



Good afternoon and a warm welcome to our first home league game of the season against our old friends from Swindon Town. It's good to see them back in League One, I know the guys at Swindon have worked really hard to get back up and their hard work has certainly been rewarded.

I hope that you have all had a good summer break and are ready for the new campaign, refreshed and ready to go. Our summer Season Ticket campaign has gone really well once again with ticket sales reaching almost 4000, which is fantastic when you consider only two years ago we were hovering around 1400.

Let's hope that we can reward you this season with some memorable home results and a good League One campaign.

This summer has been one of football realisation, realisation that clubs cannot spend more on wages than they receive in income, guiet a basic business fact but one that has generally been ignored in football. The SCM (Salary Cap Management) has now been implemented in League one following a successful test in League Two and clubs are now having to run on a business footing, with common sense prevailing.

We are working within the 65% threshold, it is difficult in football to say no to that extra signing that will 'give you the edge', the common phrase 'two more signings and we'd be in the top two' but now, reality has kicked in and if you can't afford 'the extra two', you can't get them, it's as simple as

League Two introduced this a couple of years ago and you have to say that that division has become more stable during that period which can only be good for the game. It was also good to see that this simmer, the Championship are falling into line with SCM, albeit this does not affect this season as theirs will begin next year. This is the division that has had the majority of problems with administration etc. As we have covered many times in these notes, the clubs in the Championship all chase the 'golden chalice' promotion to the promised land of the

Premier League but at the end of the day, only three clubs can achieve this and the rest have to suffer the consequences of ridiculously high wages/long contracts etc etc.

The Championship are £700million in debt so it desperately needs some form of financial management from above to address this. Portsmouth are a classic case of mismanagement and living beyond their means. Let's hope that the SCM will keep our game in check and put an end to fans worrying if their clubs will even exist.

We have been busy in the transfer market during the summer (working within our means) and brought in some excellent signings which we hope will enhance our squad for the year ahead and I would like to say a big welcome to Jonathan Franks. Simon Walton and Steve Howard to Victoria Park and hope we enjoy some success together.

Preseason has been hectic this year with four games in two weeks. The North East clubs have been brilliant with us, each one sending quality teams to The Vic and bringing in fans in good numbers. To have Sunderland, Middlesbrough and Newcastle United here in one preseason is fantastic for the Club and helps with Club finances, even though the police charges for the Newcastle game were £12,000 – quite high for a Club who have had 08 one arrest in three years, but we got on with the job 09 and the game went ahead even though we were -£12,000 before kick off!! Just when you think you can capitalise on extra income, so do the police I quess.

Today we will have the Season Ticket presentations with three lucky winners receiving £5,000, £3,000 and £2,000 respectively. We have Pools legend Brian Honour handing out the cheques just before kick off.

Finally, get behind Neale, Micky and the lads and let's kick off the season in style.







Pools had been in a three-year slump since the shock departure of Alan Murray in 1992 with neither Viv Busby, David McCreery nor John McPhail able to arrest the alarming fall. Keith Houchen had returned to The Vic to see out his playing days, but was almost instantly thrown into the managerial hot-seat with the unenviable task of turning the Club's fortunes around. One of the first things that needed sorting was our lack of goals, somebody to play up front alongside the manager. Damien Henderson was brought into the squad initially on loan but it was Howard who had caught the eye in the pre season friendlies and it was no surprise when he was named in the starting line-up for his League debut at The Deva Stadium, Chester.

Pools' midfield that sunny August day was, let's say, a mixture of youth and experience. Old-stager Tony Canham had been brought in from Houchen's old club York City, and would line-up alongside 39-year-old Mick Tait. The younger element that would bring the average age down to a respectable level were



Howard and 18-year-old Steven Halliday, who had finished the previous season with an incredible debut hat-trick in the last game of the campaign against Mansfield at The Vic.

Indeed the extreme age-range of the midfield was echoed across the entire team, with 19-year-old fullback Denny Ingram paired up with the experienced Sean McAuley, and a central defence consisting of young Ian McGuckin and old hand Peter Billing. Billingham youngster Steve Jones took the goalkeeper's shirt

The inability of the Club at the time to organise the playing strip was firmly brought into the spotlight for this game. A temporary yellow with black shorts arrangement was worn, with a hastily added "Strongarm" logo. This was to be the kit's one and only appearance and it was quickly replaced with the vastly improved red, white and blue

"cricket shirt" away strip which was a radical but brilliant move by the Club as it became hugely popular with fans and was a big seller in the Club Shop.

As for the match itself, well it's safe to say that whilst Pools failed to light the blue touch paper for the forthcoming season, debutant Howard was making his presence felt. On twenty minutes a superb cross by Sean McAuley was met with a powerful downward header by Howard and it needed a superb save by Stewart in the Chester goal to stop a certain goal. Sadly, it couldn't last and goals from Bishop in the first half, and Priest in the second left Pools in a "holy mess" according to The Mail.

For young Howard it had been a decent start though and a taster of things to come from the big lad - especially once he'd been moved up front by Mick Tait late in his Pools career. Welcome back Steve!



Pools 1 Sunderland 0




"Obviously it was very disappointing because we went there so high on confidence," he explained.


"It's a tough start for us because Swindon did really well last year and had a good result on Tuesday so they will be on a big high.




Paolo Di Canio is the type of personality who requires little introduction and his successful start to life as a manager will surely mean he remains in the spotlight for a while to come yet.

With the Robins scrapping for points in a desperate bid to escape relegation, Pools made the long-haul to the County Ground at the start of last April. Things started to go wrong for the hosts in the warm-up when keeper David Lucas was injured and Phil Smith was called-up to be his late replacement.

Unfortunately, Smith had a helping hand in the opening goal of the game when he collected a corner but rushed a throw. It only reached Evan Horwood who didn't even stop to take a touch before sending the ball back first time over the head of the stranded keeper and in to the unquarded net.

It was a wonderful strike worthy of being a winner, but it didn't turn out to be in the end as Pools were reduced to ten men shortly after the break when Gary Liddle was sentoff for a strong challenge on Paul Caddis.



The man advantage seemed to inspire Town, who grabbed a leveller ten minutes later when Matt Ritchie got up highest to convert a deep cross and it ended all-square.

Four In Focus

We take a look at some of the key members of the Swindon Town squad.



Goalkeeper Wes Foderingham

Swindon Town initially signed Crystal Palace goalkeeper Wes Foderingham on a three-month loan deal in October 2011, a move made permanent in January following a string of impressive displays.

The former England Under 19 keeper came through the ranks with Fulham but was released and moved on to Bromley where he caught the eye of Palace during a pre season game against the Eagles.

His eye-catching start for the Robins saw him keep clean sheets in each of his first five games and go on to concede just six goals in fifteen games – enough to convince Paolo Di Canio to sign him on a longer contract.

Now 21, Foderingham was rated as one of the most talented keepers in League Two last term and he'll be keen to enhance his growing reputation at a higher level this season.

Defender Troy Archibald -Henville

Town boss Paolo Di Canio swooped for Exeter City defender Troy Archibald-Henville on a two-year deal in late June 2012 as part of the strengthening for League One.

The 23-year old was a regular for the Grecians last term after joining the club in January 2010 on a permanent deal from Tottenham Hotspur after spending time at St James' Park on loan prior to that.

After a frustrating loan spell with Norwich City, the powerful and athletic central defender found his feet with Exeter and became a mainstay in the backline for Paul Tisdale's side.

He made his debut in a 2-1 at Dagenham & Redbridge and went on to impress sufficiently to earn a permanent contract following his release from White Hart Lane.

Midfielder Tommy Miller

A vastly experienced midfielder, Tommy Miller signed for Swindon on a one-year deal following his release from Championship new boys Huddersfield Town

At 33, Miller has over 400 league appearances to draw upon having cut his teeth here at Pools before going on to gain plenty of experience from spells at Ipswich Town, Sunderland and Sheffield Wednesday.

The County Durham born midfielder started his youth career at Ipswich Town and following his release at 15 from Portman Road he headed to Victoria Park where he started to catch the eye.

It was here at Pools that Miller signed his first professional contract and he went on to make his name as a free scoring midfielder and in the process gained the admiration of a number of higher-division clubs.

Striker Andy Williams


Yeovil Town were desperate to hang on to prize asset Andy Williams at the end of last season after he scored 17 goals in 39 appearances during 2012/13.

However, Paolo Di Canio persuaded the front man that his future lay at The County Ground and he became one of the Robins' first summer signings.


The 26-year-old will add strength to the Town forward line but also offers the flexibility of being able to perform on the wing if necessary too.




It was 3-0 shortly afterwards which gave the lads a real mountain to climb and it was really disappointing given the way we had begun the second half.

When Will We See You Again?

Following the demise of our neighbours Darlington and their drop down the non-league pyramid, we here at The Vic have realised that over the years, there are many a club that we will not play for a while as they are no longer in the league. With Pools being an established League One Club, then we look in this article at the clubs we used to play, some more regular than others, some more recent than others. Colin Foster investigates...

This week we focus on a team that we haven't played in a league fixture since February 2007, when we were in the midst of a promotion challenge from League Two and a long unbeaten run. I am talking about Macclesfield Town, who finished bottom of the Football League last year and were automatically relegated to the Conference.

We first played Macclesfield when they were in the old Northern Premier League back in November 1985 in the FA Cup. Their ground, Moss Rose, was an odd one at the time, a decent main stand and the rest of it a little run down. In a game plagued by rain and more rain, Pools won 2-1 with goals two goals from Alan Shoulder. We played them again in the Cup six years later and we lost 2-0 with Paul Olsson seeing red. At that time the Silkmen were in their fifth season as a Conference outfit but their ground still wasn't up to much and two seasons later this would be a nightmare for them, for they won the Conference but were refused admission to the League on the basis that their ground didn't haven't sufficient capacity or seats. However, two years later in May 1997, after they had made improvements to their ground, they again won the title and replaced Hereford in the League.



We struggled against them in the League to start with, a goalless draw at the Vic being the first meeting on 30th August 1997. In fact, it wasn't until our sixth league meeting that we turned them over, winning 1-0 thanks to a Mark Tinkler effort on their manor in February 2001. Even after this date when Pools' fortunes on the pitch improved massively under the progress made under IOR, Pools still never managed to do the double over them. Definitely a "bogey" team, a frustrating team for Pools more home than away.





During their time in the League, the Silkmen won nothing, bar promotion in their first season, followed by instant relegation. The last time the clubs met was the 20th February 2007, with Pools winning a close game 3-2 courtesy of an own goal with minutes remaining.

After Pools won promotion in 2007, Macclesfield finished third-bottom and just managed to escape the drop. Every season since they flirted with danger, their highest finish being 15th in 2010/11 before finishing bottom last season. Not only have they struggled on the pitch but the Silkmen have suffered off it with the sad loss of popular manager Keith Alexander in March 2010 and just ten months later midfielder Richard Butcher passed away aged just 29, due to a heart condition. The number 21 was retired from their squad list in his



Because of the results, Macclesfield were never the most looked forward to matches for Pools add to that their poor suppport – their home support was bad enough but for a team that falls into the category of "The North" their away support was atrocious, doing well or not. The last time we played

them on a Saturday at home, in what will have been their second away game, they brought a painful 158 fans, the last match ever saw an easily countable from the Town End 66 fans.

From most points of view they won't be missed here at The Vic. They are one of the few non-league teams that have come through the ranks in recent years that have been northern and I expected more from them. More support for sure and a better go of it. Even though they seemed to put Pools to the sword, the writing was on the wall for them a couple of seasons back.

There are none of their players that really stood out for me as stars except two former Poolies, current Bury manager

Richard Barker and "The Beast" Jon Parkin. Both rattled in plenty of goals in Cheshire, before moving on to better things. Also making his league bow there was Rickie Lambert who has now just powered Southampton via successive promotions to the Premier League. Other than that, they instill little pleasure, a dreary place to visit, a team that we regularly struggled against, and no real players who stood out (the three aforementioned aside) as players you would love to hate. A shade non-descript really.

It's difficult to tell what the future holds for them. Their squad has been reduced since relegation and they won't have the funding to compete with the likes of (nearby to a degree) Wrexham and Luton when it comes to attracting players to their flock. Their only hope can be a bit of form and some high revenue from local derbies against Stockport, newly promoted Hyde and Wrexham. Once thing is for sure though - the Conference must be one of the tightest leagues out there, and I don't rate their chances highly.



Shirt #1: 1982/3

At the end of last season we looked at the 1981/82 season, which finished with Pools in an underwhelming but fairly stable 15th position in division Four. Billy Horner was six years into his reign as manager and was looking to recapture the form that had seen his side make a credible push for promotion a year earlier. With funds limited, such an improvement looked unlikely, but on the whole things could be have been worse... as we were about to discover.

CUP WOES


Just as it had twelve months earlier, the 1981/82 campaign began with cup football. The second season of the Football League Group Cup saw the lower division competition rebranded as the Football League Trophy. The cup was a dismal failure for Pools. Billy Horner's side lost all three games. including a 4-0 home defeat to Bradford witnessed by just 655 people, and all of this before the league season even

OFF TO A BAD START

With the early cup games extinguishing enthusiam from day one, Pools limped into the new season. The opening league game is traditionally a wellattended fixture, yet a depressingly low crowd of just 1009 was there to watch a dull goalless draw with Scunthorpe, by some distance the lowest opening day league crowd in the Cub's history.

ON THE BRINK?

Crowds barely improved over the season. An average of less than 1400 saw finances hit crisis point. Star forward Bob Newton was sold to



Port Vale for a pitiful sum, and other players had their contracts renegotiated. Horner did what he could, drafting in players from semi-retirement or the local

leagues, but the wheels were coming off. Pools ended the season in 22nd

A NOVEL SOLUTION?

With the future looking perilous, beleagured chairman Vince Barker hit upon what might generously be called "thinking outside the box". His suggestion was that Pools should secure thir future by merging with their greatest rivals, Darlington. Unsurprisingly, his idea was greeted with a mixture of anger and bewilderment.

MANAGING THE TEAM

With things falling apart all around him, it was no surprise that 1983 finally saw the end of Billy Horner's long stint in charge. A 1-0 defeat at home to Hereford in March proved to be the tipping point, and Horner returned to a coaching role.





Former Spurs and Derby player John

Duncan was appointed as Horner's replacement and the new man could hardly have taken over in less enviable circumstances. A lot of hard work lay ahead, beginning with another election campaign.
