HELLO and welcome to the Banks's Stadium for today's npower League One encounter with Swindon Town....

Today's programme notes are all about the next generation of supporters and players. BECOME A MINI-SADDLER

With this in mind, we operate a policy of FREE football for all under-8's when accompanied by a full-paying adult. Basically, by becoming a Mini-Saddler, youngsters receive a Membership Card (and a number of other goodies) which, when presented at the Ticket Office, can be exchanged for a free ticket every time their parent/guardian also attends that match.

At the moment, anyone interested in signing their youngster up as a Mini-Saddler can do so by filling in a form from Main Reception or by downloading their application from the Community Department's website www.walsallfccp.co.uk.

PEDAL POWER RAISES HOSPICE FUNDS

LAST month, Glyn Marston and Paul Dickenson, set off on a gruelling cycle ride from John O'Groats to Lands End to raise vital money for Walsall Hospice.



The duo were supported by Ladbrokes. Glyn, 47, of Willenhall, is no stranger to fundraising and has raised over £85,000 for charity from ultra distance running but, following a serious knee injury, can no longer run and has taken to cycling to continue his

25-year-old Paul, who is deputy manager of Ladbrokes in Vicarage Road, West Bromwich, has lots of cycling experience but had never undertaken this challenge before.

"During the ride we experienced high winds, torrential rain and strong gales," said Marston. "We also had to cycle up mountains such as Shap Summit which is about 1350 feet above sea level.

"Each day was a challenge within itself. Is it something I would consider doing again? I hope to this every year for as long as I am able and would love to assemble a Walsall Hospice Cycle Team to take on the challenge with me.

I have a family member who has Leukaemia and I realise how valuable the Hospice will be to our town and will continue to support the fundraising effort as much as I can.

Head of Fundraising at Walsall Hospice, Cheryl Bradburne, said, "Glyn and Paul completed an incredible challenge on our behalf. Their support is invaluable, as is the support of Ladbrokes."

Denise Barker, Manager at Ladbrokes, Vicarage Road added; "I am so proud of both Glyn and Paul. To do such an incredible thing on behalf of someone else, with all the added pressure that brings, is truly amazing. My own family have been touched by cancer and, whilst hospital staff do the best job they can in difficult circumstances, nothing can compare to the care provided by specially-trained hospice staff for both patients and their families. Walsall needs a hospice.

A prolific couple of years for the youth team ended, with Jamie Paterson being handed a professional contract during the summer.

It was deserved recognition for the Coventry-born youngster who was promptly given a taste of first-team action during the pre-season before being called upon for our last three games.

A striker by trade, Paterson appeared on the right of midfield in our last home game, where he gave a good account of himself. "I feel that things have gone okay so far," he said. "I knew that with all the players we had missing against Colchester, I had a good chance of coming off the bench like I did in the previous game, but to get a starting place came as something of a shock to be honest.

"It's certainly made me even more determined to work hard and be involved on a regular basis. It has also made me realise that I can play at this level and boosted my confidence as a result..."— Jamie Paterson

"I was quite nervous at the start, but as the game went on I became more comfortable and felt that I coped well with the added demands.

"The other players helped me to settle in to it and told me to just go out there and be confident in what I was doing.


"The experienced lads talked me through the game and having Darryl Westlake behind me was a big help.

"It's certainly made me even more determined to work hard and be involved on a regular basis. It has also made me realise that I

"For the time being it is all about taking things as they come and being ready and able to do a job when called upon."

So, which players have most influenced Paterson, who also counts Coventry City and Manchester United amongst his former clubs whilst growing up? "Being a Liverpool supporter, I have always watched Michael Owen closely. Like me, he is an elusive player who likes to get at people and make a difference.



"I also respect Steven Gerrard, not only for his undoubted ability, but also his willingness to work hard and be positive."

That positivity is reflected in Paterson's prediction that The Saddlers can better last season's tenth place finish. "There is absolutely no reason why we can't better that," he added. "We've certainly got the quality here and if we can avoid injuries



then I feel that we can really push forward as a team and make an impact.

"There are some talented youngsters here who will be given their chance and that is a positive thing."

As you would expect, manager, Chris Hutchings is handling the youngster with care. "I have been pleased with the contribution he has made so far," he said. "Against Colchester he came into the game well as it went on and gave a good account of himself.



"That said, it's the first step on a very long ladder for him and we will be handling him in the correct way."

One player who will understand Paterson's situation is Darryl Westlake. all competitions on his way to being named Young Player of the Season.

"It's all about taking your chance when it comes along," he said without hesitation. "Like Jamie I was a bit surprised to break into the first-team so soon last season, but I was pleased with how things panned out.

"My aim now is to keep working hard and doing well to get more matches under my belt than last season and also weigh in with a few goals to help the team."

The Colchester game saw local lad Westlake in the right-back slot, playing just behind Paterson. "I thought that we linked up well," he went on. "We are both young and energetic and talked each other through the game.


"It's good for the other young lads here because they know that if they do well, their chance will come. As I said, it's all about being well prepared and ready to grab that opportunity with both hands."

The Saddlers go in search of a return to winning ways on home soil this afternoon having slipped to defeat in the previous two games here at Banks's Stadium. "It's been a bit of an up-and-down start to the season," admitted Westlake. "But if we can get on a bit of a run, we will be okay.

"The new signings have come in and made a contribution, and with the squad we have, I fully expect us to be up there challenging at the right end of the table.

"That said, League One is getting stronger every season; the likes of Sheffield Wednesday, Charlton Athletic and Southampton are all big clubs, but we can be more than a match for them on our day."




"In all fairness, it was an undeserved lead for us at the break and the second period started in a similar vein with Wrexham on the front-foot and having the majority of possession.



The opening 20 minutes saw Walsall in control of proceedings, but against the run of play, Marston Green took the lead with a well-taken goal in a rare foray forward.


The goal gave our young visitors a boost and they managed to double their advantage soon afterwards.

NIGEL MAKING PLANS FOR SAINTS

Southampton Football club seems to be a place of high drama this season, certainly if press reports are to be believed.

They have been faced with the tragic and abrupt loss of their owner, Markus Liebherr, there has been negative reaction to their reluctance to allow independent press and photographers into St. Mary's on matchdays, and there has also been the heavily-criticised dismissal of manager, Alan Pardew.

The appointment of his successor has also filled quite a few column inches, and it left the fans of several clubs last weekend very confused. First there was news that Scunthorpe United manager, Nigel Adkins, had agreed to become the new Saints boss, to then have his appointment blocked due to reluctance on Southampton's part to pay The Iron compensation for their one-time physio.

Southampton denied this, but then news emerged that Eddie Howe, manager of League One's AFC Bournemouth, had been interviewed but had spurned the chance of making the short journey to take over at the club. Former Hull manager Phil Brown also revealed he had held talks with Southampton, leaving fans rather confused as the side fell to defeat at Swindon seven days ago.

However all was settled on Sunday evening when Adkins was confirmed as the new Saints' supremo, signing a three-year deal, and bringing his assistant, Andy Crosby, with him. Saints' chairman, Nicola Cortese cited his achievements at Scunthorpe –two promotions from League One - as key to his appointment.

On his new job, Adkins enthused: "I'm really looking forward to this fresh new challenge, and I'm very optimistic of where we can take this football club. We want to excite the supporters, because when this stadium is full I am sure there is a fantastic buzz around the place, so I hope the supporters are looking forward to watching their team go out and

winning games of football in the right style."

"He is keen to explore opportunities in soccer in general and with the Rapids in particular," said the Rapids' communication manager Jason Gilham. "I think he is looking at that possibility."


When asked if Cipriani was looking to secure a contract with the franchise, Gilham added: "It is something that is being looked at from both sides."







HAVING reached the play-off Final at the end of last term, Swindon Town finally kickstarted the current campaign last weekend with a 1-0 victory over troubled Southampton.

It gave them their first League win at the sixth attempt as Charlie Austin grabbed the only goal of the game in the 65th minute.

"It was a cracking game," said Robins' boss, Danny Wilson. "Thankfully we came out on top in the end.

"It was nip-and-tuck and there wasn't too much between the teams."

It wasn't the first time that The Robins had beaten the south coast club this term as they also ran out worthy 3-0 winners at St Mary's in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy last month.


Otherwise it's been a tale of narrow defeats and draws for the Wiltshire outfit.

In fact, each of their three defeats so far have ended 2-1 – they went down by that scoreline on the opening day against Brighton & Hove Albion, whilst Leyton Orient removed them from the Carling Cup in the same fashion. The other 2-1 reverse came at MK Dons.

There have also been three draws, each by a different scoreline. It was 2-2 at Hartlepool United, 1-1 at home to Brentford and the turn of this month saw them share the spoils in a goalless draw up at Carlisle.

It is almost a year to the day that Swindon last visited Banks's Stadium. On that occasion, an early goal from Troy Deeney gave us the lead as we put in an impressive first half performance. Our visitors came back into it after the break and equalised with Billy Paynter's penalty ten minutes from time.

Our return fixture at the County Ground later in the season also ended with honours even, so another close encounter is expected this afternoon.



SWINDON TOWN

THE GOALKEEPERS -David Lucas

David Lucas signed for Swindon on a free transfer in the summer of 2009 having been released by Leeds United. A former Sheffield Wednesday team-mate of Jon-Paul McGovern, the 32-year-old signed a two-year deal at the County Ground and has gone on to establish himself between the sticks. Lucas began his career with Preston North End and spent ten years at the Lancashire club, representing England at Under-21 level during his time at Deepdale. Has been laid low through injury in recent

Phil Smith

Locked in an ongoing battle with David Lucas for the number one jersey, Phil Smith is a dependable goalkeeper and has been equally as reliable when called upon. Having joined Swindon in 2006 from Crawley Town, the 30-year-old made his first start for the club in a Carling Cup tie against Brentford. He had to wait for his first league start which came following an unfortunate injury to Peter Brezaovan one month later. Smith has made nearly 100 appearances for The Robins.

Jakub Jesionkowski

The Polish Under-21 goalkeeper arrived at the County Ground in August 2009 from Zaglebie Lubin. Tall and imposing, he has worked hard over the past year and is starting to make a challenge for a place between the posts. He was on the substitutes' bench for the last game and will be hoping to get the opportunity to make his mark soon.

THE DEFENDERS -Scott Cuthbert

A hugely impressive young defender, Scott Cuthbert joined Swindon from Scottish Premier League giants Celtic in July 2009. He had come through the youth ranks at Celtic Park and captained the club's Under-19 and reserve teams. The 22-year-old made his debut for the Hoops in a preseason friendly against Manchester City in 2008 before spending a year on loan to SPL rivals St. Mirren. Cuthbert captained the Scotland Under-19 side that reached the final of the UEFA Under-19 Championships in 2006. A reliable figure for The Robins.

Michael Rose

Summer signing Michael Rose joined Swindon on a free transfer from Stockport County in June 2010, putting pen-to-paper on a two year deal at the County Ground. The 28-year-old spent three months on loan to 2009-10 League One Champions Norwich City last term and has amassed nearly 300 Football League appearances throughout his career. A former Manchester United youngster, Rose brings a wealth of experience to The Robins' back line.

Alan Sheehan

In direct competition with Michael Rose for the left-back position, Alan Sheehan is another summer signing having joined on a free transfer from Leeds United following a successful loan spell at Swindon in late 2009. The former Leicester City man, who is yet to settle at a club having left the Walkers Stadium in 2008, has had loan spells with Mansfield Town, Crewe Alexandra and Oldham Athletic but will now be looking to establish himself at the County Ground.

Paul Caddis

Paul Caddis signed alongside fellow Celtic youth team graduate Simon Ferry last month for a combined undisclosed fee. The 22-year-old signed a three-year deal, concluding a lengthy pursuit from Danny Wilson. Noted for his versatility, Caddis is able to play in a number of positions but is predominantly deployed as a right-sided defender. Having come through the ranks at Celtic, he made 25 appearances for the Bhoys last season, including starts in the Champions League.

Sean Morrison

Former Plymouth Argyle man Sean Morrison signed for Swindon from Home Park in the summer of 2007. After impressing initially in both the youth and reserve sides, he was handed his first senior appearances at the end of the 2007-08 campaign. The 19-year-old went on to firmly establish himself in the team but, by last year, was struggling for action due to the form of Scott Cuthbert. After a loan spell at Southend United, Morrison signed a one-year contract extension at the County Ground.

Kevin Amankwaah

Signed from Championship side Swansea City in 2008, Kevin Amankwaah made a huge impact in the side and was virtually ever present in the latter half of his debut season having initially been kept out by Jack Smith. Reunited with former Bristol City boss Danny Wilson in early 2009, the 28-year-old made the right-back slot his own but a hamstring injury and the arrival of Liverpool loanee Stephen Darby again kept Amakwaah out of the side until the play-off final against Millwall.

Callum Kennedy

Former Reading youngster Callum Kennedy was first given a taste of firstteam action by former Town boss Paul Sturrock. Then 18, he was given a surprise start in the 4-1 Johnstone's Paint Trophy win over Brentford in September 2007. A number of substitute appearances followed and the 21-year-old became a first team regular in the 2008-09 campaign. Kennedy was subsequently unlucky with injury and the form of Alan Sheehan in his absence but was handed a new one-year deal in January 2010.

Lecsinel Jean-Francois

Lecsinel Jean-Francois is a 22-yearold Haiti international defender who previously spent time on trial with Scottish club Aberdeen, playing in a reserve team fixture against Brechin in the summer of 2008. He began his professional career in France, playing in reserve for Paris Saint Germain and Sedan before representing Falkirk on loan in 2006. Having impressed in a number of second-string games for Town during 2008-09, Jean-Francois signed a permanent deal with the club.

Will Evans

The promising central defender has impressed whilst coming through the ranks and signed his first professional contract during the summer. Highly-rated, he was given a first taste of senior action with a substitute outing in the recent Johnstone's Paint Trophy victory at Southampton.

THE MIDFIELDERS -Jonathan Douglas

Swindon Town's club captain Jonathan Douglas signed for the club on a free transfer following his release from Leeds United in the summer of 2009. The 28-year-old started his career in Ireland with Monaghan United before moving to Blackburn Rovers in 2000. He made his Rovers debut against West Ham in the Carling Cup but made just one further first-team appearance that year. Loan spells with Chesterfield and Blackpool followed before Douglas returned to Ewood Park and scored his first Premier League goal in April 2004.

Jon-Paul McGovern

Jon-Paul McGovern signed for Swindon on Friday 31st August 2007, just hours before the close of the transfer window, signing a three-year contract which has since been extended. Noted for his energy and hard-work on the wing, the 29-year-old is also able to play through the middle and had been a target of former Town boss Paul Sturrock for some time. McGovern began his career as a trainee at Celtic but was released by the SPL club after just one season.

Simon Ferry

Along with Paul Caddis, Simon Ferry made the permanent switch from Celtic last month, penning a three-year deal at the County Ground. The 22-year-old had enjoyed a hugely productive loan spell with Swindon in 2009-10, making 42 starts and scoring twice in the club's play-off campaign. Having joined Celtic aged 12, Ferry progressed through the ranks with team-mates Caddis and Scott Cuthbert but was sidelined for nearly two years with a serious ankle injury.

David Prutton

Experienced midfielder David Prutton signed for Swindon Town from Colchester during the summer. Having initially signed for the U's on a loan deal in January 2010, the move was made permanent just a week later and he had featured regularly ever since. Capped by England 25 times at U21 level, the 29-year-old started his career in 1995 as a youth player with Nottingham Forest - signing professional terms three years later.

Michael Timlin

Michael Timlin joined Town from Premier League outfit Fulham in May 2008. Having started his career as a left-winger at Craven Cottage, he was converted to a central midfielder by then-Academy Director Steve Kean. The 25-year-old flourished in his new role, earning an international call up with the Republic of Ireland. Timlin initially spent time at the County Ground on loan in November 2006 as Town won promotion from League Two.

Alan O'Brien

Former Newcastle United player Andy O'Brien is a fan favourite at the County Ground owing to his determination and positive attitude on the pitch. Also noted for his pace, the 25-year-old signed for Swindon from Scottish Premier League club Hibernian in July 2009. With five senior Republic of Ireland caps to his name, O'Brien had progressed through the youth ranks at St. James' Park before a broken leg stalled his emergence in 2004. He made his Premier League debut two years later.

THE STRIKERS -Vincent Pericard

Signed in January 2010 from Carlisle United having rejected the offer of a contract extension, Vincent Pericard had scored four goals in ten League starts at Brunton Park before agreeing terms on a one-and-a-half year deal with Swindon. Vastly experienced but as yet unable to make an impact at many of his former clubs, owing to a

mixture of ill fortune, injury and off-thepitch issues, the 27-year-old is looking to settle at the County Ground.

David Ball

Manchester City youngster David Ball singed a six-month loan deal with Swindon in July 2010 and travelled with the squad for their pre-season tour of Australia. 20-year-old Ball has been on the books at Eastlands from a young age and was named on the bench for the Manchester derby towards the end of last term. However, with first team chances limited at City, Ball opted to try and impress at the County Ground before a potential return to Lancashire in January.

Thomas Dossevi

Togolese international striker Thomas Dossevi signed a one-year contract at the county Ground having impressed during a brief trial period. The 31-year-old scored two goals in a pre-season friendly against Nottingham forest and joined on a permanent basis just three days later. Dossevi had spent the entirety of his career in France, playing for Stade Reims, Valenciennes and Nantes but was released by the latter at the end of last term.





THE CHANGING FACE OF FOOTBALL MAGAZINES

John Litster, editor of "Programme Monthly & Football Collectable" magazine describes the history and development of football magazines...

THE ORIGINS and, indeed, lifespan, of 'Sport' magazine are fairly obscure. It was published every Friday by Promise Press Ltd., 149 Fleet Street, London, and was a larger sized, more reporting-orientated equivalent to its weekly competitor, Topical Times.

Each edition was numbered, with an accompanying volume number. For example, the edition dated August 25th - 31st 1950 was Volume 12, No. 137. The last number just ran consecutively; the edition of January 7th - 15th 1951 was Volume 12, No. 156, and the following week's edition was Volume 13, No. 157. It was strange that the Volume sequence did not follow the calendar year. Adding to this confusion is the unusual anomaly of the British Library at Colindale not having copies of this periodical on file.

The contents of the 24-page 'Radio Times' sized production were predominantly
devoted to football,
although athletics
and cricket
dominated during
the summer
months. It was
printed in black on better-thannewsprint white paper, with red
used only in the front page banner
heading. There were some wellknown contributors - in 1950, for
example, Reg Drury, Maurice
Golesworthy, Ralph L. Finn
and Ivor Turnbull are listed as

Most other sports were covered on a regular basis, with lengthier features on boxing, cricket and speedway. Several years before 'Soccer Star' began its superb week-by-week listing of match details, these were included for the four English and two Scottish Leagues in the late 1940s and early 1950s.

writers.

This information, published weekly, was then used as the basis for two superb statistical yearbooks, known as 'The Blue Book of Soccer', published in 1949 and 1950.

The title 'Sport' magazine is now associated with the American sports magazine of that name. Launched in September 1946 by the New York-based publisher, Macfadden

Publications, 'Sport' pioneered the generous use of colour photography - it carried eight full-colour plates in its first edition - and almost immediately became half-bible, half-guru to a generation of men coming of age.

'Sport' pre-dated the launch of 'Sports Illustrated' by eight years, and is remembered for bringing several editorial innovations to the genre, as well as creating, in 1955, the Sport Magazine Award. What made 'Sport' most distinctive from 'Sports Illustrated', however, was the fact it was a monthly magazine as opposed to SI's weekly distribution.

'Sport' was published continually between its launch and August 2000, when its then-owner, EMAP PLC., made the decision to close the money-losing title. Today, the photo archive of 'Sport' magazine represents one of the most significant collections of 20th century sports photography in North America.

'Programme Monthly' is a 160-page magazine, now in its 30th year, and is available for £3.40 (inclusive of postage) or 9 x 1st class stamps from PO Box 3236, Norwich, NR7 7BE. www.pmfc.co.uk

LEADING BY EXAM

Football historian Leigh Edwards profiles ten leading post-war captains from today's visitors...

MAURICE OWEN

Long-serving favourite Maurice Owen captained Swindon Town's 1962-63 promotion success. Initially with hometown Abingdon, the centreforward turned professional at the County Ground in December 1946 and grabbed a hat-trick on his League debut in the following month's 5-0 victory at home to Watford. He was leading marksman on six occasions and helped Swindon twice reach the FA Cup fifth round. Later playing in a defensive role, he scored 150 goals in 555 League outings for the Robins before retiring in May 1963 and joined the club's coaching staff. He then settled back in Abingdon and died in July 2000.

STAN HARLAND

Central defender Stan Harland captained Swindon Town's 1968-69 promotion and League Cup 'double' triumph. He had spells with Burnley, New Brighton, Everton and Bradford City before joining Carlisle United in June 1964. Ever-present in their 1964-65 Third Division title campaign, he moved to the County Ground in August 1966. Also skippering Swindon's 1970 Anglo-Italian Cup final success, he netted six goals in 237 League games prior to joining Birmingham City in December 1971 and captained them to promotion that season. He was later Yeovil Town's player-boss and died in Yeovil in September 2001.

ROD THOMAS

Welsh international right-back Rod Thomas was capped 30 times while at Swindon Town. Initially

with Gloucester City, he moved to the County Ground in July 1964 and was an important figure in Swindon's 1968-69 promotion and League Cup 'double' success. He also starred in their 1970 Anglo-Italian Cup final triumph and netted five goals in 296 League games before following Dave Mackay to Derby County in November 1973. Featuring in their 1974-75 League Championship campaign, he moved to Cardiff City in November 1977, then had spells with Newport County and Gloucester again before becoming a publican.

JOHN TROLLOPE

Long-serving left-back John Trollope holds Swindon Town's appearance record. Signing professional at the County Ground in July 1960, he made his League debut in Swindon's 1-1 draw at home



to Halifax Town a month later and was everpresent in seven consecutive seasons including the 1962-63 promotion success. He featured in Swindon's 1968-69 promotion and League Cup 'double' campaign as well as their 1970 Anglo-Italian Cup final triumph. Scoring 21 goals in 770 League games for Swindon, he was their coach, then manager between November 1980 and March 1983. Later youth-team boss, he was awarded an MBE.

ANDY ROWLAND

Versatile England Youth striker Andy Rowland skippered Swindon Town's record-breaking 1985-86 Fourth Division title triumph. Initially with hometown Derby County, he moved to Bury in August 1974 and was leading marksman in three successive seasons. He was ever-present in 1975-76 and helped them progress to the League Cup fifth round in 1977-78. Reunited with Bobby Smith at the County Ground in September 1978, he was top scorer as Swindon were League Cup semi-finalists in 1979-80. He netted 80 goals in 287 League games prior to joining Swindon's coaching staff and served the Robins for 22 years.

PLE with Leigh Edwards

COLIN CALDERWOOD

Commanding central defender Colin Calderwood was capped 36 times by Scotland after leaving Swindon Town. Signing professional for Mansfield Town in March 1982, he moved to the County Ground in July 1985 and starred as Swindon won the Fourth Division title in 1985-86. He was also an important figure as they won promotion in 1986-87, then featured in two further play-off finals including their 1993 Wembley triumph. Scoring 20 times in 330 League games for Swindon, he moved to Tottenham Hotspur in July 1993 and later played for Aston Villa and Nottingham Forest. He has managed Northampton Town and Forest.

GLENN HODDLE

Ex-England International midfielder Glenn Hoddle led Swindon Town to First Division play-off final glory in 1992-93. Signing professional for

Tottenham Hotspur in April 1975, he starred in their 1981 and 1982 FA Cup final successes and was a finalist again shortly before joining Monaco in June 1987. He helped win the French League title in 1987-88 and was appointed Swindon's player-boss in April 1991,



scoring once in 64 League games while at the County Ground. Moving to Chelsea in a similar capacity in June 1993, he guided them to the 1994 FA Cup final and has since managed England, Southampton, Spurs and Wolves.

SHAUN TAYLOR

Influential central defender Shaun Taylor captained Swindon Town to the Second Division title and FA Cup fifth round in 1995-96. He impressed with Bideford before moving to Exeter City in December 1986 and skippered their 1989-90

Fourth Division title triumph. Joining Swindon in July 1991, he was ever-present alongside Colin Calderwood as the Robins won promotion to the Premiership in 1992-93. He was voted their 'Player of the Year' three times and netted 30 goals in 212 League games while at the County Ground, Moving to Bristol City in September 1996. he has since become their development coach.

MATT HEWLETT

Ex-England Youth midfielder Matt Hewlett skippered Swindon Town to the Second Division play-offs in 2003-04. Signing professional for Bristol City in August 1993, he made his League debut in that month's 3-2 defeat at home to Sheffield Wednesday and was an influential figure as they qualified for the Second Division play-offs in 1996-97, then won promotion in 1997-98. He had a loan spell at Burnley before moving to the County Ground in July 2000 and netted six goals in 179 League outings for Swindon prior to joining Torquay United in July 2005 but recurring injury problems curtailed his career in February 2007.

GORDON GREER


Scotland B International central defender Gordon Greer captained Swindon Town to the League One play-off final in 2009-10. Initially with Port Glasgow, he joined Clyde in June 2000 and moved to Blackburn Rovers for £200,000 in May 2001. He returned to Scottish football with Kilmarnock in August 2003, then joined Doncaster Rovers in July 2007. Featuring in their 2007-08 promotion campaign, he moved to Swindon initially on loan in January 2009. He joined them on a permanent basis in July 2009 and partnered Scott Cuthbert in the heart of their defence but missed the play-off Final at Wembley due to suspension.

IN 1966, a linesman by the name of Tofik
Bakhramov instantly made himself into an English

a far more obvious goal against the same opponents in South Africa. The question was posed: Where was the Russian (an urban myth – Bakhramov was actually from Azerbaijan) linesman when you needed him?

I had to laugh when I heard the footage of the Lampard goal-thatwasn't was replayed on

the big screen in Bloemfontein. How I would have loved to have seen the look on the face of FIFA's

president, Sepp Blatter!

As you may gather from that, Blatter is not my favourite person in football. The sight of Blatter scampering across to snatch the trophy from the South African President, Jacob Zuma, so that he could pass it to the awaiting Spanish captain after the Final was one of the most sickening sights in

World Cup history. I do, however, agree with Blatter's stance on goal-line video technology and I shall explain why.

One of the beauties of football is the fact that it can be played anywhere, with minimum organisation. One does not even need goalposts – jumpers, a garage door or even a kerb will all suffice if you want them to. Unlike most sports, organised football is pretty much the same from the World Cup winners to the Dog and Duck Sunday hackers' team.

Goal-line technology of any kind (be it video, Hawkeye, laser beams or simply micro-chipping the ball) will form an elitist divide within football and is it not division that causes so many gripes with us fans? Financially, the burden of installing such equipment would be significant to prevent an incident that, statistically, would only happen in games involving your team approximately once every five years?

In England, we would probably be okay down to around Level 7 or 8. In many African or Asian countries, though, the infrastructure would be impossible to install.

Let's move on for a minute and imagine that the

BESCOT HISTORY

20th YEAR AT BESCOT (BANKS'S) STADIUM: 1990/91 - 2010/11

BESCOT PEOPLE

ANDY RAMMELL

ANDY Rammell never became a household name and he never played in the top-flight despite signing for Manchester United in 1989, but he was an honest player that reached his peak with some important goals in The Saddlers' glorious promotion campaign of 1998/1999.

lan Crichton profiles 'Rambo', the target man supreme...

Andy Rammell was born in Nuneaton in 1967 and he was 22 years of age before he made the move into professional football having started his career in the humble surroundings of Atherstone United.

His stay was brief but his legacy was long-lasting because the money they received from Manchester United was used to build a new stand which was promptly named after the striker and it is still used to this day.

He never played, unfortunately, for the Old Trafford club although they certainly made a good profit on him when he moved to Barnsley in September 1990 for a fee of £100,000.

At Oakwell he really came into his own and soon shrugged off the disappointment of being released from Old Trafford to score 50 goals in 220 appearances during a six-year spell with the club between 1990 and 1996.

His next move took him to Southend United and again his never-say-die attitude endeared him to the fans despite scoring a more modest total of 15 goals in 79 matches.

Rammell was the wrong side of 30 when Ray Graydon decided to bring him to Bescot Stadium, but the move was inspired and he was given his Saddlers' League debut against Gillingham on August 8th 1998.

He was probably the best player on the park, completely overshadowing Robert Taylor for whom The Gills had shelled out £500,000, and whilst he didn't get his name on the scoresheet on that hot summer's day, he never shirked a tackle and unsettled the home defence to such an extent that Darren Carr guided Darren Wrack's free-kick past his own 'keeper, ever fearful of the aerial threat posed by the burly striker at every dead-ball situation.

By the beginning of October, Rammell had already scored eight goals and he became a key player in Walsall's Division Two promotion campaign scoring 18 goals in a side where goals were always at a premium with Darren Wrack being the only other player to reach double figures.

Unfortunately he failed to reproduce his best form in The Championship and he gradually fell out of favour after the signing of Brett Angell and joined Wycombe Wanderers in 2000.

He had netted 25 goals in 80 games for The Saddlers and went on to bag a further 31 goals in 92 matches for Wycombe. His ratio of goals-togames was quite impressive considering the amount of time he was sidelined due to injury.

'Rambo' was initially derided as too old and too expensive at £75,000 but he fully justified the faith that Wycombe manager, Lawrie Sanchez, had placed in him and he never let The Chairboy's down.

He was particularly proud of his contribution to their great FA Cup run of 2000/2001 and his goal celebration after scoring against Wolves in the fourth round will live long in the memory of those supporters privileged to see it.

He was reunited with Ray Graydon at Bristol Rovers in 2003 but time had finally caught up with him and with further knee surgery looming, the 36 year-old veteran finally called it a day after scoring six goals in a dozen League matches.

Rammell tried an abortive comeback at Forest Green Rovers in 2004 but he really knew that his ailing knees could no longer stand up to the rigours of competitive football and he took a job working for The Royal Mail.

Considering his age, the only realistic option was to retire because it was either that or risk being in a situation where he was having to get around on a walking sick in a few years time, but despite his heartbreaking decision to guit, Rammell revealed that he had no regrets.

He experienced success at a range of clubs but it is no secret that Bescot held a special place in his heart and he has certainly become part of Walsall folklore.

Oh for the days when he scored goals for The Saddlers in those Black Country derbies as we beat Wolves, West Bromwich Albion and Birmingham City.

After a lengthy spell at Torquay United, which saw him make over 300 League appearances, he joined Walsall in May 2006 but he failed to settle at Bescot Stadium during our League Two Championship-winning campaign. After a spell on loan at Bury, he rejoined Torquay United and was

subsequently loaned out to Weymouth in March 2008. He turned out for Kingstonian in 2008/09.

BENJAMIN Trevor

Much-travelled striker who arrived at Walsall on loan from Peterborough United in March 2007 as we were closing in on promotion. He scored in a 2-1 win at Torquay and then found the net at Notts County as our 2-1 victory sealed a return to League One. He has served a staggering 21 senior clubs plus a host of non-League outfits and ended the 2008/09 campaign with Kidsgrove Athletic. He had a trial with Gateshead in July 2009 but joined Tamworth in time for the start of the 2009/10 campaign before switching to Harrogate Town. His long list of clubs was extended in November 2009 when he linked up with Woking before moving to Bedlington Terriers, from whom he joined Wroxham, on loan, in March 2010. He had a loan move to Morpeth Town in September 2010.





Remembering the greatest games at Bescot (Banks's) Stadium...

TV THRILLER! Walsall 3 Notts County 2 – September 18th 1998



THERE was a time when the Sky Sports cameras used to come to Bescot on a seasonal basis and generally they brought out the best in our players, but the visit of Notts County on September 18th 1998 produced a game of football which would have been enjoyed as much by the neutral viewer as it would have been by the diehard supporter.

Walsall began slowly allowing the visitors to dictate the early play, but gradually they upped the pace and Andy Rammell glanced a fine header just over the bar and Jason Brissett began to trouble the County defence with his blistering pace.

Nevertheless Darren Ward in the visitors' goal seemed comfortable until he was beaten by a stunning strike from Paul Simpson who was on loan from Wolves and making his Saddlers debut.

He collected a pass 25 yards out from goal but his left-foot shot was so accurate that it flew into the corner of the net leaving the 'keeper stranded. Within minutes he had threatened to add to the lead and from that point onwards shots rained in from all directions, to such an extent that Walsall threatened to run riot.

Andy Rammell and Jason Brissett continued to threaten the visitors' goal with their every movement but somehow the Magpies defence held firm and when the referee blew for half-time, The Saddlers were just ahead by a solitary goal despite all their pressure.

Notts County manager, Sam Allardyce was not a happy man at the break and harsh words must have been said in the dressing room because his team came out strongly for the second half and it took them only ten minutes to go ahead as Walsall were caught cold.

Gary Jones headed the equaliser and three minutes later he put Andy Hughes clean through to score with ease. County were now 2-1 up but this topsy-turvy game still had a few twists and turns left in it and after 68 minutes Rammell ghosted in and planted a firm header into the net to bring the scores level once again.

The Saddlers were now looking the more likely winners and with just over ten minutes left, the lively Brissett made it 3-2 to Walsall when the referee allowed play to continue after Rammell had been fouled.

The winger was now in irresistible form and he won a controversial penalty late on when Gary Strodder was judged to have pulled his shirt, but the drama was still not finished as Darren Wrack pulled his kick wide even though he had sent the 'keeper the wrong way.

Walsall lived on their nerves for the last few minutes as County piled on the pressure but eventually the referee blew for time and Ray Graydon's men had held on to win one of the most thrilling games ever staged at Bescot Stadium.

THE SUN burst out of the overcast Lancashire sky as The Saddlers stepped out at Spotland for the first time since the opening day of our 2006/07 League Two Championship-winning campaign

- 4 Good start for Walsall as Darren Byfield did well on the left to thread a low ball through to Jon Macken who turned sharply before tucking the ball home to make it 1-0.
- 6 Rochdale hit back with some neat play that ended with Gary Jones placing an effort just wide of the target.
- 10 Sunshine and showers as Saddlers made a solid start to the game, looking a tight unit.
- 20 Matt Richards linked up with Ryan McGivern on the left and did well to force a corner which found its way over to Julian Gray for a shooting chance just inside the area that he put over.
- 24 An excellent passing move from The Saddlers ended with Matt Richards making room for a cross from the right that was scrambled clear for a corner as the home side found themselves under pressure before eventually being able to clear their lines.
- 26 A corner for the home side dropped by Jonny Brain and this allowed Josh Thompson to lash home on his Dale debut to make it 1-1.
- 37 A free-kick out wide for the home side played short and ended with Craig Dawson firing wide under pressure from Paul Marshall.
- 39 Mix-up in defence by Rochdale gave Julian Gray a chance but he rushed his effort and lifted the ball wide of the target.

40 - An inviting cross by Paul Marshall met with a deft header from Ryan McGivern that landed just wide.

- 44 There was a lively ending to the half. A break by the home side saw Jason Kennedy pick out Chris O'Grady whose speculative effort somehow found its way through Jonny Brain and Anthony Elding was on hand to make it 2-1 from close range. Within seconds the scores were level again as Darren Byfield lashed the ball home from 35 yards. It was a sweet strike from the skipper.
- 47 Corner for The Saddlers only half-cleared as far as Matt Richards who found Paul Marshall and his cross-cum-shot pushed over by Josh Lillis in the home goal. The resulting flagkick saw Clayton McDonald's towering header touched onto the crossbar as Ryan McGivern put the rebound into the sidenetting.
- 52 Encouraging start to the second period for Walsall as a free-kick from Matt Richards picked out Clayton McDonald whose header was off target.
- 60 Some good play by Chris O'Grady saw him turn well before getting in a shot that flew inches wide.
- 62 Rochdale won a penalty when Gary Jones was brought down by Clayton McDonald right on the edge of the area. Jones himself stepped up and fired home to make it 3-2.
- 69 The home side thought they had extended their lead when Craig Dawson headed home a corner but the assistant referee had his flag up a long time before the ball hit the back of the net to rule it out.
- 70 There was a change for Walsall as Reuben Reid replaced Paul Marshall.
- 78 First-year professional, Jamie Paterson was given another taste of the action as he replaced Julian Gray.
- 81 Reuben Reid fed new-boy David Davis for an instinctive strike that he dragged wide of the target as The Saddlers searched for a way back into the game.
- 85 There was a yellow card for David Davis who kicked the ball away having been harshly penalised for a foul.
- 87 Sweeping move by Walsall ended with Ryan McGiven cross teasingly towards Jon Macken who failed to make a proper connection as the home side held their breath.
- 90 Despite seeing plenty of the ball in the closing stages. The Saddlers couldn't find a way through the home rearguard.
