ATIENO is a Kenyan international who graduated from the youth academy at Walsall. His time as a Saddler was filled with loan spells and the towering striker added five clubs to his CV before a permanent switch to Dagenham & Redbridge in 2006. Taiwo turned out for Nuneaton Borough, Rochdale, Chester City, Kidderminster Harriers and Darlington before his arrival as a Dagger. He has also been on loan at Tamworth and played in the USA before a return to England. He scored the final goal in Saturday's 4-1 win at Burton .





Martin Rice... Information Martin Rice learned the goalkeeping art as a youngster at Exeter City and would spend his early years as a professional with the Grecians. A switch to Torquay arrived in 2007 and he would spend two years as a Gull before his release saw the superb shotstopper drop down to non-League football with Truro City before a return to TQ1.

Lathaniel Rowe-Turner...

ROWE-TURNER is a graduate of the scholarship scheme at Leicester City, turning professional at the start of the 2007/08 season. The athletic left-back failed to make a first-team appearance in a difficult campaign that saw the Foxes relegated out of the Championship. A faltering career at Leicester, which included loan spells with Cheltenham Town, Redditch United and King's Lynn, finally came to an end when LRT signed at Plainmoor for an undisclosed fee in February 2010.

LONDON-BORN Ling began his illustrious career as a cultured midfielder at Exeter City in the mid-1980's, making well over 100 appearances in four years as a Grecian.

Ling then moved to Southend United, via a brief spell at Swindon Town. He would enjoy five successful years with the Shrimpers before returning to Swindon in a move that would herald the peak of his playing days.

As a central midfielder in Glenn Hoddle's fluent side of the early 90's, Ling played a pivotal role in Swindon's promotion to the Premier League.

His playing career then followed a path back to his East London roots with Leyton Orient, who he later managed, before hanging up his boots at Brighton & Hove Albion in 2000.

Ling was appointed Orient boss in December 2003 after a spell as caretakermanager at Brisbane Road. Within less than three years, he guided the O's to automatic promotion from League Two and then stabilised the club as an established League One outfit.

He left Leyton Orient by mutual consent in January 2009 and was immediately hired by Hibernian in the Scottish Premier League to set up a network of scouts.

His next managerial role arrived in the summer of 2009 when he was appointed by Cambridge United and his first season was one of impressive consolidation, finishing tenth in the Blue Square Premier.

He left Cambridge in February 2011 and has guided the Gulls into the promotion shake-up this term.

FOR the second time in less than two weeks. The County Ground plays host to League Two's top two teams.



THE last visitors here, Cheltenham Town, arrived on March 10th just behind Swindon in the table. In astrange twist, it's now Torquay United who occupy second position ahead of tonight's crucial encounter. The only difference is that the Gulls are four points behind Town rather than the six that Cheltenham were 10 days ago. In many respects, you could argue that this match may have a much more significant bearing over the final outcome of the League Two promotion race.

A glance at the current form table shows you there isn't much to choose between the two teams. Swindon have gained two more points than Torquay across their last ten games - a statistic which should tell you how well Martin Ling's team have been playing considering the recent run of wins Town have racked up. The only side in the division that come as close to replicating Swindon's recent form apart from Torquay is, perhaps rather surprisingly, Aldershot. Like Torquay, they've gathered a rather impressive 22 points from the last available 30. It's Swindon's home form this season that puts them head and shoulders above their nearest competitors. They've won more games, gained more points, scored more goals, and conceded fewer goals than anyone else in their league on home soil. Regardless of Saturday's defeat at Crewe, that array of facts and figures is why visiting teams still fear a visit to Wiltshire.

I must mention the distressing scenes witnessed at White Hart Lane on Saturday. Bolton midfielder Fabrice Muamba suffered a cardiac arrest towards the end of the first-half of an FA Cup Quarter-Final match against Totteriham. At the time of writing this, Muamba remains critically ill in intensive care.

It's incidents like this that put football into perspective. We often get so wrapped up in the minor and major issues of sport that we forget there is even a human side involved. Fans and players of the game are equally as guilty. It is perhaps worrying though that only incidents as severe and upsetting as this make us realise there is far more to life than football.

LEFT-WINGER Lee Holmes needs no introduction. A loan star at The County Ground in 2004/05 and Swindon's tormentor-in-chief just three weeks ago, the 24-year-old returns aiming to make a huge impact...

WHEN Lee Holmes walked through The County Ground doors last Wednesday, he wasn't the only person sporting a wry smile across his face.

Swindon fans who heard the news of his return via radio, message boards or social media sites celebrated as Paolo Di Canio not only successfully . secured the loan capture of a player proven at this level.* but a move that came at the expense of rivals Oxford United. who themselves were hoping Holmes would stay and assist their own promotion push after a promising month-long spell at the Kassam Stadium. The U's then signed former Town winger Cristian Montano two days later.

For 24-year-old Holmes, returning to SN1 represented a move back to a club he says gave him the happiest three months of his football career so far. Holmes arrived fresh faced in December 2004, a 17-year-old looking to make a name for himself from Derby County. He made his debut in a 2-0 win against Peterborough United and was an instant hit; his pace, skill and crossing ability adding natural width and flair to Swindon's left flank. He won multiple man-of-the-match awards and at the season's end, after his loan spell had been extended he won the Supporter's Young Player of the Year award.

There is no question Di Canio has pulled off something of a masterstroke. And who knows, at just 24 Holmes still has a bright future ahead of him. The question is: will it involve Swindon Town?

Welcome back Lee. Are you looking forward to your second spell at the club?

I am, most definitely. Obviously my first spell was a long time ago but it brings back good memories for me. I'm looking forward to building on that.

lee holmes:

Was it a difficult decision to come here? Obviously there were a few clubs keen to secure your signature, including Oxford...

There are always decisions to be made in football, good and bad, but I think having spent time here before and having enjoyed that spell, when the opportunity to return came about I didn't have to think too long.

What do you remember about your first spell in Wiltshire?

It was a massive part of my career, a valuable step in helping me get to where I wanted to be. I have really fond memories. I recall the manager was a bit loopy at the time, Andy King! But it was probably the happiest three months I've had in football. At the end I won a young Player of the Year award, which was great. I scored a goal up at Doncaster and I seem to recall creating a few more. It was just a good time for me and made my decision to join the club this time around a very easy one.

You played at The County Ground in Southampton colours earlier this season. What did you make of the Swindon Town team as an opponent?

We came off the pitch knowing we'd been in a game. I said to Aden [Flint] afterwards that I fancied Swindon to go up. That was a while ago and I know the side hadn't hit top gear at that stage, but they played some really nice football. It could have been a closer game than it was.

I've had a frustrating season being in and out of the Southampton team, but I enjoyed coming here – I always enjoyed playing on this pitch and in this stadium. It feels like home.

You join us after your spell up the road with Oxford...

Football throws up some funny situations, particularly when you go on loan, but I needed to get out and play some football and going there was great for me. It enabled me to build my fitness and sharpness and I appreciate them for giving me that opportunity. Now I have another opportunity here.

You played against us for a second time in Oxford's 2-0 win a few weeks ago. Did you feel the team had evolved from the time you played against them earlier in the season?

You could tell the quality throughout the whole side. Even though in the games I've played in Swindon were on the losing side, the quality has been there. If Swindon can maintain those qualities then they'll get the rewards at the end of the season.

You look at the fixtures coming up and you can't help be excited about what lies ahead. It's going to be difficult, but a Wembley appearance and a big game in the build up, there are exciting times to be had here and hopefully I can be a part of it.

What are your long-term plans?

The future is unknown from my point of view. I'm here until the end of the season and I want to show the gaffer and other people what I can do and what I can achieve. If that leads to the reward of a more permanent contract then that would be great.

SWINDON Town climbed to the top of the table with a 1-0 win at Torquay United on what was the fourth meeting of the season between the two sides...



Torquay United 0 Swindon Town 1 28 December 1985 Attendance: 1,710

THIS was the fourth meeting of the season between the sides, but Town's win at Plainmoor on this they went to the top of the Fourth Division for the first time.

The three earlier encounters had all come within the space of 13 days, with Swindon securing a narrow 4-3 aggregate win in the First Round of the Milk Cup either side of claiming their first League victory at The County Ground on 26

played for the Gulls in that game, made two saves midway through the first-half as Town made a

cautious start in Devon. Defending an end that was slippery, having not fully thawed out following sub-zero temperatures, the visitors failed to get a shot on target before the break.

But it was a different story in the second period, when Swindon laid siege to the Torquay area, with Dave Bamber and Colin Gordon never lar from the action. Both had efforts disallowed, but the two combined to get the decisive goal in the 55th

Bamber's 20-yard shot thudded down off the underside of the crossbar and may well have been over the line, but there was no indication from referee John Martini until after Gordon had followed up

Bryan Wade saw a header cleared off the line with ten minutes left and then nit the bar immediately after in what had by then become almostone-way traffic

Following that success. Town lost at Tranmere a week later but. it would prove to be the last defeat of the season, Lou Macari's men remaining unbeaten for a club record 21 games.

THEN Gary Walsh was challenged by Shaun Taylor as he arrowed in on Fraser Digby's goal, the City striker tumbling to the ground in the penalty box leaving Town fans with the hearts in the mouths as referee David Ellery waved play on.

But as play resumed Town midfielder John Moncur intercepted a ball on the edge of the Town box and swept a diagonal ball out to Martin Ling on the right. Ling, whose performance on the day made him many people's Man of the Match, carried the ball forward to the corner of the Leicester penalty area.

Right back Nicky Summerbee moving industriously on the overlap down the Town right forced a corner, and Summerbee himself sauntered out to the right wing to swing the set piece in.

With his left foot entangled in paper cast upon the pitch by already celebrating Town fans, he aimed

"Taylor has scored and that surely means it's the Premier League for Swindon Town now." his right footed cross towards the Leicester penalty spot. Shaun Taylor climbed to make a challenge but was uncharacteristically beaten by Gary Walsh who appeared to head clear. The ball however dropped to Moncur ten yards outside the Leicester 18 yard box, and the Town midfielder headed it back into the danger area.

This time, with Walsh out of the equation, Taylor found himself in space eight yards out. City keeper Kevin Poole threw himself at the ball trying to get there ahead of the predatory Taylor, but as so many times that season 'Ooh' Shaun Taylor put his head where he might expected to get it hurt.

Beating Poole to the ball, Taylor diverted it past the flailing goalkeeper and into the net for his thirteenth of the season as the Swindon contingent in the 73,802 strong Wembley crowd reacted in hysteria.

Taylor himself responded in the way that had earned the respect of every Town supporter all season. Turning back towards the halfway line, left arm raised in a 'That's got that done then' type of way, the big central defender returned to his position.

Taylor has scored and that surely means it's the Premier League for Swindon Town now proclaimed the TV commentary.

'What more is there to do?' asked the goalscorer afterwards. 'I've played at Wembley, scored a goal and finished up playing in the Premier League. I had a phone call an hour before kick-off from my old manager from my nonleague days at St Blazey who rang me to wish me good luck. It hit home how far I've travelled in the last few years.'

The game was 53 minutes old and Swindon had taken what seemed an unassailable three goal lead in the chase for a Premier League place. But as everyone who was there knows, there was more drama to come.

TONIGHT'S Hall of Fame inductees both made a huge contribution to STFC ...

SHAUN TAYLOR was signed from Exeter City by Glenn Hoddle for a fee of £200,000. He made 259 appearances and score 33 goals, in a Town career which stretched from 1991 to 1996.

In his first season, he helped Town rise to eighth in the Second Division (Championship) table. The following season he was ever present in the campaign that saw promotion to the Premiership through the play-offs. It was during this season that he gave one of the bravest performances in the club's history. With the Town trailing 2-0 he returned to the field, and despite having ten stitches in his head, powered home a header which started a revival that ended with Town running out 6-4 winners at Birmingham.

He notched 12 goals in the League campaign including one at Wembley in the 4-3 victory over Leicester. Ever present in the Town's Premiership season, he suffered consecutive relegations but while so many moved on, Taylor stayed to help win the Championship in the 1995/96 season. The following season he was sold to Bristol City for £100,000.

'Ooh Shaun Taylor' was a war cry of the Town fans during this period when he was a colossus in defence and the affection in which he was held by Swindon supporters is shown by the fact that he was voted Swindon's Footballer of the Year three times in 1992, 1995 and 1996.





GLENN HODDLE signed for Swindon as a player-manager in April 1991. He went on to play a major role on as well as off the pitch making 75 appearances and scoring three goals before he left in 1993.

Helping Swindon avoid relegation at the end of the 1990/91 season, in the following season he might have helped Swindon to promotion had finances not dictated the sale of leading scorer Duncan Shearer. In the following campaign which saw Swindon win promotion to Division Two through the play-offs, he made 45 appearances in the League and play off matches. Although he only scored two goals both were crucial one giving Town a vital home win over Sunderland in the opening day and the other in the play-off final against Leicester City.

Lured away to Chelsea before he had the chance to play and manage Swindon in the Premier League meant Swindon lost not only an astute manager, but a vital cog in their playing machine; a sweeper who could turn defence to attack and demonstrate ball skills of the highest order.

Before his time at Swindon, he won England international recognition with 53 caps and eight goals and after it he became a successful England manager taking England to the World Cup Finals. He has since gone on to set-up a football Academy in Spain for up and coming youngsters.
