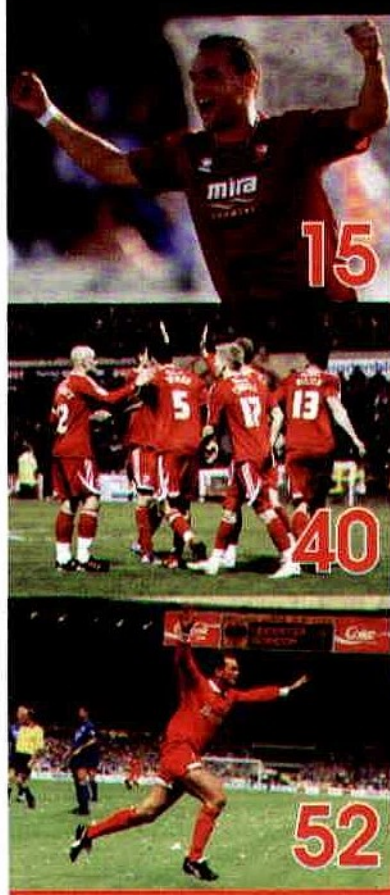

I was very pleased with many aspects of the game and the team have matured very well. The attitude of my players was excellent...

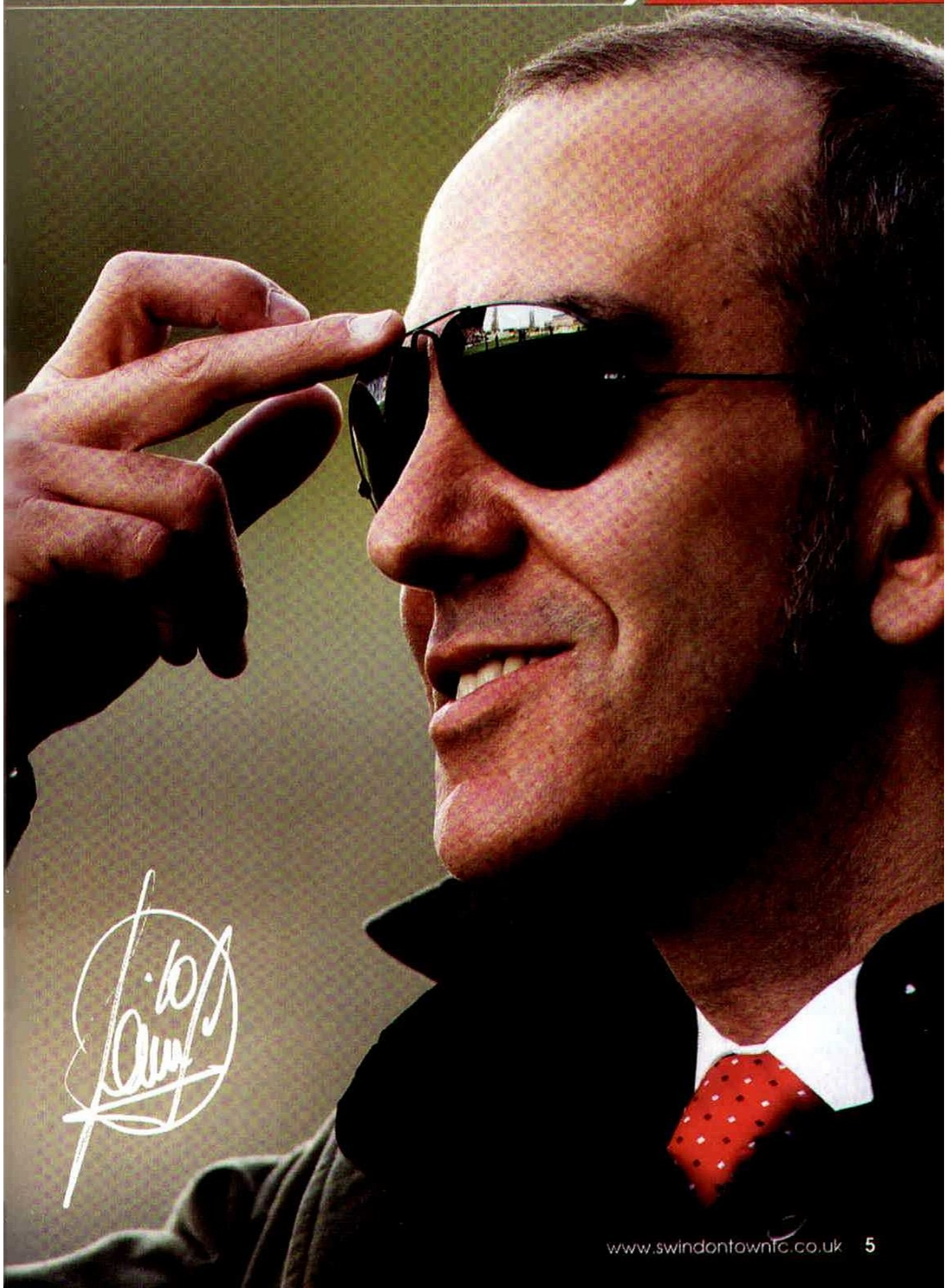
did well in many areas. We also had to adapt players into different positions; Risser went to centreback and McCormack went to right-back having also played at left-back on Saturday for a spell.

téhoué signs for town

SWINDON Town added to the squad on Wednesday with the loan signing of French striker Jonathan Téhoué from League One side Leyton Orient.

TÉHOUE could make his Town debut this afternoon after signing for the Robins earlier this week on loan until the end of the season.

Téhoué, 27, was in the stands to see Tuesday night's 4-0 win over Dagenham & Redbridge at The County Ground and put pen to paper on the deal on Wednesday lunchtime before giving his first interview exclusively to STFC Player, the club's official online TV service.

The Frenchman arrived at Leyton Orient in January 2010 following a successful trial period at the club. A strong striker with top flight experience in his native France, Belgium and Turkey, Téhoué came to E10 with an impressive pedigree and made a name for himself in England by netting Orient's equaliser in their 1-1 draw with Arsenal in the FA Cup last season.



His professional career began with French side SC Bastia, for whom he played seven Ligue Un matches in the 2003/04 season.

Injury disrupted his time at Bastia, and he moved to Cyprus to join APOEL in 2005

before returning to northern Europe with a spell at Belgian side Royal Excelsior Virton in the second half of the 2005/06 season.

His impressive form at Excelsior earned him a move to top flight side FC Brussels in the summer of 2006. Turkish Süper Lig club Kasimpaspor then came calling the following close season, and he also played for Konyaspor before a contract dispute ended his time in Turkey.

He looked set to join Huddersfield Town in the 2008/09 season, but the ongoing dispute with Konyaspor scuppered a move to England at that time.

But having secured his release from his Turkish club in late 2009, Téhoué began to make up for lost time by becoming a super-sub for the O's - 10 of his 11 goals last term came from the bench.

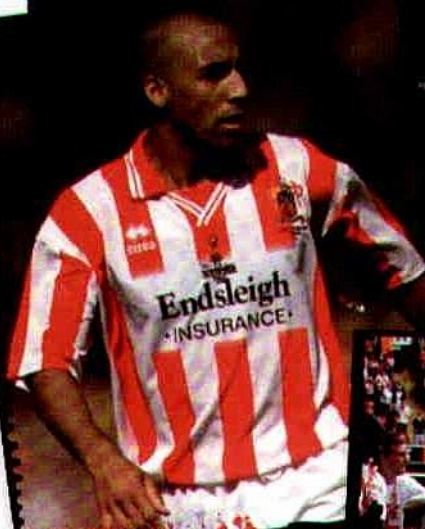

He soon moved to their local rivals Yeading and then joined Fisher Athletic for the 2007/08 season and scored 11 goals in 32 appearances for the Blue Square South side.

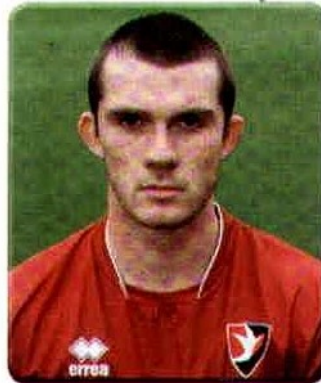


Josh Low...

LOW joined Cheltenham Town from Peterborough United during the 2008 August transfer window and signed a two-year deal with the Robins. The former Cardiff City and Welsh Under-21 international is a traditional right winger, who is able to take people on and provide crosses. At just over six feet tall he is also a powerful runner capable of supplying dangerous balls into the box and contributes the occasional goal himself.

Jimmy Spencer...

SPENCER joined Cheltenham Town on a six-month loan from Huddersfield in July 2011. The frontman, a graduate from the Terriers' academy, is a clever striker and was once the subject of a six figure bid from Manchester City back in his academy days. He joined Morecambe on loan for the entire 2010/11 season and scored eight goals in 32 appearances for the Shrimpers. He has scored eight goals in 36 appearances so far this term.



Brian Smikle...

THE winger is a former West Bromwich Albion trainee who had loan spells with Hereford United and Halifax Town. He then joined Kidderminster, where he was a member of the Harriers team under Mark Yates that reached the FA Trophy final in 2007 and during the 2009/10 campaign made 43 League appearances in the Blue Square Premier Division.

Last time out

CHELTHENHAM were in action on Tuesday night and went down to a 3-1 defeat at Morecambe in League 2. Darryl Duffy gave the visitors the lead before a brace from Kevin Ellison and a goal from Izak Reid sealed the win. The win saw the Shrimps complete the double over the Robins after a 2-1 victory at The Abbey Business Stadium in mid August.



Plans to expand

CHAIRMAN Paul Baker this week revealed plans to redevelop The Abbey Business Stadium. The club are looking into plans to build a new 3,000 capacity all-seater stand at Whaddon Road. Baker told BBC Radio Gloucestershire: "I think the will is there, I've always wanted to finish the jigsaw and finish the project. That would be this stand. It can be really exciting both for the sponsors and for the community."

THE away game at The Abbey Stadium was only Swindon's second game of the season on the road. The home side took all three points with a header from defender Steve Elliott the difference between the teams on the day. Elliott could return to the side today after recovering from an ankle injury.



mark yates

the gaffer

YATES was appointed Cheltenham Town manager on the 22nd December 2009 following the departure of Martin Allen. Yates left Kidderminster Harriers after four years to take his first step into Football League management.

His coaching career began in earnest working for Steve Cotterill as a coach at Burnley before taking his first management job back at Kidderminster. In his first season in charge he led the Harriers to the FA Trophy final against Stevenage Borough - the first competitive match at the newly re-built Wembley Stadium - and took them to sixth place in the Blue Square Premier.

Yates was given the task of keeping Cheltenham Town in the Football League on his arrival and he passed with flying colours with a number of top performances towards the end of the campaign.

The summer of 2010 saw the arrival of a number of key signings such as Wes Thomas, Steve Elliott and on loan midfielder Marlon Pack. Despite a prolific first half of the season, a dip in form saw the Robins edge towards a relegation battle once again which they ultimately avoided.

The current season has seen a rejuvenated Cheltenham side keep League One well within their sights under Yates' guidance with today's game another key clash in the promotion race.

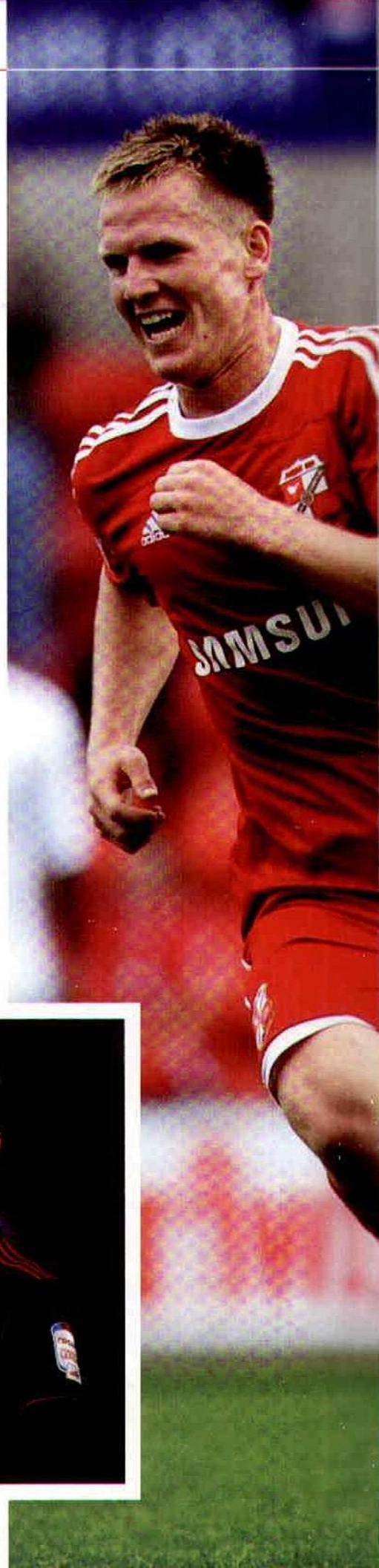
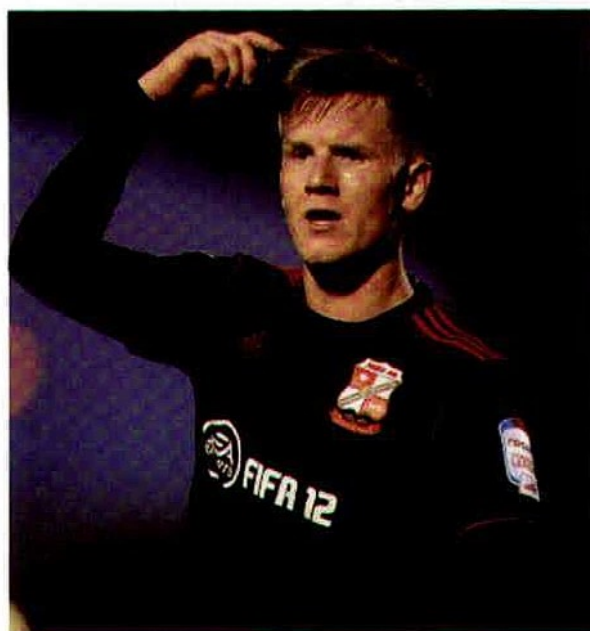
MP: It was a bit of a different scenario for me because I left on a free transfer. I went on loan to Cheltenham last season

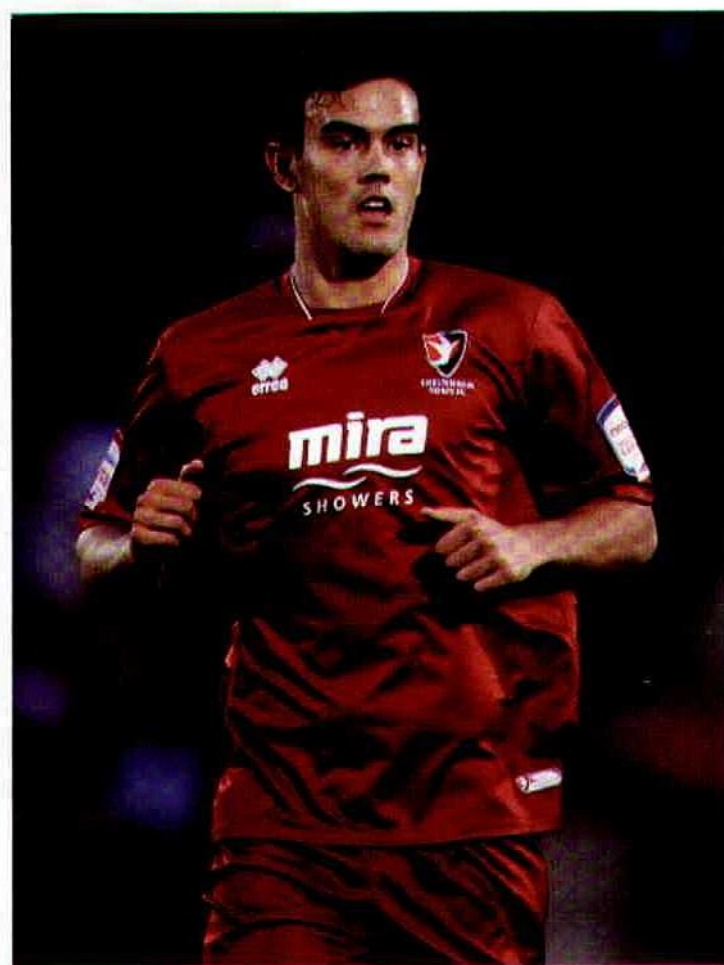

SWINDON Town produced a fine performance to register a 3-0 home victory over visitors Cheltenham Town back in February 2008 in League One. The win came with goals from strikers Simon Cox, Billy Paynter and Christian Roberts.

It was almost a case of déjà vu for the Town fans who had travelled to Huddersfield three days earlier and seen their side concede a first minute goal.

But thankfully, against a struggling Cheltenham, Peter Brezovan pulled off a fine save to deny Steve Brooker and Swindon went on to take the three points for the first time in five meetings.

The big Slovakian 'keeper saw a number of efforts go narrowly high or wide, but by the time substitute Christian Roberts raced on to a Hasney Aljofree free-kick ten minutes from the end, the game as a contest was over.

Town were gifted the lead on 20

minutes when the visitors made two defensive errors in quick succession. A poor clearance from Alex Russell was hit straight to a lurking Jon-Paul McGovern, who fired in a low cross to the far post. Gavin Caines failed to deal with it and the ball rebounded to Simon Cox for a simple tap in past Shane Higgs.



Swindon went further in front four minutes before the break when they again caught the visitors napping. From a free-kick given against Cox, the striker almost

immediately regained possession and sent the ball wide to Michael Pook. The midfielder, who was to join the Whaddon Road club in 2009, sent Anthony McNamee scampering down the flank before sending in a perfectly flighted cross for Billy Paynter to meet with a diving header.

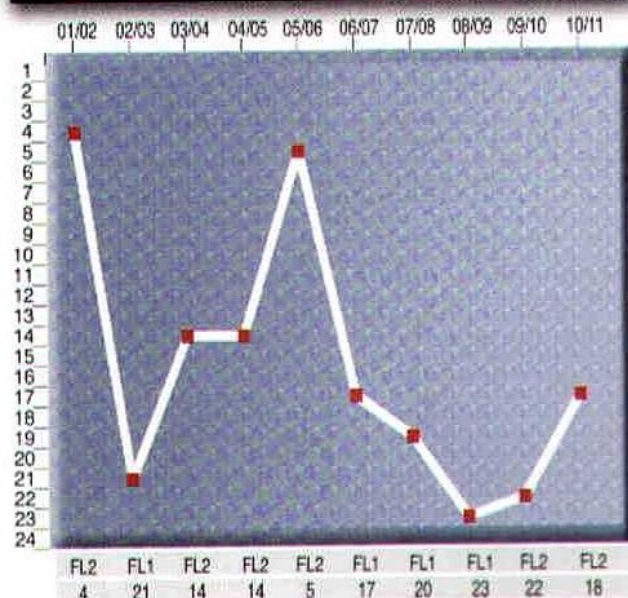

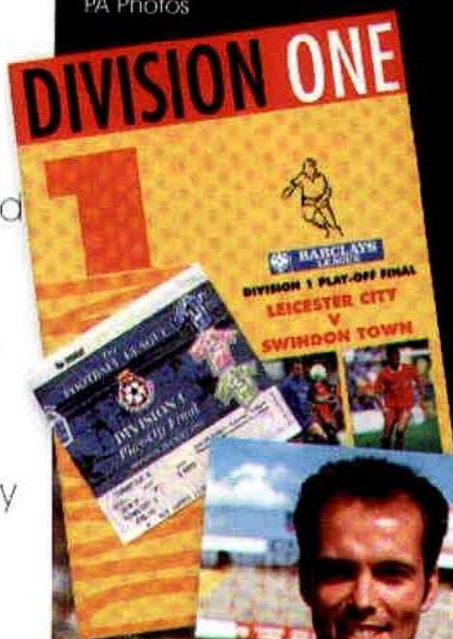
AFTER Glenn Hoddle had given Town the lead with just three minutes of the first half remaining, Swindon came out for the second half determined to build on their advantage. With the second period just two minutes old top scorer Craig Maskell was to give STFC fans the luxury of some breathing space by extending Town's margin.

CENTRE back 'Dohh' Shaun Taylor intercepted a ball meant for David Oldfield five yards inside the Leicester half. Carrying the ball down the left hand side, the defender released Maskell who held his run to remain onside wide on the left hand side. Cutting back inside the striker's pass picked out John Moncur 25-yards from goal, who looked to be setting himself up for a shot at goal.

Instead the ex-Tottenham man cut back, skipped past three challenges and played the ball past a fourth defender back to Maskell, who had again cleverly held back to beat the offside trap on the edge of the 18-yard box.

Then, from a couple of yards outside the corner of Leicester's six-yard box Maskell struck the ball hard and true, left-footed across goal and clattered the ball into the back of the net off the far post.

The Town striker cantered to the corner flag, arms outstretched, with a smile that seemed to say 'Did you see what I just did?' Mobbed by his marauding teammates in front of an ecstatic travelling Town support, Wembley was a sea of red and white.

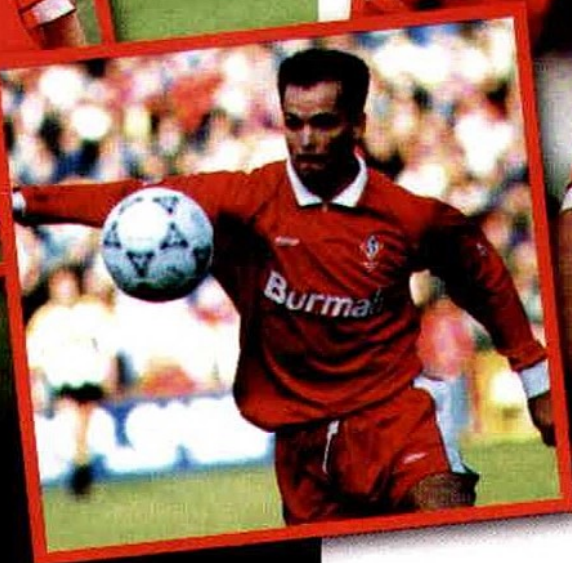
'It was pretty special for the Town striker as well, as he explained: 'It's a dream come true for me. To score a goal on my first trip

here and win promotion is almost unthinkable. John Moncur has made a lot of goals for me this season and it was his pass that put me in again.

'It wasn't an easy angle but I made up my mind to shoot for the far post. This time last year I was looking at playing another year in the old third division. It's been a fantastic turnaround and it means the world to me.'

Maskell then had a thought for all us Town fans: 'But the people who really matter today are the fans. There are some who have supported the club for the last 25 years or more and this day was as much for them as any of us.'

Thanks for that. I can promise you that all Townies enjoyed it every bit as much as you, but at 2-0 to Swindon and 47 minutes gone, this match was far from over.

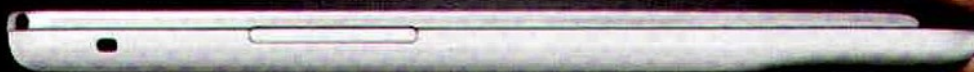

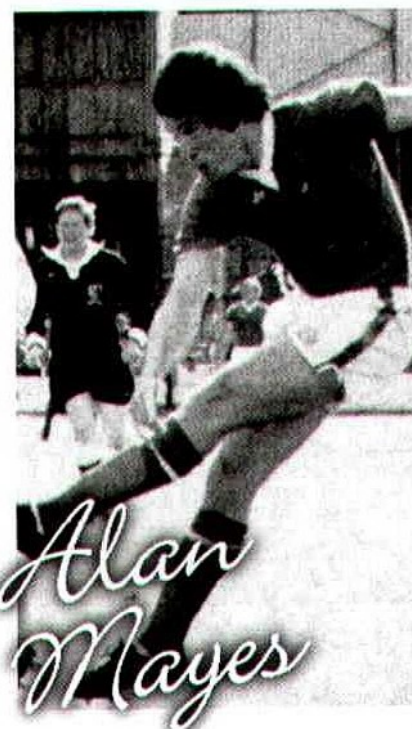
TODAY'S Hall of Fame inductees are well remembered for goals and guile...

JOHN MONCUR was signed for Swindon from Tottenham Hotspur by Glenn Hoddle towards the end of the 1991-2 season. Although his appearances were limited to 67 and his goals to six he made a lasting impression as one of the most gifted midfield players ever to wear the Town shirt.

Although his appearances were limited in the 1992/93 season by injury, he played in all three of the play-off matches weighing in with a vital goal in the semi-final away leg at Tranmere and helping the Town to win a place in the Premier League. The following season he won the Town's Player of the Year Award. Scoring the Town's first Premiership goal at Sheffield United with a quickly taken free kick, he missed only one match during the campaign. He also scored in the memorable 2-2 draw at Anfield.

Although this season was to culminate in relegation and see the end of his on field contribution to Swindon, he was still to prove of great benefit to the club. His sale to West Ham was eventually to realise over £1 million for Swindon, well over tenfold what he had originally cost the club.

He went on to make over 200 appearances for West Ham leaving Hammers fans, like those of Swindon, appreciative of a player whose performances always included skill and endeavour in equal quantities.



ALAN MAYES was originally brought to The County Ground by Bobby Smith and made an immediate impact by scoring a genuine hat-trick in a period of just 21 minutes on his debut at Rotherham United.

He was to go on to make 184 appearances for the Town in two spells between February 1979 and December 1980 and then between July 1983 to the end of the 1984/85 Season. During this time he scored 82 goals for Town, many of them as part of a formidable striking partnership with Andy Rowland which many supporters considered the outstanding Town scoring machine of the 1980s.

His most successful season was the 1979/80 one when he scored 19 League goals in 44 appearances and six more in a League Cup run which saw Swindon reach the semi-final. In July 1983, Ken Beamish brought him back to The County Ground and in his first season back he was the club's leading goalscorer with 17 goals in 34 appearances, a remarkable achievement playing in a team which finished 17th in the table.

Although injuries restricted his appearances in the 1984/85 season he still managed to average over a goal every other game before moving to Carlisle United at the end of the season. Although of slight physique he would pop up here, there and everywhere to net goals for the Swindon cause.
