




Not forgetting the fact that because we are lucky enough to have in our team the top goalscorer in this League, we pose a threat against any opponent.

The Hughes In Brief...

So, the start of a New Year and hopefully a successful one for Barnet FC. The festive period was a mixed one for us. First we had the loss at Dagenham and then the one at Crawley too. The Crawley game wasn't too bad a result away from home against the top team, but it was disappointing to concede so early, from poor defending from a set-piece, and then not really test their keeper enough. We ended up with four strikers on the pitch but we didn't have enough going forward, which is unlike us - we usually have plenty of chances.

Those two defeats made the Bristol Rovers game really important. All the lads were well aware that it was a six-pointer, and that we'd catch them if we could beat them. Everyone was fired up for it and wanted to put things right after the two defeats over Christmas. There wasn't much in the game but I thought we were the better side. The game opened up much more in the second half and we began creating more chances. After Izale's goal it opened up even more and Clovis managed to grab a second. It was really pleasing to get the win and gives us a good start to the years. It was also good to get points against one of the sides around us in the league because that is going to be very important between now and the end of the season.

We know January is an important month for us in the league, because we don't want to be looking over our shoulders going into the last few months of the season. This time last year we were in real trouble but managed to get a few wins when Paul Fairclough came in. We're not in such a bad position this season but it's still a case of getting as many wins as possible this month, and hopefully that will put us in a good position to climb up the table.

Tonight's game had to be put to the back of our minds over Christmas, but we were preparing all of last week and were in all weekend getting ready for the game. We had a bad result against Swindon earlier in the season but we're a much better team now. That can't happen again tonight. We've got four massive halves against them, and we are looking at it in that way rather than as two legs. We need to get a good start tonight. It goes without saying that we want to win the two halves at home, which will make

things more straight forward because we'll have a lead to defend. We're expecting a big crowd and all the lads are looking forward to it because it is a cup final. We'll be going out to win and hopefully if we can get something out of tonight then it'll boost our league form too.

We've got two tough games to get through first, but as players and for everyone involved with the club, a trip to Wembley would be massive, especially for the supporters, who have had to watch relegation battles for the last few years. It would be amazing for them, the chairman, the manager in his first season, and the coaching staff - it would be a great day for everyone if we were to make it. Without demeaning Swindon at all, it would probably mean more to us than it would to them because of how our seasons are going, and hopefully we can show that on the pitch. We know how much this could mean to the club, and I think something like a cup final can really help a club turn a corner, so maybe next season we can use this to push on. If we do well it could mean better things for the club as a whole, and financially it would be great, which would help improve the squad for next season. But as I say, we're not looking too far ahead and we're fully focussed on the game tonight, and then Accrington on Saturday.

Swindon are a good side but we've studied them and we know about them. They had a great result beating Wigan on Saturday and are looking strong for promotion, which unfortunately we aren't this year. On paper they should beat us over the two legs but I know we're as good as anyone and hopefully we can prove a few people wrong, as we have a few times already this season.

We're really hoping for an Underhill cup atmosphere tonight. It's up to the players to get the fans off their seats, but please do get behind the lads as always.






Traditionalist that I am, I kicked off penning my column for this evening's game at 3.00pm on Saturday afternoon. An unbeaten run in November, with LAWRIE SANCHEZ short-listed for League 2 Manager of the Month, did not stop the harbingers of doom and

gloom at Underhill emerging from behind their computers to advise us all that the loan players would be gone in January, top scorer IZALE McLEOD and perhaps MARK MARSHALL would be sold in the transfer window and we would be heading for the Blue Square Bet. So let's have a reality check. With a free Saturday because Bradford City were involved in The FA Cup, I can reveal that Reading's 6ft 4ins tall central defender MICHAEL HECTOR is already committed to stay at Underhill for the rest of the season and that fellow defenders PAUL DOWNING and JACK SAVILLE have signed deals into the New Year.







And, whilst we are talking about it, McLeod said on Twitter recently: "I think certain people are getting ahead of themselves with all this transfer talk ... Barnet player till end of season".

Speculation on Twitter led to some wild talk and

unsubstantiated and incorrect stories about a bid for McLeod but chairman TONY KLEANTHOUS and I decided that the club would ignore them. The club policy is that we only announce an offer for a player that has been accepted via the club's website.

Matters took a turn, though, when Swindon chairman JEREMY WRAY denied on his club's website that they had made a bid for McLeod and had not spoken to Barnet FC about his availability.

"It would show great disrespect to unsettle a player when we have such important games coming up with them", he said.

LAWRIE SANCHEZ was at the County Ground on Saturday checking tonight's opponents in their sold-out FA Cup with Budweiser 3rd Round tie against Premiership Wigan Athletic. He and 19-goal League 2 top scorer McLEOD are concentrating more on a possible Johnstone's Paint Trophy final at Wembley Stadium than Twitter chat. Sanchez knew the size of the Bees' task tonight from their comprehensive 4-0 defeat at the County Ground but Swindon's giant-killing demolition of Wigan underlined that our League 2 rivals are on song.





Also caught in the transfer window speculation last week was former Swindon Town winger MARK MARSHALL, who has made 80 starts and two substitute appearances in his time at Underhill. The Bees, remember, rejected a couple of bids for

Marshall in the last transfer window and now Sky Sports reckons there is interest from "a host of clubs", with Portsmouth, Leeds United and West Ham United named.

Interestingly, SAIF RUBIE, Marshall's adviser, is quoted as saying that a move for Mark could be on the cards this month. "If he doesn't leave in January he will see out his contract in the summer."

GARY BORROWDALE, the 26-year-old QPR left back whose loan period with Barnet ended last month without him signing the extension to the end of season agreed by the clubs, is still in the Bees' radar. Borrowdale played 15 games for Barnet in the first.





Australian central defender DANIEL LEACH asked if he could act as co-commentator alongside KARL BATES at the Bristol Rovers game ... and broke the news that injury made it unwise for him to subject himself to the pressures of professional football any longer.

The 24-year-old Daniel told listeners that he was looking to pursue a different career and had only good things to say about Barnet FC, sentiments certainly reciprocated by all at Underhill.

An interesting, very sociable character, the 6ft 2ins tall Leach played State football Down Under and captained the Oregon State University side in America before arriving at the Barnet training ground then in Hertfordshire with an introduction to manager IAN HENDON. He played in the pre-season friendly against Arsenal just three days later and soon signed a contract. Unfortunately, injury beset his career at Underhill, culminating in Daniel's "exclusive" story last week about his retirement from the game. He will be missed.



Two other departures from Underhill: CEDRIC BASEYA, the 6ft 5ins tall Reading striker, and 24-year-old Lincoln City striker GAVIN McCALLUM.

The 24-year-old Baseya made three substitute appearances for the Bees before his short term deal

was ended by a leg injury and he has returned to his parent club. Canadian international McCallum, who also made three substitute appearances, has returned to Lincoln.



Skipper MARK HUGHES collected his fifth yellow card of the season early in the recent Bristol Rovers game at Underhill - great relief when it was realised that the latest yellow card came after the December 31 cut-off date. 28-year-

old Mark got a warning from The FA rather than a one match ban and is available for tonight's game.



Other disciplinary "escapees", all with four cautions on December 31, were Saville, Marshall, DARREN DENNEHY and MARK BYRNE.

The next stage: a player with 10 cautions by April 8 will receive a two-match ban.

Returning Kettering Town manager Mark
Cooper was said to have been considering his
position at the club after just one game, after
expressing his disappointment that guarantees
regarding new investors had yet to be met. The former
Tamworth boss replaced ex-Barnet man Mark Stimson in
the Poppies' hot seat last week.

Bristol Rovers' League 2 survival hopes have been boosted with the news that Crystal Palace midfielder Andy Dorman will stay with the Pirates' for a further month on loan. The 29-year-old as featured in every Rovers game since his arrival at the club in November, including Saturday's FA Cup encounter with Aston Villa.

Everton defender Phil Jagielka could be out of action for up to two months after the England international suffered a knee injury in last Wednesday's Premier League match with Bolton Wanderers at Goodison Park.

Doncaster Rovers striker Billy Sharp looks set to leave the Championship strugglers for divisional rivals Leicester City after the two clubs agreed a fee over the weekend. The former Sheffield United forward is Rovers' current top scorer with ten goals this season.

Peterborough United centre-half Kelvin
Langmead has agreed a permanent deal with
Northampton Town after being on loan at
Sixfields since the start of the season. The 26-year- old as
plenty of experience at this level, having joined Posh
from Shrewsbury Town in the 2009-10 close season.

Blue Square Bet Premier strugglers Newport
County have put three players up for sale in an
effort to reduce costs. Former Barnet loanee
Craig McAllister is one of the trio, along with fellow
attacker Tom Miller and goalkeeper Danny Potter,
although manager Justin Edinburgh may be able to use
some of the money saved to add a player or two to his
squad.

Jordan Rhodes' remarkable season in front of goal for League 1 promotion-chasers
Huddersfield Town continued on Friday with a five-goal haul in the Terriers' 6-0 mauling of struggling
Wycombe Wanderers. The Scottish international striker has now managed 25 in the league so far.

Aldershot Town have moved into the transfer market in attempt to improve their on-field fortunes, with the capture of defenders Troy Brown and Sonny Bradley. Ex-Ipswich youngster Brown

has joined from divisional rivals Rotherham United until the end of the season whilst 20-year-old Bradley has made a month-long switch from Championship side Hull City.

MK Dons manager Karl Robinson believes that his side's battling 1-1 draw against Premier League Queen's Park Rangers, along with their fluid attacking style, may go some way to changing the negative aspect some neutral fans have about his side.

The future of Blue Square Premier club
Darlington remains in the balance, despite
former chairman Raj Singh's promise to waive
any outstanding money owed to him should a buyer for
the beleaguered Quakers be found.

Former Tottenham and England midfielder Nick Barmby has formally announced his retirement from playing, in preparation for taking over as full-time boss of Hull City. Barmby, who made 23 appearances for his country during an illustrious career, has been in temporary charge of his home town team since the departure of current Leicester boss Nigel Pearson in November.

West Ham United defender Callum
McNaughton has signed permanently for
League 2 AFC Wimbledon in a two and a half
year deal after impressing on loan since his arrival at the
club in September.

Championship Barnsley have increased their attacking firepower with the capture of wily striker Chris Dagnall from Scunthorpe United.

Dagnall, who enjoyed a prolific time in front of goal for Rochdale before is switch to the Iron, could make is debut this coming weekend against Leicester City.

Former Northampton Town boss Gary Johnson was tipped to make a shock return to League 1 side Yeovil Town, six years after leaving the club for Bristol City. The Glovers, currently in the middle of a relegation scrap, currently have Terry Skiverton in charge and there is speculation that he may be supported by Johnson taking over an advisory role.

Neil Warnock became the latest managerial casualty of the season after being relieved of his duties at the helm of Premier League strugglers QPR at the weekend. The ex-Scarborough, Notts County and Sheffield United boss had been unable to replicate the excellent form that saw the R's win the Championship title last May.







The Robins Reviewed... By James Castle

The Season So Far

Swindon are enjoying life on their return to the fourth tier, and currently sit 4th in the League 2 table having collected 43 points from exactly half their league fixtures so far. With only one defeat in all competitions since the end of September coming into their FA Cup 3rd Round clash with Wigan Athletic at the weekend, Paolo di Canio's Robins are in impressive form.

Championship side Bristol City were beaten 1-0 in the Carling Cup before Town exited the competition at the 2nd Round stage after defeat at Southampton, with Swindon earning the right to take on Premier League Wigan on Saturday in The FA Cup after an impressive 4-1 home win against League 1 Huddersfield Town and a 1-0 victory at Colchester United. Three successive triumphs over Exeter City, AFC Wimbledon (on penalties) and Southend United has led the Robins to Underhill, and just two games away from a Wembley final.

Last Season in the JPT

Swindon managed to reach the quarter-final stage in last season's competition, before bowing out to League 1 rivals Brentford on penalties at the County Ground. The Robins made light work of a trip to promotion favourites Southampton in the 1st Round, dominating much of the game and coming away from St. Mary's with a resounding 3-0 victory, courtesy of a brace from Vincent Pericard and another from the prolific Charlie Austin.

Pericard was to score in the next round as well, with a clinical strike in first-half injury time to double the Robins' lead following David Ball's 10th minute strike, and this proved enough to see off a spirited Torquay United side in front of their own fans.

The Robins, however, tasted defeat in the following round after a hard-fought 1-1 draw at the County Ground, with Brentford prevailing 4-2 in the penalty shoot-out. Town took the lead inside the first quarter of an hour through Austin before being pegged back eight minutes before the end of the half through Robbie Simpson's close-range header.

Football League Trophy History

Swindon took part in the first four seasons of the competition, their best performance being a 3-2 semi-final defeat at home to Aldershot in the 1986-87 season. Promotion to the Second Division, and the Premier League, curtailed their involvement until 2000, bar one season (1995-96) when they were defeated 1-0 by Hereford United at the County Ground.

The Robins reached the semi-final stage twice more, in 2001 and 2005, but were beaten both times by Southend United at Roots Hall, although they did manage to thrash the


Shrimpers 6-1 at home in the 1st Round of the 2002/03 competition.


Town bowed out at the opening stage in 2006/07 by the only goal in a keenly-fought contest against Wycombe Wanderers at Adams Park but went one stage further the following year, beating Brentford 4-1 at home before going down 3-1 to Cheltenham Town at the County Ground. 2008/09 saw the Robins reach the quarter-final stage, a penalty shoot-out victory at Aldershot followed by a win by the odd goal in three over Hereford at Edgar Street – a third successive away game proved one too many, with Brighton proving victorious at the Withdean. They reached the same stage the following campaign, losing 5-3 on penalties at home to Norwich City in front of almost 5,000 spectators after a goal-less draw.

With their involvement in the competition ending, for the third year running, at the quarter-finals last term this season's Southern Final appearance is, like Barnet, the furthest the club has progressed in this competition.

Last Time at Underhill

Town's last visit to Underhill was another Cup encounter, with the two sides squaring up for the right in a 3rd Round FA Cup Replay to earn the right to face Bristol Rovers at home for a place in the last sixteen of the competition. Barnet had forced a replay after striker Adam Birchall had scored a stunning late equaliser in a 1-1 draw at the County Ground and it was the same score after extra-time. Billy Paynter's 42nd minute strike sent the visitors into the break ahead but the same player was to score at the same end in the second half, this time putting through his own goal. The Bees hung on under some pressure, particularly after midfielder Michael Leary's dismissal just over a quarter of an hour from the end of normal time, but Paul Fairclough's charges clung on and dug in, and managed to secure a dramatic victory 2-0 in the penalty shoot-out with keeper Rob Beckwith emerging as the hero of the night.

PAOLO DI CANIO - MANAGER

After a glittering playing career Paolo is making his first steps in management at the County Ground after being appointed last summer. Born in Rome he played for Lazio, Juventus, Napoli and AC Milan before in 1996 he joined Celtic. A season later he signed for Sheffield Wednesday and then a well remembered spell at West Ham United, before a season with Charlton Athletic prior to a return to Italian football. Vastly talented and capable of incredible moments of skill, strangely he was never capped at full level by Italy.

1 MATTIA LANZANO

Italian goalkeeper Mattia departed native side USD Gavorrana 1930 in July to sign a two-year deal with Swindon Town. The 20-year-old custodian travelled with the squad on the pre-season tour to Italy and made his debut in the 11-0 win over Norcia. Lanzano competes with Phil Smith and Mark Scott for the number one jersey this season.

3 CALLUM KENNEDY

Former Reading youngster Callum was granted a taste of first team action after being taken on the club's pre-season tour of Austria in 2008. The 22-year-old left-back impressed during numerous substitute appearances before making his full debut against Carlisle United. He was awarded a new contract in 2009 but a pelvic injury sustained mid-way through the season kept him on the sidelines for a lengthy period. Loan spells at Gillingham and Rotherham United ensued during 2010/2011 and Callum returned to The County

Ground as first-choice left-back for 2011/12.



4 ADEN FLINT

Aden joined Town from Alfreton Town in 2011 after a string of impressive performances. The 21-year-old defender, who has received two international caps at England 'C' level, made his debut in the 1-1 draw with Rochdale in February. Aden has now secured his place in the starting line-up on a regular basis.



5 JOE DEVERA

Joe became Di Canio's first signing as boss in the summer after an established spell with Barnet. The 24-year-old, who is of Venezuelan descent, made 177 appearances during a six-year career with the Bees, and was named the club's Player of the Year in 2008 and 2011. A product of the Barnet youth system, Joe can play at either right-back or centre-back.

6 ALBERTO COMMAZI

Experienced defender Alberto signed a two-year deal at The County Ground in July following lengthy talks with the club. The 32-year-old progressed through the system at AC Milan before spending time with the Como, Monza and Verona. Alberto spent last season at Spezia before arriving in Wiltshire for his first spell in English football.



7 PAUL CADDIS

Paul signed from Celtic in 2010 on a three-year deal. The 22-year-old can play in many different positions but is predominantly a right-sided defender. Paul came through the ranks at Celtic and enjoyed much success at youth team level. He made 42 appearances in 2010/11 season and was voted Fans' Away Player of the Year. He took over the captain's armband from new signing Oliver Risser in August.




8 SIMON FERRY

Simon made the permanent switch from Celtic in 2010. Simon joined Celtic at the age of 12 and progressed through the ranks at Parkhead. However he was sidelined for nearly two years with a serious ankle injury. The 23-year-old midfielder has already proved to be a major part of the side and scored his second goal of the campaign in the FA Cup win over Huddersfield Town.

9 PAUL BENSON

Swindon recently completed the signing of Charlton Athletic striker Paul Benson on a two-and-a-half year deal. Paul joined Dagenham & Redbridge in 2005 after being spotted playing non-league football. The six-foot hitman struck 28 times to help Dagenham win the Conference title and netted 22 goals the following term, He also scored in all three play-off matches as

Daggers defeated Rotherham United 3-2 in the League Two play-off final. The frontman joined Charlton Athletic and scored ten goals in 28 starts for the Addicks. The 32-year-old made his Swindon debut from the bench in the 2-0 home win over AFC Wimbledon.



10 MATT RITCHIE

After two separate loan spells Matt signed a two-and-a-half year contract with Town last year. Ritchie made his full debut for the club in the 2-0 Johnstone's Paint Trophy second round win over Torquay United at The County Ground before going on to make 34 appearances during the rest of the season. The 22-year-old attacking midfielder was voted Fans' Player of the Year for his efforts in 2010-11.



11 ETIENNE ESAJAS

Etienne signed for Town after impressing during a three-week trial at the club during the summer. The Dutchman scored in each of his friendly appearances for the club against a Marche XI and Swindon Supermarine and put pen to paper on a two-year deal at The County Ground shortly afterwards. The 27-year-old made 65 appearances for Sheffield Wednesday during his previous stint in English football.

12 ALAN McCORMACK

Alan signed a two-year deal at The County Ground in July following his release from Charlton Athletic. The 27-year-old Irishman trained with Di Canio's side for a week before putting pen to paper. Alan started his career at Preston North End before a move to Southend United. He went on to make 130 appearances for the Shrimpers scoring 15 times during three seasons at the club. Charlton Athletic secured his services last summer following Southend's relegation.



13 OLIVER RISSER

Oliver penned a two-year deal at The County Ground in July and was named club captain shortly after although he has since been replaced. The 30-year-old is a Namibian international who has played in Norway, Germany and Greece during his career. Oliver is a powerful defensive midfielder and can also play as a centre-back.

14 JORDAN PAVETT

Jordan won a competition of more than 3,500 players to sign a professional contract with Swindon last year. The striker who has previously spent time at Ipswich Town and Colchester United joined Swindon after working as a plumber with his dad's firm. The 20-year-old was handed the number 14 shirt by Di Canio ahead of the 2011/12

season and featured during the preseason tour of Italy.



17 ALAN CONNELL

Swindon clinched the signing of Grimsby Town striker Alan for an undisclosed six-figure sum in the summer. The 28-year-old frontman arrived at Blundell Park from Bournemouth in 2010 and scored 29 league goals for the Mariners last term. A popular player in two spells at Dean Court, the former lpswich trainee has won promotion to League One on three separate occasions and has also enjoyed prolific spells with both Torquay United and Hereford United.

21 LANDER GABILONDO

Spanish winger Lander signed for Town in August after arriving on trial soon after the start of the campaign. He was born in San Sebastian and came through the youth system at Real Sociedad. Lander then moved to La Liga rivals Osasuna where he played 159 games in the Spanish 2B division. The 24-year-old winger, who likes to take on full-backs, made his first Swindon appearance from the bench against Oxford



23 RAFFAELE DE VITA

Italian striker Raffaele signed a twoyear deal with The Robins in the summer after a spell in Scotland with Livingston. The 24-year-old joined Blackburn Rovers aged 15 and came up through the ranks at Ewood Park. Despite a hat-trick in a reserve team game against Wigan Athletic, first team opportunities never materialised and the frontman opted to leave the Premier League side. In 2008 he moved north of the border where he spent three seasons with Livingston. Last term he made 31 appearances, scoring 11 goals.



24 JONATHAN SMITH

Swindon secured the signing of York City midfielder Jonathan in June. The former Forest Green Rovers man joined The Robins for an undisclosed fee on a two-year contract. The 24-year-old was highly-rated during his time with the Minstermen and will be hoping to make a lasting impression during the League Two campaign.

26 PHIL SMITH

Paul joined Town in 2006 from Crawley Town and made his first start for the club in a Carling Cup defeat by Brentford. His heroics between the sticks during the 2006/07 didn't go unnoticed by the fans who named him their Player of the Season. The 30-year-old goalkeeper endured a frustrating campaign in 2009/2010 but made 33 starts last season and now competes with Mark Scott and Mattia Lanzano for a starting place at The County Ground.

29 LUKAS MAGERA

Swindon signed Czech Republic international striker Lukas during the summer on a two-year deal. Capped four times by his country, the 6'4" striker's arrival brought an end to Di Canio's search for a

targetman. The 28-year old striker spent the last few seasons with Politehnica Timişoara and played for his country against Scotland in a UEFA Euro 2012 Qualifier in October.



34 RONAN MURRAY

Swindon signed Ipswich Town striker Ronan in late November on loan until mid January making his debut against Aldershot Town. The 20-year-old came through the Academy at Portman Road and has progressed through to the first team squad although is yet to feature for Paul Jewell's side this term. He gained some valuable experience last season during a loan spell with Torquay United and has been capped up to U19 level with the Republic of Ireland.

35 WES FODERINGHAM

Swindon initially signed 20-year-old Crystal Palace goalkeeper Wes on loan deal in October which was subsequently made permanent last week, The former England U19 'keeper enjoyed a prolific start to his Swindon career keeping consecutive clean sheets in his first 5 games for the club.

39 MEHDI KERROUCHE

Algerian striker Medhi became Di Canio's eighth signing of the summer, agreeing a two-year contract at The County Ground. The 25-year-old left United Arab Emirates side Al-Oruba during the summer and was awarded the number 39 shirt with Swindon. Kerrouche scored 12 goals in 18 games for the UAE Second Division outfit last year.



Managing To Succeed...

Football Historian Leigh Edwards profiles ten managers who have played significant roles in the history of Swindon Town FC...

SAM ALLEN

Sam Allen gave Swindon Town outstanding service in various capacities. Previously a clerk in the GWR offices, he spent seven years as a Swindon director before becoming their secretary-manager in July 1902. He made several shrewd signings and guided Swindon to the Southern League championship in 1910-11 and 1913-14, also twice leading them to the FA Cup semi-finals. Taking Swindon into the Football League in 1920, he plotted further FA Cup runs and remained in charge of team affairs until becoming secretary only on the arrival of Ted Vizard in April 1933. He held that post until his death on New Year's Day 1946.

BERT HEAD

Bert Head plotted Swindon Town's 1962-63 promotion success. Signing professional for Torquay United in October 1936, the defender moved to Bury in February 1952 and was assistant-boss before becoming Swindon's manager in October 1955. He produced several fine players including Mike Summerbee, Ernie Hunt, Don Rogers and Rod Thomas before returning to Bury as manager in August 1965. Appointed Crystal Palace's boss in April 1966, he guided them to the top-flight for the first time in 1968-69 and had a spell as general manager. He was later manager and director at Bath City and died in February 2002.

DANNY WILLIAMS

Danny Williams guided Swindon Town to a promotion and League Cup 'double' in 1968-69. A former wing-half, he turned professional with hometown Rotherham in October 1942 and starred in their 1950-51 Third Division (North) title triumph. He made a club record 459 League appearances for the Millers before becoming trainer-coach in July 1960, then was manager prior to taking charge of Swindon in August 1965. Leaving the County Ground in July 1969 to manage Sheffield Wednesday, he then managed Mansfield Town before rejoining Swindon as boss from March 1974 until May 1978. He now lives in Bournemouth.

FRED FORD

Fred Ford plotted Swindon Town's 1970 Anglo-Italian Cup final triumph. He was a centre-half with Erith & Belvedere, Arsenal, Charlton Athletic, Millwall and Carlisle United, then coached Bristol Rovers before becoming Bristol City's manager in July 1960. He guided them to promotion in 1964-65 and discovered several notable players, then coached Swindon from September 1967 until his appointment as Bristol Rovers' boss in April 1968. Returning to Swindon as manager between October 1969 and May 1971, he later coached Torquay United, then was Oxford United's chief scout until his death in October 1981.

LOU MACARI

Former Scotland international midfielder Lou Macari managed Swindon Town to the Fourth Division title in 1985-86. He won all three major Scottish honours with Celtic before moving to Manchester United in January 1973, featuring in three FA Cup finals including their 1977 triumph. Joining Swindon as player-boss in July 1984, he also guided them to promotion in 1986-87 and Second Division play-offs in 1988-89. He left in July 1989 to manage West Ham and briefly Birmingham before leading Stoke City to the Second Division title in 1992-93. Rejoining Celtic as boss, he later managed Stoke again and Huddersfield Town.

OSSIE ARDILES

Former Argentina international midfielder Ossie Ardiles was unlucky not to lead Swindon Town to the top-flight in 1989-90. Together with Ricky Villa, the World Cup winner made headlines with his transfer from Huracan to Spurs in July 1978. He helped them win the FA Cup in 1981 and UEFA Cup in 1984, moving to QPR in May 1988. Appointed Swindon's boss in July 1989, he plotted their 1989-90 Second Division play-off final success but they were denied promotion due to an illegal payments scandal. He took charge of Newcastle United in March 1991, then managed West Brom and Spurs before coaching overseas.

GLENN HODDLE

Ex-England international midfielder Glenn Hoddle plotted Swindon Town's 1992-93 First Division play-off final triumph. Signing professional for Spurs in April 1975, he starred in their 1981 and 1982 FA Cup final successes and was a finalist again shortly before joining Monaco in June 1987. He helped win the French League title in 1987-88 and was appointed Swindon's player-boss in April 1991, scoring once in 64 League games while at the County Ground. Moving to Chelsea in a similar capacity in June 1993, he guided them to the 1994 FA Cup final and has since managed England, Southampton, Spurs and Wolves.

STEVE McMAHON

Former England international midfielder Steve McMahon managed Swindon Town to the Second Division title in 1995-96. Initially with Everton, he joined Aston Villa in May 1983 and moved to Liverpool in September 1985. He starred as they won the League Championship three times and FA Cup in 1989, then reunited with Peter Reid at Manchester City. Appointed Swindon's player-boss in November 1994, he made 42 League appearances and remained in charge until September 1999. He managed Blackpool to promotion in 2000-01 as well as two LDV Vans Trophy final triumphs, since coaching Australian side Perth Glory.

ANDY KING

Former England U-21 midfielder Andy King managed Swindon Town to the Second Division play-offs in 2003-04. Signing professional for Luton Town in July 1974, he joined Everton in April 1976 and appeared in the 1977 League Cup final. He moved to QPR in September 1980, then West Brom a year later and rejoined Everton in August 1982. After spells at Wolves, Luton again and Aldershot, he became Mansfield Town's boss in November 1993. He was assistant-boss at Grimsby and Swindon, where he was appointed manager from November 2000 until August 2001, then again between January 2002 and September 2005.

PAUL STURROCK

Former Scotland international striker Paul Sturrock guided Swindon Town to promotion in 2006-07. A legend at Dundee United, he starred as they won the Scottish Premier title in 1982-83, Scottish League Cup twice and were Scottish Cup finalists four times. He became their coach in June 1989, was St Johnstone's boss and rejoined Dundee United as manager in September 1998. Taking charge of Plymouth in October 2000, he plotted two promotion campaigns, then managed Southampton. He led Sheffield Wednesday to promotion in 2004-05, then was Swindon's boss for a year and has since managed Plymouth and Southend.

10 Campaigns In The Life Of Swindon Town FC

Football historian LEIGH EDWARDS selects ten post-war Swindon Town seasons that are worth reminiscing over...

1962/63

Swindon Town won promotion to the Second Division for the first time in 1962/63. Bert Head's young side won just one of their first six games, then top scorer Ernie Hunt netted a hat-trick in a 5-1 victory over Brighton. Cliff Jackson scored three times in a 4-3 win at Millwall and Jack Smith did likewise in a 5-0 victory over QPR as Swindon overcame the 'Big Freeze' to maintain their promotion challenge. They hammered Colchester 6-1 and clinched promotion with a 1-0 win at home to Shrewsbury. Keith Morgan and John Trollope were ever-present, while other stars included Mike Summerbee and Bobby Woodruff.

1968/69

Don Rogers starred as Swindon Town achieved an epic League Cup and promotion 'double' in 1968/69. Early pace-setters in the Third Division, they lost 1-0 at home to Watford in the title 'decider' watched by 28,898 and finished runners-up on goal average. Swindon defeated Torquay 2-1, Bradford City 4-3, Blackburn 1-0, Coventry 3-0, Derby 1-0 and Burnley 3-2 in the League Cup before beating Arsenal 3-1 after extra-time in the Wembley final: Peter Downsborough, Rod Thomas, John Trollope, Joe Butler, Frank Burrows, Stan Harland, Don Heath, Roger Smart, John Smith (Willie Penman), Peter Noble, Don Rogers.

1969/70

Swindon Town challenged strongly for promotion to the top-flight in 1969/70. Fred Ford replaced Danny Williams as manager and Arthur Horsfield was signed from Newcastle, starring as Swindon were among the early leaders. Peter Noble grabbed a hat-trick as they beat Charlton 5-0 and maintained their promotion challenge with a 14 match unbeaten run. Swindon finished fifth in the Second Division, their highest position at the time. They also defeated Blackburn 4-0, Chester 4-2 and Scunthorpe 3-1 in the FA Cup before losing 2-0 to Leeds United in the sixth round, then beat Napoli 3-0 in the Anglo-Italian Cup final.

1979/80

Bobby Smith guided Swindon Town to the League Cup semi-finals in 1979/80. Swindon had narrowly missed promotion the previous season and Alan Mayes scored twice in an early 4-0 win over Brentford. They defeated Portsmouth 3-1, Chester 2-1, Stoke City 2-1, Wimbledon 2-1 and Arsenal 4-3 in the League Cup before losing 4-3 to Wolves in the semi-finals. Andy Rowland and Alan Mayes formed an exciting partnership as Swindon gained four successive wins, then trounced Bury 8-0. They took Spurs to an FA Cup fourth round replay but finished mid-table despite signing David Peach and Glenn Cockerill.

1985/86

Swindon Town stormed to the Fourth Division title with a record 102 points in 1985/86. Lou Macari's side made a poor start in the League but defeated Sunderland and Sheffield Wednesday en route to the Milk Cup fourth round. Kenny Allen arrived from Torquay and Dave Bamber from Portsmouth as Swindon soared to the top of the table with 14 wins in 16 matches. They set a club record of 13 consecutive home victories with a 3-1 win over Burnley and clinched the title with a 1-1 draw at Mansfield. Charlie Henry and Colin Gordon scored 35 goals between them, while skipper Colin Calderwood was ever-present.

1986/87

Lou Macari plotted Swindon Town's 1986/87 Third Division play-off final triumph. Colin Gordon was sold to Wimbledon, while newcomers included Jimmy Gilligan, Mark Jones, Fraser Digby and Bristol Rovers pair Tim Parkin and Steve White. Six victories in eight games catapulted Swindon into the promotion race, then Jimmy Quinn returned from Blackburn and Phil King arrived from Torquay. They starred as Swindon gained seven straight wins and qualified for the play-offs in third position after remaining undefeated in their last 11 matches. Swindon beat Gillingham 2-0 in the play-off final replay after a 2-2 aggregate draw.

1989/90

Swindon Town won the 1989/90 Second Division play-off final but were denied top-flight status after an illegal payments scandal. Swindon had qualified for the play-offs the previous season and Ossie Ardiles replaced Lou Macari as manager. They soared into the promotion frame with seven wins in nine games including a 6-0 victory over Stoke and signed David Kerslake from QPR in November. Alan McLoughlin, Duncan Shearer and Steve White starred as Swindon maintained their challenge with just one defeat in 13 matches and finished in fourth position. They defeated Sunderland 1-0 in the play-off final at Wembley.

1992/93


Player-manager Glenn Hoddle was a key figure in Swindon Town's 1992/93 First Division play-off final success. Swindon were early pace-setters and new signing Craig Maskell grabbed a hat-trick in a 4-1 win over Cambridge United. They went second after a 5-1 demolition of Notts County, then overcame a lean spell with Ross MacLaren's return inspiring a run of seven victories in nine games. Dave Mitchell netted three times in a 6-4 win at Birmingham and Swindon qualified for the play-offs in fifth position. They defeated Tranmere 5-4 on aggregate, then gained a thrilling 4-3 win over Leicester in the Wembley final.

1993/94

Assistant-boss John Gorman replaced Glenn Hoddle in charge as Swindon Town prepared for the 1993/94 Premiership campaign. New signings included Jan-Aage Fjortoft, Andy Mutch, Luc Nijholt and Adrian Whitbread, with Swindon starting with a 3-1 defeat at Sheffield United. They drew 0-0 at Norwich but despite signing Terry Fenwick and Keith Scott, were already facing relegation by the time they managed their first win 1-0 at home to QPR in November. Swindon completed the double over QPR and also beat Southampton, Spurs and Coventry as well as drawing against Arsenal, Liverpool and Manchester United.

1995/96

Swindon Town stormed to the Second Division title under player-boss Steve McMahon in 1995/96. They had plummeted from the Premiership to Second Division and newcomers included Wayne Allison, Steve Finney and Mark Seagraves. Swindon were early leaders, winning seven of their first nine games, and Kevin Horlock netted a hat-trick in a 4-1 victory at Bristol Rovers. They remained in pole position and took Southampton to an FA Cup fifth round replay. Ian Culverhouse and Mark Robinson were ever-present, while leading scorer Wayne Allison and Shaun Taylor also starred as they won the title by nine points.





The Bees and The Robins have actually gone head to head from the spot once before!


The teams met in the 3rd Round of The FA Cup back in the 2007-08 season. Barnet were there thanks to 1st and 2nd Round wins against Gillingham and Burton Albion. The Bees pulled off a memorable draw at the County Ground against then League 1 Swindon Town courtesy of a brilliant curling effort from Adam Birchall to earn another chance at Underhill. It was to be another memorable night!



Manager Paul Fairclough gave home débuts to Rob Beckwith in goal and Cliff Akurang in attack. He also has access to a very experienced bench which featured veterans Lee Harrison, Giuliano Grazioli and Ian Hendon.



Barnet fell behind just before half time as Billy Paynter easily beat Beckwith with a fine effort. Early in the second half Paynter then made amends as far as Barnet fans were concerned when he turned Jason Puncheon's fierce shot into his own net. At the end of 90 minutes it was one goal each, although the Bees had played the last 17 minutes of the game with 10 men as Michael Leary had been sent off for what was in all honesty a horrible lunge at Sofiene Zaaboub.





As the rain crashed down while the teams prepared for the shoot out, it appeared that Fairclough had already selected his five chosen penalty takers in advance, "Keep your head and get a good strike on the ball" was the simple message. It was common knowledge that the team had been practising their spot kicks all week in training and the cause was helped immediately as that man Paynter crashed the first spot kick against the bar. Thomas comfortably beat Brezovan and then Swindon failed again, Christian Roberts missing the target completely. Up stepped Ismail Yakubu who had performed admirably during the game but his weak effort also went wide. Hasney Aljofree then fired the ball over the bar and incredibly the Robins had missed their first three penalties. Substitute Joe O'Clearuill kept his nerve to score with ease leaving the lime light for débutante Beckwith, who made a fine diving save to parry the kick by Miguel Comminges. There was no way back for Swindon and Underhill went wild with celebrations. Beckwith was mobbed by all including Paul Fairclough.



The reward for the teams efforts was a 4th round tie at Underhill against Bristol Rovers which Barnet lost 0-1 but the Bees would have been a goal ahead in the first half if Jason Puncheon had kept his nerve – yes you guessed it, from the penalty spot!



Paul is in conversation with Sean McCausland...

What attracted you most when signing for Barnet Football Club? The biggest attraction for me was the opportunity to play first team football. I was told before I came here that the club had a really good set up in terms of facilities and also a very decent bunch of players. So when I was told of a possible move I was eager to sign.

When an aspiring footballer which player did you look up to and why? John Terry is the player who I have continually aspired to be like. He plays in my position and is the captain of England. And he has almost won everything while playing as a centre back. I try to model my game on his, picking up pointers and trying to incorporate his attributes into my own game.

So what do you think when Lawrie Sanchez says you play in the style of John Terry? It's a big complainant to receive. And it nice to be acknowledged for a solid performance and it's a good comment. But I can't let myself get carried away by one comment, I have to continue playing and let my performances do

the talking.

What was your debut like in professional football? It was a good memory and a great game to play in. It's something you look forward to when you are in the youth set up so it was a relief to get my league debut out of the way in many ways.

And what about the game itself? Hereford United 2 Lincoln City 0 It was an important win for the side. We worked hard as a team to earn those three vital points. And a great start for my professional career to get it off with a win.

What would you say your strongest attributes as a player are? My strongest attribute is probably my ability to read the game, which helps me to intercept passes and breaking up attacking play. Another strong attribute is my general defensive ability. I am a good header and clearer of the ball and don't mind the odd tackle.

Which aspects of your game, do you believe you need to improve? I need to improve on my leadership skills on the pitch. I have to be more vocal and communicate better in situations. Another area I could improve on is

the ability to take the ball out of defence. Instead of clearing it I need to be able to take the ball out into the midfield area and look for a pass.

How has your partnership with Michael Hector at centre-back developed? Yeah it has been a good partnership that has developed positively over a good run of games. Hopefully we'll get to continue our partnership in the back four because he is a good player and we have fitted in well.

Is League 2 football physically tougher than you expected and how does it differ from Premier League reserve team football? Yeah it's a lot tougher then I expected. The football is a lot more direct and in your face. With the play being more direct you have to deal with situations that require brute strength in terms of winning headers from long balls and set pieces. So I've had to deal with the physicality of it, so that has been a step up for me. And another change is that you want to win every game, as points are so important in League 2 whereas in reserve football you knew that the result didn't affect the club quite as much as it would in the senior team. Another huge difference is the bigger attendances at games.

Ambitions for the season? I want to continue playing for Barnet making sure that I produce as many solid performances as I can. And of course the main aim is to push Barnet as far as we can up the league and secure a position that reflects the ambitions of the club. Also hopefully we can reach Wembley.

If you could play at any stadium where would it be? Wembley. It's the home of the national side and for me football. It's a dream of mine to play there and hopefully I can do that with Barnet.


Favorite player of all time? Zinedine Zidane is my favorite player. I watched him a lot when I was younger. He never failed to entertain me and was a really skillful player.



of a contingency plan.







Youth Development





James Thorne, Head of Youth Operations at Barnet FC writes about a Week In The Life Of The Youth Department...

Time management and

organisation is paramount in the Youth
Department. We plan for the whole year
before pre-season training commences and I
have to manage my time effectively so that I
am able to keep in touch with all the activities
that go on throughout the season across
eleven squads.

The Centre of Excellence operates seven days a week throughout almost all of the year and has a full schedule all of the time. Across any given week we will on average have twelve to fifteen games to watch and thirty five different training sessions. Additionally, the coaching staff will get out to scout any time they are required to do so and watch any players we have out on loan or that are involved in other fixtures.

We operate for twelve months of the year giving the younger age groups a small break in the summer and a few weeks off over Christmas and new year. All staff meet regularly so that any changes to the schedule can be effectively communicated to both staff and players and the schedule is devised to make as much use of the summer months and good weather as possible.

We see all our players a minimum of four times a week with most groups in five or six days of a week. Seven day weeks for staff can be common and the staff make huge sacrifices so that we are able to deliver the best educational programme possible to our players across all the age groups.

We adopt a holistic approach to all our age groups and although each group has a designated coach sharing ideas, practices, training methods and seeing other staff is common place. All staff are encouraged to contribute in all areas so that everyone is aware of what is happening at the club, within the department and so that all players and staff are well acquainted with each other.

All the staff from the Head of Youth and Youth Team Coach get as excited and are as knowledgeable about our latest crop of Under 9s as the U9s are in the Youth Team and First Team results. Players and staff regularly work with different age groups and we try to achieve a balance between consistency of delivery and variety to keep the players and staff fresh and ready to learn.

We encourage everyone here to come out of their comfort zone and embrace all the challenges and experiences that come their way whether it be the Youth Team Coach taking the Under 9s or Herts Senior Cup Team to the Goalkeeper Coaches leading an outfield session.

All this takes a great deal of planning so along with regular board and management meetings, all our dealings with other clubs, the Football League, updating the website and trying to give everyone something interesting to read in the programme, life in the Youth Department is always varied, never dull and provides all the staff with an exciting challenge to get the very best out of themselves and all of the aspiring young players that make up the Barnet FC Centre of Excellence.

Manager: John Coleman had a 20 year playing career mainly for a host of non league in the North West of England from 1979. A prolific striker who scored over 500 goals in that time, John was appointed player Manager at Ashton United before joining Stanley in 1999. He is the club's longest ever serving Manager.

Brief Directions By Road: An early start required for this one everybody - M1 and M6 junction 29 and onto the M65 signposted Blackburn. Leave the M65 at Junction 7, taking the Clitheroe turn off the roundabout. Turn right at the first set of traffic lights opposite The Clayton Business Park, following the A678 (Blackburn Road). Follow the road over the Canal Bridge to the next set of traffic lights. Turn right again going over the motorway bridge and towards Accrington on the A680 (Whalley Road). After approximately half a mile turn left into Livingstone Road to find the ground, which is 50 yards past the Crown Hotel on the left. These directions are based on those provided by Accrington Stanley FC.

Car Parking: Over 300 free spaces in two car parks available at the ground, and unrestricted in the surrounding streets. Bees fans will be probably be directed to their own parking area close to the away terrace turnstiles.

Directions By Train: A train from London Kings Cross will take around 4 hours with a change at Leeds. Accrington Station is a good 25 minutes walk away from the ground although the route passes numerous pubs! A bus from the station stops outside the Crown Pub, which virtually overlooks the ground and this runs every 15 minutes.

Supporters Coaches: Coaches this season are being run by the club. The coach will leave the Pavilion at 8.30am and the ticket price is £25. The Pav will open at approx 7.00am for pre-journey refreshments. Discounts on travel are available for season ticket holders, club members and association members. Bookings for coach travel for all 2011-12 season away games can be purchased online or by calling 02084496325. See page 48 for full details.

Eating And Drinking Locally: The place is inundated with pubs and many close to the ground on Whalley Road. The Crown literally overlooks the ground and is very friendly. My sources reveal that The Whittakers Arms 322 Burnley Rd is particularly happy to receive away fans. It is situated close to the old Peel Park ground from

Stanley's past. However there are many excellent pubs in the town centre too that come recommended; notably The Park Inn on the 68 Manchester Road which is supposedly haunted by an ex landlord called Edwin. It probably has a high fence surrounding it! The snack bars in the ground serve up excellent hot dogs, burgers and chips. Outside the ground is a Fish Bar which is very conveniently placed close to the ground in Whalley Road and opposite The Grey Horse pub it comes highly recommended by my contacts and I can recommend the Steak Puddings (meat and gravy encased in suet) which were available last season.

The Social Club: The social club is out of bounds to away fans before the game.

Ground Description: Accrington Stanley are a 1968 reincarnation of the old league club that played at the Peel Ground and folded in 1962. The existing ground stands and terracing have only been around since the 1990s. The main stand is actually two separate stands one either side of the halfway line and there is seating for around 1,200. The Whinney Hill stand opposite the main stands is covered seating although it is a little shallow. With segregation in force it is the open Coppice Terrace is given to the away contingent. The slightly larger newly covered home end The Sophia Khan Terrace with seating at the very front completes the picture.

Rivals: Burnley, Blackburn and even further back in the black and white days with long shorts, wing wizards, halfbacks and magic sponges, Nelson.

Admission Prices: Terrace Adults £15, Concessions (Students with ID, OAPs and under 18s) £10, Juniors and U17s £5.

Our Last Meeting & Memories: It was a long trek home from our last visit in April 2011, Mark Marshall's goals was the only cheer in a 3-1 defeat. Our last meetings in the Conference in season 2004-05 produced two home wins. In the February a 4-1 Stanley victory certainly was a wake-up call to then table-topping Bees and Giuliano Grazioli's last minute goal was purely a consolation. Morton became a presenter on Play School. Accrington's famous sons and daughters also include Morecambe FC President Jim Bowen, National Lottery expert (who is so mystic that she still has to work) Mystic Meg, Cricketer David Lloyd and numerous world renown actors from Coronation Street and Emmerdale (Farm).

Ladies To Make Underhill Return

Barnet FC Ladies will make a welcome return to Underhill this Sunday 15 January 2012 when they resume their fixtures after the Christmas and New Year break. The Bees will entertain Cardiff City in an FA Women's Premier League fixture, which will kick-off at 2pm.

Barnet ended 2011 with two "home" fixtures at Uxbridge FC's Honeycroft ground during a period of heavy activity on the pitch at Underhill. These matches resulted in a 4-2 win against Nottingham Forest and a 2-2 draw with Charlton Athletic. The Ladies' last appearance at Underhill was for the 1-4 defeat against Sunderland in early November. Barnet's first scheduled FA Women's Premier League National Division fixture of the New Year against Coventry City on Sunday 8th January was postponed due to a waterlogged pitch.





With Barnet playing away for the next two Saturdays, the next League 2 encounter at Underhill will not be until the last weekend of this month, with the Bees squaring up to the Railwaymen of Crewe Alexandra in their first 3.00pm Saturday home league kick-off since the end of October, writes James Castle. Alex find themselves safely ensconced in mid-table prior to Saturday's home league match against Plymouth Argyle, and will be hoping to do as well as they did in their last away fixture, a 5-2 victory at Bristol Rovers.

Only Cheltenham and Southend, currently second and third in the table, have won more games on the road in the division than Crewe's six so far this season, a record that has seen the club take almost two-thirds of their current points haul away from Gresty Road this campaign. The Bees can take heart from the fact that their next visitors have lost as many as they have won, and a fast start from Lawrie Sanchez's men may prove to be an advantage, with the Alex winning all but one of these away games after opening the scoring.

Brief Directions by Road: A nice an easy one! M1 to junction 15a (signposted Northampton (N) A43). Simply follow the signs for the A43. After approx. 2 miles take the 2nd exit at the roundabout, effectively straight on (still on the A43) and you will see the ground directly ahead. Follow this road until you reach the next roundabout adjacent to the Little Chef and TGI Friday and turn right into the stadium complex.

Car Parking: After turning into the complex turn right at the next small roundabout and down the slope to the parking area to your right. There is a £3 charge for parking. In the past I have experienced delays in getting out of the car park and onto the A43 after the game, therefore try and get a space close to and facing the exit gate.

Directions by Train: London Euston trains bound for Birmingham New Street stop at Northampton, journey time approx. 75 minutes. Once outside the station a choice of three buses will take you to the ground, the numbers 1, 27 and 28. A taxi will cost about £6.00. Walking time from the station to the ground is around 30 minutes and a bit of a trek.

Eating and Drinking Locally: The Magic Tower is a pub/restaurant on the complex which gets full of home fans before the game while the Sixfields Tavern never used allow away fans - no 100% sure this has been relaxed. The Megabowl, behind the home end

has a good range of drinks while TGI Fridays is allegedly where most away fans head for. The best bet is to find a pub in the town centre like my good self get there early enough for a meal and a quiet drink. There are a couple of those unmentionable fast food establishments in the leisure complex a few minutes walk from the car park but very little else apart from the Old Orleans which is an OK bar/restaurant – inexpensive grills/steaks. Food inside the ground I am reliably informed is OK, fairly varied and of average price.

Ground Description: Northampton Town originally played at the Northamptonshire County Cricket ground, which was only 3 sided as directly opposite the modest main stand was the expanse of the cricket pitch.

The fully covered Sixfields Stadium was opened in October 1994 with a full house for the visit of a certain Barnet FC whose goal in the 1-1 draw was scored by Dougie Freedman. The arena, which frankly has little character but football has changed and this type of the stadium is now the norm, resembles a larger version of the stadium constructed for Chester City but is all seated. The single tiered main stand holds 4,000 while the Alwyn Hargrave Stand opposite about half that number. The stands at either end of the ground (South and North) are identical and do not quite stretch the width of the pitch. These stands are designed to allow for easy extension. The Paul Cox Panel & Paint South Stand is reserved for away fans and can accommodate up to 800 although some seats have restricted views. It does however have excellent facilities for the disabled.

Admission Prices: South Stand – Adults £19, Concessions £15, Under 18s £6. Disabled £13 (with carer free of charge)

Our Last Meeting & Memories: Our last visit was in February when we came home with a point in a 0-0 draw in front of nearly 5,000. Our visit in 2005 was very memorable however when the floodlights failed before the teams returned after an eternity and Nicky Bailey sealed a superb 2-1 win. Barnet have had some unforgettable times against Northampton Town including winning an FA Cup 1st round replay in 1989 when we were still a Conference side 1-0 on one of the coldest evenings ever. The winning goal was eventually credited to the much missed Kevin Durham direct from a corner in the second half. Barnet held on, just. However the replay should never have been as the Cobbler's Bobby Barnes was guilty of one of the misses of the decade in the first game drawn 0-0 at Underhill in front of the Match of the Day cameras.

Celebrity Watch and Interesting Info: Northampton are the only club to suffer four successive relegations from Division 1 to Division 4 although they may not thank you for reminding them. The road which leads to Sixfields - Walter Tull Way - is named after allegedly only the 2nd black footballer in English Football - Lieutenant Tull was unfortunately killed in action in France during Word War 1. Formula 1 motor racing brothers Michael and Ralph Shumacher bought a sizeable piece of land close to Northampton and built a pair of houses for their families. American actor and singer David Soul, famous for his role as 1970s TV Cop Ken Hutchinson in Starsky

& Hutch and two number 1 hit singles in the UK has a cottage in the nearby village of Upper-Elmington. Northampton Town had allegedly made offers for various Barnet players over the years including Dougie Freedman, Duncan Hardy, Roger 'Harry' Willis and Andy Clarke.







The founder of "Programme Monthly" magazine John Litster describes the programmes and the often fascinating stories that lie behind them in a series that he calls...COLLECTORS'TALES...

And who knows what an autographed programme from tonight's final will bring in the years to come?...

Collecting autographs used to be a compulsory part of being a young football fan. In the days when there was easy access to players as they came and went from the local football ground for matches and training, there was usually a number of shiny faced schoolboys waiting with pencils and autograph books poised.

Norman Shiel remembered his autograph collecting days in issue 251 of Programme Monthly. "As a youngster I had a couple of autograph books on the go and they now contain a very motley collection of items. Stanley Matthews in the early sixties sent a reply from Stoke to my plea for an autograph and it certainly looks genuine to me. Some I was able to get myself at the various benefit and charity games which brought stars, usually in their twilight years, closer to the fans; Len Shackleton, Jackie Milburn, Brian Clough and such like all fall into this category.

I also have, however, religiously stuck into my album a series of Newcastle United players autographs from the midsixties which came through the local paper in return for vouchers. I have to this day no idea whether they are genuine. After all we are surely most of us aware of the signed footballs given away by clubs to sponsors or draw winners who have indeed been signed but not by the players!

"I do have one album which was given to me at the end of the season by a player. He was never a big name playing only a few games for Nottingham Forest in the early sixties but because he came from my part of the world and knew the family he simply left the album in the visiting dressing room for a season and sometimes there would be a few signatures, sometimes loads. I see no reason to doubt the authenticity of these.

"For myself I much prefer items which are in themselves desirable and then further enhanced by autographs. Menu cards are very good examples of this. I have tried to collect them from the post cup-final banquets after all the pre-war finals. This is neither easy nor cheap. Some I have which are plain and they can be attractive and, depending on what is



in them, of some historical interest. The ones that really come to life however are those which have the signatures of the players and often some of the more or less distinguished guests. Bob Crompton an early Rovers great signed the 1928 menu as manager; Tom Webster drew a whole cartoon with his signature in the huge 1933 menu and Stanley Rous' neat signature is there in 1935, his first final as secretary to the FA. My favourite however is the Bolton menu from 1923 which was given to me by the son of the Wanderers goalkeeper.

"Autographs on programmes usually make them look scruffy. Even at my age I couldn't resist getting big Neville Southall to sign my Exeter City programme after a visit from Torquay for whom he was then playing. Generally however the only signatures that seem attractive to me on programmes are when they have been specially done by a complete side after a special match. My friend Ceri Stennett has a superb example of this which he got from his friend Ernie Curtis, the last surviving player from the Cardiff Cup-Final team of 1927. He has the match programme signed by all the Cardiff players at the time and then signed again by Curtis with a dedication personally to him. Presumably all the other Cardiff players must have had similarly signed programmes which may or may not have survived.

"Does it matter when something is signed? I don't really know how to answer that. One of the few signed photographs I have is of William McCracken in his prime, sent to me as a schoolboy and signed by the great man in his old age. I treasure that even though it was signed decades after he finished playing."

Without doubt, historical documents in the history of the game.


