



## IN TOWN

## TODASY

**NOTTS COUNTY** picked up what could prove to be a huge win on Tuesday against Tranmere Rovers, with Craig Westcarr's goal earning them a 1-0 win at Prenton Park ahead of today's relegation clash.

THE win put to an end a miserable run of nine consecutive defeats for the Magpies, who had been in freefall since their last victory – a 1-0 triumph over Sheffield Wednesday at Hillsborough on March 12th.

It has been a torrid
2011 for County, who had
harboured ambitions of a
play-off place before the
onset of the New Year, a year
which has seen them pick
up just six wins in 23 games,
and plunged them towards
the League 1 relegation zone
in the process.

After a shaky start to

his Meadow Lane tenure, former boss Paul Ince looked to have turned the club's fortunes around with a run of six games unbeaten across November and December, but the onset of the aforementioned run of defeats made his task considerably more difficult.

The former Blackburn Rovers boss' fate was sealed with the 2-0 home reverse to Oldham Athletic on April 2nd, with Magpies hierarchy deciding to show him the door before the subsequent home clash with Rochdale.

New boss Martin Allen's

opening two games didn't bring about a change in fortune with defeats to Yeovil Town (2-1) and AFC Bournemouth (2-0), but Tuesday's win over Tranmere will have galvanised his side no end as they prepare to visit The County Ground.

The last meeting between the sides came back in November, with Town looking to have held on for a 0-0 draw at Meadow Lane before substitute Lee Hughes snatched an 87th minute winner for the Magpies.


Burch signed for the club on a free transfer in the summer of 2010 after his contract with Lincoln City expired. A former England Under-20 international and a Tottenham Hotspur trainee, the 27-year old has also spent loan spells with Woking, Stevenage Borough, West Ham United and Barnet.




Thompson joined on a permanent contract from Oldham Athletic in January 2009 on the back of an impressive loan spell He arrived with plenty of games under his belt, including 129 at Nottingham Forest and three caps for the Republic of Ireland. A versatile member of the squad, he has performed consistently at centreback, right-back, as well as in the centre of midfield. His whole-hearted performances led to him being handed the captain's armband, a role that he continued to carry out throughout the 2009/10 League 2 Championship season. The 29-year old is closing in on 100 league appearances for the Magpies and has 28 appearances for the club to his name this season.



Spicer signed a two-year contract with the squad in the summer of 2010. The former Arsenal trainee had previously spent five years playing in the Championship with Burnley and then, more recently, Doncaster Rovers. An adaptable player, he can comfortably slot into any midfield berth.




Bishop joined the club from Barnet on a two-year contract in July 2009 and soon became a popular figure with the Meadow Lane supporters. His industrious performances in the centre of midfield throughout 2009/10 helped the team's midfield become one of the most dominant in League 2.



Burgess was brought to the club on a two-year deal in July 2010 from Blackpool. The imposing forward played a big part in the Tangerines' monumental


Tangerines' monumental promotion to the Premier League, ending up with six goals in 22 starts. He also played a part in all three play-off matches that secured their top-flight status.



The striker was added to the ranks until the end of the 2010/11 campaign in March, 2011. The Gambian international has performed for a number of teams throughout Europe during his career, which started back in 1998 with Swedish outfit Falu BS. Since then, he has played in Greece, Denmark, Bulgana and Norway.



The defender joined
Notts County in November
2010 on loan from Liverpool
and returned for a second
loan stint in January 2011.
The right-back impressed
at The County Ground for
Swindon during a loan
spell last term and was a
member of the Wembley
side. He has now made 25
County appearances.



Chilvers returned to the club in the summer of 2010 on a two-year deal after spending a brief but impressive loan spell at Meadow Lane during 2001/02 as a promising Arsenal youngster. Over the years that passed he gained plenty of experience and returned to the club with a glowing reputation as a commanding central defender.



Edwards is Notts County's longest serving player, having arrived in the summer of 2004 on a free transfer. Since then he has been a key member of the squad with his no-nonsense showings at the heart of the backline. He signed a new two-year deal in the summer of 2010 and has been a regular again this season.



Harley was once a teammate of former Town player Sam Parkin at Chelsea. After leaving Stamford Bridge he enjoyed extended spells with Fulham, Sheffield United. Burnley and Watford before arriving at Meadow Lane last summer. He has been a regular on the left for the Magpies this term.




The striker was added to the ranks as part of a fresh influx of players during the summer of 2009. Signed for an undisclosed fee from Preston North End, he agreed a three-year deal. He has also represented Carlisle United, where he managed to score 51 times in 137 appearances for the Cumbrians.



Wholey made his professional debut seven days ago in the home defeat by AFC Bournemouth, replacing Mike Edwards in the 74th minute. Wholey is a left-sided player who has progressed through the youth ranks at Meadow Lane to reach the first team squad.



Westcarr was recruited on a free transfer from non-league Kettering Town in July 2009. He was handed an initial one-year deal to prove himself upon his return to the Football League, having spent four years in the Conference. The former Nottingham Forest man produced plenty of dazzling performances on the wings and in the forward line. Blessed with blistering acceleration, he found himself near the top of the goalscoring and assist charts in 2009/10. His performances earned him a two-year extension to his contract at Meadow Lane. The 26-year old has been a regular contributor so far this term and has 13 goals in 45 appearances to his name, including the winner against Tranmere Rovers on Tuesday evening.



**MARTIN ALLEN** was appointed as first team manager in April 2011, following the departure of Paul Ince.

**ALLEN** had been in charge of Barnet on a non-contract basis and had turned around their fortunes during his three games in charge with two wins and one draw.

'Mad Dog', as he his known from his playing days, has a reputation for rejuvenating sides that have been struggling, having done so at both Brentford and MK Dons during an impressive managerial career.

The former West Ham and OPR midfielder's first

managerial role came at Barnet, where he built a side that would go on to reach the play-offs after his departure to Brentford towards the end of the 2003/04 season.

At Brentford he built a side that twice reached the League 1 play-offs and twice reached the FA Cup fifth round during an impressive two-year stay at Griffin Park.

A season with MK Dons saw Allen take a side that had recently been relegated to League 2 and lead them to the play-offs in his first season, building the base of a side that would go on to enjoy success in the following years.

Allen's first game with the Meadow Lane club was a 2-1 defeat at relegation rivals Yeovil Town, before overseeing his first win on Tuesday night at Tranmere Rovers.

After today's League 1 clash, there are just three games of the 2010/11 campaign remaining.





## One To Watch

**LEE HUGHES** began his career with non-league side Kidderminster Harriers and scored 35 goals during the 1996/97 season although the club failed to win promotion to the Football League.

HE also won a call-up to the England 'C' side before being sold to West Bromwich Albion in 1997 with a £200,000 fee enough to secure his services.

A lifelong fan of the Baggies, Hughes made his debut for the club as a substitute on the opening day of the 1997/98 campaign. He soon became a success with the Hawthorns club, scoring 31 goals in the 1998/99 season – more than any other player in the Football League or the FA Premier League.

After missing out on promotion to the top-flight, West Brom sold Hughes to Coventry City for a club record transfer fee of £5 million in the summer of 2001. His one-season stay

with the Sky Blues was a turbulent one as he finished the campaign with 15 goals from 38 starts as well as two red cards. Coventry missed out on promotion whilst rivals West Brom were promoted in second place.


With the Baggies finally in the top-flight, Hughes returned to the Hawthorns for a £2.5 million fee although he failed to score for them during the 2002/03 season. He scored 11 goals in 35 league starts during his second spell with the club.


After much-publicised off-the-field issues, Hughes returned to football in 2007 with League 1 side Oldham Athletic and put pen to paper on a two-year deal. He made his debut for the Latics in

September 2007 and scored 25 goals in 51 league starts during his stay at Boundary Park

He joined Notts County in the summer of 2009 on a two-year deal and scored a hat-trick on his debut against Bradford City in a 5-0 win. He scored 33 goals during his first season with the Meadow Lane side, becoming the first player to score 30 league goals in a season since Tommy Lawton in the 1949/50 season.

In July 2010, he agreed to extend his contract by a further year, much to the delight of the County faithful. With 13 goals to his name this season, he remains a potent goal threat for League 1 opposition.







THE Magpies boss enjoyed his first win as Notts County manager on Tuesday evening, before praising the efforts of his squad.

The win also ended a run of nine consecutive defeats and lifted them two points clear of the relegation zone.

"I'm delighted with all the players - not just the ones that played, we had three of them in the stands with the supporters," he told Magpie Player.

"They went and did their bit with the supporters, the subs were all fantastic and everyone that went on the pitch was absolutely fantastic."

"When you see the spirit like that of every team member putting their bodies on the line and fighting for the shirt, the supporters giving the players everything, the fulfilment for me personally, what that actually does, I can't put into words."




"I know Martin Allen from my time at MK Dons. I had played against them for Sheffield Wednesday and he then brought me to MK that summer as one of his first signings."



Woolmer has followed the Southern League route to the National List and was an assistant for ten seasons. His major appointments include the Football League Trophy Final, League Cup Final and the Community Shield.

## How did you get introduced into refereeing?

I was introduced to refereeing through a local park referee who lived around the corner from me.

### What has been the highlight of your career so far?

Being an assistant referee on the Premier League for three seasons and being a National List Referee for the past four seasons.

## What is the best game you have officiated and why?

Oxford United against Leyton Orient which was the last game of the 2005/06 season. It was a must-win game for both teams. Oxford winning would have meant Football League survival and for Leyton Orient a win guaranteed them promotion to League 1.

It was a fantastic actionpacked game to referee and I was pleased that the feedback that I received from the assessor was very positive.

### What are your aims as a National List referee?

To referee at the highest level possible for as long as possible.

### What skills do you think you need to become a referee?

Fitness is of the utmost importance and you need to have the discipline to train three to four times a week. You need to be impartial to each team whilst remaining focused on the game in hand.

## biggest influence in your career and why?

Keren Barratt has been a tremendous influence on my career so far. He is approachable and always give praise where necessary and criticism when needed. In short he tells you how it is!

### In your opinion who is/ was the best referee?

Paul Durkin and Alan Wiley who I was fortunate to work with during my time on the Premier League. I like their management style and professional approach to each game they officiate.

I think that the achievements of Howard Webb in the last couple of seasons have been a great example to any referee in this country. It is particularly pleasing that he is not only at the top of his game but he is also a very grounded person.

## The Law

## LAW 1 - THE FIELD OF PLAY

becomes displaced or broken, play is stopped until if has been repaired or replaced in position. If it is not possible to repair the crossbar, the match must be abandoned.

The use of a rope to replace the crossbar is not permitted. If the crossbar can be repaired, the match is restarted with a dropped ball from the position of the ball when play was stopped, unless play was stopped inside the goal area, in which case the referee drops the ball on the goal area line parallel to the goal line at the point nearest to where the ball was located when play was stopped.



































## JONATHAN DOUGLAS:







Town skipper **JONATHAN DOUGLAS** was as disappointed as anyone in The County Ground to have seen his side go down to a 1-0 defeat to MK Dons last weekend, but he is determined to help bring about a return to form against relegation rivals Notts County.

Considering how positive the mood was after the win at Brentford, how disappointing was it to follow it up with a defeat against MK Dons last weekend?

It was massively disappointing because as you say, everyone was buzzing at the performance and the win at Brentford, and it would have been brilliant to follow that up with another against MK Dons, but unfortunately it wasn't to be.

We obviously weren't at our best, but I think we created enough to get a point, with Calvin (Andrew) hitting the bar and a few other shots we had.

But there's no denying we didn't play well enough, and that's something that has got to change against Notts County, because it is a huge game and one that we need a win from.

Other results went almost exactly as you would have wanted them to last weekend. Do you feel like you missed an opportunity to make up some vital ground on your rivals with the defeat against MK Dons?

Yes we did, and the table would look a lot more



promising had we picked up even a point last week, considering the way the results went in our favour.

But there's no use dwelling on that now because nothing has really changed in the table, and we have to look forward to the Notts County game.

And on the positive side, we didn't lose any ground on the teams around us, we just didn't gain it so that's what we have to take from last weekend, and now we move on to the last few games of the season, confident of getting ourselves out of this.

## What has the mood been like in the changing room and on the training pitch this week?

The boys were obviously a little subdued coming in Monday morning because of the defeat on Saturday, but once everyone got themselves going it was back to normal again with everyone just excited for the game at the weekend.

Everyone's looked sharp in training, and we had a decent session out on the pitch earlier in the week which has served us well.

The manager's put a few things in place and everyone's grasped them all well, so it's just a matter of putting them in to practise during the game, which I'm confident we can do.

### What sort of a test are you expecting from Notts County?

It'll be a tough game because they're as desperate for points as we are, and obviously with a new manager having come in recently their players will be eager to impress him.

25-YEAR-OLD Timlin played a predominantly bit-part role as Town made their way to the play-off final last season, but has been a far more crucial cog in the Robins' wheel this term.

In spite of not playing as many games as in his first season at The County Ground, the midfielder believes it has been more a case of 'quality not quantity' this term.

"I played a lot more in my first season here under (Maurice) Malpas, and that was the year Danny Wilson came in," he said.

"I made about 46 starts and that's the most I've played in an entire season, so as far as sheer numbers of games are concerned that was my best season.

"But I'd like to think this has been my best season in terms of consistency and number of good performances.

"I've made about 21, 22 starts I think and considering the type of players we've got here - Jonathan Douglas, David Prutton, Simon Ferry, J-P McGovern and Matt Ritchie - it's pleasing for me to have got the amount games I have, and to have played well."

But Timlin's satisfaction with his own campaign's return is inevitably tempered by disappointment at the way the season has panned out for the club as a whole

'As I said I think it's been my most consistent season for Swindon which is pleasing, but I'm not trying to say it's been fantastic because of course it hasn't." he admitted.

"But on the whole. I still don't think it's a season that I can look at as a 'good' one for me because of the position that we're in."

It could have been so different for Timlin, who's days at the club appeared to be numbered earlier this season after being loaned out to Southend United in September to work under former Town boss Paul Sturrock, and he admits he was unsure what the future held during his time at Roots Hall.

"At the time I'd only started two games for Swindon; we'd won 4-0 away at Southampton and then drawn 0-0 up at Carlisle," he recalled of the period leading up to his move to Essex.

"I felt I played well in those games, but then I

was taken out for a couple of games after that and was approached about going on loan to Southend.

"It was a good opportunity to play games, and it was closer to home so it was the best option for me at the time.

"When I first went there it was only for a month, then when they extended it I thought I might be there for a lot longer, and I started thinking more long-term at Southend.

"But obviously I came back here which I was happy to do and I think my time at Southend benefited me and Swindon because it got me

### MICHAEL TIMLIN:

a lot fitter and a lot more hungry.

As he states, it would have been disappointing for Timlin to have moved away from Town on a permanent basis this year, having developed what he insists is a strong bond with the club and everything concerned with it.

It is this connection that would make the drop to League 2 even harder to stomach for Timlin – a feeling that has made him even more determined to wrench Town away from the relegation zone.

Looking back on his arrival at the club, he said: "When I first came on loan here from Fulham, Chris Coleman just wanted me to get out and get some games.

"Paul Sturrock, who brought me down here, wanted to sign me the summer after we got promotion from League 2 but I wanted to go back to Fulham because (Lawrie) Sanchez had just taken over, but I wish now that I had signed here that summer.

"But I was delighted to come back when I did, because I liked the club and the fans and it didn't take me long to settle here

"Twe always enjoyed it here, and I do feel a strong connection to this club, and I always will do"

He added: "It would be massive disappointment if we did go down because I've been here for a long time and seen the improvements on and off the pitch.

"We were in League 2 when I first arrived, and I knew that it was a big club to be in that league.

"It (relegation) would be really hard to take for me, but we've still got a great chance to stay up and we will keep going right to the end."

And with basement rivals Notts County in Town for a relegation six-pointer today, Timlin admits nothing less than a win will do as his side prepare for the first in a crucial four-game run-in.

"It's a massive game because they're one of the teams around us, and by taking points off them it will drag them back into it," he said.


"We've got four games left now, and it's all to play for.

"As long as there are points on the table to win, we've got to make sure we go and win them.

"We all know this season is a million miles away from the standards we set last year, but we've got to stay positive going into this run-in.

# GLENN HODLE

Former Swindon Town favourite

GLENN HODDLE returned to The County

Ground seven days ago to watch the Robins in
action against MK Dons in League 1.

with John Gorman – who served as his number two during his time in Wiltshire, now holding a similar position with the Dons. Whilst catching up with old friends was a welcome part of the day, Hoddle was here on business. The 53-year old met with Town Chairman Andrew Fitton with the pair discussing plans to forge closer links with Hoddle's Academy which is based in southern Spain.

After two years of planning, the Academy opened its doors in June 2008. Following extensive trials in the UK and further evaluation periods in Spain, the first 25 players received full scholarships to attend the Academy. The Academy's reputation is growing quickly and is attracting interest from all over the world. The goal of the Academy is to give young players, who just failed to make the grade at top professional clubs, a second chance.

Hoddle has long been convinced that making the critical, final decision on a youngster's career at the age of 18 is simply too early. In his view professional football has been carelessly discarding home-grown talent for too long with the Academy going some way to addressing this imbalance. Players lucky enough to be selected for the


Academy are granted full scholarships and are not asked to contribute anything.

"The Academy is the day job really," said Hoddle, now 53, speaking to BBC Wiltshire's Shaun Hodgetts seven days ago. "We play in the Spanish league in the third division. Half the squad are over in Spain and half of the squad are over here in England playing a few games. It has been hard work but we are making progress slowly but surely.


"I have had words with Andrew (Fitton) to see about filtering some of our players into Swindon Town, which would be good. At the moment we are talking to quite a few clubs about that because that's the idea behind the Academy. We aim to develop some of the boys that have been turned away by clubs and see if we can improve them.


"We are trying to get them back into the game and it would be nice to see a few players come through to Swindon, do well and then perhaps move onto a higher level. That would be very satisfactory for us and for Swindon Town Football Club."


Hoddle has a team of coaches at the Academy, which is based at the Montecastillo Resort which maintains top-quality grass pitches, gymnasium, spa, indoor and outdoor pools and tennis courts. The coaching team includes former Premier



■ Hoddle battles it out with Notts Courty








League goalkeeper Dave Beasant and Graham Rix. And Hoddle's former number two has also spent time coaching with the Academy.

"John (Gorman) was with me for a while but wanted to get back into mainstream coaching, "explained Hoddle. "I now have Graham Rix and Dave Beasant with me in the Academy coaching team and there are lots of other facets to the set-up, including physiotherapy and administration. It is a small team but it's very rewarding when you see a player return to the professional game.

"We can't get everyone that joins the Academy back into a pro club but they all improve and we are looking at other angles to see how we can develop things. Some of the things we have been talking about may see us spending more time in England and less time in Spain, but we will see what develops.

"The one thing that's for sure; there will be a conveyor belt of talent coming through from professional clubs. There are a couple of Swindon lads who have just been released that are due to come and train with us at Bisham Abbey next week."

MCPARLAND was

a regular at Meadow
Lane for over nine years
where he made almost
300 appearances for the
Magpies. The Town number

game. Born in Edinburgh,

McParland 'made it'
in football.

"I first came down to England with Sunderland as an apprentice but got homesick and decided to go back up the road to Scotland." McParland explains, sitting in the Town dugout after training earlier this week.


"After leaving Sunderland I stopped playing for nearly two years before getting back to it with a non-league team called Ormiston Primrose. The chance to join Notts County then came up and I took it."

McParland, who first joined Notts County as a 19year old, soon made his mark in the black and white amongst some illustrious names.

"It was quite a side back then," says McParland. "At the time the likes of Don Masson, Eddie Kelly and Ian McCulloch were there. They were very good players, some of whom were internationals. Tristan Benjamin and 'Pedro' Richards were there too and were unsung heroes really. Notts County got promoted in my first year up to the First Division."

After a successful playing career at Meadow Lane, McParland returned to the club as manager in October 2007, taking over from Steve Thompson who left the club following a poor start to the season. McParland freely admits that becoming a manager wasn't part of his plans during his playing days.

"I wasn't really interested until I got into my thirties to be honest with you," he said. "I was lucky enough to



work with Jimmy Sirrel who was a fantastic manager and a very good coach. I also worked with Howard Wilkinson when he was at Notts County as well as Mick Walker who was another really good coach.

"Moving into coaching wasn't something that really struck me until I finished playing. I then started to wonder 'what next' but having come through the mines in Scotland, which were closed by the time my playing days came to an

end. I had to think about my future."

He continued: "Taking the manager's job at Notts County was something I had to think long and hard about. I spoke with the Chairman at length because the club was in a bit of a mess when I first went back there.

There were some very tough times in the first few months. When I took over we were third bottom of the entire Football League but Notts County stayed up that season. We got through what was a very tough period and never really looked back."

Town entertain Notts County this afternoon with both sides needing a victory which would provide a significant boost to the 'great escape' efforts. And the Town number two is keen for the Robins to continue their defensive efforts with Lee Hughes, a player McParland helped bring to Meadow Lane, expected to spearhead the

visitors' attack.

"They have some quality players and the likes of Hughes, Westcarr, Bishop and Ravenhill have all done well for them. Defensively we have made progress because we have conceded seven goals in nine games. Two of those have come from the penalty spot.

"At the other end we have created a few chances over the last few home games and if we can start putting those away then results should turn."






# From The Standard Press Box By Danny Hall

It is safe to say neutrals won't be flocking to The County Ground for today's League 1 clash with NOTTS COUNTY.



IN the red corner. Swindon a team boasting the least number of wins at home this season (five), a total of just four goals scored at home in 2011, and a current record of one win in the last 20

Lining up in black and white against them are Notts County, who have won one of their last ten matches and are bedding in their eighth manager in the past 18 months, Martin Allen being the latest to join a list that includes our own assistant boss Ian McParland.

No one is betting on this being a humdinger.



#### Host club website: 7/10

"There was plenty of reaction on the site about Brentford's defeat in the IPT Final the previous week as well as a feature on Swindon Town. I particularly liked the 'Where are they

now?' feature with plenty of nostalgic black and white pictures evokina memories of a bygone age in an era of high technology!"

#### Kiosks: 6/10

"My two visits to the kiosks were met by enthusiastic staff who were keen to serve although the half-time queues were lengthy."

#### Stadium: 6/10

"Although rather dated now, I prefer the current setup where away fans are housed in the Brook Road Stand which used to be for home fans. The ground is cramped and still feels like a good old fashioned stadium helped by the lower tier being standing only!"

#### Pies: 8/10

I tried a Pukka Chicken Balti pie which was very tasty and hot!

#### Pitch: 8/10

The playing surface looked in good condition for the stage of the season we are at."

#### Programme: 7/10


"The programme at 66 pages (eight less than Town's offering) was




