There have been lots of changes at both clubs in terms of playing personnel since then and tonight will be another test for us against a side whose confidence will have been lifted by back-to-back home wins.



Meanwhile, it was typical of the players and management to make the gesture they did by refunding the 106 supporters at Morecambe on Saturday for their time and effort. They were hurting as much as everyone else associated with the club and are determined to put things right at the first opportunity.

It's back to Fortress Broadfield tonight. Against Bristol Rovers ten days ago the atmosphere inside the stadium was magnificent and it clearly inspired the lads.

We need it again tonight and also on Saturday for the visit of Bradford City. Be loud and proud and get behind the boys!

Tonight we face another of the big names in npower League 2 tonight as we welcome Paolo Di Canio and his Swindon Town side to the Broadfield.

A lot has happened in terms of playing personnel at both clubs since Swindon Town were here last November in the FA Cup but, as always at this level, we anticipate another tough 90 minutes this evening. Our opposition are in fine form having beaten Rotherham and Southend in the last ten days so we will need to be back at our best.

My opposite number tonight will always be highly regarded by myself and every other Glasgow Celtic supporter. I often sang his name and enjoyed his performances, I extend a warm welcome to him this evening.

As we are quickly finding out, every game in League 2 represents a real challenge to everyone at Crawley Town but it is a test we are determined to meet head on and deal with.

As is always the case among the management team and players here – win, lose or draw - the focus is on the next game and we have had to move on quickly from what happened at Morecambe. We had no wild celebrations when we beat the likes of Bristol Rovers with ease last week, we simply have to remain focused whatever the result. At Cheltenham and Morecambe we have had to listen to some acting as if they had just won the Championship itself - put simply, that is what it means when teams beat us.

The players and staff met early on Sunday morning and I am delighted they all agreed to my proposal that we should reimburse our supporters who travelled a long way and that was the least we could do.

I take the ultimate responsibility for all the performances at Crawley Town and on behalf of all the group I apologise for our performance, no excuses offered. We know that the performance was not typical of a Crawley Town team and the entire football club was hurting on Saturday night and Sunday.

We have had a magnificent period of success at the club in the last 12 months but there were always going to be setbacks once we reached the Football League, it is a major step up in class. However, it is how you bounce back that often

determines what sort of season you are going to have and I fully expect the lads to respond positively tonight even though our task is a difficult one.

The Broadfield has become our fortress and that was evident again here in our last home game against Bristol Rovers. We won 4-1 and some of our attacking play was outstanding at times. When we play with that intensity and tempo we are a very difficult proposition and it's that sort of performance level I fully expect from the players tonight. We are three points off the top of the table and we are "not happy", now that is high expectations to say the least.

Since my last notes we have done a bit of transfer business. We welcome Scott Griffiths to the club, a player I have admired for some time at Peterborough United and then last season on loan with Chesterfield, whom he helped become the champions of League 2.


Wes Thomas has moved to Bournemouth on loan with the transfer becoming permanent on January 1. The offer made by Bournemouth represented outstanding business for the club. You must remember we picked him up on a Bosman free transfer in the summer and we have a clear guaranteed profit on the player of over £150,000. It will also enable me to strengthen the squad although as always we won't be rushed into making any hasty decisions. We know the type of player we want and will pursue them with our usual diligence.

We are having to contend a horrendous injury crisis at the moment and it is hard to accept but we need to deal with it. We set high standards at this football club and we fell short of those on Saturday but in football there is usually the chance to turn things round quickly, tonight gives us that opportunity.

The atmosphere here for the Bristol Rovers game was superb and we need our fans to be loud and proud again tonight. Get behind the boys and I'm sure you will see a response.



"I was aware from my discussions with Posh Manager Darren Ferguson that Scott had a number of clubs at League 1 and 2 level interested in signing him so I would like to thank Darren for sanctioning the lad's move to us in preference to a few others."

Scott spoke to former Posh teammate Sergio Torres who gave him a glowing endorsement of the club and its ambitions.

He said: "The manager is so enthusiastic and passionate about his football which was one of the reasons I wanted to play for him." Scott made his debut on Saturday in the npower League 2 fixture at Morecambe.


Travel Update







Swindon Town

Aaron McBride runs the rule over tonight's visitors from Wiltshire



One of the most talented players ever to grace the Premier League, Paolo Di Canio is experiencing the ups and downs of management now after his surprise appointment as Swindon's new boss in the summer after the Robins were relegated to League 2.

It has been an interesting start to his first managerial appointment in England for the colourful Di Canio with mixed league results and a much publicised bust-up with one of his summer signings - striker Leon Clarke - following a recent Carling Cup defeat against Southampton at the County Ground.

Clarke has left the County Ground on loan after being told he will never play for the club again and after a hard fought victory at home to in-form Rotherham ten days ago it looked as if Swindon may have put a bad August to bed.

Further proof of that came on Saturday when Jonathan Smith and Mehdi Kerrouche scored the goals which secured a 2-0 victory over Southend that lifted Swindon up to 13th in the table.

Ten players have come through the doors of the County Ground this summer, with several arriving from abroad to try their luck in the English leagues for the first time.

Czech International Lukas Magera, Spanish winger Lander Gabilondo and Algerian striker Kerrouche are among some of the arrivals but it is home-grown midfielder Matt Richie who has been the shining star so far this season after bagging three goals in six games.

As Di Canio builds a new-look squad former Reds striker Elliot Benyon opted for an immediate return to League One by joining Wycombe Wanderers on loan. Young Welsh striker Billy Bodin, midfielder Michael Timlin and defender Will Evans have been loaned out to League Two rivals Torquay, Southend and Hereford respectively while experienced defender Kevin Amankwaah was released by the club on transfer deadline day.

Every Crawley and Swindon supporter will remember the two meetings last year, all be it with different emotions. After a 1-1 draw at the Broadfield, Reds skated into the third round for only the second time in their history when Ben Smith scored an extra-time winner on a frozen pitch at the County Ground to clinch a 3-2 win.

It is league points which are at stake tonight and Reds face a tough task against a side who look to be finding their feet at this level under their charismatic manager.

Meet the men from the County Ground

MATTIA LANZANO

The 20-year-old Italian goalkeeper signed in July from USD Gavorrana on a two-year deal. A commanding presence at 6ft 2in, Lanzano made his debut for the Robins against Rotherham this month and is one of several of manager Paolo Di Canio's signings from his native Italy.

CALLUM KENNEDY

22-year-old former Reading trainee who made his debut for the club at the age of 17. The defender debuted in the 4-1 win over Brentford in September 2007 and has gone on to make over 20 appearances whilst also spending time on loan at Gillingham and Rotherham.

ADEN FLINT

Former non-league defender Flint signed in January from Alfreton Town. Having received two England 'C' Caps the 21-year-old was courted by several league clubs before moving to the County Ground and making his debut against Rochdale in February. Flint returned to Alfreton on loan in March and led the side to promotion to the Blue Square Bet premier.

JOE DEVERA

24-year-old defender who became Paolo di Canio's first signing from Barnet. Despite being named Barnet's Player of the Year last season Devera decided to join the Robins in June after six years with the Bees.

ALBERTO COMAZZI

32-year-old defender who joined in the summer. Having learnt his trade in the AC Milan academy, Comazzi played for Serie B side Monza before joining Lazio, but failed to make a first-team appearance. The Italian joined Verona in 2002 and made over 150 appearances for the side before a brief appearance at Serie C outfit Spezia.

PAUL CADDIS

Former club captain Caddis joined in 2010 from Celtic. The 23-year-old is a Scotland-under 21 international and can operate at right-back or on the right wing. Caddis made 17 first team appearances for Celtic and featured in the Europa League match against Rapid Vienna in 2009 before a loan move to Dundee United.

SIMON FERRY

Scottish midfielder who joined the Robins permanently in 2010, having spent time on loan at the County Ground. The 23-year-old spent five years at Celtic but failed to break into the first team and joined Swindon initially on loan, making 40 appearances in 2009-10.

MATT RICHIE



Ritchie is a product of
Portsmouth's academy and joined
the Robins in January after an
initial loan spell. After a successful
loan spell with Dagenham and
Redbridge the midfielder made
seven appearances in Pompey's
first team. Voted Swindon's fans'
Player of the Year last season and
has showed early season scoring
form this campaign.

ETIENNE ESAJAS

26-year-old Dutch winger who joined from Helmond Sport FC in the summer. Having spent two years with Vitesse, Esajas moved to England in 2007 to join Sheffield Wednesday and went to on make over 60 appearances for the club. The midfielder performed impressively in pre-season and signed a two-year contract.

ALAN McCORMACK





Leading Lights

Leigh Edwards looks at the great names and games in Swindon Town's history



Danny Williams managed Swindon Town to an epic League Cup and promotion 'double' in 1968-69. The Robins were early pace-setters in the Third Division and seven successive wins climaxed with a 5-1 victory over Southport. They triumphed 6-2 at Northampton, then won 5-1 at home to Oldham, but lost 1-0 at home to Watford in the title 'decider' watched by 28,898 and finished runners-up on goal average. Don Rogers starred as Swindon defeated Torquay 2-1, Bradford City 4-3, Blackburn 1-0, Coventry 3-0, Derby 1-0 and Burnley 3-2 in the League Cup before beating Arsenal 3-1 after extra-time in the Wembley final.

SWINDON GREATS

DON ROGERS

England Under-23 international winger Don Rogers scored twice in Swindon Town's 1969 League Cup final success. He joined the club in October 1962. featured in Swindon's 1962-63 promotion campaign and was ever-present in four successive seasons. He starred as Swindon won promotion again in 1968-69 and the Anglo-Italian Cup in 1970, reuniting with Bert Head at Crystal Palace in November 1972. After moving to QPR in September 1974 he rejoined Swindon in March 1976 and netted 148 goals in 412 League games in two spells for the Robins. He has since run his own sports shop in Swindon.

MIKE SUMMERBEE Brilliant winger Mike Summerbee (above) was capped eight times by England after leaving Swindon Town. Initially with Cheltenham Town, he moved to the County Ground in March 1960 and was an important figure in Swindon's 1962-63 promotion success. He netted 39 goals in 218 League games prior to joining Manchester City in August 1965, amassing a vast collection of domestic and European honours under the Joe Mercer/Malcolm Allison partnership at Maine Road. Subsequently with Burnley, Blackpool and Stockport County, he is a successful businessman while his son Nicky also played for Swindon

JOHN TROLLOPE

Long-serving left-back John Trollope (below) holds Swindon Town's appearance record. Signing professional at the County Ground in July 1960, he made his League debut in Swindon's 1-1 draw at home to Halifax Town a month later and was ever-present in seven consecutive seasons including the 1962-63 promotion success. He featured in Swindon's 1968-69 promotion and League Cup 'double' campaign as well as their 1970 Anglo-Italian Cup final triumph. He scored 21 goals in 770 League games and was their coach before managing them between November 1980 and March 1983. He then took over as youth-team boss.



AFC WIMBLEDON:

The Dons have further strengthened their squad with the loan signing of West Ham's 19-year-old centre-half Callum McNaughton. 
SOUTHEND:

GILLINGHAM:



ROTHERHAM:







1952: Crawley lost 3-1, Doug Bastable the scorer, away to Brighton Old Grammarians in the Sussex County League.

1958: Ken Butler scored the Crawley goal as they were beaten by the odd goal in three away to Newbury Town in the Metropolitan League. All three goals came in the first period.

1969: The Southern League Premier Division game at Town Meadow with Kettering Town ended in a 4-1 win for the visitors. Phil Basey scored his fourth goal of the season for Reds.

1972: Sussex rivals Hastings United defeated Reds 3-0 in the Southern League at the Pilot Field.

1975: Goals from John Bailey and Mick Mancini helped the Reds knock Hastings United out of the FA Cup at the first qualifying round stage 2-1 at Town Mead.

1980: Reds progressed to the second qualifying round of the FA Cup courtesy of a solitary goal from David Gates at County League Haywards Heath.

1983: It was goalless at the break in the Southern League game at Hillingdon Borough and although Jeff Wood scored for Crawley in the second half they had to settle

for a share of the points from a 1-1 draw.

1986: Former Gravesend & Northfleet striker Garv Julians scored the only goal of the game to knock his old club out of the FA Cup. The first qualifying round tie was played at Town Mead.

1988: David Boyce scored a goal in each half to give the Reds maximum points from the Southern League encounter with Dover Athletic at Town Mead.

1989: There was a trip to Dorset for the Reds to play Weymouth in the Southern League but no points and no goals for Crawley as they went down 3-0.

1997 Five goals were scored in the FA Cup First Qualifying Round tie at Whyteleafe. Unfortunately the Reds were on the wrong end of the scoreline. Peter Garland and Andy Riley (penalty) were the visitors'

2003: The Reds came out on top from the Southern League visit to Newport County. Crawley fought back from a goal down at half time to secure all three points with goals from Mo Harkin (penalty) and Danny Marney.

2008: Adam Quinn and Jamie Cook were on target as Reds beat Mansfield Town 2-1 in Conference Premier.



When you have a goal scorer of Brian Gregory's calibre you always had a chance and while manager John Maggs was guick to proclaim our promotion to the premier division of the Southern League 27 years ago as a collective effort there is no underestimating the contribution Gregory made.

Gregory wasn't tall for a centre forward and not particularly quick either, but he came alive in the penalty area and had an unerring ability to sniff out a half chance and take it.

34 of them came in the league. none more important than the 58th minute strike against Addlestone and Weybridge in the final home game of the season which clinched promotion as runners-up to champions, and long forgotten, RS Southampton.

Cliff Cant's free kick was headed back across goal and Gregory was on hand to score and send a Town Mead crowd of 834, the club's biggest for ten years, into raptures.

A few weeks earlier, Maggs had warned that his side would need eight wins from their last nine games to guarantee a Premier

THE nightmare that is the FA Cup lives on for Crawley Town, and they can have no excuses for going out at the first hurdle, once again.

They were simply unable to put away any one of a dozen good chances to have scored in this first qualifying round match, and were sunk by the only Hornchurch raid of the first half.

Manager John Maggs refused however to condemn his side, other than to say: We simply were not good enough in front of goal. We had the chances, but did not take them, it's as simple as
