

AFTER a busy few weeks of football in League 2 today we find ourselves in the third round of the FA Cup against Premier League opposition. Today will be a good test for us, but also hopefully a great day for Swindon Town FC.

NEW signing Paul Benson hopes his experience can help the Robins secure promotion from League Two at the first attempt.



THE 32-year old frontman became Paolo Di Canio's first addition of the January transfer window and having helped Dagenham & Redbridge out of the division, Benson is hoping to call upon his experience to help Town to success.

"There were a few clubs interested but I made it clear to my previous club and my agent that Swindon Town was where I wanted to be and now hopefully I can repay Paolo and the club for

their faith in me," he said.

"My League Two experience will hopefully contribute towards the club and team. The promotion experience I have is something which I will try to pass on to other players who may not have it."

Benson is hoping to make his mark in the cup too, with the Robins still fighting on two fronts and a quick return to Wembley is a distinct possibility for the striker.

"I am available for both the

FA Cup and Johnstone's Paint Trophy so hopefully I will be able to play some sort of part in those competitions. With the possibility of reaching Wembley in the JPT and playing a Premier League side in the FA Cup it's a great time to join.

"This year has already started so much better for me than last year. I'm hoping to put 2011 behind me and I am really looking forward to getting my Swindon career up and running."



Conor Sammon...

THE Striker joined Latics on deadline day January 2011. The Latics managed to persuade him to join the club from Kilmarnock where he was the second leading scorer in the SPL. His senior career began at the University College of Dublin before a brief spell at Derry City. After a short trial with Kilmarnock, he made the switch to Scotland in July 2008. Before his move to Wigan, his record in the SPL in the 2010/11 season was prolific with 18 goals in 27 games.



Gary Caldwell...

JOINED Wigan Athletic in January 2010 on a four-and-a-half year deal from Glasgow Celtic. The Stirling-born centre-half started his career as a trainee at Newcastle United, and after a number of loan spells joined Scottish outfit Hibernian in 2004. Caldwell spent two-and-a-half years at Easter Park before moving to boyhood club Glasgow Celtic in 2006.

Mohamed Diame...

THE 24-year old French midfielder joined the club in August 2009 from Spanish outfit Rayo Vallecano along with team-mate Antonio Amaya. His signature was confirmed just hours before making his debut at home against Manchester United, in which he made an impressive performance. An athletic, strong and tactically astute central-midfielder, Diame had been courted by the likes of Barcelona, Real Madrid and Arsenal before the Latics decided to make the move and secure his services. He has made 82 league starts for the Latics so far, scoring four times.



Emmerson Boyce...

THE 28-year old defender followed Fitz Hall from Crystal Palace in the summer of 2006 to sign a four-year contract. Primarily a right-back, the Aylesbury-born defender can also play in the centre or right side of the back four. He began his career with Luton Town before signing for the Eagles in 2004.



Played for both

THE last transfer between the two clubs saw Gareth Whalley join the Robins from Wigan back in 2005, whilst the likes of Paul Mitchell (loan), Andy Mutch, Alan McLoughlin, Peter Thorne and former Town boss Danny Wilson are amongst those to have played for the Latics and represented Swindon.



Head to Head

THERE have been a total of ten games between Swindon Town and Wigan Athletic with the Robins victorious in three of those encounters. The last of those came in January 2003 with goals from Danny Invincible and Andy Gurney securing the Division Two win.

roberto martinez

the gaffer


MARTÍNEZ realised his ambition of becoming manager of Wigan Athletic in June 2009.

Born in Balaguer, Catalonia, Martínez began his playing career at his home-town club CF Balaguer in the Spanish Third Division before moving to Real Zaragoza in La Liga where he made his senior debut.

He was offered the chance to move to England by Chairman, Dave Whelan and he signed on a free transfer on 25 July 1995, joining fellow Spaniards Jesús Seba and Isidro Díaz. Martínez spent six seasons at Wigan, making 180 appearances for the club scoring 23 goals.

Released on a free transfer by Steve Bruce, Martínez signed for Scottish club Motherwell in July 2001 but made only eight appearances, plus eight more as substitute, before moving back to England to join Walsall on a free transfer in August 2002. He then had spells with Swansea City and Chester City before becoming Swansea manager in February 2007. In total he won 63 out of 126 games in charge of the Swans before returning to The DW Stadium to take over as manager.

Martínez could have taken an opportunity to leave Wigan in the summer of 2011 but instead elected to stay and continue the work he has started at the DW Stadium.

AS exciting as today's game is, Swindon have bigger fish to fry.

WITH any cup tie comes the standard string of emotions. Those most commonly associated with the FA Cup include hope, heightened belief and an unwavering urge for success. Throw in the added ingredient of a David versus Goliath encounter and you've got yourself a recipe for a tasty afternoon of football. Let's face it – everyone loves a good ol' 'Cup-set'.

I think it's important though that the FA Cup doesn't impede too much on the bigger picture for Town. League 2 games in January against Rotherham, Macclesfield and Southend perhaps don't carry the same wow factor as that of a Premier League side visiting The County Ground but, in terms of importance to Swindon's season, there is simply no comparison.

No-one expected Swindon to get to the Third Round of the FA Cup. Two ties against League One sides (one of which, at the time, carried a seemingly untouchable record) were considered to be bonus matches rather than a nail on chance for progression. Yet the ease by which Huddersfield and Colchester were disposed of suggests Swindon's period in League Two will be a rather



short one. The unfortunate fact of the matter is that Swindon can knock as many so-called 'better teams' out of Cup competitions as they like this season (not forgetting Bristol City and Exeter), it won't secure them promotion back to where they belong unless the form is replicated in the league. Thankfully, of late, it has been.

Wigan won't fancy this game today. They've got an important month of Premier League football and their midweek defeat to Sunderland will be of some concern I'm sure. The last thing they'll want right now is a trip to a packed County Ground to play an in-form League

Two side. Swindon shouldn't play with any fear – recent wins over AFC Wimbledon and Northampton have left them in a healthy position in the table and they'll no doubt see today as a bonus match.

In truth, it'll be tough for Swindon to get a result this afternoon. There has been a growing swell of belief from fans this week in the lead up to the match that they can cause an old-fashioned Cup upset. I see no reason to disagree but I'd far rather trade a famous win today for three more victories in the league this month. Still, no reason why we can't have both...

THE FA Cup has been kind to Jonathan Smith in recent seasons. The midfielder has reached the third round with both Forest Green Rovers and York City and this year he's looking to go one better...

What was your reaction when Swindon Town and Wigan Athletic were pulled out during the draw last month to ensure today's home tie?

I was pretty excited, to be honest. Obviously it's good to get a home draw and to get a Premier League team as well, you can't really ask for any more. Wigan have a lot of quality players including a number of internationals, so we know it's going to be a very hard game. There's no doubt we'll have to be at our absolute best to win and get a result. I've been taking a bit more of an interest in watching them on Match of the Day and they've got some very good attacking players. It's going to be very difficult, but we think we're capable of winning.

The support the team has received has been great, what part can the fans play today?

With it being a cup tie as well the crowd will get behind us, which could help. Our fans have been good all season but this

will be a big home crowd. If we can play to our best it should make for a good atmosphere, which could help us get the win. We've enjoyed good followings home and away this season, but hopefully this will be one to really enjoy. I'm looking forward to it because the nature of a cup game can make for a more exciting atmosphere.

You've reached the third round on two occasions but never the fourth. Will it be a case of third time lucky?

The FA Cup has been a lucky competition for me. I've reached the third round every time I've taken part, so it has produced some good times! But to beat a Premier League team, with Swindon, would be the biggest achievement so far. We're looking to win the game and try and go as far as we can in the competition. You always see teams from lower leagues go a long way, sometimes even the quarter-finals, so why not us?

After today's cup encounter there is the first of two legs of the JPT final against Barnet followed by a number of key league games. Do you see this as a defining month in our season?

The league is our main priority. That is our main objective and so consistency in the league is important. If we can do well in the cups as well it'll be a bonus. The manager won't let us take our focus away from the main job, but when the cup games come we'll be focused on those. We obviously have a huge chance of playing at Wembley and only a small number of the squad have done that before. It's a stage any player wants to play on.

Our last win at The County Ground in 2011 came against your former employers, Morecambe. Did you enjoy getting one over some of your old team-mates?

I was pleased we got the win, particularly after what happened a week earlier at Bristol Rovers. We all let ourselves down in that game and it was crucial we got a win under our belts. Whoever we played [when we played Morecambe] would have taken a bit of a backlash from the Rovers game!

For me personally, yes, it was nice to get the win. I have a lot to thank Morecambe for in terms of the opportunities they gave me at the start of my career. But it was nice to beat them.

Do you see the criticism that followed the draw against Bristol Rovers as a sign of progress? Everyone seemed so disappointed with what was a draw against our local rivals, which could be seen as a point gained.

Possibly. I think from the lads' point of view we just felt we didn't play as well as we could have done or had been doing in the run up to that game. The manager knows what we're capable of and he wants us to play to our potential every week, not just the odd match. On the day we were lucky to get the draw, so it might have been a good point in the end.

Is it hard to play at a high standard every week?

I think the thing for the gaffer is that if you can't play at that level every week then you're out of the team. He's hard on us but very fair. If you play well you stay in the side but if you're quality level drops you're out, and that's the way it should be. It's simple. He doesn't make excuses for any player.

You're a regular in the team now compared to earlier in the season. What's changed?

It's positive for me to be playing every week at this level. I'm lucky to be playing with some very good players, but I know that if I don't play to my best someone else will take my place. That means

that I've got to work as hard as I possibly can to make sure I impress the manager and keep my place.


You seem to have forged a decent working relationship with Simon Ferry...

He's a top midfielder with great quality. People see him as a character off the field but he works really hard on the pitch, particularly in training. He's been one of the best players this season and I'm not surprised given the quality he has. You've seen what sort of damage he can do all over the pitch as well as going forward. It's a pleasure to play with him. He brings the best out of me and I think we work very hard for each other. It's a good partnership. Whoever has played in the centre has done well this season, but obviously I would like to stay there as long as I can.

You were one of the manager's first signings, what do you remember about the move?

"Whoever I'm playing against, whether it's a Wigan player or anyone else, I just want to win the battle and do my bit for the team."





As soon as I was given the opportunity to come here I was desperate to sign, desperate. I was eager to not only test myself at this level but to come to a big team like Swindon. York City was a good opportunity for me, but Swindon are on another level. There were other Football League teams interested in me last season but they were smaller teams who were struggling. Swindon have got a big stadium, get big crowds and they have the ambition to match – it's the sort of challenge I've worked hard to get to.

In an earlier interview this season you said it took time adapting to League Two. Do you feel like a League Two player now?

There's more to come from me, but I'm pleased to be playing regularly, for a decent team and under a good manager. I've got to keep working hard. I'm hungry to succeed, which is why I came down here.

You certainly haven't struggled with the fitness regime and in some games you appear to cover every blade of grass. Has fitness always come naturally?

Yes, I've always been naturally fit but I'm not afraid of hard work. I've always done extra training to try and get ahead, so I'm not afraid to push myself. I always do whatever I can to try and gain something extra on the pitch. When I was playing in the Conference I felt that extra something could be the difference to making the step up. Working hard doesn't bother me at all.

And you love getting stuck in!

Sometimes I'm guilty of the odd rash challenge [laughs]! Once you're out on the pitch there are one-to-one battles all over the pitch that you want to win for the team. I want to win the ball. I never go out to hurt anyone; I just try and win the ball back. In the Conference there were some big players but I never felt intimidated. Whoever I'm playing against, whether it's a Wigan player or anyone else, I just want to win the battle and do my bit for the team. No-one scares me.

You say there's more to come... can you elaborate? What areas of your game do you feel need strengthening?

There are definitely things I can improve on. Sometimes my passing could be better and I need to be better on the ball. Everyone wants to get on the scoresheet as well, but to be honest I'm just happy playing in the team every week. Playing with such good players, the chances in front of goal will come. My game plan is just to keep my head down, work hard and hopefully certain areas will automatically improve.

We're at the halfway stage of the campaign. Which team or players have impressed you?

No-one has stood out. Gillingham were a good team and I think they'll be up there, but I honestly haven't seen anyone who I think is as strong as we are. We have a big, strong squad. There is good depth to it and you've got two players in every position. Not just two players, but players of equal ability meaning there is competition for places everywhere.

SWINDON Town were 3-2 winners at Wigan back in May 1987 with Peter Coyne netting the winner in what was a classic encounter.

HAVING finished in third place in Division 3, one place and two points ahead of Wigan, Town travelled to Springfield Park on a Thursday evening for the first leg of the first ever League play-offs.

Swindon made four changes from the side that had lost 3-2 there seven weeks earlier, including left-sided midfielder Steve Berry who was making only his second appearance for the club. But there was no change in how Town started. In the previous game Bobby Campbell had given Wigan a third-minute lead and this time it was his strike partner Chris Thompson, who was allowed space and time to crack a 20 yard drive past Fraser Digby.

The hosts doubled their advantage with only 15 minutes gone when, from a Barry Knowles

free-kick, the ball squirmed from Digby's grasp for David Lowe to prod home.

A fine save by Digby from Paul Jewell just three minutes after the break prevented a third goal. But that proved to be the turning point, with Town denying Wigan any further chances.

However, it took until the 72nd minute for big Dave Bamber to pull a goal back, tapping home when the keeper could only parry

Jimmy Quinn's shot.

Quinn put Town level eight minutes later, heading in a Berry free-kick via a post and the comeback was complete with two minutes remaining. Mark Jones crossed from the right for Peter Coyne to send a looping header into the far corner.

enjoyed a merry romp into round four of the FA Cup as they demolished Aldershot 7-0 at the County Ground. Two players score hat-tricks, with Howard Pritchard

netting both first-half goals. He grabbed his third in stoppage time. In between that, Andy Rowland scored three times in 16 second-half minutes, with Paul Batty the odd man out. It's the only time since World War II that two Swindon players have scored a hat-trick in the same match. The FA Cup run ended in the next round though, with a 3-1 defeat at Second Division Burnley.






FOUR additional Swindon Town legends will be inducted into the STFC Hall of Fame before kick-off this afternoon with Town Chairman Jeremy Wray presenting ties to the following County Ground heroes...

ANDY ROWLAND was one of a number of players that Bobby Smith brought to The County Ground from Bury. His playing career at Swindon stretched from 1978 to 1986 and saw him play 345 times and score 98 goals. In the 1979/80 season he formed a formidable striking partnership with Alan Mayes, finishing as the club's top scorer with 20 goals in the league and a further 11 in cup runs. He remained Town's leading goal scorer in the following two seasons - ending as the eighth highest goalscorer in the club's history. He brought down the curtain on his playing career in a season which saw Swindon finish as Fourth Division Champions. Following his retirement he was immediately taken onto the coaching staff in which capacity he continued to serve the club for a further ten years.

ARNOLD DARCY was Bert Head's second signing for Swindon Town and he joined from Wigan Athletic. Between 1956 and 1964 he made 238 appearances and scored 32 goals. In the 1957/58 Season, he missed just four games as Swindon climbed to fourth position, having finished in the bottom two positions in Division Two South the previous

two seasons, thus ensuring Swindon's membership of the national Third Division. In 1962/63 he made 26 appearances and scored five goals. The value with which he was regarded is shown by the fact that with the emergence of Don Rogers, efforts were made to accommodate him in the team at outside right and inside forward but Achilles tendon problems (the result of frequent attempts to halt his skilful runs!) saw him leave league football to join Cheltenham Town before retiring from the game.

SAM BURTON worked as a Bevin Boy for his National Service and returned to his native Swindon where his form for Ferndale Youth centre and in the Wiltshire County team won him recognition from Swindon Town. He signed for Town in 1945 although he was not able to take up a full-time contract until the spring of 1948 when his National Service was completed. A one-club man, his career was to stretch from 1945 to 1962 during which time he made 509 appearances - making him fifth in the ranking for most appearances for Swindon Town. He was ever-present in the 1954/55 Season and again in 1957/58 when Swindon finished fourth in Division Three

South thus earning a place in the national Third Division. Injury several times cost him his place but he always stayed to win it back until his retirement at the age of 36 following a neck injury. His total of 463 league appearances is more than any other goalkeeper has ever made for Swindon Town.

GEORGE HUDSON signed for Swindon from Portsmouth in September 1948. His 15-stone physique made him a pillar of the Swindon defence throughout the 1950's and earned him the nickname 'Garth' after a Daily Mirror cartoon figure. During a Swindon career which stretched from 1948 to 1959 he made 427 appearances making him eighth in the ranking of most appearances for Swindon. He was ever-present in no fewer than five seasons having one run of 160 consecutive appearances. The season's in which he was ever-present including the 1957/58 season when Swindon finished fourth in Division Three South thus earning a place in the national Third Division. Famed for his powerful heading it was ironic that a broken bone in the neck sustained when heading a ball brought an end to his career and forced his retirement in February 1960 at the age of 37.


