





IN TOWN

Tipped by many as relegation favourites after their promotion from League 2 last year, **ROCHDALE** have surpassed expectations in style so far this season, with a number of impressive performances leaving them in 10th position before today's game.

KEITH Hill's side started the campaign as they meant to continue it, suffering just one defeat in their opening nine league games – a 2-1 reverse at home to Colchester United.

This run included a 2-0 away victory at Southampton and a 3-0 home triumph over Huddersfield Town, and served to heighten expectations of survival and more around Spotland.

However, six defeats out of the next seven matches brought the club back down to earth with a bump – not least the 3-2 home defeat to FC United of Manchester in the FA Cup first round.

Despite regaining some form with three consecutive draws in the run up to the Christmas period, the Dale went into 2011 needing inspiration from somewhere to re-ignite what was becoming a stuttering season.

But inspiration they found, going on to register consecutive victories over Tranmere Rovers (3-2), Oldham Athletic (2-1) and Dagenham & Redbridge (1-0) in the opening three games of the New Year.

This form has continued into the rest of January, with Hill's miserly defence having only conceded two goals in the last five games, in a year in which today's visitors are yet to taste defeat.

The last meeting between the sides in November ended in a pulsating 3-3 draw with Michael Rose's late free-kick looking to have sealed the points for Town at 3-2, before Dale skipper Gary Jones stole a last gasp equaliser for the hosts.





The goalkeeper signed for Rochdale last month in the January transfer window and made his debut in the 1-0 win on Saturday 22nd January at Yeovil Town. The Welshman began his career as a trainee at Crewe Alexandra before a loan spell at Bury earlier this season.



Edwards joined the club from Leeds United in 2009 as cover for Kenny Arthur but injury problems hindered his progress last term. After being awarded a six-month contract in the summer, Edwards made his debut in the 1-1 home draw against Oldham Athletic at the end of November.



The midfielder became Rochdale's first new recruit in the summer of 2010 when he moved to Spotland after turning down a contract offer at Bury. The Irishman had signed for the Shakers in August 2004 after being released by Sheffield Wednesday Barry-Murphy started his career at Preston North End in 1999, but was sent out on loan to gain Football League experience and he joined Southend United towards the end of the 2001/02 campaign before a nine-game loan stirit with Hartlepool United the following season. A permanent move to Sheffield Wednesday followed in January 2003 but after 58 league appearances for the Owls before a switch to Bury in the summer of 2004 where he made over 200 appearances.



The left-winger began his career with Wrexham as a trainee before progressing through the youth ranks onto the first team stage at The Racecourse Ground. Done made a permanent switch to Hereford United in June 2008 before a loan move to Rochdale in July 2010, a deal which was extended in January until the end of the campaign.



WILL ATKINSON 16

Atkinson is a left-sided midfielder who arrived from Hull City for a second loan spell at Spotland. The 22-year-old previously made 16 appearances for Dale in the middle of last season, with his contribution being crucial to the club's promotion from League 2. He also has experience from loan spells at Port Vale and Mansfield Town.



IASON KENNEDY 7

A former Middlesbrough trainee, Kennedy made four Premier League appearances while at The Riverside Stadium and spent loans spells with Boston United. Bury and Livingston. He joined Rochdale in the summer of 2009 on a free transfer from Darlington and has now made over 150 league starts.



Thompson is a young midfielder who was given his first team bow in the final home game of the 2005/06 season against Carlisle United. He was named League 2 Apprentice of the Year the following year at the Football League's annual awards ceremony. The frontman has now made over 100 appearances for his hometown club.



Holness is a solid central defender who originally arrived at Spotland on loan from Oldham Athletic in October 2007. He impressed the Dale management sufficiently to earn himself a two-and-a-half year contract when the transfer window opened the following January. He has been a regular this term although is yet to score.




Rochdale manager Keith Hill added Williams to his squad on transfer deadline day in a deal until the end of the season. Williams, a defender, spent time with Blackpool before a move to Huddersfield Town in 2007 where he stayed for three years. He joined Stockport County in August 2010.



The defender joined Rochdale from Darlington in the summer of 2008 having played for the Quakers in the two play-off semi-final

played for the Quakers in the two play-off semi-final matches against Dale. Also able to play on the right side of midfield, Wiseman started his career with Hull City, where he had been since the age of six.



The defender joined Rochdale in June 2010 from Grimsby Town to fill the void at left-back following Tom Kennedy's departure for Leicester City. Widdowson is a former West Ham youngster who had been with the Mariners for the whole of last season after a successful loan spell the year before.

INTERESTING FACT!

Season 2009/10 ended a 41 year wait for Rochdale fans as promotion was secured with a win over Northampton Town to secure the third automatic promotion spot and a place in League 1.





IEAN-LOUIS 14

The Frenchman signed a two-year deal at Spotland in July 2010 after turning down the chance to extend his spell with Grimsby Town following their relegation from the Football League. He scored five goals for the Mariners last season after arriving in England from FCM Brussels in December 2008.



The move was so successful that Dale made the deal permanent once the January transfer window opened, with the forward signing a contract keeping him at Spotland until the summer of 2012. He has eight goals to his name this term.



Dawson started this season as a regular in the Rochdale team, before joining West Bromwich Albion on a three-year deal on transfer deadline day at the end of August. The deal saw the player immediately loaned back to Spotland for the remainder of this season. The 20-year-old central defender was recruited from Radcliffe Borough in February 2009. In the summer months he had also been an accomplished player for Rochdale Cricket Club in the Central Lancashire League, the team his brother, Andrew, will captain in the summer of 2011. Dawson made his Rochdale debut in the 1-1 draw at Port Vale on the opening day of the 2009/10 season and in March 2010 he was voted the FourFourTwo League Two Player of the Year at the annual Football League Awards.

PREVIOUSLY Director of Youth Football, Hill is a former Rochdale centre-half who had earned a good reputation for the work he has done with the club's young players.

He started his playing career with Blackburn Rovers in the late 1980s. making over 100 first team appearances, before linking-up with Plymouth in September 1992. Graham Barrow brought him to

Spotland four years later and in five seasons as a Rochdale player he became a firm favourite on the terraces with his no-nonsense style of defending.

After being released by Steve Parkin in the summer of 2001, Hill moved south for a brief spell at Cheltenham Town, before ending his playing career with spells at Wrexham and Morecambe,

As manager, his work in guiding Rochdale from the relegation places to the top half of League 2 was rewarded with a three-year contract towards the end of April 2007. He then managed the club to the League 2 play-off final at Wembley in 2008. A year later Hill again took Rochdale to the playoffs where they lost 2-1 on aggregate to Gillingham at the semi-final stage.

However, these achievements were surpassed in 2009/10

when Rochdale secured their first promotion in 41 years, finishing in third place in League 2 behind Notts County and AFC Bournemouth. This success saw Hill and his assistant Dave Flitcroft sign new two-year contracts towards the end of the 2009/10

One To Watch

GARY JONES became Rochdale's all-time record appearance maker when he played his 346th game for the club at Mansfield in March 2008. Typically, he marked the occasion with two goals as Rochdale romped to a 4-0 win at Field Mill.

THEN, on the opening day of the 2008/09 season at Grimsby, he broke the club's league appearance record when he played his 318th Football League game for Dale, passing Graham Smith's record that had stood for 34 years.

The 33-year-old joined Rochdale on a free transfer from Barnsley in February 2004 having completed a three-month loan spell at Spotland. This move came just over two years after he left Dale for the Oakwell outfit.

Jones was originally brought to the club from Swansea in January 1998. He made sporadic appearances under Graham Barrow's management, but really started to blossom when Steve Parkin took over in the summer of 1999. When Parkin moved to Barnsley in November 2001, one of his first tasks was to return to Spotland to purchase the midfielder for a fee in the region of £200,000. Iones extended his stay at Spotland by a further two


years in the summer of 2009 and progressed to make his 400th Dale appearance in the first month of last season.



have learned a lot this season."

Rochdale struck late on to secure a share of the spoils, with Hill full of praise for goalscorer Gary Jones after the game: "Gary has scored 14 goals this season. He had the frown on early on in the season after we changed things but he is a good player for us and he creates a real tempo that can't be matched by the oppositions on too many occasions."

Michael Timlin

MICHAEL Timlin is revelling in his current run in the first team, and is determined to make sure he keeps hold of his place in the side.

The 25-year-old, who has been in excellent form in recent weeks, commented: "I'm delighted to be getting a run in the side at the moment, as competition for places is very high this year.

"I've got to make sure I work hard when I get the chance because Si (Ferry) and Prutts are waiting in the wings and they are both quality players.

"But I'm full of confidence after a run of games, and I'll always keep doing my best for the team."

And having scored against today's opponents in the reverse fixture back in November, Timlin is desperate to add to his tally before long.

He said: "I was not happy after missing my chance against Exeter the other week as I know getting goals is a part of my game that needs to improve."



FIVE days after agreeing to a move to Swindon Town, Benyon is eager to get his Robins career under way.

The 14-goal striker completed his Swindon switch on Tuesday hinchtime and was in the stands for the away trip to AFC Bournemouth later that day. Benyon admits he cannot wait to get started with his new club.

'As soon as I knew of Swindon's interest this was the place I wanted to be. I came down on Tuesday and had a look around and the stadium is impressive.

I trained with the lads for the first time on Thursday and everything has been brilliant to be honest

Eric Harrison, who was the secretary of my first senior league, because he insisted I took promotion to try and officiate at a higher level. At that time, progression hadn't crossed my mind. He has continued to offer support and guidance and is still a frequent guest to my games. Of course none of this is possible without the support of your family to allow you spend so much time refereeing matches and training!

In your opinion who is/ was the best referee?

I have a lot of time for Jack
Taylor who continues to
provide support to match
officials and is always worth
speaking to. Of the current
referees, Howard Webb is in
my opinion the best referee.
He is always able to look
calm, unflustered and gives
a very authorative presence
on the field of play.



Trust me. January, with all of its New Year Resolutions and the transfer window, is a tough month.

However, the Fat Lady did sing and it is a great pleasure to welcome Elliot Benyon to the club and I am sure he will do very well. He is a delightful young man, with a very good professional attitude. V Cars were not required as he managed to sign all of the papers in Torquay just before the deadline. Well done Louise Fletcher.

At the time of penning this diary, I am aware that there is at least one other player (striker) scheduled to be joining the club early next week, once the emergency window is opened. At the time of writing I am not at liberty to reveal name(s).















































Tuesday's 3-2 defeat was hard to take for a Town side that had performed admirably on the night, and skipper **JONATHAN DOUGLAS** is no exception. The Irishman spoke to the official STFC matchday magazine about putting things right this afternoon.

What's the mood in the camp been like after the game at AFC Bournemouth?

Obviously everyone's still frustrated with the way it went because we felt like we played ok, but there's a lot of confidence been taken from the performance.

It doesn't seem to be going our way recently, but I think we've improved in the last few weeks, and everyone's been working hard to make sure that we're ready for the game against Rochdale, which hopefully we can get something from.

Did you feel like you did enough to get something from the game?

I think so yes. The first half was a bit shaky but we were still in the game at half time, and then for large parts of the second half we were well on top and should have been 3-2 up really when Thomas' goal was disallowed.

We were playing some decent stuff and had Bournemouth on the back foot and their third goal came from nothing and knocked the stuffing out of us a bit, so we felt pretty hard done by.



But it's gone now and there is no point looking back, so we've taken a lot of positives from that game and hopefully we can build on them going into the upcoming games, starting with Rochdale.

Tuesday's defeat dropped Town into the relegation zone for the first time this season, but you must still be confident of being able to haul yourselves up the table?

Of course we are. Obviously it's never nice to be down around that area of the table, but I think that we've shown more than enough in the recent games to suggest that we've got the quality to get ourselves out of it.

The table doesn't lie and we're all well aware that we've been below par a lot this season, but there is a lot of belief that we should not be where we are in the table, and that we can get ourselves up closer to where we want to be with a series of good results.

It's going ok for me at the moment – this is one of my longest runs in the side so far this year and it's doing me good.

Obviously it's never nice to be involved in a team that isn't doing brilliantly, but as I said there's still a lot of confidence in the camp that we can improve during the rest of the season and I'm hopeful I can continue to be a part of that.

How do you expect Rochdale to approach the game today? Having played in the 3-3 draw at Spotland earlier this season you must have an idea of what to expect?

I'm sure they'll give us a very tough game because they're a decent side and they're full of confidence having not lost for a while.

The game at their place was one I think we should have won, but we let them in at the end, so hopefully we can be





THE 23-year-old former Bristol City trainee agreed a deal with the Robins late on Monday night, and despite his excitement at completing the move, he admits it was something he was expecting to come to fruition until very late in the day.

"It all came about really quickly in the end,"

"I spoke to my agent at about four o'clock on Monday night and it didn't look like it was going to happen, because he said it was all pretty doubtful

"But a couple of hours later it was all back on again, and I finally signed about half-ten which was a massive relief.

"The later it got on the transfer deadline it looked a bit more like I was going to be staying at Torquay, but it all happened towards the end of the day and I'm delighted it did."

And though there was interest in the 14-goal hitman from other League 1 clubs, Benyon insists there was only ever one place he was going to find himself on the morning of February 1st.

He said: "There were bits and bobs around but Swindon was always the club I wanted to

"The gaffer said to me this morning that if we can string a few wins together then


we'll be right up around the play-offs again, and that sort of attitude suits me down to the ground.

"Swindon's a massive club and it's going places and as soon as I heard they were interested there was only place I wanted to come."

Before completing his move to The County Ground, Benyon had been at Torquay for nearly four years, and after a slow start built quite a reputation for himself, bagging 40 goals for the Gulls as they returned to the Football League.

But despite having enjoyed his time on the south coast, the striker did not leave Plainmoor with a particularly heavy heart, with his career progression top on his list of priorities when considering his options.

"It wasn't difficult to leave because once a big club like Swindon came in and

> made an offer for me I was over the moon and I couldn't wait to get here," he said.

Having been on the books at Bristol City during Danny Wilson's reign at Ashton Gate, Benyon is not unfamiliar with the way his new manager works, and he admits Wilson's presence at The County Ground was a contributing factor to his decision to move to Wiltshire.

"I was with the gaffer back at Bristol City when I was doing my apprenticeship and I liked the way he managed the team," he said.

"I remember him being a good, strong manager and I know that he likes his teams to pass the ball which I'm looking forward to getting involved in.

"I know Swindon are a passing team from when I played here in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy earlier on this year, and they played

some great stuff, so hopefully I can fit into that."

Benyon has a tough act to follow in the replacing the recently departed Charlie Austin, and though comparisons will inevitably be drawn between the two strikers, Town's new hitman is confident he can be successful as a Robin in his own right.

"There is always pressure on new players and that will be no different with me here," he said.

"Charlie Austin was a fantastic player here but I'm just coming here to do my best and do my own thing.

"I'm not saying by any means that I'm going to be the next Charlie Austin, but I definitely want to be Swindon Town's next big goal scorer, and if I can follow in his footsteps then that would be superb."

When Benyon makes his debut for Town, it will be at the highest level of professional football he has ever competed, but this is not something that worries the frontman, for whom self-belief is not an issue.

'It's a big step up for me there's no doubt about that, but it's one that I'm just going to have to take in my stride," he said.

"I'm confident I can do it and I'm looking forward to getting out there and scoring some goals. I've scored a few goals in League 2, and I'm hopeful I can come here and do the same thing

"Hopefully I'll be able to show the fans that I'm a hard-working striker, and I never give anything up.

"I don't want to get over-confident but I'm sure with games and experience in League 1 I can start notching some goals."

And as far as the rest of the season is concerned, 23-year-old Benyon is determined to fire Town to League 1 safety and beyond reaching his own personal goal targets in the process.

"I always set myself goal targets at the start of the season, so hopefully I'll be able to keep to those and help the team get up the table," he said.

"There's still a long way to go in the season, and the league is very tight so there's no reason why we can't string a few results



together and get ourselves up the league and into a better position.

But for now I'm just looking to get settled in the team, settled in the area and move forward." SWINDON





KEPING H CIEAN

Tuesday's defeat at AFC Bournemouth does not sit comfortably with on-loan defender **ANDY FRAMPTON.** After consecutive clean sheets, the Robins conceded three in midweek during a controversial encounter at Dean Court.

TOWN'S luck was seemingly out from the off with Thomas Dossevi being denied by 'keeper Shwan Jalal before a long-range effort from Liam Feeney was deflected in to give the home side the lead. Paul Caddis brought Swindon level with a superb individual effort before Danny Ings and Danny Hollands struck either side of Matt Ritchie's fifth goal of the season to seal the win for Lee Bradbury's men.

Frampton, playing his eighth game for Swindon, was honest enough to give a frank assessment of the midweek defeat by the Cherries, but insists his teammates have what it takes to 'turn the corner'.

"In the first half we weren't at the races defensively but we came to the fore in the second half and produced a very good performance," he said, looking back on the game. "I thought we were very unlucky to come away from the game with nothing to show for our efforts.

"The goals we scored were very well taken, especially the one from 'Caddi' which was a fantastic bit of individual play. At that stage you think we had weathered the storm and could push on to get something from the game.

He added: "A bit of a lapse of concentration let them in again and that proved to be the winner."

Controversy surrounded several key moments in the game, which saw Thomas Dossevi's second half header ruled out as well as an alleged foul on 'keeper Phil Smith for what proved to be the final and crucial goal of the evening.

Lady luck certainly did not fall Swindon's way on Tuesday evening but the Wimbledon-born defender insists the Robins have to put aside the midweek disappointment with a victory over League I newcomers Rochdale now the priority.


"A few key decisions didn't go our way at Bournemouth but these things happen in football," he said. "I think luck evens itself out over the course of the season but we certainly didn't get much luck on Tuesday night.

"We have to be strong-minded, get ourselves together and make sure we put in a performance against Rochdale that will hopefully result in three points."

Rochdale arrive at The County Ground well-placed in the division after an impressive start to League 1 life and have won five from 14 games on the road so far this term.

"Three points is the priority," said Frampton, whose experience has been valuable to the Swindon squad since his arrival on loan from Millwall. "The performances in the last two home games against Tranmere Rovers





and Exeter City were defensively sound and hopefully with Elliot (Benyon) now on board

He added: "As a team we know how to play and we have been playing very well. It's just a matter of time before we turn our corner



Where are they now?

TOM HEATON

Football League experience is vital to any young goalkeeper and **TOM HEATON** made his full league debut for Town before a loan spell with today's visitors Rochdale four years later.

HEATON arrived at The County Ground on loan from Premier League giants Manchester United back in August 2005 as part of a double deal that also saw midfielder/forward Colin Heath arrive in Wiltshire. Whilst fellow Old Trafford graduate Heath was thrown straight into the line-up for the league clash at Blackpool, Heaton made his Town debut three days later in a Carling Cup encounter against Wycombe Wanderers.

The stopper made his league debut the following Saturday in the 4-2 home win against Yeovil Town, which proved to be a successful day for the loan duo with Heath on the scoresheet and Heaton saving a penalty. In total the stopper made 19 appearances for the Robins, a spell which he looks back on with fond memories.

"Swindon was an incredible experience for me," he recalls. "I went down there as a 19-year old in search of first team football and Andy King gave me the opportunity to play.

"Getting the first foot on the ladder is so important and I thoroughly enjoyed every second of my time down at The County Ground. I still class myself as a young goalkeeper at 24-years old, but it makes me realise how young I was when I was playing in the first team at Swindon.

"A goalkeeper is one of those positions that you don't really peak until perhaps your late twenties, but I had plenty of highs and a few lows during my loan spell there."

Heaton and Heath were, unsurprisingly, roommates during their time at The County Ground and the pair are still in contact despite now working in different industries. "I still speak to 'Heathy' now and then. He isn't in the game anymore but I know for a fact that he enjoyed his time at Swindon, as did Neale McDermott who I still speak to quite a lot.

"Swindon's position in the league was quite difficult when we were there, but as young players it was valuable experience. It was great as a young lad to go to a club and be so well looked after."

Rochdale also played an important part in Heaton's development, with the 'keeper playing 12 games during an extended temporary stay at Spotland last season.

"I had been on loan at QPR for a couple of months and played a few games there, and was back with United when the goalkeeping coach there told me about the opportunity of joining Rochdale - which in the end proved to be one of the best decisions I have ever made," said Heaton.


"Rochdale is a fantastic football club and Keith Hill and David Flitcroft run it superbly well; the club is such a professional outfit. During my time there we were top of the league and passing for fun. It doesn't surprise me at all to see the success they have had."

Last summer Heaton made the tough decision to leave life with the Red Devils behind to begin the next chapter in his Football League career. After five loan spells away from Old Trafford, with spells at Swindon, Cardiff City, QPR, Rochdale and Wycombe Wanderers, it was time to move on.

"I signed for United as an 11-year old and left as a 24-year old," Heaton said, looking back on his time with the Red Devils. "Overall I had a

tremendous experience with the club and met a lot of great people and had some fantastic times, but I felt like I needed to set some foundations for the future and play some regular football.

"It was a big decision to leave and I had a couple of discussions with the manager and whilst there would have been a contract there for me with United, he completely understood and respected my decision to move on. Heft Old Trafford on good terms."

There were a number of potential suitors but Heaton opted to return to South Wales for a permanent switch to Cardiff City, the club where he spent a successful season-long loan in 2008/09.


"I knew a lot about Cardiff having been there on loan and the manager was great with me then.

"This season has gone well for me so far and I have been regularly involved and am getting lots of games under my belt."

Next on the Cardiff City fixture list is one of the Bluebirds' games of the season, with Heaton expected to continue in between the sticks for Sunday's derby clash against bitter rivals Swansea City.

"I am really looking forward to that one," he said. 'We have played Swansea at home this season and lost out so it's about time we put one over them.

'I have been to Swansea before as a Cardiff player but the manager decided to rest me and I had to watch the game from the bench. It was a hotly-contested game and I am looking forward to what should be a really good atmosphere on Sunday."





How did you get started in football?

I started playing when I was six years old and spent a few years with a junior club before joining Pribram, which is quite a small club in the Czech Republic. The crowds were no more than a few thousand even for one of the top games. The level of support for club football isn't too big in Czech.

What were your first reactions when you were told of Celtic's interest?

When my agent called me and said I was going to Celtic, it took a while to get my head around it; I couldn't quite believe it. Things moved on and suddenly I was leaving my home country and making my way to Scotland.

Moving to Celtic must have been a huge step to take for you as a young player?

It was hard to leave, especially as I didn't speak a word of English when I first arrived. Celtic arranged for me to stay in a hotel for the first few months and then I moved in with a Scottish family - who really looked after me. It was great to get out of the hotel and I lived with the same family for two years.

How long did it take to pick up English?

I had lessons when I was staying with the family and I gradually improved day by day. I am now a lot more confident with speaking the language and it has helped me a lot with my move to Swindon because it has been easier to settle in here. There are still many words I need to learn but my vocabulary will improve.

What do you remember of your first involvement with the Celtic first team?

I started out training with the squad and then made a few appearances for the reserves before being on the first team bench for the first time. It was an amazing experience and I remember being very nervous. Looking around the stadium with 50,000 people watching the game was quite incredible.

How did you find training with the likes of Aiden McGeady and Georgios Samaras?

The standard was very good and quite a step up from what I was used to with Pribram. Everyone was very friendly at Celtic, which is quite different from how things are back in Czech. The players were very good to be around and I learnt a lot from training regularly with them.

The Australia tour in 2009 didn't go too well for you. How did the injury happen?

It was a very long way to go for a tour and the injury made it a bad experience for me. I came off the bench after an hour but was injured in a bad tackle. It was against Brisbane Roar and I was challenging for the ball when I got a kick on the inside of the knee and injured my cruciate.

I flew back to Scotland with the rest of the squad but I had to wait a month for the operation and then I started my rehabilitation, which included plenty of time in the gym and strength work.

After returning to full fitness last summer, you joined Dundee. How was that for you?

Having completed pre-season I was fit again and ready to play, but it was difficult to break into the first team and I wanted to play a few games. The opportunity came up to join Dundee on loan and I took it. The first game I played in for Dundee was against Raith and that went well. I played a whole game but had to come off at half time in the second game with a muscle injury, before returning to Celtic.

Whilst you were with Celtic you also played international football with six appearances for the Czech U19s. Can you tell us more about that?

Representing my country was a fantastic feeling and I scored a goal against Spain which was probably the best moment. Playing big games in big stadiums was an amazing experience.

The move to Swindon is a big opportunity for you isn't it?

I am very determined to do well at Swindon. This is a very good chance for me because League 1 is a very good standard of football and I really want to get into the side and play as many games as I can.

How have you found the rest of the Town squad?

They have been really helpful. Simon (Ferry) and 'Caddi' were my teammates at Celtic and they also went to Australia on the pre-season tour that we spoke about earlier. It has been good knowing them because they have helped me get used to things. The rest of the players have been great too.

You were introduced to the County Ground crowd before the Exeter City game last weekend, how was that experience?


I really enjoyed it, although I was very nervous! The supporters were very good to me – which was a very nice moment for me. I also threw my shirt into the crowd. It was difficult to choose who to give it to but there was a small guy waving a lot at me so I gave it to him.

That's right. I want to make my debut for Swindon very soon and I hope that it's not too long before I can be playing for Swindon.




What is your routine on the morning of a match?

A month of frenzied wheeling and dealing came to an end on Monday night, leaving a record £200m changing hands after a breathless last day of dealing.

NATURALLY the Fernando Torres £50m move from Liverpool to Chelsea and Andy Carroll's £35m switch from Newcastle to Liverpool caught the headlines, but there were some great deals struck by Football League clubs, under the radar of these colossal deals. These were some of the best of them:

Sol Bamba - Hibernian to Leicester, £250,000

Yakubu, Darius Vassell, Curtis Davies - plenty of famous names have pitched up at Leicester since Sven Goran Eriksson arrived as manager. Yet it is the unheralded Bamba - a £250,000 steal from SPL side Hibs - who could turn out to be the best value. On his debut, the 26-year-old's aerial ability terrified Manchester City's pricey back four, and last weekend's brace against Millwall confirmed Bamba's threat. Once the Ivorian

acclimatises to English football and gets to grips with duties at the back, expect him to emerge as one of the best defenders in the division

Wayne Routledge -Newcastle to OPR, season-long loan

With failed stints at six Premier League clubs, it is now apparent that Routledge can't quite cut it in the top flight. In the Championship,

however, the jet-heeled wide man reigns supreme. At Cardif in 2009, he got two goals and five assists in nine games. A move to QPR yielded a further seven goals and 13 assists in 44 matches. And when he was signed by Newcastle this time last year, his incisive running brought three goals and seven assists that played a massive part in the Magpies' promotion. QPR will be hoping for a similar impact.

Andy O'Brien - Bolton to Leeds, free

O'Brien is an old-fashioned warhorse who seems to have been around for donkeys, but astonishingly, he's only 31. If anything, the years have improved him gone are the errors and clumsiness that married his time at Newcastle, replaced by the calmness and assurance that comes with ten years' experience in the top flight. That know-how has been vital to Leeds, whose inexperienced back four krbs were shipping goals left, right and centre before Christmas. O'Brien's arrival first on loan and then permanently - has coincided with a run of one league defeat in 15 games.

> **Bradley Wright-Phillips** - Plymouth to Charlton, £250,000

> > The great thing about buying a player from the same division is that he needs no time to acclimatise. If you can also sign him when he's bang

on form, so much the better. On that basis. Charlton have played a blinder in snatching Wright-Phillips from cashstrapped Plymouth. The 25-year-old has scored 13 goals this season, while his pace and skill can take defenders out of the game. If he keeps banging them in and that dodgy knee proves to be a mirage, Reading will be kicking themselves. The Addicks have bought Championship class at a League 1 price.

Calvin Zola - Crewe to Burton, season-long loan

This time last year, Zola had 16 goals from 27 games and was supposedly the subject of a six-figure bid from the Championship. It never materialised and the rapid return to form of Clayton Donaldson means Crewe's 'big man' role is filled, leaving no place for the Heskey-esque Zola. Yet if Burton boss Paul Peschisolido can restore the 26-yearold's confidence and get him running at defences again, there is no limit to the damage he can do.

Gary Madine - Carlisle to Sheffield Wednesday, £500,000 (rising to £800,000)

Carlisle fans have their doubts about Madine, questioning his pace. his aggression and his leap. But you can't knock a tally of 13 goals before Christmas, especially when you consider he's only 20 and playing his first full season in League One. A 6ft 5ins monster, he already has the stature and has shown he knows where the net is: now he must prove his 13 goals were no flash in the pan. Wednesday have bought potential rather than proven class and that is always a risk - but the big striker has plenty of time to improve.



In each edition of the matchday magazine we will be reviewing 'the away experience' through the eyes of a Swindon fan. What were the pies like? How helpful were the stewards? Town fan **SALLY ANNE** & **BRADLEY CARTER** made the trip to Dean Court.

Atmosphere: 6/10

"There was a good following from Swindon with not many empty seats. Swindon fans were making a lot of noise and getting behind the team. The main noise from Bournemouth came from the drummer who was right next to the away fans! They were fairly quiet vocally during the game - even when they were winning."

Club Shop: 9/10

"Very roomy and easy to walk around and also had a general sportswear area off the main shop. They had the usual stock and some unusual items like an Aleksandr Orlov t-shirt and Bournemouth player stickerbook. Unfortunately there were no pin badges."

Directions: 6/10

"The ground was signposted as soon as we got off the motorway and at junctions/roundabouts. The only problem is the small brown football signs are hard to see in the dark until you're right on top of them. The coaches park right behind the away stand and there were no stewards to direct us once we got into the main car park and no lighting when you wanted to walk back round to the club shop."

Host Club Website:

"The Bournemouth site was the same layout as ours so it is easy to navigate as you know where to find everything you want."

Kiosks: 4/10

"The food was good with the usual variety of choices and the prices were what you would normally expect to pay at a football ground and service was fairly quick. They had plenty of staff serving too. The mark would have been higher but they sold us a bottle of coke that was out of date!"



Stadium: 6/10

"A decent ground with three main stands and one temporary stand. The floodlights didn't go on until one hour before kick-off just before the turnstiles opened. I couldn't hear the PA system when pitch side announcer was talking either."

Pies: 7/10

"We had a sausage

roll and a cheeseburger which were of a good standard. No Meat and Potato pies which was disappointing."

Pitch: 2/10

"The pitch was in a bad condition that had the ball bobbling all over the place."

Programme: 6/10

"It was a standard League 1 programme with a threepage feature on Swindon."

Steward Friendliness: 6/10

"There was a lack of stewards at the away end when we arrived, so we didn't

know if we had to get tickets first or if it was pay on the turnstile. The stewards we spoke to outside the ground and in the concourse were fairly friendly. We were sat right at the end of the Swindon fans and the stewards were sat down between us and the Bournemouth fans, however, as soon as a goal was scored they were up on their feet and took a while to sit back down once

play had restarted."


