bucks Cup Final. Outside of football he runs several businesses involved in Telecoms and fT. "I have been invited down to Adams Park several times by sponsors through business and still have a very close affection for Wycombe."



JOHN DELANEY

Slough-born Delaney had two spells at the club and made 228 appearances, scoring an incredible 65 goals. Not bad when you consider his position was centre-back.

Joining in 1969 he skippered Brian Lee's side to two Isthmian League titles and also won 17 caps for the England Amateurs. However, the thing that many remember him for is coming back to Loakes Park as an opponent during the famous 1974-78 FA Cup run, following his move to Football League club Bournemouth.

"I didn't enjoy that game one little bit," he recalls of the 0-0 draw that preceded a Blues win in the replay at Dean Court. "I didn't really want to play against Wycombe but, of course, I had to. I wasn't too disappointed in the end when we lost the replay."

One of his teammates during his time with Bournemouth was current Tottenham Hotspur boss Harry Redknapp. "He was always with Jimmy Gabriel talking about the game and it was clear even back then that the pair of them had intentions of getting involved in coaching."

In 1975, Delaney returned to Loakes Park as a player and etched his name in the history books by scoring in the Anglo-Italian Cup Final against Monza. "That was our best night when we won that trophy. We had lost 1-0 over in Italy but managed to turn it around, it was a great achievement."

After leaving Wycombe he had spells at Hayes, Tring Town and Oxford City before calling time on his playing career.

Outside of football he worked in the aviation industry but is now retired and is enjoying playing golf and having the chance to follow the Blues again. "Work made it hard to get to games but I am starting to get back into it now and have been down a few times recently. If the players can get the fans behind them they can give anyone a real go because this crowd at Wycombe is the greatest I have heard anywhere."

VINCE FAULKNER

Vince Faulkner made 167 appearances for the club in the 1960s and is making his second Ex-Player's Association appearance this season. For his full biography please see the Milton Keynes Dons programme.

MATT CECIL WELCOMES TODAY'S VISITORS

Danny Wilson's Robins rock into Adams Park this afternoon looking to end a mini slump in form and mount the pressure on their promotion rivals as they bid to cap an extraordinary season with automatic promotion.

It's been somewhat of a fairytale year for fans of the Wiltshire club, who may not have expected to fare better than the 15th placed finish they earned last season, winning just twelve times all year.

But in Wilson, they have a manager who knows everything about this level of football, and having previously won promotion from the Championship and League Two, the Lancastrian has high hopes of making it a perfect hat trick this year.

And the ex-Barnsley and Hartlepool boss has done a fantastic job of steering the Robins towards the top two following an indifferent start to the year which left them 11th after 14 games. At that point, the arrival of a certain Charlie Austin coincided with a run of five straight league wins, and the Robins have never looked back.

Austin's rise from being a part time bricklayer to one of the country's brightest young talents is an example of football's more romantic side, and the former Poole Town hotshot's partnership with the experienced Billy Paynter has resulted in 44 goals being scored between them. To put that in context, that's ten more goals than the whole of Stockport County have scored all season – a phenomenal achievement by two players who will have earned their place in the Championship if the Robins can achieve promotion this year.

But it would be unfair to attribute Town's success simply to the predatory instincts of their attack. Winger Jon-Paul McGovern has contributed a staggering 16 assists for his team-mates throughout the campaign, while the midfield industry of fans' favourites Jonathan Douglas and Simon Ferry have made the Robins an incredibly tough team to break down.

Wilson may be slightly disappointed that his side have conceded more goals than anyone else in the top five, and as a result, have an inferior goal difference to their immediate promotion rivals, but his defence have tightened up in recent weeks and kept five clean sheets in their last nine outings.

So what chance have the Robins got of ending the season with automatic promotion? Well, to coin a cliché, anything could happen, given that Charlton and Leeds come head-to-head next week before Swindon travel to Millwall on the final weekend of the season. If Leeds drop any points between now and the end of the campaign, the Robins' fate lies in their own hands, and three wins out of three would most likely carry them into the Championship.

That means they'll have to win here this afternoon, and with Wycombe needing a victory to continue this astonishing late battle for survival, this could be a game to savour.

MANAGER: DANNY WILSON



Born in Wigan, Wilson's playing career started locally with Bury before he moved on to make over 100 appearances for three different clubs – Chesterfield, Brighton and Luton. It was with the Hatters that the midfielder achieved League Cup success in 1988 before winning the same trophy three years later with new club Sheffield Wednesday.

Capped 24 times by Northern Ireland, Wilson took the role of player-manager at Barnsley in 1994, and guided the Tykes promotion to the top flight before taking over at Sheffield Wednesday in 1998, but an unsuccessful two years saw him leave at take the reins at Bristol City in 2000.

City came close to promotion in four consecutive seasons but never quite managed it, and so Wilson moved to the newly-formed MK Dons in 2004, before switching to Hartlepool two years later.

Now 50, Wilson guided the Pools into League One in his first season in charge, and left in 2008, before being appointed manager at Swindon in December that year.

Swindon have won 31 of the 74 matches with Wilson at the helm – a win record of 42%.

BETWEEN THE STICKS

With Robins' manager Danny Wilson plotting an escape route out of League One this season, he need look no further than the club's very own instruction manual David Lucas, who has tasted promotion before with Sheffield Wednesday in 2005.

Lucas started out at Preston and during the 1998-1999 season he was a regular fixture in the side that were narrowly defeated 2-1 on aggregate by Gillingham in the League One playoff semi finals. Lucas made a total of 123 appearances for Preston in ten seasons with the club, in which time he was capped a total of four times by England at Under-20 and Under-21 level. He had also enjoyed loan spells at Darlington, Scunthorpe and Sheffield Wednesday respectively. He must have made a lasting impression with the latter as they bought him for £100,000 in June 2004. In his debut season, Lucas inspired the Owls to a 4-2 win over Hartlepool in the League One play-off final. However, after a series of injuries he joined. Championship rivals Barnsley on a free transfer in January 2007. After only three appearances for the Tykes, Lucas moved to Leeds on a free transfer just eight months later. He helped United achieve a fourth place finish in League One during the 2008-2009 campaign, although he didn't feature in either leg of the club's playoff semi-final encounter with Millwall.

Lucas, 32, linked up with fellow League One side Swindon in July 2009 on a free transfer. In reserve is former Robins number one Phil Smith, 30.

IN DEFENCE

Right-back Stephen Darby, 21, is on a season-long loan from Liverpool; a club he has been with since the age of eight.

Darby captained Liverpool in the first of their successive FA Youth Cup victories in 2006 when they beat Manchester City 3-2. After representing England Under 19s twice in 2007, he skippered Liverpool reserves to a 3-0 win over Mexican side Tigres in the 2008 Dallas Cup and two months later he lifted the National Reserve League trophy after defeating Aston Villa 3-0. At the end of the 2007-2008 season, former Liverpool and Wycombe defender Gary Ablett labelled Darby as "Mr Consistency". Having trained with Liverpool's first team for two years, he dined at world football's top table in October 2008 when he made his senior bow in a 1-1 Uefa Champions League draw with Atlético Madrid. At the end of the 2008-2009 season, Darby won the Ian Frodsham Young Player of the Year award.

After five more appearances for the Reds, two of which came in European encounters, Darby linked up with Swindon manager Danny Wilson in March 2010.

Similarly attack-minded left back Alan Sheehan, 23, will be looking to draw upon all the experience that he has gained from playing for Republic of Ireland's Under-21s five times today.

Captain Gordon Greer, 29, was



bought by Blackburn for a reported £250,000 in May 2001 from Scottish Premier League (SPL) side Clyde – the club where he started his career Alongside him should be the equally commanding Scott Cuthbert, 22, who came through the ranks at Celtic – captaining their Under-19s and reserves – before he joined Swindon last summer for an undisclosed fee. Cuthbert skippered Scotland Under-19s to a second place finish in the 2006 Uefa Under-19 Championships, after narrowly losing 2-1 to Spain.

Swindon have Haiti international Lescinel Jean-François, 23, and Kevin Amankwaah, 27, in the form of back-up. Amankwaah's mother, Rose, represented Ghana in the 1974 Commonwealth Games and she picked up a bronze medal in the 4 x 100m relay.

IN MIDFIELD

Creative force Jon-Paul McGovern, 29, has unlocked the League One defensive door 16 times this season.

The first club to identify McGovern's talent was none less than Scottish giants Celtic, whom he signed for at the age of 18. In August 2002 he moved on loan to Sheffield United where he made 15 Championship appearances, scoring three goals. After three years with the Bhoys, McGovern signed for SPL side Livingstone in July 2003 on a free transfer. In his debut season he helped the club win the Scottish League Cup after a 2-0 win over Hibernian. It was Sheffield calling for McGovern in June 2004 but he joined Wednesday, not United. on a free transfer in June 2004. In his

maiden season he continued his love affair with the South Yorkshire city by netting eight goals, one of which came in their 4-2 win over Hartlepool in the League One play-off final. He was snapped up by MK Dons on a free transfer in July 2006. In his one and only season with the Dons he scored three times and delivered seven assists in 52 appearances for the then League Two club, in a season in which they lost 2-1 on aggregate to Shrewsbury in the play-off semi finals.

In August 2007, McGovern was signed by Swindon for an undisclosed fee.

On the left is expected to be onloan Bolton forward Danny Ward. 18, who made two appearances for the Trotters in the Premier League against Sunderland and Hull respectively in August 2009. Feathering the nest for the Robins should be box-to-box midfielder Jonathan Douglas, 28, and on-loan Celtic holding midfielder Simon Ferry, 22. Douglas started his career with Blackburn, where he went on to make 16 first team appearances, and he has collected eight Republic of Ireland caps. Ferry, whose name sake Bryan fronted the rock band Roxy Music that produced the album Stranded, will be hoping to create a similar feeling amongst the Wycombe players this afternoon. Ferry collected a runners-up medal in the 2006 Uefa Under-19 Championships along with Swindon team-mate Cuthbert.

Other options include centralmidfielder Craig Easton, 31, who has represented Scotland Under 21s 22 times, along with

UP FRONT

In 1966 many people believed Batman and Robin to be the ultimate dynamic duo. In 2010, Swindon fans may be forgiven for believing that Billy Paynter, 25, and Charlie Austin, 20, are the latest 'caped crusader' and 'boy wonder' to hit League One city after they have scored a total of 41 goals between them this season.

Paynter joined Port Vale as a 15-year-old and he made his debut in a 2-0 home defeat to Walsall in May 2001. At the age of 16 years and 294 days he became the youngest player to represent the club in 20 years, and his debut goal for the Stoke-on-Trent club in a 3-2 victory over Notts County in September 2002 made Paynter the club's youngest ever scorer for 24 years. However, it wasn't until the 2003-2004 season when his name became hot on everybody's lips after he bagged 14 League One goals. Another 13 strikes in the following season was enough to secure the Valiants' Player of the Season award. Paynter's good form didn't escape the notice of Championship club Hull, who signed the Liverpudlian on loan in November 2005. He did enough to earn a permanent

contract with the Tigers, moving on a free transfer just two months later. Come the start of the 2006-2007 season, however, Paynter was pulling on the blue shirt of Championship rivals Southend after they splashed out £200,000 to secure the mercurial striker's services. A loan move to League One Bradford in February 2007 completed a whirlwind 15 months for the forward and he netted four times.


In August 2007, Paynter signed for Swindon for an undisclosed fee. On average he attempts a shot every three minutes and scores a goal every two games this season, having seen his name on the scoresheet 22 times in League One this term.

From concrete bricks to the County Ground, 20-year-old Charlie Austin's meteoric rise from non-league football to League One is somewhat of a fairytale. Whilst working as a bricklayer Austin bagged 46 goals in as many matches for semi-professional Poole Town during the 2008-2009 season, before they sold their prized asset for a reported club record transfer fee of £700,000 to Swindon last summer. Having netted 19 times this season. Robins fans will be hoping that today ends happily ever after come ten to five.

OLD BOY RETURNS IN STYLE

March 2nd 1996 (6,457)

This was the first competitive meeting here – the Robins having been relegated from Division One the previous May. Steve McMahon's side arrived at Adams Park as league leaders with just three defeats in 29 league outings. Alan Smith's Chairboys, who had done well to draw 0-0 at the County Ground on Boxing Day, were in mid-table.

Included in Swindon's line-up was left-sided midfielder Ty Gooden who had been on the Wycombe payroll for two seasons in the early 90s. He made his mark as early as the third minute when he fired past Ben Roberts from 20 yards. 15 minutes later Swindon doubled their advantage. Wayne Allison set up Peter Thorne who clipped the ball over Roberts. The Robins controlled the rest of the half with the Chairboys struggling to make inroads.


Swindon continued to press with Thorne firing over and then Allison's header forcing a good save from Roberts. However, in the 59th minute Wycombe were back in the contest. Dave Carroll headed Mickey Bell's cross into

Miquel Desouza's path and the striker beat Frank Talia with a low shot. From then on it was nearly all Wycombe with Mickey Bell constantly causing problems. Desouza was put through by John Williams but Talia reacted quickly to block with his feet. Late on both Bell and Williams went close, however, the Robins held on for their ninth away win of the season.

The Robins lost just one more league fixture in their last 16 outings, finishing worthy champions nine points clear of runners up Oxford United. The Chairboys finished in a comfortable 12th place.



ADAMS ARRIVES AT WYCOMBE

Wycombe 4 Swindon 1

November 8th 2003 (4,738)

Just seven days earlier Wycombe had lost 2-0 at The County Ground but attention now turned to the FA Cup. The Chairboys were currently under caretaker boss John Gorman but before kick-off paraded new manager Tony Adams. With just two league wins to date the Chairboys were bottom of Division Two, whilst the Robins, under Andy King, were sitting in 10th place.

Adams watched a generally scrappy first half from the Directors' Box. Darren Currie, Dannie Bulman and Keith Ryan all spurned opportunities and Swindon almost scored on 31 minutes. Talia misjudged a cross and was relieved to see Brian Howard's low shot hit the post. On the stroke of half-time Wycombe took the lead when former Swindon defender Andy Thomson headed home Currie's corner.

With Adams now alongside Gorman in the dugout, Wycombe took control in the second period. In the 65th minute Currie curled a sublime free-kick past a bemused Rhys Evans. Three minutes later it was almost 3-0, Stuart Roberts' low shot going narrowly wide. Instead the lead was halved when Andy Gurney converted a penalty after former Wanderer Sam Parkin was fouled by Michael Simpson. This set up an exciting finale. Swindon pushed bodies forward but were caught out in the 84th minute. Bulman's shot was parried by Evans and Currie finished from close range. Four minutes later Jermaine McSporran capped a great day for Wycombe when he smashed the ball home after being sent away by Charlie Mapes.


However, Adams proved to be no miracle man. The Chairboys went out in the next round in a replay at Mansfield and finished rock bottom in Division Two. The Robins finished 5th but lost out on penalties against Brighton in their play-off semi-final.

OTHER MEETINGS – AT A GLANCE

Swindon have never lost a league fixture here. Apart from the 2-1 win in 1995/96, they triumphed 3-2 in 2002/03 and 3-0 in 2003/04. The other three league meetings



here were drawn. Wycombe have fared better in cup competitions. In addition to the 2003 FA Cup victory, they defeated Swindon 2-0 in a League Cup meeting in 1998. Also, an Ian Stonebridge special earned a 1-0 win in the Football League Trophy in 2006/07. However, the Robins won here 2-1 in the FA Cup in 2007. Looking at pre-season friendlies, the 1993 fixture ended 2-2 and in 1996 the Chairboys won impressively 5-1.



OSSIE ARDILES

1989-1991 PLAYER-MANAGER ARGENTINA CAPS: 63

Former Argentina international midfielder Ossie Ardiles was unlucky not to lead Swindon Town to the top-flight in 1989-90. Together with Ricky Villa, the World Cup winner made headlines with his transfer from Huracan to Spurs in July 1978. He helped them win the FA Cup in 1981 and UEFA Cup in 1984, moving to QPR in May 1988. Appointed Swindon's boss in July 1989, he plotted their 1989-90 Second Division play-off final success but they were denied promotion due to an illegal payments scandal. He took charge of Newcastle United in March 1991, then managed West Brom and Spurs before coaching overseas.



COLIN CALDERWOOD

1985-1993 DEFENDER SCOTLAND CAPS: 36

Commanding central defender Colin Calderwood was capped 36 times by Scotland after leaving Swindon Town. Signing professional for Mansfield Town in March 1982, he moved to the County Ground in July 1985 and starred as Swindon won the Fourth Division title in 1985-86. He also helped the Robins win promotion in 1986-87, then featured in two further play-off finals including the 1993 Wembley triumph. Scoring 20 times in 330 League games for Swindon, he moved to Tottenham Hotspur in July 1993 and later played for Aston Villa and Nottingham Forest. He has since managed Northampton Town and Forest.



MIKE SUMMERBEE


1960-1965 MIDFIELDER ENGLAND CAPS: 8


Winger Mike Summerbee was capped eight times by England after leaving Swindon Town. Initially with Cheltenham Town, he moved to the County Ground in March 1960 and was an important figure in Swindon's 1962-63 promotion success. He netted 39 goals in 218 League games prior to joining Manchester City in August 1965, amassing a vast collection of domestic and European honours under the Joe Mercer/Malcolm Allison partnership at Maine Road. Subsequently with Burnley, Blackpool and Stockport County, he is a successful businessman and his son Nicky also starred for Swindon Town.

GLENN HODDLE

1991-1993 PLAYER-MANAGER ENGLAND CAPS: 53

Ex-England international midfielder Glenn Hoddle was player-manager as Swindon Town reached the Premiership in 1992-93. Signing professional for Tottenham Hotspur in April 1975, he starred as they won promotion in 1977-78, then won the FA Cup in two consecutive seasons and the UEFA Cup in 1984. He moved to Monaco in July 1987 and helped win the French title in 1987-88, becoming Swindon's player-boss in August 1991. Scoring once in 64 League games for the Robins, he left to take charge of Chelsea after the 1992-93 play-off final triumph and has since managed England. Southampton, Spurs and Wolves.





STEVE McMAHON 1994-1999 PLAYER-MANAGER ENGLAND CAPS: 17

Former England international midfielder Steve McMahon managed Swindon Town to the Second Division title in 1995-96. Initially with Everton, he joined Aston Villa in May 1983 and moved to Liverpool in September 1985. He starred as they won the League Championship three times and FA Cup in 1989, then reunited with Peter Reid at Manchester City. Appointed Swindon's player-boss in November 1994, he made 43 League appearances and remained in charge until September 1999. He managed Blackpool to promotion in 2000-01 as well as two LDV Vans Trophy final triumphs, since coaching Australian side Perth Glory.



DON ROGERS 1961-1972 MIDFIELDER

England U-23 international winger Don Rogers scored twice in Swindon Town's 1969 League Cup final success. Signing professional at the County Ground in October 1962, he featured in Swindon's 1962-63 promotion campaign and was ever-present in four successive seasons. He starred as Swindon won promotion again in 1968-69 and the Anglo-Italian Cup in 1970, reuniting with Bert Head at Crystal Palace in November 1972. Moving to QPR in September 1974, he rejoined Swindon in March 1976 and netted 148 goals in 412 League games overall for the Robins. He has since run his own sports shop in Swindon.

DRIVING?

Take the M40 towards London, then the northbound M25. At junction 27 follow signs to 'London (NE), M11' onto the M11 southbound. After 7.1 miles, where the road divides, bear right (signed A406 N. Circ. Rd West) onto the North Circular Road. Keep in left hand lanes and take first exit after 0.6 miles (signed Walthamstow and City A104). At the roundabout turn left into Woodford New Road A104. At next roundabout (Whipps Cross) after 1.2 miles, take the second

exit (signed A104 Bakers Arms, Leyton) and follow road round to left into Lea Bridge Road. Half a mile further on, turn left into Leyton Green Road (signposted to Leyton and Stratford). Filter left after 0.3 miles and turn left at T-junction into Leyton High Road. After 1.2 miles (you should be able to see the flood lights), the ground is down the side streets on the right.

WHERE TO PARK?

It's street parking only. The police say there is some car crime in the area, so don't leave valuables in sight.

USING THE TRAIN?

The easiest mode of transport for this trip is the Underground. Leyton is on the Central Line, Zone 3 – a short walk from the stadium. Exit the station and turn right down Leyton High Road. Cross over the road and continue down it. You will come to Coronation Gardens on your left and the floodlights of the ground can be clearly seen behind them. Take the next left past the gardens into Buckingham Road for the ground.

FANCY A PINT?

There is a supporters club (located in the West Stand) that admits visiting fans for a nominal fee. The nearest pub to the ground is the 'Coach and Horses'. To get there turn right outside Leyton station and walk for about half-a-mile The hostelry is on the left, within sight of the floodlights. 'The Three Blackbirds' also comes recommended. This is a bit further up Leyton High Road, near Leyton Midland station.

TICKET INFORMATION

The ground capacity is 9,271 (all seated). Visiting fans are located in the south wing of the old Main (East) Stand (capacity 1,459). There are a couple of supporting pillars that may impede your view. See 'Ticket News' on page 57 for more information. We will be wearing the normal blue strip for this fixture.
