

success on the road



SWINDON Town's Centre of Excellence have just returned from a successful tour to Holland, where three age groups took part in a training camp over the Easter break.



THE U11s, U12s and U13s agegroups were based together to give them a feel of what it's like to train, eat, and play together for the week.

The age groups played four games in total, with fixtures against FC Emma, Gravenzande, PSV Eindhoven and FC Utrecht.

Centre of Excellence manager, Jeremy Newton, was delighted with the outcome of the tour. He said:

"Trips like this are very important for the players as part of their continued development. The players and staff gain a lot from being away in a dedicated football environment for the week and this year we also brought four members of the U10s with us.

"In total we took 49 players away with us, looked after by 12 staff and we were based in Utrecht. The boys trained incredibly well and showed a professional attitude on and off the field whilst representing Swindon Town FC."

The tour began with two warmup games against FC Emma and Gravenzande which saw solid victories before the main attraction; fixtures against PSV Eindhoven and FC Utrecht. Against PSV, the U11s went down 3-1 with Luke Haines scoring the Town goal with a free-kick. The U12s went down 3-0 but the U13s won 2-1 with two goals from Jordan Young which capped a great win against a fantastic PSV side. The final game of the tour was against FC Utrecht and proved to be another good workout for the U13s as it was their fourth game in as many days. The young Robins drew the game 1-1 with the Town goal coming from Scott Twine. Goalkeeper Jared Thompson produced some outstanding saves for his side to keep it at 1-1.





PRESTON striker Tsoumou joined the Pilgrims on loan from PNE until the end of the season in late January 2012. Having made regular appearances for his parent club throughout the first-half of the season, he made his debut in the Pilgrims' 2-2 draw with Southend in February. Raised in the Congolese capital Brazzaville, he moved with his mother to Germany in 2001 and in 2003 he joined the Eintracht Frankfurt football academy. He played there for three seasons before a move to Blackburn Rovers in July 2006 for one season.

Conor Hourihane...

FEW at Argyle had heard of Irish midfielder Hourihane before he donned the green jersey in the Pilgrims' pre-season friendly against Truro in July 2011, but many were hugely excited when he joined Argyle a matters of days later. The Cork-born former Ipswich and Sunderland man has represented the Republic of Ireland at Under-19 and Under-21 level.

Romain Larrieu...

LARRIEU joined Argyle in 2000 having been released by ASOA Valence in his native France. The stopper became the number one choice between the sticks for the 2001/02 season, which not only saw Argyle win Division Three, but saw 'Le Keeper' named in the PFA Team of the Year, while breaking club and league records for keeping clean sheets. He also played a major part in Plymouth's Division Two Championship winning season of 2003/04.





Steve Fletcher...

A legend at AFC Bournemouth, the 39-year old frontman joined Plymouth Argyle in March to add vital experience to the Pilgrims' set-up. A former teammate of Plymouth player-manager Carl Fletcher at Bournemouth, the striker began his career with Hartlepool United before beginning a lengthy stint at Dean Court which has also seen him serve on the coaching staff.

Byrne's belief

FORMER Swindon Town caretaker boss David Byrne has urged the Pilgrims to play 'without fear' at The County Ground this afternoon.

Now working as a regional scout with Birmingham City, Plymouth-based Byrne is anticipating a keenly-contested clash. He believes the visitors' experience could play a key part in the outcome of the encounter.

He told thisisplymouth.co.uk earlier this week: "If you look at Argyle's spine, they've probably got the most experience in the league. That shows in the results they've achieved. But, in my opinion, playing 4-5-1 will not do it for Argyle against Swindon – they will need to be bold as well as squeaky tight at the back.

"There is a lot riding on the game for both sides, whoever wins: one can go up and the other can pretty much stay up."

Played for both

A host of players have represented both Swindon Town and Plymouth Argyle with an array of

with an array of connections between the two clubs.

Nick Hammond, a qualkeeper who played for both, is now Director of Football along the M4 at Reading whilst Sean Morrison - another with Town and Pymouth connections - is on loan from the Royals at Huddersfield Town, Ben Tozer played for Northampton Town at The County Ground five days ago whilst former Green Wayne O'Sullivan is now playing in Australia after a coaching spell in New Zealand. Lukas Jutkiewicz - a former Plymouth loanee has scored 12 goals this term following a £1.3 million switch to

Middlesbrough.

INSPIRATIONAL midfielder Carl Fletcher was upgraded to caretaker manager in September 2011 following the departure of Peter Reid.

He took charge for the first time, along with new first team coach Romain Larrieu, for the Pilgirms 2-0 npower League 2 win over Macclesfield Town. He was later Plymouth Argyle handed the job full-time following a 3-2 win over Dagenham & Redbridge. Having arrived at Home Park on an initial one-month loan deal in February 2009, the midfielder scored on his debut and never looked back.

When Crystal Palace released him at the end of the 2009/10 season, Argyle were quick to snap him up. As well as wearing the Argyle armband, he has captained former clubs Bournemouth and Crystal Palace, as well as the Welsh national team. He played in the 2006 FA Cup final for West Ham United against Liverpool

West Ham United His playing days began with AFC Bournemouth and he made his debut at 17-years old in February 1998. He went on to make 185 starts for the club, which included scoring two in a 5-2 Play-Off final win over Lincoln City in 2003.

Impressive performances for the Cherries caught the eye of West Ham United who parted with £275,000 for his services in 2004. After two years with the Hammers he joined Crystal Palace before a switch to



McCormack has made the switch from central midfielder to defensive lynchpin and has made 48 appearances so far this term. With the visit of the Pilgrims next on the agenda, the challenge is clear.

The Irishman said: "We have to get through the opening 15 minutes because I am sure Plymouth will come here all guns blazing to get the points. We know we have the quality to get through the game and to get the win.

"At this stage of the season we just want to get out there and play games. We know we can win the title and that helps you find the extra five or ten percent to combat any tiredness that creeps in due to the fixture schedule."



Vita is relishing Town's involvement in the promotion shake-up and can't wait to help his side 'finish the job'.

De Vita has been a regular for the Town this term and with 44 appearances so far this season, he is well-placed to look back on what has been a successful first campaign in Swindon colours for the former Blackburn youth teamer.

He said: "The run the team have been on has been phenomenal and there is a real desire to entertain the fans and to keep winning games. Promotion isn't far away and everyone is still focused on winning the title which would be a fantastic way to end the season."

"From a personal point of view I feel a lot sharper and it's been great to have been involved regularly over the last few weeks."

GIVEN Swindon's position in the League Two table at the start of October, it is remarkable that they can secure promotion today.



IT'S a pleasant scenario for Town - a win here coupled with defeat for either Crawley or Torquay this afternoon will see Paolo Di Canio's team return to League One just twelve months after dropping out of the third tier of English football with barely a whimper. Plenty has changed in the past year. New manager, new side and crucially, new optimism. Indeed, the single factor that has remained consistent between last season's relegation and this campaign's expected promotion is the air of inevitability about both situations. It's fair to say that by March 2011, Swindon fans had privately accepted their fate. Spinforward twelve months; Town supporters were publically accepting their promotion. Both stream of thoughts occurred long before the official notification from the Football League but nobody argued with them last year and they certainly aren't now.

Stand-in captain Alan McCormack, who has been excellent in recent matches, said this week that promotion is now an absolute minimum. I couldn't agree more and would be highly surprised if Town didn't lift the title from their current position of supremacy in the league. Many fans have, quite

rightly, highlighted the impact that Paul Caddis and Matt Ritchie have had on the side this season. Yet, you only need to look at the results gathered without them in the past few weeks to notice the quality of depth in the squad. Undoubtedly, the duo are a huge loss to the team but this is now an outfit that have proved their worth over several months and will fully deserve their title medals when they're eventually secured.


This is the time of the football season when many sides feel pressure or panic. Whether promotion or demotion is on the cards, it's a nervy time for all concerned. By contrast, The County Ground is like a sea of tranquillity at the moment. While others flounder, Swindon are floating towards their target. I'd argue that Plymouth don't really fit into either of those categories. Their recent form has seen them pull away from the relegation zone and, although not yet safe, they're now in a position of reasonable security with only four games to play. Given the off-field problems experienced at that football club recently, you can't help but feel today is a reason for all parties to celebrate.

But Argyle went in 2-1 at the break when Digby punched away vet another free-kick from Marker, but only as far as Dants Salman, who rifled home from 20 yards.

Shearer's just, his 20th of the season, came from a long kick by Digby that was nodded on by Ioan striker Paul Rideout, the Scot heading in from six yards. And Town went in front for the only time in the 64th minute when he put the finishing touch to a low cross from Kerslake

Shearer caused more trouble for Plymouth on his next visit to Home Park six months later, hitting all the goals in a 4-0 Town victory.



for keeps wes foderingham

FEW had heard of Wes Foderingham when he arrived in Wiltshire in mid-October, penning a three-month loan deal.

THE rookie slopper donned the gloves at Accrington Stanley 24 hours fater and impressed in a 2-0 away win for the Robins. Fast forward six months and now the goalkeeper is one of the first names on the Swindon teamsheet having clocked up 37 appearances this term. England goalkeeping coach Ray Clemence came to The County Ground for the home clash with Cheltenham Town in March to cast an eye over Cheltenham loanee Jack Butland However, Clemence may well have left SN1 impressed with the performance of Butland's opposite number.

With seven clean sheets in his last eight league games, fans' favourite Foderingham is now on the verge of helping the club towards an immediate return to League One football.

He said: "It is my first full season in football and I have been playing regularly which has been great. The way the season has gone has been a dream really and the lads have been doing so well. I said when I signed the ambition of the club was key and I'o rather be playing regularly than not getting games in the Championship."

The 21-year old could cap a memorable debut season for the club with the possibility of promotion secured this afternoon against Plymouth Argyle. He said "It would be great to get promoted in front of our own lans.

We need to get the win here first and foremost before we worry about results elsewhere. There is the potential of being promoted in front of our own fans at The County Ground and that's a big incentive for us. The games with Crawley and Torquay will play a part but as I said we just want to do our bit first."

Foderingham's latest clean sheet came on Bank Holiday afternoon against Northampton Town on a wet and windy Wiltshire afternoon. "We had a game plan and stuck in there. The wind had a part to play and facing Adebayo Akinlenwa was tough to play against. He marked me on corners and once he pins you, there is no way around him!"

Thankfully for the Town backline, Akinferiwa will not be a part of the opposition line-up this afternoon but Foderingham is well aware that the Pilgrims present a different type of threat this afternoon

He continued: "The game earlier in the season at Plymouth was a difficult one and it was an eye-opener for us. They were struggling at the bottom of the division at the time but they have a talented young side and have got some good results over the last few months to pull themselves away from danger."







