

KICK It Out's One Game, One Community week of action is here, with a renewed call from football's equality and inclusion campaign for supporters everywhere to report discrimination heard, or seen in stadia...

"SOME of the worst excesses of abuse, where players, fans, even managers and coaches, were abused, harassed and attacked based on colour, race and religion, are now thankfully a thing of the past," says Lord Herman Ouseley, the campaign's Chair. "But pockets of unacceptable behaviour still exist. It's the duty of

everyone within the game to flag this up where and when it happens."

Throughout the 18-day period,

extended this season by a week to accommodate all home fixtures, professional clubs will be making their contribution by holding matchday activities at their dedicated One Game, One Community day of action. At grass roots and amateur level, a number of thought leadership seminars, football tournaments








PHIL Parkinson became Bradford City's new manager on Monday 29 August 2011. He took his first steps into football management following a playing career that lasted 15 years - the majority of which were successfully spent with Reading.

Following his eventual departure from the Madejski, he began the start of his management career as he took up the reins at Colchester United. It was during the 2005/06 season that Parkinson really threw himself into the national spotlight though, amazingly winning promotion to the Championship with Colchester after finishing as runners-up in League 1.

Parkinson's exploits during that particular campaign created interest from several clubs keen on securing his services. It would be Hull City who were to win the battle for Parkinson after paying a reported £400,000 to Colchester to allow the Tigers to appoint him as their new boss.

After just six months at the KC Stadium, he turned down a managerial offer from Northampton Town to become Alan Pardew's assistant at Charlton Athletic in January 2007, a man under whom he played at Reading.

He was initially installed as caretaker manager following Pardew's exit in November 2008 but he eventually left The Valley in January 2011.

In his time away from management, Parkinson has recently been scouting for Arsene Wenger at Premier League side Arsenal.




WE'VE seen some pretty decent Swindon goals this season already but I'm not sure any match up to the strike from Mott Ritchie earlier this week...

IN truth, the game against Gillingham on Tuesday needed a goal of that calibre. It required something a bit special and Ritchie delivered with devastating effect. It wasn't that Swindon didn't play well, they did. I just think if you ask most that were here midweek, they'd say that the match was seemingly drifting towards a draw.

It's the second time in less than a week that Swindon have grabbed a vital late goal in games they haven't dominated. They did the same at Plymouth Argyle last weekend at almost the same moment in the match. Yet that's the key to success isn't it?

While Ritchie's goal on Tuesday was a sensational individual effort, Rafa De Vita's neat finish at Home Park was at the opposite end of the goalscoring spectrum. Such was the fluidity and speed of the move; you wouldn't be far wrong describing it as the perfect team goal. I think Paolo Di Canio described it as a goal worthy of gracing the Champions League stage and I've heard few disagree since.

It's a shame really that Ritchie's opener on Tuesday slightly overshadowed what was actually a very good second goal from Jonathan Smith. No-one

has really been talking about Smith's strike but that too was an excellent finish. He's not known for his goal-scoring capabilities but add that to the one he bagged against Southend United back in September and perhaps there is more to come from Town's tough tackling midfielder.

bullet effort to help Swindon to a
3-0 win.


I'd also like to throw in Jake Jervis' first goal for the club against Exeter City in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy at the start of the month. The close range finish was neat but the build-up to the goal is worth watching again if you missed it at the time.

Take the away goals out of it, it seems this season's 'stunners' have all been scored at the Town End. I'm sure there are quite a few people who have had some fantastic 'up close' views of those goals already. In fact Di Canio told us after the game midweek that it was about time they scored a 'rubbish' goal – or words to that effect. To be honest, I think we're perfectly happy with the way they are arriving now - Town End or not.

EXHAUSTED but elated after Tuesday's win, fan favourite and scheming midfielder Simon Ferry talked candidly about why he's desperate for promotion, Matt Ritchie's shooting and Steven Seagal's hair...

There were a lot of smiles coming out of the dressing room after the win on Tuesday; did it feel like an important win against a good side?

We were all buzzing, particularly about the two goals. They were two great strikes. We knew it was going to be a hard test after two games away from home. = Gillingham are a good side, so to make it three wins in a row was always going to be tough. To do it 2-0 gives us great confidence.

How would you assess Gillingham in relation to the best teams you've faced this season?

I'd say they're probably the best footballing side. They like to get the ball down and pass it. The boy Rooney [Luke] is a good player and they looked very dangerous on the counter-attack.

We rode our luck at times before taking the lead. Gillingham hit the post and could have scored from close range. Do you feel after the run of bad luck we experienced last season, and again at the start of the current campaign that perhaps things are starting to work in our favour?

That's what I said to the boys
- sometimes you have to make
- and take- your own luck. At the
start of the season we were very
unlucky at times and things felt
like they were going against us,
but you have to take it when it's
given to you. I think we deserve it.

That's now three consecutive wins and no goals conceded...

Getting a clean sheet is very important and we've got a really good base now. When you don't concede goals you don't lose games and we know we've got the attacking players going forward to give us every chance of scoring goals.

We're back in the top seven for the first time since the opening weeks of the season. Does that give everyone a boost?

We don't want to be in the top seven, we want to be in the top three. We won't be happy until we're right up there and there's a gap between us and the rest. We'll just keep working hard and hopefully we'll get there soon.

It wasn't a bad goal from Matt Ritchie, was it?

It was a great goal and he caught it well - although he had enough chances, to be fair! Matt has the potential to pull that out of his locker; he's very dangerous cutting in from the right-hand side. That's why the gaffer puts him there. He's scored a few important ones from there this season.

There were a few fans behind me who were urging him not to shoot because it hadn't been his night beforehand...

The players were the same – he always shoots! But to be fair, if he doesn't shoot he can't score, so we'll take him hitting 20 shots a game if one goes in.

After Jonathan Smith's goal did you feel left out? Talk us through your long-range effort in the closing stages. You admitted on Twitter you've kicked the dog harder...

[laughs] I was absolutely knackered! I thought I saw the keeper towards the edge of his box, so I thought 'why not?' I went for it, but I just didn't have it in my legs.

You seem to be enjoying your football at the moment...

There's nothing worse than sitting on the sidelines as a footballer. I did it for much of the season last year and I'm



desperate to take my chance when given it now. I always try my best for the team. I'll try and get some consistency for the rest of the season because I don't want to go back to not playing again.

You admitted earlier in the season you were tempted to leave in the summer, are you pleased you stayed?

It wasn't that I wanted to leave the club; it was more because I simply wasn't playing last season. That's why I was a bit unhappy. Obviously the new manager has come in and now, having been one of the players who was relegated I feel like I have a duty to get us back up. I want to put things right and be a major part in doing it.


Do you keep in touch with the lads who moved on in the summer?

Yes. I like to see all the lads I've played with do well. Fair play to them for doing what they're doing, I'm just hoping to see them in League 1 next year.

You were on the bench for one or two games to begin with this season. Were you thinking: 'here we go again?'

The start of the season is always tough because the manager is still





trying to sort his team. I thought I'd bide my time and get on with it and try and work hard to get back into the side. When I was given a chance I made sure I took it and with the exception of Crawley, I've played every match since. I'm more than happy with the way things have gone.

You played under Danny Wilson and Paul Hart last season, how different is life under Paolo?

The gaffer is brilliant. He leaves nothing to chance and knows everything about the opposition. He likes us to get the ball down and pass the ball, which suits me perfectly. He also likes us to work hard when the other team has the ball and attack when we win it back, so it's been brilliant. I probably needed someone who was going to work me hard.

Just give us an idea of the detail Paolo goes into when researching the opposition?

He knows which of their players have trained in the build-up to the game through to their height. how many games they've played... everything. I even know which foot a player is likely to use in certain circumstances, so it's a big help.

Do you think we're starting to reap the benefits of pre-season? There seems to be a certain inevitability about us winning games late on...

Definitely; particularly in this league. You can see the other teams are at it for the first hour and a lot of them tire. That's when we play our football. The Plymouth game, for example was a battle for the first 70 minutes. We got through that and started to play. That's when we got on the ball and they couldn't cope. Again, on Tuesday, we scored two goals in

the last 15 minutes, so it's a big advantage.

Another home game today... how important is it to keep the run going?

Getting a run in any league is important because it builds momentum and confidence. Even if you lose one and win another three, you have the confidence to get back on track. If we continue to win games we'll be in the top three.

There hasn't been a feeling around the club like this since the 2009/10 season; is it bringing back fond memories?

I was thinking that at the final whistle on Tuesday. In my first year this place seemed like a fortress and we were really hard to beat. It feels the same now. We started that season slowly as well, so there are some similarities. Let's hope we can build momentum like we did that year and actually go up this time.


Paolo said last Saturday he felt you were starting to play as well away from home as you are at The County Ground. Have you started doing things differently on the road?


































- classic encounters -

seven-goal thriller!

SWINDON Town have played out many high-scoring games with Bradford City over the years. One of those, a 4-3 home win back in September 1968, is amongst the best of the previous encounters...



Swindon Town 4 Bradford City 3

10 September 1968 Attn: 12,214

TOWN had come within 12 minutes of securing a League Cup Second Round victory at Valley Parade, but 20 minutes into this replay they looked to be heading out of the competition after City had raced into a two-goal lead

The visitors had adapted quicker to a surface made very slippery by a pre-match downpour and went in front through John Hall with less than two minutes on the clock, before Peter Middleton added a second.

But Swindon clawed their way back and were level with ten minutes still to go before the break



SUMMER signing Mehdi Kerrouche is proving to be one of Paolo Di Canio's top captures. With six goals already this season, the Algerian is hoping to return to the side this afternoon after missing Tuesday's clash with Gillingham.

A striker with guile and an eye for goal, the 26-year-old has proved a popular addition to the Robins' rank, his neat finishes, never-say-die attitude and penchant for an unusual celebration making him a hit with the fans. Since hitting his first goal in the Carling Cup clash with Championship pace-setters Southampton, the Algerian hasn't looked back.

He enhanced his growing reputation further last weekend at Plymouth Argyle, where he came off the substitutes bench to play his part in what has already been described as a contender for team goal of the season.

"It was a very good move," says Kerrouche, sitting back in The Arkell's Stand after training earlier this week. "Jake [Jervis], myself and Simon (Ferry) were involved in the build-up and Rafa (De Vita) was there to finish it off.

"The three points away from home were important and now we want to keep winning games to move up the league," he continues. "Since I came to Swindon I am very much enjoying playing here; I believe we play the best football in the league and we have to keep going.

"We have good quality players here and everyone here is together. There is very good solidarity here," he says, showing signs of just how much his English has improved since arriving at SN1 in July.

Kerrouche's grasp of the local lingo is not the only thing showing signs of improvement. The win in Devon was Town's second in two games, hopefully putting to an end a disappointing sequence of results on the road. "Maybe a few

months ago we would have gone to Plymouth and lost the game, but now we can go away from home, play strong and believe we can win."


The win at Home Park came at a cost for the striker, who picked up his fifth yellow card in Devon and a one-match suspension, which he served in midweek against Gillingham.
