Adi Yussuff...

THE Tanzanian striker signed for the Brewers after a trial period with the club during the summer. Born in Zanzibar, he progressed through the Leicester City Academy where he was a regular goalscorer. Last season saw him get his first taste of senior football with a loan spell at Conference side Tamworth where he scored twice in six starts for the Lambs. After his release from the Foxes, he impressed Brewers boss Paul Peschisolidi in training and in two trial games, scoring once, to earn a one-year contract at The Pirelli Stadium.



Andy Corbett...

CURRENTLY Albion's second longest serving player, Andy signed a new two-year deal in the summer that will see him bring up ten years with the club by the time his contract ends. A versatile and dependable player, he initially signed as a striker from Nuneaton Borough in November 2003 for a nominal fee.



Chris Palmer...

A versatile player comfortable at the back or in midfield, Palmer turned down the offer of a new contract with previous club Gillingham to move nearer to his Derby roots during the summer. Born and brought up in Derby, he joined Derby County as a youngster but left without making a first team appearance for the Rams. He then had a loan spell at Hereford United before spells at Notts County, Wycombe Wanderers and Walsall.



Cleveland Taylor...

TAYLOR'S return to the Pirelli Stadium on a two-year deal came after one season in the Scottish Premier League with St Johnstone. Popular with both the fans and his fellow players, he first joined Albion on loan from League One side Brentford in January 2010 and was a big hit but opted to try his luck north of the border last season.



Kee's scouting mission

BURTON Albion striker Billy Kee was amongst the crowd at The King Power last weekend to see Town's FA Cup encounter against Leicester City. The frontman began his career with the Foxes before being released in 2010 and after a spell with Torquay United, he signed for Burton in August 2011.



Keeping up appearances

VETERAN goalkeeper Kevin Poole, a member of the Leicester City side that lost to Swindon in the 1993 Play-Off final, is still registered as a player with the Brewers. He signed a new one-year deal last summer although the 48-year old is yet to make a first team appearance this term. In total he has made 429 league starts during an established career and now passes on his experience as goalkeeping coach at The Pirelli Stadium.



Last time out

THE last meeting between the two sides came at The Pirelli Stadium in mid September with the home side earning all three points in a 2-0 win for the Brewers. Despite a bright start for the visitors, Town left empty handed.





Paul Peschisolidi

the gaffer

PESCHISOLIDO is now in his third season as Burton Albion manager and passed 100 games in charge towards the end of last season.

His appointment to the Albion hot-seat was something of a surprise as the Brewers embarked on their first season as a Football League club and with the Canadian international striker's only previous managerial experience coming in the months prior to his appointment as assistant at Irish side St Patrick's Athletic.

A long and successful playing career under some of the games most charismatic managers gave the Brewers boss plenty to take into his managerial career when he succeeded caretaker manager Roy McFarland in May 2009 after the Brewers Blue Square Premier Division championship success.

In a distinguished playing career, Peschisolido also represented Canada at junior, youth, under-23 and full international level earning 53 caps and scoring 11 goals for the national side. This added to a total of 520 senior club appearances and 137 goals accumulated over a 15-year playing career. He began his footballing career in North America with Toronto Blizzard in his native Canada and with the Kansas City Comets in the American Major Indoor Soccer League. A move to England followed and he went on to enjoy established spells with Birmingham City, Stoke City, West Bromwich Albion, Fulham and Derby County.

AFTER slamming home his third goal of the campaign at Southend United on Tuesday night, midfielder Jonathan Smith is more determined than ever to help the Robins to promotion this term.

ALAN McCormack has returned to the side with distinction following his recent suspension. Now, the in-form Irishman is targeting a unique league and cup double.

Fans are still pinching themselves after Tuesday's convincing win at Southend. How did the players react afterwards?

Funnily enough, before the game a few of the boys were saying how good it would be to be a couple of goals ahead at half-time. When we went two-nil up it was as though the game was going exactly how we wanted it to. We knew if we kept good shape and discipline and played a high line up the pitch we would create chances. If you look at the stats we only had six shots but scored from four of them. It just goes to show you don't always have to dominate games or create chances. I think that's the first time this season we've scored at the right time, made the most of our set pieces and scored nearly every time we've gone forward. That's down to the work we're doing on the training pitch but also our attitude. Our desire to win the game was crucial. We wanted

to win it more than them and we knew what the win would do for our league position. We truly believe we should be up there and I think we're getting our rewards now.

Having finally caught the teams we've been chasing, does that affect our mentality and approach at all?

Now we've broken into the top three we know the task now is to stay there. It has been a hard graft to get there, you only have to look at the run we've been on to see that. We've lost one of the last 18 league games and that's the sort of run we've had to put together to get into this position. Every game has been tough and we know we've slipped up at times but we don't hold a grudge, we just get on with it, move on to the next game and set ourselves up for the next opposition. We've proved that we'll win games with the right attitude and mentality.

We know how good we are

and how good we can be, but we can't allow ourselves to get cocky. We know what we have to do – that gets drilled into us Monday-Friday on the training pitch. It's not about going out there thinking you're better than the opposition, it's about going out there and proving that's the case. If you can go out on a Saturday and show that you want to be better than the man next to you and be better than the team you're playing against then we know by working hard off the ball, with the quality of players we have, we'll cause problems when we get possession.

Every game will come with added pressure now, simply because of how tight it is at the top...

The league is very close. You saw last weekend that because we didn't play we dropped two or three places and that's what will happen now when teams lose. There's now just a point or two separating teams in the top three from fifth and sixth and we know we can't afford any mistakes or mishaps. We can't drop any more points.

The games against the sides around us come thick and fast, continuing today...

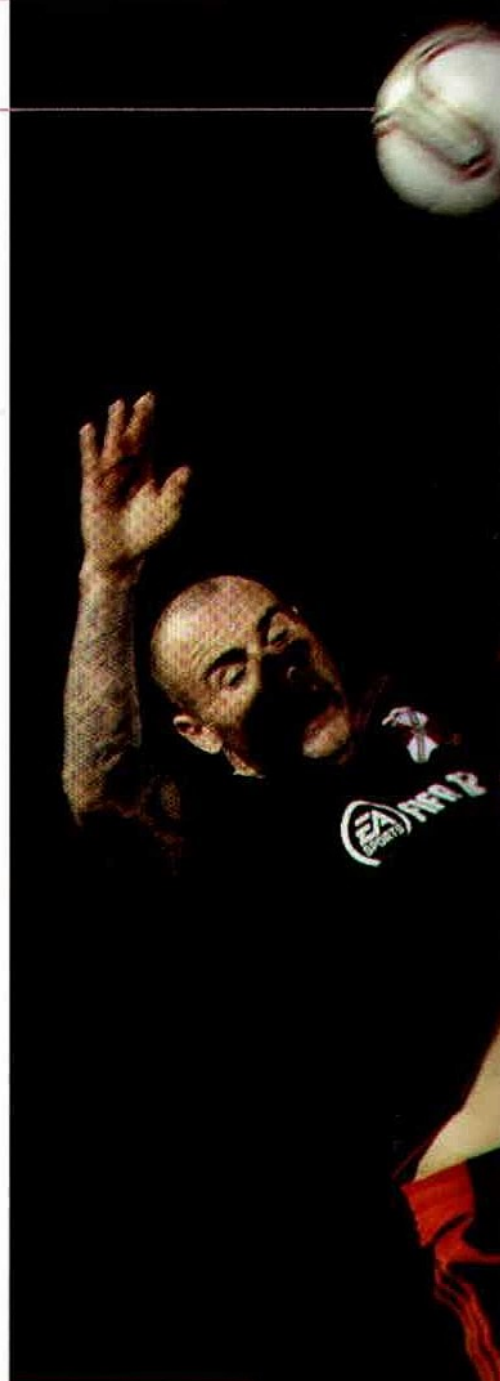
Burton have beaten us this season so we're looking forward to trying to get our revenge. It wasn't enjoyable going up there and getting beaten but we're on a good run now, we're full of confidence and we want the games to come thick and fast. We just want to win as many points as we can while we're on this run. We want to go top and we want to win this league and we truly believe we can.


Do you relish these games against the bigger sides in the division?

There's nothing like going out and playing against the best teams at your level. We can't wait to play Crawley and Cheltenham, particularly because both games are at our place. We're looking to go out and really punish them and show them we deserve to be at the top of the league. That's not arrogance, that's just a belief that with the squad we have that we can do that.

Has it been hard trying not to think about the opportunity we have of getting to Wembley?

Wembley has been mentioned and will continue to be mentioned until Tuesday night. Not many players get the chance we've got to get there and for those of our lads who have tasted it [in the play-off final in 2010] they don't want to say they've only been there once and lost. Tuesday will bring enthusiasm and excitement and hopefully we'll get one step closer not only to Wembley, but

lifting the trophy. If you look at the situation we're currently in the double is definitely on for us. We have a mentality and an attitude that means we'll keep trying to do the right things. We want to win every game and there is a belief we can win both the trophy and the league.

You've just returned from suspension and seem to have continued where you left off in the centre of defence. Are you enjoying playing at the back?

I'm really enjoying playing in defence. I didn't know what to expect when I first went in there because I'd never played there before, but I've gone in there and had great help from everyone around me. When I was first asked to play there I never imagined I'd be there for long. Now, it's about having the belief that I can play there. I've worked really hard and learned a lot and that's the way I look at it. I truly believe I can play there now and to a high standard. It's what I love to do.

The six, seven lads who have played across the back this season have all been in top form and that makes my life a hell of a lot easier! When everyone is playing well it makes learning the game a lot easier and the gaffer, players and staff will always tell me if I'm doing things wrong, particularly on the training pitch. Every Saturday I feel I've learned a bit more and I'm really enjoying it. We've got a great defensive record and I think there aren't many, if any, who have conceded less in the division. I think we have one of the best defensive records in the country and that's something to be proud of for everyone who has played a part.



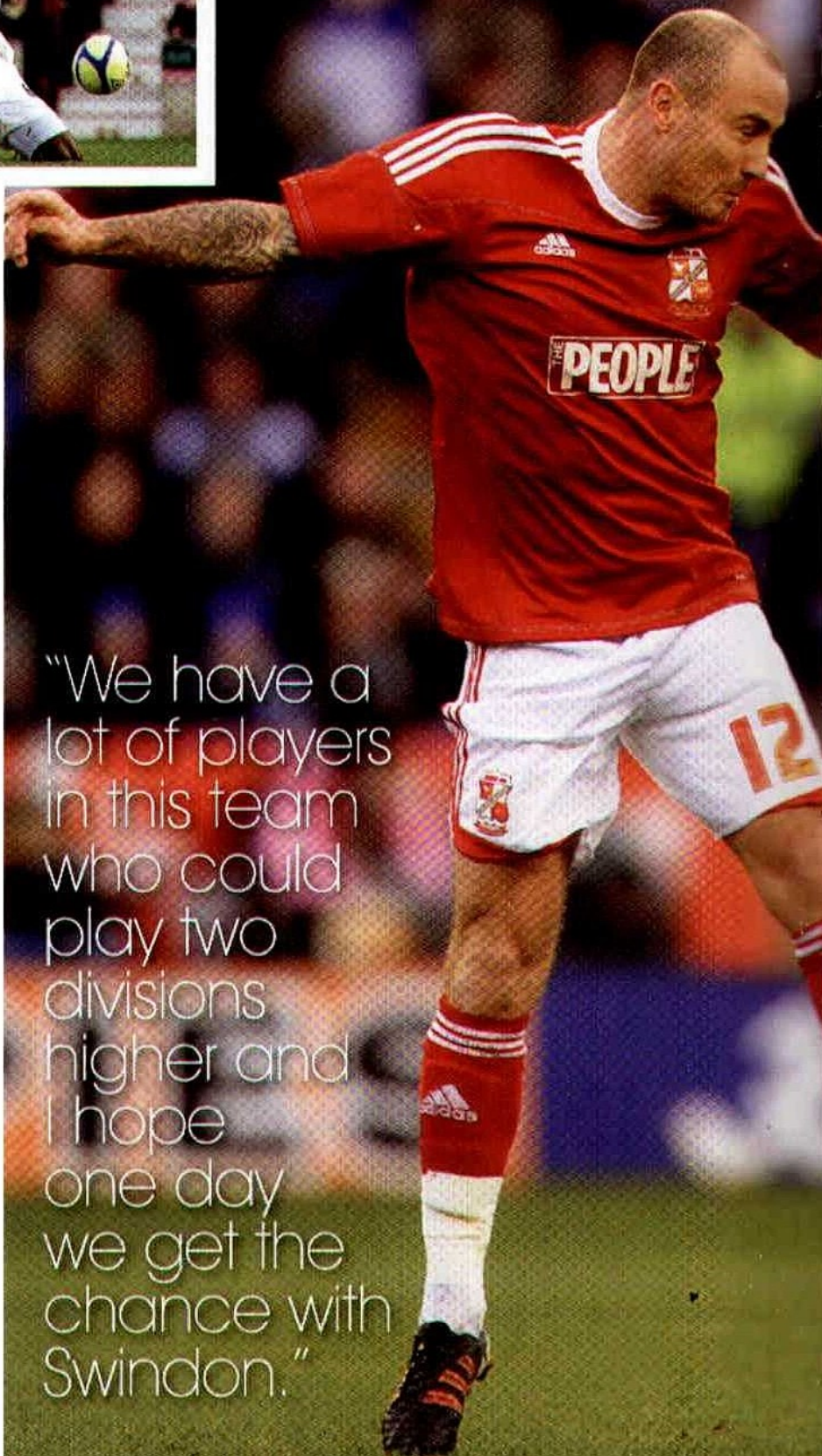
You've mentioned the number of players who have contributed at the back... are we beginning to see the strength of the squad now?

I think so. We rarely have the same team week in, week out and the gaffer is always keeping things fresh depending on the opposition. Look at the Southend game, Ronan Murray came in despite the fact Alan Connell has been in fine form, and Ronan had a great game. He helped stretch their defence and his pace was short and sharp which enabled him to get round players quickly. When you can chop and change three to four players every week and still enjoy good performances and create chances, then it's a good situation to be in.

Is there any danger of tiredness affecting us now we're playing so many games?

It is getting harder and harder after every game as the season goes on, but we're getting a lot of rest now as well. We got back from Southend at about 1.30am and on the Wednesday we just did a bit of work stretching the legs – including some light jogging – all in preparation for Saturday. With so many games coming up rest is as important as training. After Saturday's game at Leicester, for example, we were told to stay in. The next day we had a team

meeting and a massage, spa and jacuzzi followed by a light bit of training.

It seems like all the hard work done earlier in the season is paying off...

We've trained hard to be fit at this stage of the season. It has been a case of working long hours, which not many of us were used to. It was kind of unheard of to train every day and all the time. Instead of an hour-and-a-half three days a week it was two-and-a-half hours most days before winding down in the build-up to a match on a Saturday. None of us had been used to that and I think a lot of us found it difficult at first. It wasn't the old-school type of training that used to see players running themselves into the ground. Instead we were doing specific types of running based around positional play and practical technique work. Anyone watching us play now will see how we've progressed as a team and we're getting better and better all the time. All that hard work is paying off.

Do you think the hard work has created a close bond between the players?

Everyone associated with the club will tell you there's a great atmosphere around here at the moment. On the way home from Southend we were all sat in a big group around a couple of tables listening to a bit of music in the background, occasionally having a little sing song. We're a very close bunch at the moment and I believe that can help us. Sometimes things won't go your way, you might be losing a game, for example, but if you believe in your teammates and the strength of quality then that can be enough.

The fans are very much part of

that. They come far and wide to watch us in large numbers. We had 1,200 at Torquay and a similar number at Northampton... these are small grounds and sometimes not the prettiest of places and the weather can be really cold. The players are aware of that effort and we appreciate it. We're aware of the noise they make and we can tell the numbers are going up each week. If we can continue to do it on the pitch and the fans can play their part off it then this club will continue to become a close network. We're enjoying it.

That seems to be the vital thing at the moment, it's a fun time to be part of the club.

I think all the players are just enjoying themselves. There are obviously some who want to be playing more regularly but you don't expect players to be left out and be happy about it. That's part and parcel of being a player. But all of us are learning a great deal, we're being taught a hell of a lot and I think we're not only enjoying that but doing so as a group. We're all young enough to learn a great deal and we feel we can progress. We have a lot of players in this team who could play two divisions higher and I hope one day we get the chance with Swindon.

Do the players believe they can compete at a higher level?

I said after Tuesday night's game that I really feel if we could go up this year we'd get promoted again next season. You look at how we play football and how we organise ourselves, it's Championship-level stuff. We've beaten Huddersfield, Bristol City, Exeter, Colchester and Wigan - we've got good shape and the basis of a really good team and that can get you a long way in football.

- classic encounters - gone for a burton

CLUB Historian Paul Plawman looks back at a previous meeting between Town and a Burton-based side and he's had to go some way back to find this encounter, which ended with a Swindon win.



**Swindon Town 5
Burton Wanderers 3**
31 October 1896

FOR three years in the mid-1890's the town of Burton could boast having two Football League clubs - Swifts and Wanderers. The two later merged as Burton United, but the new club lost its League status after only six seasons.

With a Southern League programme of only 20 fixtures, Swindon had plenty of blank dates available for friendlies and Wanderers were joined by West Bromwich and Derby as Football League visitors to The County Ground during 1896/97.

Town made three changes from the side that had slumped to a 6-2 home defeat by Chatham a

week earlier, one of them being goalkeeper Billy Leighfield for Jimmy Calderwood.

But the hosts were off to the worst of starts when David Skea conceded a free-kick from which Bob Brown netted. However, two goals in three minutes saw Swindon go in front through Joey Murray and Skea, Jack Hallam setting up both.

Bill Flanagan levelled for the visitors but Town went 3-2 up just before the break when skipper Jimmy Munro scored from the spot following a foul on Hallam. Leighfield then misjudged a Bill Devey effort to restore parity, but George Richardson edged Swindon in front once again, scrambling the ball home in a goalmouth melee.

Munro put Town further ahead with a second penalty, given when a Murray shot was listed away by Archer. Brown, who was to sign for Swindon in the summer of 1900, completed the scoring.

record a memorable 3-2 win over the league leaders Leeds United in the race for promotion from Division Two -

it's Swindon's first-ever win over the Yorkshire side. Gordon Strachan slotted home a penalty to put Leeds in front before Steve White set up Alan McLoughlin with an unselfish header. Steve Foley nodded in David Kerslake's cross to make it 2-1 before John Hendrie pulled a goal back.

Ross McLaren's low drive smacks in off the post just three minutes later to give Swindon the win with a performance manager Ossie Ardiles describes as their best of the season. The victory leaves Ardiles' side six points behind Sheffield United in second place.

1937 – 2012

"Some people think football is a matter of life and death.
I assure you, it's much more serious than that."

AT 01:30 hours on the morning of January 23rd Swindon Town lost one of its most treasured supporters when Nigel Eady finally lost his long and courageous battle against cancer, a disease that had aggressively marched through his body these past few years. I doubt the likes of Nigel Eady will pass our way again in this lifetime; it was a privilege to know him and to enjoy his unique company.

Born on the 15th April 1937, the second son to a family who farmed in West Hanney near Wantage, he was schooled at St Peters in Weston Super Mare and then at Lancing College in Sussex, a school renowned for its footballing prowess and where his love of the game was nurtured. His passion for the football saw him attend his first fixture at The County Ground on 20th September 1947, where along with his father, and 18,000 other supporters, he witnessed the Town losing 2-1 to Newport County. Despite the loss he was hooked and even found the opportunity to be excused school in Sussex to watch his beloved Swindon Town when they played Brighton.

As a regular Season Ticket holder, he would sit with his father in The Arkell's Stand for every home game, until his father's death in 1968. He seldom if ever missed a home fixture until his own death last week and with a little more leisure time available in later life; he would also select



certain away fixtures to dovetail with his interest in visiting other parts of the country. Travel was one of his many interests and travel was not restricted to the United Kingdom. He would travel abroad and take in visits to some of the world's most grand and not so grand stadia, delighting his audience with the many stories on his return to these shores. As part of his stadium visits he was a regular at Wembley and was present for the first fixture in the new stadium, just as his father was present for the first fixture in the original stadium. His last game at The County Ground was the Town's memorable victory over Wigan Athletic in the FA Cup just a few weeks ago.

Away from football he was busy managing the West Hanney farm and on part of which he planted two community woodlands which gave him great pleasure. He also was extremely proud of his wonderful collection of National

Geographic magazines which were all meticulously catalogued and displayed in his home. He was a most trusting man, leaving for home and away fixtures and overseas trips, never thinking to lock his front door. Trust, integrity, and honesty are just some of the words friends would use to describe this unique and authentic character.

Married, albeit briefly, he had no children and would often describe Swindon Town Football Club as his child, being very attentive to its care and upbringing. He considered his extended friendships, which the football club was largely responsible for developing, as his family; a family that gave him much pleasure and happiness.

Nigel was laid to rest at West Hanney church on Thursday 2nd February, the service was attended by a vast number of his friends and extended family. In one of his last conversations with me, prior to his death, he left me in no doubt that we would be extremely displeased if less than 300 people turned up to say farewell. He would not have been disappointed by the attendance.

Nigel Eady, thank you - leaving us with treasured memories and much, much more, we are eternally grateful. RIP

WATCH out for the roundabouts' were Duncan Shearer's parting words to Lee Cox as he said his goodbyes at Inverness Caledonian Thistle before setting off for Wiltshire a week ago.

SHEARER (Duncan, not Alan) needs no introduction to the Swindon public after achieving iconic status following a £250,000 move from Huddersfield Town in the summer of 1988. Nicknamed 'The Postman', the striker went onto plunder 98 goals in 199 Town appearances before his controversial sale to Blackburn in 1992. Cox has worked hard for his Town move, but credits former England defender Terry Butcher as having had a big influence on his career. Despite hard graft in the

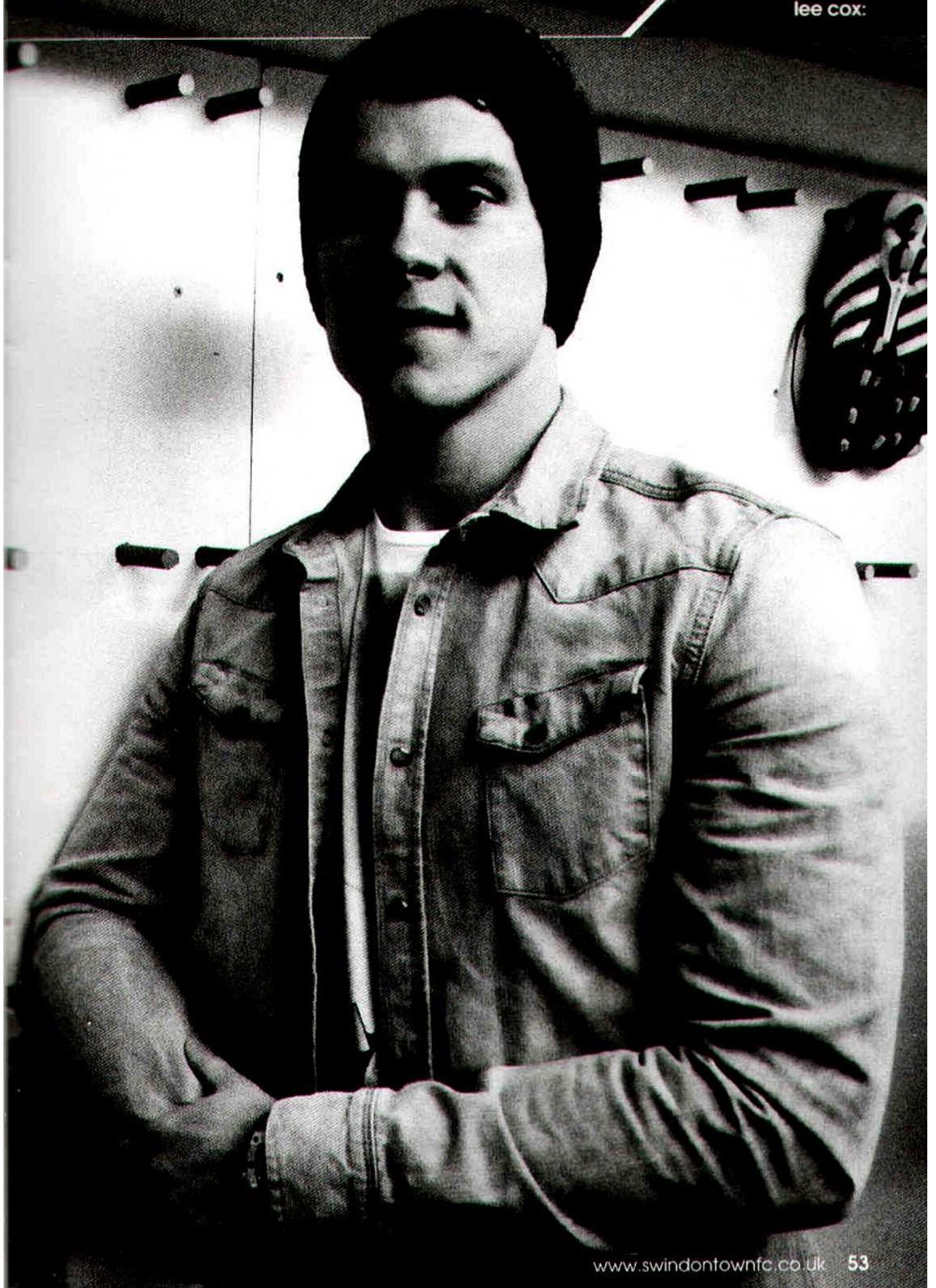

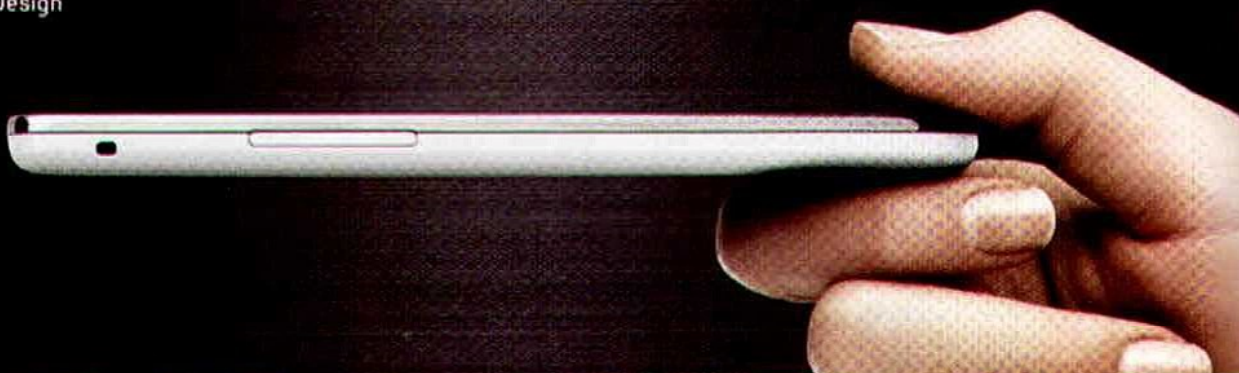

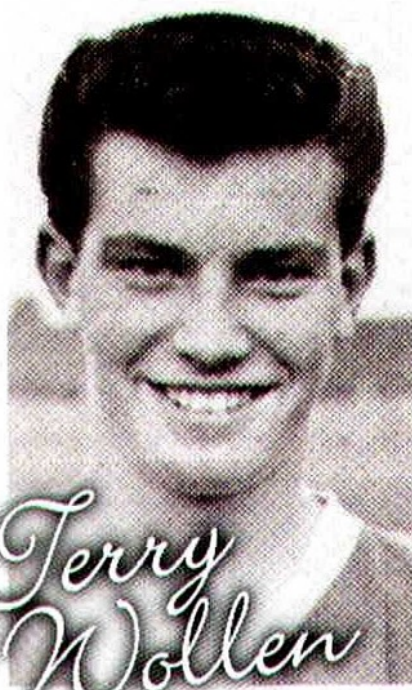
swindon town hall of Fame

THE next inductees to the Hall of Fame featured for Town over fifty years ago...

TERRY WOLLEN wrote his name in the record books with his first appearance for Swindon Town, forming with John Trollope the youngest full-back partnership in the history of the Football League.

Sadly, his career was to last only from 1960 to 1965 and to encompass 96 appearances but this was long enough for him to be part of the squad that achieved the first ever promotion in the club's Football League history when they won promotion to Division Two.

A sickening crack heard all around the ground in a match with Notts County in December 1962 resulted in a broken leg from which he never fully recovered. It was in footballing terms 'a life cut short ere noon' for without it a player described by his full-back partner as 'a better player than me' might have played for at least ten more years. As it was he made just nine more first team appearances. Such a misfortune would have caused many to turn their back on the game but Terry continued to be actively involved with the game running, a sports outfitters and working as a coach to try to give other youngsters a career that was denied to him. It was in this capacity that he continued to give valuable service to Swindon at the School of Excellence where he was described by John Trollope as 'the very best of coaches'.

KEITH MORGAN was one of the first of the local home grown talent raised by Bert Head.

Spotted playing for Westbury he made his Swindon debut aged just 18 and between 1958 and 1967 made an incredible 365 appearances. Ever present in the 1961/62 season he repeated the feat when he was captain of the Swindon team that clinched promotion for the first time in the club's history in 1963 and in the following season when Swindon for a brief period headed Division Two.

A member of the last generation when there were wing halves and inside forwards rather than midfield players he was equally at home in attack or defence often winning the ball and striding forward to turn defence into attack.

In the last season he saw first team action, he was a member of the team that knocked out First Division West Ham, whose team contained three of the team that had won the World Cup that summer, and scored a vital cup goal against Bury to help take Swindon into the Fifth Round.

Swindon was his only league club and when he could no longer play he became a frequent spectator looking down on the pitch he had graced so often.

Supporters Club Q&A

WE sometimes get asked similar questions about how the STFC Supporters Club is run so thought it would be good to cover some of these in today's notes....

Where is the Supporters Club?

Although the word 'club' often indicates fixed premises, we do not have one. Ahead of all home games, committee members can be found at the same table in the Legends lounge, so do come and say hello if you want information about our activities, or just have questions or would like more information. Incidentally, if you have never been in to the lounge take a look one day, there is lots of Swindon Town history featured.

What does the Supporters Club do?

The STFC Supporters Club is principally a fans organisation that raises funds to improve facilities for supporters, encourage youth development and also enhance the prospects for STFC. It also provides members with additional benefits and opportunities as part of the membership package.

Can fans still apply for membership?

Yes, either by visiting the website at www.swindontownsupportersclub.com and downloading the application form, or by picking up an information pamphlet and application form, that can either be collected from a member of the committee in the Legends Lounge on a matchday or from the away travel office which can be found on the approach to The County Ground from County Road.

Away Travel

Do the Supporters Club run the away travel coaches?

No. The away travel is operated independently by SAS Travel who are official travel partners. The STFC Supporters Club has a close working relationship with SAS Travel, as organisers Sally Carter and Marc Walters are committee members of the Supporters Club.

Do you have to be a member of the Supporters Club to travel with SAS?

No, anyone can use the service. However, if you are a Supporters Club member then you are entitled to a discounted price on the fare when booking for away trips on production of your membership card when booking.

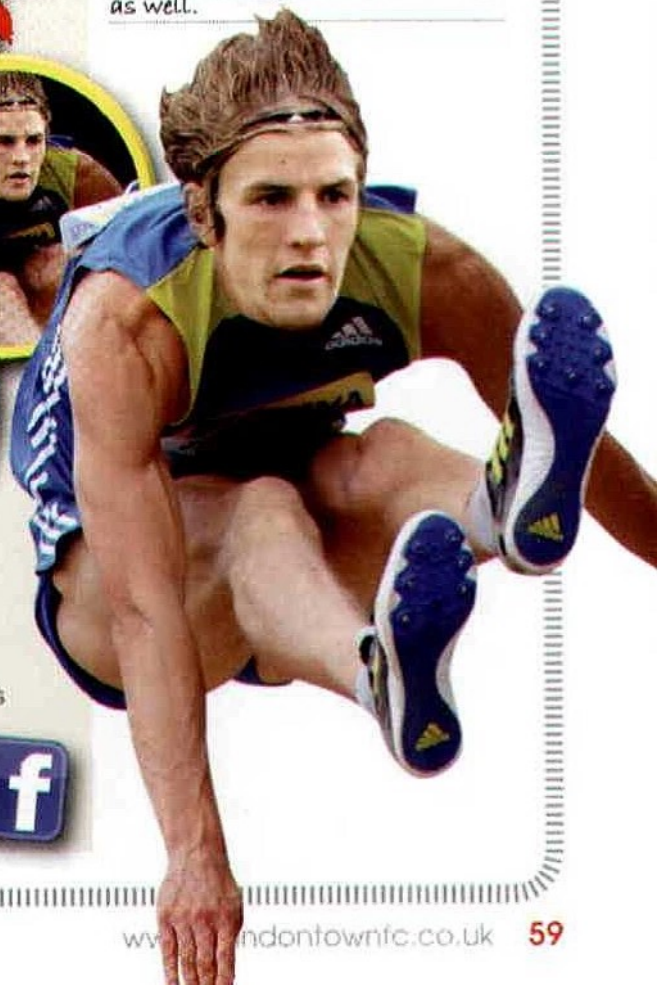
