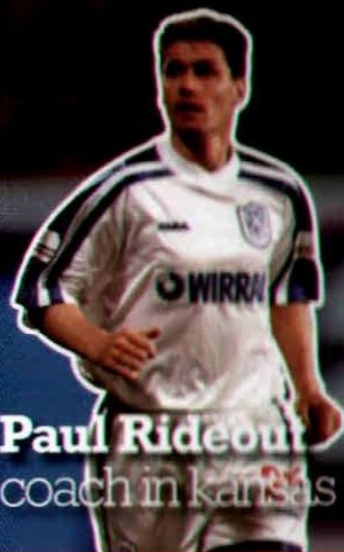

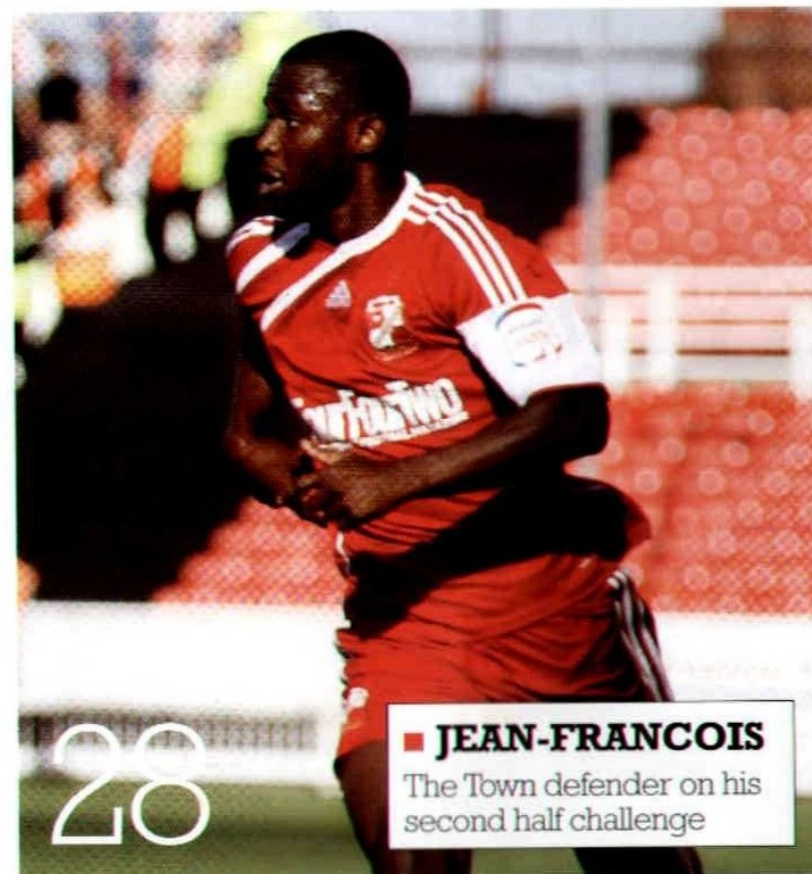

IN TOWN TODAY

TRANMERE ROVERS come into tonight's clash hoping to put to an end an indifferent run of away form, indicative of a tough season thus far which sees them flirting with the relegation places ahead of their trip to The County Ground.

LES Parry's outfit started the season as one of the favourites to struggle in League 1, and their start to the campaign did little to prove the doubters wrong, picking up just one win in their eight opening league matches – a 1-0 triumph over Peterborough United at Prenton Park.

Rovers subsequently suffered 3-1 away defeats to Yeovil Town and Colchester United before a morale boosting 1-0 away win over Bristol Rovers gave tonight's visitors hope as September came to an end.

A creditable 1-1 home draw with league leaders

Brighton & Hove Albion started October with much promise for Rovers, before defeats to Southampton (0-2) and Brentford (0-3) continued Parry's side's indifferent opening to the season.

However, the loss to the Bees seemingly galvanised the Wirral outfit, who proceeded to go on a run of just one defeat in five League 1 games – registering four wins in the process including impressive away triumphs at Walsall (4-1) and Notts County (1-0).

But this last result proved to be the catalyst for the hugely contrasting run, with defeats to Hartlepool United

(0-1), Leyton Orient (1-2) and Huddersfield Town (0-2) in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy Area Quarter Final following on from it.

An indifferent January thus far brings them into tonight's clash needing an away win to kick-start their campaign.

Town put seven past Rovers in the two clashes between the sides last season, with goals from Billy Paynter (2), Anthony McNamee and Simon Ferry clinching a 4-1 at Prenton Park, and an own goal and strikes from Paynter and Charlie Austin sealing a 3-0 triumph at The County Ground.

arrive at The County Ground after a difficult run of results. Les Parry is eyeing a change of fortunes for his side as they try to end their own County Ground hoodoo...



TONY WARNER 1

Veteran keeper Warner joined Rovers in early January, signing a contract until the end of the season at Prenton Park. The 36-year-old, who began his career at Liverpool, has made nearly 300 professional appearances during his career. He has also spent time on loan at The County Ground, having made two appearances for Town in the 1997/1998 season.



AARON CRESSWELL 3

The defender is now in his third year as a professional having come through the youth system at Prenton Park. The 21-year old left-back is a threat from set-pieces and was a regular in the squad throughout last season. He has scored four goals so far this term and has been a regular performer this term.



DALE JENNINGS 21

The 17-year old burst onto the first team scene earlier this season and has five goals in just 18 league appearances to his name so far this term. Jennings was handed his chance on the big stage by manager Les Parry on Saturday 18th September in the 1-1 home draw with Charlton Athletic as a second half substitute. Ten days later he scored his first goal for the club to seal a 1-0 home victory over Bristol Rovers in only his third senior game. He then scored a brace and two assists in the 4-2 win over MK Dons – a performance that subsequently had Premier League scouts casting a watchful eye over the youngster's progress. A wonder-goal in early November against Plymouth Argyle was followed up by another effort against Southampton in a 2-0 win on Saturday afternoon.



JOSS LABADIE 25

Labadie initially joined Rovers on loan in March 2010 from West Brom. The 19-year-old was a second year professional at the Baggies and had two previous loan spells at Cheltenham Town and Shrewsbury Town. He scored three times in nine appearances for Rovers and signed a two-year contract in the summer of 2010.



RYAN FRAUGHAN 15

Midfielder Fraughan signed his first professional contract with Tranmere Rovers in January 2009. The Liverpool-based youngster has played for the club since the age of 14 and he made his first team debut at Carrow Road against Norwich City in 2009. He has been a regular off the bench this season.



MAX BLANCHARD 18

Tranmere signed 23-year old defender Blanchard on a one-year deal in the summer of 2010. The centre-back joined Rovers from French side Moulins where he spent the 2009-10 season. He arrived at Prenton Park in pre-season and impressed against Premier League neighbours Liverpool before being awarded a permanent contract.

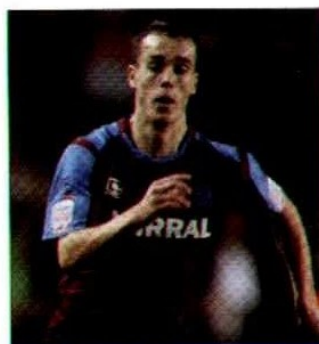


LATEEF ELFORD ALLIYU 35

The 18-year old striker came up through the youth and reserve team ranks at West Bromwich Albion before spending loan spells with Hereford United and Icelandic side Keflavik earlier this year. He joined Tranmere on loan at the end of November and has now made seven League 1 appearances for the club with one goal to his name.


IAN GOODISON 5

The former Jamaican international has played almost 300 times for Tranmere after arriving at the club in February 2004 during Brian Little's tenure as manager. He has been named supporters' Player of the Season three times, and has twice won the North West League 1 Footballer of the Year award. He has more than 100 international caps to his name.


MICHAEL KAY 17

Rovers completed the month long loan signing of Kay from Premiership side Sunderland in January 2011. The 21-year-old, who has been with the Black Cats since the age of eight, was an ever-present in their reserve team last term, and has previously spent time on loan at Gateshead during the earlier part of this campaign.


ASH TAYLOR 12

A versatile central defender or midfielder, 19-year-old Taylor has been at the club since the age of 10 and was a first team regular throughout Season 2009/2010. Despite being born in the Wirral, Taylor has been capped by Wales at Under 18 level, and has also spent time on loan at Colwyn Bay during his early career.


JOHN WELSH 8

A former England U21 international, Welsh joined the ranks at Prenton Park after four seasons with Hull City. He began his career at Liverpool and made his debut for the Anfield club at the age of 18. The winger made his 65th league start for Rovers in Saturday's 2-0 home win over Southampton at Prenton Park.

IAN THOMAS-MOORE 9

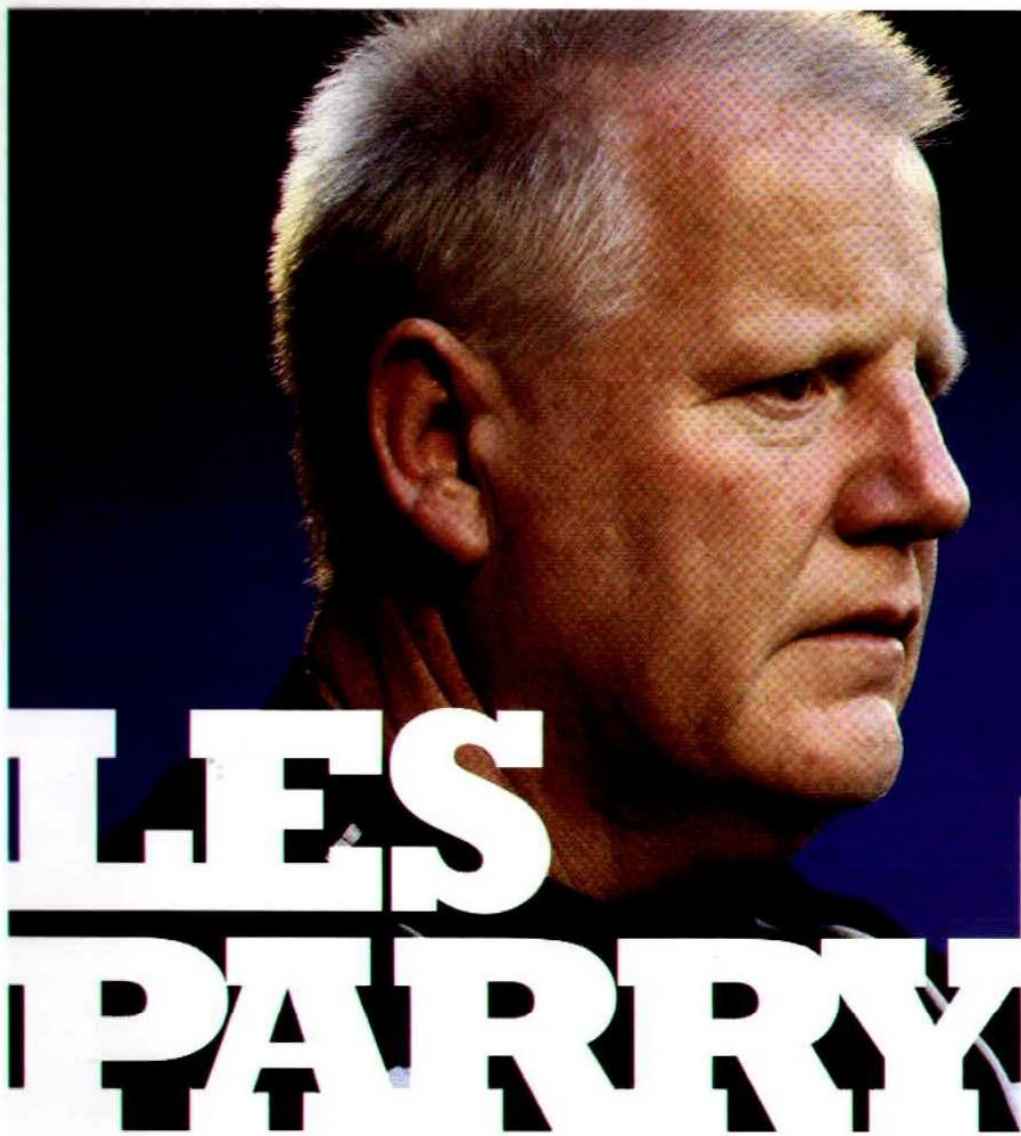
The striker returned to Prenton Park for a second spell with Tranmere Rovers on transfer deadline day in 2008. Thomas-Moore scored 12 goals in 41 league starts in his first stint after coming up through the youth ranks. He has also played for Nottingham Forest, Stockport County, Burnley and Leeds United.


ADAM MCGURK 26

Tranmere signed striker Adam McGurk on a one-year deal in August 2010 after he impressed during a trial spell. The 21-year old is a product of the Aston Villa youth system and played for the club's reserve team before a serious knee injury hampered his progress. He has one cap for Northern Ireland at U21 level.


ZOUMANA BAKAYOGO 24

Tranmere Rovers initially signed defender Zoumana Bakayogo on a short-term contract in September 2009. The 24-year old, who was born in Paris, began his career at Paris St Germain before moving to Millwall in 2006. He spent time on loan at Brighton & Hove Albion and returned to France last season where he played for UJA Alfortville. He has represented the Ivory Coast at Under-23 level, playing in Olympic Qualifiers. His early performances for Rovers attracted the attentions of higher-division clubs although the defender soon put pen to paper on a new contract - a deal which was subsequently extended by a season in the summer of 2010. He has struggled to regain his form this term though, with just eleven appearances to his name.



LES PARRY

A run of just two league wins from 11 games brought the curtain down on John Barnes' brief reign as manager of Tranmere Rovers, but the Liverpool legend's dismissal from post proved to be something of an opportunity not to be missed for **PARRY** – the club's long-serving physio.

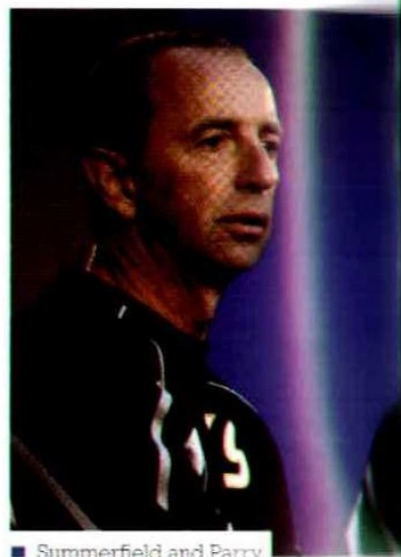
BARNES, along with his assistant Jason McAteer, was sacked in early October 2009 with Parry placed in temporary charge with Shaun Garnett and former Swindon striker Wayne Allison named as his assistants. The trio guided Rovers to five wins and three draws before Parry was handed the manager's chair on a permanent until the end of the season in December. Parry successfully kept

Tranmere in League 1, securing the team's place for the 2010/11 season with a vital victory away at Stockport County on the final day of the 2009-10 season.

Parry started as part-time physiotherapist at Tranmere in 1991 before being appointed full-time by Johnny King two years later. He completed a PhD in 'Sports injuries in professional soccer and

the effects of detraining' at Liverpool John Moores University in July 2010 and continued to fill the physiotherapist role alongside that of manager until the appointment of Crewe Alexandra's Steve Walker in October 2010.

Speaking of his time as sole physio at Prenton Park, he recently told BBC Sport's Paul Fletcher: "I listened to 900 or so pre-match

and half-time team talks, I watched a manager prepare for a game 900 times and listened to him on the bench observing why and when he made changes.

"Throw in my involvement with reserve games and that is probably 1,500 games. In many ways, I am not equipped to be a manager but, then again, I cannot think of anyone else with that type and volume of

One To Watch

ENOCH SHOWUNMI joined Tranmere on a two-year deal in the summer of 2010 after spending the second half of last season with Scottish Premier League side Falkirk.



SHOWUNMI who has played twice for Nigeria, began his career at Luton Town in 2003 and played a key role in their promotion campaign in 2004-05.

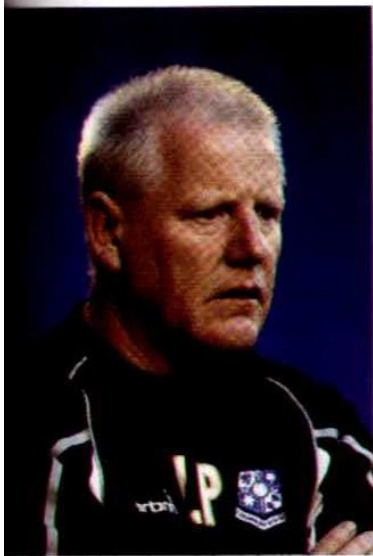
He joined Bristol City in 2006 and helped them gain promotion into the Championship. In total his time at Ashton Gate saw him score 13 goals from 50 league outings. He also had a loan stint away from

Bristol towards the end of the 2007/08 campaign with a ten-game spell at Sheffield Wednesday.

In the summer of 2008 he made a move to Leeds United where he linked up with Jonathan Douglas and Alan Sheehan at Elland Road. However it was not an altogether successful spell in Yorkshire as the striker managed just three league appearances for the

Whites. In January 2010 he was allowed to join Falkirk in search of regular first team football and he scored once in 21 games for the Bairns.

Tranmere beat off interest from a number of League 1 teams to secure the striker's services in the summer. He rewarded the faith shown in him by Les Parry by scoring in three consecutive games at the end of August and he now has seven to his name.

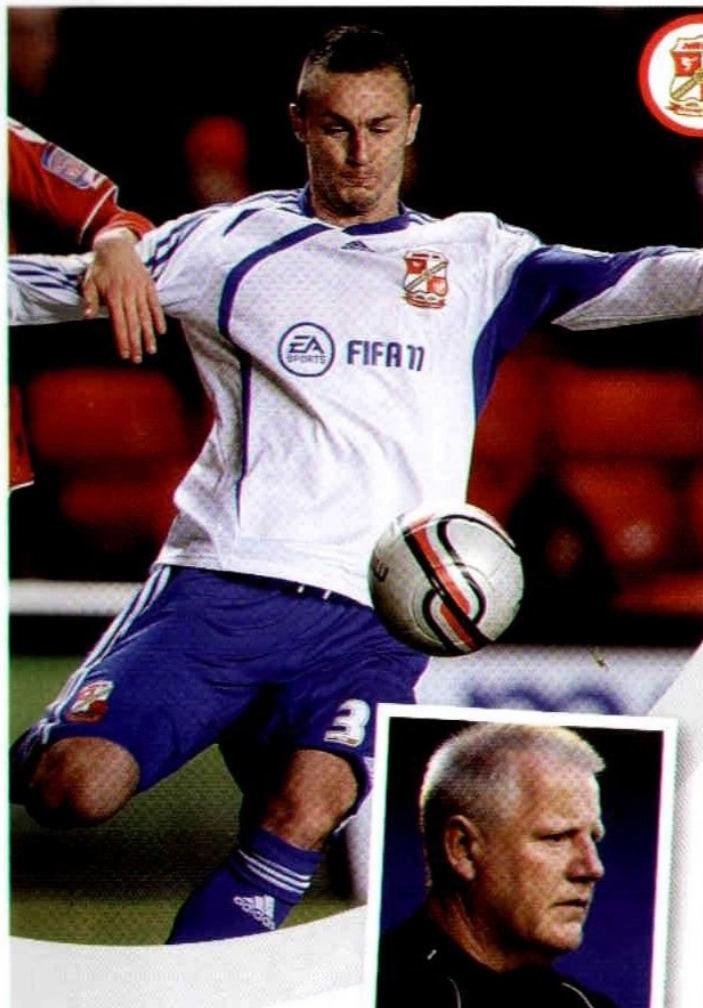

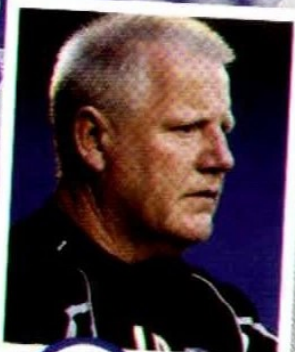
THE defender will this evening serve the second of a three-match suspension, but after his red card against one of his former clubs, Yeovil Town, he is more determined than ever to get back into action.

Rose has made 16 starts in League 1 for the Robins after joining in the summer on a free transfer from League 2 side Stockport County.

Speaking of the dismissal against the Glovers, he said: "It was a bit silly to be honest, the lad caught me and I got a bit frustrated. I did catch him and unfortunately that means I will miss three games."

"Losing against Yeovil really disappointed me because I felt like it was my fault. We were on top of the game and were doing pretty well before I got sent off."

He added: "The only plus point is that we have three games in a week so the suspension period is over quickly. I'll keep working hard in training in the meantime because I want to be back fighting for my place in the first team again as soon as the ban comes to an end."

"The Swindon game is a bigger game for us than the Southampton one. Last year we didn't have much luck there but runs are there to be broken."

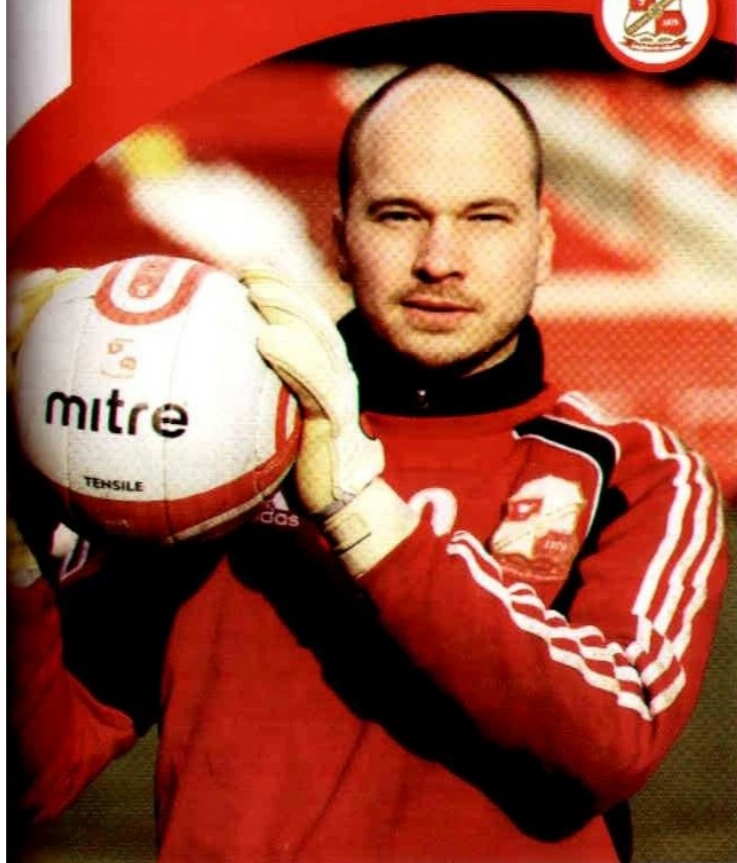
TWO home wins from two games this week would be the perfect end to January and the Town 'keeper is hoping to play his part in helping the Robins achieve that aim.

"There's a lot of negative things going around and it's easy to fall into that mindset, but we can't afford to do that - we've got to stay together."

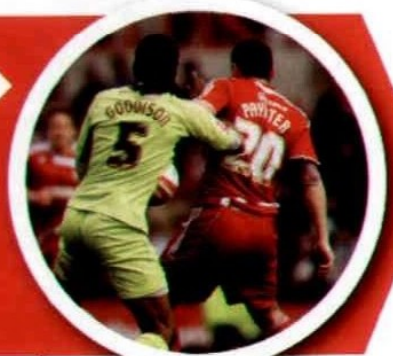
"One good performance every few games isn't good enough, and that's got to change now."

In the rule book

JAMES LININGTON became Select Group assistant referee in 2006 and during the same year was appointed as an assistant referee in the FA Challenge Vase Final and the Football League One Play-Off Final. He joined the National Group as a referee in 2008.

How did you get introduced into refereeing?

I was released from a club at the age of 15 because I was not strong enough to play in senior football and at the level I intended to play at. I then took up refereeing to stay involved in football with the intention to return to playing when I became stronger. I have still not returned to playing because I enjoy refereeing and had set myself a target to become a career referee.

What has been the highlight of your career so far?

I have a number of highlights; these include refereeing the Isle of Wight

gold cup final, Hampshire senior cup final and both legs of the Southern League Final. As an assistant referee I would say being appointed to the FA Vase Final and the League 1 play-off final in 2005-06. I was then promoted to the select group of assistants in 2006.

What is the best game you have officiated?

The League 1 play-off final between Swansea City and Barnsley in 2006 at the Millennium Stadium was a special moment for me. The roof was closed due to bad weather, which made the noise from everyone in the ground to be even louder than you can imagine which made the hair on the back of my neck stand up.

What are your aims as a Select Group assistant referee?

My aims are to be appointed to the national list of referees and then onto the select group. As an assistant referee my aim would be to progress to the highest standard as one of the world's best assistants Phillip Sharp.

Who has been the biggest influence in your career and why?

At the start of my career a big influence was Barrie Wade - he was a friend and mentor to me. He officiated on the national list of assistants and I travelled to watch him on games which I looked closely at his technique. Barrie had great technique which proved to help me as an assistant later in my career. As a referee he watched me on many occasions and he would always give me advice and prepare me early for the next level.

There have been many others that have helped me throughout my career who include, Ron Groves, Rob Harris, Paul Durkin and Steve Dunn. There are many others but I am sure they all know who they are.

The Law

LAW 12 - DISCIPLINARY SANCTIONS

THE yellow card is used to communicate that a player, substitute or substituted player has been cautioned.

The red card is used to communicate that a player, substitute or substituted player has been sent off.

Only a player, substitute or substituted player may be shown the red or yellow card.

The referee has the authority to take disciplinary sanctions from the moment he enters the field of play until he leaves the field of play after the final whistle.

A player who commits a cautionable or sending-off offence, either on or off the field of play, whether directed towards an opponent, a team-mate, the referee, an assistant referee or any other person, is disciplined according to the nature of the offence committed.

SEEING RED!

WEST Ham manager Avram Grant branded the red card he believes cost his side a crucial win at Everton "a joke".

Frederic Piquionne headed the Hammers into a 2-1 lead with six minutes remaining, but Piquionne, who had been booked four minutes earlier, leapt over advertising hoardings to celebrate and was shown a second yellow card on his return to the field.



DANNY WILSON

Good evening and welcome to The County Ground for tonight's match against **TRANMERE ROVERS**. It's another huge game for us, and we're desperate to get back on track with a win after a disappointing few weeks.

JONATHAN DOUGLAS led Town to a disappointing derby defeat to Bristol Rovers at the weekend, and despite his frustration at what was a sloppy Town display, the skipper is determined to inspire his side to their first win in five games tonight.

Looking back on the defeat to Bristol Rovers on Saturday, what do you feel went wrong?

It was another case of avoidable errors costing us the game. We played alright in places, but they got their first and second goals as a result of mistakes and a lack of concentration in our defence, and we left ourselves with a mountain to climb.

J-P took his goal really well and it came at a time when we were really getting back into the game so there was a real belief that we could get something from it.

But then we let them in

again not long after and that was a real kick in the teeth that we never really had the chance to bounce back from.

We've been saying it all year, but it's not a case of us being a bad side, it's just lapses in concentration that keep costing us and it's got to stop.

What has the mood been like in the camp ahead of the match against Tranmere Rovers?

Obviously confidence is a bit low around the place because it's been a few weeks since we last won, and we've had some pretty gutting defeats and poor



performances recently.

But we've been working really hard over the last few days, as we always do, and we've got to be confident about the game against Tranmere, because we've got enough to beat them.

Losing is never a good thing for a team's confidence and there's no denying it's taken a hit recently, but everyone still has a belief in their own ability, and hopefully that will come across against Tranmere.

How did you rate your personal performance against Bristol Rovers? Do you feel like you're getting back to your best form?

I think I did ok, and I am feeling fairly good about my game at the moment. As I've mentioned before, it hasn't been the easiest of seasons for me because I've been in and out of the side through injury and suspension, but hopefully now this is the start of a decent run in the team for me.

But it goes without saying that regardless of the way I'm playing, it's more important that the team start picking up points immediately, and hopefully I can help us do that.

What sort of a test are you expecting from Tranmere Rovers this evening?

They are all tough games in this league, and the Tranmere game will be no different. They've had a great win over Southampton at the weekend and will be full of confidence, so it will be a difficult one for us.

They're a big strong side so we'll have to measure up to that, but I'm confident we can.

How much would a win do for the team?

It would be a massive boost, and one that everyone is in need of, so here's hoping we can put in a good performance, cut out the stupid mistakes and get back on track.

Pavett gets started with Town

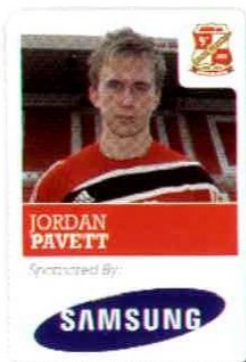

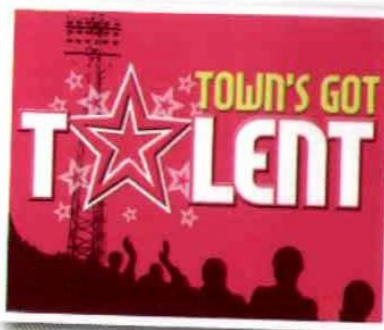


Town's Got Talent

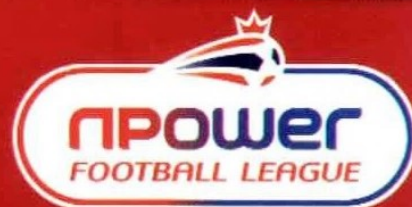

IT has been a season of false dawns for Jean-Francois, with the young defender apparently having won the battle to replace Gordon Greer at the heart of the Town backline after being selected for the season's opener against Brighton & Hove Albion, only to see injury and loss of form set him back on numerous occasions.

Another of those dawns came when, after a lengthy spell on the sidelines, Jean-Francois was selected in the 4-0 away triumph at Plymouth Argyle, putting in a man of the match performance on his return to the side.

A run of four starts then followed, before yet another injury put paid to the Haitian's hopes of an extended run in the side, and Jean-Francois admits that series of events was indicative of what has been a tough season for him thus far.

"This time last season I'd had about 20 games that I started, and this year I've only started about nine which of course is not ideal," he said.

"You can see that it is frustrating for me, and I can't be happy with the season so far so I have to work harder.

"First it was injury, then it was form, then it was another injury so it's been really difficult for me.

"I have to keep doing all the stuff in training that I've been doing and hopefully I can impress the manager enough to get more games."

Jean-Francois' first team opportunities received a boost last week with fellow centre-half Sean Morrison moving to Championship side Reading, and while the 24-year-old was disappointed to see his teammate leave, he is looking forward to trying to cement his place in the side in Morrison's absence.

"I wouldn't have minded if Sean had stayed because he would have helped the team a lot. It is a big loss for the team, but that is football.

"A lot of people go, and we have to deal with that and keep going without him.

"Obviously he's a great player and it's disappointing, but I wish him all the best for the future.

"When I started the season I said the same thing about replacing Gordon (Greer) and I've only started nine games so I can't assume anything.

"Obviously when people in my position leave I've got more chance, but I have to keep working hard and showing what I

can do on the pitch.

"Hopefully I can start doing that now, but I can't just assume I'm going to be playing because Sean's left."

The Haitian has been at The County Ground for nearly two years, and despite still looking shaky at times, has evidently benefited from his time in Wiltshire, and he is delighted with the development he has made.

"Even compared to last season I think I have made great progress," he said.

"I came to Swindon two years ago, and I think I have made a big improvement in my game.

"I have shown myself and the people around me that I have got the quality to be a regular starter in this league.

"But football is never easy: you can do well today and be the worst player tomorrow, so it's important to keep concentrating.

"I have to keep working hard if I want to be the best defender at this club, which is my aim."

He added: "My confidence has increased a lot since I've been here.

"When you're playing a lot it can only help the amount you believe in yourself.

"I think my quality as a footballer has improved as well, but you always have to keep working on things like that to keep doing your job well.

"If you stop working on something, there is no way you're going to get better, so it's important to just keep working on my game."

As far as the rest of the season is concerned, Jean-Francois is as determined as ever to help Town turn around the ailing campaign, and the defender reiterated the squad's desperation to reward their fans for their continuing support – with his particularly favourable reception in mind.

"I'm looking forward to the rest of the season to be honest, because we're not far off what we want to be," he said.

"We've said that a lot, but we've got the quality to get back from where we are to the top six.

"What we are expecting is to be in the play-off places and we know what we need to do.

"We need to reward the fans because we have disappointed them a lot, but they know we need them, and hopefully we can give them something to cheer about.

"I didn't play for about two months but when I came back I heard people singing my name which I am really pleased about.

"I love to hear it and it helps my game, so hopefully it can carry on like that."

And as for the rest of his personal campaign, Jean-Francois insists he would rather play a supporting role in a successful team than a starring role in a mediocre one – a turn of events he hopes will develop sooner rather than later.

"I've had some good games from a personal point of view, but that is never enough if the team aren't getting results, and we haven't been," he said.

"Apart from my personal pride, me having a good game doesn't really mean anything unless the result is right.

"I am happy when I've done well and people congratulate me, but the main thing is to win the game – there should be eleven players up for the man of the match award."

"I'm pretty good in the air and love a challenge," he smiled. "I enjoyed my time with Alfreton Town and hopefully can work hard here and try and break into the side.

"There is competition for places here at Swindon, right across the backline with the likes of Scott Cuthbert and Andy Frampton here, but I am sure I will be learning from those guys too."

Flint has been a regular in the Alfreton team in 2010/11 and scored three goals in 24 appearances for the club this term prior to his switch to SN1. Laurie Wilson, son of Town manager Danny, is also on the books at Alfreton and was able to offer an insight of what to expect

of a move to Swindon.

"When I told Laurie about the opportunity of joining Swindon he said I'd be a fool not to sign," Flint explained. "We had a chat and he told me what to expect from his Dad, but he was very positive.

"When I came down to Swindon and spoke to the Gaffer, he told me he wants to get the ball down and play. I certainly don't like to overplay though and my style is to 'get rid' when required that's for certain. That's not to say I'm not comfortable with the ball though - but I'm sure the step up in standard and coaching will really benefit me."

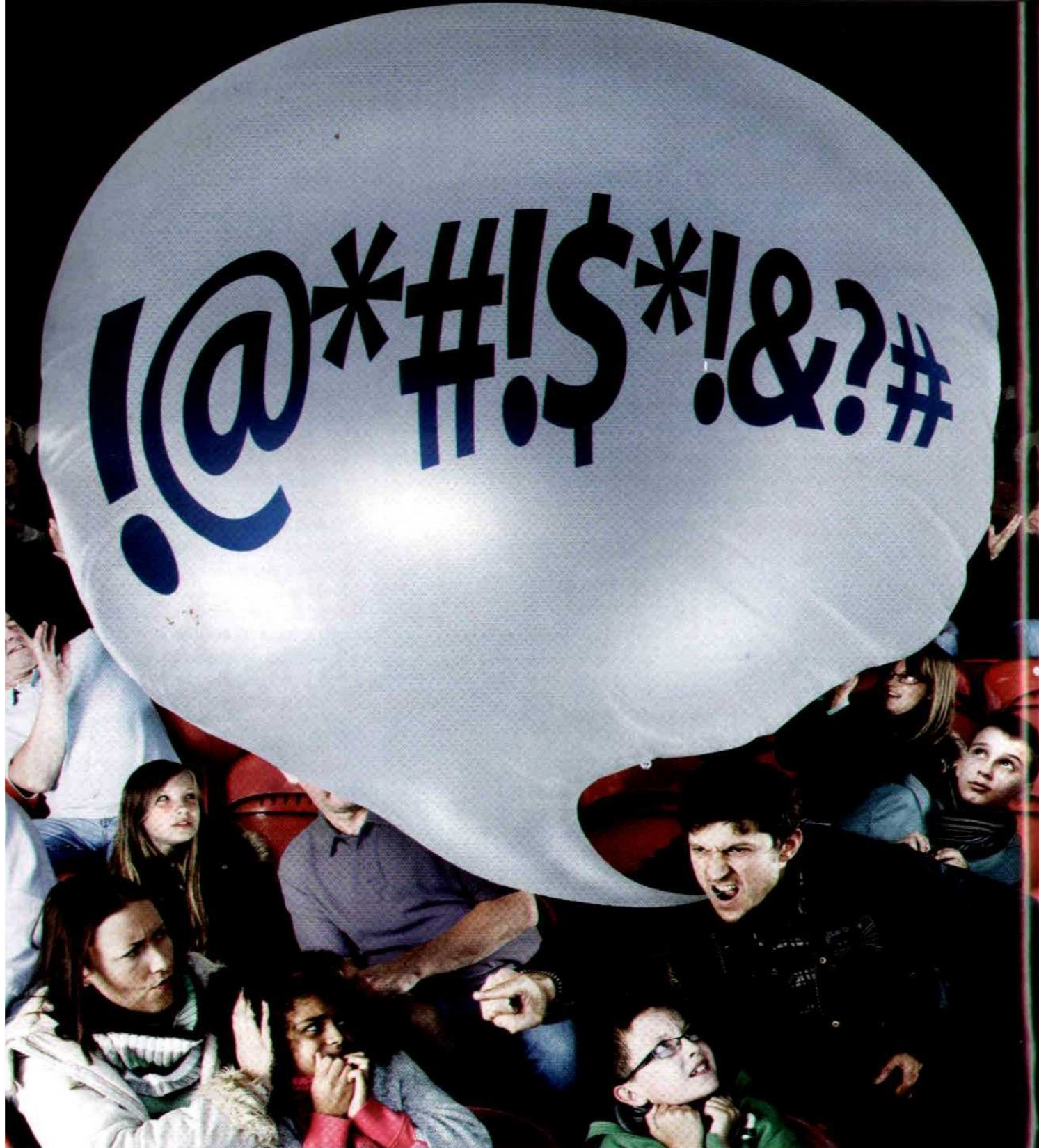
Flint knows he will have to adjust to changes on and off the pitch having made the switch into the professional game, but he is looking forward to getting his new career under way.

He added: "Alfreton was a few levels down but I'm pretty confident that I can cope with league football. It's going to be a challenge for me but I'm up for that.

"All I can do is to try as hard as I can in training every day and try to learn as much as I can from the guys around me."

Where are they now?

PAUL RIDEOUT

Energetic striker **PAUL RIDEOUT** topped and tailed his career with spells at both today's sides, registering 42 goals in 115 games for Town in the early '80s, and scoring six goals in a 46-game spell for Tranmere Rovers at the turn of the century.

ONE of the youngest ever players to represent Swindon Town, Rideout made quite an impression during a three-year stay at The County Ground which came to an end when Aston Villa paid £250,000 for his services in 1983.

After signing apprenticeship forms at Town in 1980, Rideout wasted no time in forcing his way into the first team, and made his debut at the age of just 16 years and 107 days, scoring in a 3-1 victory over Hull City at The County Ground.

His first season in a Town shirt ended with the youngster registering four goals from 12 appearances, and considerably raising the levels of expectation for his sophomore effort in the process.

And it was indeed in his next two campaigns that Rideout really made his name as a Town player, slamming home a total of 37 goals in the two seasons.

Rideout's goals were one of the few highlights of what was a dire year in Season 1981/82, as Town plunged into the Fourth Division for the first time in their history.

The 18-year-old's exploits were inevitably noticed by many a superior suitor after his first full year as a professional, but Town managed to hold on to their star asset for another season – a move that paid some considerable dividends for the club. Rideout

bagging 23 goals as Town finished in 8th position.

A move to Aston Villa for a club record fee of £250,000 then followed as then Town manager Ken Bearnish saw fit to cash in on what was his most valuable asset at the time, and move the club forward as a result.

Rideout's career went from strength to strength after leaving Wiltshire, with fruitful spells at Italian side Bari and Everton – for whom he scored the winning goal in the 1995 FA Cup Final – decorating what was a hugely successful career.

After a lengthy period abroad with Chinese outfits Qianwei Huandao and Shenzhen Jianlibao, as well as American side Kansas City Wizards, Rideout returned to the UK to play for his final club in professional football: today's visitors Tranmere Rovers.

The frontman found it tough to re-adjust to the British game initially, but after finding his feet he soon made a name for himself on the Wirral.

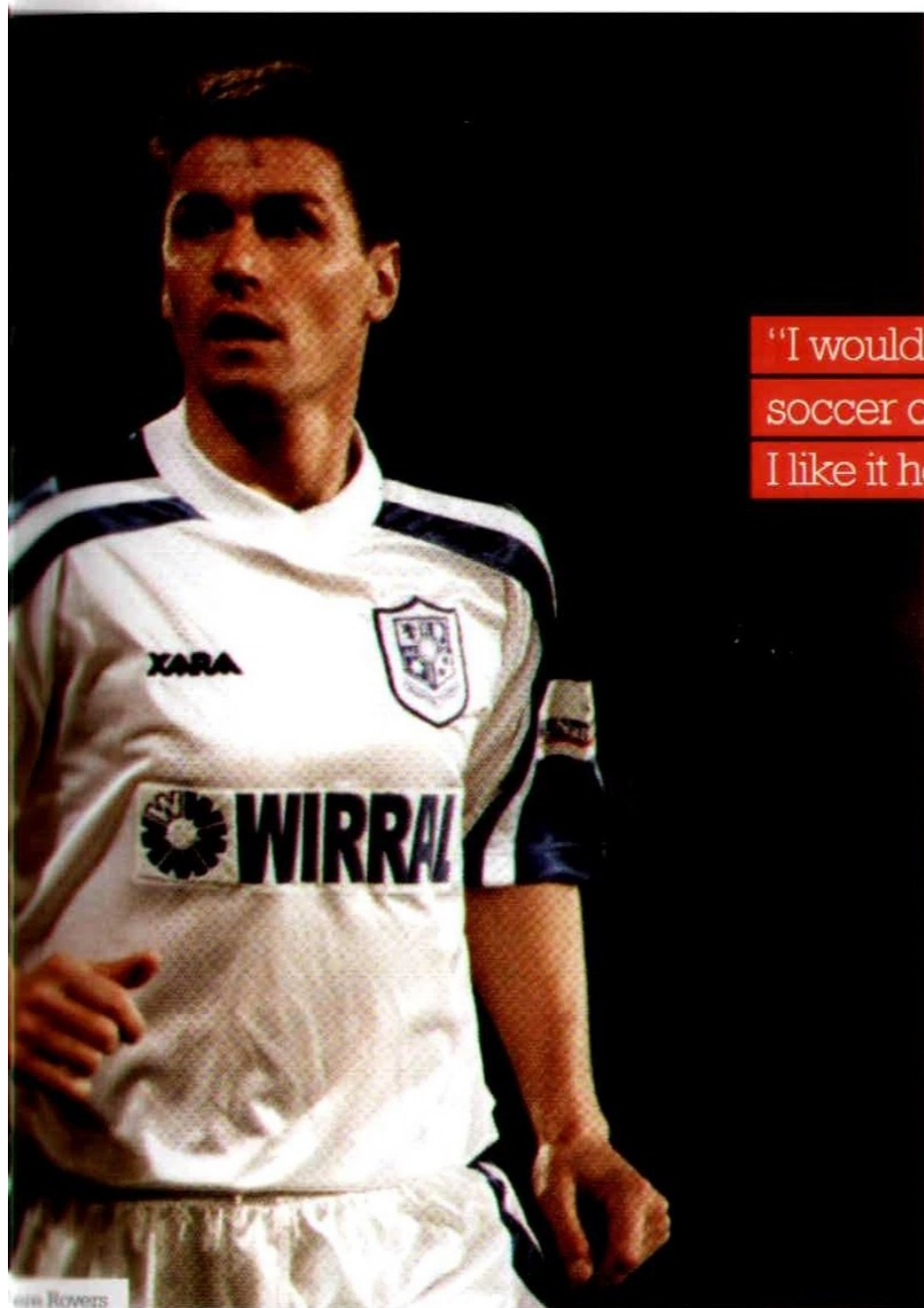
Despite having inevitably lost a yard or two of pace, Rideout still brought a lot to what was a talented Rovers outfit at the time, and is still held in high regard at Prenton Park.

Nowadays, the 46-year-old is a coach at MLS side Kansas City Wizards, where he looks after much of the youth set up, and has

enjoyed much success in the process.

"I've got four teams at the KCFC Alliance which is a coaching set-up for youngsters in Kansas," he said.

"It's work that I really enjoy and I've had quite a lot of success with it too as three of the four sides are state champions.

"A lot of people have asked if I've ever planned to go into management, but I've got no real plans to do that, and certainly not back in England."

And as for his plans for the future, Rideout is more than content to remain in the States and continue developing his coaching skills away from his home country.

"I would like to coach college soccer over here to be honest, I like it here, I like the life," he said.

"I will do a few more coaching badges later on and get back into that, but eventually I will look to do college football and that's as far as I want to go.

He added: "The system over in England seems as though every player that retires wants to go into management. It's a dogfight, and I don't really want to get involved in that.

"There are some magic coaches over there as well that are much more qualified than I am, and as I say, I don't want to get back into that life. I'm quite happy to do what I'm doing right now."

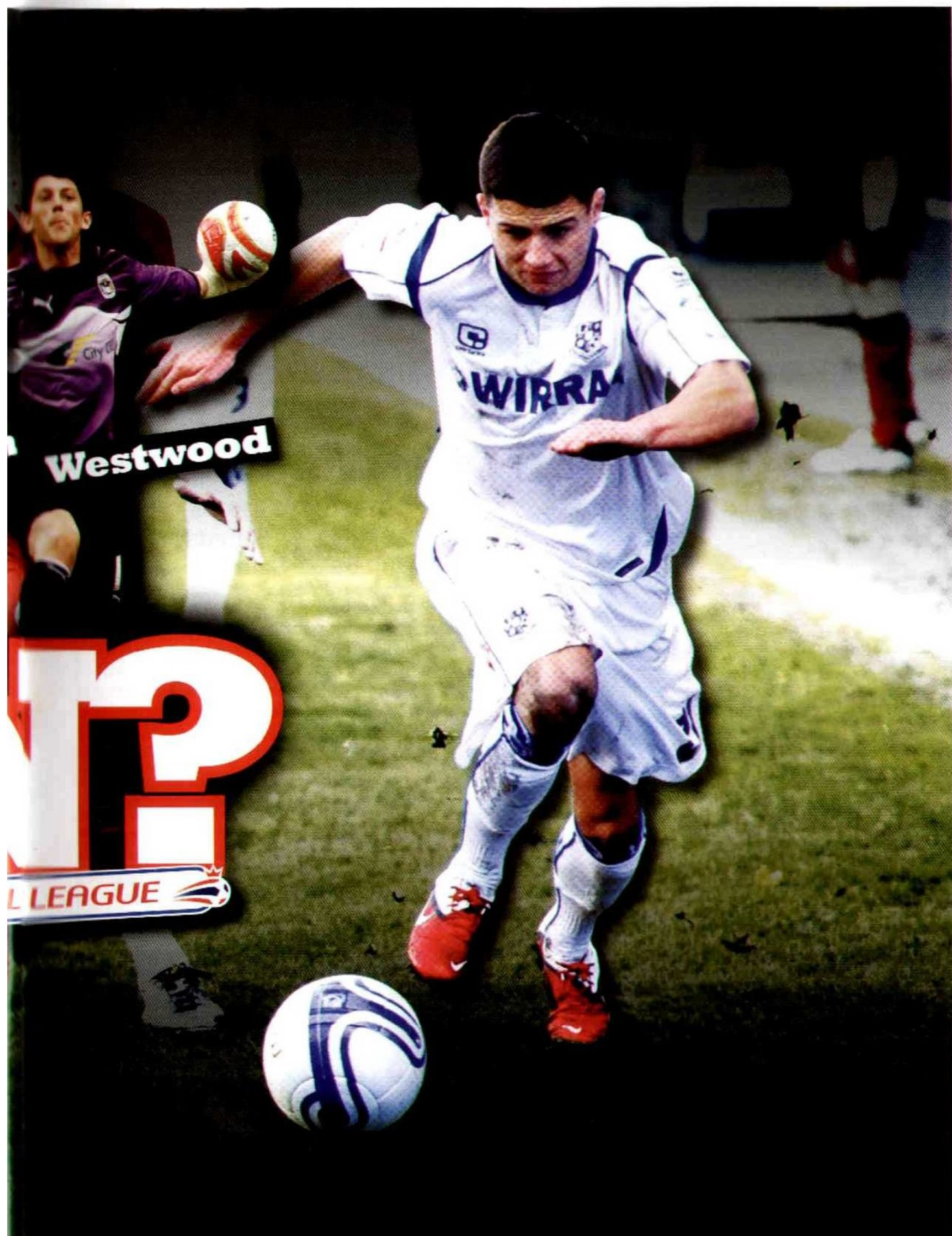

I recently posed a question on Twitter to find out who everyone thought was the young player in the Football League most likely to attract offers from a Premier League club during the January transfer window.

Lots of names featured, with Watford keeper Scott Loach (pictured), Coventry stopper Keiren Westwood, Nottingham Forest midfielder Lewis McGuigan and Swindon striker Charlie Austin all mentioned several times.

Alex Oxlade-Chamberlain, Southampton's prodigiously talented and very fast winger, also generated several replies. The 17-year-old, a regular for his club this season, is the subject of much speculation, with clubs such as Arsenal, Liverpool, Tottenham and Fulham all linked with the teenager, who has been at Saints since the age of seven.

Former Saints players Gareth Bale and Theo Walcott have already made the move to a top Premier League side but Southampton manager Nigel Adkins has already made it clear that his club do not need to sell Oxlade-Chamberlain, who has apparently told his boss that he has no interest in leaving anyway.

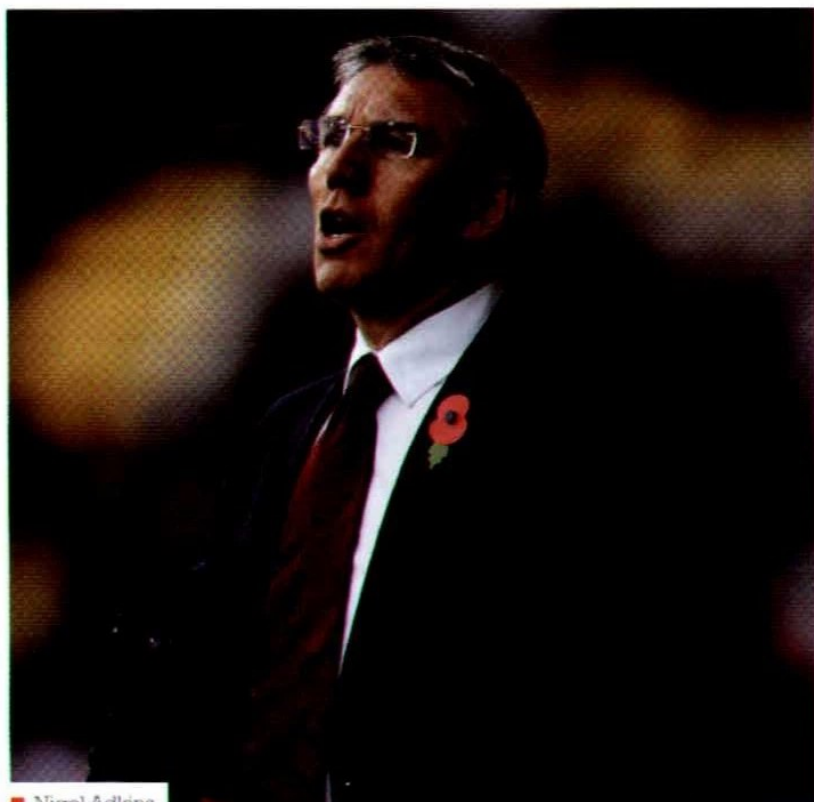
As well as Oxlade-Chamberlain, I have also highlighted Tranmere's talented young forward Dale Jennings.

If Oxlade-Chamberlain has been talked about for some time, then Jennings, who turned 18 four days before Christmas, has come out of relative obscurity this season. He has made only 19 first-team appearances for the League 1 club after his debut as a substitute against Charlton in September 2010. However, since then his performances have swiftly brought him to the attention of numerous Premier League and Championship sides.

Scouts from Everton, West Brom, Sunderland, Fulham and Watford were all spotted at Tranmere's match against Plymouth on 13th November. What they saw was a serious contender for goal of the season.

Jennings picked the ball up close to the left touchline 10 yards inside the Pilgrims half.

He accelerated beyond right-back Karl Duguid, surged into the Plymouth penalty area and eluded four more players as he cut inside before striking home from a central position 12 yards out. I have watched the goal numerous times and what really strikes me is the fear and panic created by the speed of Jennings. His first touch is

slightly heavy but his pace allows him to retrieve the situation. After that, his control is immaculate and the opposition are clearly scared to touch him for fear of conceding a penalty.

Jennings can use both feet well but normally plays on the left side of a front three. He scored twice in the 4-2 win over MK Dons in October but Parry reckons his debut goal, the winner at Bristol Rovers in late September, is his best so far. Tranmere went into the fixture bottom of the table and with an injury list that forced Tranmere boss Les

Parry into fielding players he thought "should have been doing their homework".

Jennings was arguably one of those but he settled the contest with a blistering left-footed

strike from 20 yards after creating the space to shoot with a deft turn.

Parry readily acknowledges that Jennings is aware of the increasing number of scouts that follow him from game to game.

"There are no secrets in football," said the Rovers boss. "You think there are but the truth is there aren't. Dale has got an adviser so he will be told that people are watching him, even if he only finds out after the event."

Jennings joined the Tranmere youth system after he was released by Liverpool, starting the current season as a second-year scholar. Rovers had the good sense to offer him a professional contract in October, signing him up until the summer of 2012.

The big issue for a player like Jennings is whether it would be wise for him to leave Tranmere at such an early point in his career. His predicament reminds me of something Watford manager Malky Mackay recently told me when discussing his own club's attempts to hang on to their talented young players.

"If you go to a Premier League club at the age of 16 or 17, there might be 50 players between you and a first-team jersey," said Mackay. "I ask youngsters to think whether it would be better to leave the club when they are 20 and already have several years of first-team experience."

John Bostock became the youngest person to play for Crystal Palace when he made his debut at the age of 15 years, 287 days in October 2007. He was regarded as hugely talented and was controversially signed by Tottenham the following summer. He is almost 19 now and nowhere near the first team at Spurs, for whom he has yet to make his debut. Instead, he is on loan at Hull. From a purely footballing perspective, would it not have been better for him to stay at Palace for longer?

I get the impression that Parry knows Jennings will eventually leave Prenton Park if he is to fulfil his potential. Managing that point of departure is crucial to all concerned.

If a club did make a big offer that Rovers would be foolish to refuse, then the League One side would explore the possibility of immediately signing Jennings back on loan - as Rochdale did after selling Craig Dawson to West Bromwich Albion. The defender was signed by Rochdale from Unibond League outfit Radcliffe Borough and was a key component of the side that won promotion from League Two last season. He signed for West Brom on 31 August but was immediately loaned back to Rochdale for the current campaign.

Parry would be very happy for January to pass without any mention of Jennings but I'm not sure he thinks there is much chance of that.

I just hope that Jennings does not disappear into the abyss of a huge squad, where he is unable to develop and refine his gifts.

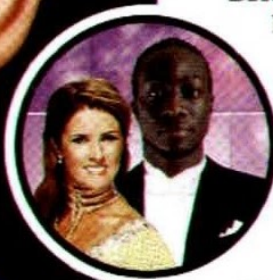

SKY SPORTS NEWS thrive on it, the newspapers embrace it, and fans get excited by it. But how significant is the January transfer window? In truth, not very.

DESPITE the hype, few major moves are done in the winter window and they are virtually all in the Premier League.

Since its inception in 2003/04 significant signings in the January window have been few and far between.

Think of all the big transfers in the last six or seven years, Rooney to Manchester United, Ronaldo to Real Madrid, Tevez to Manchester City - all of them took place in the summer.

So insignificant is the January window that in 2005 only TWO clubs spent any money: Manchester United and Chelsea. Sir Alex Ferguson spent £12.8m to take Louis Saha to Old Trafford from Fulham and Scott Parker went from Charlton to Stamford Bridge for £10m. To those you can now add Darren Bent from Sunderland to Aston

Villa for £18m rising to £24m.

The window is even less significant in the Football League. Mainly because most of the business done in the window is loan moves.

Scan the transfer page on the BBC website and all you will see is 'Loan' written after the vast majority of the moves.

But clubs can make loan moves outside the transfer window, so why all the commotion?

Admittedly Yakubu's move to Leicester is something for Foxes fans to get excited about, but again, it was a loan so could have happened before or after January.

And if some of the rumours of transfers to some clubs are to be believed then there could be more big Premier League names dropping down to the Championship. But they

will all undoubtedly be on loan.

So while Jim White may be counting down the seconds until Big Ben strikes 11pm on January 31, the truth is many managers will be tucked up in bed knowing they can continue to sign players on loan from the second week in February.

The loan window closes at 5pm on March 24, so that is the time to really know if your club will be making any moves to strengthen the squad for a title push, a race for the play-offs or to help them in their battle to avoid the drop, not January.

But even with the historical facts to back it up, fans will still get excited until the final seconds of the window, newspapers will fill their column inches with rumours and Sky Sports News, well they will do what they do best. Hype.

Host club website: 6/10

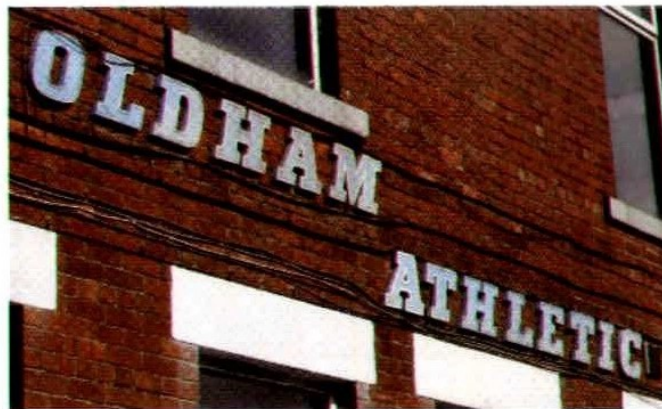
"Very similar to the Town site. Just substitute the red for blue!"

Then...

AT the end of the 1987/1988 season, a prohibition order was placed on The County Ground with certain safety measures having to be implemented.

As a result, the 1988/89 kick-off was delayed until September 11th, but work on the Stratton Bank had still not been completed by this time.

It was hoped to re-open the bank by the end of October, but reconstruction was further delayed and only a small section re-opened - on the Shrivenham Road side - as an away fans enclosure.

At the start of 89/90 following Lord Justice Taylor's Report on Hillsborough the capacity of the Bank was set at 4,368.



Now...

THE Stratton Bank capacity has now halved following the installation of seats all the way across the stand.

With home fans occupying the Town End, Arkell's Stand and Don Rogers Stand, the Stratton Bank is now allocated to away supporters. Southampton, who visited The County Ground on Saturday 11th September, brought 2,189 supporters, with those fans utilizing the North-East corner of The Arkell's Stand as well as the Stratton Bank. Sheffield Wednesday also used the Stratton Bank earlier this season whilst Leeds United regularly filled the Stratton Bank during their stay in the division.

The current capacity of the Stratton Bank is 2,037.
