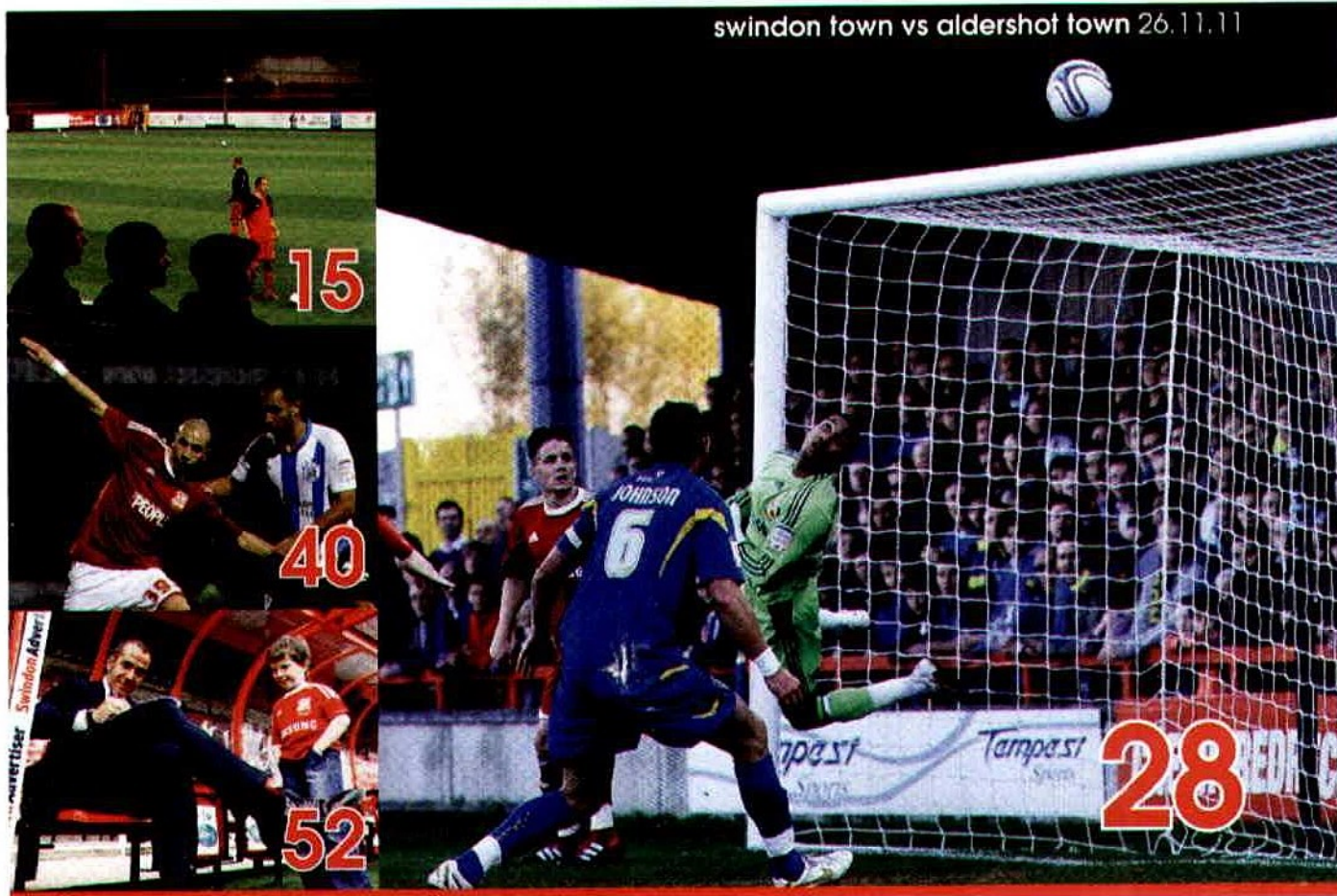

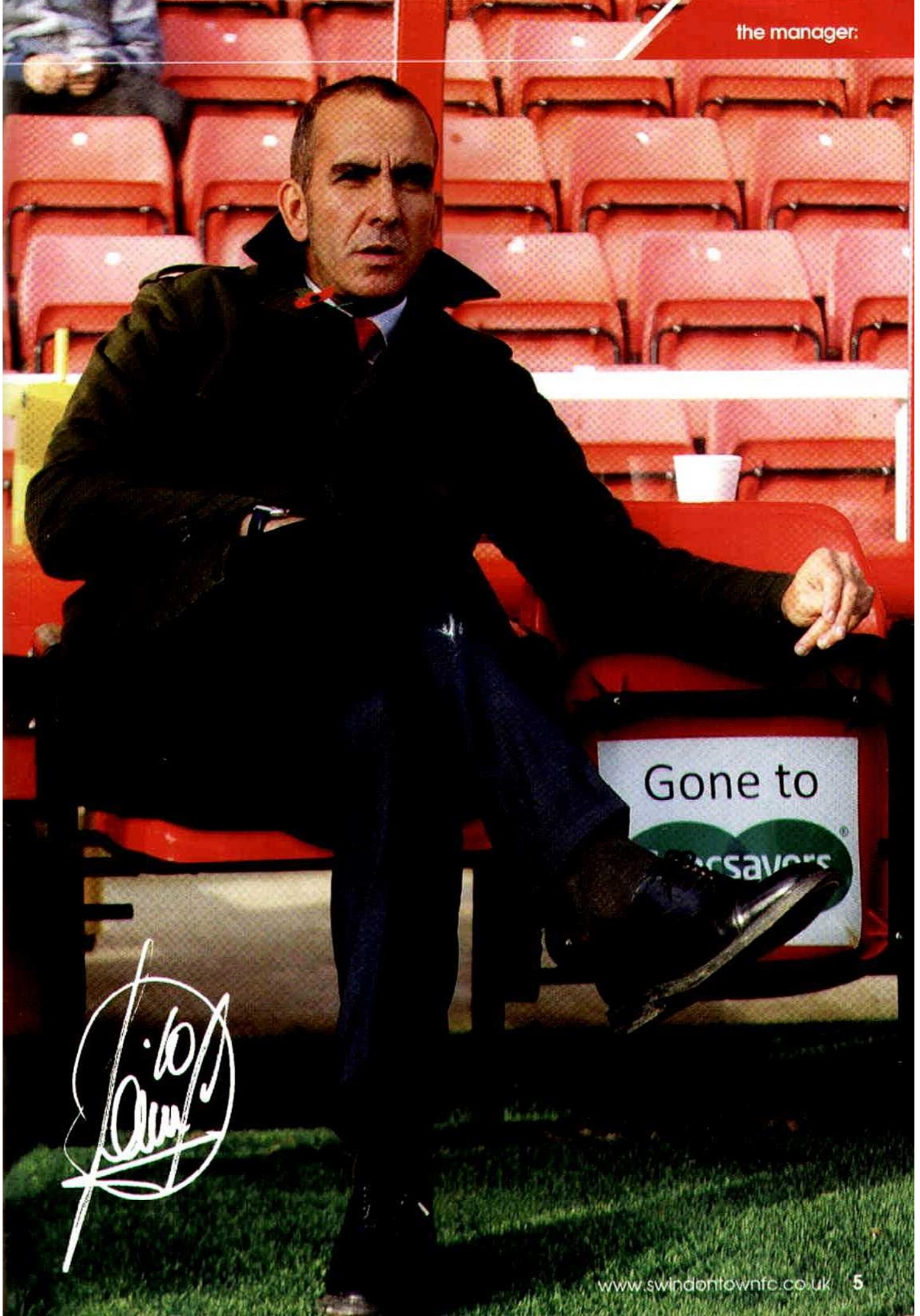

draw for round three has paired us with Colchester United and that's a good draw for us in my view. I think we can go to their place and get a win.

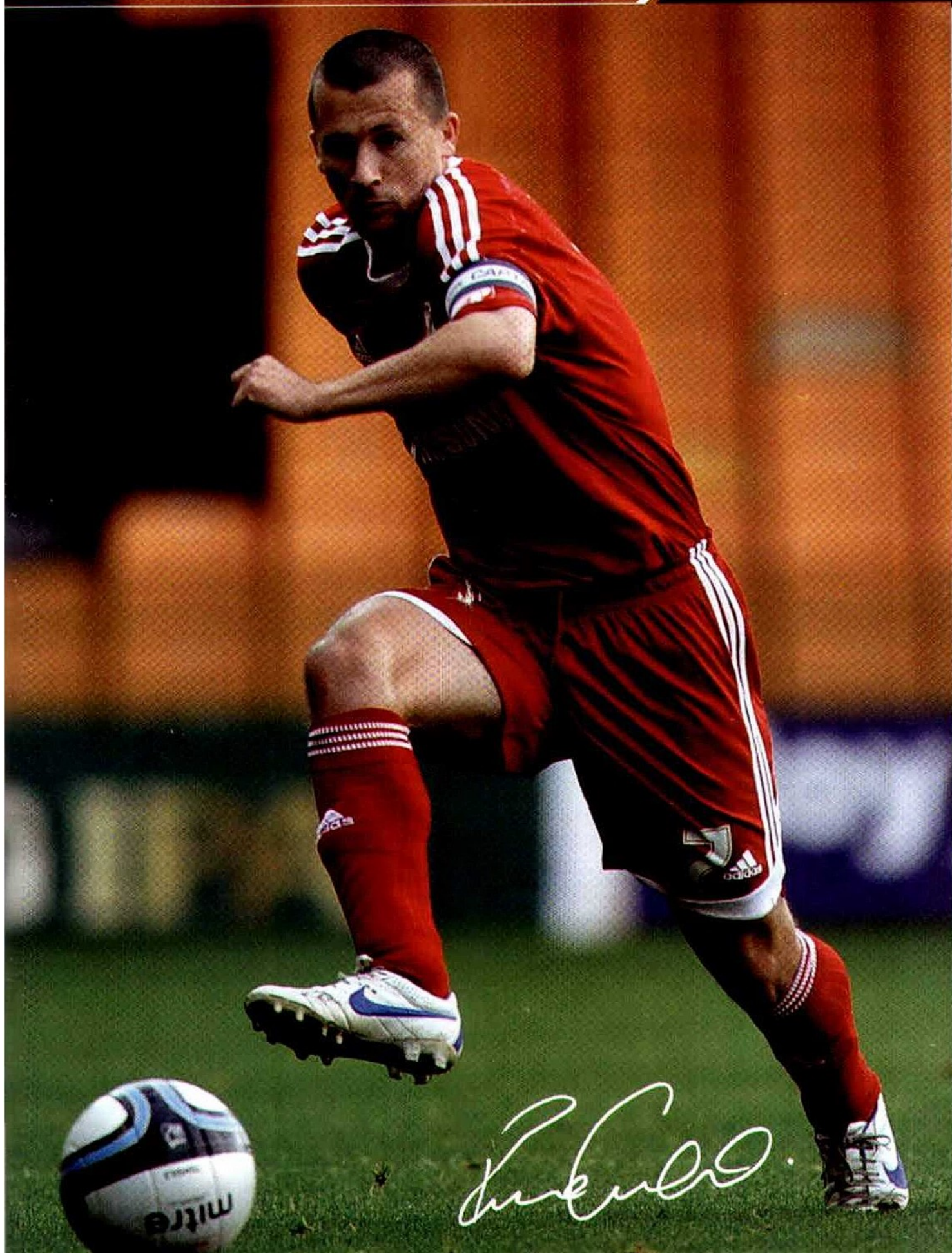

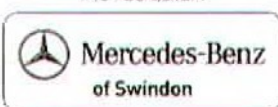

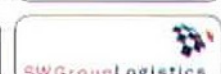

The FITC team have recently sent out a consignment of charity donations consisting of football boots and kits to be distributed amongst the football communities of Livingstone as well as schools around the area.

In addition, the scheme have ordered 100 hand-stitched footballs which are manufactured at the Alive & Kicking factory at Lusaka. The Football in the Community Trust would like to offer their sincere thanks to Gareth and Daniel John from Urban18, Freddy Austin (father of former Town player Charlie), Andy Davitt, Graham Davis, Craig Curtis

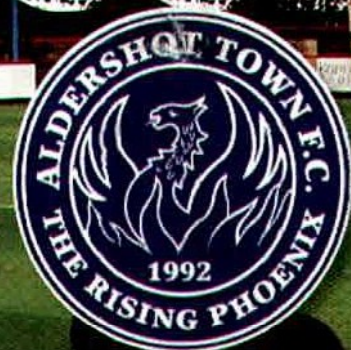

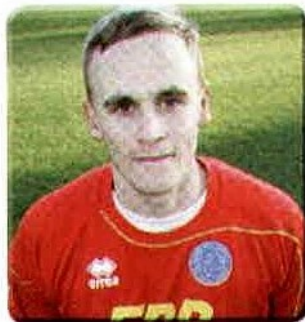




## aldershot town the shots

### James Collins...

**COLLINS** is a midfielder, but can also play at left-back and in central defence. He began his career at Watford, but never made a first team appearance and joined Havant and Waterlooville in February 2005. He captained the Conference South side through to an FA Cup fourth round tie at Liverpool, a game in which the Hawks led twice before eventually losing 5-2. He moved on to Newport County in 2009 and reunited with his former Exiles boss Dean Holdsworth at Aldershot Town in the summer.



### Jamie Day...

**ON** loan from Crawley Town, Day is a left-sided player who came through the ranks at Peterborough United. He made his senior debut whilst on loan at Crawley in early 2004 before returning to London Road, where he won promotion from League 2 in 2007/08. He joined Rushden and Diamonds in July 2010 before a switch to Crawley Town.

### Scott Davies...

**DAVIES** started his career in Reading's academy. He had season-long loans at Aldershot Town in 2007/08 during which he was part of the side that won the Blue Square Premier title and 2008/09. He made his debut for Reading against Nottingham Forest on the opening day of the 2009/10 Championship season, but was released by Reading in the summer of 2011 and joined Crawley Town before rejoining the Shots for a third loan spell in October.



### Adam Mekki...

**MEKKI** can play on the right-hand side of midfield, on the wing or as a forward. He was a member of the Shots' youth team that won the Hampshire Midweek Floodlit Cup in 2010 and had work experience loans at Zamaretto League Premier Division side Oxford City and Carshalton Athletic during the 2010/11 season.

### Hylton the hotshot

**ALDERSHOT** Town arrive at The County Ground with one of the division's leading marksmen amongst their ranks. 22-year old Danny Hylton has 12 goals to his name so far this term in all competitions, his most recent efforts being a brace in the home win over Crewe Alexandra at the end of October.

**THE** last transfer between Swindon Town and Aldershot Town was in May 2008 with defender Chris Blackburn joining the Shots on a free transfer. Since converted to a defensive midfielder, the 29-year old now plies his trade with Stockport County.



### Last meeting

**THE** last time Swindon Town met today's visitors was in October 2008 at Aldershot with penalties required for the Robins to secure a 7-6 win on penalties in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy. Goals from former Reading striker Simon Cox and Jerel Ifil saw the full-time score finish 2-2.







# Dean Holdsworth

## the gaffer

**HOLDSWORTH** began his playing days as an apprentice at Watford in 1986 before moving to Brentford in 1989. From there Wimbledon paid £720,000 for him in 1992 and he made 208 appearances in all competitions for the Dons during five years, scoring 76 goals.

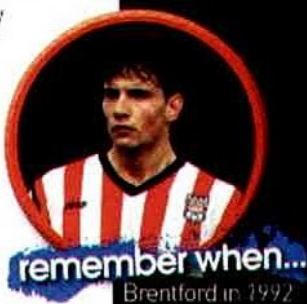
He moved from Wimbledon to Bolton Wanderers in 1997 for a record-setting £3.5 million fee and enjoyed six seasons with the Trotters. After a brief spell at Coventry he helped Rushden and Diamonds to promotion in 2003 and then returned to Wimbledon, where he played 30 games in 2003/04.

Holdsworth retired from professional football and signed for Havant & Waterlooville in June 2004.

His first season with the Hawks saw him voted Players' Player and Supporters' Player of the Year, having accrued 33 goals. He also stepped up to the role of assistant manager in February, sparking the revival of the side from their lowest point.

Two matches into the 2005/06 campaign he was offered the position of assistant manager at Derby County, and decided to leave to focus on his managerial career, however he returned to the Hawks for the start of the 2006/07 season after a stint helping Weymouth to promotion. He then left again in January 2007 having failed to find his fitness.

He hung his boots up in May 2008 to take on the manager's job at Conference South outfit Newport County. He became manager of Aldershot Town in January 2011.

# foderingham

"To come here and start the first seven games and keep clean sheets in five... it couldn't have gone much better."

**ARGUABLY** Paolo Di Canio's greatest move in the transfer market this season has been the loan capture of Crystal Palace goalkeeper, Wes Foderingham. Here, he reveals the players that inspire him, his favourite save and why he's not bad in front of goal...

**'WHAT** a save! Cast your mind back over the last seven games and remind yourself how many times you've uttered those words. Last Saturday there were two occasions, and that was just from the opposition fans. Wes Foderingham kept Town in the game at two crucial junctures. The first was a point-blank stop at full stretch following an AFC Wimbledon corner with the home side looking to extend their lead in the first half, the second saw Foderingham palm away a ball bound for the top corner shortly before Town scrambled home the equaliser.

Suffice to say Foderingham's loan spell has been a revelation. In five of his seven games he's kept a clean sheet and the clamour to secure his signature on a more permanent basis grows by the week.

**Ten games now unbeaten,  
Wes - you've been here for seven.**

**What was your reaction to last week's draw - a point gained or two dropped?**

We were a bit disappointed because we finished the game strongly. We felt we should have nicked it. It was a different story at half-time because we were a goal down, we probably would have taken a point at that stage.

Wimbledon seemed to be all over us all over the pitch. They were pressing well and it was a scrappy game. They didn't allow us to play football. They retained possession and their fans got on top of us. It was a tough away game. A point was probably a fair result and hopefully we'll look back on it as a good draw further down the line.

**Given how many clean sheets you've had were you frustrated by the scrappy nature of the goal conceded?**

I was absolutely incensed, to be honest. Not because we conceded

but the manner in which we allowed it to happen. There was a defensive mistake, a failure to clear the ball which has gone across our box and they've managed to get a shot off. It was a horrible way to concede, particularly because it was in the first ten minutes. That always makes it an uphill struggle away from home. We tend to come on strong in the last 10/15 minutes of games and had we kept it level until then I would have fancied us to win the game.

***Were you pleased with your performance?***

I was delighted, on a personal level. I had a lot more to do than recent weeks, so it felt good being able to make some crucial saves.

***Would you rather have less to do, even if it means you don't get a chance to make as many saves?***

I'd rather have a quiet game, yes. It's nice to make saves but goalkeepers are judged on how many goals they concede. I'm always pleased to make a difference when I can, but clean sheets mean the defence and I are doing our jobs.

***Are you pleased with the way the move has gone so far?***

I'm really enjoying it. I'm happy to be playing games. This is my first spell playing matches in front of big crowds, particularly at this level in the Football League. So to come here and start the first seven games and keep clean sheets in five... it couldn't have gone much better.

***Did you expect to go straight into the side when you arrived?***

If I'm honest I didn't expect to play straight away, no. When I first spoke to the manager he

said he couldn't guarantee me game time, so I wasn't sure if he'd throw me into the deep end or not. I started the game at Accrington and I think keeping a clean sheet helped my cause. If I can just keep playing and doing the right things I'll be happy.

***Would you like to stay beyond your initial loan spell?***

The Palace manager has told me he'd like me to stay as long as possible to gain experience, so I guess we'll see what happens in January and if Paolo is happy to keep me here. I'm happy to stay because I'm enjoying it.

It's probably too early to tell [what I'll do permanently]. My contract finishes at the end of the season and there have been brief talks about extending it, but nothing concrete.

***Tell us a bit about your career so far and how you ended up in Wiltshire...***

I started at Fulham and went through their academy. I played for England's U16s, U7s and U19s. I got released after my first year as a pro and I signed for Palace soon after. I've had loan spells at Bromley, which was the point where I felt I really kicked on as a goalkeeper, then again at Histon in the Blue Square Premier. That was a more challenging experience. They had money problems, the squad was young and within two games we'd been relegated.

At the start of this season I was playing for Palace's reserves when I got a call from my agent saying Swindon were interested. The club invited me to train for a couple of days. Paolo said he wanted to have a look with a view to a loan deal and, luckily, he thought I did well.

"If Paolo is happy to keep me here. I'm happy to stay because I'm enjoying it."





***What were your first impressions of Paolo?***

He's a very passionate man, which is good. I like a manager who can motivate his players in games and during training sessions. I think there's a fear factor with him as well, so everyone is out to impress. That helps. You don't want to cross him or make him upset and you know if you have a bad game you might be out of the team. That pushes you in every game and in all the training sessions.

***Tell us a bit about Domenico Doardo, the goalkeeping coach.***

He's similar to Paolo in that he's very thorough with his work. Before games he'll tell me about key players, what they're capable of from deliveries and set pieces. He does a lot of work for us. He always researches penalties and he was probably the unsung hero in the penalty win against AFC Wimbledon in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy. Phil [Smith] saved three penalties, so it was a combination of Phil and Domenico's hard work.

***Do you get on with the other goalkeepers? Is there a lot of competition?***

It's difficult because we all want to play but only one of us can. But there is a goalkeepers' union in which we all stick together. Whoever plays gets good support from the others, it's like a family in that respect. We have to look out for each other. Phil's a great professional and always gives me help and advice. Phil and Mattia are both probably upset they're not playing, but they just get on with it.

***What has been your favourite Swindon game so far? Your best save?***



Probably the save from the game last week... early in the first half, after they scored, there was a header at the near post which I managed to tip over the bar. I didn't know much about it but I got up thinking: 'I've done well there!' Playing in the FA Cup was also a great moment for me.

***Did it feel weird picking the ball out of the net in that FA Cup tie against Huddersfield? It was the first time you had to do it in Swindon colours.***


It was, but it was a good goal, so I couldn't complain. I was always going to concede at some stage, so at least it was a good goal.

***What would you say are your main attributes?***

I've been working on my presence as a goalkeeper. You need that; you can't afford to be shy or timid. You have to be confident. It comes easily if you're a confident person, but it can be hard if you're not, or if you're young going into a first team in the Football League for the first time. Coming in as a loan player when you don't know the players is tough, but we're all professionals and I have to do my job just as they have to do theirs. If they need shouting at, I'll do it! We're a team and we need to get the best out of each other. I've tried to come in and be strong and stay positive, your confidence builds with each good performance.

***You've had a solid back four in front of you, which must help?***

They've been fantastic. They've made my job easy, even made me look good! I've not played with such a solid back four since my academy days. The communication between them

has been excellent. Aden [Flint] wins everything in the air and he does well with high balls in the box when we're under pressure. Alan [McCormack] is also doing well, he's very comfortable. He's not the biggest but still wins a lot in the air.

***There seems a good team spirit, who do you get on well with?***

It's a tight group but you have individual friends you hang around with. I spend a lot of time with Jake [Jervis] and Liam [Ridehalgh] because we're all on loan - we're all going through the same experience. Jake and I are both on Twitter. It's probably not the pinnacle of our day, but it's always good fun. We all play a fair bit of FIFA as well. I've played Jake six times and I'm undefeated! I'm usually Barcelona, Jake Real Madrid.

***And you boys love a Nandos... Swindon seems to be missing a trick by not having one!***

I know. I was gutted and disappointed when I found that out. I think Nandos took up about a third of my day when I was living in London, so I'm going to have to mix it up a bit. They'd make a lot of money if they had one in Swindon!

***Do you feel settled here?***

I really like the area and the boys have made me very welcome. It's a nice place. The fans have been really supportive, too, which is good for the confidence.

***You've played for England at three levels; do you think a call-up for the U21s is possible in your current form?***

It would be nice. I'll be honest it's not one of my biggest priorities

because I've got a lot to focus on already, but if I keep playing well then you never rule it out. The aim is to keep improving and if it comes along I'd be over the moon. It's a great honour to play for your country, but some players play for the U21s and fizzle out. If I had to choose I'd rather maintain good form at club level.

***Who are your goalkeeping heroes?***

David James. He made a lot of errors earlier in his career but he never let it get to him. He always came back strong. If any other player makes a mistake it doesn't usually lead to a goal, but it does if it's a goalkeeper. You have to have the quality to put errors behind you if you do make a mistake, a cool mind, and James was really good at that. More recently, I liked Shay Given. I'd say my attributes are fairly similar to his.

***What's the best save you've ever seen?***

It was by Gregory Coupet [France & Lyon]. It was a weird save. Someone made a back pass which went over his head. He couldn't handle it, so he's done a diving header to get it onto the cross bar. As he's got up a striker has won the rebound and volleyed it into what looked like the bottom corner, but Coupet got up and saved again.

***Paul Robinson earned Blackburn a penalty last weekend with his head. Have you ever ventured that far forward?***

I scored once at U14s level. It was against Tottenham. The ball's come to me and I've chested it, then a Cruyff turn and put it into the top corner - great strike! I still talk about it!

# - classic encounters - downing the shots

**THE** Robins upset the form book to produce a fine display at The County Ground to brush aside the challenge of visitors Aldershot. The home side made a bright start to the game, racing into a 5-0 lead at half-time...

**SWINDON** Town rarely looked like a side hovering just above the relegation zone as they tore into the visitors from the first whistle and, even without top scorer Peter Eastoe, had raced to a 5-0 lead by half-time.

The Shots made a game of it in the second half, scoring three times through Ronnie Walton (twice) and Pat Morrissey, with former Town striker Jack Howarth selling up two. But Dave Moss finished off a move he had started six minutes from time to seal victory for the hosts.

The winger set up Swindon's first two goals, the first coming inside forty seconds. Jim Wallace's

poor clearance fell to Dave Syrett who notched his fifth in as many games.

And another centre from Moss resulted in Will Dixon - later to join the Hampshire club - slotting home from five yards.

Five minutes later, the visitors were in trouble again when Syrett's mazy run was halted by Wallace and Trevor Anderson (pictured top left) stroked home the resulting penalty.

Moss registered assist number three when his corner was neatly controlled by Kenny Stroud, who then rifled the ball past Glenn Johnson for his third goal in successive games.

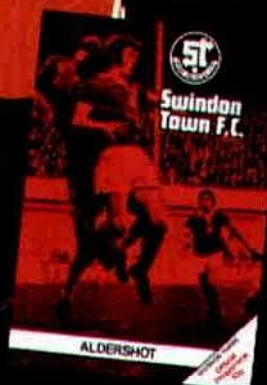
A fourth goal in 16 minutes, just before the interval, came when Morrissey impeded the foraging Moss and Anderson again placed his spot kick out of the keeper's reach.

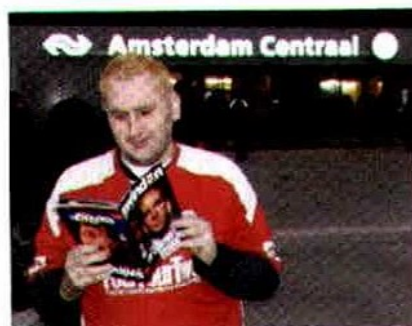
