


In reflection...



DUGUID re-signed for Colchester United in July 2011, after leaving Plymouth Argyle, reuniting him with the club where he made his name. Originally he came up through the youth team at Layer Road, making his debut in December 1995 against Hereford United at Edgar Street as a youth team player. He spent 14 years at the U's in his first spell,

making enough appearances to see him well into the top ten appearance makers. He was part of Phil Parkinson's squad that made it into the Championship for the first time in the club's history and is once again an important member of the team. The 34-year old has now made over 500 career appearances and started against Scunthorpe United last weekend.

Forward - Clinton Morrison

THE frontman has a raft of experience and signed a two-year deal with the U's in the summer after leaving Sheffield Wednesday at the end of last season. He began his career with Crystal Palace and came up through the ranks at Selhurst Park before going on to score 61 goals in 157 league appearances for the Eagles. A move to Birmingham

City for £4,25 million followed in the summer of 2002 but he returned to his former club three years later for a £2 million fee. After two seasons, in which he scored £1 league goals for Coventry City, he signed for Championship side Sheffield Wednesday and he netted seven goals in almost 60 league outings for the Owls.



Forward - Jabo Ibehre



THE tall, powerful striker made an instant impact for the U's, scoring a brace in Saturday's win. He started out with Leyton Orient and made over 200 appearances for the O's scoring 39 goals before moving to Walsall. The striker made 39 appearances and scored ten goals in just one season at the Bescot Stadium before spells with Stockport County and Southend

United. He secured a switch to StadiumMK in 2009 where he has made over 100 appearances. Having started the opening game of the 2012/13 season for the Dons, Ibehre came off the bench for the next four games including an appearance at The County Ground in August. Moved to Colchester last week on a temporary, three-month loan deal.

Incensed by the decision to release him in 1977, Swindon's supporters presented him with a crystal set before his departure.

Kevin Watson...

SIGNED for Swindon in the summer of 1996 and scored his first and only goal in Town colours in the 3-1 win at Southend. In his three years at The County Ground, Watson made over 60 appearances before departing for Rotherham at the end of the 1998/99 season. In June 2004, the midfielder joined Colchester. In his four year stint at the club, he made well over 100 appearances. He now works as a pundit for Sky Sports.

Johnnie Jackson...

JACKSON joined Town on loan in September 2002. He made 17 appearances and scored twice during his spell, netting on his home debut, against Northampton. After returning to Tottenham, Jackson was loaned out to a number of clubs, including Colchester, before signing permanently for the Us in 2006. In a three-year spell at Layer Road, Jackson racked up over 100 appearances before moving on to Notts County. He is currently captain at Charlton Athletic.

Jamie Cureton...

CURETON was brought to Swindon by Andy King on a wave of expectation in the summer of 2005. After a frustrating start to the campaign, the striker joined Colchester on loan until the new year. After his return to The County Ground, Cureton found himself back in the side and went on to score seven goals as Town were relegated to League Two. After 32 appearances in a red shirt, the striker joined the Us on a permanent deal. He went on to make over 40 appearances and notch 24 goals before moving to Norwich. He has since passed the 200-goal landmark.

Puttyfoo: Rob Noves Darren Ward is determined to make a success of his time with Swindon Town. He made his home debut for the Robins in the recent 4-0 home win over AFC Bournemouth and after missing last week's cup win over Burnley, he's hungry for more action.

The manager made it very clear what would be expected of me and that suited me fine.

WITH almost 500 appearances to his name, the 34-year old has an impressive football CV. After starting out with Watford, he went on to represent the likes of Crystal Palace and Wolves before signing a permanent deal with Millwall in January 2010. After over 100 appearances in a Millwall shirt, Kenton-born Ward arrived at The County Ground in search of a new challenge and with Paolo Di Canio's men chasing a second successive promotion, he's relishing the opportunity.

How has the move to Swindon been for you so far?

I have really enjoyed my time here. It has been tough from a training point of view but I am getting used to the regime. It has been a good challenge and that's something I wanted.

What was the main attraction of joining Swindon?

Over the last two seasons I have played 70 odd games for Millwall so it wasn't as if I wasn't getting regular football. The main

thing for me at Swindon was a new challenge and that's what I wanted. I needed something fresh in my career. Sometimes you need a new direction and I wanted to see what was going on out there and Swindon was a very attractive proposition after spending eight years with Millwall.

You scored Millwall's first goal of the season didn't you?

You're right. It was in the league cup game at home to Crawley. I actually scored Millwall's first of the season two years ago as well at Bristol City. Hopefully I can get amongst the goals for Swindon!

What are the main differences you have found between Millwall and Swindon since you arrived?

The training is a lot different. I was fully aware of the situation before I signed for Swindon and it didn't phase me at all. The manager made it very clear what would be expected of me and that suited me fine, I am moving closer to the club which will make things a lot easier too. Travelling any



sort of distance to training every day just puts more workload on your lap. I've been in a hotel until now but am just about to move close to Swindon. The training here is quite intense and you have to keep your concentration. The manager is a bit of a perfectionist and you have to do what you're asked. I am still learning all the time and even at 34-years old, the amount I have learned in four weeks is incredible.

You joined at the same time as four other players. A month on, can you see things really gelling together now?

Definitely; I said since day one that I wanted to come here to contribute and help the club and that's been my target. With the help of the team, the club and the fans that's our aim. There will be ups and downs but in general, from experience, everyone has to rally together and you can see things coming together as the lads are now getting to know each other well now.

You were cup-tied for the Capital One Cup third round tie against Burnley a week ago. You're probably not a great watcher of games, but how did you find it watching from the stands?

It was something new really. Since arriving I have been pretty heavily involved having started four games and been sub twice. I've been thrown straight in the mix so it was interesting to see the game from another view. It was a good opportunity to learn more about the team and it is all part of the process. It was good to see how the players work together.

Having played most of your football at Championship level, can you see sufficient quality in the Swindon squad to win promotion?

The quality is here and you can see that. It's a case of realising what we have got here at the club and working on it. If you are prepared to do that then you have a chance of succeeding at the end of the season. Hard work is the key, ultimately on the training ground because that's what helps prepare you for a matchday. You can't take your foot of the gas here because the gaffer will be straight on you. The work ethic is very good here and with a big squad here, the competition for places should help bring the best out of everyone.

Former Town players Jack Smith and Steve Mildenhall are still at The New Den. How are they getting along?

They've done well. Jack signed a new deal in the summer and has made almost 100 appearances for Millwall now. Steve had a spell in the first team last year and is now trying to get back in, but they're both great guys who I keep in contact with.

Who is the best central defender you have played alongside during your career?

Matt Lawrence. He's a great guy and has been a really good influence on my career. He had an unbelievable few years at Millwall and played in the UEFA Cup and in the FA Cup final. We racked up something like 59 clean sheets in two seasons playing together. He's a fantastic





lad and despite being nearly 40-years old now, he's still playing.

And who is the most difficult player you have had to play against?

Probably Adriano at Inter Milan. He is a very good player and was very hard to deal with. There have been a few that I have faced over my career, including Thierry Henry who was tough to keep hold of.

Fitness is very important to you. Has it always been such a priority for you or have you been influenced by others across your career?

It's just been a realisation for me. Football is evolving and every year it gets quicker and the players get stronger so you have to grow with that. If you are not prepared to do it then be prepared to fail. It's as simple as that in my eyes.



What are the key factors of your fitness work?

I do a lot of strength work and work on core stability. Being flexible is also important in addition to a good diet. You can work hard and train hard but if you are not looking after your body then you will fall behind. You are what you eat so if you don't look after your diet then be prepared for some form of failure or issues. Learning about it, which is what I have done a lot of over a number of years now, has shown me the importance of it. I now try to show people about how important it can be. Setting high standards can really help your game.


What can you tell us about your blog?

It's a process to help people and show them what there is out there in terms of helping yourself. It's about realizing that you are the one that has the influence to make the difference. I am very interested in health and fitness because it enables you to do what you do.

Around a week ago the number of Twitter followers you have went up by around 10,000. What happened?!

A few things have clicked into place recently. I have been asked to be in a social networking site to do with health and fitness so I have been promoting that a little and hopefully that will help people learn a little more about improving their lifestyle. I take great pride in what I do and the Twitter figures are shooting up! We'll see how it goes.







You seem to have plenty of ideas outside of football. Would you like to stay in the game when you retire from playing professionally?


I look after my fitness and feel good so I have no intention of retiring for a long time. I don't want to get sidetracked because I have a job to do here and get paid to play for Swindon, which is what I want to do. I have a lot of targets still to reach in my career and I am determined to reach them. They won't all be reached within the next two or three seasons: I am looking to set records and very high standards and injury permitting it would be nice to see people try and get near them.

I have a few companies outside of football but they are looked after by my teams so I have very little work to have to contribute towards them at the minute. They are there as and when I come out of football, if that's what I do. I have left the door open.

Tonight Colchester United come to Town and you could be lining up against your former Crystal Palace teammate, Clinton Morrison...

I set up quite a few goals for him when we played together. I scored a few as well whilst he finished the season with around nine. Ask him and he will tell you I set up most of them! I know him well and it could be a good battle. Colchester are a difficult side to face and I am sure they'll be looking to impress having just changed their manager.

It's funny how it works, this sport of ours.

FOOTBALL'S a cyclical industry. Unless the natural scheme of things is disrupted by oil-rich Russians or if you happen to support Rochdale, then ups and downs are commonplace.

And when you're up, as the old nursery rhyme goes, you really are up.

I don't know about you, but right now I can't help but look around the rest of League One and see glimpses of how Swindon Town used to be.

Whether it's the financial struggles and near-civil war at Portsmouth, the poor performances and subsequent managerial departure at tonight's guests Colchester or the chairman versus fans stand-off at Bournemouth, up and down the division there are instances which bring back memories of Swindon's past.

So to sit atop it all in the relative comfort of committed displays on the pitch, a manager with passion and drive and a board with ambition and direction is real luxury.

Almost as luxurious as three points at Shrewsbury.

Town showed something different on Saturday. They weren't at their best, even if they dominated large chunks of the game, but they forced a result.

That's a trademark of a good side and one character trait that Paolo Di Canio's team has yet to fully develop since the Italian took charge in Wiltshire 16 months ago.

We've had fluency and fluidity, passion and passing and goals galore but to see the side grinding out a victory away from home, at such a notoriously difficult place to visit, is so encouraging.

And to finish it all off we got a goal from Simon Ferry, which is

about as rare as a French filet steak, and that made the victory just a little bit tastier.

You know when Si's scored, and admittedly it's not often, because the Swindon half of the press box goes slightly doolally - a mixture of surprise and delight that generally results in the various journalists asking themselves more than once if it really was the Scot who found the net.

Ferry deserved a goal on Saturday for the work he put in throughout the match, and scoring is the one part of his game which still raises a few doubts.

Now he's targeting four or five for the season. I hope he manages that and many, many more.

Colchester visit tonight and I have one abiding memory of games with the U's here at The County Ground. It was 11 years ago, ended 1-0 in Town's favour and saw Neil Ruddock's only major contribution in a red shirt. His free-kick almost ripped the net out on the Stratton Bank.

Let's hope for more of the same this evening.







TOWN hosted Grimsby for this evening kick-off, looking to correct a poor run that threatened to undermine a good start to the campaign.

Glenn Hoddle rested goalkeeper Fraser Digby in favour of Nicky Hammond, and there were just two minutes on the clock when striker Craig Maskell hit his ninth goal of the season.

Maskell pounced to turn home from a tight angle after Grimsby keeper Rhys Wilmot failed to hold a long-range effort from Martin Ling.

Described in the Adver as 'bungling', Wilmot allowed the ball to squirm from his grasp, but while Town dominated the encounter the strike proved to be the only goal. Maskell again drove over the bar before a Micky Hazard shot was cleared off the line. Dave Mitchell and Hoddle both struck wide before Wilmot redeemed himself with a superb save from Hazard.

Mariners' manager Alan Buckley switched to using a sweeper at half time and finally Gary Croft tested Hammond from a Jim Dobbin cross.

Wilmot blocked at Ling's feet and then grabbed a strong shot from Mitchell, but the result could have been different if Grimsby's Dave Gilbert had held his nerve rather than driving into the side netting as the game drew to a close.

The result brought a run of four games without a win to an end, which had dropped Town to eighth in the table. Never again that season would we occupy such lowly a position.

Disappointingly, despite spending much of the season in the play-off places, the attendance was the lowest at the County Ground since December 1988.

North Side Story...

If you are inside the stadium this evening then you will either be sitting inside, or looking at, The Arkell's Stand. Read on and you'll find out more about the history of what is traditionally known as The North Stand...

THE current Arkell's Stand is arguably the epicentre of Swindon Town Football Club and was built in 1971 to replace the original North Stand. Bought for £264,000 and purchased on a 42-year mortgage, the new structure originally included a skittle alley and two squash courts.

The stand first saw service in a reserve fixtures on 14th August 1971 before witnessing its first league match a week later – a 2-1 win over Charlton Athletic. The new structure took The County Ground seating capacity up to 8,300.

With parts of the old stand dating as far back as 1896, the new stand was built on the back of the old wooden structure.

Nearly 2,000 seats from the original stand remained in situ for a time, but with the roof removed. They were still in place

for the biggest ever attendance at The County Ground in 1972 before they were finally removed in 1974. That space was left empty until 1992, when permanent seats were added to the front of the stand.

The multi-coloured seats that adorned the new stand for many years were finally replaced with red seats in the summer of 2010. After all the improvements over the years, the Arkell's Stand now has a seated capacity of 6,324 and houses the changing rooms, the club offices and a gym in addition to the hospitality suites and the boardroom.

Home and away fans can also enjoy dedicated supporters' bars in the shape of The Legends' Lounge and Bar71 respectively – why not enjoy refreshments and a bite to eat before the next home game...?




