Charlie Ademeno...

22-YEAR OLD Ademeno signed for the Dons in the summer after spending an unsuccessful year with Grimsby Town, where he made just 12 league appearances, scoring twice. A striker with pace, he began his career as a trainee with Southend United before five spells out on loan including a double stint at Salisbury City. He scored five goals in 11 starts for the Whites towards the back end of the 2008/09 season but has just one goal to his name so far this term.



Lee Minshull...

A tough-tackling midfielder who signed from Tonbridge Angels in May 2010, Minshull got his career going as a centre-back at Ramsgate. When he joined Tonbridge in 2009 he moved into an attacking midfield role and scored 17 times in 40 appearances, finishing the season as second top scorer and being voted Player of the Year for 2009/10.

Kieran Djilali...

DJILALI joined AFC Wimbledon in the summer after coming through the ranks with Crystal Palace. He made eight appearances for the Eagles during the 2008/09 season and made his Football League debut in the home clash against Burnley in August 2008. He then spent loan spells at Crawley and Chesterfield to gain invaluable first team experience before departing Selhurst Park in the summer of this year. He has pace, quick feet and good close control.

THE centreback joined Brentford as a trainee in July 2008 and was soon converted to a central role, having played much of his youth football at right-back. He signed professional forms a year later, but despite being on the bench on several occasions he failed to make a first-team appearance. He signed for the Dons in July 2010.

Garrard made 17 appearances for Town after joining the youth team ranks from Spurs. He went on to make 114 appearances for AFC Wimbledon between 2006

APPOINTED as AFC Wimbledon's first full-time manager in May 2007, Brown's managerial career rose to prominence during a nine-year spell in charge of Hayes, whom he took from the lower half of the Ryman Premier Division to third place in the Conference in 1999. His record at Hayes included 82 wins from 232 games in charge.

He moved onto Aldershot Town in 2002 and in his five years in charge at the Recreation Ground he steered the Shots to a Ryman Premier League title and a 2004 Conference Playoff Final where they were agonisingly denied a Football League place losing a penalty shootout to Shrewsbury Town.

Brown left Aldershot amidst emotional scenes in March 2007 but was soon able to return to football and along with trusted lieutenant Stuart Cash, the pair lifted the Dons into League 2 at the first attempt last summer.

The 2011/12 season began with a narrow 3-2 defeat at home to Bristol Rovers before their first triumph of the campaign came the following Saturday with a 2-0 victory at Dagenham & Redbridge.

The Dons lost out to Swindon in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy earlier this season before a 1-1 draw between the sides at Kingsmeadow in League 2.





MAY I start by wishing you all a happy and healthy New Year.



THE signs already look promising in 2012 for Town. If it wasn't for the upturn in fortune in the final few months of 2011. we'd probably be saying that it'll go down as a year to forget. Relegation to League Two was tough to stomach but I think it was the manner in which Swindon capitulated that really left a bad taste in everyone's mouth. They seemed to disappear without a whimper: no final day survival push, no fight, no desire, no heart. In truth, I think everyone would have been happy if 2011, from a footballing perspective, had drawn to a close back in April.

The arrival of Paolo Di Canio in May last year was a calculated gamble by the club. Something was needed to inject a new lease of life into The County Ground and frankly, that arrived by the bucket load with the appointment of Di Canio. The first few weeks of the season were always going to be tricky; and so it proved. Di Canio was finding his feet in management; players were arriving from across the globe in their droves. The club were entering uncharted territory compared to those around them in League Two.

The opening day win against Crewe had some believing that Swindon were going to breeze straight back into League One without even getting their hands dirty. For most, including the manager, the reality of the task was far more complicated. It was a tough baptism of fire and there have been low points along the way - the defeat


here against Oxford leads the list. The real test of any side, or indeed situation, is not to dwell on how it happened but by showing how you intend to respond to it. In Swindon's case, the character displayed in the closing months of this calendar year has been quite remarkable.

The recent 15 game unbeaten run, progression to the Area Final of the JPT and a tie against a Premier League club in the FA Cup this weekend suggests the past few months have been littered with success. While 2011 will forever be blemished with the tag of relegation, it was also the year that allowed a foundation to be constructed for what could be a very memorable 2012.

Puttytoot Photography. PA Photos. Gareth Williams LOAN striker Ronan Murray is looking to start the New Year with a flourish and get Swindon Town – and a key stage of his career - off to a flyer.

REGARDLESS of the final outcome of Swindon Town's 2011/12 season, supporters will look back at the contribution of Paolo Di Canio's loan acquisitions with fond memories. Goalkeeper Wes Foderingham has been a revelation in goal since joining from Crystal Palace, Liam Ridehalgh has added consistency to the defence while Jake Jervis has been a key player in attack. And should the Robins succeed in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy by reaching the final or even going all the way and winning at Wembley, Di Canio will be forever indebted to Ronan Murray.

Town were a goal down in the Southern Area Semi-Final against Paul Sturrock's then league leaders Southend United at Roots Hall before Paul Caddis' equaliser and a late winner from Murray sealed a dramatic victory.

"I was due to come on when we were 1-0 down, but 'Cad' [Paul Caddis] scored and the gaffer delayed bringing me on for about another ten minutes," explains Murray.

"He wanted to see how the game panned out. When the gaffer eventually brought me on he just said: 'Do your best and get us that goal'. Luckily enough I did and I must admit it was better coming on at 1-1 than 1-0 down because the momentum was with us after the equaliser. That made it easier for me; you could feel the confidence going through the team."

That confidence has continued to grow for both club and player. The 3-0 home victory against Morecambe saw Town extend their unbeaten run and Murray bag his second goal - a precise effort through a sea of legs following Matt Ritchie's cutback, to complete a fine team move - since making the temporary switch from Ipswich Town.

"The goal against Morecambe was probably better, but the one in the cup was definitely the more important of the two," explains the Irishman. "The goal at Southend meant more to the

team. We had managed to get back into the game having been behind and to win it like that ... we were all buzzing afterwards. Plus it was a header, and I don't get too many of them!" he laughs. "I just don't get many opportunities. What I try and do is take defenders away and move them around for others to get on the end of crosses and finish them off. My job is simply to buzz around and cause havoc!

Scoring a goal always makes things easier for a new player. The lads had been brilliant with me from day one up until that game, but that felt like my way of re-paying both them and the fans for welcoming me here."

Murray's loan spell is set to end on January 14 unless the two clubs agree an extension. Di Canio will certainly hope Murray can wreak further havoc before he returns to his parent club. Certainly, when the Italian boss captured the 20-year old in mid-December he was excited about Murray's potential.

"We have been missing a player like him," said Di Canio ahead of Murray's arrival. "He offers something different. He is quick, nasty in that he is a competitor, and he is an Ireland Under-21 international. When we counterattack we need a player who can attack the space and who has courage. He is the kind of player who can get into that position, twist and turn and then smash the ball into the goal."

Murray's speed and predatory instincts have already served Di Canio well, but the move has worked both ways.

"There is a great strikeforce here. All the players have their own attributes and they're all different nationalities. I've learned a lot from different players at

Ipswich and I'm learning new things here, too. The gaffer is brilliant in the training sessions. He's all about technique. He has a different mentality which means he speaks to players individually and gives everyone time and attention. It's brilliant. And because he was a great player you listen to everything he says. You always listen to what coaches tell you, but when someone like him pays so much attention to detail to things you feel you're getting more. His approach worked for him as a player and we can all identify with him because we grew up watching him on TV. We've seen what he can do first hand, so it's important to listen to what he has to say."

Murray suggests there isn't much between Swindon Town and Ipswich Town apart from the obvious differences between the divisions the two clubs play in. His previous experience of League Two came at Torquay United last season and while he admits that particular opportunity was beneficial, he's finding Swindon an altogether different proposition, one he hopes will prepare him for any






opportunities that may follow his eventual return to Suffolk.

"There isn't a massive difference in the level of football," he continues. "The standard is simply a bit higher when it comes to the quality of the end product. For example, a League Two player might take a player on but not deliver a final ball, whereas in the Championship the quality of the cross will also be good.

"There are differences between Swindon and Torquay," he continues. "There is a much bigger fan base here and the club seems more stable and more suited to League One or higher. Torquay have limits but I have no doubt that if Swindon got promoted they'd not only stay up, they'd compete. There is a really strong team spirit here as well. I felt from day one that everyone is on a bit of a high. I'm very lucky to come into a team that's winning games and high on confidence. Everyone was very friendly and Alan [McCormack] in particular helped introduce me, a fellow Irishman, to the lads. Of course, every club has their own approach





but I have been impressed by the level of professionalism for a League Two side. All the backroom staff are Italian and they have their own way of doing things, you just have to buy into that. It's been really good. I'm enjoying the experience and I have to say the fitness levels are very high. For me, the move has been brilliant so far. Two goals in four games, you can't really ask for more than that, so I'm just looking to kick on into the next game, and the one after that."

Murray has chosen a good time to go out on loan. The congested Christmas and New Year period means he will have had the opportunity to figure in nine games in his month-long spell.

"There are so many games," he says. "You never know what's going to happen with injuries and people being rested, so it's a great time to be here. This is when any squad comes together because there will be tiredness and injuries. The players who might not have played as many minutes as others are important at this time of year. All I can do is keep my head down, work hard and try and do my bit."

Murray will be hoping that if he can keep scoring he'll have the opportunity to start in the FA Cup third round tie against Wigan Athletic on Saturday. Every member of the Swindon playing squad will be keen to test themselves against Premier League opposition, something Murray did last year when the Tractor Boys' lost 7-0 against Chelsea at the same stage last season.

"That was an experience and a half!" he laughs. "I can't believe it's been a year since then, this year has really flown. Chelsea had their strongest team out on the

day and there were 46,000 inside Stamford Bridge. It was strange playing against players like Frank Lampard, but you had to try and do your job for the team. It was a great experience to play against players of that calibre."


Ultimately Murray hopes he can take on quality players every week with Ipswich at Championship level. Beyond that, he harbours international ambitions. He's represented the Republic of Ireland at numerous levels including the Under-21s. For now, though, he admits establishing himself at club level is his priority and he's focusing on a strong second half of the season before putting his feet up and watching Giovanni Trapattoni's senior team compete at this summer's Euros.

"It'll be great to watch us out there because Ireland is in a bit of a state at the minute and it's something for people back home to look forward to. They always go mad during a tournament, so hopefully the team will do well and people can party while it's going on. Ireland had a tough group. At least now we're able to try and put that handball incident against France to the back of our minds!" Murray grimaces when he recalls Thierry Henry's controversial goal during Ireland's World Cup qualifying play-off defeat against France in 2009.

"I was actually on international duty in eastern Europe that night and the team were all gathered round the TV watching. We couldn't believe what we were seeing! It was unbelievable. But that's the way it goes, you win some you lose some!"

One thing's for sure, while Murray remains in the Swindon squad Di Canio will be hoping his side wins more than he loses.

MANAGER John Trollope had four new signings on view for this opening day clash,

which was the first to be worth three points to the winners.

Gary Emmanuel came from
Bristol Rovers in exchange for
Brian Williams, with Mike Graham
and Craig Moores both arriving
from Bolton Wanderers. The
fourth, Gary Williams – signed
just three days earlier from
Blackpool – and Town graduate
Brian Hughes were the stars in
a comprehensive home victory.
Williams' raids down the left set
up two of the goals while Hughes,
aged just 19, scored one and had
two assists.

Williams' pin point cross was met by a Roy Carter header at the far post to give Swindon a 15th minute lead. And another on 63 minutes saw the unchallenged Hughes put the hosts 3-0 up. The young midfielder had feed up Town's second nine minutes after the break. His clever back-heef from a free-kick allowed Graham to bend the

ball round the delensive wall and into the top corner. Steve Ketteridge reduced the arrears with 15 minutes to go, but the three-goal cushion was quickly restored when a stinging 15-yard.

shot from Hughes

was nonchalantly diverted past covering defenders and the unsighted Dave Beasant by Roy Greenwood

The unbeaten start was extended to five league games before inconsistency reigned as just three points were taken in 11 games from mid-October. And a final day defeat at Newport consigned Town to relegation, along with Wimbledon.



SWINDON Town Football in the Community Trust has recently returned from Zambia after completing a six-day coaching programme in Livingstone



THE five-person coaching team worked with over 300 youngsters and 35 Zambia Association coaches during their visit to Africa with the word of Swindon Town Football Club being spread far and wide.

The week started with the STFITC learn delivering a coaching session to local Under 17 Tearn, Nirmala FC on Monday evening with the evening being complete with a STFITC 11-a-side match with the tearn.

Tuesday saw the launch of the Zambia Coaches Association Workshop with the association receiving their new STFC coaching tracksuits before taking the field for the practical element of the workshop. In the evening the STFiTC team delivered coaching practices to 20 local females and local Under 14 side Nirmala FC.

Wednesday saw the Zambia Coaches Association Workshop completed with all the coaches returning to go through another set of warm up drills and technical sessions. The coaches also went away with a new set of Swindon Town coaching kit and essential coaching material. The evening saw the local Under 17's girls and boys return for their second coaching session.

Thursday saw Jon, Beth and Clive deliver a one-hour coaching session to local school, Nakitindi. The team worked with over 20 children at the school whilst also getting a village tour by local coach Charles. Luke and Tim were at Bhurati Sports Ground for a skills-based session. The children also went away with a football shirt each from the donations delivered to Zambia the week before.

The coaching programme in Zambia was completed on Friday with 16 teams of Under 17's Boys and 5 under 17's Girls teams taking part in the 2nd STFiTC Festival of Football. The 21 teams all received a donation box consisting of a full playing kit, t shirts, junior and adult football boots and trainers.

Amit Rama, who was instrumental in the STFiTC coaching programme, was presented with a Swindon Town first team shirt which is now proudly displayed in the clubhouse at Bhurati Sports Ground.

Saturday evening saw the STFiTC team and Coaches from the Zambian Coaches Association come together to celebrate the week's success. STFiTC were presented with individual gifts including a handmade beaded STFC logo whilst all Zambian Coaches received their certificate recognition for their attendance to the Coaching Workshop. One hundred hand-stitched Alive and Kicking footballs were distributed to each individual team coach and to various schools and youth groups throughout the coaching programme.





swindon town of Canada

THE first three members of the STFC Hall of Fame were inducted at the last home game against Morecambe. Today, the second set of legends will join the Hall of Fame and here are their profiles ahead of their induction.

MAURICE OWEN made an immediate impact with Swindon, scoring a hat-trick on his first appearance. A one-club man, he went on to make 601 appearances which is the second highest number in the club's history. His playing career stretched from 1947 to 1963 and he brought the curtain down on his playing days in fine style as club captain of the first ever Swindon promotion winning side.

During his career he scored no fewer than 165 goals making him the fourth highest scorer in the club's history. This is a record made more noteworthy by the fact that he was the club's leading scorer in six seasons. When his playing career was over he showed his versatility when serving the club as assistant secretary, trainer and groundsman. An England 'B' international, he turned down the opportunity to move to more fashionable clubs in higher divisions in order to stay loyal to Swindon Town.

ROGER SMART was a Swindonborn player who rose up through the ranks and went on to make 411 appearances between 1962 and 1973. Among the 59 goals he scored for the club were two of the most memorable in its history. First, his last-minute effort against Shrewsbury in 1963 clinched promotion for the first time in Swindon's history. Then in 1969, he scored the first goal at Wernbley which set Town on the road to victory over Arsenal.

A youngster who scored five goals in just ten outings in the club's first promotion winning campaign of 1962/63 he was a seasoned professional in Danny Williams side of 1968/69 which achieved the double of League Cup and promotion. The following year he was an ever-present in the Town side that finished fifth in Division Two.

JOE BUTLER signed for Swindon from his native Newcastle in 1965. Signed as a full-back he soon settled down to the role in defensive midfield. a role in which he featured in Swindon's double season of 1968/69 when they wan promotion and the League Cup. Between 1965 and 1976 he made 428 appearances and despite being used in a mainly defensive capacity still managed to weigh in with 22 goals. He was ever present in the 1969/70 Season in which Swindon secured fifth place in Division Two, the highest in the club's history, and won the Anglo Italian Cup Winners Cup and the

Anglo Italian Inter league Cup. His efforts in this season won him the accolade of being Town's Player of the Year, an award he was to win again in the 1972/73 Season. His tireless running and ability to pop up when most needed earned him the nickname 'Zebedee' among his fellow professionals. Danny Williams rated him one of his best ever signings and the recommendation he came with of being a great little competitor certainly proved true and earned him a richly deserved testimonial game in 1975.

ALAN McLOUGHLIN was signed from Manchester United in 1986 and he made a big impact playing 135 games and scoring 24 goals from midfield. in 1989/90 he scored no fewer than 12 goals during the league season. He scored the play-off final winner against Sunderland at Wembley - earning Town a brief promotion to the top-flight. Pushed back into the second tier by the Football League the following season, McLoughlin was sold to Southampton for a club record fee of £1 million. His appearances as a substitute for the Republic of Ireland against Egypt and England made him the first Swindon player to appear in a World Cup and he went on to win 42 caps.
