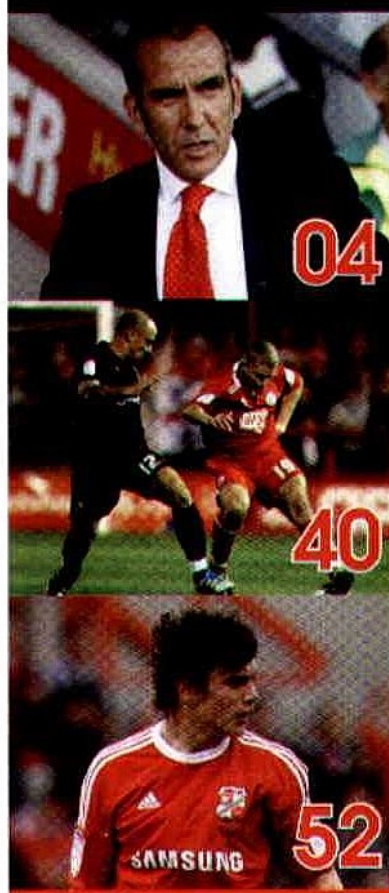

of his replacement. Aden Flint and Alberto Comazzi are both good players and with different qualities. I am not worried about the situation because they will be able to do their job properly.

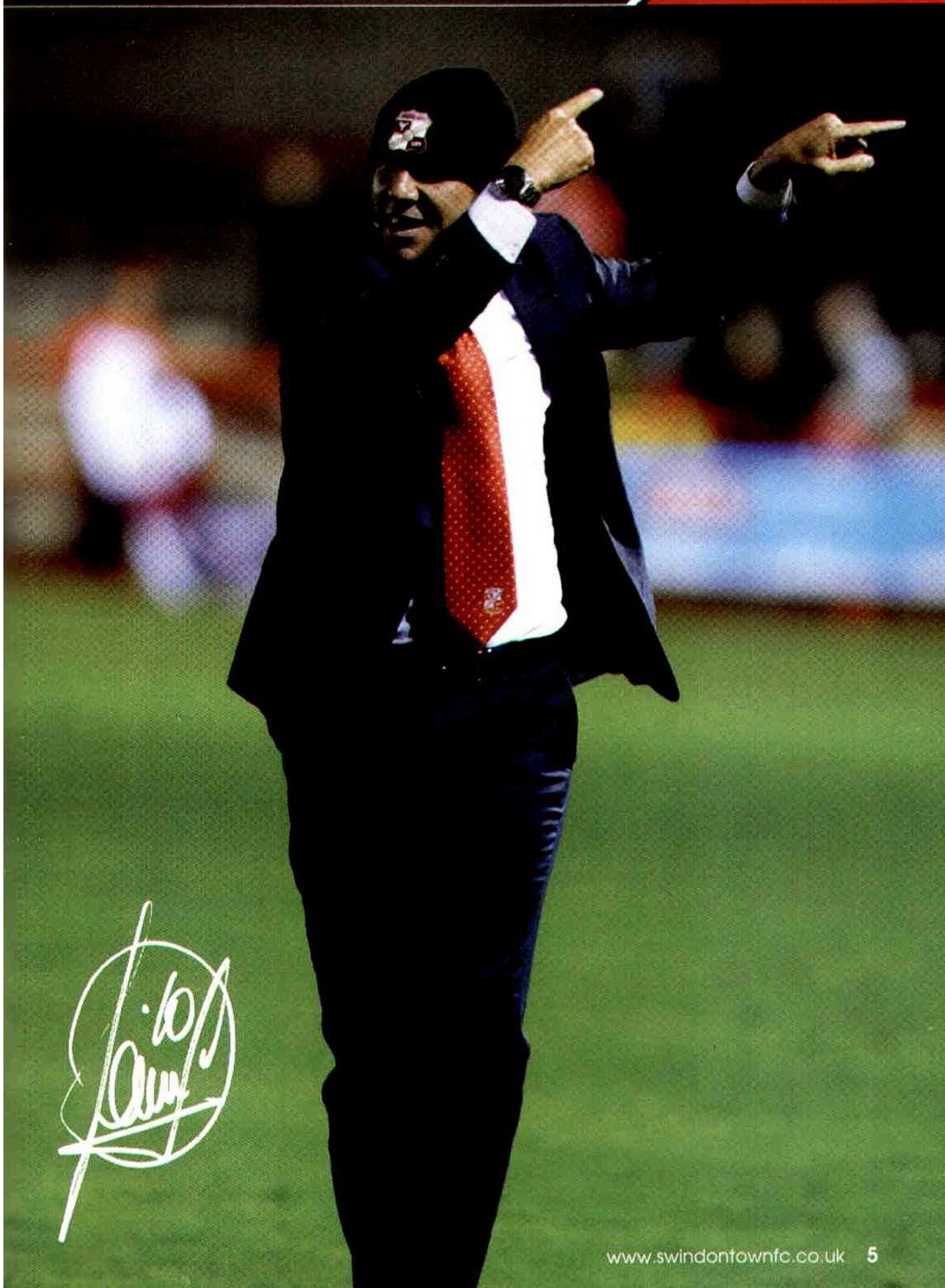
Lukas Magera has been missing for the last few games although he returned to training earlier this week. He came to the club without a top level of

samsung 'win a pro' trials

THE search for Swindon Town's next star player started six days ago, with the first of the Samsung Win A Pro Contract trials.

SAMSUNG, the club's official sponsor, launched the competition in June, which will see one unknown player being awarded a professional contract with the club.

More than 5,000 hopefuls entered the competition through www.facebook.com/samsungfootball.

The shortlisted players will be put through their paces at a series of regional and national trials over the coming months, before Paolo Di Canio and his coaching staff pick a winner in December.

The winning player will sign his contract and join the first team squad during the January 2012 transfer window.

Sixty players travelled to Gillette Corner, Isleworth, West London, last Sunday [September 18] for the first of the regional trials.

FootballCV Head Coach Danny Nicholls, who is co-ordinating the trial process on behalf of the club,



was impressed with the standard of players at the opening event.

He said: "There was some real talent out there.

"My coaching staff were really encouraged with the level of ability and technique showed by some of the players.

"There's still a long way to go, but if this is an indication of the calibre of player we're getting, then things look very promising indeed."

Samsung's European

"The first of the regional trials proved extremely encouraging.

"Last season 'Win a Pro Contract' discovered Jordan Pavett, who proved good



enough to make the grade and signed for Swindon Town FC.

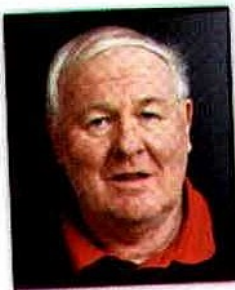

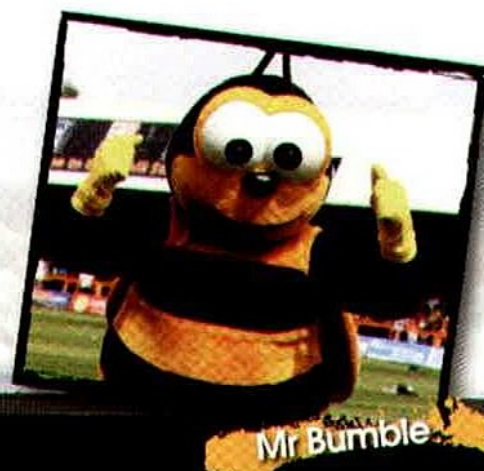

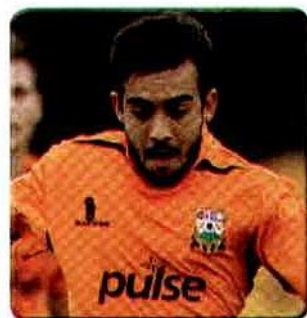

Steve Kabba...

AN experienced striker whose career began at Crystal Palace, Kabba has also played for Sheffield United, Watford in the Premier League and Brentford as well as a handful of clubs on loan. Kabba is a centre-forward who leads the line and his experience, both on and off the pitch will be vital this season for the Bees. Last season he scored 11 goals including all four in the 4-1 triumph at Burton Albion in April.

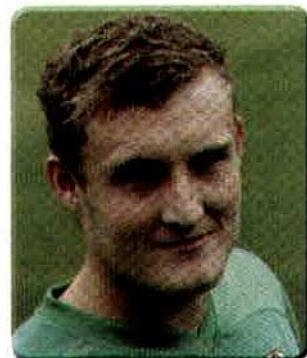


Sam Deering...

DEERING was on loan from Oxford United for much of last season and he has made a positive impact after joining in February. He is talented on the ball and will take on opponents and can deliver excellent crosses from wide positions. He can play in a variety of forward positions and is now a Barnet player.

Lloyd Owusu...

THE experienced striker signed for Barnet on a short-term deal as a free agent 12 days ago. The 34-year old signed for Luton Town in January and scored six times in 13 games before leaving the Hatters at the end of last season. Owusu began his career with Slough before a switch to Brentford in 1998 where he scored 70 goals in 195 appearances. He has also played for Sheffield Wednesday, Cheltenham Town, Reading, Adelaide United and Ghana.



Liam O'Brien...

RUISLIP-born goalkeeper O'Brien joined Barnet on a permanent contract after beginning his career with Portsmouth. He left Pompey in January to link up with the Bees for training before penning a permanent deal. The England Under-19 international had a loan spell with Eastbourne last season, but played in just one game - a 4-0 defeat at Barrow.

BARNET boss Lawrie Sanchez played eight games for Swindon Town on loan from Wimbledon during the 1993/94 Premier League season, one of which was a 2-2 home draw with Manchester United.

lawrie sanchez

the gaffer

CONFIRMED as the new manager of Barnet on May 13, 2011, Lawrie Sanchez has achieved unprecedented results for teams he has managed. He led Wycombe Wanderers to the FA Cup semi-finals and lifted Northern Ireland nearly 100 places in the FIFA rankings.

After entering Wembley folklore with the Wimbledon goal that beat Liverpool in the 1988 FA Cup final, he returned to the Dons after a spell in charge of Sligo Rovers. He took the Irish outfit to the Cup Winners Cup before managing Wimbledon's reserves and stepping up to first team coach. At Wycombe, Sanchez inherited a team at the bottom of the old Second Division. They avoided the drop and two seasons later, Sanchez inspired a run to the Cup semi-finals. Sanchez left Wycombe in 2003 having become the longest-serving manager in their history. Northern Ireland were ranked 124th in the World and had not scored a goal for over 1,200 minutes when Lawrie took charge in 2004. By the time he left, Ireland were top of their Euro 2008 qualifying group and were 27th in the World, an all-time high. While still manager of Northern Ireland, he answered the call of Fulham and kept them in the Premier League before leaving at the end of 2007.

THE early indications are that this season could be an interesting one in League Two...

IT'S the tenth round of matches today but you'd be a brave man to predict the title winner, let alone those who may reach the play-offs this season.

Morecambe have made the strongest start but they, like everyone else in the division, have already lost at least once.

Rotherham, Shrewsbury, Burton Albion and Oxford are the only teams yet to suffer defeat on their own patch. Interestingly enough, Swindon have already faced that quartet this season. In fact, out of the league's top seven sides, it's only Morecambe that Town are yet to tackle. They'll have to wait until the week before Christmas before that fixture.

My guess would be that Morecambe probably won't still be top of the table by then. There are so many sides in this league that are capable of turning each other over that the likelihood is that any number of teams could top the tree on the same day the angel does in your household.

You have to cast a searching glance all the way down the table to 21st before you land upon Swindon's opponents today. Barnet may have nine points from nine games but lie just nine points off second place. Tight indeed.

Regardless, Town have to look at matches like this one as 'must wins'. In the main, Swindon have been solid at home so far and it's imperative that The 'County Ground curse' they hold over other sides continues. Teams such as Hereford, Gillingham and Bradford all come here before the end of

October. I'd argue that Swindon should be lining up three points from each and every one of those games.

Interestingly enough, Swindon are also one of only two sides yet to draw a game this season in League Two. Along with their opening day opponents Crewe, it's been a case of all or nothing for Paolo Di Canio's side so far.

The manager said this week that he'd happily take two wins and a defeat for every three games between now and the end of the season. My mathematics has never been great but I make that in excess of 80 points and that should guarantee promotion. I think it's fair to say Swindon fans would readily accept that too.

Town defender Joe Devera will be looking to get one over his old teammates today and help his new employers continue to climb the table...

IT'S fair to say that Paolo Di Canio likes to do his homework before each match. Together with his management team, the Italian watches DVDs of the opposition, quite often into the small hours, while a team of scouts will watch the other team in the weeks leading up to a game. Suffice to say the BBC Football League Show cameras weren't the only spies at Underhill for Barnet's defeat against Oxford last Saturday.

For his preparations this week the Swindon boss can also call on the added benefit of the experience of a player who spent five years with today's opponents. Joe Devera was Player of the Year twice during his stay at Underhill, where he progressed from youth team to senior squad to become one of only a handful of players to win the award on two separate occasions. After having been such a positive influence at the club, particularly last season during which he played 46 games and helped the club avoid relegation, he feels well versed with the intricacies of Lawrie Sanchez and

Giuliano Grazioli's squad.

"I've still got quite a few friends there, too many to list individually and I'm looking forward to catching up with them all," he explains. "They've kept most of the squad together from last season. Izale McLeod will be a threat if he's fit and plays, same with another of their strikers, Steve Kabba - I've always rated him as a player. They have some really strong lads and I'm looking forward to it. We shouldn't pay too much attention to their league position; it'll be a tough game."

"I have spent a large chunk of my career so far at the club and they've been a huge part of my life really," Devera continues. "It was a tough decision to leave after five years, but I felt the time was right to move on. I had always lived in that area and I felt it was a chance to try something different, to head away and go somewhere new. They're a great club. It's well run and they have a brand new training ground, the set up is decent."

Any sentiment Devera feels for

his old club will be pushed to one side at 3pm this afternoon. Yet while Barnet sit in the bottom four, they're only three points behind Swindon and Devera urges players and fans not to take too much notice of the Bees' lowly position. Devera has more League Two experience than anyone in the Swindon squad and he feels the league table doesn't mean a great deal at this stage of the season. He also knows any side is capable of beating any other in the division.

"Teams at the bottom can beat teams at the top. Sometimes it comes down to who wants it more and I'm really desperate to win promotion, it would mean everything," he says. More important, he says, is that the team focus on getting three points and put last week's defeat behind them.

"We haven't started as well as we would have liked to have done, but we're a new team and I think we expected to take a little time to get," he explains. "We would have liked to have picked up a few more points from the first few games but when you have such a big turnaround of players and coaching staff it's always going to take time to settle. Our response to the run of defeats has been good and hopefully we can bounce back from last week's defeat with a win today. Now we have some games under our belt I think you'll see the real potential of this side."

Devera's own form this season mirrors that of the team. He's the first to admit he endured a slow start that saw him make way for Aden Flint and Alberto Comazzi for the visit of Southampton in the Carling Cup. Yet since his return to the side, in the centre as opposed to the right-back position where he was so often

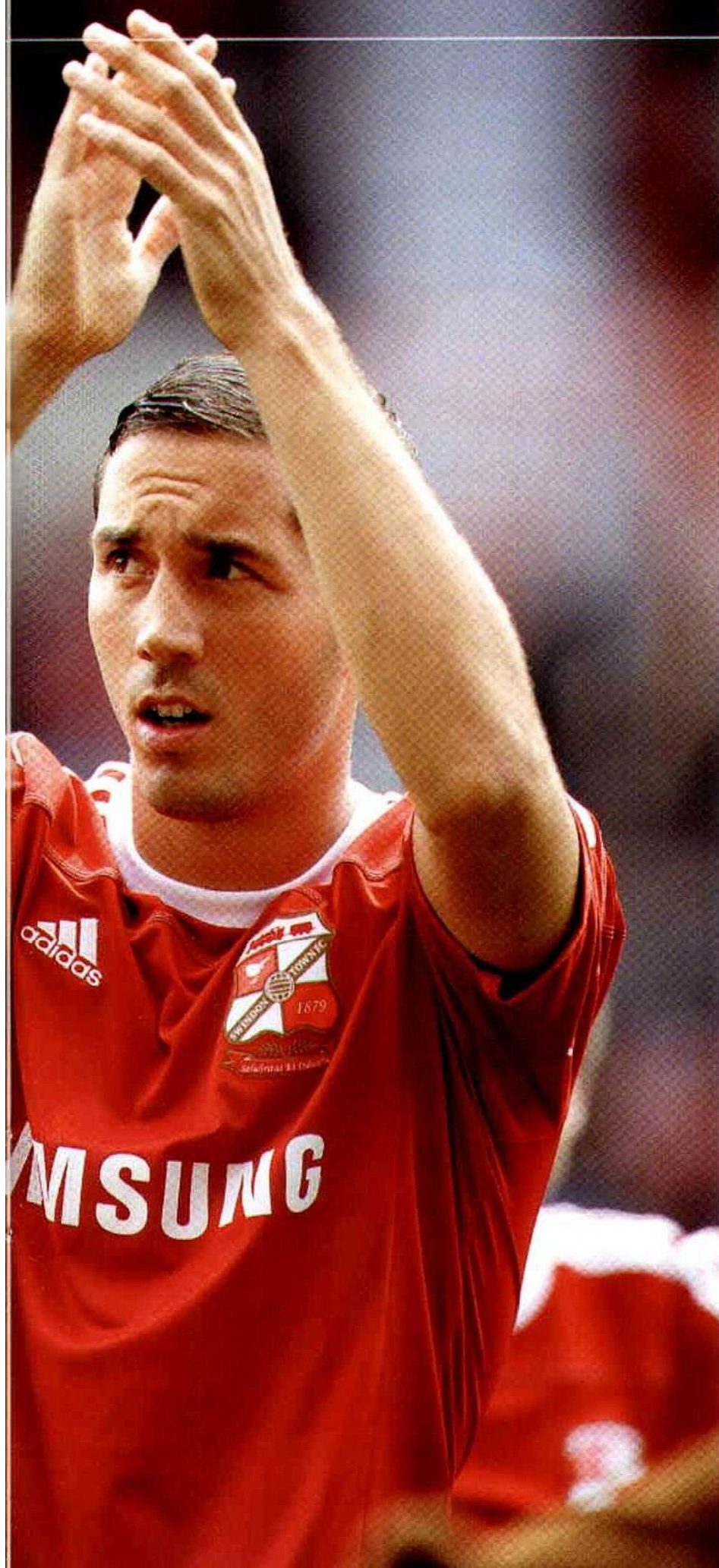


deployed at Barnet, he has impressed at the heart of a defence that kept two consecutive clean sheets, all of which were played alongside midfielder Alan McCormack.

"I feel I didn't start the season as I wanted to," he admits. "For whatever reason I just couldn't get going. Now, though, I have had a few games under my belt and I feel good. It's time to keep that going. I can't make excuses for why I didn't play so well at the start. Things just weren't going right for me, but I'm not too worried. We've done a lot of work on set plays as a unit because things just didn't seem to be going our way at the beginning of the season and now I think we have a better team spirit, which helps. Over time we've got to know each other a bit more and I feel that's really come on in the last few weeks."

"We've obviously had a few central partnerships and in recent weeks Alan (McCormack) slotted in seamlessly, you wouldn't have thought he was a central midfielder," Devera continues. "Aden has been good this season as well. I know he

didn't get any opportunities last season but he has taken his chances this season. He did really well in that run of games in August and showed his class."

And far from considering being dropped to the bench a negative move, he feels there is a bigger picture that will benefit the club as a whole as the season develops.

"It's tough for anyone when you're not playing, but it does motivate you and make you work harder to try and get your place back. That is going to be one of our strengths this season. We haven't got just a strong 11, we have a tight squad of 20 and everyone is going to play their part at some stage."

Devera admits the talk of automatic promotion at the start of the season was something of a culture shock having joined from a side more used to fighting the bottom of the table than the top. And while Swindon's end goal remains the same, he believes the side need to focus on the here and now to achieve the wider aim.

"It always was – and remains – our aim to go up, but we need to ensure we don't get too caught up in something that is so far down the line. We're more concerned at taking things game by game. We have some very good players who can win or change a game, so we just need to keep focused and see what happens."

"Last season in particular at Barnet I was involved in a relegation scrap all season and it's a different mentality, you just feel as though you're battling for your life. In saying that, whether you're looking at the top or bottom there is always pressure to try and win games. It's a challenge whatever end you're in."

Town have already been at the top of the league and in the

bottom four and now, despite last week's set back, Devera feels confident the side can push on and build on the three wins that preceded the Burton defeat.

"We've set the benchmark with the three-game unbeaten run. We know we can win games, score goals and keep clean sheets, so I'm sure we won't let one defeat affect us. We're all raring to go. We started the Burton game well and enjoyed a good first half. We had a lot of opportunities and we should have perhaps put some of them away. At the same time we needed to defend better and perhaps stay a bit tighter and try and nick something. The defence has been more solid in recent weeks and against Crawley we worked hard. We outfought them. Maybe that didn't happen against Burton to the same extent, but we'll be trying to do that today."

Devera admits there are some good sides in the division, but he thinks Town will be fitter than most, something that will benefit the team as winter approaches.

"The training we did in the summer was the hardest I've ever done," he admits. "Maybe that was one reason why we started the season sluggishly. I don't know, but I think you can see the benefits of it now in each game. We're all hitting top gear and we're looking strong late on in games."

Off the field Devera feels he's adapting to life away from the capital. His move to Wiltshire was his first away from north London, where he lived for most of his life and where he has left a huge support network of friends and family behind.

"It's really different here," he smiles. "London feels like such a big city in comparison with loads to do. I had all my friends and family there whereas the only

people I know here are mostly involved at the club. I spend a lot of time with my teammates. I wouldn't say I'm closer to anyone in particular; I just get on with everyone. It has just been such a huge change for me and I've really enjoyed that. I feel more responsible because it's the first time I've been away from friends and family so I'm more self-dependent. I don't mind the cooking and everything else. I won't lie and say I'm the best of cooks – I do a lot of pasta – but it's ok because we have a good healthy lunch together at the club, which helps!"

So with things finally getting on and off the pitch for the 24-year-old, Devera concludes our chat by discussing his international ambitions. Devera had previously explored the option of representing his father's country of birth, Venezuela. He feels if he can continue to play regularly and impress at the heart of Town's defence international football might not be such a far-fetched pipe dream.

"I haven't had a call-up yet," he explains. "I made contact with them in the summer but by then it was too late to get involved in the Copa America. I'm still hoping it's something that could happen. They had a good run to the semi-finals in the recent tournament, so it would be amazing to play at that level and against some of the best players in the world."

Venezuela's World Cup qualifying campaign starts in earnest next month in Ecuador, but first things first... Devera could have a crucial part to play in today's game and for him there are bragging rights at stake. For the team, a return to winning ways is essential.

Eyes down and fingers crossed.

HAVING met today's visitors on only four previous occasions, we look back to the first just over five years ago - which marked a County Ground debut for Town boss Dennis Wise and his assistant Gus Poyet.

However, the opening 20 minutes did not go to plan for them, Nicky Bailey firing Barnet ahead following some hesitant defending in the home penalty area.

Swindon had two chances to open the scoring in the first five minutes. But Ricky Shakes

headed wide when he should have done better before Andy Monkhouse missed from six yards on the other side of goal.

And a 13th minute effort from Christian Roberts was ruled out for offside.

At the interval Michael Pook was replaced by Paul Evans in midfield and it took Town just nine minutes to draw level. Shakes atoned for his earlier miss, sending in a cross shot from 15 yards that crept over the line at the far post.

The visitors twice went close to regaining the lead through Dean Sinclair and Adam Gross, before the new management duo made a double substitution eleven minutes from time.

With 90 minutes already played, man of the match Roberts cut the ball back from wide on the right to Royce Brownlie and the Aussie's 30-yard drive flew past Lee Harrison into the roof of the net to seal victory.

A mini football festival is being held at Croft Sport Centre's £1.5m state-of-the-art football hub today (Saturday 24th September) which will see girls' and boys' teams playing matches on the brand new pitches.

Town goalkeeper Mark Scott will be on hand to kick start proceedings at 9.30am with tournaments for both under 11 and under 13 girls' teams, while Croft Junior FC and Old Town United FC, who will both be based at the new football hub, will hold their own training sessions and matches on the 3G artificial pitch and grass pitches between 10am and 1pm.

The new pitches, which were officially opened by Swindon Mayor Cllr Ray Ballman on September 1, were funded



through a £224,470 grant from the Football Foundation, £150,000 from the Football Association, while Swindon Borough Council made up the remaining £1.12m thanks largely to section 106 developer contributions. Croft Junior and Old Town United also made contributions to the

facilities, which are open to the whole borough.

The football hub has received strong backing from the Wiltshire County FA and North Wiltshire Youth & Minor Football League.

Cllr Keith Williams, Swindon Borough Council's Cabinet Member for Leisure and Corporate Services, said: "I would urge anyone who hasn't been down to see the fantastic new facilities at Croft to do so on Saturday.

"The new pitches look fantastic and we have had some excellent feedback from the players who have had the chance to use them. The football festival is all about showcasing the new football hub at Croft which we hope will become a Centre of Excellence not just for junior football, but for girls and disabled football."
