**THIS** is a very crucial period of the season for us. We have a chance to take big steps in terms of our league position and having worked towards success all season, winning the League Two title is now our main focus.

AFTER today there are only five games to go and those results will be very important for us. We are very close to direct promotion which would be a great achievement.

We can decide our own destiny because I believe we are the best team in this division. I am not saying this because I am arrogant; I used to say this when we were sixth in the table. Every game is difficult and we know that, but we must keep going and make sure we play in the right way. We are at the top and everybody wants to play against us to show what they can do.

The Barnet match last Tuesday was a tough workout. Thankfully the game saw us come away with the points and we managed to extend the gap at the top of the table. We travelled to Barnet without a number of key players - such as Caddis, Ritchie and Holmes - but we kept the ball on the ground and did well. I knew we would be okay when we went there because the players worked hard and took their chances. Ten of the fourteen players who played at Barnet last week had been with us since the beginning of the season and came with us on pre-season in Norcia. They have the discipline and that helped us through. I have to feel confident because even without some of our key players, we have the ability to play the right way and have success. We have maintained the collective desire to work hard throughout matches and that must continue. we don't want to rush him back to early. We would like to have him back for the final push and that remains a possibility. There is no need to risk him because Joe Devera has been doing well at right-back. Caddis has been a key player for us this season and it will be good to have him back when the time is right.

We have options in terms of selection again for today's game. Simon Ferry didn't play at Barnet last week so Oliver Risser and Jonathan Smith played in the midfield and that made us a little more solid but in a different way. Raffaele De Vita and Luke Rooney started at Barnet too and we created many chances. In terms of injuries, Paul Caddis has been working hard on his recovery but Today we begin back to back home games and this is a big opportunity for us. We didn't win against Bristol Rovers but won at Barnet, so the results have come for us. I don't know how many teams that will end up at 86 or 87 points, but there is no reason why we can't get 90 or more. All we can do is continue to win games and keep moving forward. Then I hope we can celebrate together.











**IT'S** good to be back at The County Ground after consecutive away trips and today's game against Northampton Town will be another tough test for the lads as we look to secure promotion.

**THE** game against Barnet on Tuesday night was a good result for the lads and another step closer towards our ultimate goal of promotion this season. When you go to places like Underhill you need to grind results out and I think we did that. We're carrying a few injuries at the moment but that win goes to show the strength and depth we have in the squad.

My injury is coming along and I've been spending quite a lot of time with young Louis Thompson in an Oxygen tank in West Swindon. I would just like to take this opportunity to thank all the staff at Swindon therapy centre for MS for their kind help. The reason for this treatment is to speed up the recovery of injuries as you breathe in 100% oxygen. I'm hoping to be back in full training this week and we'll assess it from there.

The Easter period is a busy one with fixtures coming up thick and fast, but it's these periods of the season that are pivotal, we just need to keep our heads down and keep picking up as many points as possible, if we do that then promotion will take care of itself.

As this programme went to print the Morecambe game hadn't been played but the lads headed up North in high spirits for us to secure all three points in the reverse fixture on New Years Eve.

If the results go in our favour during this period we will be hoping that we can secure promotion at home to Plymouth Argyle and all being well with my rehabilitation programme, I will be aiming to make my

#### Brett Williams...

THE striker has faced Swindon Town twice already this season in Rotherham United colours. The frontman joined the Millers on loan from Reading at the end of August and went on to score twice in 11 league outings. He joined the Royals from Eastleigh where he had a record of a goal every two games for the Spitfires. Williams signed for Northampton on loan in February and he scored his first goal for the Cobblers in the March defeat at Accrington.





Lewis Young... NORTHAMPTON Town signed former Watford right winger Young in July 2011. He made his first senior appearance as a substitute in Watford's 1-0 victory over Bristol Rovers. He joined Burton Albion in July 2010 following a trial. After his release by the Brewers in May 2011 he moved to Sixfields.

#### Jake Robinson...

FORMER Shrewsbury Town striker Robinson put pen to paper on a two-year contract at Sixfields in June 2011. The Brighton-born front man spent the second half of the 2010/11 season on loan at Torquay United, scoring seven goals in 22 appearances. His total goal tally for the season was 16, as he found the net nine times for his parent club in the first half of the season, including scoring twice against the Cobblers for Shrewsbury in September 2010.





Anthony Charles... THE defender signed for Northampton last month, penning a deal to keep him at Sixfields until the end of the current season. The 31-year old centreback previously had extended spells with Barnet and Aldershot Town as well as spells in non-league football with Hayes and Farnborough.

#### **Top Scot**

NOT only is Colin Calderwood a Swindon Town legend, he's pretty highly regarded by today's visitors too. The Scot helped Swindon to three promotions as a player before quiding the Cobblers to promotion in 2006 as manager. He is now assistant manager to Chris Hughton at Birmingham City where he is chasing promotion to the top-flight. Calderwood was due at The County Ground on Saturday 31st March to be inducted into the STFC Hall of Fame before being summoried for scouting duties by Hughton.

#### Town treble

THE last player to score a hat-trick in a match between Swindon and Northampton is Simon Cox. The striker netted the treble at Sixtields in March 2009 helping the Robins avoid the drop. Cox, a former Northampton loanee, is now preparing for this summer's Euro 2012 campaign after breaking onto the international scene.

#### College crew

NORTHAMPTON coalkeeper Neal Kitson is a graduate of St. John's University in New York, which former Town midfielder Stefani Miglioranzi also attended. Miglioranzi has now retired from the game after spending last season with Philadelphia Union.



NORTHAMPTON Town appointed former Watford, Colchester United and Coventry City boss Boothroyd as their new manager in succession to Gary Johnson in November 2011.

Boothroyd took over at Watford in 2005 and initially helped them stave off relegation to League One. He then caused a major shock as he won promotion to the Premier League with the Hornets in his first full season. via the play-offs. Boothroyd then guided the club to the FA Cup semi-finals and a tie against Manchester United during their season in the lop-flight. On Watford's return to the Championship, he again took them to the play-offs but they missed out on promotion. In September 2009, Boothroyd was appointed as manager of Watford Colchester United. The Essex side were unbeaten in Boothroyd's first nine games, going on to finish eighth in League One in 2009/10.

In May 2010 he was named as the new manager of Coventry City, and he took the club to fifth in the Championship in December 2010, before leaving in March 2011. This was his most recent managerial position before being handed the reins at Sixfields.

Risser is hoping to wrap up the first

Risser scored his fourth of the season at Barnet last Tuesday evening after being recalled to the starting line-up and with 33 appearances for Town this term; he is well placed to discuss what has been a busy campaign.

Speaking of Town's recent fixture schedule, he said: "The games have been coming quickly but we always give our best in every match we play in.

"We are top of the league and everyone wants to beat Swindon so we know the games are going to be tough. We almost have our hands on promotion and as players we want to win every match, as we have done until now."

#### Paul Benson

AFTER helping Dagenham & Redbridge to promotion via the play-offs two years ago, Paul Benson is looking to secure the League Two title this term.

Benson has been a big success since making the switch from Charlton Athletic in January, hitting his tenth goal of the season against Cheltenham last month. The 32-year old is now hoping to add a second promotion from League Two to his CV by firing the Robins to success.

He said: "History shows that if you can get to 87 or 88 points then you are looking at a good chance of getting promoted. The league this year has been very competitive and the target is to be promoted as Champions.

"Northampton will come here looking to get them up the table and we won't underestimate them for sure."

## - chris tanner -

MEDIA & Communications manager Chris Tanner takes a look back on a busy ten years at The County Ground...



#### A decade of Swindon

When September comes around I'll have completed ten years of service at The County Ground. I applied for the role of Website Editor back in August 2002 and after just under a year in that role, moved to Media Manager. The main responsibilities of the job here include editing the matchday. programme, filming and editing content for STFC Player (the club's official online TV service). looking after the official website and managing all media and press enquiries. I am the only full-time member of media staff at the club so describing the job as 'busy' wouldn't do it justice! Working for STFC is hugely enjoyable though and there isn't a day goes by that anyone in the office can 'clock watch'. Working for the club that you support is a unique and diverse experience.

#### Programme production

Editing the matchday programme is one of the main responsibilities that falls within my role. With limited resources we rely on a number of contributors to get the programme together. Head of Design, Derrick Johnson, does a fantastic job with the design with no less than two national programme awards coming to SN1 this season. Nick Judd, who was essentially my boss when I began as a not so fresh-faced website editor, writes the main feature interviews - that today sees Aden Flint in the spotlight. 'IT was a memorable afternoon the last time these sides met.'



**FORGET** that it was the last game of 2011, there was something in the air that day in December. Up until the final moments, the match was following a rather generic pattern. Swindon conceded in the first-half, equalised in the second and then, while pushing for a winner against a tired Northampton defence, had Oliver Risser dismissed for a straight red-card to seemingly end any hopes of stealing the points.

I vividly remember the final moments of the game because, in truth, the home side should have won the game before Swindon nicked it in unbelievable fashion. Northampton's on-loan striker Saido Berahino somehow blazed over the bar in the final minute to let Town off the hook. At that point, we were gleeful for a hard-fought point. That is probably what made Alan McCormack's last-gasp winner all the more sweet and was perhaps the reason that Paolo Di Canio decided to run half the length of the pitch to celebrate the goal with his players. There are going to be moments over the course of this campaign that we'll never forget - and that is up there with the best of them.

The bigger picture was the impact that goal had on the second-half of the side's season. Having been beaten by Torquay United on Boxing Day after a fabulous run, it was always going to be a test of character and resolve for Swindon at Northampton and they passed the test. An unbeaten 2012 until early March followed; this was a defining few minutes in the club's campaign.

Northampton are in a healthier position than they were back in December. They aren't out of the woods just yet but have given themselves a real chance of survival this season. They may well have one or two points to prove this afternoon as well. While many people are talking about the fight for promotion in League Two, a glance down to the bottom of the table shows that the battle for relegation could go to the last day as well.

Nick Judd Ptotures Puttytoot Photography, PA Photos, Careth Williams **ADEN** Flint is back and he means business. Town's towering centreback is looking to win the league title in his first season as a professional.

SEPTEMBER 2011 and there's panic in the Flint household. The defender is winning so many man-of-the-match awards that bottles of champagne are beginning to breed and take over the place. Forget the mantelpiece, at one stage it was looking as though he'd need a trophy cabinet to call his own to house his growing collection of bubbly.

Cast your minds back to those murky waters of Town's early season and you'll recall \* that Aden Flint was arouably head and shoulders above his teammates in terms of form and consistency. Granted, the football was good (think Crewe, Oxford], the results were changeable [Dagenham, Cheltenham, Shrewsburyl yet one thing remained constant. Put simply, Flint was a colossus. More successful in the air than Top Gun's Iceman and equally as assured with the ball at his feet. Flint's form was a revelation. He'd win headers with the inevitability of night following day while those go-go gadget legs

thwarted opposing strikers on a regular basis.

That Flint was playing at all let alone a star performer - was something of a surprise when you consider the arrivals of Joe Devera and Alberto Comazzi in the summer. Flint had impressed during a 1-1 draw at Rochdale in February the previous season but only brief cameos followed. He returned to his former club Alfreton Town on loan before the end of the 2010/11 campaign, guiding them to Conference North glory as Town were relegated, but there were few signs he would play such a dominant role this time around.

Now, after missing a chunk of 2012 – including the JPT final at Wembley – Flint has returned alongside Alan McCormack in the centre of defence. And judging by an assured display at Underhill last Tuesday, including a last-ditch tackle which, together with a nifty dive from Wes Foderingham helped keep a 21st league clean sheet, Flint is back just when it matters...

#### aden flint:

### How important was the victory at Barnet last Tuesday?

I'd say it was probably one of the biggest wins of the season, to be honest. We needed it. It was our game in hand and it took us five points clear at the top with a game in hand still, which puts us in good stead.

The players seemed extremely focused from the start, like you all sensed a win could really help kick-start a push to get the team over the line. Was that the feeling before the game, to get a five-point cushion again going into the Easter weekend?

I think the lads knew before the match that it was going to be a massive game for us. We treated it like any other and luckily we came away with the win.

#### You knew from experience that Barnet is a tough place to go, but it was an accomplished performance...

The slope isn't the best but it has to be said credit where it's due, it's a very good playing surface. We got it down and played well in parts. It was a difficult game but we did what we had to do.

#### Another clean sheet, too ...

Yeah, we were delighted with that. The lads have done well this year but it's not just the defenders and the goalkeeper, it starts from the top. The striker and midfielders also work hard, so it's a team effort.

## The fans were out in force again, did that help?

Yes, the fans have been brilliant all season. They follow us in large numbers everywhere, which helps us. It felt like a home game at Barnet with over 800 Town supporters there!

#### How pleased are you to be back following your injury?

At one point I thought the season was over, so it's great to be back and I'm really enjoying playing again. I just hope I can be involved until the end of the season and play my part. I don't really like watching footballs from the sidelines! If I'm not chosen then that happens and you know the lads who come in can do the job, but it's better to play. I've got to play well to keep my place and that's what I intend to do.

#### What was the feeling in the dressing room after the draw against Bristol Rovers last weekend?

Frustration really. We were disappointed that we didn't get the win, to be honest. We had a couple of good chances in the first half and one or two in the second, so we had enough to win the game but we just didn't quite manage it. I think overall we were happy with the way we played, particularly the tempo of the first half. We've just got to keep doing that and take our chances to keep going forward.

#### I think the general consensus in the stands was that had we gone ahead we would have won comfortably, which is what happened at Barnet.

The first goal relaxed everyone at Barnet because the goal came at a time when they were beginning to get into the game. We went from there and played our football, making sure we got the basics right. But yes, had we scored on Saturday I think we would have gone on to get two or three. A goal always helps us build momentum.

#### Wembley has been and gone and it obviously came a bit too soon for you. How did you feel about missing out?

I was disappointed but there was nothing I could dc, it just came too quickly for me. It's one of those things that can happen in football. Hopefully we can get there again so I can experience it. As a club we have to put that behind us. The league was our priority when the season started and that's still the case. We were focused against Bristol Rovers but the win just didn't come. That made the Barnet game

bigger and we've come through that well, so hopefully we can push on.

#### You've resumed your partnership with Alan McCormack. You two seem to play well together...

We know each other's game inside out and we're constantly talking to each other, so we know what positions we need to be in and what we need to do regarding the opposition. Jay [McEveley] and Joe [Devera] also played really well last Tuesday, so it was a solid performance from the back four. But like I say, the clean sheet starts from the work done by the front two and spreads through the team. Everyone played a part.

#### The defensive unit looks capable of doing a job in League One, should we get there, would you agree?

You'd like to think so. 'Macca' has the experience and Joe has been playing at this level for five years, so they have more experience than me. Jay has played in the top flight and so he knows all about playing at a higher level, and all of that im always earning and it's great to have experienced players around me, as well as experienced staff SAMS



experience combined could stand us in good stead.

This is your first major season in professional football. Injury aside, can you believe how well it's gone and how well you've played?

I've scored a few goals, which is always nice. I'd obviously like to score more. I'm always learning and it's great to have experienced players around me, as well as experienced staff. I just want to improve and keep developing. But yeah, on the whole I've been pretty happy. When we win the league then that will top it all off nicely.

#### Is it a case of 'when' and not 'if' we win the league then, do you think?

I think so. We're in a strong

position and so I hope we can finish the job in the next week or two. The key is to get promotion sewn up as quickly as possible I. and after that we don't stop. We

want maximum points.

#### A couple of weeks ago Paolo Di Canio said he wanted us to secure promotion by endof-play today. We were eight points clear of fourth before Morecambe, so is it doable?

It depends how results fall for us really. If they go our way, then maybe, but we're just concentrating on winning our games. That's all we can do.

#### Northampton are a side in good form. What do you remember about them from the previous encounter?

They're a good side with good individual players; we know that from the game at their place. We've just got to do what we do.

#### That game was, of course, the scene of Paolo Di Canio's infamous pitch celebration. Are you enjoying working with him?

It's fantastic. His knowledge is great. He does so much research before games and he's very passionate too. He always tells us what should have been done in certain situations if we don't do things right and he's always giving us constructive advice and encouragement.

#### Finally, we know you like your tattoos. Are you considering a commemorative one if we do win the league?

[laughs] No, I'm not, but I think Simon Ferry is the man for that. Maybe 'League winners' accompanied by a picture of the trophy, perhaps. You'll have to ask him about that!

SWINDON Town fans and players had to wait a while for the away game at Northampton to take place, but the delay was worth the wait as the Robins put on a six-star show at the 'other' County Ground



#### Northampton Town 2 Swindon Town 6 26th November 1968

Attendance: 6.827

THIS Third Division fixture should have been the opening one of the season but cricket took precedence at Northampton's County Ground home on 10 August and so the sides met on a very wet November evening.

Just six days earlier, Swindon had gained a League Cup semifinal lead at Burnley, but they were looking to bounce back from two away defeats in the League and were forced to make one change, with Mick Blick stepping in for the injured Frank Burrows.

The Cobblers made the early running with Barry Lines having an effort ruled out for offside. but they took the lead just two minutes later with a looping header from John Roberts, But by the time the hosts found the net again, through Bob Hatton in the 57th minute, they were 4-1 down.

John Smith opened Town's account in the 28th minute and Don Regers gave them an interval lead, racing from the half-way line and beating two defenders before rounding keeper Gordon Morritt.

Two goals in as many minutes from Roger Smart and Don Heath were quickly followed by Hatton's reply. Peter Downsborough was then forced to make three good saves to preserve Town's advantage.

Cobblers replaced one former Town man, Eric Weaver, with another, Dennis Brown, but soon afterwards Peter Noble stooped to head in a fifth from a cross by Heath. Rogers completed the scoring, following another 50vard sprint as Swindon moved up from sixth place into the top two.

THANKS to Swindon-town-fc.co.uk for the profiles of today's Town inductees...

KENNY STROUD was a ball-boy at Wembley on the day Swindon Town lifted the League Cup in 1969 and his first goal at The County Ground came that same year, when he netted for the South of England's schools team against the North in a 3-1 win. He went on to become a schoolboy international.

swindon town

His Town career started on 4th September 1971, when he made his first team debut in a televised 0-0 home draw with Queens Park Rangers. He made just two more appearances that season, and just five the next, as he gradually broke into the first team ranks.

It wasn't really until the 1974/1975 season that Stroud became a first team regular and his first goal for the Town came at the end of that season, when he scored in a 3-1 home win over Exeter in April.

An accomplished and loyal defender. Stroud stayed at The County Ground for eleven years, his most memorable moment coming in January 1977, when he scored a 30 yard screamer of a goal in an FA Cup tie against Everton at The County Ground. The goal earned the Town a replay, and also won the Central Television Goal of the Season award.

Stroud went on to make over 300 appearances for Swindon, before being released at the end of the 1981/1982 season. With the club in financial difficulty, the Board were unable to match his wages from the previous season, and he left to join Newport County.





JIMMY ALLAN signed on as an apprentice for the Town two weeks before his 17th birthday, having previously played in the Highland League for Brora Rangers, and he made his debut on September 4th, 1971 - in a 0-0 home draw with Queens Park Rangers. It was another two seasons before Allan became the club's first choice keeper - replacing the legendary Peter Downsborough after his public falling out with manager Les Allen.

hall of fame:

A committed Christian, Allan became the first professional player ever to refuse to appear on a Sunday. He consequently lost his place in the side, and he didn't make the number one jersey his own again for over a year, when fellow keeper Jim Barron left the club to coach in the US.

Allan went on to make over 370 league appearances for the Town in all competitions, and it should have been more - his career was brought to an untimely end after an unfortunate collision with Rochdale's Steve Johnson in a match in October 1983 left him with a shattered left arm.

After a lengthy battle against the injury, Allan was forced to retire, and he was rewarded with a testimonial match versus Chelsea in May 1986. Eventually, he went into coaching, and actually made a couple of appearances in the Western League for Torrington, a full ten years after retiring from the game.
