





On playing at home...

WE must forget the display we made against Leyton Orient and work to make The County Ground a very tough place for teams to come and play once again. The County Ground is very important for us and the challenge is there to get back to winning ways in front of our own fans. The performance against Leyton Orient was not good and we will not win here if we play like that again. AFC Bournemouth come here on the back of two home games and they have individuals who can cause problems. We must stay alert.

On taking chances...

We have to start again and make The County Ground a fortress again.

On team selection...

THERE are many options in terms of team selection at the moment because we have many players. I can select any one of them. We can change the team, even after a win, because the opponents have a different physical presence with each game.

On Harry Redknapp...

I will see my old friend Harry Redknapp this afternoon as he comes to The County Ground with AFC Bournemouth, I didn't have a chance to speak to him this week building up to the game so it will be nice to have a reunion with him after the game. I will offer him a nice glass of red wine afterwards which hopefully he will have after having witnessed a Swindon win. At the moment I am very happy with the options we have and that gives me the opportunity to really think and gauge what is required to win each game. I don't want to change my idea on football; we analyse the opponents before each match to address their qualities as well as looking at our own selection.


In reflection...

Town captain Alan McCormack looks back on a busy week for the Robins which has seen consecutive away games. He is hoping to lead the club to back to back wins following Tuesday's triumph at Portsmouth...

TODAY we are back in action at The County Ground and we will come up against a very attacking AFC Bournemouth side.

When you look back at the last fixtures we've had it's not been a great three weeks for us. After the celebrations at Stoke we quickly came back down to earth with a bang against Preston then a defeat to our local rivals and the lads were devastated. Then another defeat against Leyton Orient so it was very important to go to Carlisle and get something and put in the performance that we did in the second half. It gave us a lot of belief that it was only a slight blip we were going through. We all knew that deep down we all had to re-group, dig our heels in and start working harder.

We had a great week Monday to Friday last week and then on Saturday up at Carlisle we produced a good display. Pitman returns...

FORMER Swindon Town midfielder Jamie Pitman has been appointed Phase Coach for the STFC Academy.

Trowbridge-born Pitman came through the Swindon youth ranks in the mid-nineties and made three first team appearances before joining Hereford United. After spells with Yeovil Town, Woking, Forest Green Rovers and a return to Edgar Street – he then qualified as a physiotherapist.

In October 2010 he was appointed caretaker manager at Hereford following the departure of Simon Davey, before being appointed permanent boss two months later. He was on the touchline twice against the Robins last term as manager of the League Two side.

Pitman is now responsible for the 13-16 age groups at The County Ground and will work alongside Paul Bodin and Jeremy Newton in the new-look Academy set-up.

Speaking of his return to Swindon, Pitman said: "After coming through the youth system here at Swindon it's nice to be back at the club that gave me my first chance in football.







Goalkeeper - Shwan Jalal



THE Baghdad-born goalkeeper grew up in East Sussex and played, for Gillingham and Hastings Town before signing for Spurs in 2001. A successful loan spell preceded a permanent move to Woking in 2004 and he went on to make 85 appearances for the club. He spent the 2007/08 season with Peterborough United and after a 12-game spell on loan with Morecambe

he signed a similar deal with Bournemouth. The move became a permanent one in August 2008 and he went on to become a regular as the club escaped relegation. He played a major role in the Cherries reaching the play-off semi-final in 2011, but last season missed a large part due to an operation before returning to action towards the end of the campaign.

He began his career with Burnley and came up through

the youth team but never made a first team appearance for the Turf Moor club. After a ten-game loan spell at Kidderminster Harriers he left Burnley to sign for Bury but after being offered an extended contract he signed for Shrewsbury Town. He was a success last season and won every player of the year award bar one to complete a memorable campaign.

A former player and manager at both clubs, Quinn joined Swindon in December 1981. It wasn't until 1983/84 that he would make his mark: 15 goals that season prompted a move away from The County Ground. Lou Macari brought the striker back in 1986 where he would stay for a further two seasons, scoring 43 goals. Quinn had a playing stint at Bournemouth before moving into management. Chris Casper...

ON loan from Manchester United, Casper made 16 appearances for Bournemouth scoring one goal prior to joining Town. Brought in by manager Steve McMahon on a temporary deal in October 1997, the centre-half made ten appearances for the Town in a period that saw them top the Division One table.

Sadly, Casper's playing career was ended aged 25 in 1999. After a spell in management with Bury, he is now a youth team coach at Old Trafford.


Matching Up...

AFTER starting pre-season with Charlton Athletic, McCormack signed for Swindon in July and made his debut as a substitute in the 3-0 opening day win over Crewe. He went on to make 51 appearances for the club last season, the majority of them as centreback.

The Inside I Consider The Inside I Consider I Consider

Images: Puttyloot Bob Noves It's been quite a year for Wes Foderingham. Since first setting foot inside The County Ground just under a year ago, the goalkeeper has made his Football League debut, celebrated his 21st birthday and broken countless club records.

My first season with the club was fantastic as well as keeping so many clean sheets. THE former Fulham stopper arrived at Swindon in October with a little more than a handful of reserve team appearance at Crystal Palace to his name. He is expected to make his 50th senior career appearance against AFC Bournemouth this afternoon and took time out after training earlier this week to speak to COYR about his time in Wiltshire so far.

The Swindon Story

You are fast approaching a year at Swindon Town. Where has the time gone?

Time has gone very quickly and it's been a great year for me. Promotion in my first season with the club was fantastic as well as keeping so many clean sheets. I bedded into the team really well and it's such an exciting time to be with the club. I am really

looking forward to the future and things have gone well.


Do you remember when you first heard of Swindon's interest in you?

I remember it well. I had just finished playing a reserve game for Palace against Millwall when my agent called me and told me of Swindon's interest. The next thing I know I was on my way down to Swindon and things went pretty quickly from there.

What do you remember of your Town debut?

It was good to keep a clean sheet for starters! The back four helped me out a lot and we were playing Accrington away so it was a little bit of a journey to get up there as well. It was my Football League debut and I remember being really nervous before the game too.

Leigh Bedwell made his senior debut at Preston a few weeks ago. How is your relationship with him?



He has come back this season and has improved a lot. It's just the two of us working with Domenico these days whereas last season there were four goalkeepers. I was pleased to see 'Bedders' make his debut at Preston. The circumstances weren't great for me, but it was still a special moment for him.

How do you look back on what happened at Preston that day?

To be honest I think a lot was made of it. I was very disappointed to be substituted and you could see that by my reaction but I don't condone that at all. I was frustrated and I knew I had made a mistake for the goal and we were 2-0 down. It wasn't anything towards the manager, the club or the fans.

The whole incident was over pretty quickly too wasn't it...

I spoke to the manager the next day at training and he explained his reasons for taking me off. He said if I apologised to the fans for my actions then I would be straight back into the team and so it proved as I played in the following game. That's all behind me now.

What are your targets with Swindon this season?

We have a fantastic squad of players here there's no doubt about that. The challenge will be how quickly everything settles down and we can start picking up points on a regular basis. It took time for things to bed down last year but then everything got going. People shouldn't read too much into things at the moment; I think we will be right up there when Christmas comes around.



What does a typical training session involve for the Town keepers?

Domenico is very different to the goalkeeping coaches that I have worked with before. With other coaches you would do a little bit of everything each day but with Domenico we will concentrate on specific areas. On a Monday we usually do strength work and on a Tuesday we'll do footwork or kicking and Wednesday maybe handlingbased drills. Thursday is usually crossing and suchlike with reaction drills mixed in. Domenico is very thorough with his work and he helps me out a lot during games. He is very supportive and offers a lot of advice before and after games.

Who is the best finisher in training?


I would say Matt Ritchie because his finishing is a joke. In training his standard of shooting is devastating and although he shoots a lot during games, his shooting is generally excellent.

How do you 'stay sharp' during games?

We spend a lot of time together as a squad and the management team makes sure we are well drilled whether it is at training or in games. The gaffer makes sure everyone keeps their focus.

What is the best save you have ever made during your career?





Not a lot of people will have noticed it I don't think, but I'd say a save I made against AFC Wimbledon last season. It was a header at the near post which I managed to get across to and flick it over the bar. I got a touch on it and for me that's the best stop I have made.

Do you look out for goalkeepers when you watch highlights on the Football League Show or Sky Sports?

I don't actually! The highlights don't usually show too many of the top drawer saves as it's more often than not just the goals flying in up and down the country. I look at the standard of the other players and not specifically at the 'keepers.

In your opinion who are the best goalkeepers you have lined up against since being at Swindon?

Last season Bobby Olejnik stood out for me. He was playing for Torquay against us and



looked impressive and of course he has gone on and got a move to Peterborough. The MK Dons 'keeper – David Martin – looked good when they came here at the end of August too.

You played against Jack Butland, who was part of the Olympic squad, last season. What are your ambitions to play at international level?

Jack's situation was a little different. It was a special scenario and he had done really well in the Under-20 World Cup. He then went to Cheltenham to get regular games and he had a very good run. I think the Under-21s is a realistic aim and if I keep playing regularly and keep my standards up then hopefully I will get a call.

Who is the toughest opponent you have faced since you have been with STFC?


Adebayo Akinfenwa. He's a strong boy and uses what he has got really well. I have been asked that question before and I gave the same answer. He's such a tough opponent and I don't see my answer to that question changing any time soon.

Matchday

What is your normal matchday routine for a Saturday game at The County Ground?

I usually wake up at around 9am on a matchday. Breakfast for me normally is toast and fruit or porridge and fruit and that doesn't change too much.

I'll then make sure everything is organized for the game in terms of things I have to take to the ground and then have a pre-match meal of chicken and pasta at around half eleven. Once I get to the stadium I have a massage and a stretch before going out for the warm-up. I don't like my warm-up to be too long so I usually stay out for around half an hour which includes stretching, handling and kicking work.

Do you get nerves before a game still?

I used to, but not now. When I first came to Swindon, such as before my debut against Accrington, I was really nervous but to be honest with you ! don't really get nervous before games now.

What is it like playing in front of a packed Fastplant Town End Stand?

It's really good. The fans here

are great and it gives me a lot of confidence going into games when they're singing my name and being so supportive of the team.



What do you do outside of football?

I don't have anything too crazy to be honest. I like watching films and box-sets and have just finished watching the Prison Break box-set. That's the best thing I have seen in a while and I really enjoyed it.

Who do you room with on away trips?


Leigh Bedwell. He's a good lad and people think he is quite quiet but when he's around Domenico and me he's quite lively and is a great guy.


How do you fill your time on the longer coach trips?




How have you found Swindon as a place since moving here?


It's certainly a lot quieter than what I was used to in London! It's been fine though and I live over in North Swindon which has been great. It's a nice area of Town to live and the location is good.

Match Analysis...

The protracted trip to Carlisle United for Town fans saw the Robins return with a point thanks to goals from Adam Rooney and Paul Benson...

TOWN twice came from behind to draw 2-2 at Carlisle United with goals from Adam Rooney and Paul Benson earning Swindon a point.

Former Town loanee Jake Jervis put the home side in front on 14 minutes. Alan McCormack's attempted clearance hit a Carlisle player and fell kindly for Jervis who side-footed home.

Just short of the half-hour mark, Town were level. Benson's flicked header landed invitingly for Rooney and the Irishman lashed home, left-footed into the bottom corner from 20 yards. The strike sparked a goal-glut with three efforts hitting the back of the net inside six minutes. Two minutes after Rooney's equaliser, Jervis had the home side ahead once more. A ball forward was nodded down for the striker to set himself and thunder a volley high past Wes Foderingham.

With the home support still enjoying Jervis's fine effort, Benson had hauled Swindon level once more. Given far too much time and space to advance into the area, the striker looked up before smashing the ball low past the goalkeeper to earn Town a share of the spoils.

"IT is a shame to go out from this ground not only without winning, but without winning by four or five goals. So I am not happy.

"Carlisle had two shots and got two goals from two defensive errors. We did enough to win and I told my players that I will defend them but they have to be brave. I respect my opponents but in the long run we should finish 20 points ahead of them." Rooney comment...

I haven't been with the club long so it's going to give me a bit more confidence now having got off the mark.

"It was a busy first half an hour or so and the goal they scored early on was unfortunate. The lads showed real determination to get back into it and 'Benno' finished well for his goal too."

ROBIN Van Persie. He was playing for Arsenal and we played against them in a friendly when I was at Barnet in pre-season.







- Missing a fixture (I forget the opponents) entirely after the aforementioned Clio's exhaust fell off somewhere around Leicester.

The list could go on and on and on, but I'm limited to 500 words.

However, you put on a brave face and a smile through the tougher days in anticipation of occasions a little bit special. Occasions like Tuesday night.

I'd only been to Fratton Park once previously, as a Townobsessed 10-year-old to see Chris Hay break his nose and Steve Mildenhall something a little more private in a 1-0 win that sent Swindon top of the old Division One.

I remember that evening on the South Coast well because of its atmosphere and spectacle, and I'll remember Tuesday night in the

Those are the evenings you get stuck on the motorway for. Long may they continue.






Charity Of The Year...

Premier Bound...

Swindon Town's 1992/93 season continued with an entertaining home draw against Oxford United in mid September. Here is how the game unfolded...

SWINDON'S campaign for promotion to the Premiership took another blow on Sunday 20th September 1992, and there are few teams that we would be have been less happy dropping points against.

Despite leading the visitors on two occasions, Town conceded an 84th minute equaliser to draw 2-2 with Oxford United in front of the TV cameras.

Man of the Match Martin Ling snatched a 42 minute opener with a well placed left footed drive, and the midfielder could have made it two shortly after halftime, placing a header over the bar.

But when Fraser Digby uncharacteristically made a hash of collecting a corner, Andy Melville was on hand to force an equaliser.

Paul Bodin upped his game, supplying a cross that Dave Mitchell couldn't quite convert, but it was Shaun Taylor who headed a trademark goal from a curling Glenn Hoddle centre which crossed the goal line via the cross bar.

Hoddle himself soon fired a 25 yarder just too high, then saw another effort force a save from Paul Kee.


Craig Maskelll clipped the cross bar and Taylor headed another chance over, before David Penney's acrobatic volley deflected off Taylor to give Oxford an unlikely share of the spoils.

While Lewis featured for Oxford, there was no sign of Morse or Hathaway. Which was a sharne because home-loving boy Joey Beauchamp appeared to have gone missing during the game.

Of course, come the end of May, Town were promoted to the top flight. The O's finished 14th.



Hall Of Fame...

Two members of Town's League Cup winning side will be at The County Ground today to be inducted into the STFC Hall of Fame...

RODNEY Thomas was born at Glyncorrwg in Wales in 1947. He was spotted by Bert Head as a player of potential while playing for the Gloucestershire County side and signed for Swindon from Gloucester City in July 1964. He made his first team debut in 1966 and between then and 1973 went on to make 355 appearances for the club. The 1966/67 season saw him win a regular spot at right-back keeping out Owen Dawson an England Youth International He missed just two League matches in the 1968/69 promotion season and played in all 12 matches of the cup run that season when Swindon won the Football League Cup. The following season he was ever present in the Anglo-Italian Cup Winners Cup and the Anglo-Italian Inter League Cup as Swindon landed both trophies. A model of consistency he was ever present in the 1970/71 League campaign and missed just one match the following season. In 1973, former Swindon manager Dave Mackay lured him away to Derby County where he won a League Championship medal the following year. His tall somewhat gangling figure sometimes made him appear clumsy but this was deceptive as many forwards found when a long leg swept out of nowhere to win possession while the accuracy of his passing was of a higher quality than normally seen in full backs of the era. He won his first full Welsh cap in 1967 against Northern Ireland and went on to make over fifty international appearances for his country many whilst at Swindon making him the most capped player in Swindon's history.



FRANK Burrows was born at Larkhill in Scotland in 1944 and signed for Swindon at the beginning of the 1968/69 Season from Scuntherpe United. A replacement for Welsh international Mel Nurse, along with John Smith he was to be one of the last two pieces in the jigsaw that created Danny Williams' side that was to win promotion and land the Football League Trophy. Frank's time with Swindon would stretch from 1968 to 1978 and see him make 346 appearances. He missed just two matches in the League campaign that saw Swindon premoted in 1969 and one in the successful League Cup campaign the same year. The 1969/70 season saw Swindon secure fifth place in Division Two, the highest in the club's history and Frank make 38 appearances scoring a vital last minute winner against Hull City at The County Ground. The same year saw him win the Anglo Italian Cup Winners Cup and the Anglo Italian Inter League Cup Winners medals. He remained the first choice central defender until the end of the 1975/76 season after which, although making the occasional appearance, he was more influential as the Chief Coach under Danny Williams. It was the offer of the position of Assistant Manager at Portsmouth which saw him leave Swindon in January 1978. A rugged and tough tackling defender who was strong in the air his strength and determination were one of the bedrocks on which the successes of the late sixties and early seventies were based.

At the next roundabout take the 3rd exit onto the B4380 (Thieves Lane). Continue along Thieves Lane going straight over two roundabouts and this will lead you into Oteley Road. You will reach the stadium further down Oteley Road on the left.


