



Lawrie Sanchez Says...

Welcome to Paolo Di Cannio and his team to Underhill this evening.

This is of course the fourth time the sides have met this season and I am hoping that tonight we can record our first victory over Swindon Town.

Whilst there must be some disappointment at the County Ground that they did not go on and win the JPT at Wembley the other week after knocking us out at the Area Final stage they are certain to be promoted back to League 1 come the end of the season.

I thought early-on in the season that any team that finished above Swindon would be Champions of this division, and this is how it is turning out.

The truest correlation in football is that between the size of the playing budget and the corresponding league position and that is borne out by the respective league standings of the two teams at Underhill tonight.

And furthermore if you look at the wrong end of the current league table you will see the teams with the smallest wage bills, but having said that Swindon will know how close we came to knocking them out of the JPT when frankly I don't think we enjoyed one slice of good fortune over the two legs.

2012 has so far been a mixed bag of results and performances. For all of January we were playing extremely well and accumulating victories and sometimes on other occasions we have played poorly and got exactly what we deserved nothing.

But in our recent two matches against Macclesfield Town and Torquay United we could easily quite easily taken 4 or 6 points from these two games; instead we have had to very reluctantly settle for just the one.

Football can indeed be a cruel mistress when she conjures up results like that.

There was a great deal of disappointment in the dressing room after the Torquay result. We were gutted to have nothing to show for our good play. I think that we need some 9 points from our remaining games. We have a tough run-in with Swindon, Cheltenham, Crawley and Southend all looking to win promotion, either automatically or via the play-offs.

This is why the other three fixtures against Hereford, AFC Wimbledon and Burton could be so vital. Don't think for a second that I think we are unable to go and win points against the top teams in this division, rather I'm looking at how we can go about gathering in the minimum requirement of the 9 points.

The support coming from the terraces and stands at Underhill last Friday was really noticeable. I think the players gave the crowd something to get behind and the supporters responded magnificently and there was a general air of positivity about the place that I think had a genuine impact on the players' performances.

The Swindon fans will likely be here this evening in good numbers, so I do hope we can all do our bit to create a good atmosphere for the Barnet players go about their work tonight.

The Hughes In Brief...

We were all shocked and disappointed after the Torquay game on Friday and I'm sure everyone at the game would agree that we didn't deserve to lose. The manager said afterwards that it was probably our best home performance this season and in a way that made it even more disappointing that we came away empty-handed. We had plenty of chances and should have taken the lead – as well as the penalty miss we also had a few other chances to score. Then we were just really unfortunate with their goal. Sead went down injured and then it was one touch and in the back of the net – just a freak goal. It was a shame because our young back four defended really well for the whole 90 minutes.

On reflection though, it was a good performance and we have to take the positives out of that going into the final few games of the season. We played well the week before that too, so although we've only got two points out of the last three games, there has been a definite improvement in our performances compared to the previous month. We need to build on those now and get some more points on the board. Even with the loss on Friday we're still not in the bottom two, and this time last season we were in a much worse position, so there are lots of positives.

Like Torquay, Swindon are another side flying high in the league. They are an excellent side but this is our fourth time playing them this year so we know them inside-out. Because of that we don't really need to do much homework on them; it's just about building on our last two performances. If we do that then I'm sure we'll get something from the game, which would be a real boost for us going into the two games over the Easter weekend. We tend to play better against the good sides in the league because we are able to get the ball down more and that suits our game. The gaffer has said from day one that he doesn't fear any of the top sides in the league and that has been in our heads throughout the season. We're desperate for points and will be fighting with everything we have tonight.

Swindon have hopefully got a bit of respect for us from the times we've played them already this season, and they will probably know that our league position isn't really a true reflection of how we play. We've shown in our games against them this season that we are a decent side. They beat us in the semi-final by one goal over the two legs but both games were very close. People will look at us being knocked out the cup and think it affected our season because we went on a bad run afterwards where we didn't win in nine games, but I'm not sure it did have that

much of an impact. As players we were just concentrating on each game and we might well have had a bad month even if we hadn't got knocked out the cup, because we had a lot of injuries and suspensions at the time and had to change our team a lot.

This is our game in hand and so it's a really good chance to catch up with the teams above us and pull away from the drop zone, a win tonight could see us move up three or four places. Having that game in hand at this stage of the season does take a bit of pressure off us because it gives us a chance to pull clear. I'm sure the other teams around us in the league will all be keeping an eye on our result tonight.

I've been involved with relegation battles before where the team isn't playing well and no one can see where the next win is going to come from. That's not the case with us at the moment because our mentality is positive, our performances recently have been good, and we've got a lot tougher and stopped conceding so many goals. Now it's just a case of putting the ball in the back of the net. The mood is really positive and we're looking up rather than looking behind us. We just need to get the final few points we need to be safe.

The lads all noticed how good the atmosphere was on Friday night and it really helped us, so please carry that on tonight. Everyone will have us down to get beaten tonight, but we quite enjoy being the underdogs. Let's hope another upset is on the cards.

I once got into a lift at the Cafe Royal with Pele to go to a Football Writers Association dinner.

Pele's visit to London had been kept secret and he had been in a downstairs room at the hotel with my daughter Julie until the 600 football writers and guests had assembled. We got the OK and I escorted the VIP guest to the lift.

Just as the doors were closing there was a clatter of feet and in came one-time Barnet chairman Dave Underwood, a friend since his playing days at Watford and Gillingham.

Dave was a regular guest at all the Signy football parties at that time, a lively laugh-aminute character. "Who's that with Dennis Signy?" he asked.

I stared at the ceiling to make sure the lift was going in the right direction as Dave repeated his question in a booming voice.

Pele

Pele and Signy then entered the dining area to tumultuous applause from the football writers when it was announced that the great Brazilian was joining us on the top table for dinner, sitting between Bobby Charlton and Gordon Banks.



I have often been accused of name dropping ... I see no harm in that if you have the quality names to drop. In a career in football spanning some of the biggest stars I have met, and become friends with, the likes of Sir Stanley Matthews, Tom Finney, Billy Wright, Nat Lofthouse and Tommy Lawton.



When I travelled to Stoke to meet Matthews for a Sunday Express Celebrity report, Stan met me at 12.45 p.m. for a

coffee and a chat at the hotel opposite the station.

He then drove me to the ground, where he had arranged a private box and refreshments for me and other guests who were looking in to see him.

Then to the directors' box to see the match and complete my Matthews style report. A young fellow called Mark Stein scored twice in the last few minutes to necessitate a rewrite of the intro - but the final version was in the Sunday Express office by 5.00pm. (Dennis always meets a deadline. It is ingrained. Other contributors take note. Ed.)


When the time came to leave on the 6.00pm train to London Stan insisted on driving meand then presented me with a bone china teaset for my wife Pat to mark my visit.

One other thing I recall of that day. Stan, although at the tail end of an illustrious career, took 20 minutes to walk the few yards from the car park to the entrance to the ground as he had to stop every few yards to sign autographs for supporters getting on in age and for youngsters probably not around when he was in his FA Cup winning prime.

I recall Stan telling me of one manager's " team talk" - "make sure we are on the 6 o'clock train going home after the match!"

The five years I spent on the celebrity round were the most enjoyable of my football writing career and the impact George Best made on my fellow writers was immense and the love and affection shown to Bobby Charlton stood out.

Whats The Buzz?...

James Castle is on the prow fooking for stories from the beautiful game...

The only unbeaten home record in League 2 remained preserved at the weekend as promotion-chasing Shrewsbury Town held off a strong challenge from Aldershot Town to snatch a point at the New Meadow. Josh Payne scored from the spot for the visitors and, despite the Shrews going down to ten men when David McAllister saw red for an elbow, the home side levelled courtesy of former Aldershot striker Marvin Morgan.

Luton Town has sacked its manager Gary Brabin after an indifferent run of form that saw the Hatters collect just one win in their previous seven matches. A 2-1 defeat at the hands of promotion rivals York City left Town outside the play-off places by three points by the end of the weekend's fixtures, although they do have games in hand on some of the teams above them.

Ipswich Town chief executive Simon Clegg has angered Blues fans by deciding not to apply for Category One status under the Elite Player

Performance Plan, the new version of the current academy system that will begin next season. Category One status will allow clubs to have greater powers to take youngsters from smaller clubs, but Clegg does not think that it would be a financially viable move for his club.

Preston North End manager Graham Westley accused four of his team of leaking team tactics and his side's planned formation prior to their 2-0 defeat at Sheffield Wednesday on Saturday. The former Stevenage boss has found it difficult to turn round Preston's poor run of form since replacing Phil Brown as manager in the New Year.

Wolverhampton Wanderers' caretaker boss Terry
Connor remains positive that his side can beat the
drop despite Saturday's 2-1 defeat to fellow
strugglers Bolton leaving his side six points from safety.

Blue Square Bet Premier strugglers Darlington gave their chances of surviving relegation to the regional divisions a boost with a battling 3-3 draw at AFC Telford at the weekend. Much-travelled striker Drewe Broughton scored the Quaker's first goal and snatched a point after a superb volley by Danny Lambert in the last ten minutes levelled the scores.

Charlton Athletic remain six points clear of second placed Sheffield United in League 1 after recording a 2-0 victory at The Valley over London rivals Leyton Orient, a result that leaves the O's five points above the drop at the opposite end of the table.

A fifth defeat in six games for Cheltenham Town has seen Mark Yates' charges slip to the final playoff spot; Southend's 4-0 victory over the Robins at the weekend included a goal from former Shrimper Freddy Eastwood, his first since his return to Roots Hall on loan from Championship side Coventry City.

Portsmouth administrator Trevor Birch has welcomed the club's latest initiative of a Supporters' Trust share scheme as a 'welcome step forward' for the Championship side's survival. The scheme, which launched on Saturday, invited Pompey fans to deposit a refundable minimum of £100 into a protected account that could lead to the trust developing an offer to buy the club if sufficient people come forward.

Wrexham manager Andy Morrell has said that his side still has its work cut out to overhaul Blue Square Bet Premier leaders Fleetwood Town, with the Welshmen eight points behind in second place with one game in hand despite managing a best-ever league points haul of 90 with six games left to play.

Former Barnet defender Grant Basey scored an injury-time penalty to rescue a point for relegation-threatened Wycombe Wanderers at promotion-chasing Stevenage. The Chairboys managed a sixth game unbeaten, and condemned Gary Smith's Boro to a fifth straight league draw in the process – Stevenage face former manager Graham Westley on Easter Monday when they entertain Preston North End at the Lamex.

Cardiff City boss Malky Mackay has backed striker Kenny Miller to get back amongst the goals, despite the former Glasgow Rangers front man failing to find the net in his last fourteen outings for the Bluebirds. City remain very much in the promotion mix, sitting just two points and two places outside the play-off places despite a disappointing goalless draw against Millwall at the weekend.

A Darren Dodds goal inside the first two minutes was enough to give Falkirk a record fourth Scottish Challenge Cup final win over Hamilton Academical on Sunday, with the veteran captain heading home from a corner after just 82 seconds proving enough for the victory.

League 2 Burton Albion are likely to be without captain John McGrath for considerably longer than first feared; a torn foot ligament suffered against Swindon Town in February will now require surgery with the thirty-two year old midfielder likely to miss at least the end of the current season and possibly the beginning of next.

England captain Rachel Unitt scored on her 100th appearance as the women's international team thrashed Croatia 6-0 in a Uefa European Championship qualifier on Saturday.

The Robins Reviewed... By James Castle

The Season So Far

Swindon Town are well on course for a return to League 1 at the first attempt and are starting to live up to their tag as one of the promotion favourites this term after a slow start to the season. The Robins ait at the very summit of the table,

Their Carling Cup campaign ended at the 2nd Round stage, losing 3-1 at home to Southampton, but not before they had knocked out another Championship club, Bristol City, on their own patch at the previous stage.

A fine victory over Premier League Wigan Athletic by two goals to one at the County Ground took the Robins to The FA Cup 4th Round where they found Leicester City too hot to handle despite putting up a great fight in their 2-0 defeat. A 1-0 win over the Bees at home in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy second leg gave Town the chance to win the trophy for the very first time, only to come up against a determined Chesterfield outfit that ensured the Spireites would have their name on the silverware this season.

Last Season

Swindon moved into the fourth tier at the end of last season after a disappointing League One campaign which saw them eventually finish one point and one place below Plymouth at the foot of the table, and with all three of their League victories after Christmas coming away from home.

A 2-1 defeat to Leyton Orient put paid to any Carling Cup ambitions at the 1st Round stage, with a similar fate befalling them in The FA Cup although Crawley Town only managed to prevail in a replay at the County Ground, edging it 3-2 after extra time after a 1-1 draw in the first match. Town did manage to reach the quarter-final stage of the JPT after convincing wins over Southampton and Torquay at home, but were to lose on penalties to League One rivals Brentford after a 1-1 draw at the County Ground.

New Signings

Paolo di Canio rang the changes when he arrived as manager with no fewer than nine new faces in the Swindon squad since the end of last season, including former Barnet defender Joe Devera. Of these, four made the switch in the recent January transfer window bringing a mixture of of youth and experience to the ranks.

One name familiar to Bees fans is former Dagenham & Redbridge striker Paul Benson, who was a regular name on the score sheet during his time under John Still's tenure at the Daggers. Over eighty career goals in five full seasons for them saw a number of clubs after his signature with a move to Charlton Athletic just before the start of last season the result. Benson managed ten League goals for the Addicks in

28 starts before his switch to Swindon, his first goal for the club coming in the 1-0 win at home to Macclesfield.

Goalkeeper Wes Foderingham has made his initial loan move to the Robins a permanent one, having joined the club in October from Championship side Crystal Palace, and has so far only been on the losing side once for his new club. Providing the guile in midfield are ex-Gillingham trainee Luke Rooney, a recent signing, and former Yeovil and Leicester player Lee Cox, who joined the club from Inverness Caledonian Thistle where he had made nearly 70 appearances in the Scottish Premier League.

They Played For Both

Last season's player of the year at Underhill made the summer switch to the County Ground; Joe Devera made over 200 first team appearances for the Bees, scoring twice, before joining Swindon at the end of last season having helped Barnet maintain their League Two status on the final day. Barnet's Mark Marshall made the move in the opposite direction the season before, having joined the Robins from Grays Athletic in 2008.

Other recent Bees players to have transferred directly from today's visitors include striker Jake Hyde, Barnet's young player of the year in 2009-10, and defender Nicky Nicolau who moved to Underhill at the end of the 2005-06 season and who went on to make over a century of appearances in the black and amber. Bees' legend Giuliano Grazioli also enjoyed a spell at Swindon after leaving Peterborough United in 1999, scoring eighteen times in over eighty appearances for the club before moving to Bristol Rovers.

Last Time at Underhill

It was honours even at Underhill back in January in an enthralling Johnstone's Paint Trophy Southern Final first leg game, the game finishing 1-1 courtesy of two headed goals. The visitors took the lead when defender Aden Flint took advantage of some hesitation in the Bees' defence to head home from close range following a corner from Caddis a minute before the break. Barnet's reply came from captain Mark Hughes who nodded home a Mark Marshall free-kick with eighteen minutes remaining.

PAOLO DI CANIO - MANAGER

After a glittering playing career Paolo is making his first steps in management at the County Ground after being appointed last summer. Born in Rome he played for Lazio, Juventus, Napoli and AC Milan before in 1996 he joined Celtic. A season later he signed for Sheffield Wednesday and then a well remembered spell at West Ham United, before a season with Charlton Athletic prior to a return to Italian football. Vastly talented and capable of incredible moments of skill, strangely he was never capped at full level by Italy. Paolo of course led Swindon Town to Wembley in the Final of the JPT during his first season in management as well as topping the League 2 table for most of the season.

1 MATTIA LANZANO

Italian goalkeeper Mattia departed native side USD Gavorrana 1930 in July to sign a two-year deal with Swindon. The 21-year-old custodian travelled with the squad on the preseason tour to Italy and made his debut in the 11-0 win over Norcia.

3 CALLUM KENNEDY

Former Reading youngster Callum was granted a taste of first team action after featuring during the club's pre-season tour of Austria in 2008. The 22-year-old left-back impressed during numerous substitute appearances before making his full debut against Carlisle United. He was awarded a new contract in 2009 but a pelvic injury sustained mid-way through the season kept him on the sidelines for a lengthy period. Loan spells at Gillingham and Rotherham United

ensued during 2010-2011 before Callum returned to The County Ground as first-choice left-back for the 2011-12 season.



5 JOE DEVERA

Joe became Paolo's first signing as boss in the summer after an established spell with Barnet. The 25-year-old, who is of Venezuelan descent, made 177 appearances during a six-year career with the Bees, and was named the club's Player of the Year in 2008 and 2011. A product of the Barnet youth system, Joe can play at either right-back or centre-back. Quick on the recovery he now prefers the central defensive slot.

6 DANIEL BOATENG

Swindon signed Arsenal defender Daniel on loan until the end of the season during the January transfer window. The 19-year-old has featured 27 times for Arsenal's reserves since first breaking through in 2009-10.



7 PAUL CADDIS

Paul signed from Celtic in 2010 on a three-year deal. The 23-year-old can play in many different positions but is predominantly a right-sided defender. Paul came through the ranks at Celtic and enjoyed much success at youth team level. He made 42 appearances in the 2010-11 season and was voted Fans' Away Player of the Year. Delivered the

corner that led to Swindon's goal at Underhill in the JPT Area Final and put in the cross that was headed home for their winning goal at the County Ground.



8 SIMON FERRY

Simon made the permanent switch from Celtic in 2010 having initially joined Celtic at the age of 12 where he progressed through the ranks at Parkhead. However, he was sidelined for nearly two years with a serious ankle injury. The 24-year-old midfielder has already proved to be a major part of the side and scored his second goal of the campaign in the FA Cup win over Huddersfield Town.

9 PAUL BENSON

Swindon completed the signing of 32-year-old Charlton Striker Paul in January. Paul joined Dagenham & Redbridge in 2005 after being spotted playing non-league football. The six-foot hitman struck 28 times to help Dagenham win the Conference title and netted 22 goals the following term. He also scored in all three play-off matches as Daggers defeated Rotherham United 3-2 in the League 2 play-off final.



10 MATT RITCHIE

After two separate loan spells Matt signed a two-and-a-half year contract with Town last year. Matt made his full debut for the club in the 2-0 Johnstone's Paint Trophy

Etienne signed for Town after impressing during a three-week trial at the club during the summer. The Dutchman scored in each of his friendly appearances for the club against a Marche XI and Swindon Supermarine and put pen to paper on a two-year deal at The County Ground shortly after. The 27-year-old made 65 appearances for Sheffield Wednesday during his previous stint in English football.



12 ALAN McCORMACK

Alan signed a two-year deal at The County Ground last July following his release from Charlton. The 28-year-old Irishman trained with Paolo's side for a week before putting pen to paper. Alan, a central defender, started his career at Preston North End before a move to Southend United. He went on to make 130 appearances for the Shrimpers scoring 15 times during three seasons at the club.

SWINDON TOWN FC

13 OLIVER RISSER

Oliver penned a two-year deal at The County Ground in July. The 31-year-old is a Namibian international who has played in Norway, Germany and Greece during his career. Oliver is a powerful defensive midfielder and can also play as a centre-back.

14 JORDAN PAVETT

Jordan won a competition of more than 3,500 players to sign a professional contract with Swindon last year. The striker who has previously spent time at Ipswich Town and Colchester United joined Swindon after working as a plumber with his dad's firm. The 20-year-old was handed the number 14 shirt ahead of the 2011/12 season and featured during the pre-season tour of Italy.

14 JOHN BOSTOCK

John is a talented midfielder who Spurs paid Crystal Palace £700,000 for when he was still a teenager. He has since seen loan action at Brentford, Hull City and at Sheffield Wednesday. Still only 20-years of age.

16 LEE COX

Swindon signed Inverness
Caledonian Thistle midfielder on a
two-and-a-half-year deal last
month. The 21-year-old, whose
contract was due to expire at the
end of the season, previously had a
loan spell with Yeovil.



17 ALAN CONNELL

Swindon clinched the signing of Grimsby Town striker Alan for an undisclosed six-figure sum in the summer. The 29-year-old frontman arrived at Blundell Park from Bournemouth in 2010 and scored 29 league goals for the Mariners last term. A popular player in two spells at Dean Court, the former lpswich trainee has won promotion to League One on three separate occasions and has also enjoyed prolific spells with both Torquay United and Hereford United. Alan scored the goal which dashed Barnet's dreams of a trip to Wembley in the JPT Area Final.

19 LUKE ROONEY

21-year-old Luke joined The Robins during the January transfer winder for a reported six-figure sum. The former Gillingham left-sided midfielder made an instant impact at The Country Ground, providing an assist for the winning goal in his debut at home to Macclesfield Town.

21 LANDER GABILONDO

Spanish winger Lander signed for Town in August after arriving on trial soon after the start of the campaign. He was born in San Sebastian and came through the youth system at Real Sociedad. Lander then moved to La Liga rivals Osasuna where he played 159 games in the Spanish 2B division. The 24-year-old winger, who likes to take on full-backs, made his first Swindon appearance from the bench against Oxford United.

22 LEE HOLMES

Lee is on loan at Swindon from Southampton. He is 25 years-of-age and is a midfielder by trade, his career started as a trainee at Derby County.



23 RAFFAELE DE VITA

Italian striker Raffaele signed a two-

year deal with The Robins in the summer after a spell in Scotland with Livingston. The 24-year-old joined Blackburn Rovers aged 15 and came up through the ranks at Ewood Park. Despite a hat-trick in a reserve team game against Wigan Athletic, first team opportunities never materialised and the frontman opted to leave the Premier League side. In 2008 he moved north of the border where he spent three seasons with Livingston. Last term he made 31 appearances, scoring 11 goals. A skillful left winger.



24 JONATHAN SMITH

Swindon secured the signing of York City midfielder Jonathan in June. The former Forest Green Rovers man joined The Robins for an undisclosed fee on a two-year contract. The 25-year-old was highly-rated during his time with the Minstermen and will be hoping to make a lasting impression during the League 2 campaign.

26 PHIL SMITH

Paul joined Town in 2006 from Crawley Town and made his first start for the club in a Carling Cup defeat by Brentford. His heroics between the sticks during the 2006/07 didn't go unnoticed by the fans who named him their Player of the Season. The 32-year-old goalkeeper endured a frustrating campaign in 2009/2010 but made 33 starts last season and now competes for a starting place at The County Ground.

27 ALESSANDRO CIBOCCHI

Paolo's tenth signing of the summer

was the capture of Italian left-back Alessandro. The 29-year-old will compete with Callum Kennedy for a first team place this season.

29 LUKAS MAGERA

Swindon signed Czech Republic international striker Lukas during the summer on a two-year deal. Capped four times by his country, the 6'4" strikers' arrival brought an end to the clubs search for a targetman. The 29-year old striker spent the last few seasons with Politehnica Timişoara and played for his country against Scotland in a UEFA Euro 2012 Qualifier in October.



34 RONAN MURRAY

Swindon recently extended the loan signing of Ipswich Town striker Ronan until the end of the season. The 20-year-old came through the Academy at Portman Road and has progressed through to the first team squad although is yet to feature for Paul Jewell's side this term. He gained some valuable experience last season during a loan spell with Torquay United and has been capped up to U19 level with the Republic of Ireland.

35 WES FODERINGHAM

Swindon signed 21-year-old Crystal Palace goalkeeper Wes on a permanent deal after an initial spell on loan. The former England U19 'keeper has enjoyed a prolific start to his Swindon career, a keeper of many a clean sheet.



Swindon Town's Star Graduate...

Football historian LEIGH EDWARDS profiles one of Swindon Town's finest-ever players...MIKE SUMMERBEE, a classy winger who went onto win eight England caps...

A son of former Preston and Barrow wing-half George Summerbee, he was born in Preston and moved to Cheltenham as a youngster when his father became Cheltenham Town's manager. Mike was the first wave of young players introduced by Bert Head at Swindon and made his League debut in the Robins' 2-0 victory at home to Bournemouth three months before turning professional in March 1960.

Summerbee scored his first League goal in Swindon's 4-3 win at home to Colchester United the following month and missed just one match in 1960-61. He formed an exciting right wing partnership with Ernie Hunt and was a key figure as Swindon won promotion for the first time in their history in 1962-63. Other young stars who played for Swindon during this period included Cliff Jackson, Don Rogers, John Trollope and Bobby Woodruff.

Mike featured prominently as Swindon stormed to the top of the Second Division in the opening weeks of the 1963-64 campaign and began to attract the attention of bigger clubs. Summerbee was Swindon's leading marksman and 'Player of the Year' in 1964-65, netting 39 goals in 218 League games for the Robins before moving to Manchester City for £31,000 in August 1965.

Joe Mercer's first signing for City, the manager had played alongside Summerbee's father in Aldershot's star-studded wartime team and followed young Mike's progress. Mike was ever-present in City's 1965-66 Second Division title triumph and starred as they won the League Championship in 1967-68, the FA Cup in 1968-69 and League Cup and European Cup Winners' Cup in 1969-70. He missed the latter final through injury but was awarded a special winner's medal.


Summerbee made his full England debut in the 1-1 draw with Scotland in January 1968 that confirmed Sir Alf Ramsey's team as the winners of their European Nations Cup group and winners of the Home Championship. He kept his place for England's 1-0 victory over Spain at Wembley in the European Nations Cup quarter-final first-leg and scored his only international goal in the 1-1 draw against Switzerland in November 1971.

A fashionable dresser in the 'Swinging Sixties' Mike was part-owner of a boutique with George Best. He was a League Cup finalist again in 1974 and played over 300 games in the top-flight before moving to Burnley for £25,000 in August 1975, then had a spell with Blackpool before becoming Stockport County's player-manager.

Mike was a colourful character and a genuine personality as well as a player with skill in abundance. He retired from the game to concentrate on his business activities, including a bespoke shirt making company, combining these with a successful career as an after-dinner speaker and also appearing alongside Pele in the film 'Escape to Victory'. His son Nicky followed in his footsteps, playing for both Swindon and Manchester City.

When a CV Is Not Checked Thoroughly Enough...

WITH both Burton Albion and
Rotherham United on the hunt for new
managers, the boards of both clubs will
be well aware that a bad choice could
spell rebellion in the stands. Here are a
few clubs whose recruitment process let
them down.

Claude Anelka - Raith Rovers

WHEN he isn't shamelessly engineering moves for his more talented younger brother, Claude is an amateur player and DJ at London clubs.

However, in 2004, he tired of seeing managers do "crazy things" and decided to have a crack at it himself. After offering £300,000 to any lower league club who would let him be their manager, his hand was duly snapped off by Scottish Division One side Raith Rovers.

Sadly, old Claude wasn't exactly averse to "crazy things" himself, signing a clutch of players from Parisian seven-a-side leagues and taking just one point from 24 before 'moving upstairs'.

Fred Kirkham - Tottenham

EVEN by early 20th century standards, this was a bizarre one. A travelling salesman and referee, Kirkham had never played or managed a team in his life, though he had been officiating for 17 years.

On 13th April 1907, Kirkham refereed a Southern League match between Tottenham and Watford. Five days later, and to the bewilderment of supporters, he was named manager of Spurs.

It was, says his official bio, "a disastrous appointment". Despised by both fans and players he resigned in July 1908 with the dressing room in rebellion and having lost 19 of his 50 games in charge.



Attilio Lombardo – Crystal Palace

THOUGH he looked about 50, Italian winger Lombardo was only 31 when he ditched Juventus for the bright lights of Thornton Heath.

Even so, he was probably still

a bit young for management – especially as he couldn't speak a word of English!

Not that Palace chairman Mark Goldberg was too bothered about that. When manager Steve Coppell moved upstairs in early 1998, Goldberg appointed Lombardo as boss with roly-poly Swedish midfielder Thomas Brolin as his interpreter.

Doomed to failure? Of course it was. Though Lombardo's performances were so good he was called up by Italy, Palace were relegated in last place.



Hristo Stoichkov – Celta Vigo

ONLY Celta Vigo know why they appointed the famously temperamental Bulgarian in 2007. But one thing's for sure – it wasn't his CV.

In his only previous job, as manager of Bulgaria,

Stoichkov had proudly announced that he "doesn't do tactics" before sending his side out in a 2-4-4 formation that left them trailing Malta for 60 minutes.

He also fell out with every – yes every – player in the squad, forcing two captains and three players into early retirement, lambasted the fans and then accused Romania of fixing a European Championship qualifier.

Relegated in his first season, he left citing 'personal reasons' just six weeks into the following campaign. Fans rejoiced.

Sean McCausland is in conversation with on loan defender Jordan Mustoe, aka Mustard...

What attracted you most when signing for Barnet Football Club?

The first team opportunities and the chance to have a new start made me put pen to paper.

When an aspiring footballer which player did you look up to and why?






If you inherited £25,000 - what would you do with it?

Keep practicing and work hard. And believe that you have the quality to make it!






Barnet v Torquay United (30/03/2012)




Rossi Eames the programme manager adds'l have been very proud of the way the players have conducted themselves this season and







TPOWER LEAGUE 2

Barnet return to League 2 action in less than a week's time when Steve Evans' Crawley Town visit Underhill for what could prove to be a decisive game in the Red Devils' quest for a second successive promotion, writes James Castle. Town will come in to the Easter weekend in good form, an unbeaten run of eight games propelling the Sussex side back into the automatic promotion places, on goal difference ahead of Shrewsbury Town.

Crawley's record away from home is extremely impressive, with only Morecambe losing as few as Evans' side's four games on the road so far, and Town has only lost to fellow promotion chasers Shrewsbury and Swindon Town in League Two away from their own patch since the turn of the year. Barnet fans though can take heart from the fact that their opponents are yet to prevent the Bees from beating them at Underhill in five previous attempts, encompassing various Southern League competitions and the only meeting between the two in the Conference here in Hertfordshire. The corresponding fixtures in Crawley are honours even thus far, with both sides winning two of the six played since the Bees turned professional in 1966.

Older Bees fans will remember one of those Bees wins; a stunning first-time effort by the late Carl Hoddle that helped Barnet to a 2-1 FA Cup 2nd Round win at Crawley back in December 1993, a strike so good that it ended up on the Match of the Day 'Goal of the Month' competition. With the Red Devils in fantastic form, and the Bees needing points for very different reasons at the other end of the table, Barnet supporters will be hoping for goals of a similar quality, hopefully in the midst of some Bank Holiday sunshine...

Cheltenham.

Brief Directions by Road: The best bet to get to Whaddon Road is via the M40/A40 which bypasses Oxford. Stay on the A40 into Carlton Kings on the outskirts of the town where you will meet a main set of traffic lights with the road from Cirencester to your left. At the next set of lights turn right into Hales Road (B4075 signposted Prestbury). This road becomes Priors Road, stay on it until Whaddon Road can be found on the left after about a mile and a half opposite a small parade of shops. Turn left here, go straight on at the small roundabout and after approx. 1/2 mile the ground will be in sight to your right. For the free park and ride service (see below for details), continue along Priors Road then turn right into Bouncers Lane. Continue to a double mini roundabout. Turn left at the first one then take the second exit at the second one onto B4348 Tatchley Lane, signposted Evesham A435. Follow this road to another roundabout; continue straight over and the Cheltenham Racecourse Park and Ride is on the right-hand side. These directions are courtesy of CTFC.

Car Parking: In years gone by this was a tough call as there were no parking facilities at the ground and the local streets are heavily restricted. The club offers a free park and ride system from nearby Cheltenham racecourse. Buses run every 20 minutes. The Town Centre is 15 walk away where you will find numerous pay and display car parks.

Directions by Train: Cheltenham Spa station is a good 2 miles away from the ground and a taxi is the only realistic option. Train back to Hertfordshire after the game will pose a problem however!

Coach Travel: Full details are on page 48, one page back!

Eating and Drinking Locally: The local Chippy on Whaddon

Road is very good but that is the only real option for food close to the ground. The drinking situation is however much more affluent. The two friendliest pubs close to the ground are The Fox & Hounds and the Sudley Arms, both on nearby Prestbury Road. In Wymans Road (behind the Stadium's In2Print Stand) is Parklands Social Club, where away fans are welcomed there is also very limited car parking for £4. The club will make a minimal charge for temporary membership.

The Social Club: The onsite social club"The Robins Nest" is open to all and serves light snacks, a small entrance fee is applicable.

Ground Description: The first thing that strikes you at Whaddon Road is the familiarity of the main stand which is a larger version of the one at Underhill. It was built in a year earlier than ours in 1963 and the similarities are evident if you look closely. For instance two of the original floodlight gantries sit on top of a roof which is supported in the centre by one thin central upright. Morecambe FC also had a very similar main stand. This one holds about 1,000 seats and has a small paddock at the front. To it's the left is the Cheltenham & Gloucester stand which is basically a low roof over terracing, it is the "home" end. Opposite is the very smart In2Print Stand which was completed in 2001 replacing a very popular terrace, it has room for around 1,800. Completing the picture is the latest edition to Whaddon Road, The Carlsberg Stand. Visiting supporters to the stadium will be allocated an area of covered seating dependent upon the number of fans they expect to bring to the game. The initial allocation of tickets will be for the In2Print Stand and then part or all of the Carlsberg Stand".

Our Last Meeting & Memories: League 2 February 2011, and a Joe Devera goal was the highlight for Barnet in a 1-1 draw We were treated to a highly entertaining 3-4 defeat at Whaddon Road in early December 2000 when Tony Cottee, Omar Riza and Darren Currie were our scorers. The clubs had been frequent opponents in the old Southern League of the 1960s and 70s and the Gola and Conference campaigns of the 1980's. The highlights for me? A certain James Greaves double in a 2-1 away win in 1978, when he left the field to a moving standing ovation from one and all, another double from a certain Nicholas Evans again away from home in 1987 plus a stunning Gary Bull hatrick in a yet another away win in October 1990.

Celebrity Watch: For music lovers everywhere Cheltenham offers a very diverse list of musicians/artists who were born or were/are resident here. Brian Jones of the Rolling Stones, Planet Suite composer Gustav Holst, Rocky Horror writer Richard O'Brien, punk queen Toyah – who I was fortunate enough to back with my band at the East Finchley British Legion in the 1970s - and ex Motorhead guitarist Wurzel. British Winter Olympian Eddie "The Eagle" Edwards is still practising at the local dry ski slope but one wonders if he was influenced by the knowledge that another famous skier

came from these parts - Edward Wilson who went to the Antarctic with the Captain Scott Expedition in 1912, nipped out of the tent for a bit and unfortunately never came back!


ONE YEAR ON...



The founder of "Programme Monthly" magazine John Litster describes the programmes and the often fascinating stories that lie behind them in a series that he calls...COLLECTORS'TALES...

Mike Blackstone was one of the longest serving League club

programme editors when Exeter City dispensed with his services at the end of 2010-11 season. In issue 265 of Programme Monthly, he recalled how his interest in programmes began.


It all started when receiving a fourpenny one ... match programme that is. An Exeter City issue, with an aerial view of St James' Park resplendent on its cover. It was bought for me as I went along to my first ever game. It was something I cherished and still have to this very day. I bought another at the second game, then a third and so on, and before I had probably realised it, I had become an Exeter City programme collector.

Gone are the days of course when you could buy a programme or a magazine for just fourpence - now they are more likely to cost you £3 more at some grounds. And gone are the days when they were little more than a means of identifying the players, with a little bit of club news 'thrown in' for good measure. Now they are highly polished magazines, full of reading, features, news and top quality photographs.

It wasn't long of course, and with the means to buy other programmes, that I branched out to not just collecting Exeter programmes, but issues from other clubs as well. It was more out of curiosity I suppose, just to have a read of different clubs' publications. I well recall buying bundles of mixed programmes ranging between £2 and £5. And you used to get a lot then for that price.

Eventually though, and having left school and started work, there was a little more disposable income and then it was decided to try and complete a collection of Exeter City programmes, home and away, going back to the first competitive season after the war - 1946-47.

I am so glad I bought them when I did, for anyone




starting today with the same aim would have to be a very rich person! £10 to £15 per copy is not unusual now. I was never one to collect purely for monetary gain, though, but obviously it is nice to know how much your collection is worth.

Programmes have always fascinated me from that very first day I was given one at St James' Park. For it is not just a record of your team and its players, and the games they have played, but a social record as well. Programmes change year on year and so do the advertisements which give a flavour of Exeter of yesteryear when you start to turn the pages of programmes from 40,50 and 60 years ago.

They do of course bring back a lot of memories of matches. And then you begin to recall the players that played in them, both in the City side and the opposition line-up. The programmes provide a comprehensive account of how the Grecians have progressed (or stumbled!) from one year to the next. They also reveal the personalities behind the Club and the trials and tribulations that they had to face in order to keep the Football League flag flying at St James' Park.

I still collect programmes today. I simply cannot resist them. No matter where I might see a game, I have to have a programme. My collecting habits have perhaps become more selective now, but I still get as much enjoyment out of holding and reading each newly printed copy of the Exeter City programme, just as I did when my father parted with fourpence to buy one for me all those years ago.




