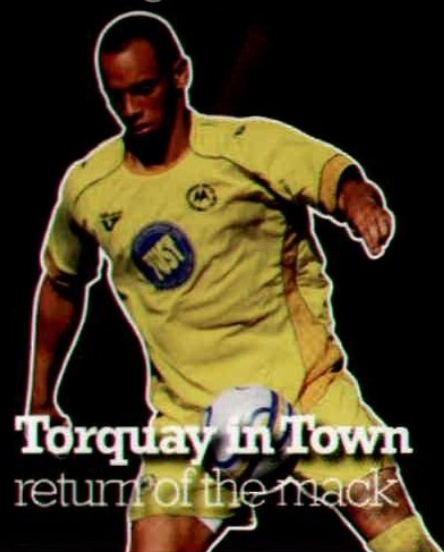

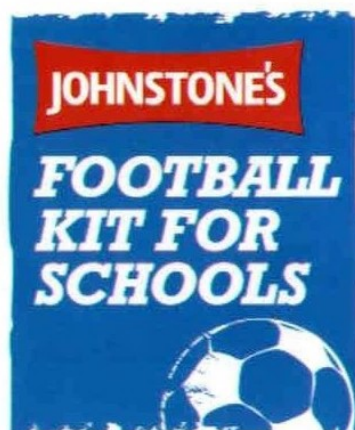

Tonight will be a difficult game and there may be parts of the game where Torquay get up a head of steam – and we will have

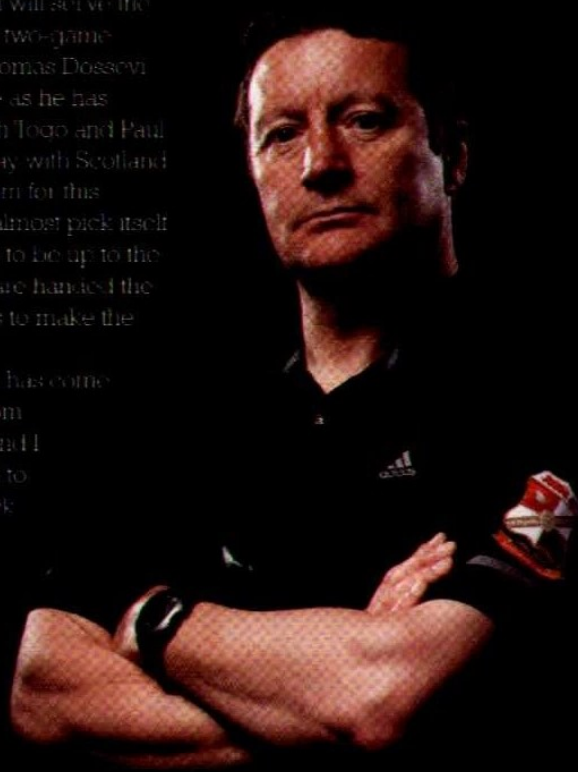

IN TOWN TONIGHT

Having endured a nightmare run of form in recent weeks which has seen them take just three points from their last six League 2 games, **TORQUAY UNITED** will be relieved to have a break from their league woes with tonight's Johnstone's Paint Trophy second round clash.

The Gulls made a barnstorming start to the year, winning all four of their opening fixtures, including overcoming both Lincoln City (2-0) and Port Vale (2-1) on their travels.

Following a number of summer signings, Paul Buckle's new-look squad looked to have been gelling together rapidly as they blazed a trail at the top of the League 2 table early on this term.

However, the wretched run of form in which they currently find themselves commenced with a 2-1

defeat at the hands of a Craig Easton-led Southend United.

Consecutive 0-0 draws against Accrington Stanley and Stevenage Borough then followed, before back to back home defeats against Macclesfield Town (1-3) and Aldershot Town (0-1) did little to lighten the mood around Plainmoor. The two-game losing run came to an end with Torquay taking a point from Saturday's 1-1 draw at Shrewsbury Town. Former Bristol City man Elliot Benyon hit the target for his fifth goal of the campaign.

The Gulls reached this

stage of the competition by virtue of their 3-0 penalty win over Bournemouth back in August, after having played out a goalless draw with the Cherries during normal time.

Buckle's side went out of the tournament at the same stage last year, losing on penalties to eventual winners Southampton after a 2-2 draw in normal time.

Tonight's clash reunites Town and former employees Wayne Carlisle and Lloyd Macklin, both of whom will be hoping to impress on their former stomping ground with cup progress the aim.

With two former Swindon players in their squad, **TORQUAY UNITED** will arrive at The County Ground with their eyes firmly set on cup progress. Here is a rundown of the Torquay squad and the dangermen to keep an eye out for.



CHRIS ROBERTSON 5

A young defender who is equally adept at right-back or centre-back. Robertson arrived on loan from Sheffield United on loan during the 2006/07 season. He made the move to Plainmoor a permanent one in the summer of 2007 and scored on his home debut against Wycombe Wanderers. He signed a new deal in the summer.



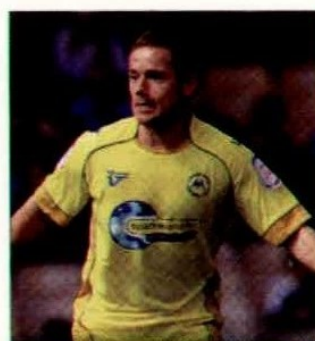
WAYNE CARLISLE 15

The midfielder spent a 12-game loan spell with Swindon on loan from Crystal Palace during the early part of the 2001/02 campaign. He scored on his full league debut for the Robins at Wycombe Wanderers and has also played for Bristol Rovers, Leyton Orient and Exeter City.



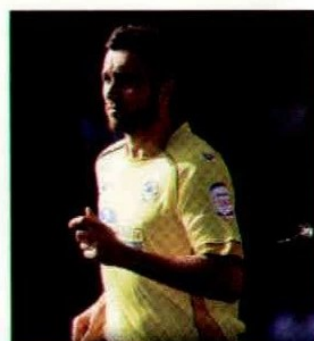
SCOTT BEVAN 1

Bevan signed for Torquay United in September 2008 on loan from Shrewsbury Town and made his debut against Wrexham in a 1-1 draw. The goalkeeper has since played a huge part in the team breaking a club record for minutes without conceding a goal in league matches and with his agility and size (6'6"), he has made the goalkeeping position his own. He signed a permanent 18-month contract with the Gulls in December 2008 and only injury stopped him from completing the end of the 2008/09 season between the sticks. Last season Bevan shared the 'keeping duties with Michael Poke but following Poke's summer move to Brighton, Bevan began the 2010/11 season between the sticks.



DANNY STEVENS 19

Stevens began his career with Spurs as a 12-year old before being released seven years later. He then joined Luton Town but failed to break into the first team set-up and joined Torquay after a successful trial spell in the summer of 2007. A popular figure with the Plainmoor faithful, he has now made over 90 league appearances.



MARTIN GRITTON 20

The Glasgow-born forward began his career with Plymouth Argyle and joined Torquay on a free transfer in September 2002 following a successful loan spell. He then had spells with Grimsby, Lincoln and Macclesfield before joining Chesterfield in January 2009. He is currently on loan with Torquay from The Spireites.



DAMON LATHROPE 22

The midfielder was offered a professional contract with Torquay at the start of the current campaign following his release from Norwich City, where he was youth team captain. He began his career with Cambridge United and joined The Canaries following the closing down of the Cambridge United youth department.

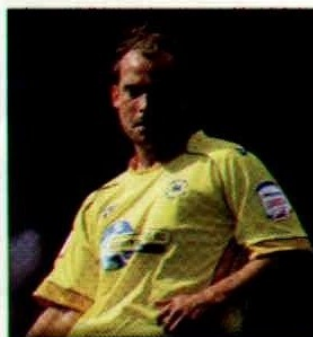


ELLIOT BENYON 9

The forward started out with Bristol City and had two very impressive loan spells at Crawley Town and St Albans during the 2006/07 season before Paul Buckle showed his interest and offered him a contract at Plainmoor. He finished as top goal scorer and player of the year last season.


GUY BRANSTON 23

One of the most experienced members of the Torquay squad, Branston has now amassed over 300 league appearances after starting his career as a trainee with Leicester City. Torquay is the defender's 17th professional club and he has spent no less than 13 spells on loan during a nomadic career.


KEVIN NICHOLSON 3

An experienced left-back, Nicholson was an ever present during the 2007/08 campaign having made the move from then Blue Square Premier rivals Forest Green Rovers. He started as a trainee with Sheffield Wednesday and has also played for Northampton Town, Notts County and Scarborough.


LEE MANSELL 7

Arrived in the summer of 2006 and the energetic midfielder has been one of United's most consistent performers during the last three seasons. Highly-rated from a young age, Mansell made his Football League debut for Luton Town at the age of just 18, and scored 5 goals from 17 starts in his first season.


LLOYD MACKLIN 14

Still Swindon's youngest ever player after making his Town debut as a 15-year old, Macklin joined Torquay United in the summer following his County Ground release. The winger has been used by manager Paul Buckle as an impact player from the bench so far this term and will hope to impress against his old club.

DID YOU KNOW?

Defender Phil King first signed for Swindon Town from Torquay United in February 1987. King, who now hosts the hospitality floor at The County Ground on matchdays, went on to make 150 appearances for the Robins in two spells with the club.


EUNAN O'KANE 10

The 20-year old from County Derry began his career as a youth team player at Everton before a move to Coleraine followed. After just 13 games with his new club he caught the attentions of Torquay who secured the midfielders services. He can operate anywhere across the midfield.


LATHANIEL ROWE-TURNER 2

Leicester-born, the defender came through the impressive youth system at Leicester City but never managed to break into the first team. He spent a loan spell at Cheltenham Town last November before arriving at Torquay on loan in February, before making the move a permanent one in the summer.


CHRIS ZEBROSKI 26

The Swindon-born striker started out as a member of Paul Wainwright's Swindon Robins as a nine-year old. Zebroski then joined the Swindon Town Centre of Excellence before being released at 16. The frontman then joined the Football Academy at Cirencester before joining Plymouth Argyle in 2005. After four first team appearances with The Pilgrims he joined Millwall before a successful season-long loan with Torquay in 2007/08. His form with Torquay was enough to persuade Wycombe Wanderers to sign him in the summer of 2008 for £20,000 from Millwall. He returned to Torquay United, initially on loan, in November 2009. It was a successful return to Plainmoor with 4 goals in 7 games. United came back in for Zebroski and brought him back to Plainmoor on loan with a permanent deal signed in January 2010.

The Johnstone's Paint Trophy remains high on the Swindon Town priority list and after an early exit from this year's Carling Cup, the Robins are looking to make strides in this year's remaining cup competitions.

TOWN go into the game on the back of defeat at Dagenham & Redbridge on Saturday afternoon in the first ever league meeting between the two sides. It was a disappointing outcome from the visit to the London Borough of Barking & Dagenham Stadium with a Thomas Dossevi goal all the Robins have to show for their efforts.

Attention now turns to the cup with the visit of Torquay United stoking the interest in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy once again. Town were dealt a tough hand in the first round draw with an away clash at current trophy holders Southampton.

However, goals from Charlie Austin and a brace from the resurgent Vincent Bendis secured a safe passage into round 2. In a FA meeting with the Gulls' midfielder Jon Paul McGovern, who came off the bench on Saturday at Dagenham, Towns name them most about the pros and cons of cup football. The Glaswegian reached

the semi-finals of the Scottish FA Cup during his time with Livingston and was a part of the MK Dons side which reached round 3 of the League Cup against Tottenham Hotspur in 2006 with a 5-0 defeat ending the League 2 side's interest in the competition.

With McGovern and his teammates set to face lower division opposition this evening, he is under no illusions as to what is required to make the next stage.

This will be a really tough game for us," said McGovern, who turned 30 on Sunday. "It's the second round of the competition and Torquay will come here wanting to get through themselves, especially against a League 1 side."

Torquay started the League 2 season really well and have some quality players in their squad and we know it's going to be a hard game.

They will relish coming to The County Ground against a good side at a nice stadium. They will look forward to it and have their

own game plan but from our own point of view we have to go into the game with confidence. There is no reason why we can't get through to the next round.

And tonight's encounter could see a match up between McGovern and former Sheffield Wednesday teammate Guy Branston who joined the Gulls in the summer from Burton Albion. Branston, who has 320 league starts to his name, played 13 games for the Hillsborough club after joining from Rotherham United in June 2004.

"I had the pleasure of playing with Guy when we were at Sheffield Wednesday together," said Town's own former Wednesdayite. "He is a good man and a real character. He is a good player to have alongside you in the dressing room that's for sure."

"He has good experience at the back and I have played against him a couple of times over the last couple of years and he has done well in those games."

Town's number seven believes his side can bounce back from Saturday's League 1 defeat and can produce a performance of sufficient quality to see Town through.

Whether it is a league game or a cup game, there is always a level of expectation on you as a player. What we have to do is knuckle down and put in a professional performance

and hopefully that will be a winning one."

Loosing against Leyton Orient was disappointing and we didn't want to go out of the competition at the first hurdle, but that's unfortunately what happened. Being out of the Carling Cup means we now have a little bit more time to concentrate on the league and the other competitions that we are in, one of which is the Johnstone's Paint Trophy. We will go in with the same attitude

and hopefully that will be a winning one."

McGovern has been one of Town's most consistent performers this term and having already amassed 110 league starts in a Swindon shirt, he is keen to make the most of what tonight's tie has to offer.

"It's a tremendous competition to win. We know how much coverage there is as you get to the latter stages. It has now become quite a high-profile competition and you are only a couple of steps away from reaching Wembley, so a win against Torquay would be magnificent for us and little bit closer to reaching the final."

TORQUAY United boss Paul Buckle was full of praise for the efforts of his players after taking a point from the League 2 clash against Shrewsbury Town on Saturday afternoon.

"We won't change and we won't stop passing the ball," said Buckle. "And you won't see this team lose confidence in what they're doing, because we'll keep encouraging them and we won't have a go at them for

missing chances."

A fifth goal of the campaign from in-form striker Elliot Benyon helps the Gulls take a point with Buckle pleased with his side's display in possession.

"We used the ball very well all afternoon, and I can't remember Shrewsbury really troubling Scott Bevan at any time in the game. It's incredible how many times we've hit the post in the last few games — it must be seven or eight."



Billy Bodin

AFTER coming off the bench for his Town debut on Saturday, Billy Bodin is hoping to feature against Torquay United as the Robins look to extend their run in the competition.

"It would be great to be involved. I have been on the bench a couple of times now, one of which was against Southampton in the last round of the competition.

"I am slowly but surely getting used to life as a professional here but I am really enjoying it."

The Welsh U21 international is looking forward to a potential match-up against former teammate Lloyd Macklin this evening.

"I still speak to Lloyd now and again and I am sure he is looking forward to coming back and playing at The County Ground. If he is on the right and if I did feature in any part of the game then that would probably be wide on the left. It would be great to line-up against him."

Bodin featured for Swindon's reserves against the Gulls at Plainmoor recently and the winger is hoping for a change in fortunes this time around.

"They had quite an experienced side out when we played them, whereas we had a relatively young side out. Hopefully we can do a job on them on Tuesday night and get through to the next round of the cup."

MATT Ritchie is hoping to make a big impact in a Town shirt after rejoining Swindon on loan from Portsmouth.

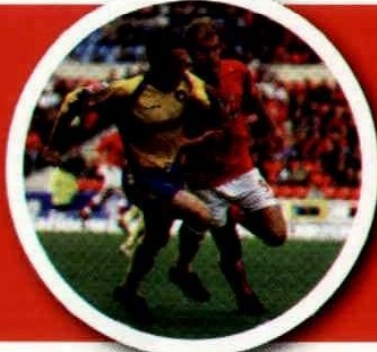

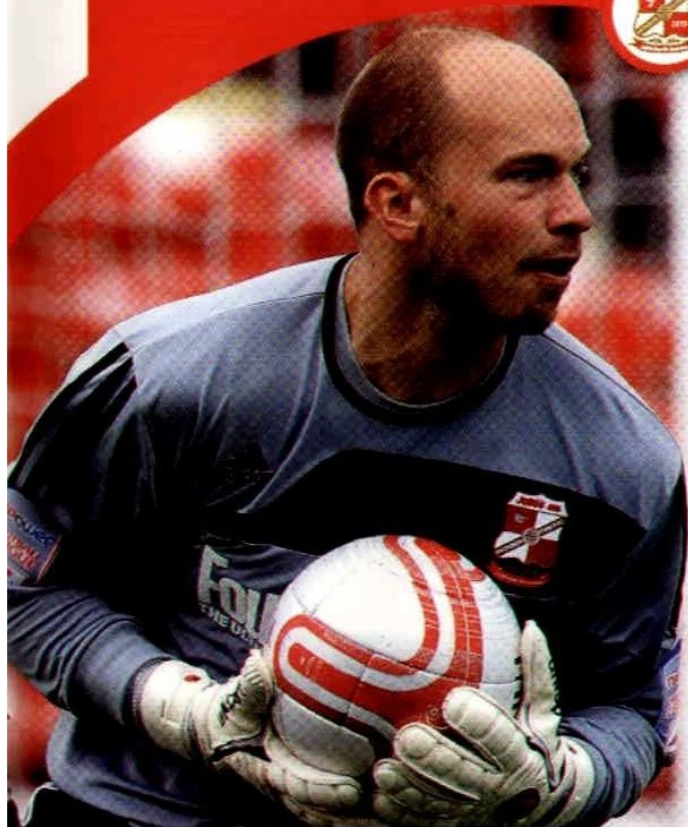
"It's a good opportunity to progress and a win against Torquay would put us into the Area Quarter-Finals," said Smith, who has made three first team appearances so far this term.

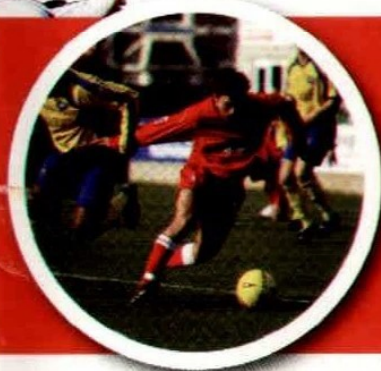

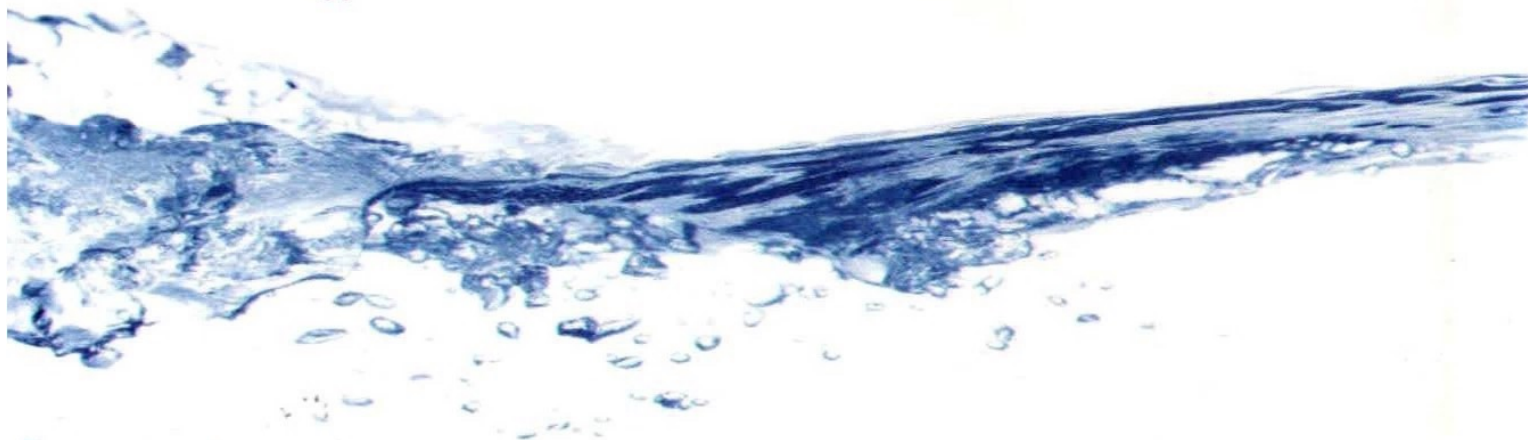
