ALL WE CAN DO IS GO FOR IT

t is a warm welcome back to Gresty Road for this afternoon's match with Swindon Town. Paolo Di Canio's side are currently top of the division and looking odds on to win the title sooner rather than later. Although they overcame us on the opening day of the season, they made an indifferent start to the season and some critics were questioning the appointment of Paolo in his first managerial role.

He rode that early storm, carried on introducing his own ideas and improved his squad. They have been the most consistent side at our level and their form in the second half of the season saw them achieve a 10game winning streak after losing to Torquay on Boxing Day. Every team with designs on promotion has to discover a level of consistency and Swindon have done that. They will deserve their immediate return to League One at the end of the season.

Paolo is a passionate Italian and he has been good for our league. He has raised the profile and interest in our football and he always has something enlightening to say in his interviews! It will be intriguing to come up against him this afternoon because he likes his team to play the right way. He has always been a winner as a player and is determined to be one as a manager and good luck to him.

We know that facing the current league leaders is going to be tough. We respect them and admire them for what they have achieved so far, but the players do not fear them. They have shown already this season that we can compete with the best sides in the league and get a result. We recently drew here with Shrewsbury after conceding an awful goal and if that hadn't had gone in when it did, it could have been a game we could have won.

The players have shown that neversay-die-attitude that I have been trying to instil since I took over. That was there in abundance again at Gillingham last weekend. After the disappointment of our performance at Rotherham, it was important that we bounced back with a better one down in Kent and the players gave it their all to get a result. We had to win the game twice if you like after throwing away a 3-1 lead far too easily, but I was delighted with the way they responded and continued to press for a winner. They got their reward with Max's (Clayton) injury-time winner. The lads deserved it and so did those supporters who made their way to Gillingham to support us. I'm sure you had an enjoyable journey home.

I publicly apologised for our performance at Rotherham and the players were told in no uncertain terms afterwards that it wasn't acceptable. It was by far our worst display under me as manager and I was so annoyed afterwards that I didn't go over to the travelling supporters to applaud them. They know that it is not my style at all and I can only apologise to them for that. It won't happen again and I hope the seven-goal thriller made up for it at Gillingham!

All the players put a shift in at the Priestfield Stadium but I must say Nick (Powell) was exceptional. I don't think you will ever see a better goal anywhere than his first one and his second was equally well executed for different reasons. He is now our top scorer with 11 goals and is only getting better with experience. We must congratulate him on his League Two Apprentice of the Year award, an honour he collected in London on Sunday evening.

It is important that we try and protect him as much as possible and as a club we have done that. We don't want to over expose him too much in the media and getting too involved with that. To his credit he doesn't take too much notice and as a Football Club we want his football to do his talking for him and he is certainly doing that at the moment. His goals and award marked a terrific week for him following his performance for England Under-18s against Poland. The support and atmosphere was great and everyone was very proud to see Nick, Max and Ben Garratt all on the pitch at the same time for their country, especially to have it here at the Alexandra Stadium. It was a big decision for me to allow Max and Nick to play for England instead of at Rotherham, but I think it was a one-off for them to play in front of their home crowd. I'm sure they would have enjoyed the experience.

I am going grey quicker and my voice is not the best from all the shouting but there is never a dull moment here at Crewe. You just never know what can happen and that is what makes us an exciting team. One thing is for certain with ten games left, we won't be sitting back and picking up draws. There are 30 points up for grabs and we want as many as we can get to make sure we have enough to be in at least 7th place. As usual we will be looking to win every game-, and will got for it.

Swindon will know they are in a game today and I'm sure Paolo will remind them that we were the better side in the first half at the County Ground back in August. We should have been two or three goals up at the break, but missed those chances and found ourselves 1-0 down instead after a dubious penalty on the stroke of half-time. They scored two more in the second half at the right time but we felt the score line was not a true reflection of the way we played.

We only have Carl Martin struggling at the moment with a thigh injury and it is very encouraging to have virtually a full squad to choose from. That is testimony to the physios at the club and the work Andy Franks has done on their fitness levels. We have had a busy schedule, so to come through virtually unscathed has been very pleasing.

Your support is gong to be very important in the remaining games and I can only thank you for the support you give the players. It makes a hell of a difference and all I can ask is that you get behind them again today from the first whistle to the last, as you have done.

"WE WILL KEEP FIGHTING RIGHT UNTIL THE END"

Defender Adam Dugdale says that the never-say-die-attitude that has been installed at the club always gives us a chance in our remaining ten matches. The Railwaymen showed that fighting spirit to win a seven-goal thriller against Gillingham last weekend and keep our play-off hopes very much alive. Young Max Clayton popped up in the right place at the right time again to head home a Byron Moore cross and seal three vital points in our quest to reach the top seven.

ugdale says that the Alex dressing room won't accept defeat until the final whistle: "We will continue to fight until the final minute of any match because you never know what might happen. Max has got in there and scored another important goal for us and we won't be settling for anything less than wins at this stage of the season.

"We killed ourselves really at Gillingham because we were 3-1 up and were cruising really. We have got to learn to see those type of games out because it did cost us against Wimbledon. We have to stop conceding the goals like we did. ' says Duggy. "The good thing is that we are fit as a group and have a great belief to go right to the end. It has paid dividends for us earlier in the season, like away at Morecambe, and we are now unbeaten in six games. We have a drawn a few in that run but we want to remain unbeaten for as long as possible to give ourselves the best possible chance of getting into a play-off place.

"It was an outstanding performance at Gillingham and some of the football we played on the day was exceptional. The two young lads have scored important goals and we all know what AJ (Leitch-Smith) is capable of when he gets chances.

"Nick's goal (the first one at the Priestfield Stadium) was unbelievable. I was close to him when he hit it and it has flown in the top corner. It was a fantastic strike and we all know what a talent he is. He is destined for big things and it certainly helps when you have him and Max in the team because you know they can score a goal out of nothing and win you the game."

> After serving a frustrating three-match ban following his dismissal at Barnet. Dugdale is determined to retain his place in the heart of the defence. The defender had prided himself on playing in

every game until his suspension and he is eager to finish the season strongly and win himself a new deal here at Gresty Road.

Next up this afternoon are table toppers Swindon Town and Dugdale knows it will be a stern test against the most consistent side at our level.

"Swindon are the best side in the league because they are top by some distance and have been outstanding over the last 20 games or so, ' says Adam. "It is the sort of game you look forward to as a player because you want to test yourself against the best.

"They have been on a great run and look favourites to win the league but we know that on our day we can be a match for anyone. They are all tough games because you can be facing a team with something to play for every week. Teams are going for promotion or a play-off place and then you have the teams fighting for their lives at the bottom, wanting to stay in the league.

"You have to earn every point and although we respect everyone, we don't fear anyone. All we do is look forward to the challenge and give everything we have to try and get a result.

Duggy added: "The dressing room was buzzing after what happened at Gillingham and we just want to take that confidence into the Swindon game and make sure our little run continues."

MAX CLAYTON

Clayton desperate for another start after late Gills winner

Amazingly Max Clayton's statistics for the first team actually stands at four goals from his two starts for the first-team! The 17-year-old produced a match winning touch once again at the Priestfield Stadium last weekend, when his injury time header from Byron Moore's cross sealed a remarkable three points in a seven-goal thriller. Boss Steve Davis had once again turned to his teenager to try and grab a late winner and he duly obliged with a glancing header into the far corner.

t was Clayton's England Under-18 International team-mate Nick Powell inspiring Crewe to a wonderful victory in Kent, scoring two exceptional goals and creating another for the recalled AJ Leitch-Smith but the local lad showed once again that he is a born goalscorer.

After Danny Spiller was red carded for a reckless challenge on our substitute Jordan Brown, the stage was set for Clayton to once again provide his match-winning intervention and keep our play-off hopes very much alive.

His winning goal at Gillingham ended an almost perfect week for the son of our former striker Paul Clayton. In mid-week he had started and finished for the England Under-18s in their fine 3-0 win here at Gresty Road over their Polish counterparts. He had a hand in a couple of those goals and showed the watching Steve Davis that he can also play in a wide role of a three.

It was no great surprise that Clayton described representing his country in front of his home crowd as 'right up there with making his senior debut'.

"I think playing for England at my

home ground was the proudest moment of my life,' said Max.

"It was a great night and I really enjoyed it and of course it was good to get a 3-0 win. Personally, I managed to get two assists as well so I have to be pleased with that and I'm glad that I could help the team to victory.

"It was a great turn out by the fans and a great game to play in. It's a night that I can't really speak about to be honest. Playing at Crewe for England was a dream really, and like I said it is really hard to explain what it meant to me."

Crewe Alexandra, England and Polish fans turned out in force for a friendly International to see our firstyear professionals Nick Powell, Ben Garratt and Clayton line up for their country.

It is the first time since Seth Johnson lined up for England U17 against Russia back in 1997 that an Alex player had pulled on the Three Lions shirt at Gresty Road. On that night, the likes of Stoke duo Matthew Upson and Jonathon Woodgate lined up for England, and over 6,000 fans turned up at Gresty Road to cast their eye over the next generation of England youngsters. Clayton, along with Powell and Garratt, has now represented England at U16, U17 and now U18 levels, and he feels the experience of international football can only make him a better player.

Crewe fans who attended the game might have been surprised to see Clayton operate in several different positions for England, including a centre midfield role, while Powell generally operated in a much deeper position than he does in his club colours.

Max admits there are adjustments that need to be made when making the step into international level: "Playing for England is obviously a completely different experience to playing with Crewe but I love it. It's great working with Noel (Blake) and the coaches, and it can only help me learn more and make me a better player.

"It is flattering that I get to play in more than one role for England, and that versatility is only going to help me in the future, but I'll play wherever he wants me to play really."

The youngster admits that seeing some familiar faces in the England squad does help, as does his exposure to first team football here at Gresty Road.

"I feel comfortable around the players and playing back at my own age group. The senior games has definitely helped me when I play at this age group because I feel stronger and bigger, and now I want more senior games to help the international side further."

After the game though, Max was quick to turn his attentions back to club level, and is now targeting becoming equally as comfortable in the Crewe first-team as he feels when playing at his own age group.

There may have been some memorable moments for Clayton already this season, none more so than his late, late winner at Gillingham to go with a similar one at Morecambe back in November, or even his sweet volley which gave the Alex the lead against Accrington last month - but you have to remember that Max has still only started just two games for the club!

Understandably Max is desperate for more first-team action at the club, but he realises he must be patient in his quest for regular starts.

"Obviously I want to play as much as I can, but I know it is in my best interests for Steve (Davis) to feed me in slowly because I know eventually that I will be playing. I've just got to keep doing what I am doing and hopefully score some goals when I get my chance.

"To start at Bradford was a learning curve for me. It was a tough game and the team did not play as well as we can on the day. I found it tough going but I learnt a lot and what is expected of me at first-team level.

"I think I have improved since then and become stronger and now all I can do is keep doing well in training and hopefully I will get another start soon."

A VIEW FROM THE DRESSING ROOM with David Artell

A very good afternoon and a warm welcome to the Alexandra Stadium for today's visit of league leaders Swindon Town, a game that we come into off the back of a thrilling win over Gillingham last weekend.

t was a pretty unbelievable game, but I don't think anybody in the ground that had seen the first half would have believed what entailed in the second half if you had of told them at half time. Thankfully we came out on the right side of a seven-goal thriller.

But I think we deserved it. We dominated for long periods in the first-half and Gillingham didn't even have a shot, so to concede three goals in the second half was very disappointing, especially from two long throws.

As a defender playing in a game like that is not very nice because you want to keep clean sheets. We felt in control at half time, but we gave a really silly goal away minutes in to the second half and then two more later in the game. We know we have to get better at that.

Every player has to do a job, and not the spectacular things, we need to dig in and nullify the opposition's threat, and that is something we know we have to improve on.

Oxford's position is obviously one we can look at, but Crawley are having a bad run at the moment too, and even though they have games in hand, they have to play Saturday, Tuesday games nearly every week between now and the end of the season which is not easy. As the old cliché says, we just need to take one game at a time and see where that takes us, starting with Swindon today, and if we can get a win today it shows that we can beat anybody.

But if we play like we did at Gillingham and can keep up our good home form we have got a chance. It is all about how you perform on the day in this league. We won't fear Swindon today, but we will respect them.

On the opening day of the season we were perhaps a bit unlucky not to get something at Swindon. We had some great chances in the first-half and then I gave a dubious penalty away on the stroke of half time, which gave them a massive boost, so we know that we can compete against them.

But it is up to us to go out today and show why we should be in the play-offs and hopefully take a step to getting there. Hopefully the supporters can get behind us today, because we need them and if they can show us some real support that can only help us.

AJ LEITCH-SMITH

Local lad aims to make up for lost time

With the crucial run-in towards the end of the season approaching, Steve Davis will need to use a large number of his squad. The club's physiotherapist and fitness departments deserve great credit for keeping the majority of our squad available for selection. The likes of Steve Phillips, Matt Tootle, Luke Murphy, Ash Westwood, Harry Davis and Adam Dugdale have been virtually injury free and played in the majority of the games. It has been key to our sustained effort to break into the play-off places.

AJ Leitch-Smith has made great strides with his injury record as well this season. The Crewe-born forward has already surpassed his personal best for appearances having made 31 and scoring six goals. There has been a vast improvement in getting the talented 22-year-old out onto the pitch, but there is still the possibility of more to come from him.

To his enormous credit, Leitch-Smith has worked exceedingly hard to overcome the niggling injuries that have so far hampered his Crewe career. He has become stronger physically and that has helped him mentally. He knows that he can now stay fit and make a contribution to the cause over a period of games.

Saying that he has not totally conquered those little set-backs that have prevented him from fully establishing himself as a regular in our front-line. He has only recently returned from a troublesome ankle problem but again was in the right place at the right time to score our second goal at Gillingham on Saturday.

"I've had a number of injuries over the last couple of seasons but I feel



as though I am improving now, ' says AJ. "It has set me back in terms of holding down a place in the team but I have worked hard and played a number of games this season.

"It has been a lot better and I've being doing extra work at training to make sure that I am in better condition. It has helped me and I feel as fit as I have ever done.

"I am available for selection and want to play my part before the end of the season." AJ fully appreciates that he has a fight on his hands to convince the boss that he can be relied upon to stay fit and score the goals we need to remain in the promotion hunt. The competition is fierce for places, especially with Nick Powell showing what he is capable of in a more advanced position and Max Clayton improving all the time.

"We do have some very good forwards here and it will be those who score the goals and play well that will stay in the team. We are still optimistic of doing well this season because we have quality in the squad and can beat anyone on our day, ' says AJ.

"I have to work hard to try to stay in the team. After winning at Gillingham, we are still not out of contention for a play-off place and remain confident. We need to put a run together to make sure that if anyone slips up, we can take advantage of that.

"We have to keep putting the performances in and make sure that we are clinical in front of goal to finish the chances we always create. There are still enough points to play for and we just have to keep pushing on and hope that someone slips up."

Devera became Paolo Di Canio's first signing as Town boss in June 2011.Devera linked up with the Robins arch-rivals Oxford United (typically for us!) in a bizarre match which saw the visitors virtually dominate after the U's had their striker James Constable sent-off after barely ten minutes!

How the Robins went on to lose 2-0 was anybody's guess and Di Canio was more perplexed than anyone. He said in his post-match interview: "I watched the game back and though Mamma Mia, we are three levels over this level! We lost but we completely dominated the game." They quickly overcame their 'derby' defeat with an emphatic 4-0 win over Dagenham and Redbridge.

Di Canio has not been afraid to tip his side as the best in the league, even when they were placed out of the automatic spots and that confidence he has in his squad has paid

after an established spell with Barnet and will hope to use his considerable experience to help Swindon to success. The 24-year-old, who is of Venezuelan descent, made 177 appearances during a six-year career with the Bees, and was named the club's Player of the Year in 2008 and 2011. A product of the Barnet youth system, Devera can play at either right-back or centre-back, and will add much-needed depth to the Town defensive line.

Callum Kennedy

Former Reading youngster Kennedy was first granted a taste of first team action by former Town boss Paul Sturrock. The youngster made a surprise start in the 4-1 win over Brentford in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy in September 2007. Numerous substitute appearances then followed in Season 2008/2009, before he made his full debut dividends. At times this season, he has reacted angrily to defeats, but this man-management has only spurred his players on to become better and improve. Di Canlo was a winner as a player and it is pretty obvious that he is just as determined to be just as successful as a manager. He is a perfectionist who doesn't enjoy losing too much and says he has been able to convert his players into 'battling warriors'.

The results do speak for themselves. After a shaky and nervous first half against Crewe on the opening day of the season, they eventually won 3-0, but then suffered surprising away defeats to Cheltenham and Dagenham. A slow start to the campaign saw them lost 2-1 at home to Oxford and lose narrowly away at Shrewsbury. The odds on them being

against Carlisle United at the start of December 2008. He was awarded a new one-year contract in the summer of 2009 although injury caused lack of first team action, but Kennedy did sign a new one-year deal in January 2010. After Ioan spells at Gillingham and Rotherham United during Season 2010/2011, Kennedy returned to The County Ground as firstchoice left-back for Season 2011/12.

Alessandro Cibocchi

Paolo Di Canio sealed his tenth signing of the summer with the capture of leftback Cibocchi in July 2011.The 28-year-old joined Town on their preseason tour of Italy last week, and did enough to convince

McCormack started his career at Preston North End, before a series of loan moves preceded a switch to Southend United. He went on to make 130 appearances for the Shrimpers, scoring 15 times during three seasons at the club between 2007 and 2010.

Charlton Athletic secured his services last summer following Southend's relegation to League 2, and McCormack went on to make 24 appearances for the Addicks, scoring once. McCormack competes with Michael Timlin, Jonathan Smith, Simon Ferry and Oliver Risser for a midfield slot, but has recently played at right-back for Town. shone through. They won three tough league games against Rotherham, Southend and away at Crawley in September to really ignite their season and they followed that up with more convincing victories against Barnet (4-0), Port Vale (2-0), Gillingham (2-0) and Morecambe (3-0) as they headed into Christmas. They were beaten 1-0 at Torquay on Boxing Day but that defeat acted as a spur for a club record run of ten successive wins. Including in that unbelievable sequence of results

MIDFIELDERS Oliver Risser

Risser penned a two-year-deal at The County Ground in July 2011, and was named club captain shortly after although he has since been replaced as captain by Paul Caddis. The 30-year-old is a Namibian international who has played in Norway, Germany and Greece during his career. A powerful defensive midfielder, Risser has recently played as a centre-back and scored for Town against Crewe on the opening day of the season.

Simon Ferry

Ferry made the permanent switch from Celtic in August 2010, penning a threeyear deal.

The midfielder had enjoyed a hugely successful season at SN1 in 2009/2010, making 42 starts and scoring twice in Town's play-off campaign. Having joined Celtic at the age of 12, Ferry progressed the ranks at Parkhead, however, he was sidelined for nearly two years with a serious ankle injury, and 2009/2010 was his first full season of professional football, a season in which he was agonisingly close to success. Ferry made 25 appearances during the 2010/11 season and was often a frustrated figure on the substitutes bench, especially during the second half of the campaign. The 23-year old has already proved to be a major part of the side and scored his second goal of the campaign in the FA Cup win over Huddersfield Town.

Matt Ritchie

After two separate loan spells, Matt Ritchie signed a two-and-a-half year contract at with Town in January 2011. Ritchie made his full debut for the club in the 2-0 Johnstone's Paint Trophy second round win over Torquay United at The County Ground, before going on to make 34 appearances during the rest of the season, scoring 12 times. A bustling attacking midfielder, the 22year-old was voted Fans' Player of the Year for his efforts in 2010/11. Ritchie's

Swindon Town secured the signing of York City midfielder Smith in June 2011. The former Forest Green Rovers man joined the Robins for an undisclosed fee, signing a two-year contract at The County Ground. The 24-year-old was highly-rated during his time with the Minstermen, and has continued to impress for Town.

Luke Rooney

Former Gillingham winger Luke Rooney joined in January 2012 in one of the biggest transfers of the League Two January Transfer Window. One of the brightest prospects to emerge from Gillingham's youth system in recent years, Rooney came through the Gills' academy and went out on loan to nonleague Lewes before making his Football League debut in September 2009. He went on to have two loan spells with Eastbourne before becoming a regular in Andy Hessenthaler's side. He made a total of 61 appearances for Full-back Joe Devera signed from Barnet, and for a fee of £30,000 the highly-rated midfielder Jonathan Smith came in from York City.

The summer spending spree also saw the Namibian International Oliver Risser and duly score on his debut against Crewe Alexandra and the Italian striker Raffaele De Vita arrived on a free transfer from Scottish side Livingston.

That firepower has only been added to further with young Billy Bodin returning from a loan spell at Torquay United in January. The Welshman has returned with a real appetite for goals and has scored three from his seven appearances. He had previously scored against Crewe as a Torquay United player in a 3-0 win at Gresty Road back in November.

The January transfer window saw Di Canio swoop for the vastly experienced Paul Benson from Charlton Athletic. The former Dagenham and Redbridge striker now 32, adds some real class to their finishing and has already scored eight goals for the club following his six-figure move to the County Ground.

Benson's arrival in the New Year was not the only permanent capture with goalkeeper Wesley Foderingham signing from Crystal Palace after impressing on Ioan and Luke Rooney from Gillingham. Late movement on deadline day also saw young midfielder Lee Cox sign from Inverness.

Swindon Town signed Ipswich Town striker Ronan Murray in late November on a loan deal until 14th January 2012.

Murray came through the Academy at Portman Road and has progressed through to the first team squad but is yet to feature for Paul Jewell's side this term. He gained some valuable league experience last season in a loan spell with Torquay United and has been capped up to U19 level with the Republic of Ireland. The frontman came off the bench for the Tractorboys in the Carling Cup defeat at Chelsea in January last year and made a total of 20 appearances during the

2010/11 season. Murray made his debut off the bench against Aldershot Town on Saturday 26th November, before kept on his toes by the experienced Phil Smith and Italian Mattia Lanzano.

Young defender Callum Kennedy is one of the most promising in the league and Italian centre half Allesandro Cibocchi has settled in well since arriving in July. Scottish defender Paul Caddis has been a fundamental part of their success this season and midfielder Matt Ritchie is regarded as one of the finest players in the entire division.

Swindon will win promotion at the end of the season and will want to clinch the championship as quickly as possible. Di Canio may have his critics and his antics has seen him sent to the stands on three occasions this season, but he has proved that he is a fine manmotivator who thrives under pressure. MANAGER - PAOLO DI CANIO

Pormer West Ham United and Charlton Athletic striker Paolo Di Canio was unveiled as Swindon Town manager on Monday 23rd May 2011.

The Italian signed a twoyear contract, and joined the club alongside assistant Fabrizio Piccareta and fitness coach Claudio Donatelli. The Town job is his first as a manager after a

glittering and often controversial playing career.

Di Canio made a flying start to his Town career with a 3-0 home victory over the Alex in League 2, and has since guided Town to the top of League Two, including a run of 10 straight wins.



As a player, Di Canio made over 500 senior appearances with the likes of Juventus, Napoli, Lazio, and AC Milan, before a move to Britain where he excelled with Sheffield Wednesday, Celtic, and perhaps most notably West Ham United where he scored over 50 goals, most of them spectacular.

Billy Bodin

The son of Town legend and Under 18's manager Paul, Bodin signed his first professional contract at The County Ground in 2010, alongside fellow youth team graduate Will Evans.

Bodin has progressed through the ranks at the club, having played from Under 9 level upwards in red and white. He was top scorer for both the Under 18 and reserve teams at The County Ground in Season 2009/2010, and was rewarded with a one-year deal by thenmanager Danny Wilson. The 19-year-old, who can play as both a leftwinger and a striker and started Town's first game of the season against Crewe Alexandra before linking up with Wales U21s and then moving on to a successful loan spell with Torquay.

Jonathan Tehoue

Swindon Town signed Leyton Orient striker Jonathan Tehoue on Ioan until the end of the season on Wednesday 7th March. A strong striker with top flight experience in his native France, Belgium and Turkey, Téhoué came to E10 with an impressive pedigree and made a name for himself in England by netting Orient's equaliser in their 1-1 draw with Arsenal in the FA Cup last season. He had originally looked set to join Huddersfield Town in the 2008/09 season, but the ongoing dispute with Konyaspor scuppered a move to England at that time. But having secured his release from his Turkish club in late 2009, Téhoué began to make up for lost time by becoming a super-sub for the O's - 10 of his 11 goals last term came from the bench.

Raffaele De Vita

Italian striker De Vita signed a two-year deal with the Robins in June 2011, joining Town after a spell in Scotland with Livingston. De Vita joined Blackburn Rovers aged 15 and came up through the youth and reserve team ranks at Ewood Park. Despite a hat-trick in a reserve team game against Wigan Athletic, first team opportunities never surfaced and the frontman opted to leave the Premier League side. In July 2008 he moved into Scotland to join Livingston where he spent three seasons. Last term he made 31 appearances, scoring 11 goals.

Paul Benson

Swindon Town completed the signing of Charlton Athletic striker Paul Benson on a two-and-a-half year deal on 1st January 2012. Born in Southend, Benson joined Dagenham & Redbridge in 2005 and struck 28 times in 2006/07 to help Dagenham & Redbridge win the Conference title, and netted 22 goals the following term, scoring in all three play-off matches as Daggers defeated Rotherham United 3-2 in the League Two play-off final to clinch promotion to League One. In total, including FA Trophy matches, Benson notched 84 goals in 201 games for John Still's side, before joining Charlton Athletic for an undisclosed fee on Monday 30th August and made his debut for the club the next day in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy - against his former side. In total he scored ten goals in 28 starts for the Addicks before joining Swindon where he has made a prolific start scoring five times.

The pace of Eric Sabin, Stefan Miglioranzi and the superbly named Danny Invincible worried Crewe, but Swindon wasted four decent openings when they were on top and it came back to haunt them.

The decisive break through came in the 16th minute. Crewe were patient in their build up at the back before finding Kenny Lunt in space, and his super curling pass set up Ashton perfectly for him to slot home his seventh goal of the season and give the Alex the lead.

Swindon pressed for a leveller, but Sam Parkin, Invincible and Miglioranzi all wasted excellent chances and soon, Town found themselves two goals adrift. Lunt's perfectly flighted free-kick was headed on by Ashton and he was so unlucky to see his effort bounce down and out off of the cross-bar before Stephen Foster rushed in to head home on 38 minutes.

Town came out for the second half in similar attacking fashion, with efforts from Matthew Hewlett and Sabin. Steve Robinson also sent a good effort just wide of Ince's post and the Crewe number one was called into real action to punch a Duke free kick away in the 50th minute.

But Crewe always looked a threat on the break with Jack's pace the key. For all their efforts to get back into the game, Swindon were dead and buried by the hour mark when Ashton raced clear to break the offside trap and his unselfishness in front of goal presented Jack with the simple task of tapping home his 11th goal of the season.

CLUB CONNECTIONS

FOOTBALL HISTORIAN LEIGH EDWARDS TAKES A LOOK AT THE CLOSE CONNECTIONS BETWEEN CREWE ALEXANDRA AND TODAY'S OPPONENTS SWINDON TOWN.

WEMBLEY WINNER

Former Swindon Town midfielder Gareth Whalley featured in Crewe Alexandra's 1996-97 Second Division play-off final success. He turned professional at Gresty Road in July 1992 and also helped Crewe to win promotion in 1993-94, scoring nine goals in 180 League games before joining Bradford City for £600,000 in July 1998. Briefly returning to Crewe on Ioan in March 2002, he joined Swindon from Wigan Athletic in August 2005 but was unable to prevent relegation in 2005-06, making 24 League appearances while at the County Ground.

YOUTH INTERNATIONAL

Ex-England Youth central defender Ashley Westwood played for both Crewe Alexandra and Swindon Town. He moved to Gresty Road from Manchester United for £40,000 in July 1995 and starred in Crewe's 1996-97 Second Division playoff final triumph, scoring nine goals in 98 League games before sold to Bradford City for £150,000 in



July 1998. Moving to Swindon on Ioan from Chester City in March 2007, he made nine League appearances while at the County Ground. Fellow England Youth international Anthony McNamee also played for both clubs.

PROMOTION WINNER

Former Swindon Town left-back Mark Gardiner helped Crewe Alexandra to win promotion in 1988-89 and 1993-94. Signing professional at the County Ground in October 1984, he was a member of Swindon's 1985-86 Fourth Division title squad and scored once in ten League games for today's visitors prior to joining Torquay United in February 1987. He joined Crewe in August 1988 and also helped Dario Gradi's side to reach the play-offs in two consecutive seasons, netting 35 goals in 193 League outings before moving to Frederikstad in June 1995.

CUP HERO

One-time Crewe Alexandra central defender Colin Prophett was ever-present for Swindon Town in 1976-77. Moving to the County Ground from Norwich City in September 1974, he starred as Swindon took West Ham and Everton to FA Cup fourth round replays in 1974-75 and 1976-77 respectively and netted ten times in 160 Third Division games prior to joining Chesterfield in September 1978. He joined Crewe in October 1979 and was ever-present in 1980-81, scoring once in 79 League outings before moving to Cardiff City as reserve team coach in July 1981.

WARTIME FOOTBALL

Former Swindon Town inside-forward Fred Chandler played for Crewe Alexandra either side of the Second World War. Moving to the County Ground from Blackpool in May 1936, he played alongside Jimmy Cookson in Swindon's attack and netted seven goals in 21 Third Division (South) games for today's opponents prior to joining Crewe in May 1937. He formed a notable left-wing partnership with Matt Johnson and played for the Alex in wartime football, scoring 22 times in 80



League outings while at Gresty Road before retiring in May 1947.

LEADING MARKSMAN

Former Crewe Alexandra striker Keith East was Swindon Town's leading marksman in 1965-66. Moving to the County Ground from Portsmouth in May 1964, he partnered Don Rogers and Mike Summerbee in Swindon's attack and netted 21 goals in 45 League games for today's visitors prior to joining Stockport County in December 1966. He joined Crewe from Northampton Town in July 1971 and briefly played alongside Stan Bowles, scoring eight times in 34 Fourth Division outings while at Gresty Road before moving to Folkestone in June 1972.

WING WIZARD

Winger Tommy Weale played for both Swindon Town and Crewe Alexandra during his career. Moving to the County Ground from Folkestone in July 1929, he made his League debut in Swindon's 4-1 defeat at Fulham on New Year's Day 1930 and scored in his only other first-team appearance in the Robins' 4-1 reverse at Watford three months later. He joined Crewe in July 1931 and created numerous chances for Jimmy McConnell and Bert Swindells, netting 27 goals in 101 Third Division (North) outings prior to joining Burnley in February 1934.

TITLE TRIUMPH

Former Crewe Alexandra striker Peter Coyne featured prominently in Swindon Town's 1985-86 Fourth Division title triumph. Moving to Gresty Road from Ashton United in August 1977, he was Crewe's leading marksman in two consecutive seasons and netted 47 goals in 134 Fourth Division games prior to joining Hyde United in July 1981. He reunited with Lou Macari at Swindon in August 1984 and also featured in their 1986-87 promotion campaign, scoring 30 times in 110 League outings before moving to Colne Dynamoes in July 1990.

TOP SCORER

One-time Crewe Alexandra inside-forward Tommy Armstrong was Swindon Town's top scorer in 1933-34. Moving to the County Ground from Airdrie in July 1933, he scored on his League debut in Swindon's 2-1 win at Newport County a month later and netted 30 goals in 64 Third Division (South) games for today's opponents prior to joining Crewe in July 1935. He partnered Bert Swindells in attack and featured prominently as the Alex won the Welsh Cup in two consecutive seasons, scoring ten times in 68 League outings while at Gresty Road.

EVER-PRESENT

Former Swindon Town left-half Teddy Ware was ever-present as Crewe Alexandra finished eighth in the Third Division (North) in 1937-38. Moving to the County Ground from Clapton Orient in July 1936, he contested a first-team slot with Stan Wilcockson and made five Third Division (South) appearances for Swindon prior to joining Crewe in July 1937. He formed an effective half-back line with Gardner Blake and John Scott, playing 61 Third Division (North) games while at Gresty Road until retiring during the Second World War.

TOPICAL TALKING POINTS

Season 2012/13 will, providing that everything goes according to plan, see Rotherham United moving back to Rotherham. Their new ground will be named the New York Stadium and in the match programme when we made our last visit to the Don Valley Stadium, season ticket prices for the new stadium were announced.

We made just three visits to the Don Valley, but we were never to come back with the full points although we did manage a draw on two occasions. The layout of the ground is not exactly conducive to provide a good football atmosphere, and for visiting supporters in particular their view is very restricted. However it

would only be fair to mention that on our three visits I have always found the staff there to be friendly and helpful. Long may the good relations between the two clubs continue. F.A. Cup replays saw both Chelsea and Tottenham Hotspur win their respective replayed games. Chelsea made the trip to take on Birmingham City and in charge for the first time was Roberto Di Matteo who has been appointed the temporary manager of the club after Andres Villas Boas was relieved of his job. Di Matteo made a number of changes for the trip to Birmingham and not in the staring line-up were Frank Lampard and Didier Drogba. There could be even more changes to come.

Tottenham had to come from behind to eventually win their replay against Stevenage but it was not without some cost. Michael Dawson sustained an injury in the game and it may be that he will not be able to play again in the current season. Another player who had to be replaced was Aaron Lennon, but his absence could prove to be a short one. The loss of such key players could have a real effect on their final league position when the season ends.

Following a run of poor results there was a managerial change at Tranmere Rovers after their defeat at Chesterfield. Les Parry is the man to lose his job, and somebody who is quite familiar to Rovers fans replaces him. The person concerned is Ronnie Moore who is back at Prenton Park for a third time until the end of the season. The financial position of clubs is one topic, which could easily worsen. At Glasgow Rangers, the players have been asked to take large cuts in their salaries, an item which has not been cleared at the time of writing. Details of the items under investigations keep appearing in the press and it will be some time before the whole picture is clarified.

When it comes to stealing the headlines with regards to goal scoring though, then the name of Robin Van Persie quickly comes to mind. In league or cup games, the goals keep coming at a steady rate. According to press reports it would seem that Manchester City are showing a great interest in him. He is out of contract with Arsenal next year, and they will try to persuade him to come to the Etihad Stadium to continue his career.

If you think of serial goal scorers, Lionel Messi is another name that quickly comes to behind. Was it really a surprise that Messi set a new record of scoring five goals in a Champions League game in Barcelona's 7-1 victory over Bayer Leverkusen. Still only 24 years of age, he has already scored 250 goals in just 378 games and in this season already got 50 goals. Just what would be his value in the transfer market today. It is impossible to even quess a figure. What an asset Barcelona have.

RECALLING THE SIGNIFICANCE OF A DATE -SATURDAY MARCH 10TH

Just a week ago, it was a visit to Gillingham to see Crewe in action, a routine I have followed for many years. It was exactly 78 years to the day that at, seven years old and one day old, I had a birthday treat, I was going to see my first ever football match.

Trewe Alexandra were at home to Accrington Stanley, and I was taken to the game by my Uncle, my Aunt and my Grandmother to the game. There is no mention of my Grandfather for he had no interest in football at all, the others were in fact all season ticket holders.

My knowledge of the rules of football was not existent, but there was plenty of excitement when the goals were scored. On that day a total of six were scored, four by Crewe and two by Accrington. It was some years later that I was to realise that

the Crewe player wearing the number five shirt was a really famous player. It was Fred Keenor, a Welsh international who had been in the Cardiff team that won the 1927 F.A. Cup Final 1-0 to Arsenal. One of his international jerseys and his cap are on display in one of the lounges at our ground.

Looking back, I would never have thought, that the date Saturday March 10th 1934, watching Crewe Alexandra in action, would be the start of a journey that has taken me all over the country to see my team. Supporters have seen themselves in various spots on the ground, I started in the main stand, then a spot on the edge of the grass at the Railway End of the ground, the main popular stand, and then the Gresty Road End, in other words, I have done the round trip.

It was not too long after finishing my National Service that I joined the Supporters Association, serving on their committee, and helping out in various ways. That led to me taking over as Editor of the matchday programme.

At first I thought my knowledge would be enough to produce material for the programme, but I was quickly to learn there were still many gaps to fill. I spent hours doing research at the Football League offices in Lytham St Annes, and in various libraries. In these years, those visits gave me so much pleasure and most importantly confidence.



My proudest moment to date is

being on the first-team coach and escorted in to Wembley Stadium. Then the walk down the tunnel at the old Wembley Stadium and then seeing Crewe win 1-0 against Brentford in the Play-Off Final. Sitting in the press box there was another amazing experience I will always remember.

Just what is it that Crewe Alexandra has given me as an 85-year-old supporter over such a long period of time? I have been able to meet so many managers and

secretaries of my club. Players and ground staff too, the list goes on and I have always made myself welcome whenever I meet any of them, I enjoy my contact with a truly great club, and I feel have earned their respect.

Finally onto a coincidence. When I saw my first game back in 1934, I was to see Crewe score four goals and on the 78th anniversary of that date, I would see Crewe score four again, this time at Gillingham.

Friendship in football would often start from a brief meeting; others develop over years and happily continue right up to the present day. It always gives me a boost when visiting an away ground to meet people I know. Visiting a new ground is always something to remember and I will readily admit to a ritual I try to observe, that is to walk out through the players tunnel and out on to the pitch, so far my requests have never been refused.

EDITOR'S SAY EVEN SUCCESSFUL MANAGERS FACE UNCERTAINTY

Sir Alex Ferguson has always had a way with words and he aptly describes this time of the season as 'squeaky bum time'. He is of course referring to the title run-in and he often uses the now legendary phrase to start implementing the mind games. His opposite numbers usually take things in their stride, but previously he has got a rise from Kevin Keegan and Rafa Benitez when it has come to the crucial run-in.

The canny Scot will soon turn his intentions to his city neighbour Roberto Mancini and his squad of players. How they handle it will be interesting although of course Mancini has previously won the Serie A title with Inter Milan on three occasions.

The humorous term 'squeaky bum time' can now refer to the behaviour of chairman and owners at this time of the season. They can become rather trigger-happy and usually point the gun directly at the manager! If they believe that a manager is unlikely to fulfil their original objective then they can often lose their jobs in February and March.

The logic being that a new manager may spark a mini-revival and they can collect enough points to secure a European place, promotion, a play-off place or survival. Sometimes it can have the desired effect. On other occasions it can be become an absolute disaster and in this instance the judgment of an owner must be questioned.

One thing is for certain managers can now receive the sack even if they think they are doing reasonably well. That is why as football supporters we have been left scratching our heads a little at the recent sackings of Lee Clark at Huddersfield and Gary Megson at Sheffield Wednesday. Both of those proud Yorkshire clubs were in the hunt for promotion either automatically or through the playoffs in League One. The Owls were third in the league when Megson was dismissed just days after his side won their local derby in front of 36,000 passionate supporters.

Clark's Huddersfield side had set a new record when remaining unbeaten in 43 matches over 11months and had suffered just three defeats in 55 matches before he was dismissed following a narrow 1-0 loss to Sheffield United. The Terriers had been in a play-off position but their chairman Dean Hoyle felt that Clark was not the man to see the job through. He basically questioned his mental strength if the club had to endure the play-offs again after they lost 3-0 to Peterborough in last year's final at Old Trafford. Many argued that Clark deserved another crack at the chance to take the club up.

Clark's replacement at the McAlpine Stadium is Simon Grayson, a man who was sacked as Leeds United boss as his chairman Ken Bates wasn't totally convinced that he was the right man to secure at least a play-off place in the Championship.

The managerial merry-go-round continued to gather pace with the former Cardiff and Stockport County manger Dave Jones replacing Megson at Hillsborough. At another of his former clubs, Wolverhampton Wanderers, they sacked the long-serving Mick McCarthy and eventually replaced him with his assistant Terry Connor. It appeared that the Premier League club didn't have a contingency plan in place and had to promote from within after a number of potential targets embarrassingly rejected the opportunity to try and save the club from relegation. Connor, likeable as he is, has not won a game and the pressure is now mounting on the Wolves owner Steve Morgan.

Another club trying to remain in the top flight is Queens Park Rangers, who despite spending a lot more than fellow promoted clubs Norwich City and Swansea City are struggling to avoid a relegation scrap. Their solution was to sack Neil Warnock and unveil Mark Hughes as his successor. His higher-profile was to suppose to attract better players before the closure of the transfer window and it certainly worked with five new faces arriving at Loftus Road. Unfortunately, the Rangers team is needing time to gel and results have not drastically improved.

Like-him or hate-him, the experienced Warnock has always been a superb motivator and



surprised the football world.

manager,

especially in the lower leagues and it was no great surprise when he was appointed Leeds' new manger shortly after leaving the London club.

The managerial dismissals also occur at the very top of our game too. The Chelsea manager Andre Villas-Boas has been fighting a losing battle ever since he succeeded the fairly successful Carlo Ancelotti in the summer. His record at Porto was impressive with three trophies in one season, but his age and personality went against him. At just 33 and with no previous playing career to speak of, Villas-Boas found the job of transforming an ageing Chelsea side into a success an appointment too early.

The Chelsea dressing room was formed under previous boss Jose Mourinho and the ghost of the now Real Madrid coach haunts the corridors of their Cobham based training ground. A friend to the players, Mourinho had forged a siege mentally at Chelsea and earned the respect of his key players by being successful.

Villas-Boas inherited an older and more powerful dressing room and was told to faze them out with one eye on the future. He wanted to build his own team but the likes of Frank Lampard, Ashley Cole, Florent Malouda, Fernando Torres, Didier Drogba, Michael Essien and Salomon Kalou were not happy about being left out of big games. A 3-1 first leg defeat to Napoil in the Champions League sealed Villas-Boas' fate.

It became obvious that the senior players at Chelsea were not prepared to commit to the philosophy employed by their young manager and his days were numbered following just three league wins in 12 matches. The senior players had seen the back of another manager.

One thing they have to accept is that there needs to be a transitional period at Stamford Bridge and they will have to accept that they cannot play in every game. Some will inevitably leave in the summer regardless of who takes over from interim boss Roberto Di Matteo.

Chelsea's owner Roman Abramovich has always been a trigger-happy owner. He wants perfection and that means winning the Champions League and Premier League title playing

Barcelona-like football. It is almost an impossible job and Villas-Boas paid the ultimate price because the club is not even guaranteed a top fourth finish at the moment. Not to be competing in the Champions League with the budget they have would be an absolute disaster, but no club can assume they are going to be successful. Two of the top six are going to miss out this year and every year thereafter. Even Harry Redknapp's Tottenham, who have played some breathtaking football this season, will be nervously looking over their shoulders at their London rivals Arsenal and Chelsea.

Football managers now have to contend with inpatient owners and the high expectations of supporters. Without the comfort of transfer speculation to use on their back pages for the majority of the season, the media are a lot more focussed on managers and how they are doing. They have become the number one stories and that has only enhanced the pressure on them to succeed. Whilst Villa-Boas may now be fishand-chip paper as they say, it won't be long before a fresh target emerges. -

WE CANNOT EXPECT OFFICIALS TO HAVE HAWK EYES!

ootball is a conservative business. Difference is odd, newness is dangerous; the status quo has long been cherished.

Just look at the way Graham Westley is mocked for working his players, or how lan Holloway is seen as a 'character' just because he can deploy a metaphor.

It is little wonder then, that while sports like tennis and

cricket cricket, for goodness sake - have used new technology to help officials, football remains stubbornly rooted in the dark ages.

Even before last week's lunacy at

Bolton, when neither linesman nor ref spotted that Clint Hill's header was a yard over the line, nobody had been able to raise a sensible objection to goal-line technology.

By that, we mean Hawkeye a bunch of cameras would that track the ball and send a highpitched beep to the ref telling him if it had crossed the line

It's accurate, it wouldn't cost much, it wouldn't stop the game. And it would ensure that poor linesman don't get abused for failing in an impossible task.

Every report of the Bolton v QPR match said that the ball was 'clearly' over the line. What most didn't mention is that it was only clear after you'd nipped inside to watch a replay or gone home to see it on Match of the Day.

Yes, some eagle-eyed fans and players might have seen it.



Would England have beaten Germany in the World Cup with the help of hawkeye.

But, unlike the lino, they weren't on the other side of the pitch, trying to see past two players on the line and making sure there weren't any fouls in the box.

Tests have proved that the human eye is not capable of processing all the information a linesman needs to take in when a ball is kicked, when a run is made, where every defender is on the pitch and the speed of the pass. Every decision is therefore an educated guess. We should be amazed that they get so many right, not that they drop an occasional clanger.

So why are the authorities so resistant to giving them a hand?

One particularly daft protest is the 'pub debate'. This is basically that football needs controversy so that we've all got something to talk about 'down the pub'.

I don't know about you, but I tend to talk about how the team is playing and the way they lined up. We don't sit there going 'Well, I think it crossed the line'. 'Hmm, I'm not sure it did'. And if we did, I'd give it up as terrible craic and get drunk at home.

The other argument, usually peddled by FIFA, is that any new technology must have the capacity to be implemented at every level of the game. Hawkeye, they say, is too expensive.

Maybe, but there is another cheaper - way. Let those who can afford Hawkeye have it. For those who can't, give the fourth official a monitor and a radio to the ref.

It might not be as quick, but in the time it takes for players to protest, or to celebrate a goal, he could watch a replay and give the ref a yes or a no. Even that's got to be better than rank and repeated injustice. MARKETING NEWS

The Italian is now on the verge of taking Swindon Town to promotion in what is his first season in football management. The Wiltshire club are runaway leaders at the top of League Two and Di Canio's bold prediction suggesting that it would be his side winning the title this season is now just a handful of games away! Di Canio is proving to be a winner as a manager, as he always was as a player. You don't play for top clubs such as AC Milan, Juventus, Glasgow Celtic, Lazio and West Ham if you do not have that inbred winning mentality and the Roman-born Paolo has that in abundance. Here we look back at the maverick's colourful career.



FANTASTIC

THE BEST TRAINER AT THE CLUB

His former boss at West Ham, Harry Redknapp always hailed his Italian forward as the 'ultimate professional' during his four seasons at Upton Park. Di Canio's dedication to training, fitness,



conditioning and diet set the perfect example to young players coming through the ranks and Redknapp loved him for it.

Di Canio famously described not giving your all in training as a 'smack in the face of fans, it's a moral insult to them all.'

He goes on in his 2000 autobiography "Training is a way of life for me. I always went in on

my days off. Too many times there are way too few doing extra training. I don't understand this. I don't understand why you wouldn't. It is only benefiting yourself. You only become fitter and a better player."



OVERCOMING MIND GAMES

Di Canio scored many memorable goals in Britain but his winning goal against Manchester United in the 4th round of the FA Cup back in 2001 lives long in the memory. Cheered on by almost 10,000 West Ham fans at Old Trafford, Di Canio wasn't fooled by Fabien Barthez's mind games after breaking the offside trap.

The French goalkeeper tried to trick Di Canio into believing that he had been caught offside by stopping and raising his hand. Di Canio took no notice and slotted it home for West Ham's first win in Manchester for 15 years. "He didn't fool my brain" was Paolo's way of expressing it.





FAIR PLAY PAOLO

Sadly, Paolo's career in England is remembered for his shoving over of referee Paul Alcock as a Sheffield Wednesday player. Alcock certainly made a meal of his fall, but the Owls striker deserved his record 11-game ban and £10,000 fine. That regrettable incident overshadows this particular moment of unrivalled Fair Play during a match between his beloved Hammers and Everton in 2001. With the Everton goalkeeper Paul Gerrard lying injured after leaving his goal and clearing up field, Di Canio could quite easily have headed into the empty net after Trevor Sinclair crossed but instead he plucked it out of the air and the game ended 1-1. He received a standing ovation from the Everton fans, an award from FIFA for 'displaying a special act of sportsmanship' and a death threat from his West Ham team-mate Stuart Pearce!



DI CANIO TWISTS AND TURNS AGAINST MILAN

Back in 1994, Paolo Di Canio scored arguably the most famous goal of his entire career against the soon-to-be European Champions AC Milan. With



just 12 minutes on the clock, the Napoil number 7 collected a long ball from Renato Buso inside the Milan box, but with his route to goal blocked by the covering Christian Panucci. Franco Baresi and Stefano Eranio he decided to go for goal himself and after twice fooling the Italian internationals. with dummies

and drag backs, he drove his left-footed shot past a surprised Sebastiano Rossi from an acute angle. As the Sao Paolo Stadium erupted, Di Canio withdrew his shirt and raced towards the Neapolitan crowd.





ANTICS ON THE TOUCHLINE

Paolo Di Canio rages with passion and he has lit up League Two with his touchline antics. Not only did he predict early on that Swindon would win the npower League Two title this season but his celebrations, gestures and interviews have certainly caught the imagination. He recently thanked the FA for imposing his third touchline ban after 'waving his arms around in the technical area' but it was his wild celebrations to mark Swindon's winning goal at Northampton that supporters adore. He got banned for his Mourinho impression but it will live long in the memory.
